MINERS AT A GLANCE

- » **UTEP TO HOST OLD DOMINION IN C-USA OPENER, 89TH HOMECOMING GAME SATURDAY NIGHT**
UTEP will host Old Dominion in the 89th homecoming game, while the Miners are opening league play at Saturday night in the Sun Bowl. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.
- » **UTEP IN HOMECOMING GAMES**
The Miners are 39-48-1 all-time in homecoming games. UTEP will host Old Dominion for a third time (2014, 2016, 2021) during homecoming.
- » **3-1 STARTS**
UTEP has started 3-1 for the second straight year after defeating UNM, something that hasn't happened since the final two years (1987, 1988) of the Bob Stull era.
- » **STOUT 3RD-DOWN D**
The UTEP defense leads Conference USA and ranks 11th nationally in third-down conversion percentage (28.3). The Miners have allowed only 15 of 53 third-down conversions.
- » **GUN SLINGIN' GAVIN**
Gavin Hardison ranks first in C-USA & fifth nationally in yards per attempt (10.3).
- » **RACKING UP 100-YARD GAMES**
Jacob Cowing registered his eighth 100-yard career game after tallying a career-high 174 receiving yards against UNM. Cowing is five away from tying the program's all-time leader with 13.
- » **HURRY!**
UTEP tallied 10 QB hurries against UNM. It's the first time hitting double-digits in hurries since 2018 (10 at UTSA), and the third time since 2010 (10 vs. Rice). The last time UTEP had more than 10 hurries was in 2009 (17 vs. #12 Houston). **Praise Amaewhule's** seven hurries were the most by a UTEP player since 2000.

MINER NOTABLES

UTEP IN C-USA OPENERS

The Miners are 5-11 in Conference USA openers since joining the league in 2005. UTEP has lost its last 11 league lid lifters. The last win came against no. 12 Houston during a 58-41 victory on Oct. 3, 2009.

UTEP IN HOMECOMING GAMES

The Miners are 39-48-1 all-time in homecoming games. UTEP has lost its last five homecoming contests as the last victory came against Old Dominion, 42-35, in 2014. The Miners also faced ODU in 2016's homecoming game. The last homecoming game was in 2019 against UTSA.

CHANGING THE NARRATIVE

At 3-1 on the season, the Miners have already equaled the highest win total on a year during head coach **Dana Dimel's** tenure. UTEP also had three victories in 2020, but it should be noted that it had four contests, including three slated for the Sun Bowl, canceled due to the Covid-19 pandemic. With eight games to go, UTEP has a chance to surpass that number and possibly post the first winning record at the school since 2014.

ROLLING AT 3-1

UTEP is off to a 3-1 start for the second straight season, something that hadn't happened since the final two years (1987, 1988) of the Bob Stull era. Overall it marks the seventh 3-1 start for the Miners since 1966. The Orange and Blue also previously achieved the feat in 2020, 2010, 2005, 1991, 1988 and 1987. If UTEP is able to knock off ODU on Oct. 2, it would secure its best record through five games (4-1) since 2010. That year UTEP raced out to a 5-1 record before finishing 6-7 on the season, including a loss in the New Mexico Bowl to BYU.

COMEBACK KIDS

UTEP trailed by 10 (13-3) at the half against New Mexico (Sept. 25), before rallying past the Lobos for the 20-13 victory. It is the first time that the Orange and Blue overcame a 10+ point halftime deficit against an FBS opponent since a 48-45- overtime win at SMU on Sept. 29, 2007. UTEP was down by two touchdowns (28-14) at the half before storming back to tie it, 42-42, and force OT. After holding SMU to a field goal, Marcus Thomas rushed in from 10 yards out for the game-winning score.

WINNING WAYS WITH SECOND-HALF SHUTOUTS

UTEP recorded second-half shutouts in wins against both at NM State (Aug. 28) and against New Mexico (Sept. 25). The prior last time the Orange and Blue had multiple victories that also featured second-half shutouts was in 2010. That year the Miners blanked both NM State (9/18/10) and Arkansas Pine Bluff (9/4/10) over the final 30 minutes of action.

A TALE OF 2 HALVES AND A DOMINATING SECOND-HALF DEFENSE

New Mexico took a 13-3 lead into the locker room on Sept. 25 as it racked up 217 yards of total offense, along with 14 first downs. The Lobos also went 5-for-9 on third-down conversions. In the second half, the UTEP defense shutout UNM, while allowing 71 yards of total offense and giving up only three first downs. UNM also went 0-for-9 on third-down conversions in the second half.

FINDING A NEW WAY TO WIN

Heading into the contest against New Mexico, UTEP had last 28 straight contests to FBS opponents when scoring 20 points or less. The Miners snapped that streak in impressive fashion, forging a second-half comeback to rally past the Lobos, 20-13.

HOME COOKING

For the second consecutive campaign, UTEP is out to a 2-0 start at home. That hadn't happened in two decades (2000, 2001). The Miners bounced Bethune-Cookman, 38-28, in their home opener on Sept. 4, before rallying past UNM, 20-13, on Sept. 25. It's the first time that the Orange and Blue picked up double-digit wins in each of the first two contests since 2010. Overall the Miners have won four straight contests in the Sun Bowl, the longest stretch since a six-game surge over the course of the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

COWING REACHES CENTURY MARK FOR 8TH TIME

Jacob Cowing hauled in seven receptions for a career-high 174 yards against New Mexico. He added a 55-yard touchdown against the Lobos. Cowing also hit the century mark for the eighth time during his career. He ranks tied eighth on the 100-yard games' list. **Chuck Hughes** (1964-66) leads the program with 13 100-yard games.

COWING CRASHING THE END ZONE

Wide receiver **Jacob Cowing** has caught a touchdown pass in six straight games, which is the longest streak since **Kris Adams** also hauled in a TD reception for six consecutive contests in 2008. His next target is **Jeff Moturi's** 10-game surge in 2007. Furthermore, Cowing has become the first Miner in the modern era (post 1965) to record a touchdown catch in the first four games of the year.

WHERE COWING RANKS NATIONALLY

Jacob Cowing has 293 yards on 13 receptions and three touchdowns in three games played. Cowing ranks 23rd nationally in yards (293), 24th in yards per reception (22.5), tied 15th in touchdowns (three) and 19th in receiving yards per game (97.7). Utah State's Deven Thompson leads in yards (454) and yards per game (151.3).

ONE OF THE TOP WRs IN THE NATION

Jacob Cowing leads Conference USA in receiving yards (467) while ranking fourth nationally in that department. Cowing's 116.8 yards per game ranks second in the league and fifth nationally. WKU's Jerreth Sterns (120.0) leads C-USA in yards per game, while USC's Drake London (135.0) leads the nation in yards per game and total receiving yards (540).

ALL ABOUT THAT CONSISTENCY

WR **Jacob Cowing** has been Mr. Consistency since arriving on campus in 2019. He has caught a pass 22 straight games, with at least two receptions in the last 16 contests of the streak. Most recently he had a huge game in the win against New Mexico (Sept. 25), grabbing seven passes for a career-high 174 receiving yards. It was the most receiving yards by a Miner since Jordan Leslie had 218 at Tulsa in 2012. The lone time of his UTEP career that Cowing failed to make a catch came in his second appearance, a 38-3 loss at Big 12 power Texas Tech on Sept. 7, 2019.

GARRETT'S GOT THAT TOO

WR **Justin Garrett** has been just as reliable for Miner QBs. He has posted at least two catches in 19 straight contests, a streak that started on Oct. 5, 2019, vs. UTSA in the Sun Bowl. Most recently he had four catches for 105 yards in the victory against New Mexico (Sept. 25).

MINER NOTABLES

COWING & GARRETT HITTING THE CENTURY MARK

Jacob Cowing (174) and **Justin Garrett** (105) each hit over 100 yards receiving against New Mexico. It was the second time the WR duo each hit the century mark. Cowing tallied 102 yards and Garrett 120 at ULM last season.

FIRING AWAY

Gavin Hardison has averaged 10.3 yards per attempt through four games in 2021, a huge jump from his average of 7.1 in 2020. Hardison ranks first in Conference USA and fifth nationally in yards per pass attempt.

OTHER NOTABLE HARDISON NUMBERS

Gavin Hardison's completion percentage (59.8) is also improved from last year (54.3), a quality achievement considering he's taking shots. Hardison has surpassed his touchdown passes from 2020 with six, the most he's thrown in a year as a Miner.

CHUNKS OF YARDS PER COMPLETION

UTEP quarterbacks rank second in Conference USA and sixth nationally in yards per completion (17.1). FIU (17.3) leads C-USA, while Army (25.6) leads the nation.

GOING LONG

Both **Jacob Cowing** (72 yards, 57 yards) and transfer **Tyrin Smith** (52 yards) have a reception for at least 50 yards on the year. Last season, Cowing (82 yards) was the lone Miner to eclipse that distance over the eight contests of action.

PRIMETIME DEION HANKINS

Deion Hankins scored his second touchdown of the season on a four-yard rush in the third quarter against New Mexico. It was his 11th career score, while it was the fifth consecutive game he's found pay dirt dating back to the 2020 season. The five-game streak is the longest by a UTEP player since **Treyvon Hughes** also had a five-game string during the 2019 season.

INYANG'S CAREER NIGHT

Dy'vonne Inyang's performance was one of the reasons why the Miners rallied to beat UNM, shutting it down in the second half. Inyang tallied a career-high seven tackles, while the senior safety intercepted his first pass in a Miner uni-

form. Inyang's INT came at the 8:31 mark of the third quarter.

STUD LINEBACKERS

Tyrice Knight (12) and **Breon Hayward** (10) combined for 22 tackles during UTEP's win against New Mexico. It's the second time the linebacking duo each hit double figures in tackles. The pair combined for 27 tackles (Knight 11, Hayward 16) against North Texas in the 2020 season finale.

PRAISE CHASING QB'S

Praise Amaewhule tallied a career-high seven quarterback hurries in UTEP's 20-13 win against New Mexico. It was the most since **Menson Holloway's** eight QB hurries at Nevada on Nov. 4, 2000. Amaewhule added two pass breakups, a strip-sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and four tackles.

TYSON WILSON'S IMPACT

Tyson Wilson made his first career start against New Mexico. The sophomore DB made the most of his starting nod as he posted a career-high seven tackles and a career-best two pass breakups.

THE INCUMBENT KICKER

Gavin Baechle has handled field goals and PAT's for the Miners over the last three seasons. During that span, he has converted 26-of-35 field goals (long of 46) and all 56 of his extra point tries for a total of 134 points. In 2021, he is 8-for-10 on FG, and 11-for-11 on PAT conversions. His PAT percentage ranks first in school history, and his field goal percentage (.743) rates in the top 10.

DAS BOOT

Joshua Sloan averaged 44.7 yard per punt against New Mexico, his second-best performance since coming to UTEP. Sloan booted six balls for 268 yards, including a pair placed inside the 20-yard line.

BALL CONTROL

UTEP ranks second in Conference USA and 14th nationally in time of possession (33:11.75). Charlotte leads C-USA (34:50.00) and Army leads the nation (40:29.25).

MINERS SWEEP C-USA AWARDS ON WEEK 0

Jacob Cowing (offense), **Dy'vonne Inyang** (defense) and **Gavin Baechle** (special teams) were selected as the Conference USA Players of the Week after

their performances at NM State on Aug. 28. Cowing gathered a career-high 158 yards on five receptions. Baechle scored a total of 12 points, kicking a perfect 3-for-3 on field goals and 3-of-3 on PATs. Inyang tied his career high with six tackles to lead the Miners.

MINERS EXPERIENCED IN THE TRENCHES

UTEP's offensive line has taken on a veteran look as seven players have combined for 99 starts in the orange and blue. El Paso native **Bobby Deharo** leads the way with 31 starts, followed by **Zuri Henry** (23), **Elijah Klein** (17), **Darta Lee** (10), **Andrew Meyer** (7), **Gamaliel 'Tres' Barboza** (6) and **Jeremiah Byers** (5). The Miners cut their sacks allowed per game in half last season, from 2.9 in 2019 to 1.5. The O-line also paved the way for **Deion Hankins** to set the school freshman rushing record, while compiling 100+ yards in three of the seven games that he played in (Hankins rushed for 99 yards in the season finale versus North Texas).

FIVE MINERS PICK UP PRESEASON HONORS

UTEP had a total of five players named to Conference USA's 2021 preseason watch list, as selected by the league's 14 head coaches. Miner DE **Praise Amaewhule**, WR **Jacob Cowing**, OL **Bobby Deharo**, WR **Justin Garrett** and DB **Dy'vonne Inyang** all made the list.

THEY'RE BACK

Due to the uniqueness of the COVID year, UTEP returns all 11 starters on offense and eight on defense from last year's 3-5 squad. Returning starters on offense are LT **Darta Lee**, LG **Bobby Deharo**, C **Andrew Meyer**, RG **Elijah Klein**, RT **Zuri Henry**, WR **Justin Garrett**, WR **Jacob Cowing**, WR **Walter Dawn Jr.**, TE **Trent Thompson**, RB **Deion Hankins** and QB **Gavin Hardison**. Returning starters on defense are DE **Jadrian Taylor**, DT **Kelton Moss**, DT **Keenan Stewart**, DE **Praise Amaewhule**, LB **Tyrice Knight**, CB **Josh Caldwell**, S **Dy'vonne Inyang** and S **Justin Prince**. UTEP's primary kicker (**Gavin Baechle**) and punter (**Joshua Sloan**) also return.

He initially walked on at Texas A&M before continuing his football career at Mesa Community College, where he appeared in six games prior to being diagnosed with Burkitt lymphoma.

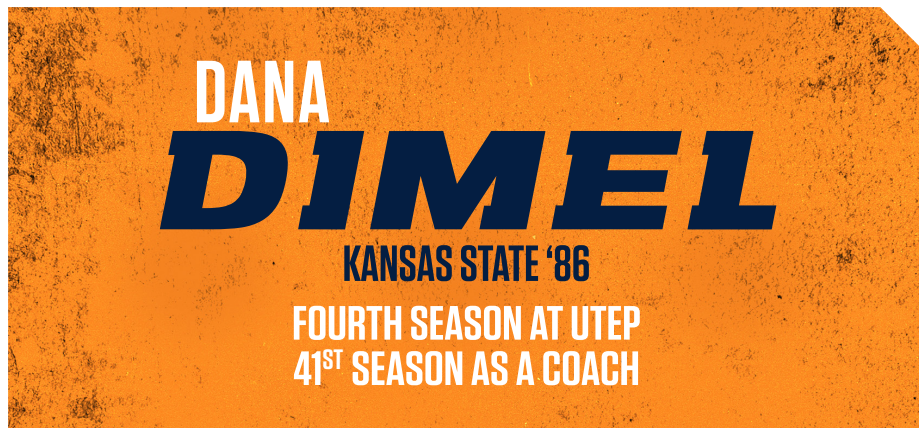

UTEP HEAD COACH



Dana Dimel was named the 26th head coach in UTEP football history by Director of Athletics Jim Senter on Dec. 6, 2017. He enters his fourth season as UTEP head coach and his 10th season overall as a head coach in 2021.

His first two seasons were all about laying the foundation for the revival of UTEP Football. In 2020, the Miners began to see results, as they tripled their win total while putting a much more talented and competitive product on the field. Two Miners -- defensive end Praise Amaewhule and wide receiver Jacob Cowing -- earned second team All-League honors, and two others -- offensive lineman Jeremiah Byers and running back Deion Hankins -- were tabbed to the C-USA All-Freshman Team. Amaewhule ranked second in C-USA and 13th nationally in sacks (0.88 per game), and Cowing was second in C-USA in receiving yards per game (86.4). Hankins set UTEP freshman records for rushing yards (592) and rushing touchdowns (nine). He was third in C-USA in rushing touchdowns, and fifth in rushing yards per game (84.6).

A trio of talented underclassmen -- Cowing, Hankins and quarterback Gavin Hardison (1,419 yards passing in seven games) -- spearheaded the Miner offense in 2020, while senior wide receiver Justin Garrett chipped in with 38 catches for 510 yards. Meanwhile, the UTEP defense was also vastly improved from 2019, as Amaewhule led a unit that produced 47 tackles for losses and 13 sacks in the shortened campaign.

In 2019, Cowing led all Conference USA freshmen with 550 receiving yards. Cowing and Garrett both came on strong to conclude the campaign with 441 and 370 receiving yards respectively over the final six games. Cowing wasn't the only true freshman to make his mark in C-USA in 2019. Amaewhule was tabbed to the league's All-Freshman Team after tying for the team lead in tackles for losses (5.5) and sacks (three).

In 2018, Dimel led the Miners to their first victory in two years -- a 34-26 triumph at Rice. Dimel's first UTEP team featured second team All-Conference USA graduate transfer linebacker A.J. Hotchkins, who tied for the league lead with 126 tackles and finished 17th nationally in tackles per game (10.5). The 2019 Miners had two second team All-Conference

performers in senior defensive end Denzel Chukwukelu, who tied for the team lead in tackles for losses (5.5) and sacks (three), and senior center Derron Gatewood, who made a productive return to the starting lineup after missing the entire 2018 campaign due to injury.

Numerous Miners have garnered honorable mention All-Conference USA accolades under Dimel, including defensive back Nik Needham in 2018. Needham finished his career as UTEP's all-time leader in pass breakups (33) and is currently with the Miami Dolphins.

Dimel was previously the head coach at the University of Wyoming and the University of Houston. He served as the offensive coordinator, running backs coach and tight ends coach at his alma mater, Kansas State University, from 2009-17. He also spent three seasons on the staff at the University of Arizona.

Dimel completed his third tour of duty with the Wildcats, including a year (2005) continuing work on his graduate degree. Working under legendary coach Bill Snyder, he was a part of 12 bowl teams during 19 seasons in Manhattan. The Wildcats posted an 11-win season (2012), two 10-win campaigns (1995, 2011) and five nine-win seasons (1993, 1994, 1996, 2014, 2016) during that span, and finished in the top-18 of the national poll on three occasions (2011, 2012, 2014). They won the Big 12 championship in 2012.

Dimel compiled the most wins of any active offensive coordinator in college football from 2011-17 (61), and was a part of eight straight bowl appearances including in 2017. The 2016 Wildcats defeated Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech, Baylor and TCU. With Dimel calling the plays over seven seasons, the Wildcats averaged 33.4 points per game and 6.2 yards per play. They ranked third nationally in fewest turnovers per game behind LSU and Alabama from 2011-17.

During Dimel's tenure as offensive coordinator, Kansas State routinely ranked among the nation's best teams in red zone and third down efficiency. In 2016, Kansas State rated 10th in the country in red zone offense and 22nd in third down conversions behind a rushing attack that rated third-best in the Wildcat record book (3,013 yards).

In 2014, Kansas State led the nation in

scoring efficiency (scoring drives/total drives), while the Wildcats ranked 11th in the country in team passing efficiency, 14th in red zone offense, 16th in passing offense and 24th in scoring offense. K-State was also 25th in third down conversions and 12th in fourth down conversions while shattering the school record for passing yards (3,736) and completion percentage (65.3). The Wildcats tallied 5,481 yards of offense (fourth in the school record book) and 465 points (sixth).

Dimel's play calling helped wide receiver Tyler Lockett leave K-State with the school's career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdown records, while quarterback Jake Waters broke the school marks for single-season passing yards (3,501) and total offensive yards (3,985).

Dimel's units found success again in 2013 as K-State rated eighth nationally in yards per completion and 13th in passing efficiency, while the Wildcats ranked fifth and third in school history in those respective categories. One of the best offenses in the nation on third downs (No. 13) and inside the red zone (No. 27), K-State ranked in the top-10 in school history in yards per play (second), total yards (fifth), passing yards (fifth) and points (eighth). John Hubert concluded his career as the Wildcats' no. 2 all-time leading rusher with 2,993 yards.

The 2012 season was another banner year on offense as Dimel co-coordinated an offense that finished in the top-25 nationally in nearly 10 categories, including a ninth-place ranking in yards per attempt, 11th in scoring offense and 13th in yards per completion. That year Dimel coached Heisman Trophy finalist Collin Klein, who passed for 2,641 yards and 16 touchdowns while rushing for 920 yards and 23 scores.

In 2011, Dimel led a rushing offense that saw Klein set a new Big 12 record and NCAA record by a quarterback with 27 rushing touchdowns while surpassing the 1,000-yard rushing mark on the season.

In 2010, the Wildcat offense ranked third in the Big 12 and in the top-25 nationally at 33.6 points per game. K-State was also ranked among the top-10 teams in the country in total red zone efficiency and No. 1 in touchdown percentage in the red zone.

In 2009 and 2010, Dimel had the charge of molding a former community college quarterback into a physical running back in the Big 12 Conference. That player was Daniel Thomas, and 2,850 yards and 30 touchdowns later, Thomas left Kansas State as a two-time Big 12 rushing champion, an All-American and the school's no. 3 all-time rusher.

Dimel started his career at K-State as a graduate assistant from 1987-88 prior to being elevated to offensive line coach in 1989. He took over as offensive coordinator in 1995. Overall Dimel spent 10 seasons in Manhattan (1987-96) prior to accepting the head coaching position at Wyoming. At the time of his hire, he was the youngest Division I-A head coach in the nation at the age of 34.

Wyoming's three seasons at Wyoming (1997-99) produced a record of 22-13, with one eight-win season (1998, 8-3) and two seven-win campaigns (1997, 7-6 and 1999, 7-4). The Cowboys posted a combined conference mark of 14-9 while splitting time in the Western Athletic Conference (1997-98) and the Mountain West Conference (1999). In 1998, Wyoming was 6-2 in the WAC's Mountain Division, good for a second-place finish. Dimel coached three Academic All-Americans at Wyoming.

Dimel spent 2000-02 as the head coach at Houston. Spearheading a major rebuilding effort, he led the Cougars to five wins in 2002 following a 0-11 campaign in 2001. In Dimel's final game with the Cougars, Houston upset conference champion Louisville. Dimel brought in the top-ranked recruiting class in Conference USA in both 2001 and 2002 and coached Joffrey Reynolds, who broke the C-USA season rushing record with 1,545 yards.

He continued work on his graduate degree at Kansas State in 2005 prior to taking over as Arizona's tight ends coach and, eventually, run game coordinator from 2006-08. In 2008, he added running backs to his list of responsibilities as he was promoted to Associate Head Coach with the Wildcats. The 2008 Arizona squad finished 8-5 while posting a bowl victory (Las Vegas Bowl) for the first time in 10 years. Among Dimel's protégés at Arizona was Rob Gronkowski, who emerged as one of the top tight ends in NFL history with the New England Patriots.

During his initial tenure at K-State, Dimel coordinated an offense that established school records for touchdowns, points and yards in 1995. He mentored 11 offensive linemen who went on to sign NFL contracts over those 10 years, while he was also instrumental in developing All-Americans Barrett Brooks, Jim Hmielewski and Quentin Neujahr.

During his career as a head or assistant coach, Dimel has coached 37 players who have gone on to play in the NFL.

Dimel was a two-year letterman as an offensive lineman at Kansas State. He was a member of the Wildcats' All-Decade Team for the 1980's. He signed a free agent contract with the Minnesota Vikings and attended training camp in 1987.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Marketing from Kansas State in 1986.

Dimel and his wife, Julie, have a son, Winston and a daughter, Josey. His son was a graduate transfer fullback on the UTEP football team in 2018. He previously played at Kansas State and scored 25 touchdowns over three seasons. He was a three-time All-Big 12 player, garnering first team honors in 2015 and 2016.
