



Away from the athletics forum, Brinkley spent 20-plus years hosting the "Good Times in the Morning" radio show at WCMT 101.3 FM in Martin, where he often kept local listeners informed of the latest OVC news and notes.

Brinkley currently teaches as an adjunct professor in the UT Martin department of communications as well as the department of health and human performance.

Brinkley is a highly accomplished narrator of audiobooks, author and voice actor. He has provided the voiceover work for over 500 different projects in the last five years alone.



2021-22: Enjoyed a dominant campaign, racking up All-Ohio Valley Conference first team, OVC All-Newcomer and National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 18 second team accolades... Joined two-time All-American Lester Hudson as the only players in UT Martin history to garner both All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer awards in the same season...Was the only NCAA Division I player in the nation to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game...Ranked in the top-three in the OVC in scoring (16.9 points per game, second behind OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams from Murray State), steals (1.6 per contest, third) and blocked shots (1.4 per outing, third)...Ranked second in the OVC with 1.5 blocks per game in league play...Played in all 30 contests, logging 29 starts...In addition to points (508), steals (48) and blocks (41), he also topped the Skyhawks in field goals made (198) and free throws made (70)...Averaged 4.9 rebounds and 1.8 assists per contest...Knocked down 73.2 percent (52-for-71) of his free throw attempts against conference opponents...Scored at least eight points in all 30 games, including 24 double-digit performances and a dozen outings of at least 20 points...Led the team in scoring 14 times while also pacing the squad in rebounds on seven different occasions...Registered a pair of double-doubles (19 points and a career-best 12 rebounds on Dec. 4 at Western Illinois, 17 points and 11 rebounds at Belmont on Jan. 29)...Poured in a career-high 30 points (on 13-of-22 shooting) in the home win over UNC Asheville on Dec. 14... Versatility was on full display on Feb. 5 against Tennessee State when he was one of only two NCAA Division I players to tally at least 20 points, five rebounds, four assists, four blocks, three steals and zero turnovers in a game...Shot over 50 percent on nine separate occasions, including a 7-of-9 effort (77.8 percent) in the Feb. 3 victory over Southeast Missouri... Made multiple three-pointers in 13 outings, including a career-best five trifectas (in eight tries) against No. 21 Murray State on Feb. 19... Sank at least four free throws in nine games, including a career-best nine makes in 10 attempts against SIUE on Jan. 24... Snared at least six rebounds in 12 different contests... Handed out a career-high five assists at Eastern Illinois on Feb. 12... Produced a dozen multi-block performances, including a career-high five swats at Tennessee State on Jan. 6... Was responsible for 15 multi-steal efforts, including a career-best five swipes on Dec. 11 against Middle Tennessee...Dialed up five OVC Newcomer of the Week honors, tying Hudson (2007-08) and current UT Martin teammate Parker Stewart (2019-20) for the most in school history.

BEFORE UTM: Was part of the Bethune-Cookman program in 2020-21 under Skyhawk head coach Ryan Ridder but did not play as the school opted out of all sports... Spent his first two collegiate seasons at Troy, where he played in 60 career games while making 13 starts from 2018-20 at Troy under head coaches Scott Cross and Phil Cunningham...Accumulated 245 points, 146 rebounds, 77 assists, 46 steals and 19 blocks during his Trojan tenure, averaging 15.4 minutes per contest... Played in all 31 games and cracked the starting lineup a dozen times during this sophomore campaign, averaging 4.7 points and 3.5 rebounds per outing...Scored in double figures on six different occasions, including a career-best 21 points on 9-of-12 shooting against UAB on Nov. 7, 2019...Was responsible for a pair of double-doubles, accomplishing that feat against Carver on Nov. 18 (11 points, career-high 11 rebounds) and at Georgia State (14 points, 10 rebounds) on Feb. 1...Additionally grabbed 10 rebounds while divvying out a career-best five assists against Texas A&M on Nov. 20...Swiped multiple steals in 10 different games as a sophomore...Averaged 3.4 points per game while shooting 52.7 percent (39-of-74) from the floor as a freshman...Scored a season-best 12 points twice (season-high five field goals made at Georgia Southern on Feb. 15, career-best three trifectas at Coastal Carolina on March 9)...Hauled in a season-high seven rebounds (to go along with seven points) against No. 11 Florida State on Dec. 3 and stuffed the statsheet all around against Georgia Southern on Jan. 17 (nine points on 4-of-4 shooting, four rebounds, three assists, career-best three steals, one block)...Handed out at least three assists in six different games, had five multi-steal efforts and swatted away at least two blocked shots on three separate occasions...Prepped at West Orange High School, where he averaged 18 points, seven rebounds and five assists per game as a senior for head coach Eric Jones...Helped lead the Warriors to the 2018 state Final Four, scoring a team-best 20 points against nationally ranked Oak Ridge...Additionally shattered the school's single-game record with 13 assists and also went off for 34 points in the Metro vs. Florida All-Star Game.

PERSONAL: Born on Dec. 10, 1999...Son of Lyndsay Campbell and Kevin Simon, Sr....Has four siblings, Sha, Skylar, Neenee and Kevin III...Majoring in interdisciplinary studies.







2021-22: Played in 17 contests while drawing a starting assignment twice as a nagging preseason injury caused him to miss chunks of time in midseason and at the end of the year... Averaged 4.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.0 assist while logging 15.0 minutes per game... Scored in double figures three times (all in the span of five Ohio Valley Conference games from Jan. 6 through Jan. 20)... Tallied a season-best 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting while tacking on eight rebounds in a season-high 25 minutes against Austin Peay on Jan. 20... Scored 12 points against both Tennessee State (Jan. 6) and Tennessee Tech (Jan. 15)... Began his season by making his first seven field goal attempts spread out over three games, capped off with eight points in eight minutes on Nov. 20 against Troy... Connected on a pair of trifectas against Troy (Nov. 20) and at Tennessee State (Jan. 6)... Knocked down a career-best six free throws in just seven tries while tacking on a career-best three assists in the aforementioned game against Tennessee Tech on Jan. 15... Topped the squad in rebounding four times, including a season-best 10 boards in only 17 minutes at Florida Atlantic on Nov. 19... Hauled in at least six rebounds in six of his first 10 outings... Blocked a shot in three straight OVC games from Jan. 15 through Jan. 22... Was named to the Athletic Director's Honor Roll for the spring semester.


BEFORE UTM: Played two seasons at North Florida under head coach Matthew Driscoll...Was part of a 2019-20 Atlantic Sun Conference cochampionship squad after the Ospreys went 21-12 overall and 13-3 in league play...Shot 53.8 percent (105-for-195) from the floor – including a 39.4 percent clip (13-of-33) from three-point range – while tallying 260 points and 167 rebounds over 46 games during his stay in Jacksonville, Fla....Posted averages of 8.7 points and a team-high 6.2 rebounds per contest last season...Started in 16 of his 17 games, connecting on 53.1 percent (60-for-113) of his field goal tries while knocking down 47.6 percent (10-for-21) of his attempts from three-point land...Snared a pair of double-doubles in 2020-21, posting career-highs of 18 points and 12 rebounds at High Point on Dec. 5 while tallying 18 points and 11 rebounds against Edward Waters on Dec. 21...Scored in double figures on five different occasions, equaling his career-best with 18 points against North



Alabama on Jan. 30...Also tied a career-high with 12 rebounds and swatted away a career-best two blocks at Lipscomb on Jan. 16...Career-high of three assists came at Miami (Nov. 29) and in the aforementioned contest against Edward Waters...Scored in double-digits twice during the 2019-20 campaign (season-highs of 11 points, nine rebounds, three assists and two steals in only 16 minutes against Trinity Baptist on Nov. 18 and 11 points against LIU on Nov. 28)... Equaled a season-high with nine rebounds against Florida National on Nov. 7 and had a trio of three-assist performances to go along with three multi-block efforts (against Georgia Southern on Nov. 11, at Dayton on Dec. 30, against Jacksonville on March 3)...Nearly averaged a doubledouble (9.7 points and 9.3 rebounds per game) and rejected a team-best 23 blocks on his way to All-Tennessee Community College Athletic Association first team and Defensive Player of the Year honors in his lone season at Motlow State....Playing under head coach Arthur Latham, he shot 46.4 percent (109-for-235) overall, including a 39.6 percent clip (21-of-53) from three-point land as the Bucks went 18-11 overall with a 14-4 conference mark...Corralled nine doubledoubles during the 2018-19 season, including a monster outing at Dyersburg State on Jan. 18 where he set career-highs with 19 points (on 8-of-11 shooting) and 18 rebounds...Also put together an 18-point, 12-rebound, career-best four-assist game against Cleveland State on Feb. 1 and had 18 points plus 12 rebounds the next day against Chattanooga State...Had 14 doublefigure scoring games and grabbed 10 or more rebounds on 13 different occasions as a redshirt freshman, also posting seven multi-block games and a pair of multi-steal efforts...Began his collegiate career as a pitcher on the University of Cincinnati baseball squad but redshirted in 2018 after a season-ending injury...Was a highly acclaimed two-sport star at Upperman High School...Garnered Class AA first team all-state, All-Region 4AA and District 8 Most Valuable Player honors in basketball as a senior as the Bees went 24-6 overall... Shattered the UHS career records for highest field goal percentage, rebounds and blocked shots under head coach Bobby McWilliams.




2021-22: Provided an immediate frontcourt presence, starting in 22 of his 29 games played...Ranked fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference in blocked shots (1.0 per game) and seventh in field goal percentage (.527, 89-for-169)...Averaged 7.3 points and 5.2 rebounds in 19.4 minutes per contest...Ranked second on the squad in both rebounds (151) and blocked shots (30)...Topped the Skyhawks in scoring once and paced the team in rebounds five times...Produced a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds in the victory over UNC Asheville on Dec. 14...Scored in double figures on 10 separate occasions, including career-highs of 18 points, eight field goals made (in 11 attempts) and 30 minutes played against Tennessee State on Feb. 5...Equaled a career-best with eight field goal makes (in nine tries) for 17 points in just 23 minutes against Belmont on Jan. 8...Connected on at least 60 percent of his shot attempts in a dozen different contests, including a perfect shooting effort (5-for-5, 3-of-3 from the free throw line) for 13 points in 17 minutes against Miami-Hamilton on Nov. 13...Made multiple free throws in 10 separate outings, including an unblemished 6-for-6 performance from the charity stripe in the road win at Tennessee State on Jan. 6...Snagged double-digit rebounds three times, tying a career-high with 11 boards at Drake (Dec. 19) and against Morehead State (Feb. 16)...Set a career-best with three assists against both Troy (Nov. 20) and the aforementioned Dec. 14 contest against UNC Asheville...Registered nine multi-block games, including a career-high four swats while narrowly missing a double-double (12 points, nine rebounds) against Tennessee Tech on Jan. 15...Was responsible for six multi-steal performances, including a career-best three swipes on Jan. 12 at Morehead State.



Ryan Ridder enters his second season as the University of Tennessee at Martin head men's basketball coach in 2022-23. He was announced as the 12th head coach in program history on March 30, 2021.

In Ridder's debut season as a Skyhawk, he led a team that was the first NCAA Division I squad to not return a single player from the previous season since the 2014-15 campaign. As a direct result, UT Martin produced seven of the Ohio Valley Conference's 16 Newcomer of the Week award winners - marking the second-most honorees in that category in school history (just one shy of the 2014-15 squad).

Ridder's 2021-22 Skyhawks faced a grueling schedule that shaped up to be the one of the toughest in recent memory. Eight of UT Martin's nine nonconference NCAA Division I opponents owned a .500 record or better, combining for a 175-126 mark (.581 winning percentage). Overall, the Skyhawks played in 12 games against opponents who would eventually play in the postseason.

UT Martin showed glimpses of breaking through in 2021-22, starting the OVC season with a 2-0 record for just the third time in school history (first time since 2002-03). The Skyhawks won their first two conference road games for the first time in the school's Division I Era (since 1992). UT Martin defeated eventual College Basketball Insider participant UNC Asheville by double figures and led for 25:43 of clock time against a nationally ranked Murray State squad that ended the season boasting the best winning percentage (.912, 31-3 record) in the NCAA Division I ranks before eventually falling by a narrow 62-60 margin on Feb. 19.

Ridder coached dynamic junior guard KJ Simon (who was a part of his Bethune-Cookman squad but sat out the previous season) in his debut season as the Skyhawks' bench leader. Simon racked up All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer honors, joining two-time All-American Lester Hudson as the only players in school history to win both of those awards in the same season. Simon also chalked up National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 18 second team accolades as he was the only NCAA Division I player in the country to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game.

Off the court, UT Martin earned the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award in 2021-22. The Skyhawks were the only current OVC institution to earn the honor as UT Martin posted a cumulative 3.22 Grade Point Average for the year.

Ridder joined the Skyhawks after four successful seasons as head coach at Bethune-Cookman University, a NCAA Division I member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. During his tenure in Daytona Beach, Fla., Ridder set numerous school records, posted a .646 winning percentage in league play and won the 2017-18 MEAC regular season championship. He was spotlighted by ESPN to its top "40 Under 40" list of the nation's head and assistant coaches in May 2020.

A Lexington, Ky. native, Ridder owns a 151-95 record as a collegiate head coach, which also includes four seasons at Daytona State College. He boasted the most wins (48) in the first three years in Bethune-Cookman history before the school opted out of all sports for the 2020-21 campaign. From 2017-20, Ridder's Wildcat squads posted a winning MEAC record for three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history, going 31-17 during that span.

Ridder's first season as a Division I head coach was historical as he helped guide Bethune-Cookman to just the second MEAC regular season championship in its 38-year



history. For his efforts, he was named the Joe B. Hall Award winner, defeating candidates from schools such as Miami, Louisville, Oklahoma State and Washington for the honor that recognizes the top first-year head coach in the Division I ranks.

Overall, Ridder tutored five All-MEAC players, one MEAC Player of the Year, two MEAC Defensive Players of the Year and one MEAC All-Rookie team member at Bethune-Cookman. He led the Wildcats to their first-ever win over a Conference USA opponent (FAU) and increased the school's NCAA RPI rating by over 60 points while in charge of the program.

Ridder, 37, began his head coaching career in 2013-14 at Daytona State College – accumulating a 95-28 overall record at the NJCAA level. He brought home Mid-Florida Conference championships in each of his four seasons after inheriting a program that went 6-25 during the previous season.

The Falcons were consistently ranked regionally and nationally under Ridder as he earned four consecutive conference Coach of the Year accolades. He mentored 25 all-conference performers, 16 players who advanced to play at four-year institutions and two NJCAA All-Americans while boasting a 96 percent graduation rate amongst his student-athletes.

Ridder got his start at the Division I level with three seasons as an assistant working under head coach Robbie Laing at Campbell University, located in Buies Creek, NC. He was an integral part of a Fighting Camels staff that signed the highest ranked recruiting class (64th nationally) in the ASUN Conference in 2013-14.

By the time Ridder departed to accept his first head coaching gig, Campbell was tabbed as the Big South Conference preseason favorite and had defeated Power 5 opponents such as Iowa and Auburn. The Fighting Camels got off to their best start in school history in 2011-12 and produced the Big South Freshman of the Year.

Ridder's first collegiate job came at Embry-Riddle University, where he was a volunteer assistant under his father Steve Ridder in 2009-10. The Eagles collected a 30-6 overall record and continued its tradition as a national college basketball powerhouse at the NAIA Division II level. Steve is still the head coach at Embry-Riddle and has tallied 740 career victories to go along with a .707 winning percentage (ninth-best amongst active head collegiate coaches with at least 600 career wins).

Ridder began his collegiate playing career at the College of Wooster in 2003-05 before finishing up under his father at Embry-Riddle. After graduating with a degree in aerospace studies in 2008, he moved to North Carolina to embark on a coaching career. He was an assistant at North Raleigh Christian, trained youth players while working for the Hoop City U basketball training academy and additionally was the head coach for numerous teams engaged in international competition with 365 Sports for the 2008-09 academic year. He earned his Master's degree in sport management with a concentration in intercollegiate athletic administration from California University of Pennsylvania in 2009.

Ridder and his wife, the former Jen Calnan of Daytona Beach, Fla., have two daughters - Brixton and Remi.







Denver Cobb is in his second season as an assistant coach on the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball staff in 2022-23. Cobb is no stranger to Skyhawk head coach Ryan Ridder as the two were college teammates at Embry-Riddle and served on the same staff for three years at Bethune-Cookman before coming to UT Martin.

Last season, the Skyhawks combined for seven Ohio Valley Conference Newcomer of the Week honorees - accounting for nearly half of the league's yearly total. The seven winners were the second-most in that category in UT Martin history, trailing only the eight honorees from 2014-15.

With a roster that did not return a single player from the previous season (marking the first NCAA Division I program to accomplish that feat since 2014), the Skyhawks faced a tough slate in 2021-22. UT Martin played a dozen contests against eventual postseason participants as eight of the Skyhawks' nine nonconference opponents posted a record of .500 or better.

KJ Simon, who was a part of the Bethune-Cookman squad under Ridder and Cobb but sat out because of NCAA transfer rules, shined in his first season at UT Martin. The junior guard collected All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer accolades, joining two-time All-American Lester Hudson as the only players in Skyhawk history to sweep those honors in the same season. Simon was the only NCAA Division I player in the nation to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game, also achieving National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 18 second team recognition.

During the offseason, UT Martin was the only current OVC program to win the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award for the 2021-22 campaign. The Skyhawks posted a 3.22 Grade Point Average for the year.

While at Bethune-Cookman as an assistant and defensive coordinator from 2018-21, Cobb helped the Wildcats to 31 wins and back-to-back winning seasons in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference before the school opted out of the 2020-21 campaign. His squad in 2019-20 ranked third nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense while his 2018-19 team was No. 14 in the country in defensive points per possession. Cobb coached four separate All-MEAC performers at Bethune-Cookman, a list that includes two-time MEAC Defensive Player of the Year Cletrell Pope.



Cobb was the assistant director of player development and assistant defensive coordinator at Texas Tech University in 2017-18, working under head coach Chris Beard. The Red Raiders went 27-10 and made an appearance in the Elite 8 during Cobb's stop in Lubbock, finishing with a No. 6 national ranking for the best season in program history. Texas Tech won a school-record nine games against top-25 ranked squads behind a stifling defense that KenPom ranked as the third-best in NCAA Division I basketball. Beard captured Big 12 Conference Co-Coach of the Year honors as the Red Raiders touted second team All-American Keenan Evans, first round NBA Draft pick Zhaire Smith and current Minnesota Timberwolves swingman Jarrett Culver (the sixth overall pick in the 2019 NBA Draft).

From 2015-17, Cobb served as an assistant coach and assistant to the athletic director at Rocky Mountain College in Billings, Mont. He aided the Battlin' Bears to 36 victories over two seasons as his squad ranked in the top-15 in the national NAIA ranks in free throw percentage, three-point field goal percentage, three-point field goals made and total rebounding. He coached three honorable mention All-Americans, two different Frontier Conference Defensive Players of the Year and eight all-conference selections at Rocky Mountain College.

Cobb additionally spent three seasons as an assistant at Bethany College in Lindsborg, Kan., serving the 2014-15 campaign as the associate head coach. The Swedes shattered numerous school records while dialing up 39 wins in Cobb's last two seasons. He oversaw second team All-American Idris Ibn Idris (who signed a professional contract after he was the second-leading scorer in the nation at 27.4 points per outing) as part of seven all-conference performers, including a Newcomer of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year.

Hailing from Daytona Beach, Fla., Cobb got his Division I start at the University of South Florida as a graduate assistant in 2011-12. The Bulls went 22-14 that season, finishing with their best Big East record in school history (12-6). USF equaled its most single-season victories in program history and not only reached its first NCAA Tournament since 1992 but won a pair of games against California and Temple. Cobb worked under Big East Coach of the Year Stan Heath as the Bulls set a conference record with 56.6 points allowed per contest.

Cobb's first collegiate coaching job came at his alma mater, Embry-Riddle. As an assistant coach alongside Steve Ridder – UT Martin head coach Ryan Ridder's father – Cobb helped pace the Eagles to a 29-5 overall record, winning the conference regular season and tournament championships. Embry-Riddle topped the country in field goal percentage defense (.375), aided by second team All-American David Butler (a two-time conference Defensive Player of the Year) and another first team all-conference recipient.

After a two-time all-conference playing career, Cobb graduated from Embry-Riddle with a bachelor's degree in aerospace studies in 2009. He then earned his Master's degree in physical education from South Florida in 2012.





Erik Buggs is in his second season as an assistant coach on the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball staff in 2022-23. He was also promoted to the program's recruiting coordinator in June 2022.

In Buggs' first season, the Skyhawks did not return a single player from the previous season - marking the first time an NCAA Division I squad could say that since 2014-15. UT Martin wasted no time showcasing its talent as the program combined to win seven of the 16 Ohio Valley Conference Newcomer of the Week awards.

The Skyhawks were matched up against a tough 2021-22 schedule as eight of their nine nonconference NCAA Division I opponents combined for a 175-126 record (.581 winning percentage). UT Martin wound up playing 12 games against opposition who played in the 2022 postseason.

Buggs coached playmaking guard KJ Simon, who established himself as an OVC Player of the Year candidate in 2021-22. The junior was crowned to the All-OVC first team as well as earning a spot on the OVC All-Newcomer squad, becoming the first Skyhawk since two-time All-American Lester Hudson to accomplish that feat. Simon was the only NCAA Division I player in the country to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per contest and was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 18 second team in the process.

In the classroom, UT Martin was the only current OVC program to receive the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award last season. The Skyhawks managed a cumulative 3.22 Grade Point Average.

Buggs has been a member of championship squads as a collegiate student-athlete and as a coach at the high school level. In 2020-21, he was the associate head coach under two-time NBA champion Mike Miller at Houston High School in Germantown, Tenn. The Mustangs ranked as high as No. 8 in the national prep polls on their way to a 26-3 record and state, sectional, regional and district championships. As the lead assistant at Houston, Buggs handled player development of multiple collegiate prospects while also overseeing academics and college recruitment.



Before his stint at HHS, Buggs also spent time in his hometown of Memphis, Tenn. as the head coach at both Kingsbury High School (2018-20) and Memphis Catholic High School (2016-18).

Beginning in 2016, Buggs served as the head coach and recruitment coordinator for Hoop City Basketball Club, an adidas Gauntlet organization based out of Memphis. He established direct relationships with NCAA, NAIA and junior college coaches and successfully placed players at every level of collegiate basketball – most of which went on to enter the NBA Draft pool and sign professional contracts overseas.

Buggs carved out a remarkable collegiate career on the hardwood, as he is the all-time leader in games played (138) while ranking fourth in assists (425) and sixth in steals (157) at Valparaiso University. Playing under head coaches Homer Drew (2008-11) and Bryce Drew (2011-13), Buggs was a part of 95 wins, a pair of Horizon League regular season championships, one Horizon League tournament title and three postseason appearances (2013 NCAA Tournament, 2012 National Invitation Tournament, 2011 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament).

Starting in 122 games during his career, Buggs shined in the biggest moments. He was named Horizon League Tournament Most Valuable Player after scoring a career-high 22 points (on 9-of-13 shooting) with four steals in the championship victory over Wright State. He followed that with 14 points (on 7-of-11 shooting) and a career-best five steals against Michigan State in the first round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament. That same season, he was also named to the Horizon League All-Defensive Team after swiping 55 steals (ranking in the top-10 for a single season in Valparaiso history).

Buggs followed his collegiate days with a professional playing career, spending time in Switzerland and Chile from 2013-16. He helped guide the Club Deportes Universidad Catolica squad to a playoff berth during his tenure in Santiago, Chile.

In high school, Buggs captured all-state honors and was a McDonald's All-American nominee as a senior at Mitchell High School, helping lead the Tigers to a berth in the state championship game with a 30-5 record. He was a four-time All-Region 16 AA and All-District 16 honoree, garnering Region MVP status as a junior while spending his first three seasons at White Station High School.

Buggs is married to the former Destiny Corbin from Chicago, Ill. and the couple has four children - Kyleigh, Elias, Egypt and Emery. He earned his bachelor's degree in sports management from Valparaiso in 2013 before obtaining his Master's degree in education from Memphis in 2020.





Reed Ridder joined the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball coaching staff as an assistant in June 2022.


The younger brother of Skyhawk head coach Ryan Ridder, Reed comes to UT Martin from Daytona State College in Daytona Beach, Fla., where he was an assistant last season for head coach Joey Cantens. Reed also spent time as a director of player development and recruiting at Georgia Southern (2020-21) under head coach Brian Burg after serving as a graduate assistant on head coach Tom Crean's staff at Georgia from 2018-20.

Last season at Daytona State, Ridder was instrumental in the development of a trio of NJCAA All-Central Conference honorees. Reggie Quezada tallied first team accolades while Johan Crafoord and Ky Stattmann each collected second team honors for the Falcons, who ranked third in the country in three-point field goals per game (10.2).

During his lone year at Georgia Southern, Ridder helped the squad to a 13-13 season in the first year of a rebuilding process. After the Eagles returned just two scholarship players from the previous season (the fourth least amount in NCAA Division I), Georgia Southern led the Sun Belt Conference with 15.8 forced turnovers per contest.

At Georgia, Ridder worked closely with a pair of eventual NBA Draft picks in Anthony Edwards (No. 1 overall

pick in 2020) and Nicolas Claxton (No. 31 overall pick in 2019). Edwards was crowned as Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year before the Minnesota Timberwolves made him the first Bulldog to become the top pick in the NBA Draft.




Division II universities. He spent his freshman season at Lynn University in Boca Raton, Fla. before transferring to play his final three years for his father Steve Ridder at Embry-Riddle University in Daytona Beach, Fla.

During his junior campaign, Reed helped the Eagles to a 35-2 overall record, a championship in The Sun Conference and a Final Four appearance in the NAIA national tournament. He averaged a career-best 13.0 points per game as a senior as the school transitioned into the NCAA Division II ranks, capping off his Eagle career with averages of 10.0 points, 2.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 1.2 steals over 94 games played. In just three seasons, he ranked eighth in program history with 181 three-pointers made - converting 37.6 percent of his career attempts from beyond the arc.

Ridder played professionally for two seasons following his collegiate career, competing in Spain (2017-18) and Australia (2016-17).

Coaching runs in the Ridder family as Reed's father Steve is still the head coach at Embry-Riddle. Steve has tallied 740 career victories and a .707 winning percentage, which ranks ninth amongst acrive head collegiate coaches with at least 600 career wins. Reed's brother Ryan has compiled a 151-95 career record and a .614 winning percentage over nine seasons - the last five coming at the NCAA Division I level.

An Ormond Beach, Fla. native, Ridder graduated from Embry-Riddle with a degree in business administration in 2016. He later earned his Master's degree in sports administration from Georgia in 2020.





SUPPORT STAFF



Dantiel Daniels is in his second season on the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball staff. He spent the 2021-22 campaign as the program's director of basketball operations before moving into the role of special assistant to the head coach in 2022-23.

Last season, the Skyhawks faced a daunting schedule that included 12 teams who eventually participated in the postseason. UT Martin was the first NCAA Division I team since 2014 to not return a single player from the previous season, which led to seven Ohio Valley Conference Newcomer of the Week selections (one shy of the program's all-time record).

In the classroom, the Skyhawks combined for a 3.22 Grade Point Average in 2021-22 and were the only current OVC institution to earn the National Association of Basketball Coaches Team Academic Excellence Award.

Daniels came to UT Martin from Lincoln Trail College, located in Robinson, Ill. He spent the 2020-21 season as an assistant coach for the Statesmen. Prior to that, he was a graduate assistant at his alma mater Colorado State University.

Daniels worked under head coach Luke Stuckey at Lincoln Trail, who produced a pair of All-Great Rivers Athletic Conference and All-Region XXIV guards. Dante Combs (12.4 points per game) and Lamar Lillard (10.8 points, team-best 7.0 rebounds per contest) each picked up postseason accolades for the Statesman this past season.

Daniels began his coaching career at Colorado State alongside head coach Larry Eustachy. He worked closely with the frontcourt players, which included All-Mountain West Conference honoree Nico Carvacho, who averaged 9.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game for the Rams.

A Wentzville, Mo. native, Daniels began his playing career at Southern Illinois University. Playing for head coaches Chris Lowery and Barry Hinson, Daniels captured Missouri Valley Conference All-Freshman honors in 2011-12 after leading the league in blocked shots (1.6 per contest), ranking second in school history for a rookie. He averaged 8.3 points and 4.9 rebounds per game while ranking sixth in the MVC with a .567 field goal percentage. He followed that with an injury-riddled 2012-13 campaign where he averaged 7.7 points and 3.2 rebounds per contest while converting 60.9 percent of his field goal tries (second-best mark in the MVC).

Daniels played his final two seasons under Eustachy in Fort Collins, Colo., ending his career ranking second on Colorado State's all-time field goal percentage list (.622). He started in all 66 games he played as a Ram, averaging 7.6 points and 6.3 rebounds in 24.4 minutes per contest. His debut season in 2014-15 was a historical one as Colorado State went 27-7 overall with a 13-5 league mark, owning the Mountain West's best winning percentage on its way to a National Invitation Tournament berth. The following season, Daniels hauled in five double-doubles and topped the MWC in offensive rebounding with 3.6 boards per outing.

Daniels parlayed that into a professional career as he made stops in Finland, Uruguay and China from 2016-19.

The first Division I signee in Holt High School history, Daniels later earned his bachelor's degree in liberal arts with a minor in media studies from Colorado State in 2016. He followed that with a Master's degree in adult education and training from Colorado State in 2018.



Deonte Johnson is in his third season with the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball program and seventh season overall counting his tenure as an undergraduate. He was promoted to director of player development in June 2022.

Johnson spent last season as a graduate assistant during Ryan Ridder's first year at the helm. He had previously served as a player development coach under interim head coach Montez Robinson and additionally served as head manager as an undergraduate for parts of four seasons under former head coaches Heath Schroyer and the late Anthony Stewart.

During his Skyhawk tenure, Johnson has been an integral part of staffs who have made three postseason appearances and won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference divisional championships. He aided individual skill workouts and helped in the development of UT Martin's four All-OVC first teamers, six All-OVC second team honorees and six All-OVC Newcomers since 2015. That list partially includes current Skyhawk guards KJ Simon (who became the first UT Martin representative to sweep All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer honors since two-time All-American Lester Hudson in 2007-08) and Parker Stewart (All-OVC second team and OVC All-Newcomer in 2019-20).

A Kansas City, Mo. native, Johnson graduated from UT Martin with a degree in interdisciplinary studies in 2018. He obtained his Master's degree from UT Martin in 2022.



SUPPORT STAFF



Austin Nisbett is in his first season as the University of Tennessee at Martin director of basketball operations in 2022-23.

An Ormond Beach, Fla. native, Nisbett came to the Skyhawks after spending the past four seasons with a pair of NCAA Division I basketball programs. He was a graduate assistant for the Columbia University men's squad last year and was an assistant video coordinator for the Duke University women's team from 2018-21.

During the 2021-22 season, Nisbett worked under head coach Jim Engles at Columbia, an Ivy League institution located in New York, NY. Nisbett assisted coaches and full-time support staff members with administrative duties, team travel, practice preparation, on-court operations and player development. He also acted as video coordinator, breaking down film and developing statistical databases of personnel to assist the Lion coaching staff with scouting, roster management and construction of developmental plans.

At Duke, Nisbett was a part of an Atlantic Coast Conference powerhouse program under head coaches Joanne P. McCallie (2018-20) and Kara Lawson (2020-21). He coded team and player film for video breakdown and statistical analysis while assisting the Blue Devil coaching staff produce scouting reports. He also assisted coaches with player development and acted as a scout team player.

Outside of the collegiate realm, Nisbett was a video assistant for the USA 3x3 women's national team in the spring of 2021. In that role, he assisted Lawson and the coaching staff with team video operations during their spring training camp sessions.

Nisbett graduated from Duke in 2021 with a bachelor's degree in political science. He is pursuing a Master's degree in sport management after completing his first year of the graduate program at Columbia.



Alston Jones is in his first season as a graduate assistant on the University of Tennessee at Martin staff in 2022-23.

Jones joined the Skyhawks after an accomplished collegiate playing career on the hardwood. He saw playing time in 113 games from 2015-19, earning all-conference accolades in three different seasons. Overall, the point guard tallied 1,188 points and 475 assists over his career while his teams piled up 82 victories, a .631 winning percentage and a trio of conference championships.

A Kansas City, Mo. native, Jones began his playing career at Daytona State College under current Skyhawk head coach Ryan Ridder. He helped lead the Falcons to a combined 50-14 record and a pair of Mid-Florida Conference titles. As a freshman, he was an all-conference second team performer after shooting a career-best 50.8 percent from the floor. The following season, he was an All-Mid-Florida Conference first team selection, averaging a career-highs of 14.1 points and 5.5 assists per contest. He poured in a career-best 35 points (on 15-of-26 shooting) at Palm Beach State College on Nov. 22, 2016 and distributed a career-high 15 assists against Trinity Valley three days later.

Jones then transferred to the Division I level, where he was a part of NC Central's run to the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18. He sank a career-best 84 percent of his free throw tries while playing in 23 games under head coach Levelle Moton, guiding the Eagles to four dramatic wins over the course of five days at the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference tournament.

Jones wrapped up his collegiate career under head coach Steve Ridder (Ryan's father) at Embry-Riddle. He garnered Sunshine State Conference All-Newcomer accolades while averaging 13.7 points and a team-high 4.3 assists per outing. He scored at least 20 points on seven different occasions and handed out 13 assists against Rollins on Jan. 30, 2019 – the third-best single-game performance in school history.

Following his playing days, Jones spent two years working in the corporate field before pursuing his Master's degree from UT Martin. He graduated from Embry-Riddle with a degree in interdisciplinary studies in 2020 and has one son, Kruz.





SEASON PREVIEW

Ryan Ridder's phone has been buzzing a lot lately. He sees the notifications and reads the chatter. It's hard not to.

The second-year University of Tennessee at Martin head men's basketball coach is aware of the preseason predictions that many pundits have laid out for his program in 2022-23. Two prominent national publications - Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook and The Almanac - have proclaimed the Skyhawks as the Ohio Valley Conference favorites. A little over two weeks ago, it was announced that UT Martin tied for the most first-place votes and were selected third in the league's official preseason poll, conducted by head coaches and communication directors.

"There are people who say 'we have blinders on'," Ridder says with a laugh. "Well if you open up a newspaper



or check your phone, you see where people are picking you. To our guys, I don't know if they know where we got picked in any poll. I don't think they really care. They come in knowing that we weren't very good last year from a won-loss standpoint and we have to earn our keep every single day. Our guys just come in and work – we're 0-0. They know what they want to get accomplished. Our expectations for our program are the same – we try to get better every day."

The Skyhawks showed promise in Ridder's debut season, garnering loads of individual success while enduring some close calls before ultimately ending the year with an 8-22 overall record. Their 4-14 mark in league play left the squad one game outside of the OVC Tournament picture.

An outsider's view of the situation would simply chalk up last year to the start of a rebuilding process, especially for a team that was the only NCAA Division I team to not return a single player from the previous season. But last year's finish left a lasting hunger in the nine returners, a trait that has seeped into the work ethic of the five newcomers since the start of the summer.

"We've seen a group that is willing to learn and understand that this thing is a process – they know success can't happen overnight," Ridder said. "We're taking it day-by-day. Obviously, we get excited as games approach but everybody has come in willing to learn and wanting to sacrifice for each other. Our staff loves to coach these guys – we've upgraded our talent and they're trying to figure out how to utilize it and enhance each other's games."

On paper, the projected strength

of UT Martin's 2022-23 squad is undoubtedly the backcourt. Preseason OVC Player of the Year **KJ Simon** (the only NCAA Division I player to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game last year) and **Koby Jeffries** (the lone Skyhawk to start in all 30 games last season) each logged heavy minutes a year ago. The newcomer trio of **Parker Stewart** (982), **Desmond Williams** (641) and **Jordan Sears** (493) have combined for over 2,100 career points over eight NCAA Division I seasons.

"I think the way you win now is with great guards," Ridder said. "That was kind of the focus for us this year was to get better and older in the backcourt. We have the opportunity to spread the floor and make some plays for each other a little better than we did last year in our offensive scheme. Defensively, we should be able to put pressure on teams with our perimeter defense – we can turn guys over so we can run in transition. I do think we have a collective toughness to us no matter who we play, even if we're a little smaller."

Simon is primed for a big season after earning All-OVC first team accolades in 2021-22. The 6-3 do-it-all guard went off for at least 20 points in a dozen games last season.

"The first thing you notice with KJ is how much he works," Ridder said. "He is obsessed with basketball and he stays in that gym – he's committed to getting better. He can put up stats all over the board but this year he's really locked into how can he help us impact winning? It can look different on a variety of nights because he's so capable of playing all over the floor."



SEASON PREVIEW



Joining Simon on the Preseason All-OVC squad is Stewart, who returns to the Skyhawk program after a season at Indiana – pacing the Hoosiers in three-pointers (53) and three-point field goal percentage (.393) on the way to a NCAA Tournament berth. In 2019-20, the 6-5, 205-pound sharpshooter was an All-OVC selection after topping the league in three-point field goals made (2.8 per contest) and ranking third in scoring at 19.2 points per game.

"Parker is a great character human being," Ridder said. "We're not just bringing in a really good basketball player, we're bringing in a grown man who provides some maturity to our group. The guys love him and his ability to come in and connect with his teammates has been seamless."

Jeffries led UT Martin in assists (89) last season while ranking sixth in the OVC with 1.4 steals per game. Williams started 60 of his 84 career games

at Troy, scoring in double figures 24 times over three seasons. Sears tossed in 8.6 points per game over his 57-game career at Gardner-Webb, reaching double digits in the scoring column on 21 separate occasions.

Grant Hurst (23 games played as a true freshman in 2021-22) will likely redshirt this season while **Dylan Pumpian** (walk-on who played in three contests last season) complete the Skyhawk backcourt.

UT Martin's frontcourt includes a pair of returning starters in KK Curry (9.7 points, 4.9 rebounds per game) and Chris Nix (7.3 points, 5.2 rebounds per outing). Curry scored in double figures 15 times last season and showed a knack for getting to the charity stripe – leading the squad in both free throws made and free throws attempted. Nix ranked in the top-10 in the OVC in blocks (1.0 per game, fourth) and field goal percentage (.527, seventh) while dialing up 10 double-digit scoring games.

Senior returner **Josh Endicott** was a starter at one point last season before a nagging injury caused him to miss chunks of time. The 6-9, 205-pound lefty led the Skyhawks in rebounding four times in his 17 games played and provided four games of 10 or more points.

Sophomores **Josiah Morris** (23 games played) and **David Kamwanga** (16 games played) were both playing regular minutes by the end of last season and will look for expanded roles as the youngest members of the UT Martin frontcourt.

A pair of newcomers will vie for major minutes at forward in **Jalen Myers** and **Rifen Miguel**. A 6-8, 195-pound southpaw who played his freshman season at Division I Texas A&M Corpus Christi, Myers averaged 19.0 points per game while ranking in the top-five nationally in rebounding (11.4 per game) and free throw percentage (.890) at Hinds Community College last season, securing conference Most Valuable Player accolades. Miguel shot 53.2 percent (41-for-77) last season at Troy after helping Ohio win a Mid-American Conference championship and make an NCAA Tournament appearance during the 2020-21 campaign.

A loaded roster full of talent has led to a noticeable competitive spirit during the team's preseason practices, which officially started on Sept. 26.

"You want that competitive fire," Ridder said. "When you have guys that are fighting for playing time, every drill and everything we do is critical. I tell people this all the time – we don't have starters. We have eight starters in my opinion. We're looking for closers – who are those guys that can really help us win down the stretch."

A new-look OVC is on the horizon as three programs have departed and the league welcomes in a trio of new schools. The race to the OVC Championship event in Evansville, Ind. promises to be a wild journey as exactly half of the 10 teams picked up first-place votes in the league's official predicted order of finish.


"The OVC is clearly as good a league as I've ever been in," Ridder said. "Gameplanning in this league is very unique – we have a lot of great coaches. I think 1 through 10, nobody will be surprised at how it shakes out. We're fired up to compete and have a chance to be playing our best basketball in March."



PRESEASON NOTES

The highly anticipated 2022-23 University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball campaign began on Sept. 26 when the Skyhawks held their first official practice, 42 days ahead of the season opener at Pitt. UT Martin enters this season with championship aspirations as the Skyhawks have been tabbed as the preseason favorites in the Ohio Valley Conference by Blue Ribbon and The Almanac. UT Martin returns nine players and four starters from last season while welcoming five newcomers who each boast Division I playing experience.

KJ Simon returns for his senior campaign as the reigning All-OVC first teamer was the only Division I player in the nation to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game. Parker Stewart, who achieved All-OVC status after averaging 19.2 points per game as a Skyhawk in 2019-20, returns to campus after logging 31 starts at Indiana last season. That dynamic backcourt duo has received national attention from three college basketball preseason publications (Blue Ribbon, The Almanac, Lindy's Sports). That pair joins returning starters KK Curry (9.7 points and 4.9 rebounds per contest), Koby Jeffries (6.3 points, team-best 3.0 assists per outing) and Chris Nix (7.3 points and 5.2 rebounds per game, team-high .527 field goal percentage) in 2022-23.



Celebrating its 75th anniversary in 2022-23, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

This year the conference welcomes three new member institutions with the additions of Lindenwood, Little Rock and Southern Indiana to the 10-member league. The OVC has had just 24 full-time members in its 75-year history.

Beth DeBauche, who was named one of nine voting members of the new NCAA Board of Governors in June 2022, was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud history dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles "Turkey" Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged February 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime in the national semifinals. WKU went on to finish in third place

after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In 1990 as a No. 16 seed, Murray State took No. 1 seed Michigan State into overtime before falling 75-71.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the 2009 Opening Round game at University of Dayton Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346 and included many MSU fans who made the three-hour drive from Morehead for the game.

In 2007-08, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson became the first men's Division I player to record a quadruple-double in a game, when he registered 25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a victory over Central Baptist College. Hudson, who ranked fourth in scoring nationally as a junior, returned for his senior season in 2008-09 and was second nationally in scoring (behind Davidson's Stephen Curry) at 27.5 points a contest. Hudson earned numerous honors (including OVC Player of the Year and OVC Male Athlete of the Year in each 2008 and 2009 and All-American status from several outlets) before being drafted by the Boston Celtics with the No. 58 pick of the 2009 NBA Draft.

In 2009-10, Murray State made OVC history by winning a record 31 games (31-5) on its way to the league's regular season and tournament championships. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the No. 13 seed Racers topped Vanderbilt in thrilling fashion when senior Danero Thomas hit a jumper as time expired to lift MSU to a 66-65 victory. It marked the first OVC team to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament since 1989 and snapped a skid of 71-straight loses to Southeastern Conference foes (dating back to 2000-01). In the second round, the Racers pushed eventual national runner-up Butler to the brink before losing 54-52.

In 2010-11 Morehead State would make if three NCAA Tournament wins in as many years for the league and got a bit of revenge for the 2009 tournament loss to Louisville in the process. After finishing second in the regular season and winning the OVC Tournament Championship, the No. 13 seeded Eagles were shipped to Denver to play the in-state foe Cardinals. MSU jumped out to a 15-2 advantage but were down four points (61-57) with just over a minute to play in regulation. After two free throws from two-time OVC Player of the Year Kenneth Faried, the Eagles held for one final shot attempt and senior Demonte Harper pulled up off a cross-over dribble to nail a 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds left that gave Morehead State a 62-61 lead. UofL had one last attempt but Faried blocked the Cardinals last shot, giving MSU the win, its first over Louisville since the 1956-57 season.

In 2011-12 Murray State put together one of the greatest seasons in OVC history, beginning the year 23-0 (an all-time OVC best) and being ranked as high as No. 7 in the coaches poll on Feb. 6. The squad was the first OVC team to be nationally-ranked since Murray State was ranked in 1997-98; in addition, the top 10 ranking was the first for an OVC team since the 1970-71 campaign (WKU). The Racers would top nationally-ranked Memphis and Saint Mary's during the season and win the league's regular season and tournament championships. MSU earned a No. 6 seed in NCAA Tournament, the highest-ever seed for an OVC team since the NCAA began seeding the field in 1979. The Racers would top Colorado State 58-41 in the second round before falling to Marquette in the third round. Murray State would win 31 games overall, tying the OVC all-time record the Racers set in 2009-10.

After the Murray State win in 2011-12, the league had won NCAA Tournament games in four-straight seasons, something that had never happened in league history (three-game winning streaks from 1960-62 and 1987-89 had been the previous best streaks). Over that time period (2009-12) the OVC was one of just nine conferences nationally to win a NCAA Tournament game in each season and one of only three non-BCS leagues (joining the Atlantic 10 and WCC) to do so.

In 2013-14 Murray State won five games to claim the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) and in the process became the first OVC men's basketball team to ever play games in the month of April.

The 2014-15 season saw five OVC men's basketball teams earn postseason bids, the most in league history, and a year later (2015-16) that number was eclipsed with six teams making national postseason tournaments.

For just the second time in league history (the other being 1987), the OVC placed two teams in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, as Murray State won the OVC Tournament crown for the second-straight season and Belmont earned an at-large bid after going 26-5 overall

(16-2 OVC) with a NET ranking of 47. As a No. 11 seed, Belmont would top Temple in the Opening Round in Dayton (its first-ever NCAA Tournament victory) before narrowly falling to Maryland in the next round, while No. 12 seed Murray State crushed Marquette 83-64 in the first round (the second-biggest margin of victory ever by a 12 seed over a No. 5 seed in tournament history) before losing to Florida State. It marked the first time since 1971 that the OVC had two wins in the same NCAA Tournament and marked the first time two different OVC teams won a tournament game in the same year.

In 2021-22, Murray State capped the year with an 18-0 OVC had two wins in the same heart of the Same heart in OVC history. The 18 wins also tied the OVC record, for Conference wins in a season. They would go on to win two games and capture the OVC Championship, making them the only team in OVC history to go undefeated during the regular season and win the tournament crown in the same year. The Racers earned a No. 7 seed in the NCAA Tournament and topped San Francisco in the first round; MSU finished the year ranked No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 22 in the Coaches Poll.

Murray State guard Ja Morant put together arguably the greatest season in League history in 2018-19, earning first-team consensus All-American honors (only the third player in OVC history to achieve that feat joining WKU's Clem Haskins in 1967 and WKU's Jim McDaniels in 1971) while becoming the first player since the NCAA began officially tracking assists (1983-84) to average 20-plus points (24.5) and 10-plus assists (10.0) in the same season. Morant, who won the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard, finished the year with 331 assists, the sixth-most in NCAA single-season history. During the year he had three triple-doubles (including just the ninth in NCAA Tournament history) and became the first Division I player in 20 years to record 40 points, 11 assists and five steals in a regulation game.

Morant was picked No. 2 overall by the Memphis Grizzlies in the 2019 NBA Draft, equaling the highest-ever draft pick in OVC history (tied with Eastern Kentucky's Jim Baechtold who went No. 2 in 1952). Overall he was just the third NBA Lottery Pick (which began in 1985) in OVC history. Belmont senior Dylan Windler was selected by the Cleveland Cavaliers No. 26 overall in the 2019 NBA Draft, giving the OVC two First Round picks in the same draft for only the second time in history (Western Kentucky's Tom Marshall and Jack Turner were selected with the seventh and eighth picks of the First Round in 1954). Overall Morant and Windler were the 10th and 11th players in OVC history to be First Round NBA Draft Picks.

Morant was named the 2019-20 NBA Rookie of the Year after averaging 17.8 points, 7.3 assists, 3.9 rebounds and 0.9 steals per game in 67 contests. He hit 47.7 percent from the field and 77.6 percent at the free throw line in leading the Grizzlies to more wins and a ninth place finish in the Western Conference (after the team finished 12th the previous year). Dating back to 1983-84, he is one of just three players to attend a non-Power 5 college to win the award, joining Damian Lilliard of Weber State (2012-13) and Larry Johnson of UNLV (1991-92).

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, including Pat Spurgin from Murray State, who won the first-ever Olympic gold medal awarded in women's air rifle at the Olympic Games Los Angeles 1984, Murray State's Morgan Hicks, who was a member of the 2004 United States Olympic Rifle Team and Morehead State's Brian Shimer who competed in five Winter Olympics in bobsled (winning a bronze medal in 2002) and coached the 2010 United States bobsled team to its first gold medal since 1948. Former Morehead State football and Eastern Kentucky track and field athlete Dallas Robinson competed with the U.S. bobsled team during the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. In addition, some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as football's Phil Simms (Morehead State) and Tony Romo (Eastern Illinois), basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and Kenneth Faried (Morehead State) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) - who is the only athlete to ever play in the NCAA Basketball Championship, a Major League Baseball World Series (New York Yankees) and an NBA Championship Series (Los Angeles Lakers). Present-day OVC alumni standouts like basketball players Ja Morant (Murray State), Robert Covington (Tennessee State), Cameron Payne (Murray State) and Chelsey Perry (UT Martin), football player Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois), baseball player Alec Mills (UT Martin), who threw a no-hitter for the Chicago Cubs in 2020 and golfer Danny Willett (Jacksonville State), who won the 2016 Masters Tournament.

The OVC sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track, volleyball and beach volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

SEASON RECAP

Year 1 of the Ryan Ridder Era brought along several positives as the University of Tennessee at Martin men's basketball squad showed glimpses of breaking through despite facing perhaps the toughest schedule in school history during the 2021-22 campaign.

The Skyhawks were the first NCAA Division I program to not return a single player from the previous season since 2014-15 but did not let that faze them.

In the Nov. 9 season opener at then-No. 17 Tennessee, UT Martin more than held its own in a 90-62 setback. The Skyhawks (44.8 percent) outshot the host Volunteers (42.9 percent) and led for 8:28 of clock time during the first half. UT Martin was within single digits with 14:30 to go in a contest that had five ties and 11 lead changes against a Tennessee squad who would eventually claim the Southeastern Conference tournament championship and a No. 5 final ranking in the Associated Press poll.

In that game against the Volunteers, KK Curry tallied 15 points and 11 rebounds - becoming only the third Skyhawk in two decades to snare a

double-double in a season opener. For his efforts, he was awarded with the first OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the 2021-22 season.

Four days later, Ridder earned his first victory as UT Martin head coach as the Skyhawks clipped Miami-Hamilton by a 94-66 margin in the home opener.

UT Martin then traveled to the Paradise Classic in Boca Raton, Fla., playing three games in three days against stout competition. The Skyhawks competed throughout in setbacks to Florida Atlantic (75-67) and Troy (80-67) before ending the event with a 77-72 triumph over North Dakota. UT Martin shot 60 percent (9-of-15) from three-point range in the win, marking the program's best performance from downtown since Jan. 13, 2016 - a span of 173 games.

KJ Simon was voted as OVC Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 22, marking just the sixth time in school history (first since Feb. 16-23, 2015) that the program produced two different winners of that award in back-to-back weeks.

The Skyhawks evened their record to 3-3 after a 103-43 dismantling of Carver College on Nov. 24. UT Martin shot 52.6 percent (40-for-76), securing the program's largest margin of victory since Jan. 2, 2016 - a stretch of 177 contests.

Three straight road contests followed as the Skyhawks fell to Western Kentucky (81-66 despite a season-best 13 trifectas), Middle Tennessee (73-61) and Western Illinois (81-64). UT Martin returned home to host Middle Tennessee for the second time in 10 days but fell to the Blue Raiders by an 84-75 margin on Dec. 11.

The Skyhawks picked up their most impressive victory of the season on Dec. 14, defeating a UNC Asheville squad who would eventually win a postseason contest by a convincing 79-68 margin in the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 reared its ugly head for the first time in mid-December as UT Martin had to rearrange its schedule. The Dec. 18 road outing at Evansville was cancelled a mere 18 hours before the scheduled tipoff. The Skyhawks then added a

road game at Drake less than 24 hours before gametime. Right as that game was tipping off, it was announced that UT Martin's regularly scheduled Dec. 21 outing at then-No. 13 Ohio State was cancelled. That was a slight sign of things to come as the Skyhawks had four schedule alterations (two cancellations, one addition, one postponement) due to COVID-19 protocols during the 2021-22 season.

On Dec. 20, Simon collected his second OVC Newcomer of the Week honor, aided by a career-high 30 points on 13-of-22 shooting in the victory over UNC Asheville.

OVC play opened on Dec. 30 and UT Martin quickly emerged as one of the hottest teams in the league. The Skyhawks downed Austin Peay by a score of 65-62 on Dec. 30, which was their first true road win of the season. Exactly one week later, UT Martin's offense went wild in front of a national audience on ESPNews. The Skyhawks shot a blistering 54.5 percent from threepoint range (12-of-22), committed only five turnovers and led for 38:41 of clock time in a 94-78 drubbing of Tennessee State on the road. The 94 points were the program's most in an OVC contest since Jan. 13, 2016 while it was the first time that UT Martin turned the ball over five times or less against a league opponent since Dec. 30, 2017.

The Skyhawks began their OVC schedule with a 2-0 record for just the third time in school history (also accomplishing that feat during the 2002-03 and 1997-98 campaigns). The Tennessee State win also marked the first time in UT Martin's Division I Era (since 1992) that the program won its first two conference road games. In fact, the Skyhawks were the only OVC team during the first week-and-a-half of the season to win a road game in league play (earning two in that span).

However, UT Martin could not sustain its momentum as the Skyhawks would drop their next five games falling to Belmont (81-55), Morehead State (76-62), Tennessee Tech (76-70, despite leading for 33 minutes of clock time), Austin Peay (72-57) and Murray State (74-66).

In the Jan. 12 outing at Morehead

State, Koby Jeffries swiped six steals - the most by any UT Martin player against a NCAA Division I opponent since Nov. 12, 2017 (a span of 130 games).

Simon was rewarded for his fine play with his third OVC Newcomer of the Week accolade on Jan. 3. One week later, Bernie Andre nabbed the same award, giving the program three different winners of that honor for just the second time in Skyhawk history (also occurring in 2014-15).

UT Martin got back in the win column on Jan. 24 in a rescheduled home contest against SIUE, winning 76-70. The Skyhawks were clutch from the free throw line, knocking down a remarkable 29 of their 31 attempts for a 93.5 percent clip. The 29 makes were the most against a Division I opponent since Jan. 24, 2011 - a span of 342 games.

A 58-53 home loss to Eastern Illinois and 87-58 road setback to Belmont followed, closing out the month of January.

On Jan. 31, Simon was spotlighted as OVC Newcomer of the Week for the fourth time.

A two-game homestand started on a high note as UT Martin was dominant in an 84-63 win over Southeast Missouri on Feb. 3. Two days later, the Skyhawks set a school record with 12 blocked shots against Tennessee State but ultimately fell by a 69-61 margin.

History was made on Feb. 7 as Simon dialed up his fifth OVC Newcomer of the Week accolade of the season. That tied him with two-time All-American Lester Hudson (2007-08) and Parker Stewart (2019-20) for the most such awards in school history. The announcement also gave UT Martin its seventh combined OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the season, which trailed only the 2014-15 Skyhawk squad (eight) for the most ever OVC Newcomer of the Week selections in a single season.

Next up was the annual road swing through the Land of Lincoln as UT Martin fell 71-63 to SIUE and 82-70 to Eastern Illinois.

The Skyhawks held their final homestand of the season on Feb. 16-19 against a pair of league heavyweights. UT Martin held a lead for over 33 minutes of court time but fell 68-60 to defending OVC Tournament champion Morehead State before one of its most inspired efforts of the season three days later. Against a Murray State squad that was ranked No. 21 nationally, the Skyhawks left it all on the floor during Senior Day. UT Martin led by six points at the halftime break, held a five-point advantage with three minutes to go and led by one until the eventual OVC champion Racers converted an oldfashioned three-point play with 10 seconds remaining for the 62-60 win. The Skyhawks led for 25:43 of clock time during the contest, which featured Andre scoring his 1,000th career point in the final home game of his collegiate playing days.

The final two games of the season followed as UT Martin narrowly fell 76-69 at Southeast Missouri. Minutes before tipoff of the season finale at Tennessee Tech, the Skyhawks were officially eliminated from the OVC Tournament field. UT Martin then fell 88-75 to conclude the season with an 8-22 overall record and 4-14 mark in against league opponents.

Ridder's 2021-22 Skyhawks faced

a grueling schedule which included 12 games against opponents who would

eventually participate in the postseason. Eight of UT Martin's nine nonconference NCAA Division I opponents owned a .500 record or better, combining for a 175-126 mark (.581 winning percentage). That number doesn't even include the aforementioned Ohio State game that was cancelled or the two games against league foe Murray State, who won a game in the NCAA Tournament and ended the season with the best winning percentage (.912, 31-3 record) in the nation.

Simon racked up All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer honors, joining Hudson as the only players in school history to win both of those awards in the same season. Simon also chalked up National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 18 second team accolades as he was the only NCAA Division I player in the country to average at least 16.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.4 blocks per game. He ranked second in the OVC in scoring at 16.9 points per outing (trailing only league Player of the Year KJ Williams from Murray State) while also ranking second in the league in steals (1.6 per game) and third in blocked shots (1.4 per contest).

After missing the first five games of the season because of an injury suffered during the offseason, Andre developed into a legit threat for OVC opposition. He was responsible for six doubledoubles - all in league play - over the final dozen games of the season. He became the first Skyhawk to corral three double-doubles in a row (Jan. 22 at Murray State, Jan. 24 against SIUE, Jan. 27 against Eastern Illinois) since Javier Martinez in 2016-17. His career fittingly ended with a season-best 25-point effort (on 11-of-18 shooting) and 11 rebounds at Tennessee Tech. Andre swished 88.7 percent of his free throw tries (55-of-62) to lead the OVC in that category.

Off the court, UT Martin earned the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award for their cumulative 3.22 Grade Point Average. The Skyhawks were the only current OVC institution to receive that award. UT Martin graduate guard Darius Simmons was also named to the NABC Honors Court for his perfect 4.0 GPA

UT MARTIN PUTS UP A FIGHT BUT FALLS 90-62 IN SEASON OPENER AT NO. 17 TENNESSEE

UT Martin matched the No. 17 ranked team in the nation blow-for-blow in the first 25-plus minutes but a strong second half by the Tennessee Volunteers led to a 90-62 Skyhawk setback at Thompson-Boling Arena.

UT Martin led for 8:28 of clock time during the first half and was within single digits with 14:30 to go in a contest that featured five ties and 11 lead changes. The Skyhawks (44.8 percent) outshot Tennessee (42.9 percent) for the game but the Volunteers made 17 three-pointers on the way to the win.

KK Curry pieced together an outstanding debut for UT Martin, securing a double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds. The Cleveland, Tenn. native made seven of his 12 field goal tries, becoming the first Skyhawk to earn a double-double in his UT Martin debut since Terrence Parker (12 points, 10 rebounds at Marshall on Nov. 10, 2017).

Also reaching double figures in the scoring column for the Skyhawks was KJ Simon (14 points, six rebounds, three steals, two blocks) and David Didenko (11 points, 3-of-5 from three-point land).

Tennessee was led by 20 points apiece out of Kennedy Chandler and Santiago Vescovi. Olivier Nkamhoua tallied a double-double (11 points, 14 rebounds) while Justin Powell chipped in 13 points off the bench for the Volunteers.


Four UT Martin players eclipsed double figures in the scoring column as the Skyhawks soared to their first victory of the Ryan Ridder Era, 94-66 over Miami-Hamilton.

KK Curry had his second bigtime performance in as many tries during the early stages of the 2021-22 campaign, piling up 22 points (on 8-of-13 shooting), nine rebounds, three assists and three blocks in 26 minutes. He joined KJ Simon (20 points, six rebounds, three steals), Darius Simmons (19 points, four rebounds, four assists) and Chris Nix (13 points on 5-of-5 shooting, seven rebounds, two blocks) in double-digit scoring as UT Martin improved to 27-3 in home openers since joining the Division I ranks in 1992.

Mikel Henderson (nine points), Koby Jeffries (nine assists against zero turnovers) and Josh Endicott (eight rebounds in 15 minutes) also heavily contributed to the Skyhawk success as UT Martin won the rebounding battle (54-30) and outscored the Harriers by a 42-14 margin in the paint.

UT MARTIN SCORCHES THE NETS FOR 77-72 VICTORY OVER NORTH DAKOTA IN PARADISE CLASSIC FINALE

A remarkably efficient offense out of UT Martin set the tone for an impressive nonconference victory as the Skyhawks generated a 77-72 triumph over North Dakota.

Playing its third game in three days at the Paradise Classic event, UT Martin showed no signs of tired legs as it knocked down 54.7 percent (29-for-53) of its field goal attempts. That included a sizzling 60 percent (9-of-15) clip from beyond the three-point arc. That marks the best performance from downtown for the Skyhawks since shooting 64 percent (16-of-25) against Tennessee Tech on Jan. 13, 2016 – a span of 173 games.

The duo of KK Curry and KJ Simon helped UT Martin to its first road win of the season. Curry dialed up a career-best 24 points while nabbing a game-high nine rebounds. Simon collected 21 points on 9-of-13 shooting and swatted away a pair of blocks.

Mikel Henderson (nine points on three 3-pointers) and Koby Jeffries (3-of-3 shooting, game-high seven assists) also performed well.

SKYHAWKS BREEZE PAST CARVER COLLEGE IN 103-43 HOME VICTORY

Eleven different UT Martin players scored as the Skyhawks dialed up a 103-43 win over Carver College at the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center.

Of those 11, UT Martin placed six scorers in double figures for the first time since Nov. 21, 2018 against Western Illinois. Accomplishing that feat today for the Skyhawks was Darius Simmons (18 points on 6-of-8 shooting, including four 3-pointers), KJ Simon (16 points, eight rebounds), KK Curry (16 points on 7-for-7 shooting, six rebounds, four assists, three blocks), Bernie Andre (13 points in his season debut), Josiah Morris (career-best 12 points) and Chris Nix (10 points on 5-of-6 shooting).

David Didenko added team-highs of nine rebounds and five assists for UT Martin, who improves to 3-3 on the season after shooting 52.6 percent (40-of-76) with a season-best 12 three-pointers and 30 assists. Mikel Henderson (five assists), Koby Jeffries (four assists, six rebounds) and Grant Hurst (five points, four rebounds, four assists, two steals) additionally performed well for the Skyhawks, who claimed their largest margin of victory since a 122-60 win over Boyce College on Jan. 2, 2016.

Playing its eighth consecutive exhibition against a NCAA Division I opponent, Carver College was led by 13 points out of Antwon Ferrell. The Cougars shot 26.7 percent from the floor (16-of-60) while making 16.7 percent (3-for-18) of their three-point attempts.

SIMMONS STAYS HOT BUT SKYHAWKS DROP 73-61 DECISION AT MIDDLE TENNESSEE



Ushering in the m e n ' s basketball

era at UT Martin was James C. Henson.

Henson, a former standout football player and track performer at Mississippi State, served in numerous capacities during his early years at UT Martin. He coached football and basketball, headed the Department of Physical Education, served as director of athletics and taught a chemistry class. Colleagues and students both remember his philosophy of life, good humor and amicable manner.

manner.
In 1952, the UT Martin athletics department opened a new branch of the department that catered to only women's athletics, thanks in large part to Henson's funding.

Henson also was at the helm of some of the most successful programs in school history - the men's tennis program. Henson won four Volunteer State Athletic Conference titles in the 1970's. After coaching the team for three decades, Henson retired in 1980.

Henson's presence is still very much around the UT Martin campus, as the Henson House overlooks the team's varsity tennis courts and serves as an office for the head coach as well as a dressing room, a player locker room, media room equipped with surround sound, a stringing room with three stringing machines, a full kitchen and a team meeting room.

All in all, Henson served

All in all, Henson served as athletics director from 1947-71, and head coach of the football (1947-56), men's basketball (1947-52) and men's tennis (1952-80) squads.

In 1984, Henson was the ninth member inducted into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame.

The longest tenured coach in

UT Martin history, Floyd Burdette was at the helm when UT Martin competed in the Volunteer State Athletic Conference.

Burdette, who played basketball at UT Martin in the mid-1930's, returned home to head the men's basketball program in 1952. A native of Martin, Burdette had served for seven years as the head basketball coach at the University of Alabama prior to his appointment at Martin.

Burdette won the most games of any coach in UT Martin history (197), and posted a .500 record or better in nine of his 11 seasons in the VSAC. As the team prepared to exit the VSAC and enter the Mid-South Conference in 1970, Burdette's team stormed to three successive victories and the conference

championship
Burdette also was part of
a major change in UT Martin
athletics history in 1969,
as he recruited Leonard
Hamilton, who was the first
African-American to suit up
for a UT Martin athletics
program.

Burdette was a charter member into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame in 1983.

A s the UT Martin program

program entered the Gulf South Conference, Bob Paynter was appointed to run the men's basketball program, as well as direct the athletics department in 1971.

Prior to becoming head coach and director of athletics, Paynter had been serving as an administrative assistant to UT Martin Chancellor Archie R. Dykes. A native of Richmond, Ky., he received his bachelors degree from St. Mary's College in Minnesota, his master's degree from Eastern Kentucky University, and a doctorate in education from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. His coaching experience included a 14-year stint as head coach at the University High School of East Tennessee State University.

Paynter compiled three seasons with a .500 or better record, but could never reach that mark in GSC competition. Paynter did, however, coach eight different players to All-GSC honors. Paynter was responsible for Fred Sanders, Jim Martin and Larry Carter earning All-GSC first team accolades in his tenure, as well as guiding Jack Bendure, Marcus McLemore, Vic Quinn, Joe Biddie and Don Hubbard to All-GSC second team mentions in

his tenure. In fact, Paynter was the man responsible for recruiting Hubbard, who ended his four-year UT Martin career as the school's all-time leading scorer, reaching 1,124 points.

Leading the UT Martin

program to its first-ever 20-win season and NCAA Division II Tournament appearance was head coach Art Tolis.

Tolis, who had served as an assistant coach at Louisiana State University for six years, was highly respected as a coach and a recruiter prior to his appointment at UT Martin by Chancellor Charles E. Smith and athletics director Ray Mears.

director Ray Mears.

In Tolis' first season at the helm, he led UT Martin to five Gulf South Conference wins, which was the total of combined GSC wins the team had accumulated in the previous two seasons. Don Hubbard earned All-GSC second team honors in 1900 e1.

1980-81 The team took off in Tolis' second season, setting a program record for single-season overall wins (20) and GSC victories (nine). The team earned one of the program's biggest wins at the time, a 65-41 drubbing of Mississippi State in Starkville on Dec. 12, 1981. In the season's 11 losses, only one loss was more than eight points, including an amazing seven losses by five points or less. Three of the team's losses came to GSC rival Livingston by a combined eight points, including the GSC Tournament championship game. Even with the loss, the team advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament, defeating Central Missouri before falling to future OVC member Southeast

Missouri by a 56-53 score.
Tolis' second season
also produced another
school record, as the team
landed two first-team AllGSC selections in Larry
Brooks and Darrell Smith.

Leading one of the most

successful stretches in UT Martin basketball history was Glen Ellyn, Ill. native Tom Hancock.

Hancock had spent one season as an assistant coach at UT Martin before being promoted to head coach after the resignation of Art Tolis concluding the

1981-82 season.

Hancock's first year was a season of many firsts for UT Martin, as the team broke or tied 19 school records en route to a program-best 21 win season, its first Gulf South Conference championship, and second consecutive NCAA Division II South Central Regional Tournament.

Picked seventh out of eight teams in the preseason poll in 1982-83, Hancock earned GSC Coach of the Year Honors and 6-7 junior center Jerry Davis was named GSC Player of the Year - both of which were the first time UT Martin was represented in those GSC categories. The Pacers went 17-1 at home and ranked No. 4 in the NCAA in defense, as Davis, Gus Rudolph and Mitch Stentiford were all named to the GSC's first team.

Hancock would go on to post two more 20-win seasons and win one more GSC championship in the 1987-88 season. Overall, Hancock's teams shattered more than 40 records in his tenure, as he averaged 19 wins per season (second-most in school history).

Perhaps the most influential

c o a c h in UT Martin history was Cal Luther. Tabbed by UT Martin athletics director Don McLeary to guide the UT Martin program through the NCAA Division-I re-classification process, Luther had more than 30 years of coaching

experience.

After rebuilding DePauw (Ind.) to an Indiana Collegiate Conference championship, Luther moved on to Ohio Valley Conference member Murray State, where he was credited for laying the foundation for the program's success. At Murray State, Luther led the

Murray State, Luther led the Racers to three OVC titles, was named OVC Coach of the Year three times, and earned a spot in the school's athletics Hall of Fame after leading the team to two NCAA Tournaments. From Murray State, Luther went to Longwood in Virginia, where he led a former all-girls school to a transition from Division-III

transition from Division-III to Division-III, earning five winning seasons and a 20-7 record in 1988-89.

At UT Martin, Luther guided the team into the Ohio Valley Conference and made the change from the Pacers nickname to Skyhawks. While the team scheduled the toughest scheduled the toughest opponents for most of Luther's tenure to keep up with Division-I budget restraints, Luther still found success - earning OVC Coach of the Year in 1996

after his program earned its first OVC winning season. Luther was inducted into the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame as a pioneer in

UT The Martin Skyhawks earned its

first-ever postseason berth as a Division-I member under the guidance of Bret Campbell. An assistant coach at OVC member Austin Peay before his arrival in Martin, Campbell gave the Skyhawks its first-ever winning season since joining the Division-I ranks in just his third season in charge.
Six of the 14 UT Martin

all-time 1,000 point scorers played Campbell, in under Campbell, including standout guard Lester Hudson. In Campbell's last two seasons as coach, the Skyhawks were led by Hudson, who quickly became one of the most dynamic players in the NCAA after tallying the NCAA's first-ever quadruple double (25 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals) against Central Baptist in his third career game.

Under Campbell, Skyhawks hosted its first OVC Tournament game and won its first two OVC Tournament games.The best season by far in Carra by far in Campbell's tenure was 2008-09, when the Skyhawks secured its first-ever regular-season outright OVC championship. The Skyhawks posted its first 20-win season since 1987-88, and made an appearance in the National Invitation Tournament, where it hung tough with Auburn before falling 87-82. For his efforts, Campbell received OVC Coach of the Year honors.

as an assistant coach at UT Martin, including the role of associate head coach during the 2008-09 OVC championship season, Jason James was named the program's eighth head coach. A native of St. Louis, Mo., he was the nation's second-youngest NCAA Division-I men's basketball head coach at the time of his hiring.
A bit of history occured

in December of James' debut season, as the Skyhawks earned back-to-back OVC Player of the Week accolades for just the

second time ever.

In Year Two of the James Era, the team tripled its win output from the previous season. Senior Benzor Simmons became the Benzor program's 15th member of the 1,000 point club, while a trio of freshmen combined to win eight adidas OVC Freshman of the Week awards, the most awards recorded by one school since the league began handing out the award in

1978-79. 19 2011-12, **Tames** coached OVC Freshman of the Year Myles Taylor, who was also a member of the OVC's All-Newcomer team.

The following season, James led UT Martin back to the OVC Tournament, downing league heavyweights Eastern Kentucky (25-10 record) and winning at OVC West champion Murray State (21-10) for the first time in

(21-10) for the first time in program history.

In 2013-14, James oversaw three players who joined UT Martin's exclusive 1,000 career point club in Mike Liabo, Myles Taylor and Terence Smith.

Leading IJ Martin to anunprecedented era success is Heath Schroyer.

Walkersville, Md. The native directed the Skyhawks back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 1981-83. Schrover's 41 wins are tied for the most in a twoyear span in school history.

In 2015-16, Schroyer led UT Martin to its firstever OVC West division championship and first OVC Tournament championship game in program history. The Skyhawks advanced to the postseason for the second straight year, winning their first round game in the 2016 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Schroyer was at the forefront of one of the most successful seasons in school history in his debut season, as the Skyhawks finished one win shy (21) of the school record. UT Martin's 13-win increase from the previous season was tied for the fourthbest improvement in the nation as the Skyhawks led all of Division-I with 12 road wins, which is a school record.

UT Martin notched the first three postseason victories in the program's Division-I history, advancing all the way to the Final Four of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. Out of 345 Division-I members, the Skyhawks were one of the final 14 teams alive in the hunt for a national postseason title.

Schroyer was named the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Men's Basketball Coach of the Year in 2014-15. He was also one of 16 finalists for the 2015 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award.

Tying a s c h o o l record for most

single-season victories in his first year was Anthony Stewart, who was elevated to head coach on April 21, 2016 after

coach on April 21, 2016 after serving as associate head coach under Heath Schroyer. UT Martin's 22 wins in 2016-17 equaled the school record for most single-season victories, as the Skyhawks won their first-ever outright OVC West division championship and advanced to the OVC championship Tournament

game for the second consecutive year.

After his debut season, stewart was selected as one of 21 finalists for the 2017 Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, given annually to the nation's top Division-I minority head coach. His 22 wins were the third-highest total of the 29 first-year head coaches in Division-I basketball that season.

UT Martin's 14 home wins in 2016-17 were the most in the school's Division-I Era (since 1992) and were the most for the program since 1987-88. The Skyhawks' 10 nonconference wins were tied for the most in program history and were the most since 1986-87.

In his second season at the in his second season at the helm, UT Martin produced four different players who collected an OVC weekly accolade, which tied the 2008-09 OVC championship squad for the second-most OVC weekly award winners in for the secon weekly award school history. award winners in

In 2018-19, Stewart helped guide the Skyhawks to another OVC Championship

tournament win.

The 2019-20 season saw Quintin Dove and Parker Stewart both earn All-OVC nods, marking just the fourth time in school history where UT Martin landed players on both of the league's first and

second teams.

Stewart tragically passed away at the age of 50 on Nov. 15, 2020 - less than two weeks before UT Martin was set to start the 2020-21 campaign.

Montez Robinson was appointed

as interim head coach on Nov. 17, 2020 - two days after the sudden passing of Anthony Stewart

Anthony Stewart.

The 2020-21 UT Martin squad swept the season series against Ohio Valley Conference rival Southeast Missouri for the first time since the 2008-09 season, swept OVC foe Eastern Illinois for the first time since 2014-15, defeated OVC preseason favorite Austin Peay and beat Evansville for just the second time in school history (was previously 1-11 against the Purple Aces).

Purple Aces).

The Skyhawks began the season 3-0 for the first time since the 1989-90 campaign, three years before UT Martin joined the NCAA Division I ranks. The Skyhawks were one of the final 33 Division I teams to stay unbeaten (not suffering their first setback until Dec. 20) and were a perfect 6-0 in games decided by single digits - five of which came in OVC play.

Robinson, who was

Robinson, who was originally hired as an assistant coach, came to the Skyhawks after a successful five-year stint as head coach at Alcorn State University. The Fairfield, Ala. native compiled a .556 winning percentage in league games with the Braves.

Robinson's best season occurred in 2016-17, when he guided the Braves to the SWAC Tournament championship game. He became the first Alcorn State representative to win SWAC Coach of the Year accolades since 2002. He was a two-time finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award (following the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons) and was also a finalist for the 2016 Joe B. Hall National Coach of the Year Award.

Ryan Ridder w a s tabbed as

the program's 12th head coach on March 30, 2021.

In Ridder's debut season as a Skyhawk, he led a team that was the first NCAA Division I squad to not return a single player from the previous season since the 2014-15 campaign. As a direct result, UT Martin produced seven of the Ohio Valley Conference's 16 Newcomer of the Week award winners - marking the second-most honorees in that category in school history (just one shy of the 2014-15 squad).

In 2021-22, the Skyhawks started the OVC season with a 2-0 record for just the third time in school history (first time since 2002-03). The Skyhawks won their first two conference road games for the first time in the school's NCAA Division I Era (since 1992).

UT Martin faced a grueling schedule that included 12 games against opponents who went on to play in the postseason.

Ridder joined Skyhawks after eight highly successful seasons as a head coach at Bethune-Cookman University (2017-21) and Daytona State College (2013-17). The Lexington, Ky. native was named the 2018 Joe B. Hall Award winner for the nation's top first-year Division I head coach. In his head coaching career, he has tallied five conference championships, won a conference Coach of the Year accolade on five separate occasions, coached two All-Americans and mentored 31 all-conference honorees. He was spotlighted by ESPN to its top "40 Under 40" list of the nation's head and assistant coaches in May 2020.








STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

Olympic sport student-athletes train in the recently updated Fieldhouse weight room and adjacent multi-purpose room known as "the blue room" The 3,500 square foot weight room's renovation is highlighted by the Ecore Beast flooring that includes five inlay platforms highlighting UTM. In addition, updates included new Hammer Strength equipment, Eleiko barbells and a nutrition area to help support each Skyhawk athlete's development. Continued upgrades are ongoing to provide UT Martin student-athletes the best possible environment to compete for championships and develop positive habits to live a healthy active lifestyle.

Left: Lester Hudson ('09) became the first Skyhawk in history to be selected in the NBA Draft when he was drafted by the Boston Celtics in 2009. A twotime OVC Male Athlete of the Year. he led the UT Martin men's basketball team to its first-ever OVC regular season championship in 2008-09. The only player in NCAA Division-I history to accumulate a quadruple-double, he has suited up for the NBA's Boston Celtics (2009-10), Memphis Grizzlies (2009-10, 2011-12), Washington Wizards (2010-11), Cleveland Cavaliers (2011-12) and Los Angeles Clippers (2014-15) since graduating from UT Martin. He has since become one of the most popular players in the Chinese Basketball Association, winning a pair of Most Valuable Player awards.



Above: Heather Butler ('14) became the first player in UT Martin and Ohio Valley Conference history to play in the WNBA after signing with the San Antonio Stars. She left the Skyhawks as the program and conference's all-time leading scorer with 2,865 career points, ranking 16th in NCAA history. Her 392 career 3-pointers tied the NCAA all-time record while scoring double figures in all 129 games of her career, ranking as the second longest streak in history.

Below: Hunter Richardson ('18) is the only Skyhawk to earn All-OVC golf honors in all four seasons. He garnered OVC Player of the Year accolades in both 2017 and 2018, becoming just the eighth golfer to ever repeat as OVC Player of the Year. In July 2019, Richardson made his PGA Tour debut at the Barbasol Championship, held in Lexington, Ky., becoming the first-ever UT Martin golfer to play in a PGA Tour event.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



KURT McGUFFIN BOXTH YEAR • KANSAS STATE, 1999

Kurt McGuffin was officially named the 15th University of Tennessee at Martin's director of intercollegiate athletics on May 22, 2017. The 2022-23 academic year is his sixth season at the helm of Skyhawk Athletics.

During his UT Martin tenure, McGuffin has overseen multiple Ohio Valley Conference championship programs while implementing significant facility upgrades across the board. Last season marked the first time in school history that four different athletic programs won OVC championships (soccer, football, golf, beach volleyball), leading to the Skyhawks' highest finish in the history of the OVC Commissioner's Cup. Academically, UT Martin Athletics shattered a school record with 191 OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll recipients in 2019-20, 28 OVC Medal of Honor winners in 2021-22 and set a new departmental record for Grade Point Average during five consecutive semesters, culminating in a 3.33 in Spring 2022. Skyhawk Athletics has also been at the forefront of community service, as representatives from over 10 teams were in the middle of cleanup efforts during the aftermath of the tornado that touched down in nearby Dresden in December 2021.

McGuffin has nearly 25 years of experience in the collegiate athletics forum, including six years as athletics director at Missouri Western State University, an NCAA Division II school located in St. Joseph, Mo. Before leading the Griffon

athletics department in 2011, he also spent time as an assistant athletics director for development at the University of Colorado (2010-11), as a senior associate athletic director for external operations at Kansas State University (2000-10) and as an assistant director of athletics for development at the University of Idaho-Moscow (1999-2000).

In his time at Missouri Western, McGuffin achieved the highest student-athlete grade point average in the history of the school while also setting an all-time high for graduation rate and community service hours. He significantly increased revenue generation to annual and endowment giving by 30 percent and he launched a capital campaign that produced five of the top 10 gifts in university history, finishing off \$13 million in building enhancements in the spring of 2016. In addition, he successfully added six additional sports to bring the total to 16 while collaborating to initiate a Master's program in Sport Business Management – which added 20 graduate assistants to his staff.

McGuffin oversaw six Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association championship squads in his tenure at Missouri Western. That includes the Griffon football program winning its first ever outright MIAA championship in 2012, a year where they also made the deepest postseason run in school history into the Division II quarterfinals. The Missouri Western baseball team claimed its first-ever MIAA title in 2013, the women's basketball team won the MIAA regular season in 2015-16 while the Griffon softball program racked up three conference championships (2014 tournament, 2016 regular season, 2016 tournament) in McGuffin's tenure. During the 2016-17 academic year, the Missouri Western baseball team qualified for the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back seasons (2016-17) for the first time in program history while the Griffon softball program made it to their fourth straight NCAA Regional. The women's golf program also saw freshman Chong Yong advance to the NCAA Championships, becoming the first individual in school history to accomplish that feat.

McGuffin also sustained previous successful programs and experienced growth in resources across the board at Missouri Western. He hired head coaches to lead the Griffon volleyball program to its highest win total since the mid-1990's and earning the most MIAA victories in program history in 2014. The Missouri Western tennis squad also took a new direction under McGuffin, resulting in its first winning season in more than a decade in 2014-15. The Griffon soccer program has also shattered over 20 school records while making its first ever postseason appearance in 2014 while the women's golf program advanced to its first ever NCAA Championship berth in 2016. As a direct result, McGuffin led the Missouri Western charge into the top-100 in the Learfield Cup standings, elevating the program from its 287 ranking when he took over.

Facility improvements were also paramount in McGuffin's success at Missouri Western. He raised nearly \$8 million for a total renovation of Spratt Memorial Stadium while also helping construct a state-of-the-art women's soccer locker room and the Zack and Mary Workman Academic Success Center in 2014.

The upgrades to Spratt Memorial Stadium were instrumental in Missouri Western remaining as the summer home of the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs since 2010. McGuffin led the charge in 2014 as the Chiefs and Missouri Western announced an extension for St. Joseph as the sole training location through the 2017 season.

At Colorado, McGuffin created and implemented a new annual giving program which increased total giving by 15 percent. He added over 600 new members in the first year by establishing fundraising goals, implementing a new donor database, revamping the process of daily donations and planning special events. He also assisted with fundraising and development of a brand new \$12 million sport court practice facility while taking part in a \$1.5 billion university capital campaign.

In addition to his title as senior associate athletic director for external operations at Kansas State, McGuffin also served as the associate athletic director for development, the assistant athletic director for annual giving and the assistant director of athletic development in his decade in Manhattan. He completed over \$25 million in facility enhancements while also leading a \$90 million "Changing Lives Campaign." He also increased annual giving by 50 percent and endowments by over 70 percent.

McGuffin was the sport administrator for the Wildcat men's basketball, men's and women's golf and the men's and women's cross country/track and field programs. He led the development and implementation of a department-wide strategic plan while overseeing all external units (including development, ticketing, marketing and communication) responsible for a revenue of over \$28 million and budgets of \$12 million.



McGuffin led marketing campaigns that resulted in the largest football seasonopening crowd in Kansas State history while also heading a sales group that sold out men's basketball games in three out of four seasons. In his tenure, the Wildcat women's basketball and volleyball programs were each in the top-10 nationally in attendance.

Before his first full-time role in athletics administration at Idaho-Moscow, McGuffin also was a graduate assistant for fundraising at Wichita State University, the director of men's basketball operations at Eastern Washington University and the head men's basketball student assistant at Kansas State.

McGuffin is a proud member of the National Association of College Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the National Association of Development Directors (NADD). He has also spent time on the NCAA Division II Men's Golf Ranking Committee, the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Committee and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee. In addition to currently serving on the NCAA Division I Softball Committee, he is also serving on the NACDA Football Championship Subdivision Athletic Directors Association Executive Committee. During the 2020-21 academic year, he was Chair of the OVC Council of Directors of Athletics.

An Iola, Kan. native, McGuffin graduated from Kansas State with a bachelor of science degree in education in 1996. He obtained his Master of Science degree in education from Wichita State in 1999. He is married to the former Jessica Whisler of Goodland, Kan. and the couple has three children – Bryce, Brett and Brea.
