SHULMAN RECEIVES CONTRACT EXTENSION

It was announced on Oct. 22 that Skyhawk head coach Jeremy Shulman had come to terms on a contract extension that will keep him on the Skyhawk sidelines through 2031.

Shulman's 360 career victories across all levels of collegiate basketball are the seventh-most amongst NCAA Division I active head coaches who are aged 50 or younger. He trails only Iowa's Ben McCollum (425), Saint Louis' Josh Schertz (422), Texas Tech's Grant McCasland (403), Idaho State's Ryan Looney (398), California Baptist's Rick Croy (380) and Marquette's Shaka Smart (370).

TRNKA, NIANG NAMED OVC PLAYERS TO WATCH

The Ohio Valley Conference spotlighted UT Martin juniors Afan Trnka and Lamine Niang as "Players to Watch" for the upcoming 2025-26 men's basketball season.

The OVC unveiled its list of 22 "Players to Watch" during its annual Basketball Media Day festivities on Oct. 14, held in Evansville, Ind.

A 6-2, 180-pound guard, Trnka is the Skyhawks' leading returning scorer at 8.3 points per outing. He was the only UT Martin player to see action in all 33 games a year ago, logging 23 starts and dishing out a team-best 97 assists (2.9 per contest).

Niang saw playing time in 31 contests and made 13 starts in the frontcourt in 2024-25, topping UT Martin in field goal percentage (.584, 45-of-77) and blocked shots (26).

GRUELING SCHEDULE AWAITS

The Skyhawks will take on five nonconference teams that finished above .500 last season, including a pair of postseason participants. UT Martin will be matched up against squads from eight different leagues before officially opening up OVC play on Dec. 18.

The 2025-26 campaign officially opens at UNLV on Nov. 4 as the Skyhawks head to Las Vegas for the first time since the 2013-14 season. The home opener is set for Nov. 9 as Kentucky Christian visits the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center for the second time in as many years.

A stretch of four straight road/neutral games follow as UT Martin heads to Bradley – fresh off a 28-9 campaign and appearance in the NIT quarterfinals – on Nov. 12. The next three outings will take place in the Sunshine State, beginning with a Nov. 18 showdown at Florida State – one year after the retirement of Skyhawk alum Leonard Hamilton.

UT Martin will then take part in the Pensacola Invitational multi-team event on Nov. 22-23, clashing against Prairie View A&M in the first game before a matchup against either Southern Miss or North Florida.

A season-long three-game homestand is next on tap, starting with a Nov. 25 contest against Brescia. A pair of return trips from last year are next on the schedule as Charleston Southern plays on Dec. 2. Reining SouthWestern Athletic Conference champion and NCAA Tournament participant Alabama State then makes its first trip to the Elam Center on Dec. 7.

A midweek Dec. 10 outing at Southern Illinois follows for the Skyhawks before the nonconference slate wraps up with a Dec. 14 home matchup against Champion Christian as the Tigers come to UT Martin for the fourth consecutive season.

The OVC slate includes 20 games with home-and-home series against all other member institutions in a true round-robin format. That includes eight contests against teams that finished above .500 last season, including NCAA Tournament participant SIUE.

The league schedule runs through Feb. 28 while the 2026 OVC Championship is set for March 4-7 in Evansville, Ind. as the tournament will be hosted by the Ford Center for the ninth straight year.

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR ONCE AGAIN

For the second straight season, UT Martin is slated to lead all NCAA men's basketball

Division I programs in most international student-athletes. The Skyhawks have 13 players who hail from outside the United States and have 11 total countries represented on the 2025-26 roster: Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Gambia, Lithuania, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Senegal, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain and the United States.

UT Martin' 11 nations represented topped Cal Poly (nine) and Arizona (nine) for most countries on the roster in 2025-26. Utah (seven), Indiana State (six), Jacksonville State (six) and Loyola Maryland (six) conclude the top-five.

Last season, the Skyhawks' 12 international student-athletes beat out Hawai'i (nine), Buffalo (eight) and Weber State (eight) for the most in the country.

Entering the 2024-25 season, only 17 student-athletes from outside of the United States graced UT Martin rosters in the program's first 73 years of existence.

RETURNING EXPERIENCE

A year after only touting one returner and limited NCAA Division I experience from its newcomers, the 2025-26 version of the Skyhawks boast eight players who have combined for 227 games played at the Division I level.

That list includes Lamine Niang (49, including 18 at Cal State Northridge), Dragos Lungu (37 games at San Diego), Afan Trnka (33 games), Filip Radaković (29 games), Andrija Bukumirović (26 games), AJ Hopkins (24 games), Luca Colceag (22 games at Northern Colorado and Montana State) and Lucas Williams (seven games).

RARE FEAT OF BROTHERS ON ROSTER

Sophomore Will Hopkins joins his older brother AJ, a senior, on the Skyhawk roster in 2025-26. The Hopkins duo is one of just 10 brother tandems on NCAA Division I men's basketball rosters this season, joining Dominykas/Dovydas Butka (Campbell), Macon/Houstan Emory (Delaware), Cameron/Cayden Boozer (Duke), JR/Chase Konieczny (Florida Gulf Coast), George III/BB Washington (Florida Gulf Coast), Cooper/Cole Bowser (Furman), Cobi/Cooper Campbell (Troy), Cade/Chase Courbat (Northern Iowa) and Adam/Jack Tauer (St. Thomas).

The Hopkins' are the first set of brothers on the Skyhawk men's basketball team since Roger/Art Castle in 1997-98.

PRESEASON OVC PREDICTIONS

The Skyhawks were tabbed eighth in the 2025-26 OVC's predicted order of finish, as voted by the league's head coaches and communication directors.

Five separate teams garnered at least one first-place vote as Little Rock received 12 of the 20 top slots on the way to 188 points as the preseason favorite. Defending regular season champion Southeast Missouri earned six first-place votes and was second with 177 points while reigning tournament champion SIUE (one first-place vote, 163 points) and Tennessee State (one first-place vote, 135 points) rounded out the top-four.

Lindenwood and Morehead State tied for fifth place with 100 points apiece while Tennessee Tech (80 points) narrowly edged out UT Martin (79 points). Southern Indiana received two first-place votes on the way to 67 points while Eastern Illinois (63 points) and Western Illinois (57 points) rounded out the poll.

FAMILIARITY WITH COACH SHULMAN

Three current UT Martin players previously played for Skyhawk head coach Jeremy Shulman while he was building a junior college dynasty at Eastern Florida State College in Melbourne, Fla.

Andrija Bukumirović and Afan Trnka each suited up for Shulman at Eastern Florida State for the 2023-24 campaign before following their head coach to UT Martin. Luca Colceag was also coached by Shulman at Eastern Florida State in 2023-24 and transferred to Northern Colorado before joining Shulman for his senior season.

Assistant coaches Sellé Hann, Truman Moore and Nick Johnson worked with Shulman at

Eastern Florida State while assistant coach Mark White hired Shulman as an assistant while he was head coach at East Mississippi Community College.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES/PROMOTIONS

Six of UT Martin's seven members of the coaching staff from last season return for the upcoming 2025-26 campaign.

Drew Kelly is the lone new face on staff as the Liberty Corner, NJ native brings 28 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Skyhawk bench. He spent the last three seasons (2022-25) at Northern Illinois after serving as both the head coach and athletic director at Harcum College from 2005-22. He also served as head coach at Bucks County Community College (2002-04) as well as stints as an assistant coach at The College of New Jersey (2000-02) and Haverford College (1997-2000).

A trio of UT Martin assistant coaches received new titles during the offseason. Jawaan Holmes is now the program's first-ever general manager in addition to his assistant coaching duties. Sellé Hann (director of player development) and Truman Moore (director of recruiting) also earned promotions heading into the 2025-26 season.

LOOKING BACK AT LAST SEASON

Head coach Jeremy Shulman's debut season at UT Martin featured 16 newcomers, which were tied with California, IU Indy and Louisville for the most in NCAA Division I men's basketball in 2024-25. The Skyhawks also touted the most international players (12) in the NCAA Division I ranks, which led to national attention when Mike Lopresti from NCAA.com profiled UT Martin in a feature story as part of World Basketball Day on Dec. 21.

The Skyhawks had several close calls in 2024-25, logging the most one-possession or overtime games (14) in the NCAA Division I ranks. UT Martin's six overtime games were tied for the most in a single season in school history as eight losses (including seven in OVC play) were decided by one point or in overtime.

Navigating the entire season without a single minute of playing time from a returner, the Skyhawks won their first-round matchup in the OVC Championship tournament, posting 14 victories against a brutal schedule that included five postseason participants (three of which took part in the NCAA Tournament) and nine games against eventual 20-win teams. UT Martin went 3-1 against the OVC regular season champion (1-1 against Southeast Missouri) and tournament champion (2-0 against SIUE) while also defeating CollegeBasketballInsider.com champion Illinois State. In addition to NCAA Tournament participant SIUE, the Skyhawks also recorded sweeps over OVC rivals Western Illinois, Eastern Illinois and Southern Indiana.

UT Martin wound up ranking in the top-20 in NCAA Division I men's basketball in offensive rebounding per game (13.73, 12th), bench points per game (29.73, 17th), rebounds per game (39.42, 19th) and three-point field goal attempts per game (28.8, 20th) in 2024-25. The Skyhawks also topped the OVC in three-point field goals made (9.1 per contest) and offensive rebounding (13.1 per outing) in league play.

Many records fell in Shulman's first season at the helm at UT Martin. The Skyhawks' 949 three-point field goals attempted were the most for a single season in school history and their 306 makes from three-point land were the second-most in program history – just three shy of the benchmark. UT Martin also established single-game school records for three-point field goals made (19), three-point field goals attempted (42) and rebounds (73), a record that had stood since 1979) against Champion Christian on Dec. 15. Six days later, the Skyhawks also produced the program's largest margin of victory in an OVC contest with a 77-46 road win at Southern Indiana – splashing 18 three-pointers (in 38 attempts) for their most treys against a NCAA Division I opponent in school history.



UT MARTIN SKYHAWKS HEAD COACH JEREMY SHULMAN



Jeremy Shulman is in his second season as University of Tennessee at Martin head men's basketball coach in 2025-26. The Nashville, Tenn. native was announced as the 13th head coach in Skyhawk men's basketball history on March 27, 2024.

Shulman's debut season at UT Martin featured 16 newcomers, which were tied with California, IU Indy and Louisville for the most in NCAA Division I men's basketball in 2024-25. The Skyhawks also touted the most international players (12) in the NCAA Division I ranks, which led to national attention when NCAA.com profiled UT Martin in a feature story as part of World Basketball Day on Dec. 21.

Navigating the entire season without a single minute of playing time from a returner, the Skyhawks won their first-round matchup in the OVC Championship tournament, posting 14 victories against a brutal schedule that included five postseason participants (three of which took part in the NCAA regular season champion (1-1 against Southeast Missouri) and tournament champion (2-0 against SIUE) while also defeating CollegeBasketballInsider.com champion Illinois State. In addition to NCAA Tournament participant SIUE, the Skyhawks also recorded sweeps over OVC rivals Western Illinois, Eastern Illinois and Southern Indiana.

UT Martin wound up ranking in the top-20 in NCAA Division I men's basketball in offensive rebounding per game (13.73, 12th), bench points per game (29.73, 17th), rebounds per game (39.42, 19th) and three-point field goal attempts per game (28.8, 20th) in 2024-25. Six days later, the Skyhawks also produced the program's largest margin of victory in an OVC contest with a 77-46 road win at Southern Indiana – splashing 18 three-pointers (in 38 attempts) for their most treys against a NCAA Division I opponent in school history.

Shulman's 2024-25 roster combined to win one OVC Player of the Week and a trio of OVC Newcomer of the Week awards. Tarence Guinyard became only the fifth player in school history to be named All-OVC first team and OVC All-Newcomer in the same season as he ranked second in the league in scoring (16.8 points per game) in conference competition. He was also crowned as an Oscar Robertson Trophy National Player of the Week on Dec. 17.

Before he was appointed at UT Martin, Shulman spent 14 seasons as head coach at Eastern Florida State College (formerly known as Brevard Community College) in Melbourne, Fla. In that span, he became the program's all-time wins leader (346 victories) and elevated the Titans to a national powerhouse – piling up 11 conference championships in the last 12 seasons with a pair of Final Four and three Elite Eight appearances in the NJCAA Division I Tournament. He won 80.9 percent (152-36 record) of his conference contests at the helm of Eastern Florida State.

A nine-time conference Coach of the Year, Shulman averaged 24.7 wins per season at Eastern Florida State – a number that includes 18 victories during the COVID-19 shortened season. He won 76.4 percent of his games (346-107) after taking over a Titan squad that was coming off a seven-win season and had not been to the postseason in 11 consecutive years. He built the program to annual national contenders as Eastern Florida State finished as national runner-up in 2016-17 and third nationally the following season. He was inducted into the Florida College System Activities Association Hall of Fame in 2023.

Shulman won at least 18 games in all 14 seasons at Eastern Florida State, while posting a dozen 20-win seasons and a pair of 30-win campaigns. He placed at least four players on an all-conference team in every season, mentoring 78 all-league selections and six conference Players of the Year.

From 2014-19, the Titans went 146-28 – an .839 winning percentage while averaging 29.2 wins over a five-season stretch. That included back-to-back 30-win campaigns (31-6 in 2016-17, 30-5 in 2017-18) and an unblemished 15-0 conference record in 2015-16.

Plenty of history was made during Shulman's first three years in charge of Eastern Florida State. His first season (2010-11) included the program's first state tournament in 11 years while the 21 victories in 2011-12 were the program's most since 2000. The following season, the Titans achieved their first Southern Conference title in 13 years, starting a string of 10 consecutive seasons with a conference championship while also adding a title in 2023-24.

Shulman, 46, has additionally taken part in other coaching ventures as he was a court coach during the 2017 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Cup training camp as well as serving as the head coach of The JUCO Products roster in the 10th annual "The Basketball Tournament" (TBT) – a 64-team single-elimination tournament in 2023.

In addition to his success on the hardwood, Shulman preached academics as his Titan program boasted a remarkable graduation rate of 98 percent. His 2020-21 squad earned a 3.34 Grade Point Average – the sixth-highest amongst all NJCAA men's basketball programs.

Before his first collegiate head coaching job, Shulman spent three seasons (2007-10) as an assistant coach under Mark White at East Mississippi Community College in Scooba, Miss. He was part of a Lions turnaround that included an 11-14 record in his first year, followed by records of 17-11 and a record-setting 27-7 campaign in his final year in Scooba. After a semifinal round state and regional tournament appearance in his second season, the 2009-10 East Mississippi squad was ranked No. 12 nationally (highest in school history), won a program-record 27 games and qualified for the NJCAA Tournament for the first time ever after winning the NJCAA Region 23 Tournament championship. Shulman also was part of the program's first-ever Mississippi Association of Community and Junior Colleges North Division regular season championship.

Shulman's first taste of coaching came at the AAU level as he was the youngest coach in Tennessee AAU history (16). In 1998, he founded the Midstate Ballerz Elite AAU program as a senior in high school, serving as head coach and program director. He won 415 games over 10 seasons while churning out a trio of state championships and three national top-12 finishes, including a fourth-place performance in 2005. During his tenure with Midstate Ballerz, 126 players went on to earn scholarships at the collegiate level, including 60 at the NCAA Division I level. A sampling of Ballerz Elite AAU alumni includes Mississippi State's Jarvis Varnado (2010 NBA Draft pick) and Tennessee's Scotty Hopson (2007-08 McDonald's All-American).

Coaching runs in the Shulman family as Jeremy's uncle John is in his second season leading the Central Arkansas program after also serving as head coach at Chattanooga (2004-13) and Alabama-Huntsville (2019-24).

Shulman graduated from Middle Tennessee State University in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and a double minor in athletic coaching and psychology. He is married to the former Evi Vilde of Riga, Latvia (a former All-Conference USA volleyball player at Central Florida) and the couple has three children, Jordan, Mila and Gianni.
