# **GAME NOTES**

Tennessee State heads to Martin looking to snap a five-game OVC-Big South skid and earn its first win at UT Martin since 2013. The Tigers face a Skyhawks squad riding a three-game winning streak and coming off another strong stretch of conference play as the long-standing series continues Saturday at Hardy Graham Stadium.



SERIES INFORMATION: Saturday marks the 35th all-time meeting between Tennessee State and UT Martin, with the Tigers holding an 18-16 advantage in the series. TSU has dropped the last four meetings overall and five straight at Hardy Graham Stadium.

### **WEEK 10 BY THE NUMBERS:**

- 3.4: The Tigers averaged 3.4 yards per play against Lindenwood up from their previous outing and boosted by two explosive drives early.
- 9: Secondary Brendan Hale paced the defense with a team-high nine tackles his fourth straight game with at least four stops.
- 12.0: Quarterback Byron McNair averaged 12 yards per completion, including two passes of 20+ yards in the first quarter.
- 31: Syncere Safeeullah returned an interception 31 yards, marking TSU's fifth defensive takeaway of the season.
- 43.0: Punter Mark Shenouda continued his consistency with a 43.0-yard average, including a 51-yard boot that flipped

### PRESEASON BY THE NUMBERS:

- **5:** Offensive line coach Russ Ehrenfeld brings a wealth of experience and a proven track record in developing NFL talent. Ehrenfeld holds the distinction of having coached the last five NFL draft picks under his tutelage. His first came in 2000 with Michael Thompson (Atlanta Falcons), followed by Kadeem Edwards (Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 2014), Demetrius Rhaney (St. Louis Rams, 2014), Robert Myers (Baltimore Ravens, 2015), Anthony Morris (Oakland Raiders, 2015), and Lachavious Simmons (Chicago Bears, 2020). Known for his expertise in developing linemen at multiple positions, Ehrenfeld has consistently prepared players to compete at the next level.
- 8: Mark Shenouda is Tennessee State's lone returning punter for the 2025 season. In 2024, he appeared in 10 games and punted 40 times for 1,608 yards, averaging 40.2 yards per punt with a long of 60. Shenouda consistently helped control field position, placing 13 punts inside the 20-yard line and recording seven fair catches. He also had eight punts travel 50 or more yards, showcasing both distance and accuracy, while avoiding any blocked punts.
- **13**: Devon Starling played three seasons at Tennessee State before transferring to Northern Arizona for the 2023 season. At TSU, he totaled over 1,900 all-purpose yards and 15 touchdowns, earning OVC Co-Freshman of the Year honors as a freshman. Starling led the Tigers in rushing in multiple seasons and was a consistent threat in the passing game, while also contributing on special teams. In 2023 at Northern Arizona, he led the Lumberjacks with 726 rushing yards and seven total touchdowns, including three 100-yard rushing games. He added 210 receiving yards on 22 catches, averaged 85.1 all-purpose yards per game, and contributed four tackles on defense, showcasing his versatility and playmaking ability.
- 15: Rayon Johnson will face his former team, Alabama A&M, later this season in

# REGGIE BARLOW HEAD COACH

Tennessee State University named Reggie Barlow as the 23rd head football coach in program history on March 23, 2025.

A proven leader with extensive coaching experience and a championship pedigree, Barlow brings a wealth of knowledge and a history of success at both the professional and collegiate levels.

Barlow joins TSU after a standout tenure as head coach of the UFL's D.C. Defenders, where he led the team to a league-best 9-1 record and a championship game appearance in 2023. His remarkable leadership earned him 2023 XFL Coach of the Year honors.

Under his guidance, the Defenders produced seven All-XFL players, including Offensive Player of the Year Jordan Ta'amu, the most of any team in the league. His squad dominated on the ground, leading the league in rushing yards (1,490) and rushing touchdowns (18), while defensively ranking second in sacks (29) and first in pick-sixes (4).

Before his success with the Defenders, Barlow served as head coach at Virginia State University for six seasons. He made history in 2017 leading the Trojans to their first unbeaten season in school history and winning the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) Championship. His efforts earned him CIAA Coach of the Year honors.

Barlow began his collegiate coaching career at his alma mater Alabama State University as quarterback coach for two seasons and head coach for eight seasons. During his time at the helm, he led the Hornets to a 49-42 record and three SWAC East Division titles while developing standout quarterbacks like Super Bowl XLVII champion Tarvaris Jackson. His influence went beyond wins and losses, as his teams also excelled in the classroom, boasting an 80% graduation rate.

As a player, Barlow was a standout wide receiver and return specialist at Alabama State before being selected in the fourth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars. During his NFL career, he played for the Jaguars, Oakland Raiders, and Tampa Bay Buccaneers, leading the league in punt return yards in 1998 and earning a Pro Bowl alternate selection. He capped his playing career by winning Super Bowl XXXVII with the Buccaneers in 2002.

# GREGG WILLIAMS

Gregg Williams brings more than 30 years of professional football coaching experience, including a Super Bowl title and multiple stints as a defensive coordinator and head coach in the NFL. Williams served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the D.C. Defenders of the UFL/XFL from 2023 to 2025. His extensive NFL resume includes coaching stops with the New York Jets, Cleveland Browns, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, New Orleans Saints, Buffalo Bills, Washington Redskins, Jacksonville Jaguars and Tennessee Titans. He was head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2001 to 2003 and served as interim head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 2018, posting a 5–3 record Williams was the defensive architect behind the New Orleans Saints' Super Bowl XLIV championship run in 2009. In Music Citr, Williams is most remembered for guiding the Tennessee Titans to an AFC Championship appearance in 1999 as defensive coordinator. He spent seven seasons working under former Titans head coach Jeff Fisher, who later reunited with Williams during their time with the Rams. Throughout his career, Williams has coached two AP Defensive Rookie of the Year winners — Jevon Kearse (Titans, 1999) and Aaron Donald (Rams, 2014) — and developed a reputation as one of the game's most innovative defensive minds.



# SHANNON HARRIS CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / QB

Shannon Harris, fresh off winning the UFL Championship with the D.C. Defenders, has been named Co-Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach at Tennessee State University. Harris will also serve as permanent head coach of the Defenders for the 2026 season, marking his third stint with TSU. A former starting quarterback, captain, and Team MVP for the Tigers, Harris began his coaching career at his alma mater (2002–09) before building an extensive résumé with stops at Hampton, Alabama State, Alcorn State, and Virginia State. At Alcorn, he helped guide he Braves to three straight SWAC Championship appearances, a 2015 league title, and the inaugural Celebration Bowl, while mentoring multiple all-conference players. He later returned to TSU as Offensive Coordinator (2019–20) and served as Offensive Coordinator and Interim Head Coach at Virginia State (2021–22). Harris has also gained NFL experience with the Tennessee Titans



TRIANO MORGAN
CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / RB

Toriano Morgan enters his first season as Co-Offensive Coordinator and Running Backs Coach at Tennessee State after serving as head coach at Edward Waters. With more than 20 years of coaching experience at the high school and collegiate levels, Morgan has developed 35 all-conference players and helped send 13 to the NFL.Nicknamed "Mr. 180" for his ability to transform programs, Morgan led Edward Waters to its first winning season in over two decades and guided the Tigers to a top-10 HBCU national ranking in 2023. Under his leadership, the offense produced record-setting performances, including quarterback Jyron Russell becoming the programs all-time leading passer and earning BoxToRow National Player of the Week honors. Morgan also served as Assistant Head Coach, Offensive Coordinator, and Quarterbacks Coach at Virginia State, helping the Trojans to an 8-2 record and a second-place finish in the CIAA Northern Division. He previously revitalized programs at Virginia Union University and Dillard High School, earning a reputation for innovative, high-powered offenses. In 2022, Morgan was selected for the NFL Coaching Academy and named to FootballScoop's Rising Star Coaches Watch List

#### CEDRIC THORNTON, ASSOC. HC/LINEBACKERS

Cedric Thomton brings more than 20 years of coaching experience to Tennessee State, including recent roles as defensive tackles coach and special teams coordinator at Alabama A&M, and defensive coordinator at Grambling State and Alcorn State. At Alcorn, he helped lead the Braves to two SWAC championships and Celebration Bowl appearances, developing multiple all-conference and All-America players while overseeing nationally ranked defenses in sacks, tackles for loss, and turnovers.At Grambling, Thomton mentored standout players like Sundiata Anderson and freshman Keyshawn Johnson, a 2023 Stats Perform FCS Freshman All-American. He also served as defensive coordinator at Alabama State, where his 2014 unit ranked among the top 15 nationally in scoring defense, passing defense, and takeaways, including a program-first shutout since 1994.



#### **DEION HARRIS / DEFENSIVE LINE**

Deion Harris, who most recently served as linebackers coach for the D.C. Defenders, has been named linebackers coach at TSU. Harris began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Virginia State and rose through the ranks of the UFL, where he helped develop one of the league's top linebacker units.



#### JEROD KRUSE, SPECIAL TEAMS / SECONDARY

Jerod Kruse, a 24-year coaching veteran, joins Tennessee State as Defensive Secondary Coordinator and Special Teams Coordinator after serving as the Research and Strategy Coach for the Cleveland Browns in 2024. He previously spent 2021–23 on the Kansas City Chiefs' staff, working on advanced game planning, and also consulted for EA Sports on Madden and NCAA video games. Kruse's NFL experience includes two stints with the Cleveland Browns (2017–18, 2024), where he helped elevate the defensive secondary into the league's top 10 and mentored Pro Bowl cornerback Denzel Ward. At the collegiate level, he served as Secondary Coach and Co-Defensive Coordinator at FIU (2019–20). William Jewell (head coach and defensive coordinator), Southeastern Louisiana, Emporia State, and Baker University, developing multiple NFL players and conference-leading defenses.



#### **DEXTER JACKSON, SAFTIES**

Former NFL safety and Super Bowl MVP Dexter Jackson brings a wealth of experience and championship pedigree to the Tennessee State football coaching staff, serving as the Tigers' safeties coach. Jackson was named Super Bowl XXXVII MVP after recording two interceptions in the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' 48-21 win over the Oakland Raiders. He played 10 seasons in the NFL, primarily with the Buccaneers, and also had stints with the Arizona Cardinals and Cincinnati Bengals. Over his career, Jackson totaled 17 interceptions and more than 450 tackles. A native of Quincy, Florida, Jackson played collegiately at Florida State from 1995 to 1998. He earned second-team All-ACC honors as a junior and senior, finishing his Semioles career with 194 tackles, seven interceptions, 16 pass breakups and four blocked field goals.



### RUSS EHRENFELD, OFFENSIVE LINE

Russ Ehrenfeld enters his 10th year of his fourth stint at Tennessee State after spending last season with the DC Defenders of the UFL. A highly experienced offensive line coach, Ehrenfeld has developed numerous professional players, including four NFL draft picks in a two-year span—Kadeem Edwards, Demetrius Rhaney, Robert Myers, and Anthony Morris—the first time in TSU history that four linemen were drafted in such a short period. During his tenure at TSU, Ehrenfeld has coached multiple All-Ohio Valley Conference selections and All-Americans, including Child Okeke and Jessamen Dunker, several of whom earned opportunities in the NFL. His offensive lines have consistently ranked among the conference's best in rushing and fewest sacks, setting the foundation for TSU's high-powered offenses. Prior to his current stint, Ehrenfeld spent three seasons at Chattanooga, helping the Mocs allow just nine sacks in 2009—third fewest nationally—and coaching multiple all-league linemen and tight ends. He previously coached TSU's offensive line from 1997—99, helping the Tigers win back-to-back OVC championships in 1998 and 1999, with four linemen from the 1999 squad advancing to the NFL.



**EDDIE WOODS, TIGHT ENDS** 

Joining the offensive staff as Tight Ends coach is Eddie Woods, a legendary high school coach in Middle Tennessee and TSU football alum. Woods compiled a 77-30 record in nine seasons at Cane Ridge High School and is credited with developing dozens of Division I athletes. He brings a no-nonsense approach and a strong commitment to player accountability.



### NICK ANDREWS, WIDE RECEIVERS

Nick Andrews, who will serve as wide receivers coach. A former standout at Alabama State and a two-time All-SWAC receiver, Andrews most recently served as defensive coordinator at powerhouse Clay-Chalkville (Ala.) High School. His deep understanding of both sides of the ball makes him a valuable asset to TSU's passing attack.



### JUSTIN HANNAH, DEFENSIVE ANALYST

Justin Hannah will serve as a defensive analyst. Hannah played professionally in the Arena Football League before coaching at his alma mater, Tuskegee University, and most recently served as head coach at Murphy High School in Mobile, Alabama.

# Momentum Shift: Football Looks to Carry Homecoming Energy into Conference Play

Tennessee State's homecoming victory over Howard wasn't just a celebration — it was a statement. After a challenging first half of the season, the Tigers found rhythm, balance, and confidence in a 24–7 win that could define their stretch run.

Now, as the calendar turns fully to Ohio Valley Conference—Big South play, head coach Reggie Barlow believes the performance can be the spark his team carries the rest of the way.

"Our guys prepared really well," Barlow said. "They were resilient, they competed to the end, and I was really proud of them. We're blessed to get the win, but we also know the job demands more."

The victory showcased a Tennessee State team that is learning how to finish. Quarterback Byron McNair led a balanced offense that clicked from start to finish, completing 18 of 22 passes and tossing three touchdowns to three different receivers — Connor Ruth, Snap Reed, and Devaughn Slaughter.

McNair's efficiency reflected an offense that's maturing behind a young core of skill players. "Byron played a solid game," Barlow said. "He used his legs to get first downs and made really smart decisions. Connor's patience on that route, getting his first college touchdown in that moment, was special. And Snap continues to impress every week."

For Reed, the performance was another step forward after returning from injury earlier in the year. "He's played and practiced with such grit," Barlow said. "He's hard to bring down, he's getting stronger, and now that he knows the system, he's playing with real confidence."

That offensive poise was matched by a defense that made timely plays and showed its depth. Linebacker Micah Gay earned OVC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors after intercepting two passes — both leading to touchdowns — while adding double-digit tackles.

"Micah just has great instincts," Barlow said. "He was patient and stayed where he needed to be. Those interceptions came at big moments and helped us build momentum."

TSU also saw production from players stepping into expanded roles. Cornerback Jason Watkins and freshman Dominique Dixon contributed key stops in the secondary, while Brandon Hale and Byron Davis anchored the linebacking unit. "Those guys competed at a high level," Barlow said. "They want to get better, and that's what you need heading into the conference stretch."

Now, the Tigers (2–5) set their focus on Western Illinois, another team searching for its first OVC–Big South win. The

Leathernecks (0–8) enter the matchup with quarterback Cason Carswell (1,256 yards, nine TDs) and running back Markell Holman, who averages more than 70 rushing yards per game.

"They're a tough team," Barlow said. "They've played two quarterbacks, they'll throw it around, and they're physical on defense. Their kicking game is solid. We've got a lot of respect for them and have to prepare to compete."

Saturday's game marks the second of a three-game homestand at Nissan Stadium. After seeing a strong turnout for homecoming, Barlow hopes fans will keep the same energy for the final stretch.

"Our fans showed out for homecoming — it was electric," he said. "We feed off their energy, and we're so grateful for it. But like we tell our guys, the job demands more. We need that same support this weekend."

The Tigers and Leathernecks will kick off Saturday at 1:30 p.m. at Nissan Stadium. The game will stream live on ESPN+.



# Nashville's Jason Hoath Jr. Embraces Family, Faith and Football at Tennessee State

Under the Friday night lights of Middle Tennessee, football was always more than a pastime for Jason Hoath Jr. It was family, faith, and a lifelong classroom built by his father — a coach who taught him that success comes from effort, not entitlement.

The Nashville native grew up around the game, spending evenings on high school sidelines while his father, Jason Hoath Sr., coached at Columbia Central and later served as an assistant at Page High. Those years shaped how the younger Hoath saw football — not just as a sport, but to build character.

"People like to throw around the term 'daddy ball," Hoath Jr. said with a laugh. "But my dad didn't go easy on me. He probably coached me harder than anyone else. He never pushed me to do something I didn't want to do—but if I told him I wanted to get better, he made sure I put in the work."

That work ethic guided him through a late and uncertain recruiting process. Tennessee State entered the picture just as Hoath was preparing to commit elsewhere, giving him a chance to stay home and play Division I football in front of family.

"TSU came in around the end of April," he said. "It was late, but I knew some people up here, got on a visit, and it just felt right. It was a chance to stay close to home, play at a higher level, and get my school paid for. It checked every box."

Hoath has continued to grow in his role with the Tigers, recording 12 career receptions for 97 yards entering this season. His breakout year came

in 2024, when he posted nine catches for 86 yards as TSU captured the Ohio Valley - Big South Conference title and advanced to the FCS playoffs.

"Real football starts when it gets cold outside," he said, smiling. "Playing in December, that's when it's real. Getting to the playoffs and seeing this team come together like that — it reminded me of those deep high school playoff runs. My family was so proud. It was full circle."

When former head coach Eddie George stepped down last offseason, many players across the program faced tough decisions about their future. Hoath chose to stay, crediting Assistant Athletic Director for Sports Performance Scott Holsopple with keeping the team grounded and united during the transition.

"Coach Holsopple is the standard," Hoath said. "When he talks about what it takes to win championships, you listen, because he's been there before. When everything felt uncertain, he was the one telling us, 'We're going to be okay.' You could trust him because he's lived it."

That trust carried over into the arrival of Head Coach Reggie Barlow, whose leadership, Hoath says, has begun to reshape the team's identity.

"It's been different," he said. "The coaches came in at different times, so finding our identity has taken a minute. But the talent's here. We're just a couple plays away. Once everything clicks, people are going to see who we really are."

Off the field, Hoath leans on his faith and his family — both of which remain central to his life. Whether it's spending time with his siblings, cheering for his brother's amateur fights, or visiting his fiancée, he keeps family close.

"Family time is everything for me," he said. "I love watching my siblings play. My sister cheers, my younger brothers play baseball and soccer, and my other brother is into fighting now. I'm also recently engaged, so spending time with my fiancée means a lot too."

When he's not with family or teammates, Hoath finds peace in quiet moments of reflection.

"Getting into my Bible and praying is something that really grounds me," he said. "It's that reminder that no matter how crazy things get with football or classes, I can always turn to God."

With homecoming week underway, Hoath's focus remains on his purpose — both on and off the field.

"I didn't come here to party," he said. "Homecoming's great, but it's not for football players. We came here to win games, get degrees, and make an impact. That's the job."

From backyard routes with his father to representing his hometown school, Jason Hoath Jr. embodies what it means to be a Tennessee State Tiger — grounded in family, driven by faith, and determined to leave his mark in the city that raised him.



# Football Looks to Snap Skid, Celebrate Homecoming with Renewed Energy

Homecoming week at Tennessee State University is always special — the crowds, the alumni, the music, and the unmistakable pride that fills the air around Hale Stadium. But for head coach Reggie Barlow and his Tigers, Saturday's matchup against Howard is about more than just the celebration. It's about Family.

The Tigers (1-5) enter the contest looking to snap a five-game losing streak after last week's 28-12 setback to Southeast Missouri. Despite the recent stretch, Barlow said the team's focus remains steady as they prepare to host the Bison (3-3), who are coming off a 27-20 loss to Sacred Heart.

"Man, it's homecoming," Barlow said. "I've been hearing all these great things about homecoming here at Tennessee State University. I'm looking forward to it — the festivities, the alumni, the student body. But the work is still on the field. We've got to get ourselves prepared for a good Howard team."

While the week is filled with celebrations, Barlow knows his team's attention must stay between the lines.

"As a player and a coach, I always looked at homecoming as being about the alums who come back," he said. "We want our players to enjoy some of what's happening, but still stay focused and prepare the right way."

That preparation includes building on the positives from last week's performance. Quarterback Byron McNair has been a steady hand for the Tigers, throwing for 663 yards and two touchdowns this season. He's connected often with Devaughn Slaughter, who leads the team with 264 receiving yards, and Snap Reed, who averages 50 yards per game.

On the ground, Kendric Rhymes has been the offensive engine, rushing for 393 yards and three touchdowns, while Zack Simmons-Brown adds another 191 yards and two scores. Simmons-Brown's 50-yard touchdown against SEMO provided one of the team's highlights last weekend.

"That play was blocked up well," Barlow said. "Zack saw a crease and hit it. Of course, once he got through, they couldn't catch him."

Defensively, Kaiki Baker and James Stewart have anchored a unit that forced four turnovers against SEMO. Baker leads the Tigers with 41 tackles, while Stewart has tallied nine tackles for loss and three sacks. Barlow praised the group's resiliency, particularly in the second half of last week's contest.

"I was proud of how our guys stayed in the fight," he said. "They kept competing to the bitter end. That's what we expect from them."

The Tigers will need that same fight against a Howard team that brings a balanced offense led by quarterback Tyriq Starks, who has thrown for 749 yards and four touchdowns, and running back Anthony Reagan Jr., who averages 6.3 yards per carry and has four scores.

"They're well-coached and play hard," Barlow said. "They run some wildcat stuff and do things a little different on special teams. We've got to be ready to go play our style of football — be able to run the ball and execute in all three phases."

Saturday's matchup also carries a bit of added emotion. Last season, TSU spoiled Howard's homecoming in Washington, D.C. Now, the Bison arrive in Nashville looking for payback — and Barlow knows his team must protect its home turf.

"This game has to mean something to us," he said. "Not saying the others didn't, but this is homecoming — Tennessee State homecoming. We want to put on a good show for everyone coming back."

Kickoff is set for 4:30 p.m. at Nissan Stadium, as Tennessee State looks to give its fans more than just a reason to celebrate — but something to cheer about long after the band stops playing.



# Family, Legacy, and the Drive Behind Epoki Fakaosi

The pursuit of excellence runs deep in Tennessee State defensive linebacker Epoki Fakaosi's bloodline. Born in San Jose, California, he grew up surrounded by Olympic stories, world championship medals, and a household that valued humility, respect, and relentless effort.

His mother, Sandra Bacher, is a 14-time U.S. national champion in judo, a three-time Olympian, and a former world champion wrestler. His father, Epoki Sr., a Tongan judo gold medalist, carried the Olympic torch through Tonga for the Sydney 2000 Games.

Many would find that kind of legacy overwhelming—Fakaosi finds it motivating.

"She always taught me to be humble," he said of his mother. "Never be the showboat type. Just be professional. Every time I practice, I try to thank the coaches and do my best—that's how she raised us."

Now a junior transfer making his mark at Tennessee State, Fakaosi is channeling those lessons into his own athletic journey. Through five games this season, he has recorded seven tackles, one sack, a forced fumble, and a blocked kick—all while maintaining a 3.6 GPA as a kinesiology major. His performance reflects the same balance of drive and humility that defined his parents' careers on the international stage.

The Fakaosi household reflected its diverse, high-achieving roots. Training and competition were part of everyday life. Bacher's résumé reads like a chronicle of perseverance: competing in the 1992, 1996, and 2000 Olympic Games, earning a bronze medal at the 1999 Pan American Games, and capturing gold at the 1999 World Wrestling Championships. His father represented Tonga internationally in judo, winning gold at the 2007 South Pacific Games and bronze at both the 2007 Oceania Open World Cup and the 2008 Oceania Championships.

"My mom got me into judo and wrestling," Fakaosi said. "She helped me a lot when I was starting football, too. She's been everywhere competing and knows everyone. Growing up around that kind of discipline taught me a lot about respect and work ethic."

Even his sister, Eleni, carried the family torch, competing in collegiate wrestling at Simon Fraser University in Canada before transitioning into coaching in California.

Despite his family's deep roots in martial arts, Fakaosi's own path took a different turn. "My first time playing was sixth grade," he recalled. "We didn't win a game all season, but I got some time at quarterback and scored our first two touchdowns. After that, I just kept playing every year." In high school, he was the definition of versatility—lining up at quarterback, running back, linebacker, fullback, and defensive line. An injury slowed his college recruitment, sending him down the junior college route before he earned his opportunity at TSU.

"It wasn't easy," he said. "You've got to prove yourself at every level. But that's what my parents always taught me—no matter what, you keep working."

Fakaosi's heritage—Tongan from his father and Japanese and German from his mother—has shaped his perspective on life and leadership. "Honestly, it was really just me, my mom, my sister, and my little brother growing up," he said. "My dad wasn't around a lot, but he did teach me about protecting your family and always being there for your siblings." That lesson remains central to his identity. "One of the patterns on my tattoo means protecting family," he said. "That's what I try to live by—always looking out for them, helping however I can."

At home, his mother made sure the family stayed connected through food and culture. "My mom's Japanese and German, so we ate a lot of Asian food—a lot of rice," he said with a smile. "She always made sure we ate together, even when things got busy." Though the Fakaosis family lived far from extended relatives, their closeness never wavered. "We don't live around a whole bunch of our family," he said. "But for me, it's always family first. I'll put them before myself if I have to."

When it comes to his Tongan roots, Fakaosi understands he's representing more than just himself. Only 16 players born in Tonga have ever reached the NFL, and just 21 players with Tongan heritage suited up in 2024. Among them, Giovanni Manu currently plays for the Detroit Lions.

In the sports world, Tonga and other Polynesian nations are often compared to their uce in Samoa—both countries rich in Olympic martial arts tradition but more widely recognized through football and entertainment. Names like Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, Roman Reigns (Joseph Anoai), and Haku (Tonga Fifita) have

brought Polynesian pride to the global stage, blending strength, culture, and charisma.

"I didn't really know too many athletes from my Tongan side," Fakaosi said. "The only one I remember my dad telling me about was George Holani, who played at Boise State and is now with the Seattle Seahawks. But it just makes me want to represent more."

Whether on the practice field or in the classroom, Fakaosi carries the mindset of an athlete raised in a championship family. He plans to stay involved in sports long after his playing days. "I'm studying kinesiology," he said. "I'd love to keep playing football or maybe get into wrestling or rugby again. But if not, I want to coach or be a personal trainer and start my own gym."

When he's not studying or training, Fakaosi enjoys drawing, painting, spending time with his girlfriend (Athena Barajas) and playing Call of Duty on his PlayStation. His art often reflects his Polynesian heritage. "I've always liked drawing," he said. "A lot of my art is pattern work—kind of like the Tongan tattoos."

From the judo mats of San Jose to the football fields of Nashville, the lessons instilled by his parents remain his foundation. His mother's humility and work ethic continue to guide him. "Even now, she'll say, 'I didn't do much in my time,'" he said. "I'm like, 'Mom, you're an Olympian and a world champion!' But that's who she is. She's humble. She just taught us to always be thankful and respectful."

At Tennessee State, those same values have earned Fakaosi the respect of coaches and teammates alike. His story isn't defined by medals or trophies, but by persistence, gratitude, and family.

"Family is everything," he said. "No matter where life takes me, that's always first."





# Barlow and Co. Focus on Reset as Football Visits SEMO

Tennessee State will look to put an end to its four-game losing streak Saturday when it visits Southeast Missouri for an Ohio Valley—Big South matchup at Houck Stadium. The trip marks TSU's first visit to Cape Girardeau since 2021.

Coming off a 31-7 loss at Eastern Illinois, head coach Reggie Barlow said his team remains committed to improvement despite recent setbacks.

"Obviously, last week for us didn't go the way we wanted it to," Barlow said. "But I'm proud of our guys — they fought hard and stayed in the fight against a really good team. We're experiencing growing pains, but we're getting there. Our guys are going to keep on working, and we'll have a chance to go out and compete this week against SEMO."

The Tigers showed flashes of progress against Eastern Illinois, particularly through the air. Quarterback Byron McNair completed 16 of 20 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown — his most efficient outing of the season. His connection with freshman receiver Snap Reed provided one of TSU's few bright spots, as Reed hauled in his first collegiate touchdown on a 28-yard strike in the fourth quarter.

"Snap is a hard worker — he wants the ball and he's a playmaker," Barlow said. "That was a really good throw by Byron and a good catch by Snap, keeping his feet inbounds. We're happy with where he is right now, and we'll continue to find more ways to get him the ball."

Barlow said McNair's continued development is one of the key storylines as TSU

moves deeper into conference play.

"I thought Byron did some good things last week," Barlow said. "He got the ball to his receivers and showed his running ability, escaping the pocket and keeping plays alive. He's still growing — this is his first time playing Division I football and working with new coordinators — but he's getting better every week."

Defensively, TSU was anchored by James Stewart and Kaiki Baker, who combined for 13 tackles and multiple key stops in the loss at EIU. Stewart, who posted three tackles for loss and a pass breakup, continues to set the tone for the defensive front.

"James Stewart is the standard," Barlow said. "If we can get everyone to match his intensity and approach, we'll be in great shape. Kaiki Baker is a baller — he broke up a big pass in the end zone and came back after a tough hit. Those guys are tough, competitive, and great leaders for our team."

Saturday's matchup pits the Tigers against a SEMO team looking to climb back into the conference race after an up-and-down start to the season. The Redhawks enter the game at 1-4 but remain dangerous on both sides of the ball. Quarterback Jax Leatherwood has thrown for 1,113 yards and seven touchdowns while completing 65 percent of his passes. Running backs Brandon Epton Jr. and Payton Brown provide balance in the ground game, combining for 371 rushing yards and five touchdowns.

SEMO's receiving corps is led by Cam Pedro, who has 25 catches for 316 yards and three touchdowns, and Kalvin Gilbert, who

averages nearly 19 yards per reception. On defense, linebacker Landon Sylvie has recorded 49 total tackles to lead the team, while Latrevion Thompson has 3.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. The Redhawks also feature one of the league's most reliable kickers in Justin Keller, who has made six of eight field-goal attempts, including two from beyond 40 yards.

"They're coming off a bye week, so they've probably had a chance to get some guys healthy," Barlow said. "We know they'll be excited to host us, and we'll be ready to go out there and compete. They've got a solid football team."

The Tigers last faced SEMO in November 2024, earning a 28-21 win at Nissan Stadium to close the regular season and secure a share of the OVC crown. Both rosters look different this fall, and Barlow expects another hard-fought matchup.

"Last year's game was a battle, and they'll probably have a mindset of wanting to get one back," Barlow said. "But it's two new teams — both of us lost a lot of players. We're just focused on getting better each week and seeing how we stack up."

Saturday's trip also offers the Tigers a chance to regroup away from home and strengthen team chemistry.

"I love being on the road with our guys," Barlow said. "There's a sense of togetherness — you see them interacting, bonding, and handling themselves like professionals. I'm proud of how they carry themselves, and I'm looking forward to getting on the bus with them again this week."



# From the Pyramids to the Pyramid to Music City

The sound of a spiraling punt cutting through the summer sky has become a familiar sight at Tennessee State football games. For punter Mark Shenouda, however, each booming kick represents more than just field position — each one reflects a journey that began nearly 6,000 miles away in Cairo, Egypt, and eventually led to the turf at TSU.

"I was actually born in Egypt and grew up playing soccer my whole life," Shenouda said. "When we moved here, I kept playing. My brother was the first one to get into football and seeing him transition from soccer to football really persuaded me to go and learn, too."

His brother, Kerolos Shenouda, played a central role in shaping Mark's path. After the family relocated from Cairo to Mount Juliet, the brothers carried both a love of soccer and the discipline of a tight-knit household. Kerolos tried football first, serving as a kicker and punter at Wilson Central High School before committing to TSU in 2020. Mark followed in his footsteps, but punting always came naturally.

"My older brother taught me a lot," Shenouda said. "He was my mentor. Every year since freshman year of high school, my average has gone up. He always pushed me to be better."

By his senior year at Mount Juliet High School, Shenouda had become one of the nation's top specialists. Rated a five-star punter by Kohl's Kicking in the Class of 2023, he ranked No. 2 in Tennessee and No. 15 nationally. He averaged 42.2 yards per punt with a long of 57. Those numbers made him a coveted recruit and earned him a spot at Memphis to begin his college career.

But football, like life, often requires adjustments.

"Out of high school, I had TSU, but I thought Memphis was where I was supposed to be," Shenouda said. "When the scheme changed there, I hit the portal again. My brother got me in touch with Coach Eddie George and Coach Keith Burns, and I felt like this is where I needed to be."

Shenouda transferred to TSU ahead of the 2024 season, making an immediate impact. He averaged 40.2 yards per punt across 40 attempts that year, with a season-long boot of 60 yards. Through the first four games of 2025, he has improved to 42.5 yards per punt, including 10 pinned inside the 20 and five traveling 50 yards or more.

"I feel like it's been a good start to the season," Shenouda said. "But it could be a lot better. Really, the main thing for me is consistency — perfecting the little things that eventually become big things."

That drive for consistency has been tested under two different coaching regimes at TSU — first under George and Burns, and now under Reggie Barlow and special teams coach Jerod Kruse. The transition has required both physical and mental adjustments.

"The biggest difference is really the punt formation," Shenouda said. "Last year we were in more of a pro style, and this year we're running more spread, which benefits me big time. Having more gunners running down the field to bail me out makes the net punt better."

The new scheme highlights Shenouda's strengths — a powerful leg, steady mechanics, and the ability to flip the field when his team needs it most. And while punters don't get as many chances as other players, he treats every opportunity as a moment to shine.

"In soccer, you're always in the game," he said. "But in football, I don't get many chances. So, when I do, I've got to take advantage of them."

That balance between patience and precision is something Shenouda has carried from his family's journey across continents. Most of his extended relatives remain in Cairo, leaving Nashville as home for him, his parents, and his two brothers. "It's real-

ly just my mom, my dad and my two brothers here," he said. "I went back once, and it was special. All my family is still in Egypt."

In Nashville, Shenouda has built a new home — blending the passion of a soccer player with the focus of a football specialist. His pregame playlist may surprise some, leaning on country artists like Riley Green, Zac Brown Band and Gavin Adcock, but it keeps him calm and locked in.

"Really, I like the fast-paced ones," he said with a grin. "They get me ready for games."

That preparation has extended to leadership. Even as a specialist, Shenouda has embraced a bigger role on the team. "It's something I feel like I was meant to be," he said. "I've been a leader since I was young, and I always liked holding people accountable — which ultimately holds myself accountable. I hope I set a good example for the other guys."

Playing for George sharpened that mentality. "Since day one, he was a big leader," Shenouda said. "I looked up to him, and every day he pushed me to be better. Growing up, I watched him a little, so when I found out he was the head coach here, it was kind of sick that I got to play for someone I watched when I was younger."

Now, under Barlow, Shenouda's role is even more defined. He's not just a punter — he's a field-flipper, a tone-setter, and a symbol of resilience. Every time he drops the ball onto his foot, it's more than a kick. It's the story of Cairo, of Mount Juliet, of family, of patience, of persistence.

And for Shenouda, that story is still being written.

"I feel like every year I get better," he said. "That's the goal. Just keep growing, keep getting more consistent, and keep helping this team."

At TSU, the kid who once chased a soccer ball in Cairo now chases perfection — one punt at a time.





# Football Eyes Road Bounce-Back After Home Setback

Tennessee State football has reached a turning point. After opening the season with four straight home games — capped by a 35-8 loss to Tennessee Tech last weekend — the Tigers are preparing for something new: their first road trip of the year. For head coach Reggie Barlow, it's more than a change of venue. It's a chance for his young team to regroup, build cohesion, and chase its first Ohio Valley Conference win of 2025.

The Tigers (2-2, 0-1 OVC) struggled to find rhythm against Tennessee Tech. The Golden Eagles struck early with a 71-yard touchdown run on the second play from scrimmage and dominated on the ground, piling up nearly 300 rushing yards and three touchdowns. Tech's defense stiffened in the second half, holding TSU to two field goals and a late safety.

Barlow said the loss was disappointing but highlighted positives. "We knew Tennessee Tech was a tough outfit. Sometimes on defense, if you're not in your gap, that can turn into a big play, and that's what happened there. But our guys stayed in the fight. We forced some field goals, even had two misses, and that's something to build from."

Despite the score, TSU controlled the ball for more than 33 minutes and ran 72 plays compared to Tennessee Tech's 55. The defense forced three punts and recorded three sacks. On offense, running back Kendric Rhymes led the Tigers with 31 rushing yards and added 53 receiving yards for 84 all-purpose yards. Quarterback Byron McNair went 8-of-14 for 114 yards, while Jonathan Palmer finished 13-of-25 for 127 yards, showing flashes of the depth Barlow

is developing under center.

The quarterback rotation remains a work in progress. "All three of those guys bring something different," Barlow said. "Mc-Creary, he's smaller but has a good arm and can make plays in the quarterback run game. Byron gives you a little of both. They're all young, just now getting their college experience. We've got to keep developing them and put them in the right situations."

Tennessee State will face another tough test in Eastern Illinois, which opened OVC play with a 31-23 win at Western Illinois. The Panthers (2-2, 1-0 OVC) rolled up 329 yards of offense, fueled by a balanced rushing attack. Jacaree Fleming ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns, while Charles Kellom added 75 yards and a score. Through four games, EIU has averaged more than 24 points per game, topping 30 points twice, demonstrating the effectiveness of its steady ground game and strong offensive line.

Defensively, the Panthers have leaned on a formidable front seven, recording six sacks and 29 tackles for loss through four games. Tylan Foster, Ja'Wuan Nickson, and Saipeti Maiava Jr. have combined for 93 tackles, while Drake Van Hyfte and Samuel Robles each have two sacks. For TSU, finishing drives efficiently against this defense will be critical.

Barlow said film study showed just how complete the Panthers are. "Eastern is a solid team. They've got a massive offensive line, athletic running backs — number 22 [Kellom] and number 28 [Fleming] are really good. Their quarterback [Connor Wolf] is solid, and they've already put up a lot of

points. It's going to be another tough OVC test."

The challenge for Tennessee State goes beyond X's and O's. After four weeks at Nissan Stadium, the Tigers will board buses to Charleston, Illinois, for Saturday's matchup at O'Brien Field. Barlow, who coached in the XFL and UFL where travel was constant, sees the road trip as an opportunity to build team unity. "It's about team camaraderie, being able to travel together. Some of my best memories as a coach are getting on the bus with a group of guys you believe in and trust. You get to have meals together, meet together, stay in a hotel. That builds connection. I'm excited to take that trip with these guys."

The Tigers have shown flashes of what they can be — a strong rushing attack led by Rhymes, a defense that thrives on third down, and special teams anchored by kicker Freddy Perez, who has connected on four field goals this season. But finishing drives remains a challenge. "We've got to finish drives with touchdowns instead of field goals," Barlow said. "We've got to keep building on the positives. Our guys are tough and resilient, and they're going to keep fighting."

Kickoff is set for Saturday afternoon at O'Brien Field. For Tennessee State, the game is more than a contest on the scoreboard. It's a chance to prove that this young team can rise under pressure, grow together on the road, and begin carving out an identity in the OVC. As Barlow puts it, "This trip isn't just about a win — it's about seeing what kind of team we are when we face adversity together."



# Football Regroups After Bye, Prepares for #11 Tennessee Tech

Tennessee State got a rare early season pause in its schedule last week, and head coach Reggie Barlow made sure the Tigers used it wisely. After a demanding start that featured two classics and the top ranked opponent in the first three games, the bye week offered time to heal, refocus and reset ahead of a critical rivalry showdown Saturday at Nissan Stadium against #11 Tennessee Tech.

"Coming off of a bye week, we had a chance to get some work in," Barlow said. "We practiced about three days, really tried to get some guys back healthy and healed up, but also improve our skill set and personnel. The guys came in and worked hard. Coaches did a good job, and we were able to get out and do some recruiting too."

The early slate — which included topranked powerhouse North Dakota State, North Carolina A&T and a matchup with Alabama A&M — tested TSU immediately. While the results were mixed, Barlow believes that kind of competition will pay off as the Tigers move into conference play.

"All these guys want to know how they measure up against the better teams," Barlow said. "We got a chance to play against North Dakota State, obviously they're a really solid program. Now we get another opponent in the top 25. All these games are challenging, but our group will be ready to rock and roll."

On the field, the Tigers have leaned on their ground game to establish rhythm. Running back Kendric Rhymes leads TSU with 228 rushing yards through three games, averaging 4.8 yards per carry. Fellow back Zack Simmons-Brown has chipped in 104 yards and a touchdown, helping the offense surpass 500 total rushing yards.

The passing game has split between quarterbacks. Byron McNair has completed 19 of 31 passes for 169 yards and one touch-

down since taking over as starter, while Jonathan Palmer, who opened the season under center, has gone 16-for-34 for 161 yards. On the outside, Devaughn Slaughter leads the team with 121 receiving yards, while Rhymes has doubled as a reliable target with 77 yards and a touchdown reception.

Special teams have provided consistency as well. Punter Mark Shenouda is averaging 41.9 yards per kick, while kicker Freddy Perez has connected on two field goals from beyond 40 yards.

The Tigers now turn their attention to Tennessee Tech, a team off to one of the hottest starts in the country. The Golden Eagles are 3-0 and have outscored opponents by an average of 60.7 to 10.3, the best scoring margin nationally. They lead the FCS in scoring offense and rank seventh in scoring defense — fourth among teams that have played at least three games.

Tennessee Tech quarterback Kekoa Visperas has directed the offense with efficiency, throwing for 736 yards and eight touchdowns on 68 percent passing with just one interception. The run game has been just as dynamic, with Quintell Quinn averaging 80.7 yards per game and four touchdowns, and Q'Daryius Jennings adding 65 yards per outing with four more scores. Freshman Maurice Sims has contributed 119 yards, highlighted by a 78-yard run. The Golden Eagles' depth has been evident, with nine different receivers catching touchdown passes; Luke Shields leads with two, while Maury Sullivan has a team-high 14 receptions for 162 yards.

"They've been outstanding this season in terms of scoring the ball and defense," Barlow said. "They're a solid football team, and we've got to get ourselves prepared to play. Their quarterback is completing nearly 70 percent of his passes with eight or nine touchdowns and just one interception. He's

doing a good job with the ball."

The rivalry only raises the stakes. Since 1984, TSU and Tennessee Tech have met 38 times, with the Golden Eagles holding a 22-16 edge in the all-time series. The Tigers have delivered statement wins of their own, including a 63-13 rout in 2001, a 44-16 victory at Nissan Stadium in 2016 and a 24-10 road win in the spring 2021 season. But Tech has claimed the last two meetings, including a 35-0 shutout in 2023 and a 24-14 win last year in Cookeville.

This matchup also plays into the Sgt. York Trophy race, which is awarded annually to the team with the best head-to-head record among Tennessee's OVC programs: TSU, Tech and UT Martin. The Tigers have captured the trophy five times, with back-to-back titles in 2007 and 2008 followed by a three-year run from 2011 to 2013. More than a decade later, they are eager to reclaim that honor, and a win over Tech would provide a valuable foothold.

Still, Barlow remains confident in his team's direction. McNair is settling into the starting role, Rhymes has emerged as a reliable playmaker, and the defense has shown the ability to force opponents into long-yardage situations.

"Byron did some good things," Barlow said.
"Obviously, there are things he needs to improve on, but I trust he'll work on those as we prepare for our next opponent. He's a solid player, loves football, hardworking guy. We expect him to make all the necessary adjustments."

The mission is clear: break through against a high-powered Tennessee Tech squad and prove that lessons learned against ranked opponents can translate into wins in the OVC-Big South race. The bye week offered time to regroup. Now the Tigers look to carry that preparation onto the field.



# Football Sets Sights on Victory in Historic Legacy Series Opener

Tennessee State has had little time to dwell on last week's loss to one of the nation's best. The Tigers will need every bit of focus Saturday when they turn the page and welcome Alabama A&M to Nissan Stadium for the debut of the Legacy Series.

The four-year agreement, announced in February, pairs two of the South's most tradition-rich HBCU programs in an annual matchup that will alternate between Nashville and Huntsville through 2028. The Tigers and Bulldogs first met in 1930, with TSU holding a 21–8 edge in the all-time series. The teams haven't faced each other since 2010, when Tennessee State claimed a 27–14 victory. Saturday's meeting at Nissan Stadium marks the beginning of a new chapter in this storied rivalry, with kickoff set for 3:30 PM.

For Tennessee State head coach Reggie Barlow, the chance to highlight history while testing his team against a familiar opponent is a rare opportunity.

"They had a shootout versus Alcorn State and was able to pull out the victory," Barlow said of Alabama A&M's home-opening win. "Really good team, quarterback [Cornelious Brown IV] playing well, got a lot of guys on defense running to the ball. So should be a fun matchup and i'm looking forward to it."

Saturday's game marks the first meeting between the schools in 15 years. TSU leads the all-time series 21–8, but Alabama A&M enters with momentum after Brown IV accounted for five touchdowns and 260 passing yards in a 41–31 victory over Alcorn State.

The Tigers, meanwhile, are trying to rebound from a loss to defending national champion North Dakota State. Barlow said the test offered value beyond the final score.

"Getting a chance to play against North Dakota State really was an honor for us. You always wanna see how you measure up against teams and programs like that," Barlow said. "In the second half, our guys went out, they stayed in the fight, they competed hard, and was able to play with some pride at the end of the game. So that made us proud that we finished like that. That game, I think, will help us down the road when we come up against another opponent like that that has great talent, great program and all that stuff."

TSU opened the year with a narrow 24–21 win over North Carolina A&T in the John A. Merritt Classic, a game that highlighted some of the Tigers' emerging playmakers. Running back Kendric Rhymes, a transfer from Southern, rushed for 174 yards and two scores in his debut. His coach sees him as more than just a weapon in the backfield.

"Obviously, he's a really good football player, even better person, comes to work every day with great attitude, positive attitude," Barlow said. "Playing in the SWAC, he's had his chances and opportunities to play against Alabama A&M," George said. "Like I said, he knows they're a tough team."

Quarterback Jonathan Palmer has thrown for 161 yards and one touchdown through the first two games, while freshman receiver Devaughn Slaughter has shown flashes as a deep threat, hauling in five catches for 106 yards and a score. The Tigers will need more consistency offensively to keep pace with Alabama A&M's high-powered attack.

Defensively, Tennessee State will look to build on flashes of toughness shown in the second half against North Dakota State. The Tigers know the key will be slowing down Brown and cutting down big plays, and if they can carry that fight into four quarters, they'll give themselves a strong chance to make the Legacy Series opener a memorable one.

Beyond the on-field matchups, Saturday also carries meaning for the program and its supporters. TSU has promoted the Legacy Series as a showcase for HBCU excellence and an opportunity to strengthen ties between two universities with proud football traditions. Barlow said the atmosphere will be just as important as the competition.

"We're looking forward to our fans coming out, being part of this game, cheering on our student-athletes, and bringing the noise," Barlow said. "I know our supporters will be there to back us."

For Big Blue, the Legacy Series opener offers a chance to reset, show resilience after a tough loss, and celebrate the program's place in HBCU football history. With tradition on one side, momentum on the other, and pride on the line, Saturday's matchup could be an early turning point in the Tigers' season.



# From Blocked Kick to Big Stage: Football Ready for Bison Showdown

The stage is set for one of the biggest challenges Tennessee State football has faced in recent years. Fresh off a dramatic Week 1 victory over North Carolina A&T in the John A. Merritt Classic, the Tigers now welcome the nation's top-ranked team and defending FCS national champion, North Dakota State, to Nissan Stadium on Saturday.

For TSU, the matchup comes with both confidence and urgency. The Tigers have now won back-to-back season openers and claimed their third straight Merritt Classic. But the real test begins against a program that has set the gold standard for FCS dominance.

Running back Kendric Rhymes wasted no time making his presence felt in his TSU debut. The transfer powered his way to 174 rushing yards and two touchdowns, earning recognition as HBCU National Co-Player of the Week. His punishing runs, particularly in the second half, gave the Tigers the spark they needed to pull ahead.

"I think Kendric Rhymes ... rhymes with Big Time," said Barlow. "He plays the game the right way. Coach Harris and staff did a great job getting him the hall."

The Tigers' offense found its rhythm after halftime, piling up 173 of their 252 total yards and scoring 14 points — all on the ground from Rhymes.

There were fireworks through the air as well. Quarterback Jonathan Palmer, the hometown product, connected early with fellow newcomer Devaughn Slaughter on an 82-yard strike that electrified the crowd. Slaughter finished with four catches for 102 yards and a

touchdown, plus 35 yards on kickoff returns — a performance that earned him OVC-Big South Freshman of the Week honors.

"I tell people he's been here before," Barlow said of Slaughter. "He doesn't carry himself like a freshman. He's big, he's strong, and he wants the ball all the time."

TSU's defense also made its mark, stifling the Aggies for much of the night. North Carolina A&T managed just 219 total yards — with 173 of those coming in the fourth quarter — and scored only once.

Kaiki Baker paced the unit with nine tackles, while James Stewart earned John A. Merritt Classic Defensive Player of the Game honors after recording six tackles, one forced fumble, and a sack. Byron Davis and Ravon Johnson also forced fumbles, with Syncere Safeeullah recovering both.

"I thought the defense played very hard and physical," said defensive coordinator Gregg Williams. "These guys have bought in. James played outstanding, but I thought there were a lot of guys who stood out."

The defining moment came with just six seconds remaining. Clinging to a threepoint lead, TSU faced a tense finish as the Aggies lined up for a potential game-tying 38-yard field goal from the 21-yard line. That's when Lathun Snipes broke through and blocked the kick, sealing the Tigers' victory in dramatic fashion.

Special teams provided steady contributions throughout the night under new coordinator Jerod Kruse, going a perfect 3-for-3 on extra points while adding a field goal.

"It was a situation where, at the end of the game, we ran a block we'd shown earlier," said Kruse. "In that moment, guys pushed a little harder and moved the line back. Snipes got his right hand up, and once he blocked it, the rest was history."

While the Tigers look to build on their momentum, they know Saturday's opponent represents the pinnacle of FCS football. North Dakota State, winners of 10 of the last 13 national championships, opened its 2025 campaign with a dominant 38-0 win at The Citadel. The Bison showcased their trademark physicality, piling up 519 yards of offense despite being held scoreless in the first quarter. Quarterback Cole Payton led the ground attack with 103 rushing yards, while running back Barika Kpeenu added 80 yards and two touchdowns.

The showdown at Nissan Stadium offers TSU both a measuring stick and an opportunity. For a program eager to climb back into the national conversation, facing the defending champions provides exactly the kind of stage the Tigers have been building toward.

And the atmosphere should be every bit as electric as the matchup. The Merritt Classic crowd brought the energy in Week 1, and with the Bison faithful known for traveling well, Saturday's game is expected to deliver a charged environment inside Nissan Stadium. For the Tigers, it's not only about competing with the champions — it's about doing so in front of a showcase crowd on their home stage.





# Kruse Brings NFL Pedigree, Development Focus to Secondary

When Jerod Kruse joined Tennessee State this summer as special teams coordinator and secondary coach, he immediately recognized the Tigers had something many college programs lack: depth in the defensive backfield.

"Coming from the NFL, you're used to traveling with seven or eight defensive backs," Kruse said. "Now, we've got 11 or 12 guys who can all contribute in some way. That's a blessing."

That depth, combined with Kruse's emphasis on teaching and player development, could play a major role in TSU's push for consistency in 2025. After years of tutelage under around Gregg Williams' defensive system, the secondary is expected to anchor a Tigers defense that prides itself on physical play and speed.

Kruse is not building the group alone. Former Super Bowl MVP Dexter Jackson, who played more than a decade in the NFL, works closely with the defensive backs, while analyst Justin Hannah provides additional support after professional stints in the CFL and NFL camps. Together, the staff is creating an environment centered on accountability and growth.

"These guys have taken coaching really well," Kruse said. "We coach them hard in practice, then on game day we want them to play fast and confident. That balance has helped them grow through camp."

A longtime collaborator with current TSU defensive coordinator Gregg Williams, Kruse has carried a consistent philosophy throughout his career: players respond to coaches who make them better.

"Our philosophy has always been that players will follow you if they believe you can help them improve," Kruse said. "Gregg has turned more undrafted free agents into Pro Bowlers than just about anyone in the last 25 years. That's development. That's what we're bringing to TSU—finding each player's strength and holding them accountable to it."

Kruse's coaching toolbox also includes an innovative background with technology. He has consulted with EA Sports on the Madden video game series, helping design scheme adjustments. That experience, he said, has given him a new perspective on how young players learn the game.

"Practice mode is an incredible teaching tool," Kruse said. "Players can run formations, recognize alignments and communicate in real time with a joystick in hand. The brain doesn't distinguish between mental reps and physical reps, so you can stack learning without adding wear and tear on the body."

Those methods align with Tennessee State's broader embrace of analytics and artificial intelligence. Kruse saw the trend firsthand in his recent stint with the Cleveland Browns, where Al-driv-

en teaching tools and virtual meeting rooms became part of daily preparation.

"Al is the buzzword right now, and everybody is figuring out how it fits," he said. "Some of the technology can break down film faster, and virtual teaching models can help players get more reps without taking more hits. At the end of the day, it's all about making them better and keeping them healthy."

For Kruse, the message to his players at TSU is simple: they are here because they have talent, and it's his job to maximize it.

"They wouldn't be here if they didn't have something special," Kruse said. "Our job is to figure out what that is, develop it, and put them in positions to succeed. If they believe you can make them better, they'll give you everything they've got."

As the Tigers prepare for the 2025 season, Kruse's blend of NFL experience, innovative teaching, and emphasis on player development may be exactly what helps turn depth into dominance.



# Special Teams Poised for Growth with Barlow at the Helm

Special teams has long been called football's "hidden third," but at Tennessee State, it's beginning to stand shoulder-to-shoulder with offense and defense. The Tigers are betting that a renewed focus on this phase of the game will give them a competitive edge.

The shift comes with the arrival of Jerod Kruse, TSU's new special teams coordinator and secondary coach, alongside the rare perspective of head coach Reggie Barlow—a former NFL standout return specialist. Together, they are building a unit capable of flipping fields, swinging momentum, and winning games.

Before becoming a coach, Barlow spent seven seasons in the NFL with the Jacksonville Jaguars and Tampa Bay Buccaneers, establishing himself as a dynamic playmaker in the return game. He totaled 92 kickoff returns for 1,855 yards and one touchdown, and 158 punt returns for 1,639 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 23.2 yards per kickoff and 10.4 yards per punt. For Tennessee State, those numbers are more than statistics—they serve as a blueprint.

"Coach Barlow knows exactly what it looks like to change a game on special teams," Kruse said. "That perspective trickles down to our players. It's not just about kicking and covering—it's about creating opportunities."

Kruse's approach emphasizes flexibility across the unit. "Sometimes it's a crapshoot," he said. "One guy today, another guy tomorrow, depending on the game. We've looked at a bunch of players back

there."

That extends to the kicking game, where Kruse stresses consistency and resilience as much as mechanics. "There's no kicker in the world who's ever been 100% on PATs or field goals," he said. "Short memories—if you miss, you have to move on to the next play because you're only as good as your next one."

Kruse highlighted the impact of punter Mark Shenouda. "Mark got some kicks in last year, so he's really the only returning specialist," Kruse said. "What I've really liked about him is his approach with the group overall and his role as the veteran leader of the specialist units. He's taken it upon himself to hold the group accountable to the standards we set, and he knows that if anything's wrong, I go to him first. He's embraced the coaching, stepped into the leadership role, and the rest of the guys have followed in a really positive way."

A key part of that development is finding the right fit for critical roles. Kruse said the Tigers are testing multiple players in return positions, with guidance from Barlow and assistant Nick Andrews, both of whom excelled in similar roles during their careers. "It's nice to have guys like Nick Andrews and Coach Barlow, who know what it takes," Kruse said. "We've worked with several players, and we haven't locked in on one yet. The good thing is we have multiple guys we're developing to be proficient."

"When I got here in May, they'd already done some really good things in

the past," Kruse said. "We're making a few slight adjustments in technique and approach, but the group has been extremely coachable. From mid-May to now, and adding a few in early August, the growth over the last few weeks has been exactly what we wanted."

# Harris Returns Home With Alumni Spirit and Renewed Championship Confidence

When Shannon Harris walks into the Tennessee State football offices, the walls are the same, the hallways are familiar, and the memories come rushing back. For the former Tigers quarterback and longtime assistant, returning to his alma mater feels like stepping back home — but with a program moving forward in new ways.

Harris is entering his third stint on the TSU staff, this time as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He first traded his cleats for a whistle in 2003 as a graduate assistant and went on to serve in nearly every offensive role through 2009. He returned in 2018 as an analyst, was elevated to offensive coordinator in 2019–20, and left the program in 2021 following the arrival of then-head coach Eddie George.

Now, four years later, Harris is back on Jefferson Street, bringing with him fresh perspective — and hardware. He spent the past two seasons with the DC Defenders of the United Football League, helping guide the team to a championship in 2025 and earning UFL Coach of the Year honors.

"To go from being a head coach at that level and now back as an assistant, I think everyone should experience that," Harris said. "It makes you better. You understand why head coaches say certain things, and you manage the game differently. It's made me a much stronger coordinator, and I'm excited to bring that here."

What excites Harris just as much as the playbook is the renewed spirit of TSU's alumni and fan base. From his playing days in the early 2000s, Harris recalls the old tradition of former players — some coming straight from work shifts

— gathering along the practice field fence to cheer on the team.

That culture, he said, is coming alive again under head coach Reggie Barlow.

"With Coach Barlow's vision, you can definitely see the excitement," Harris said. "I've seen more former players at scrimmages in the last year than I had in the last 15 or 20. Guys are reengaged, and that matters to this program. It feels like the TSU I remember."

Barlow has made embracing TSU's alumni a priority. From open practices to community events, he has worked to ensure former players feel connected — something Harris said makes a difference for both recruiting and gameday atmosphere.

That connection will be tested and showcased in 2025 as the Tigers host an unprecedented eight home games, the most in program history. For a fan base that once packed Nissan Stadium with crowds of 20,000 to 30,000 during Harris's playing career, the expanded home schedule is an opportunity to show out again.

"It's huge for our fan base," Harris said. "We don't have to go to Memphis or Atlanta anymore — those fans can come here. With the type of schedule we have, and bringing Alabama A&M, North Dakota, and others right here, it's a chance to get the city involved and give our players the support they deserve."

Last season, TSU averaged just over 8,000 fans per game — a number Harris believes can grow with consistency and alumni engagement.

"Coming off a championship season and with eight home games, there's no reason not to fill it up," Harris said. "I've been part of those nights when 40,000 people were in the stands. These young guys deserve that same energy."

Harris's coaching journey — from TSU to Alabama State, Alcorn State, Virginia State, and the UFL — has been marked by steady growth. His return is more than just another job move; it's a homecoming rooted in pride and responsibility.

"This place means everything to me," Harris said. "When I walk around campus, I see the same buildings and remember the same moments from when I played here. But I also see the growth Dr. (Mikki) Allen has brought to athletics. It's not just football — the whole department is moving forward. To be back as part of that is special."

As TSU prepares for the new season, Harris represents both continuity and fresh momentum — an alum returning home with championship experience, charged with leading an offense that will be central to the Tigers' aspirations.

"It's not just about football," Harris said.
"It's about reconnecting the alumni, engaging the city, and making this program something everyone is proud of. That's why I came back. And I believe the support is here to make it happen."

# Russ Ehrenfeld Returns to Tennessee State with NFL Track Record

Russ Ehrenfeld is back at Tennessee State University for the fourth time, and his connection to the Tigers runs deep. The offensive line coach has spent 16 seasons with the program across multiple stints and has developed a reputation for producing NFL-caliber players, whether through the draft or free agency.

"I just love Tennessee State. I love what it stands for. I love the young people that come to school here," Ehrenfeld said. "The people that I have worked with here and the people I'm currently working with are great. I just have a great love and affection for TSU."

Ehrenfeld first arrived on campus in 1997 and was part of two Ohio Valley Conference championship teams. The 1999 squad achieved a national No. 1 ranking, cementing the Tigers' place in college football history. "The walls were built by a lot of great people, a lot of great football players, a lot of great athletes overall that have put this place on the map," he said, reflecting on TSU's legacy.

Known as "the NFL guy," Ehrenfeld has guided dozens of Tigers to professional careers. "Once you start coaching and you are around other coaches and they mentor you, or you buy into what they're emphasizing, you just become a student

of the game," he said. "I've been very blessed to work with some great players who bought into what I was teaching. Then the light turned on, the switch turned on, and they just kept working hard."

Recruiting is a cornerstone of Ehrenfeld's approach. He blends old-school techniques — visiting a prospect's home or speaking with family — with modern strategies using social media and film. "I came up originally with Splice and Film, and then it went to VHS to Disks. That changed it. But there's a loyalty. Guys can be in the portal and play for you for one season, then get in the portal again. So that makes a difference," he said.

Ehrenfeld's professional experience in leagues like the XFL and UFL gives him a unique perspective. "We had guys from Stanford, James Madison, Mizzou, Oregon State, Georgia — all different backgrounds," he said. "Those guys buying into what I was teaching, and me meeting them halfway, is how we became successful."

His love for Nashville also runs deep. A New Jersey native who attended college in Chattanooga, Ehrenfeld appreciates the city's growth and culture. "There's some great pizza places here now that weren't here 25, 30 years ago.

Monell's in Germantown is a spot I like, and the 51st Deli up on 51st Street," he said. "The music, Lower Broadway, it's all great. I've been fortunate; I have a nephew in the music industry at a very high level, and I've been able to see some great shows. I enjoy that."

As Ehrenfeld settles into his latest tenure at TSU, his focus remains on the offensive line and developing players ready for the next level. His career, which spans college and professional football, his dedication to Tennessee State, and his love for Nashville make him a cornerstone of the Tigers' program.



# Morgan's Déjà Vu: Experience and Heart Return Home

Toriano Morgan walked across Tennessee State's campus recently and felt as if he had traveled back in time. "Making my walk to lunch today, I kind of felt like it was 2000 and I was a senior walking to the cafeteria," Morgan said. "The buildings have changed a little bit, the campus has grown a lot. But for the most part, it still has that homely feeling."

Morgan, a former TSU wide receiver and team captain, has returned to his alma mater as co-offensive coordinator and running backs coach under head coach Reggie Barlow. It is a homecoming more than two decades in the making for a coach with more than 20 years of experience at the high school and collegiate levels. "To be back and be able to serve in a school that's been great to me is just amazing," Morgan said. "This program groomed me as a player and transitioned me into coaching. I couldn't write a better story."

A native of Fort Lauderdale, Morgan began his coaching career at Tennessee State in 2002 as a graduate assistant before moving on to stints at Dillard High School, Virginia Union, and Virginia State.

Most recently, he served as head coach at Edward Waters University, where he earned the nickname "Mr. 180" for turning programs around. Under his leadership, the Tigers recorded their first winning season in more than two decades and entered the HBCU D2 national polls

for the first time as a full SIAC member in 2023.

Morgan's success has been recognized nationally. In 2022, he participated in the NFL's Coaching Academy, was named to FootballScoop's Rising Star Coaches Watch List, and was selected as head coach for the nationally televised HBCU Pigskin All-Star Classic. Throughout his coaching career, he has guided 35 all-conference players and helped 13 athletes reach the NFL. Known for his innovative offensive strategies. Morgan developed record-setting units at Edward Waters, including quarterback Jyron Russell, who became the school's modern-day all-time leading passer, and Johnny Jones, an All-American honoree.

Returning to Nashville, Morgan has been struck by the growth of both the city and the university. "Going downtown, the biggest building used to be the Batman building. Now you can't even see it because there are so many bigger ones," he said. "That expansion shows the growth of the city and the commitment of Tennessee State to grow as well."

On the field, Morgan has been impressed by the leadership of TSU's veteran players, who have helped set the tone for younger athletes. "Those guys have had team success and individual success, so they're able to show the younger guys exactly how to do it," he said. "From day one, we've set our expectations and our

goals, and everyone has fallen in line." He emphasizes preparation and execution as central tenets of the team's philosophy. "It's about doing it the way we practice and letting the chips fall where they may," Morgan said.

The 2025 schedule features eight home games, a rarity for TSU in recent years. Morgan said that home-field advantage is significant not only for performance but also for the legacy of Tennessee State football. "There's no place like home," he said. "It's unacceptable for TSU football not to play well and to lose at home in front of our fans. Having eight home games on familiar turf gives us something to defend, and that's truly going to work in our favor."

The Tigers' schedule also features marquee HBCU matchups alongside nonconference tests, including perennial FCS power North Dakota State. Morgan sees these games as an opportunity to showcase both TSU football and the broader TSU experience. "Families can come out, tailgate, and young Tigers can see what it's all about," he said. "That's where it starts — making that impression so they want to grow up and be part of this tradition and legacy."

For Morgan, being back at Tennessee State is the culmination of a career built on both success and loyalty to his roots. "You couldn't script it any better," he said. "I'm blessed to be here and to help carry this program forward."



# Cedric Thornton Brings HBCU Legacy and Leadership to TSU

For Cedric Thornton, coming to Tennessee State as associate head coach and linebackers coach is about more than football—it's about family, legacy, and a lifelong bond with Reggie Barlow.

Thornton, who has previously held head coaching roles and built programs at multiple levels, described his bond with TSU head coach Reggie Barlow as lifelong. "Family, look out for family. My Lord and I, we've known each other since we were 18 years old. He's a brother to me, always will be a brother to me," Thornton said. When Barlow reached out to bring him to TSU, Thornton said it was impossible to ignore the call.

Being named associate head coach at a university with the storied history of John Merritt was meaningful on multiple levels. "It means a lot. It means my head coach sees something in me and the leadership passing. This school has a lot of history. My father-in-law, my mother-in-law, both went to school here. Father-in-law played ball here. It probably means more to them than it does to me because now their grandson gets to come be around," Thornton said.

While the title carries prestige, he emphasized that his focus is on serving wherever needed. "The title's a title. I'm a football coach. I just do whatever the

boss man asks me."

Thornton's connection to TSU runs beyond coaching; it is personal and familial. "I'm a guy, man, and I love our schools. I'm an HBCU guy. I love our schools. Like I said, it just means a little bit more because I have some family ties to the university," he said.

Walking through campus, Thornton sees the history and legacy of those who came before him—from John Merritt to Coach Gilliam and countless others—reinforcing the sense of responsibility he feels as a coach and mentor.

For Thornton, the presence of alumni and community members at games and practices carries more weight than any paycheck. "I can go to work for a dollar, but their presence means a lot. Just to see those guys get the encouragement from them, it means a lot," he said, reflecting on the volunteers and alumni who devote time and energy to support TSU athletes.

Thornton also sees the role of the community in fostering team spirit and connection. "With the history of this school, with all the great things and people that have been through here, I don't understand how it can be hard to get behind them. The moment we get to the point to realizing that, regardless of who's

standing on the sideline, those young men are still wearing blue and white... support them," he said. He noted that even though TSU is not his alma mater, he stands respectfully during the alma mater and daily recitations of the Tiger Creed as a sign of reverence for the university and its traditions.

As TSU football enters a season with a first-year staff and eight home games, Thornton sees an opportunity to strengthen the bond between players, coaches, alumni, and fans. For him, returning to a place intertwined with his family and lifelong friendships is a reminder that coaching is about more than wins and losses—it's about legacy, community, and family.



# Music City Miracle to Roar City: Gregg Williams' Homecoming at Nissan Stadium

Gregg Williams stood near midfield at Nissan Stadium, the summer sun cutting across the empty seats as Tennessee State wrapped up a scrimmage. He tugged at his whistle, his eyes sweeping across the field he once called home during some of the most unforgettable moments in Tennessee Titans history.

Just stepping onto the turf, he said, brought a rush of memories.

"It made me smile just walking in here today," Williams said. "And I need to smile as much as I can in life. I've got great memories of living here - one of my favorite cities of the 10 NFL cities I've lived in. And there were some big-time games when I walked in here that we were in. I can't wait to be in some big-time games with these young men right here."

For Williams, the new defensive coordinator at Tennessee State, this season is more than just another job. It's a homecoming of sorts — a return to Music City, to the same stadium where he helped lead the Titans to a Super Bowl appearance during the famed 1999 season and the "Music City Miracle."

Williams spent a decade with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans franchise, carving out a reputation as one of the NFL's fiercest defensive minds. His units were physical, disciplined, and relentless — a reflection of his own fiery presence on the sideline. He later went on to become the head coach of the Buffalo Bills (2001-03) and interim head coach of the Cleveland Browns (2018), with stops at nearly a dozen NFL franchises, including this writer's favorite, the New York Jets

But when he looks back on his career, Williams is quick to point to one name: Jeff Fisher.

"Jeff was one of the best guys I've ever worked with," Williams said. "We grew together. Those were some of the best years of my life."

Fisher and Williams spent more than a decade and a half together with the Oilers/Titans and again with the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams,

forging a partnership that helped define an era of football in Nashville.

Now, at 67, Williams isn't chasing the next NFL job. Instead, he's pouring his energy into teaching — and that, he says, is where he finds the most iov.

"The three happiest places I am in life...One, with my family. Two, inside the white lines — I'm a competitionaholic — and three, helping young men and young women be who they want to be," Williams said. "At this stage of my career, I only want to coach with people I like being around. Reggie [Barlow] is a big-time coach. I enjoy helping him grow too. So, this is a family moment, along with helping as many men and women as we can grow up in this profession."

Williams first crossed paths with TSU head coach Reggie Barlow and offensive coordinator Shannon Harris in the XFL and UFL, where they spent the past two seasons with the D.C. Defenders. When Barlow got the call to take over the Tigers, Williams didn't hesitate to follow.

It also helped that Tennessee State wasn't unfamiliar territory.

"In 1997, we practiced on Tennessee State's campus," Williams said. "And in 1998, we practiced in a bankrupt mall parking lot on the grass. We finally got here in 1999. I remember great things and some phenomenal players that came from this university during the times I've been in the league since 1989. I've always thought greatly about Eddie George [former TSU head coach] and his staff, too, because five of those guys have been on my staff. I think the world of them."

Williams sees his role at Tennessee State as both a teacher and a mentor, not just to players but also to young coaches eager to break into the profession. His passion for development has long been a part of his DNA, from his early days coaching high school football in Missouri to building NFL defenses.

"I love this stage of it," Williams said. "Because

I get to help these guys chase their goals whether that's the NFL, coaching, or whatever profession they choose. This place has always produced competitors."

Nashville itself has changed dramatically since Williams last lived here. The skyline is taller. the city busier, the football scene even more competitive. But for Williams, the city's spirit remains the same.

"You don't think the music industry isn't competitive? Or some of the billion-dollar companies here?" Williams said. "This place has a ton of competition in it. And those kinds of young men have prospered coming out of here. So, I want to help as many young men as we can here on this team — and young women in the different departments of this program — to grow and keep going, because that's Nashville."

Of course, returning to Nashville also means reconnecting with old haunts. Asked about his favorite places to eat, Williams' face softened as he recalled one in particular.

"Jimmy Buffett's [Margaritaville] place downtown," he said with a smile. "Jimmy was a very close friend of mine. He helped a lot with my foundation for children. I always loved going down there."

Inside Nissan Stadium, though, the pull is strongest. Williams says the rush of competition hasn't dulled, even after more than three decades of coaching at the highest levels.

"I love being inside the lines," Williams said. "That hasn't changed. To get another chance to do it here, in Music City, it's pretty special."

As the Tigers wrapped up their final scrimmage, Williams lingered on the turf at Nissan Stadium, whistle in hand, watching players jog to the sideline. For a man who once called the NFL's brightest stages home, the empty seats and echo of footsteps offered something just as meaningful — another chance to compete, another chance to teach, and another chapter in a city that still feels like home.

#### 2-MINUTE OFFENSE

**OPENING KICKOFF:** Tennessee Tech is ranked No. 5/5 this week, marking the 23rd consecutive week that an Association member has appeared in the National Top 25 poll -- extending a league record that began Sept. 16, 2024. It is Tennessee Tech's highest ranking ever in the I-AA/FCS era (since 1978), as well as the highest ranking for a member during the OVC-Big South's existence. The previous best was No. 6 (SEMO in 2024). In addition, TTU has been ranked in the Top 10 a record five consecutive weeks.

1st DOWN: Tennessee Tech is the first team in the Association's brief history to open a season 9-0, and is one of just four FCS programs at least 9-0 at this point of the 2025 season. It is Tech's second-ever 9-0 start (1952 squad opened 9-0). The Golden Eagles' current 14-game win streak is the longest active streak in the Football Championship Subdivision, and is the longest overall winning streak in the Association's history.

2nd DOWN: Tennessee Tech has won 10-straight conference games, the longest conference-game win streak in the Association's three seasons of existence. The previous record was five

3rd DOWN: Tennessee Tech can clinch a share of the 2025 OVC-Big South Association championship with a win on Saturday. TTU can win the outright crown this weekend with a victory COMBINED with a loss by UT Martin.

4th DOWN: UT Martin's overtime victory over Eastern Illinois last week was the Skyhawks' fourth OT win in five overtime games during the history of the OVC-Big South Association. UTM's five overtime games is the most in the league, as are its four overtime wins. EIU is second to the Skyhawks for most overtime contests with four (2-2 record). UT Martin and Eastern Illinois have needed OT twice in the last three seasons (UTM is 2-0).

### ABOUT THE OVC-BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

This is the third season of the OVC-Big South Football Association. On Feb. 22, 2022, the Big South Conference and Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of an association of their football member institutions that began play with the 2023 NCAA Division I football season. The initial agreement of at least four years was enhanced on June 12, 2024 that will provide an opportunity to extend the original partnership through 2030 and beyond. The unique agreement combines the two conferences' football membership to ensure NCAA championship access and stability for the multisport conferences. In creating the association, presidents from each of the multisport conferences pointed to the similiarities of the OVC and the Big South, with their complementary geographies and intercollegiate athletic philosophies, as key to making this association possible

#### PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - Nov. 3

#### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Zolten Osborne, Charleston Southern, QB • 6-1, 205 R-So. • North Charleston, S.C.

Osborne earned the award for the second time in three weeks after passing for a career-high 302 yards and accounting for two touchdowns as Charleston Southern won 23-17 at Southeast Missouri. It marked the thirdstraight victory for the Buccaneers, the team's longest winning streak since 2019. The redshirt sophomore completed 17-of-35 passes for 302 yards and a touchdown and carried the ball eight times for 11 yards and another score. Osborne scored his first career rushing touchdown on a four-yard scramble in the second quarter. Two and a half minutes later he connected with Rashawn Cunningham for a 14-yard score to put the team ahead 17-3. He has thrown for 250 or more yards in each of his past three games and tossed at least one touchdown in four-straight contests.

#### **CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Maurice LaPierre, Tennessee Tech, DL • 6-1, 228, Sr. • Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

LaPierre had three sacks (for -25 yards), four solo tackles, a forced fumble and three quarterback hurries to pace No. 8 ranked Tennessee Tech to a 27-21 win over Gardner-Webb. With the win the Golden Eagles improved to 9-0 on the season, its best start since 1952. His first sacked results in a forced fumble and Tech at the end of the third quarter with his team trailing by four points; two plays later Tennessee Tech scored to grab the lead and would not trail again. He would add two more sacks in the final quarter, the last coming on GWU's final drive of the game, where LaPierre also added a pair of quarterback hurries, resulting in a turnover on downs. LaPierre ranks third in the OVC-Big South and 23rd nationally in sacks (0.75).

#### Sanjay Strickland, Lindenwood, LB • 6-3, 219, R-Sr. • Arvada, Colo.

Strickland keyed a defense that limited Tennessee State to just 36 rushing yards (and 168 yards of total offense) as Lindenwood won 35-13 in Nashville. The senior had seven solo tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (for -20 yards), 1.0 sack (for -12 yards) and a fumble recovery as the Lions improved to 3-2 in Association play.

### **SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Zach Gordon, Charleston Southern, K • 6-0, 190, Jr. • Lillington, N.C.

Gordon tallied 11 kicking points, making three field goals and two point after attempts as Charleston Southern won 23-17 at Southeast Missouri. The junior connected from 21 and 30 yards out in the first half, and cemented the victory with a 25-yarder with 2:54 to play in the game to push the advantage to six points.

#### **FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK**

CJ Bennett, Lindenwood, RS/WR • 5-5, 169, Fr. • East St. Louis, Ill.

Bennett accounted for 114 return yards, helping Lindenwood start with good field position in the Lions' 35-13 victory at Tennessee State. The freshman averaged 15.0 yards on three punt returns with a long return of 31 yards. Bennett averaged 34.5 yards on two kickoff returns with a long of 35 yards. Bennett ranks second in the OVC-Big South and 29th nationally in combined kick return yards (403).

## **ASSOCIATION 30 FOR 30**

What if I told you that the winning team in 15 of the 24 Association conference games played thus far (=62.5 percent) scored at least 30 points in their respective victories? The winning team has scored 35, 31, 35, 34, 66, 30, 30, 31, 21, 32, 28, 27, 52, 37, 42, 29, 42, 17, 17, 48, 27, 23, 27 and 35 for an average of 33.2 points. The average margin of victory after 24 games is 16.04, as 14 of the 24 contests have been decided by double-digits. In addition, Tennessee Tech's 46-point triumph over Western Illinois in Week 6 was the highest win margin for a conference game in Association history. The previous high was 42 points (Tennessee Tech 52, Lindenwood 10 on Nov. 2, 2024).

#### RUSH HOUR

Eastern Illinois QB **COLE LaCRUE**'s 548 rushing yards this year are the most in a single-season by a quarterback in OVC-Big South Association history, breaking the previous record of 391, set by Gardner-Webb's **JAYLEN KING** in 2023. LaCrue, who tied the Association record for longest rush by a QB with a 59-yard scamper in Week 8 at Southeast Missouri, is fourth overall in the conference in rushing yards. Meanwhile, four other quarterbacks have rushed for more than 200 yards this season, and are among the Top 13 in a season for a signal-caller. Here are the five and their all-time single-season rank:

## TWO-BY-FOUR

Two players enter this week with touchdown streaks of at least five games: Gardner-Webb's CARSON GRESOCK (6 games, 11 TD in that span), and UT Martin's JASE BAUER (5 games, 7 TD). Gresock's string is the longest in the OVC-Big South this season, as Tennessee Tech's QUINTELL QUINN opened the year with a 5-game touchdown scoring streak. The overall league record is eight (Western Illinois' CAMEREN SMITH in 2024).

## **CARSON WILL SOCK IT TO YOU**

Gardner-Webb RB **CARSON GRESOCK** tied the OVC-Big South Association single-game record with four touchdowns (all rushing) in a win at Lindenwood in Week 9. It was the seventh overall 4-touchdown performance in league annals, and the fifth 4-TD rushing effort. Gresock finished with 119 rushing yards — his third 100-yard rushing game in a four-game span, and he is third overall in the Association with 627 yards. In Week 7, Gresock became just the third player in Association history with two 50-yard touchdown runs in the same game when he achieved the feat at Eastern Illinois. He first scored on a 64-yard run, and added a 55-yard scoring rush eight minutes later to join Lindenwood's **STEVE HALL** (75, 94 vs. WIU in 2024) and Tennessee State's **KENDRIC RHYMES** (60, 51 vs. N.C. A&T this season) with this distinction. Meanwhile, Gresock's 627 rushing yards this season have come on just 88 carries for an average per carry of 7.13 yards. He gained 312 yards on 27 carries ( =11.56 ypc) during a three-game span from Weeks 4-7.

## 24

UT Martin QB **JASE BAUER** was 15-of-16 passing at Gardner-Webb in Week 8 for a 93.8 completion percentage, an Association single-game record for highest completion percentage (based on 15-19 completions). The previous best was 80.0, set by Tennessee State's **BYRON McNAIR** (16-of-20) in Week 7. Meanwhile, Bauer became the third Association quarterback this season with 200 passing and 100 rushing yards in a contest after throwing for 225 yards and gaining 107 on the ground in the Skyhawks' victory over Southeast Missouri in Week 5. He joined Gardner-Webb's **NATE HAMPTON** (263 P, 132 R vs. Western Carolina in Week 1) and Lindenwood's **NATE GLANTZ** (249 P, 104 R vs. Stony Brook in Week 4) in the 200-100 club. This season is the first time any Association quarterback has recorded a 200-passing & 100-rushing game.

## TASK FORCE

Charleston Southern's defense has forced 18 fumbles this season, surpassing the OVC-Big South single-season record of 13 that was shared by Eastern Illinois (2013) and Lindenwood (2014). The Bucs have forced multiple fumbles in a game seven times this year, including three in a contest three times (at Coastal Carolina, vs. South Carolina State and at Gardner-Webb). In addition, **JUSTIN WATERS** owns eight forced fumbles, which is also an Association single-season mark. He remains first nationally with 0.80 forced fumbles per game.

## MORE FOR LESS

Southeast Missouri's **DJ DELMORE** returned an interception 95 yards for a touchdown in Week 8 against Eastern Illinois, the longest pick-six in Association history. He bettered the old mark of 94 yards, set in Week 5 by Tennessee Tech's **ANDREW SMITH**.

## **HIGH FLYING**

The Tennessee Tech Golden Eagles have scored 431 points in their nine games, which included an Association-conference game record 66 points against Western Illinois in Week 6. TTU is the first team in Association history with three 60-point games in a season, while its 431 points rank second-most in a single-season in Association annals. The Golden Eagles are nine (9) points away from breaking the league record of 439 points, set by UT Martin in 2024. Earlier this season, TTU was the first team in Association history to score at least 40 points in three consecutive games, as the Golden Eagles started the year with 65, 45 and 72 points. The 72 points against Davidson in Week 3 was an Association-record against a Division I opponent. In addition, TTU amassed three-straight games with 500-plus offensive yards (570-513-576), establishing another Association record for most consecutive games with 500 yards of total offense.

#### **NOAH'S ARK**

Tennessee Tech WR **NOAH ROBINSON** is tied for the Association lead with six touchdown receptions, five of which came in three-straight games during Weeks 3-6. During the league's inaugural season of 2023, Robinson caught six TD passes when he played for Robert Morris, and his six career 100-yard reception games during his time in the Association (5-RMU, 1-TTU) are tied for the most in OVC-Big South annals.

## LIFE BEGINS AT FORTY

Western Illinois PK **ANTONIO CHADHA** ranks second all-time in Association history with 13 field goals made from 40-plus yards. He converted a 48-yarder at Tennessee Tech in Week 6 to move into sole possession of second-place on the league's career list, and is one behind record-holder **DC PIPPIN** of Southeast Missouri, who made 14 field goals from 40-yards or longer during his time in the Association from 2023-24. Chadha is 5-of-7 from 40-yards and beyond this season, with makes from 41, 48 (twice), 49 and 51 yards.

#### BIRDS OF PREY

Tennessee Tech has tied the Association single-season record with four defensive touchdowns, as the Golden Eagles have three pick-sixes and a fumble return score in 2025. TTU is tied for second in the FCS this year for most INT return touchdowns — which is the second-most in a season in the Association record book. The Golden Eagles have returned multiple interceptions for touchdowns in all three seasons of the Association's existence, and is the first Association member with pick-6's in consecutive games — having done so in three-straight contests this year (Weeks 3, 5 and 6).

## **TECHIES**

Tennessee Tech has scored 59 touchdowns through nine contests (6.56 per game), and a total of 18 different players have scored a touchdown for the Golden Eagles this year — setting the Association single-season team record for most players with a touchdown. The old mark of 16 was first set by Gardner-Webb in 2023 and matched by UT Martin in 2024. Tech's 59 overall TDs this season are an Association single-season record, bettering the old mark of 57 set by UT Martin last year, while TTU's 55 offensive scores are also the most in a campaign in the league's existence.

## SPEED DIAL CALLS TO THE HOUSE

Tennessee Tech's **ANDREW SMITH** has tied the OVC-Big South Association single-season record with two interception return touchdowns, which came in back-to-back games. In Week 5, Smith had a 94-yard pick-six at Tennessee State, the longest interception return in Association history at the time and breaking the previous record of 85 yards, achieved by TTU's **JACQUEZ McGOWAN** in 2023 against North Alabama. In Week 6 against Western Illinois, Smith returned an INT 16 yards for a score, and his 110 interception return yards this season are second-most in a campaign in the league's three-year history.

## **CHEERS FOR DONNIE**

Southeast Missouri WR **DONNIE CHEERS** became just the second player in Association history with two touchdown receptions of at least 50 yards in the same game when he achieved the feat in SEMO's Week 8 victory over Eastern Illinois. He first caught a 54-yard pass in the first quarter, then recorded a 67-yard TD reception in the second stanza. He joined EIU's **CJ NELSON** (vs. Illinois State in Week 3) as the only players in Association history with two 50+ TD catches in a game.

## **AGENTS OF SHIELD**

Tennessee Tech QB **JACE WILSON** connected with WR **LUKE SHIELDS** on the longest pass play in Association history in Week 6 — a 94-yard score against Western Illinois that is now the longest play from scrimmage in the league's record book. The previous longest pass play was 93 yards.

#### **DOWN HOLM**

Western Illinois RB MARKELL HOLMAN caught 10 receptions out of the backfield against Charleston Southern in Week 8, the second-most receptions in a game by an Association running back, and one shy of the record of 11. Holman has 29 catches this season, the fifth-most by a rusher in league annals. The Association single-season record for receptions by a running back is 45 (Eastern Illinois' MJ FLOWERS in 2024). Meanwhile, Holman is second in the Association with 636 rushing yards, and has been the Leathernecks' leading rusher in all nine games this season. He recorded back-to-back 100-yard games with 139 against Valparaiso in Week 3, and 118 at Eastern Washington in Week 4.

#### **RUNNING BUC**

Charleston Southern RB **Ke'MARION BALDWIN** is tied for fourth in the OVC-Big South Association with six rushing touchdowns, which includes an 89-yarder at Gardner-Webb in Week 6 — the second-longest rush from scrimmage in Association history. Five of Baldwin's six scores this season have been double-digit distances, as he has reached the end zone from 39, 26, 10, 1, 89 and 14 yards out for a touchdown-run average of 29.83 yards. Baldwin rushed for 175 yards at GWU, and is fifth among the league leaders with 574 rushing yards.

#### **CATCH ALL**

UT Martin WR BRYCE BAILEY is the first wide receiver and second non-quarterback in OVC-Big South Association history to rush, catch and throw a touchdown in a season during the league's brief existance. He became just the fourth non-QB in Association history to throw a touchdown pass in a game, but the first to do so against an FBS opponent when he connected with RB JOHN GENTRY on a 39-yard scoring play at Oklahoma State in Week 1. Bailey, who is 2-of-3 passing for 54 yards and a score this season, rushed for a touchdown in Week 2, and caught two touchdowns passes vs. Southeast Missouri in Week 5. The first non-QB with the rush-catch-throw TD trifecta was Robert Morris tight end CHAESE JACKSON in 2023.

## **QUICK GLANTZ**

Lindenwood QB **NATE GLANTZ** was the only Association signal-caller to throw for 200-plus passing yards *AND* a TD pass in the first four games of the 2025 season. In Week 4, he became the second QB in Association history with a 200-yard passing (249) & 100-yard rushing (104) game against Stony Brook. In Week 6, Glantz recorded the longest rush ever by an Association QB when he scampered 59 yards in the Lions' victory over UT Martin. The previous long by a quarterback was 56 yards (Gardner-Webb's **JAYLEN KING** in 2023).

## **QUARTERBACK VISPERER**

Tennessee Tech QB **KEKOA VISPERAS** has thrown a touchdown pass in all nine games this season and owns the conference lead with 21 — in addition to a league-best seven multi-TD pass efforts. He amassed an Association season-high 431 yards of total offense (358 passing, 73 rushing) against Western Illinois in Week 6, the fourth-highest single-game total in Association history, and the third-most in a conference game. Visperas is first in the league with 259.9 total offensive yards per game, which ranks 21st in the nation. He is seventh nationally in passing TDs.

## IN A RUSH

Eastern Illinois, Gardner-Webb and Lindenwood are the only Association teams to have three different players with a 100-yard rushing game this year. For EIU, COLE LaCRUE (193 in Week 1), CHARLES KELLOM (133 in Week 1) and JACARRE FLEMING (111 in Week 5) have eclipsed the century mark, while NATE HAMPTON (132 in Week 1), QUASEAN HOLMES (116 in Week 1, 111 in Week 9, 130 in Week 10) and CARSON GRESOCK (105 in Week 6, 137 in Week 7, 119 in Week 9) have the rushing trifecta for the Runnin' Bulldogs. Lindenwood's trio consists of NATE GLANTZ (104 in Week 4), STEVE HALL (105 in Week 9, 100 in Week 10) and JARED RHODES (113 in Week 10). Of the three teams, Gardner-Webb owns the highest rushing yards per game as a team (188.56), which is second in the Association.

## **SUPER SIZE COMBO**

Southeast Missouri (569) and Southern Illinois (612) combined for 1,181 yards of total offense in Week 4, the second-most combined total offense in a game in the Association record book, and the most combined offensive yards for a non-conference contest.

## **JUMPING JAX**

Southeast Missouri QB **JAX LEATHERWOOD** threw for an OVC-Big South season-high 422 yards in Week 4 against nationally-ranked Southern Illinois, the fifth-highest single-game passing yards in Association history.

## **NATIONAL BAROMETER**

The Association is 11–10 against non-conference FCS opponents this season, which includes a win against a nationally-ranked foe. In three years of existence, the OVC-Big South is a combined 43–35 against out-of-conference members during the regular-season, with an above-.500 record in each campaign (2023 = 20–15; 2024 = 12–10; 2025 = 11–10).

#### **BIG BRAUN**

Gardner-Webb punter **BRADY BRAUN** leads the nation with a 49.31 punting average, which is tracking ahead of the Association's single-season record of 47.27, which was set by UT Martin's **AIDAN LAROS** in 2023. Half of Braun's 26 punts (13) have gone for 50-plus yards, while eight have landed inside the 20-yard line. Meanwhile, Eastern Illinois' **MASON MILLER** is also pacing ahead of the league standard, as he is fourth nationally with his season average of 48.00. He has 16 punts of 50-yards or longer, and has pinned 15 inside the 20-yard line.

## FOUR OVC-BIG SOUTH PLAYERS NAMED SEMIFINALISTS FOR CAMPBELL TROPHY

Charleston Southern LB NICK BARTALO, Eastern Illinois LS BRETT GALLETTI, Tennessee Tech WR TREMEL JONES and Western Illinois DB CHRISTIAN PIERCE were named among the 44 Semifinalists for the 2025 WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL Trophy, college football's premier scholar-athlete award presented by the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame.

## **BULLDOG BITES**

Gardner-Webb's 52-45 season-opening win at then-No. 18/19 Western Carolina was the Association's first over a ranked non-conference foe in the regular-season since Sept. 21, 2024, when Southeast Missouri knocked off No. 7/7 Southern Illinois, 38-21. The Association now has five wins over nationally-ranked out-of-conference members in its three-year history, three of which occurred in 2024. Gardner-Webb's 627 yards of offense against the Catamounts were the fourthmost in a single-game in the Association record book.

### **HUNGRY LIKE A WOLF**

Eastern Illinois freshman QB **CONNOR WOLF** threw for 411 yards against Illinois State in Week 3, the most by a freshman in Association history, and at the time was the sixth-most in a game in the league's brief existence (now seventh). Wolf also threw four touchdown passes against the Redbirds, becoming the just the fourth different QB in Association era with a 400-yard / 4-TD performance. The others were Southeast Missouri's **PAXTON DELAURENT** (2 in 2024), Western Illinois' **NATHAN LAMB** (1 in 2024) and Eastern Illinois' **PIERCE HOLLEY** (1 in 2024).

## **RECEPTIONS**

Southeast Missouri receiving tandem **KALVIN GILBERT** (125) and **CAM PEDRO** (105) tallied 100-yard receiving efforts against Southern Illinois in Week 4. It was the fifth time that SEMO had multiple 100-yard receiving individuals in the same game, the most in Association history. Following the Redhawks for most games with two players with 100 yards receiving are Eastern Illinois (3), Western Illinois (3) and Bryant (1).

## **BACK-PACKING**

Eastern Illinois QB **COLE LaCRUE** rushed for 193 yards in Week 1, an Association-record for a quarterback. He threw for 129 yards to become just the third QB in Association history with 100 rushing + passing yards in a game. Two days later, Gardner-Webb's **NATE HAMPTON** became the first with 200 passing + 100 rushing yards in a contest, as he threw for 263 yards and rushed for 132 in GWU's win at Western Carolina. Hampton was also the first QB in Association history with four rushing TDs in a game.

#### AROUND THE ASSOCIATION...

## **CHARLESTON SOUTHERN**

The Buccaneers are enjoying their first three-game win streak since 2019, as CSU won at Southeast Missouri last week, 23-17. It is the program's first time with at least three conference wins since 2021 ... Charleston Southern leads the Association in 4th down conversions at 63.6 percent.

## **EASTERN ILLINOIS**

In the Panthers overtime setback to UT Martin last week, QB **COLE LaCRUE** was 14-of-18 passing for 140 yards and two touchdowns, while **CONNOR WOLF** was 5-of-5 for 100 and a score ... LaCrue is tied for third in the OVC-Big South Association with seven rushing touchdowns, and is one shy of the Association single-season record for most rush TDs by a quarterback (8 - **NATHAN LAMB** of Western Illinois in 2024).

#### **GARDNER-WEBB**

The Runnin' Bulldogs were within three points of nationally-ranked Tennessee Tech last week before the Golden Eagles pulled away for the victory ... **QUASEAN HOLMES** now leads the Association in rushing yards with 726 following his 130 against TTU. **CARSON GRESOCK**'s 11 rushing touchdowns are tops in the conference, and rank ninth in all of FCS.

## LINDENWOOD

RB STEVE HALL posted his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game with 100 in the Lions' victory at Tennessee State. JARED RHODES led the squad with 113 as Lindenwood finished the day with 222 yards on the ground ... Lindenwood is averaging 32.5 points in its four wins (all 30-plus point efforts), compared to 14.8 points in its five losses (74 total points, including 26 total in two FBS defeats).

#### SOUTHEAST MISSOURI

In last week's defeat against Charleston Southern, QB **JAX LEATHERWOOD** was 27-of-49 passing for 274 yards and a score. This season, he has completed at least 26 passes and 270 yards in a game four times ... The Redhawks lead the Association in passing offense with 278.0 yards, which is 11th nationally ... SEMO has scored in double-figures in 32 consecutive games.

#### **TENNESSEE STATE**

The Tigers scored two plays into the game against Lindenwood when QB **BYRON McNAIR** connected on a 70-yard scoring strike to **DeVAUGHN SLAUGHTER** ... In his last five games, McNair is 78-of-121 passing ( =64.5 percent) for 873 yards.

## TENNESSEE TECH

Tennessee Tech is 9–0 for the second time in program history (1952) ... TTU's 14-straight wins is the longest winning streak in program history ... The Golden Eagles are 6–0 in conference play for the first time ever ... Tech has scored in 29 of 36 quarters, with the following by-quarter scoring breakdown: 104-27 (1st); 137-51 (2nd); 98–30 (3rd); 92-29 (4th) ... In last week's win over Gardner-Webb, Tech outscored GWU, 24-7, after trailing 14-3 with 5:16 left in the 2nd quarter. The 11-point deficit was the largest of the season ... Tennessee Tech leads the FCS in scoring offense (47.9 points per game) and rushing defense (52.4 yards allowed), ranks fourth in total defense (273.9) and ninth in total offense (466.8).

## **UT MARTIN**

JaMICHAEL McGOY is the program leader with 38 career pass break-ups, and is one shy of the school record for passes defended with 44, trailing former teammate OSHAE BAKER ... QB JASE BAUER has seven rushing touchdowns this season — all of which have come in the last five contests. He is tied for second in the OVC-Big South Association with his seven rushing scores, and is one shy of the Association single-season record for most rush TDs by a quarterback (8 - NATHAN LAMB of Western Illinois in 2024) ... UTM is 15-1 against conference foes at home since 2020.

## **WESTERN ILLINOIS**

The Leathernecks captured their first Association win of the season at Tennessee State in Week 9. **CHRISTIAN PIERCE** recorded 4.0 TFL — the second-most in an Association contest, while **KEVIN WASHINGTON** JR. added 3.0 stops behind the line. WIU finished the game with 14 TFL and five sacks. **ANTONIO CHADHA**'s 51-yard field goal with :47 left in the third quarter proved to be the difference.

## **OVC-BIG SOUTH FOOTBALL TIEBREAKER PROCEDURE**

#### 1. TRANSITIONING SCHOOLS

a. To be eligible for the conference's automatic bid to the FCS Football Championship, a school must be a full Division I member.

b. Transitioning schools will be utilized in the tiebreaker process.

c. If a transitioning school is involved in a two-way tie, the tied team that is eligible for postseason competition shall be the league's recipient of the automatic bid.

 d. If a transitioning school wins the multi-team tiebreaker, the procedure would start over with the remaining teams.

#### 2. TWO-WAY TIE

a. If the two teams played each other during the conference season, the winner of the head-to-head contest shall be the league's recipient of the automatic bid.

b. If the tied teams did not play each other during the conference season, each team's head-to-head record against all common opponents in the league will be used to determine the automatic bid.

c. If a tie still exists, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings will be used to determine the automatic bid. When arriving at a group of tied teams that each team has played, composite records between the tied teams shall be utilized to determine if one of the tied teams has won more games against the group of tied teams.

d. If the teams are still tied, a point system will be utilized based on a complete schedule and wins using the NCAA four-metric average ranking for FCS\* following all games on the final Saturday of the regular season (and the Massey ranking entering the final day of the regular season for FBS opponents) as indicated below:

e. Should the points system finish in a tie, the team with the best ranking in the NCAA four-metric average for FCS\* following all games on the final Saturday of the regular season will receive the automatic bid.

#### 3. MULTIPLE TIES

 a. If at any point, a tie is broken using the multiple-tie tiebreaker procedures and only two team remain, the remaining teams will revert to the two-way tiebreaker (head-to-head).

b. If the tied teams all played each other during the conference season, the team with the best cumulative record involving games with the tied teams shall be declared champion. For example, if a team is 2-0 against two other tied teams, that team will be declared champion.

c. If the tied teams all played one another and have identical records against the other tied teams, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league will be used to determine the automatic bid. If teams are still tied, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings will be used to determine the automatic bid.

d. If the tied teams did not play each other, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league will be used to determine the automatic bid. If the teams are still tied, and they did not play each other, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings will be used to determine the automatic bid.

e. If the teams are still tied, a point system will be utilized based on a complete schedule and wins using the NCAA four-metric average ranking for FCS\* following all games on the final Saturday of the regular season (and the Massey ranking entering the final day of the regular season for FBS opponents) as indicated below.

f. Should the points system finish in a tie, the team with the best ranking in the NCAA four-metric average for FCS\* following all games on the final Saturday of the regular season will receive the automatic bid.
