## TOP STORYLINES

- One of the most anticipated games in Fifth Third Stadium history is on tap for Tuesday night when Kennesaw State hosts UTEP in a nationally televised Conference USA showdown. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. on ESPNU.
- Kennesaw State has won five straight games and is 3-0 in Conference USA action this season. The Owls' only blemishes this season have been Power 4 losses to Wake Forest (4-2) and No. 2-ranked Indiana (7-0).
- Kennesaw State is looking to accomplish what only eight other programs have accomplished on Tuesday -- become bowl eligible in its first season of full-fledged FBS status.
- In its first away game in 45 days last week, Kennesaw State rolled up its most points (45) and yards (498) ever against an FBS opponent as it defeated FIU.
- The Owls also owned the trenches last week, totaling 214 rushing yards - a season high.
- On the flip side, Kennesaw State's continues to bend, but never break, leading Conference USA in points allowed in league play (16.3) and ranking second in points allowed overall (21.3).

- r-Sr. LB **Baron Hopson** continues to top the charts in the CUSA leaderboard, recording his fourth-straight double-digit tackle game last week at FIU and his fifth overall, making 12 stops with two pass breakups and a QB hurry.
- Hopson's 68 tackles on the season rank second in CUSA and are the most in KSU history for an Owl through six games. His five games with 10+ tackles is good for third-most in the nation.
- Continuing to anchor the backend is r-Sr. DB **Caleb Offord**, who is third on the team with 25 tackles this season.
- Offord has a whopping 10 passes defended this season to lead Conference USA, while his 1.67 passes defended per game rate ranks second nationally.
- r-Sr. WR **Gabriel Benyard** and r-Sr. WR **Christian Moss** were a deadly threat in space last week, combining for 190 receiving yards and a receiving TD.
- Benyard fell three yards shy of having his third 100-yard receiving game this season. No other CUSA wide receiver has more than one.
- The Owls offensive line continues to impress leading Conference USA with just eight sacks allowed on the season and one sack allowed in CUSA games.

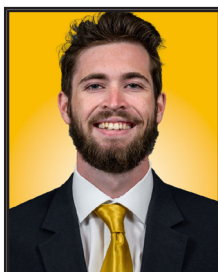
Media will call/credential pickup is at the Georgia Natural Gas Gate (located on the west side of Fifth Third Stadium) and opens two hours prior to kickoff.

# JERRY MACK

## HEAD COACH

FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH

ALMA MATER: ARKANSAS STATE, 2003

Jerry Mack, a veteran collegiate coach with 20 years of experience and five conference championships, was named the second football head coach in Kennesaw State history, on Dec. 1, 2024.

Mack comes to Kennesaw after a season as the running backs coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars and three seasons as the running backs coach at Tennessee.

Tennessee compiled a 27-12 record with Mack on staff, providing an immediate impact in his first season in Knoxville. Thanks to a bevy of backs and an electric, up-tempo offense, Tennessee jumped 73 spots in the FBS over its previous year to rank 11th nationally in Mack's first season, putting up 217.8 rushing yards per game in 2021.

The Vols shattered eight offensive records in 2021 and ranked in the top 25 nationally in scoring offense (39.3 – seventh), total offense (474.9 – ninth), rushing offense (217.8 – 11th), offensive yards per play (6.5 – 17th) and third down offense (44.7 – 25th).

Under Mack's tutelage, Jabari Small led the Vols in rushing with 141 carries for 796 yards and nine touchdowns, which tied for eighth in the SEC. Len'Neth Whitehead and Jaylen Wright also burst onto the scene as freshmen under Mack's tutelage with each earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors during the year and combining for 616 rushing yards and six touchdowns.

The 2022 season saw Mack's backs make an even greater impact as Tennessee reached the 11-win plateau for the first time in two decades, getting key victories over Alabama, Florida, LSU, Kentucky and Clemson. The Vols tied a school record for rushing touchdowns with 40, a mark that also ranked third nationally, en route to the No. 1 scoring offense in the country. Small ranked second in the SEC with 13 rushing scores, which tied for sixth in school single-season annals and were the most by a Vol in 14 years.

Combined with Wright and Dylan Sampson, the trio combined for 29 rushing scores in the fall of 2022, and Tennessee was the only SEC program with multiple running backs who logged 10 or more rushing touchdowns for the year. UT averaged 199.5 yards per game on the ground, which ranked 26th in the nation.

Wright and Sampson finished averaging 6.0 and 6.8 yards per carry for the 2022 season with Wright taking the Vols' total rushing yards crown at 875 yards on 146 carries. As a team, Tennessee broke 13 single-season offensive records and led the country in scoring offense (46.1 ppg) and total offense (525.5 ypg).

In Mack's final season in Knoxville, the Vols led the SEC in rushing with 204.8 yards per game to rank No. 9 in the country. Wright led the way with 1,013 yards on the ground, including six 100-yard performances, with Sampson (604) and Small (475) right behind him as the three combined for 13 touchdowns. Overall, UT's offense ranked 19th in the nation and fourth in the SEC with 448.1 per game and averaged 31.8 points per game.

Prior to his arrival in Knoxville, Mack served in multiple roles at Rice for three seasons. He was named the Rice Owls' offensive coordinator on Dec. 12, 2017, and tabbed as Rice's associate head coach on Feb. 13, 2019.

In his first year at Rice, Mack's offense produced four individual 100-yard rushing days and three games with players totaling more than 100 receiving yards. He saw a trio of his receivers (Austin Trammell, Austin Walter and Aaron Cephus) each top 40 receptions and 500 receiving yards, the first time since 2008 that Rice produced receivers with those levels in the same season.

In June 2019, he joined 40 assistant and positional NFL and NCAA coaches at the 2019 NFL Quarterback Coaching Summit in Atlanta. The 2020 COVID-19 shortened season saw the Owls play just five games, however, the highlight of the season came when Mack's squad handed No. 21 Marshall its first loss of the season, 20-0. Rice was named FWAAs National Team of the Week for its efforts.

In four seasons at North Carolina Central, Mack led the Eagles to at least a share of three consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championships and a berth in the 2016 Celebration Bowl, which pits the champions of the MEAC and SWAC each December. He compiled a 23-15 record in four seasons as one of the youngest head coaches at the FBS/FCS level. He was named the 2016 HBCU Football Coach of the Year by Black College Sports Page and The Pigskin Club in Washington, D.C., after NCCU smashed its school record for offense on its way to the Celebration Bowl.

Mack led the 2014 Eagles to the most victories in the program's FCS tenure with a 7-5 overall record and a share of the MEAC Championship. The team also earned the program's first win over a nationally ranked FCS opponent by defeating No. 24 North Carolina A&T in the final game of the season. NCCU broke the school record for pass completions in a season with 227 and ranked third in the FCS in turnover margin at +12.0.

In his second season at NCCU, Mack guided the 2015 Eagles to an 8-3 overall record and a 7-1 conference mark to repeat as MEAC co-champions. For the second-straight year, the Eagles beat a nationally ranked FCS opponent (No. 13/16 North Carolina A&T), this time closing out the campaign with a seven-game win streak. Mack became the first head coach in school history to win 15 games in his first two seasons. He was recognized as a finalist for the STATS FCS Coach of the Year award and was named the Black College Sports Page "Baad Team" Coach of the Year.

In his third season at NCCU, the Eagles received their first national ranking as an FCS program on Nov. 7, 2016, when the FCS Coaches Poll announced NCCU at No. 25. By the end of the regular season, the Eagles jumped to No. 18. NCCU (9-3, 8-0 MEAC) beat No. 9 North Carolina A&T, 42-21, on Nov. 19 to capture the outright MEAC championship and a trip to the second annual Air Force Reserve Celebration Bowl.

NCCU's nine victories in 2016 were the most by the Eagles in the program's Division I era. In recognition of his success in 2016, Mack was named the MEAC Football Coach of the Year, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS Regional Coach of the Year, and as one of 15 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award as the FCS Coach of the Year. He was also

recognized as the HBCU Football Coach of the Year by Black College Sports Page and The Pigskin Club in Washington, D.C., and the HBCU Male Coach of the Year by HBCU Digest.

Mack joined NCCU after spending two seasons (2012-13) at South Alabama as wide receivers coach. During that time, three of his receivers finished among the top five in the program's single-season record lists for receptions and receiving yards.

He spent the 2011 campaign in his hometown with the Memphis Tigers, also as wide receivers coach, where he tutored Tannar Rehrer, who achieved the second-highest single-season receptions in school history.

As offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach with Arkansas at Pine Bluff in 2010, Mack transformed a unit that ranked 101st in the nation in total offense to 30th nationally and No. 2 in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, breaking 10 offensive school records in the process.

Mack served as passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach at Central Arkansas during the 2008-09 seasons, helping lead the 10-2 Bears to the Southland Conference championship and placing 10th in the NCAA Division I-FCS in total offense.

In Mack's two seasons (2006-07) as wide receivers and tight ends coach at Jackson State, the Tigers ranked second in the SWAC in scoring offense both years and captured the SWAC championship title in 2007.

Mack started his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant at Delta State from 2004-05. During that time, he coached running backs and worked as assistant special teams coordinator and video coordinator, helping the Statesmen rank third in the NCAA Division II in scoring offense and total offense.

Mack began his collegiate playing career at Jackson State before transferring after one season (1999) to Arkansas State. He lettered three years at Arkansas State (2001-03) before earning his bachelor's degree in management information systems in 2003.

Mack completed his master's degree in physical education from Delta State in 2006 after serving on the Statesmen coaching staff as a graduate assistant.

He was selected for five internships in the NFL with the New York Jets (2009, 2010), Buffalo Bills (2008), Houston Texans (2018) and Miami Dolphins (2019) before ultimately earning a full-time position in Jacksonville in 2024. He also participated in the NCAA Expert and Champion Coach's Academy program in 2019.

While at Tennessee, Mack was named to the Coalition of Minority Football Coaches (NCMFC) Coalition Academy, a first of its kind mentorship program pairing influential athletic directors with minority football coaches. Mack was one of 12 coaches nationally to earn the prestigious honor. The Coalition Academy furthers the NCMFC's mission of preparing, promoting and producing minority coaches at all levels of competition.

Mack and his wife Starlett have two sons, Jaden and Jaxon, and one daughter, Skyler.

- move it to 0-2 all-time against UTEP.

**SERIES HISTORY ...**

- Tuesday's game will mark the second all-time meeting between Kennesaw State and UTEP.
- The Miners won a 20T thriller in El Paso, Texas, topping the Owls 43-35.
- Kennesaw State scored a game-tying touchdown with 2:43 left in the fourth to force overtime where UTEP managed to pull away.
- Then-quarterback Davis Bryson posted a 14-for-25 clip with 183 yards and two passing touchdowns. On the ground he tallied 70 yards with one rushing score.
- Defensively, Donelius Johnson had 15 tackles and 0.5 sacks.

**ON THE CUSP OF GOING BOWLING ...**

- After completing an NCAA-mandated two-year reclassification process from Division I FCS to Division I FBS, Kennesaw State is eligible to receive a postseason bowl bid in 2025.
- Kennesaw State is seeking its first-ever NCAA bowl berth.
- At 5-2, Kennesaw State needs just one victory over its final five games of the regular season to be eligible for bowl consideration.
- Of the 33 teams that have made the transition from FCS (formerly Division I-AA) to FBS (formerly Division I-A), Kennesaw State is looking to become the ninth-ever program to earn a bowl invitational in its first full-fledged season.

• The most noticeable change for the majority of observers as **Jerry Mack** takes the reins at Kennesaw State is the transition to a tempo spread offense.

• Leading the transition will be offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Mitch Militello**.

• Militello also served on the offensive staff with Mack at Tennessee under Josh Heupel. He also worked as an offensive graduate assistant at UCF and Missouri.

• While in Knoxville (2021-24), Militello helped tutor quarterbacks Hendon Hooker and Joe Milton, who both went on to be NFL Draft picks in the third and sixth rounds, respectively.

• With Militello on staff, the Volunteers posted the No. 1 offense in the country in 2022.

• Militello's offense has neared 500 yards twice this season - first against Arkansas State (497 - Sept. 20) and second last week at FIU (496) - Kennesaw State's biggest offensive outputs since 2021 when it recorded 571 yards of offense against Monmouth.

• In the last four weeks, Kennesaw State has poured in five of its top 10 offensive outputs in program history against FBS opponents.

• Winning the quarterback competition in the spring and fall and starting in Game 1 against Wake Forest will be Georgia Southern transfer r-Sr. **Dexter Williams II**.

• Williams made five appearances in 2024 for Ga. Southern, but didn't crack into the starting lineup.

• He began his collegiate career at Indiana -- who, coincidentally, KSU plays the second game of the season -- where he spent two seasons rehabbing injuries (2021 and 2023) but appeared in four games and made two starts with the Hoosiers.

• In his Kennesaw State debut, Williams went 12-for-33 for 149 passing yards and rushed for 44 yards to give him 193 total yards of offense.

• With KSU playing both quarterbacks against Merrimack (Sept. 13), Williams finished 9-for-17 with an interception and a rushing touchdown.

• After losing out on the starting job, Williams returned against LA Tech (Oct. 9), where he was a sensational 27-of-36 for 290 yards and four passing touchdowns.

• He set the program record for completions (27), earning selection to Davey O'Brien's "Great 8" and the Manning Award's "Stars of the Week."

• Williams returned to the backup role against FIU (Oct. 21), but finished the final quarter-plus, but finished 2-for-2 with 79 yards and a touchdown pass - largely thanks to a busted coverage that saw Williams connect with **Christian Moss** for 70 yards and a score.

• Odom made his first appearance against No. 23/21 Indiana (Sept. 6), finishing 10-for-16 for 176 passing yards.

• Odom got his first start for the Owls against Merrimack (Sept. 13), finishing 12-for-14 with 108 yards passing and a rushing and passing touchdown.

• After a slow game against MTSU, Moss was the leading receiver against LA Tech (Oct. 9), hauling in four catches for a team-best 66 yards.

• Moss again hauled in two big passes against FIU (Oct. 21), including a 70-yard bomb from **Dexter Williams II** late in the game -- the longest of his career.

• Moss hauled in his first career touchdown reception against Liberty last season on a 41-yard slant route from **Davis Bryson** in the first quarter and finished with 56 receiving yards for the game.

• In 2024, Moss finished with 14 receptions for 203 yards and two touchdowns in nine games played.

• The wide receiver room will also be bolstered by the addition of former KSU quarterback f-Jr. **Davis Bryson**, as well as newcomers Sr. **Jordan Jackson** (West Georgia), Jr. **Lyndon Ravare** (Fresno State) and four true freshmen.

• Jackson didn't appear in a game at West Georgia, but recorded 590 receiving yards and four touchdowns at Montana Tech (2021-23).

• Ravare hauled in four receptions for 22 yards at Fresno State (2024) after recording 652 receiving yards and six touchdowns at College of the Canyons (2023).

• Ravare shined in the receiving game against No. 23/21 Indiana (Sept. 6), catching two passes for 72 yards.

• Both Jackson and Ravare hauled in their first receiving touchdowns as Owls against LA Tech (Oct. 9).

• Also showing some shines of lightning is true freshman wideout **Clayton Coppock**, who hauled in his first career touchdown against LA Tech (Oct. 9).

• In just five games played, Coppock has caught seven passes for 49 yards.

TIGHT ENDS

• As Kennesaw State continues to leave the option-based offense in the past, the Owls continue to develop the tight end position, rebuilding the room this season.

• Kennesaw State added Gr. **Gerard Bullock, Jr.** (Tennessee State) and f-Jr. **Semaj Parker** (Mississippi State) this offseason.

• Bullock hauled in his first touchdown reception at Kennesaw State against Middle Tennessee (Sept. 27), catching the 19-yard pass from Odom in the first quarter.

• Through seven games, Bullock has 10 receptions for 75 yards.

• Bullock hauled in 232 receiving yards and two touchdowns in 14 games in 2024 at Tennessee State after spending two seasons at Austin Peay (2022-23) with his first year playing at quarterback.

• Parker appeared in just one game at Mississippi State, but caught nine passes for 76 yards and a touchdown at Livingstone College (2022-23).

• Returner f-Jr. **Rowan Darnell** has 24 games at tight end for Kennesaw State, recording six receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown -- all in 2023.

• In its 120 games as a program, Kennesaw State football has only been out-rushed 20 times.

• In 62 games all-time at Fifth Third Stadium, Kennesaw State has been out-rushed only nine times.

• In Week 3, Kennesaw State sported three in the Top 10 PFF offensive line grades in Conference USA -- **Brandon Best** - 84.6, **JT Pennington** - 84.6, and **Josiah Chenault** - 83.0.

• The three combined for 103 pass blocking snaps and allowed zero pressures.

• Against Arkansas State (Sept. 20), Pennington was once again sensational, earning Conference USA Offensive Lineman of the Week honors.

• Pennington helped lead an offensive charge up front that amassed 497 yards of offense, including 189 yards on the ground.

• With his help, the Owls averaged 3.9 yards per rush and cleared the way for three KSU rushing touchdowns. The Owls also averaged a whopping 5.1 rushing yards per first down run attempt.

• In 85 snaps against Arkansas State, which was most among CUSA offensive linemen in Week 4, he graded out at 86.7 in pass block rating, according to *Pro Football Focus* -- good for sixth-best in CUSA this week.

• Pennington allowed zero sacks, QB hits, hurries or pressures in his 85 snaps of action and did not incur a penalty all game.

• Kennesaw State's offensive line as a unit recorded *Pro Football Focus*'s top OL blocking efficiency rating (94.7) in CUSA against LA Tech, allowing only four total QB hurries and four total pressures all game -- which ranked tied for 14th nationally and 7th among Group of Six teams.

• Pennington earned his second CUSA Offensive Lineman of the Week honor after his performance against LA Tech as the Owls rolled up 400 yards of offense and 110 yards of rushing (4.1 yards per carry).

• Pennington recorded Conference USA's top PFF pass blocking rating (88.0) for Week 7, playing 65 snaps on the night, including 40 in pass blocking. He recorded zero sacks, zero QB hits, hurries or pressures from his right guard position, and did not incur a penalty all game.

• After an air offensive through the first three quarters, Pennington and Co. were also able to control the line of scrimmage in the fourth quarter, draining nearly nine minutes off the clock to seal the win.

• Through the first seven games of the season, Best has been one of the best pass blocking offensive linemen in the country and best among Group of Six conference, grading out at 87.1.

• In 226 snaps on the season, Best hasn't allowed a single sack or QB hit, and has allowed just two hurries and two pressures.

- Kennesaw State's new-look defense will be under the direction of defensive coordinator and safeties coach **Marc Mattioli**.
- A veteran defensive coach, Mattioli spent the last two years as the head football coach overseas with the Paris Musketeers of the European League of Football. He also coached for a season with the Parma Panthers in Italy.
- Prior to his successful trek abroad, Mattioli coached for nine years in both the Pac-12 and the SEC, working primarily at Vanderbilt and Stanford.
- Despite traveling all over, Mattioli grew up in nearby Roswell, Ga., graduating from Roswell High School in 2005.
- Mattioli has been named a CBS Sports "Conference Coordinator of the Week" for CUSA three times in 2025, earning the honor from CBS' Matt Zenitz after Wake Forest (Aug. 29), Arkansas State (Sept. 20) and LA Tech (Oct. 9).
- Mattioli's Owls have been one of the best in the conference this season, currently ranking second in least points allowed in CUSA (21.3), despite allowing 56 points to now top-10 Indiana.

- Kennesaw State features three players - r-Sr. **Garland Benyard**, r-Jr. **Donelius Johnson** and r-Sr. **Baron Hopson** - who currently hold 100+ career tackles.

- In Kennesaw State's first look at the new defense, the Owls were the only team in FBS through Week 0+1 to record four sacks and hold a Power 4 team to 10 or fewer points.

- The 10 points allowed by Kennesaw State were:

- the fewest points allowed by a road defense against a Power 4 opponent in Week 1.

- Kennesaw State's depth will get a boost with the return of transfer r-So. **Donovan Westmoreland**, one of the top-rated transfers to ever arrive on campus at KSU, who missed all of 2024 with an injury.

- Westmoreland had his best game of the season at Merrimack (Sept. 13), making four solo tackles and recording a tackle for loss.

- As he continues to get his feet under him just 13 games into his career, being the top or tied for top defensive lineman in tackles in back-to-back games against Arkansas State (6) and Middle Tennessee (4).

- r-Sr. **Tylon Dunlap** broke onto the scene last season for Kennesaw State, finishing last season as a top 15-rated defensive grade among Conference USA interior linemen, according to *Pro Football Focus*.

- Dunlap was a force against Merrimack (Sept. 13), contributing a whopping 3.5 tackles for loss - a career-high.

- Dunlap recovered his second career fumble against Arkansas State (Sept. 20). He finished with three tackles and 0.5 sacks on the day.

- Dunlap's 7.0 tackles for loss on the season rank tied for sixth in Conference USA.

- He recovered his second fumble of the season last week against Middle Tennessee (Sept. 27).

- His two fumble recoveries leads Conference USA through seven games.

- Dunlap had perhaps his finest outing as an Owl against LA Tech (Oct. 9), when he recorded eight tackles and 2.0 sacks, earning CUSA Defensive Player of the Week honors.





**DEFENSE**

• Dunlap totaled the top overall defensive grade (90.4) in the nation among defensive tackles, according to Pro Football Focus, while also tallying the top PFF pass rush grade (90.3) in Conference USA for Week 7.

• His 90.4 defensive grade also ranked him ninth-best among all FBS defensive linemen and 17th among all FBS defenders, regardless of position.

• Some of the transfers Kennesaw State brought in this offseason include r-Jr. **Marcus Patterson** (Western Kentucky), r-Sr. **Rod Daniels** (Liberty), Jr. **Elijah Harper** (Emory & Henry), Gr. **Mike Jones** (Virginia Union) and r-Fr. **Nasir Smith** (Georgia Southern).

• Patterson shined against Merrimack (Sept. 13), recording the third-best pass rushing PFF grade in CUSA for Week 3 (65.6). He finished with four tackles and a 4-yard sack.

• Patterson forced his first fumble of the season last week against Middle Tennessee (Sept. 27), while co-leading the defensive line with four tackles.

• Another surprise this season has been the play of true freshman **Elijah Hill** (Bryant HS), who is tied for fifth in Conference USA with 2.5 sacks this season. Playing limited snaps as a freshman, he only has six tackles overall.

• His 2.5 sacks this season lead CUSA freshmen and would rank tied for sixth nationally among FBS freshmen if he met the minimum requirement for official rankings.

**LINEBACKERS**

• The backbone of Kennesaw State's defense, the linebackers have been a consistent staple for the Owls and feature multiple returners.

• Among Conference USA linebackers in 2024, Kennesaw State features two in the top 15 of *Pro Football Focus'* run defense rankings -- r-Sr. **Baron Hopson** and r-Jr. **Donellus Johnson**.

• Johnson led Kennesaw State in tackles last season with 89 overall (38 unassisted) - 23 more than the next closest Owl.

• Johnson finished 12th in 2024 in Conference USA in tackles for loss with 9.0 on the season.

• Just over his last 16 games of action, Johnson has recorded a whopping 114 tackles, 12.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks.

• Johnson has missed the first six games with an injury and is considered week-to-week.

• Also looking to continue momentum from a strong 2024 season is **Baron Hopson**, who is the second-highest returning tackler from last year despite suffering a season-ending injury in Week 6.

• He finished the season with 63 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and a sack. He also forced and recovered a fumble.

• He impressed mightily in the season opener against Wake Forest (Aug. 29), recording a game-high 11 tackles.

• In Week 0-I, Hopson was one of only 17 players nationally to record 11 tackles and at least 0.5 tackles for loss against an FBS opponent and one of only 11 players to accomplish the feat against a Power 4 opponent.

• He recorded five more against No. 23/21 Indiana (Sept. 6) to lead the team through two games with 16 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.

• His leadership continued against Merrimack (Sept. 13) when he made five tackles -- including 1.0 for loss -- to finish second on the team.

• He reached double digits again against Arkansas State (Sept. 20), recording a career-high 14 tackles in the 28-21 victory.

• Washington started all 12 games for Kennesaw State in 2024 as a redshirt freshman, earning all-freshman and all-Conference USA second-team honors.

• Washington hauled in two interceptions and forced three fumbles to go along with 43 tackles for the year.

• Washington's three forced fumbles ranked second in Conference USA in 2024.

• Washington was also named a Preseason Group of Five All-American by HERO Sports (Third Team Defense), as well named to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy watch list and a nominee for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his community service efforts.

• Washington spends his time volunteering with a community kickball event at Kennesaw State that serves youth in the area. Washington also visited multiple elementary schools as part of Read Across America, reading stories to classrooms, answering questions and relaying the importance of reading and literacy.
