Women's Tennis Crowned WAC Champions With Win Over New Mexico State

May 1, 2016 at Brownsville Tennis Center – The No. 2 University of Texas Rio Grande Valley Vaqueros women's tennis team defeated the No. 1 New Mexico State Aggies 4-2 on Sunday at the Brownsville Tennis Center for the program's first-ever Western Athletic Conference Championship.

The Vaqueros fell behind early as the Aggies took the doubles point with wins on courts one and two to take the 1-0 lead.

The Aggies grabbed another point after they won on court two but the Vaqueros would rally with four straight wins in singles.

Doris Aleksovska got things rolling for UTRGV as she picked up a straight set 6-2, 6-4 victory over Lindsay Harlas on court five. Dominique Ibarra then followed with a 6-4, 6-4 win on court four over Erika Castillo to tie the match at two.

On court three, Natacha Minc went back and forth with Chloe Jolliff but came away with a 7-6 (8) victory in the first set. Minc then clinched her match with a 6-4 win in the second set to give the Vaqueros the 3-2 lead.

It all came down to the final two courts as Tara Donaho clinched the championship for the Vaqueros as she came away with the 7-6 (5), 6-4 win over Mia Brandt on court six.

Scouting the Golden Bears

The No. 1 Cal Bears enter the first round of the NCAA Championships with a 19-1 record while going 7-1 in PAC-12 play. While they are the top seed in the NCAA Tournament, the Golden Bears are the second ranked team in the ITA team poll.

The seventh ranked singles player, Maegan Manasse has posted a 12-7 singles record in dual match play en route to her 2016 PAC-12 singles championship.

Karla Popovic leads the Bears with 19 wins in the dual match season while recording 15 of those wins at the No. 6 spot.

The Golden Bears have six in double-digit victories in singles, with four of them also being ranked in singles play with No. 7 Manasse (12), No. 16 Klara Fabikova (14), No. 88 Starr (17) and No. 88 Lynn Chi (14).

In doubles, the Golden Bears have just one team with double-digit victories in the 90th ranked team of Fabikova and Olivia Haguer teaming up to post 13 wins. Manasse and Starr are ranked No. 4 after posting an 8-6 record with wins over Cal State Northridge, Wisconsin, Virginia, San Diego State, Pepperdine, Utah, Washington and Stanford.

All-Time Series

This is the first ever meeting between the Vaqueros and the Bears.

Next Up

The winner of the first round matchup will move on to the second round of the NCAA Championships to face the winner of Kansas and UC Santa Barbara on Saturday at 5 p.m.

WAC Tournament Champions

The Vaqueros recorded their first ever WAC Tournament Championship after defeating the New Mexico State Aggies. It is also the UTRGV Athletic Department's first ever WAC team championship.

First NCAA Berth

With the first WAC Tournament Championship, the Vaqueros punched their ticket to their first ever NCAA Championships in its 30-year history. It is also the first time that a program at UTRGV that a tournament championship leads to an NCAA Championship-level event.

Scratching Off Women's Tennis

The women's tennis team is now the 14th different program at UTRGV to make a postseason appearance. The only two programs yet to make an appearance are men's soccer, which just returned from an 18-year hiatus, and women's soccer, which has been in existence for two years.

Donaho's Year

Freshman Tara Donaho led the team with 14 singles victories, which led her to earn the WAC Freshman of the Year award.

Donaho graduated from Belton High School early so she could play collegiate tennis in the spring. She is the only one in Division I to do so and win conference Freshman of the Year honors.

Fight Aleksovskaja, Fight

Sophomore Doris Aleksovskaja battled back from an injury that forced her to miss the fall tournament season to post 13 singles victory, which was three times more than the four she recorded at the University of Buffalo as a freshman.

Conference Honors

Senior Reegan Greenwood (11), sophomore Doris Aleksovskaja (13) and freshman Tara Donaho (14) each earned All-WAC Second Team honors in singles after posting double-digit wins.

All-Tournament Team Honors

Senior Reegan Greenwood, sophomore Doris Aleksovskaja and freshman Tara Donaho were named to the WAC All-Tournament Singles Team. Aleksovskaja and doubles partner freshman Dominique Ibarra were also named to the All-Tournament Doubles Team.

Climbing the Ranks

Senior Reegan Greenwood is currently fourth in program history with 54 career singles wins. She is now one win behind Barbara Barrera (1988-90) for third place all-time. Ellen Nelissen (1991-95) tops the all-time list with 67 wins.

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced on August 13 the hiring of Stephanie Wooten-Quijada as the new women's tennis head coach.

In her first season at the helm, Wooten-Quijada led the Vaqueros to their first ever NCAA Championship appearance after winning their first WAC Tournament Championship.

She guided the team to an 11-10 record while also guiding Reagan Greenwood, Doris Aleksovskaja and Tara Donaho to All-WAC Second Team honors with Donaho also earning WAC Freshman of the Year.

Wooten-Quijada spent 2015 as one of the tennis professionals at Brookhaven Country Club in Dallas, where she was part of one of the highest rated private tennis programs in the country. Brookhaven Country Club is known for producing high-caliber athletes across several sports, including golf star Jordan Spieth.

Wooten-Quijada was the assistant coach at the University of Houston in 2013-14, helping the Cougars to a 21-6 record and a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to that, Wooten-Quijada spent two

seasons at Stephen F. Austin (SFA), including the last year as the head coach. She helped SFA to a combined 33-18 record, including a 15-6 mark in Southland Conference play.

As an assistant coach in her first season at SFA, Wooten-Quijada helped guide the program to its first Southland Conference Championship an NCAA Tournament appearance, the No. 35 ranking in the nation, and a 23-4 record.

Prior to her arrival at SFA, Wooten was the head coach at Lee College, where she led the program to a runner-up finish at the 2011 NJCAA Championships. She also helped develop three NJCAA Division I All-Americans that season.

Wooten-Quijada was a four-year letter winner at Purdue where she finished her career with a combined 116 victories. As a senior, she recorded 41 victories while finishing sixth on Purdue's all-time doubles victories list.

A native of Crandall, Texas, Wooten-Quijada, comes to the Rio Grande Valley with her husband, Andrés Quijada, who coached and trained at the Venezuelan Tennis Federation. Quijada was also a red-shirt for the Venezuelan Davis Cup team.
