## SCOUTING UT MARTIN

UT Martin enters the game 6-1 overall and 3-0 in Big South-OVC play. The Skyhawks average 246.4 rushing yards per game, the fifth-most in the country. The Skyhawks average 30.4 points per game, the most in the Big South-OVC. UTM allows just 84.6 rushing yards a game on defense, the sixth most in the FCS. Sam Franklin is averaging 134.3 rushing yards per game, the most in the FCS. Daylan Dotson ranks fourth in the conference with 4.5 sacks, while his 10.5 tackles-for-loss rank 16th in the country. Aidan Laros handles kickoff, punting, and place kicking duties for UT Martin. Laros leads the conference in punt average, averaging 48.0 yards per punt. He also has 13 punts of at least 50 yards and 11 punts that have landed inside the 20-yard line. Laros is 6-for-9 on field goals. UT Martin has converted 46.7 percent of their third downs and 69.2 percent of their fourth downs.

# TRE LAMB

## HEAD COACH | 4TH SEASON | TENNESSEE TECH '12

The reigning Big South Football Coach of the Year, Tre Lamb returns to Gardner-Webb after leading the Runnin' Bulldogs to their first Big South Championship in 20 years and their first postseason appearance since 1992. Under Lamb in 2022, the Runnin' Bulldogs finished 5-0 in the Big South Conference and knocked off Eastern Kentucky for their first ever FCS Playoff victory. The 'Dawgs also pushed top FBS foes to the breaking point, falling to Liberty 21-20 and to Sun Belt Runner-Up Coastal Carolina. As the offensive playcaller for GWU, Lamb's offense averaging 441.5 yards per game and scoring 32.2 points per game, both tops in the Big South Conference. The offense rolled over Eastern Kentucky for 405 rushing yards, including 245 for Narii Gaither, a new school record for single-game rushing yards in the GWU Division-I era. Lamb won his debut in decisive fashion, rallying his troops for a 42-20 win over No. 24 Elon on February 27, 2021 in Spangler Stadium. He followed with another win over Presbyterian and finished the abbreviated spring season with a 2-2 mark. Lamb is just the second head coach in the program's senior college history (since 1970) to finish at .500 or better in his inaugural season at the helm. The traditional 2021 season saw Lamb's squad nearly upset Georgia Southern in the opener and fight to the wire throughout the season – which concluded with a road win at North Carolina A&T in the finale.

Lamb, included on the AFCA's annual list of top young coaches in the country in 2021, was hired in December, 2019 after serving as offensive coordinator at Ohio Valley Conference member Tennessee Tech for two seasons. He was impressive on the press conference podium and handled the pandemic shut down and recruiting like a seasoned veteran. His penchant for handling tough situations shouldn't be a surprise – as football runs deep in the Lamb family. Tre Lamb is just the latest to rise to the position of head coach.

His father, Hal, recently retired after a legendary career and three state titles at Calhoun (Ga.) High. His grandfather, Ray, won three state championships during a career that included head coaching stops at Warren County (Ga.) High, Commerce (Ga.) High and Monroe Area (Ga.) High. Uncle Bobby Lamb has more than 100 wins and four national playoff appearances during a Division I coaching career at Furman and Mercer. Lamb was part of a coaching staff at Tennessee Tech in 2019 that engineered one of the biggest turnarounds in Division I FCS nationally. The Golden Eagles won just two games combined in 2017 and 2018, but bumped that win total to six games this past season. Lamb's offensive mastery was on full display in the 2019 opener, as the Golden Eagles racked up 671 yards of total offense in a 59-58 win over Samford. Tennessee Tech went on to score more than 30 points five times in 2019 and finished second in the Ohio Valley Conference in scoring offense (29.0 ppg) and offensive plays (893). The Golden Eagles ranked third in the conference in pass offense and pass efficiency, fourth in rushing offense – and led the OVC in time of possession. Quarterback Bailey Fisher broke six Tech records on his way to a second-team All-OVC nod. The sophomore passed for 2,643 yards and 21 touchdowns while rushing for 489 more and 11 scores. Freshman receiver Metrius Fleming also earned All-OVC honors after catching 47 balls for 629 yards and three touchdowns. He also had two rushing touchdowns, a 91-yard kick return touchdown and 1,200 all-purpose yards. Fisher was named the OVC Freshman of the Year under Lamb's guidance in 2018 and was a finalist for the prestigious STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award. Prior to returning to his alma mater, Lamb called the plays for Mercer in 2017 and spent four seasons as the quarterbacks coach for the Bears. He mentored John Russ to an outstanding career and helped freshman Kaelan Riley to a spot on the Jerry Rice Award Watch List and Southern Conference Freshman of the Year honors in 2017. Lamb served as the quarterbacks coach at Tennessee Tech in 2013. As a player, Lamb played quarterback at Tennessee Tech from 2009-2012, serving as team captain his final three seasons. He led the Golden Eagles to an OVC title in 2011, the program's first since 1975, and a spot in the NCAA Division I FCS Playoffs for the first time. Lamb was outstanding during his team's title run, directing an offense that set nine school records, including single-season marks for points scored (355), scoring average (32.3 ppg) and most first downs in a season (238). The program's Robert Hill Johnson Award winner, Lamb set three individual school records himself in 2011, establishing new marks for single-game attempts and completions and the single-season record for total offense with 2,555 yards. He finished his career with 5,301 passing yards, which ranks third in program history. He passed for a school-record 481 yards vs. Southeast Missouri State as a senior. Lamb played for his father, Hal, at Calhoun (Ga.) High before joining the college ranks, posting a 21-4 record as a starter under center. A first-team All-State selection in 2007, he passed for 2,232 yards and 27 touchdowns as a senior.

Lamb graduated from Tennessee Tech with a degree in interdisciplinary studies, education and exercise science. He and his wife, Carter, are the proud parents of two daughters – Olivia James and Drew Nix. The family resides in Shelby, N.C.

### THE GAME

The Runnin' Bulldogs return to conference play, hosting #13 UT Martin for Homecoming. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. Phil Constantino and Mark Covert will handle the call on ESPN+. Dave Friedman and Reginald Walker Jr. will have the radio call on WGNC 1450 AM/101.1 FM or online via the Varsity Network App and at [gwusports.com](http://gwusports.com).

### SERIES NOTES

Gardner-Webb and UT Martin hold an even 2-2 split in the series, with the Runnin' Bulldogs taking the first two meetings in 2001 and 2002, and the Skyhawks winning the last two contests in 2005 and 2006. UT Martin comes into today's game ranked #13 in the national poll and is the first ranked opponent for Gardner-Webb since facing #5 William & Mary in the second round of the 2022 FCS Playoffs. The Runnin' Bulldogs are 8-36 all-time against nationally-ranked FCS opponents, including a 5-15 mark at home. The last win against a ranked foe for Gardner-Webb was on February 7, 2021, a 42-20 victory over #24 Elon in Tre Lamb's first game as head coach of the Runnin' Bulldogs.

### MOVING UP THE BOARD

Ty French forced a punt early in the game at East Carolina on Sept. 23, thanks to his sack that kicked the Pirates out of field goal range. French is now 1.5 sacks shy of tying former GWU Runnin' Bulldog and Green Bay Packer Gabe Wilkins (1990-93) for the most in school history (29.0). French also has 9.0 tackles-for-loss this season, the second-most in the conference and the seventh-most in the FCS. For his career, French has 50 tackles-for-loss, the fourth-most in program history.

### THE MAYOR

Running back Narii Gaither (5-10, 181, R-Sr.) now has 2,885 career rushing yards, only the third player in program history to rush for at least 2,800 yards in their GWU career. He ranks third all-time in career rushing yards, and needs just 59 rushing yards to tie Ty Maxwell (2014-17) for the most rushing yards in the Division-I era (2,944). Gaither also has 94 career receptions, passing Philip Keefe for the most career pass receptions by a running back in Gardner-Webb history, while his eight receiving touchdowns are tied for the most in program history.

### ✓ HOT ROUTES

- ✓ Ja'Kai Young's 40-yard pick six vs ECU last week was the first interception for a GWU player returned for a touchdown since Ty Anderson returned an interception for a score on Oct. 1, 2022 at Marshall.
- ✓ Five teams on Gardner-Webb's 2023 schedule finished with a winning record, with two of those making the FCS Playoffs (Elon, Eastern Kentucky). ECU also made it to the postseason, knocking off Coastal Carolina 53-29 in the Birmingham Bowl.
- ✓ Gardner-Webb had eight games with 400+ yards offensively last season, moving past the 2005 squad for the most in the program's Division I era (since 2000). GWU totaled 455 yards on 71 plays last week vs ECU.
- ✓ Ty Anderson's safety against Tennessee State is the first safety forced by GWU since Sept. 7, 2019, when Josh Ramseur tallied a safety at ECU.
- ✓ The Runnin' Bulldogs entered the season ranked #25 in the STATS Perform National Poll, the first time GWU has been ranked in a preseason poll since prior to the 2003 season, and the first time ranked in the STATS poll since Oct. 5, 2013.
- ✓ Gardner-Webb head coach Tre Lamb (34, September 16, 1989) is the second youngest head coach in the FCS ranks currently, with only Austin Peay skipper Scotty Walden (33, November 15, 1989) slightly younger.
- ✓ Gardner-Webb are third the Big South-OVC in third down defense, as teams are converting just 35.6 percent of the time on third down this season. The 'Dawgs held RMU to just 5-for-18 (27.8) on third down and 1-for-5 (20.0) on fourth down on Oct. 7.
- ✓ Gardner-Webb won outright Big South Conference championships in 2002, 2003 and 2022. Gardner-Webb is the only team remaining in the Big South with multiple outright league titles. GWU went undefeated in each of those three championship seasons.

### THE HEAD COACHES

Gardner-Webb head coach Tre Lamb is the second-youngest skipper in Division I football at age 34. He is 16-19 in his brief tenure, with seven of those losses coming to 85-scholarship FBS programs. Jason Simpson is 113-85 in his now 18th season at UT Martin. Simpson has led the Skyhawks to back-to-back OVC championships, and is a two-time OVC Roy Kidd Coach of the Year Award winner, and a four-time Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year Award Finalist.

### LAST TIME OUT

Gardner-Webb enters this week's contest 3-4 following a 35-32 win over Eastern Kentucky. Gardner-Webb trailed 21-7 early in the second quarter, but tied the game at 21 at halftime and scored 14 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to complete the come-from-behind win, thanks to an 88-yard touchdown run by Jayden Brown and a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jaylen King to AJ Johnson. The GWU defense recorded three interceptions, the most ever thrown in a game by ECU quarterback Parker McKinney in his All-American career.

### BACK IN BLACK

Last season, Gardner-Webb opened the year with new black helmets, defeating Limestone 56-21 in the season opener. The Runnin' Bulldogs donned the black helmets in all five conference games last season, culminating in the program's first Big South Conference championship since 2003. The black magic continued for GWU in the first round of the FCS Playoffs, rolling to a 52-41 victory over Eastern Kentucky in the 2022 FCS Playoffs. While the streak ended at #5 William & Mary the next week, GWU broke out the black helmets again on Oct. 21, 2023, defeating ECU 35-32. Gardner-Webb is now 7-1 all-time in the black helmets.

### STRAIGHT BASS HOMIE

Senior defensive end Brice Bass was a force for the Runnin' Bulldogs against RMU, as he set a new career-high with three sacks. Bass forced a fumble and picked up back-to-back sacks on the final two plays of the game. So far this season, almost half of Bass' 19 tackles have been tackles-for-loss with 7.5, while also tallying five sacks. Bass also has three QB hits and two pass break ups this season.

### ROAD TRIP

The Runnin' Bulldogs will once again face long stretches away from Spangler Stadium in 2023. GWU will play just one home game in September, facing Elon on Sept. 9. The 'Dawgs will also have just one home game in November, hosting conference rival Charleston Southern in the regular season finale on Nov. 18. Gardner-Webb does play three home games in October, hosting Robert Morris on Oct. 7, ECU on Oct. 21, and UT Martin on Oct. 28.

### THIRD DOWN PATROL

The Gardner-Webb defense continues to be stout on third downs, as opposing offenses have converted just 35.6 percent of their third downs against GWU this season, the third-best mark in the conference. In week two, the 'Dawgs held Elon to 0-for-6 on third down in the first half, and the Phoenix went 0-for-9 on their first nine third down attempts of the game. On Oct. 7, the Gardner-Webb defense held RMU to just 5-for-18 on third downs and 1-for-5 on fourth downs.

### WHERE THERE'S A WILL, THERE'S A TACKLE

For the past two years, William McRainey has been a head hunter for the Runnin' Bulldogs, recording over 100 tackles the past two seasons. Last year, McRainey led the team with 104 tackles, with 9.0 TFL and 5.5 sacks. McRainey has started all 34 games he has played in since earning the starting linebacker job in the 2021 spring season. This season, McRainey has 65 total tackles, picking up 11 tackles in back-to-back games against Austin Peay and Robert Morris, and 14 tackles, along with an interception, last week against ECU. McRainey now has 297 tackles for his career, needing three more to become just the 20th player in program history with at least 300 tackles in a career.

### BIG SOUTH STATS

Gardner-Webb is 47-58 all-time in Big South Conference or Big South-OVC play since joining the conference in 2002. Gardner-Webb has gone undefeated in conference play three times, in 2002 (3-0), 2003 (4-0), and 2022 (5-0). The Runnin' Bulldogs did open their time in the Big South with six straight seasons without a losing record in conference play, going 15-8 in conference games from 2002-2007, winning seven conference games in a row before falling to Liberty 17-9 on Oct. 2, 2004. Last season's 5-0 record in Big South play ended a stretch from 2017-2021 where Gardner-Webb failed to record a winning record in conference play, going just 5-21 in that time span.

### BONJOUR

Gardner-Webb defensive stalwart Ty French (6-3, 230, Sr.) had a career-best season in 2022, breaking the Big South single-season record for sacks with 11.5 through 12 games. French is just the third player in league history to reach double figures in sacks and finished just a half sack from tying the GWU single-season mark set by Chris Mintz in 1999. French was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award and was on the final watch list for the Ted Hendricks Award in 2022. He enters the 2023 season on the Buck Buchanan Award List once again, and is a First Team Preseason All-American.

### SEMIFINALIST

For the first time ever, Gardner-Webb has a player in the semifinals for the William V. Campbell trophy in William McRainey. The Shallotte, N.C. native is the reigning Big South Scholar Athlete of the Year, graduating in July with a 3.55 GPA while majoring in Economics and Finance. He is also an Eagle Scout, and has helped the GWU football team with service projects at elementary schools in Shelby and Boiling Springs. The William V. Campbell trophy is considered the "Academic Heisman," with past winners such as Peyton Manning, Tim Tebow, Christian Wilkins, and Justin Herbert.

### MILEAGE

The Runnin' Bulldogs will play six road games this season, traveling a total of 2,112 miles. Their longest trip will be on Nov. 5, heading to Smithfield, RI to face Bryant (715 miles). The 'Dawgs have already played their shortest road game of the season, as they headed just 47 miles up the road to face App State on Sept. 2.

### A LONG TIME COMING

Before the 2022 season, Gardner-Webb last secured the Big South's three major postseason awards in the same season in 2002, when Jeremy Martin (Offensive Player of the Year), Mario Williams (Defensive Player of the Year) and Steve Patton (Coach of the Year) were honored. Kepky Baucom was also named Big South Freshman of the Year in 2002. That solo award is now split into two different awards – Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year.

### NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the first time since the 2003 preseason, GWU found themselves in the preseason national polls. The 'Dawgs are ranked #25 in the STATS Preseason Poll and #24 in the AFCA Coaches Poll. It is the first time Gardner-Webb has been ranked since earning the #24 spot in both polls on Oct. 5, 2013. Gardner-Webb's highest ranking ever was when the squad earned the #18 spot in the final media poll following the 2003 season.

### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

For the second time this season, a pair of Runnin' Bulldogs found themselves on the FedEx Ground FCS National Honorable Mention teams. Jaylen King earned his first career honor on the Freshman team after going 14-for-18 for 185 yards. He also had one passing touchdown, connecting with AJ Johnson on a 37-yard TD pass with 10:25 left to give GWU a 35-24 lead over ECU. On the ground, the Folkston, Ga. native had 16 rushes for 46 yards and one touchdown, rushing into the endzone on fourth down to cut the ECU lead down to 21-14 in the second quarter. King was part of an offense that went 4-for-6 on fourth down and averaged 6.4 yards per play against the Colonels.

William McRainey earned a spot on the Defensive Honorable Mention team after recording 10+ tackles for the third straight game. The Shallotte, N.C. native had 14 tackles and 0.5 tackles-for-loss. McRainey forced a fumble early in the fourth quarter, setting up the Gardner-Webb offense for the deciding score. The senior also had his second career interception, picking off a pass in the fourth quarter after it was tipped by Willie Harris. McRainey and the GWU defense forced three interceptions from UAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year Parker McKinney for the first time in his career at Eastern Kentucky.

### WE'RE BACK, A DEFENSE STORY

The Runnin' Bulldogs return 10 of their 11 starters from last season's defense. GWU led the conference in interceptions (16), forced turnovers (24), and third-down defense (32.1) last season. The Runnin' Bulldogs also led the Big South in sacks with 38 total for an average of 2.9 sacks a game. Ty Anderson was one of just four players in the conference to tally a pick six, recording a 45-yard interception return at Marshall (10/1). The GWU defense also forced three redzone turnovers last season, the third-most in the Big South.

### BLOCK OUT THE NOISE

Gardner-Webb was one of just two teams in the FCS Playoffs last season to win a true road game, knocking off Eastern Kentucky 52-41. The other win was #7 Incarnate Word defeating #2 Sacramento State 66-63 in the Quarterfinals. The Runnin' Bulldogs also became the first team to win their first ever FCS Playoff game in program history since Austin Peay made a run to the Quarterfinals in 2019, knocking off Furman 42-6 and Sacramento State 42-28.

### SEASONS TO REMEMBER

The 2023 season marks the 50th anniversary of the 1973 Gardner-Webb football team. That team went 7-5, the first winning season for any four-year football team at GWU, as the school was a junior college until 1970. The squad earned an invite to the Poultry Bowl against Stephen F. Austin, the only bowl invite for a senior college team at Gardner-Webb. Richard Grissom earned All-American honors, the first GWU football player to earn the accolade for a senior college team.

This season also marks the 20th anniversary of the 2003 Runnin' Bulldog team that won their second straight Big South Championship. That team featured 2003 Big South Player of the Year Mario Williams, who had 15 pass break-ups, the sixth most in a single season in program history. The 2003 team also defeating three current FBS squads (FIU, Liberty and Coastal Carolina) and shut out Charleston Southern 46-0 to go a perfect 4-0 in conference play.

## 2023 GARDNER-WEBB FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

### IN CASE YOU WERE WONDERING

- \* Gardner-Webb University's 225-acre campus is located 50 miles west of Charlotte, N.C., in Boiling Springs, N.C. The school is also approximately an hours drive from both Asheville, N.C., and Greenville, S.C.
- \* Gardner-Webb's main campus is 11.6 miles from the South Carolina state line.
- \* Gardner-Webb conferred an honorary doctor of humanities degree upon legendary singer Johnny Cash on September 28, 1971 in Ernest W. Spangler Stadium. Cash also performed a concert that day in front an announced crowd of 12,000.
- \* Gardner-Webb is named after former North Carolina Governor O. Max Gardner and his wife, Faye Webb Gardner. Founded as Boiling Springs High School in 1905 and became Boiling Springs Junior College in 1928. Renamed Gardner-Webb Junior College in 1942.
- \* Gardner-Webb University and Boiling Springs hosted the 1996 U.S. Olympic Trials for Cycling.
- \* The first game as a junior college came on September 14, 1928 vs. Kings Mountain High School (25-6 W)
- \* Ernest W. Spangler Stadium was opened on October 8, 1966 with a 21-2 win over Chowan College. Facility was renovated in 2004 to its current configuration.
- \* The largest attendance for a home football game on record is 8,490 vs. No. 2 (FCS) Appalachian State on September 23, 2006.
- \* The team won conference titles in 1930, 1933, 1951, 1952, 1955, 1956, 1961, 1962, 1963, 1964, 1965, 1966, 1987, 1992, 2002 and 2003, 2022. Program also appeared in the 1974 NAIA Poultry Bowl and hosted the NAIA National Championship Bowl in 1992. The 'Dawgs made their first appearance in the FCS Playoffs last season, defeating Eastern Kentucky 52-41 in the first round.
- \* Jim Childers, a tackle from Greenville, S.C., and George Mauney, an end from Lexington, N.C., were Gardner-Webb's first All-Conference selections in 1932.
