### WEEK 10 AT A GLANCE

#### STEWART SHINES IN ANOTHER JAX STATE WIN

Jax State extended its winning streak to five games behind another incredible performance by running back **Tre Stewart**, who carried 27 times for 232 yards and four touchdowns. He is the first CUSA player to rush for at least 210 yards in back-to-back games since Old Dominion's **Ray Lawry** in 2015 and the first to score four rushing touchdowns twice in a season since Florida Atlantic's **Devin Singletary** in 2017.

The win snapped the Flames' 12-game home winning streak and marked the first time they dropped back-to-back games since the end of the 2022 season. Quarterback **Tyler Huff** also dominated on the ground with 130 yards on 20 totes. During the team's winning streak the duo is averaging a combined 276.4 rushing yards per game. In the loss, Liberty running back **Quinton Cooley** carried 27 times for 133 yards and a score. Gamecocks safety **Antonio Carter II** led the team with nine tackles, including six solo stops, along with a pass breakup.

#### TOPS ARE BOWL BOUND ONCE AGAIN

For the sixth-straight season, WKU will be headed to a bowl game after cruising to a win over last week's Cinderella, Kennesaw State. The Hilltoppers raced out to a 21-7 lead after the first quarter thanks to a pair of touchdown passes by **Caden Veltkamp**, who finished 17-22 for 276 yards and three touchdowns. The Bowling Green native logged his third-straight start with at least 260 yards passing and three touchdowns.

WKU running back **Elijah Young** logged the team's first 100-yard rushing performance of the season, racking up 114 yards on just 15 carries for an average of 7.4 yards per carry. Young busted off five runs of 10 yards or more, including a long of 20 yards.

The Tops' greatest achievement of the night may have come in the form of a perfect game on penalties. Linebacker **Darius Thomas** helped lead the WKU defense with six tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks. Fellow linebacker **Chandler Matthews** logged nine tackles - all solo stops - along with a TFL.

#### RIVERS HAS CAREER NIGHT FOR PANTHERS

FIU wide receiver **Eric Rivers** put up a jaw-dropping stat line in the Panthers' dominant win on Tuesday, catching 11 passes for 295 yards and three touchdowns. The 295 yards are an FIU program record, the second-most by an FBS receiver this season and the third-most receiving yards in a game in CUSA history. Rivers' three touchdowns went for 51, 52 and 62 yards.

Panthers quarterback **Keyone Jenkins** tossed a career-high four touchdowns, adding another scoring strike to **Dean Patterson** to put the game out of reach midway through the fourth quarter.

Defensively, FIU held NM State to just 12 yards passing - the fewest allowed by the Panthers in program history. The victory marked another double-digit tackling effort for linebacker **Travion Barnes**, who finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops.

#### BEARKATS WIN ANOTHER DEFENSIVE DUEL

Despite being outgained by LA Tech, Sam Houston's defense forced four turnovers and got the ball back on downs in the Bulldogs' last two possessions to lead the Bearkats to win number seven on the year. Running back **Jay Ducker's** 40-yard rushing touchdown stood as the game-winner and highlighted an 13-carry, 72-yard night.

The defense also came up with five sacks and eight tackles for loss. Defensive lineman **Kendrick DuJour** had a pair of sacks, and linebacker **Kavian Gaither** finished with two tackles for loss. Defensive back **Caleb Weaver** led the way with 10 tackles, including eight solo stops, along with an interception.

Missed opportunities will haunt the Bulldogs, who finished 1-4 in the red zone with just a field goal and turned the ball over three times within the Bearkats' seven-yard line. However, both teams failed to capitalize as there were six total turnovers and no points scored off of those mishaps.
