Last Match

Bonney Continues Torrid Play to Lead UTRGV Past South Carolina State

Sept. 25, 2016 at Oliver C. Dawson Stadium – Freshman **Sarah Bonney** scored her sixth and seventh goals of the weekend to lead the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) women's soccer team past South Carolina State University (SCSU) 3-1. Bonney's four points are tied for the second-highest single-match total in program history. She finished the weekend with the first 16 points (seven goals and two assists) of her career, tied for the second-highest single-season scoring total in program history. She trails only junior **Andreya Barrera** (22, 2014). Bonney's seven goals are the second-highest single-season total in program history, behind only Barrera (nine, 2014). This is the fastest UTRGV (7-2-1) has ever reached seven wins. The .750 winning percentage ties for the best start in program history, along with the 2014 squad, which was 6-1-3. Bonney started the scoring at 38:55 with a goal from the left side off a feed from senior **Elisa Espino**. SCSU (2-8-1) tied the match on a **Mary Pierce** goal at 63:39, but at 71:03, Espino found junior **Frida Farstad-Eriksson** who headed in the game-winning goal. This was Espino's first-career multi-assist match. Bonney added a final goal at 82:21 off a pass from Farstad-Eriksson to complete the scoring. Farstad-Eriksson finished with a career-high three points. Freshman **Kinga Szemik** (4-1-0) recorded three saves. SCSU goalkeeper **Mahogany Fisher** (0-1-0) finished with 11 saves.

Previous Matches

Bonney's 12-Point Match Propels UTRGV to Record Breaking Win Over Hampton

Sept. 23, 2016 at Pirate Soccer Field – Freshman **Sarah Bonney** earned the first 12 points of her career, tied for the 13th-highest single-match scoring output in NCAA history, to lead the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) women's soccer team to an 11-0 victory over Hampton University. Bonney is the 30th player in NCAA history to record at least 12 points in a match. Bonney broke the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) record for points in a match with a WAC record-tying five goals, including the first hat trick (three goals), the first haul (four goals) and the first glut (five goals) in program history, and two assists. Bonney now leads UTRGV (6-2-1) in scoring after attempting a program record nine shots, all of which were on goal. The 11 goals are not only the most UTRGV has ever scored in a match, but also more than UTRGV has ever scored in any two contests combined and as many as UTRGV has scored in its three previous highest scoring matches combined. The 11-goal margin of victory is the largest in program history. The previous records for scoring and margin of victory were four, set in 4-0 road wins over Prairie View A&M (8/28/16) and Grambling State (8/29/14). It was also UTRGV's sixth shutout in seven matches. UTRGV has now surpassed last season's win total of five and matched the program record for road wins of four, set in 2014. UTRGV has now scored 23 goals this season after scoring 15 last season. UTRGV attempted a program record 43 shots, including a program record 28 shots on goal, while holding Hampton to one shot, which senior **Maria Eriksen** saved in the opening minute of the second half. Junior Harlingen alum **Erica Gonzlaez** (2-1-1) played a scoreless first half. Bonney's first goal was the game-winner, coming at 9:04 off a pass from senior **Evelyn Powell**. Bonney and sophomore **Malia Irvine** assisted on a goal by junior **Hanna Spets** at 11:00, and then at 13:56, Bonney scored off a feed from junior **Marcela Ramirez** to make it 3-0. Bonney scored again off a long punt from Eriksen to make it 6-0 at 64:10 and then assisted on freshman **Diana Ansah**'s first-career goal at 69:28. Ansah returned the favor by feeding Bonney in the box for a goal to make it 10-0 at 78:08. Bonney completed the scoring eight minutes later on a rebound off Hampton (1-3-1) goalkeeper **Katelyn Tucker**, who made five saves while playing the final 11:30 in relief of **Maya Andrews** (1-3-1), who made 12 saves. After going up 3-0 in the first 14 minutes, UTRGV was held off the board until the first five minutes of the second half, when Spets scored off a Powell corner kick. It was Spets' second-career two-goal match. Powell finished with two assists, giving her twice as many as she had last year. Senior **Elisa Espino**, who scored two goals last season, scored her first two goals of this season, first off a touch from sophomore **Diandra Aliaga** during a scramble in front at 53:27 to make it 5-0, and then on an Ansah feed during a breakaway at 75:30. Ansah finished with the first four points of her career. Senior **Sheridan Becanic** added her first goal of the season off a rebound at 73:21 to make it 8-0.

UTRGV Falls at UTEP

Sept. 18, 2016 at University Soccer Field – The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) women's soccer team saw its five-match unbeaten streak come to an end with a 1-0 loss to UTEP. UTRGV (5-2-1) extended its program-record shutout streak to 512:52, but just before halftime, **Aylin Villalobos** came up with a long throw in to **Aleah Davis**, who tapped the ball to **Yessenia Contreras**, who shot into the lower left hand corner of the goal. That was it against freshman **Kinga Szemik** (3-1-0), who allowed a goal for the first time in four starts, but made five saves. UTEP (7-1-2) goalkeeper **Alyssa Palacios** (7-1-2) made three saves for the shutout. UTRGV outshot UTEP 11-10, but UTEP outshot UTRGV 6-4 on goal. Sophomore **Diandra Aliaga** attempted a team-high four shots (one on goal) while junior **Andreya Barrera** attempted a team-high two shots on goal (three total).

2016 Match Notes

Texas A&M International (10/4)

- This is the second-ever matchup between these two program after playing to a scoreless double overtime draw in Laredo on Sept. 2, 2014.

South Carolina State (9/25)

- In its third-straight match against a new opponent, UTRGV beat SCSU 3-1.
- Freshman **Sarah Bonney** scored two goals to finish the weekend with 16 points on seven goals and two assists. She is just the second player in program history to have two multi-goal matches or two matches with four or more points, joining junior **Hanna Spets**, who did so on 9/23/16 at Hampton and 9/27/14 vs. New Mexico State. Bonney now ranks tied for second in program history in points in a season, behind only **Andreya Barrera** (22, 2014). She also ranks second in goals in a season, behind only Barrera (9, 2014). Bonney is also tied for third in career points, behind only Barrera (41) and Spets (17), and tied for second in career goals behind only Barrera (16).
- For her efforts over the weekend, scoring seven goals with two assists, Bonney earned the program's first-ever NSCAA College Player of the Week award. She also earned her first WAC Offensive Player of the Week award.
- Senior **Evelyn Powell** earned WAC Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- Junior **Frida Farstad-Eriksson** scored her first-career game-winning goal. She also had an assist for a career-high three points.
- Senior **Elisa Espino** notched her first-career multi-assist match with two.
- This is the fastest UTRGV (7-2-1) has ever reached seven wins. The .750 winning percentage ties for the best start in program history, along with the 2014 squad, which was 6-1-3.

Hampton (9/23)

- UTRGV won the first match to ever be played at Pirate Soccer Field 11-0 over Hampton.
- In her second start, freshman **Sarah Bonney** scored the first 12 points of her career, becoming the 30th player in NCAA history to score at least 12 points in a match and tying for 13th in NCAA history in points in a match. The 12 points are a new WAC record. She scored a WAC record-tying five goals with two assists. It was the first hat trick (three goals), haul (four goals) and glut (five goals) in program history. Bonney attempted a program record nine shots, all of which were on goal. After going scoreless on 16 shots (seven on goal) over the first eight matches, Bonney is now UTRGV's leading scorer. Bonney's first goal was the game-winner. She scored two of UTRGV's three first half goals while assisting on the other strike.
- The 11 goals are not only the most UTRGV has ever scored in a match, but also more than UTRGV has ever scored in any two contests combined and as many as UTRGV has scored in its three previous highest scoring matches combined. The 11-goal margin of victory is the largest in program history. The previous records for scoring and margin of victory were four, set in 4-0 road wins over Prairie View A&M (8/28/16) and Grambling State (8/29/14).

- UTRGV scored eight of its goals during a 37-minute span in the second half after scoring its first three goals in less than five minutes early in the first half.
- It was UTRGV's sixth shutout in seven matches.
- UTRGV now has more wins (six) than last season (five) and a program record-tying four road wins (set in 2014).
- UTRGV has now scored 23 goals this season after scoring 15 last season.
- UTRGV attempted a program record 43 shots, including a program record 28 shots on goal, while holding Hampton to one shot, which was on goal.
- Freshman **Diana Ansah** scored the first four points of her career, scoring UTRGV's seventh goal on an assist from Bonney before assisting on the 9th and 10th goals, the latter of which was Bonney's fourth strike.
- Junior **Hanna Spets** recorded her second-career two-goal match, upping her season total to three.
- Senior **Elisa Espino** posted her first-career multi-goal match, scoring her first two goals of the season and matching last year's scoring output.
- Senior **Evelyn Powell** recorded her first two assists of the season, doubling last year's total.
- Senior goalkeeper **Maria Eriksen** had her first-career assist on UTRGV's sixth goal, the one that gave Bonney a hat trick. Eriksen also made UTRGV's lone save.
- Senior **Sheridan Becanic** scored her first goal of the season.
- Sophomore **Malia Irvine** recorded her first assist of the season.
- Junior **Marcela Ramirez** posted her second assist of the season.

UTEP (9/18)

- UTRGV saw its five-match unbeaten streak and program record shutout streak come to an end at 512:52 in a 1-0 loss at UTEP.
- UTRGV beat its previous program record shutout streak by 185:32 (327:20 from Sept. 9 through Sept. 16, 2015).
- Freshman **Kinga Szemik** made a career-high five saves.

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (9/11)

- UTRGV completed the season sweep of TAMUCC and took an 8-5 lead in the South Texas Showdown, presented by Navy Army Community Credit Union standings with a 2-0 win.
- It was UTRGV's program record fifth-straight shutout.
- UTRGV has not allowed a goal in a program record 470 minutes.
- UTRGV has not allowed a goal since senior defender Evelyn Powell returned to the lineup after missing the first two matches with an illness.
- Freshman **Kinga Szemik** made three saves for her third shutout in as many matches.
- Sophomore **Elvia Valdez** scored her first-career goal, the game-winner, off a steal in the box at 75:22.

- Junior **Andreya Barrera** added a goal 1:09 later. She now has more goals (4-3) and points (10-9) than last season. Junior **Hanna Spets** recorded her first assist of the season.

St. Thomas (9/9)

- UTRGV recorded its program record fourth-straight shutout with a 1-0 win over St. Thomas.
- Junior **Erica Gonzalez** and senior **Maria Eriksen** combined on the shutout.
- Junior **Andreya Barrera** scored her career-high third game-winning goal of the season, the seventh of her career. Junior **Frida Farstad-Eriksson** recorded the assist, the fifth of her career and her first since 2014.

Incarnate Word (9/4)

- UTRGV played UIW to a scoreless double overtime draw, marking the first tie in the all-time series (1-1-1).
- It was UTRGV's program-record third-straight shutout.
- Junior **Erica Gonzalez** recorded her first shutout of the season and sixth of her career by making one save.
- UTRGV outshot UIW 28-10, including 8-1 on goal.

Prairie View A&M (8/28)

- UTRGV blew out Prairie A&M 4-0, tying for the largest margin of victory in program history, along with a 4-0 win at Grambling State (8/29/14).
- UTRGV attempted a program record 38 shots and holding PVAM to nine.
- UTRGV attempted 13 shots on goal, the fourth-highest single-match total in program history, while holding PVAM to one.
- Junior **Andreya Barrera** scored the game-winning goal, her fourth-career goal against PVAM in three matches. Barrera now had 13-career goals, meaning that 30.8 percent of them have come against PVAM. Barrera now has two game-winning goals for the third season in a row.
- Sophomore **Diandra Aliaga** scored her third goal of the season, giving her seven points, more than twice as many as last year (three).
- Junior **Frida Farstad-Eriksson** and sophomore **Daniela Cantu** each scored their first-career goals.
- Freshman **Kinga Szemik** posted her second-straight shutout by making one save.

Lamar (8/26)

- UTRGV won its first ever meeting with Lamar 1-0.
- Junior **Andreya Barrera** scored the game-winning goal at 18:16 off a feed from **Marcela Ramirez**.
- In her debut, freshman **Kinga Szemik** made three saves for the shutout.

Fairleigh Dickinson (8/21)

- Despite have eight student-athletes suffering from an illness and having to play the final 14:40 with only 10 players due to a red

card, UTRGV played tight with two-time defending NEC Champion FDU before falling 3-2 in overtime.

- UTRGV is now 1-3-7 all-time in overtime matches.
- Sophomore **Diandra Aliaga** scored more points in this match (four) than she did as a freshman (three) by notching her first two-career goals, both of which gave the Vaqueros the lead. For her efforts, she earned All-Tournament team honors. Senior **Elisa Espino** assisted on the first goal.
- Senior **Hanna Spets** earned All-Tournament Team honors.

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (8/19)

- UTRGV won the first-ever match of the South Texas Showdown, presented by Navy Army Community Credit Union, 2-1 over TAMUCC.
- Andreya Barrera** posted her first-career multi-assist match by assisting on both goals. Three of Barrera's nine-career assists have now come against the Islanders.
- Junior **Hanna Spets** scored her first goal since her freshman year, the fifth of her career, to make it 1-0.
- Sophomore **Kelzy Jepsen** scored her second-career game-winning goal and her third overall.
- UTRGV attempted a program record 15 corner kicks.
- UTRGV outshot the Islanders 18-to-2.

Glad Bugariu

Head Coach

Hired on April 26, 2013 as the first women's soccer head coach in program history, **Glad Bugariu** immediately made history with his team, as they went 8-9-4, tying for the ninth most wins by a first year NCAA Division I program in the state of Texas. Bugariu and the team road that momentum into their second season of existence, as UTRGV qualified for the WAC Tournament for the second year in a row, while also increasing the total number of conference wins by 50 percent, making the future bright for this young program.

The 2015 season also contained significant academic achievements, as the Vaqueros captured their first ever NSCAA Team Academic Award.

Additionally, Bugariu was invited to work with the Women's National Team of St. Vincent and the Grenadines during the spring of 2015 and was instrumental in their preparation and success in winning the Windward Islands Football Championship. He will continue as a technical advisor and national staff coach for the federation in 2016, a position which will see him continue to further develop the program.

During Bugariu's inaugural season, the team tied for the third best 11-match start in Texas history by going 7-1-3. In fact, the team remained undefeated through its first six matches (4-0-2), making it just the third inaugural program in Texas to do that. The team won its first match on the road, 2-0 at Southern, its first match at home, 2-1 over Huston-Tillotson, its first WAC match, 3-1 over New Mexico State, and its first match in the then-brand new Soccer and Track & Field Complex, 3-0 over Chicago State. Bugariu's team, which featured 16 true freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among those who played, racked up the honors, as **Andreya Barrera** earned Madness WAC Freshman of the Year and Madness All-WAC Second Team honors, freshman **Aimie Inthoulay** earned Madness All-WAC Second Team and a WAC Offensive Player of the Week award, freshman **Hanna Spets** earned a WAC Offensive Player of the Week award, and freshman **Aubrie Coley** earned three WAC Defensive Player of the Week awards in net.

Before coming here, Bugariu spent five seasons as the head coach at South Carolina State University, where he is the winningest coach in the program history.

After taking over a team with the lowest RPI in NCAA DI women's soccer and just nine student-athletes on the roster in 2008, Bugariu used his first recruiting class, which included 15 freshmen among the 16 newcomers, to completely revamp the program. The Bulldogs went 10-7-3 in 2009, the first winning season in program history, and tied for second place in the Great West Conference (GWC) East Division, their highest finish ever. While eight statistical records were broken, the 2009 team finished ranked 30th in the country in scoring, and also recorded the highest RPI increase and final ranking in their history. The team also had five student-athletes earn All-Conference honors and won more games that season than the program had in the previous four.

The 2010 season was the most successful in program history. Ranked 19th in the NCAA in scoring, the Bulldogs finished 13-6-1 and undefeated in the GWC East Division. Six Bulldogs earned All-Conference honors, former Mexican National Team player **Briana Lopez** was named Freshman of the Year, and Bugariu was named Coach of the Year. In total, 16 Bulldogs earned All-Conference honors in five years under Bugariu's direction, including **Alejandra Chirnio**, the first player in program history to sign a professional contract, doing so with the Carolina Elite Cobras of the W-League.

While highly successful on the field, 2010 also contained significant academic achievements, as the team finished with the seventh highest GPA out of 321 NCAA Division I teams, as ranked by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). The accolades did not stop there, as the Bulldogs also captured their first ever NSCAA Team Academic Award while also having 12 student-athletes named to the Great West Conference Fall Academic Team.

Bugariu's recruiting stayed strong, as TopDrawerSoccer.com recognized his 2011 class as a "Killer Class." Bugariu also has extensive international recruiting experience, landing two Under 20 Mexican National Team players, as well as senior national team players from Guatemala, Trinidad and Tobago, the Bahamas, Antigua and Guam during his time at SC State. The Bulldogs continued to maintain their new status as a solid NCAA DI program during the 2011 and 2012 seasons, advancing to the conference tournament semifinals each year, while also registering two of the four highest winning percentages in program history. The program also continued to improve on their national GPA ranking during this time, finishing sixth in 2011 and second in 2012. The 2011 squad had 13 student-athletes earn GWC Fall Academic honors, while 16 student-athletes were honored in 2012.

Before taking over at SCSU, Bugariu led NCAA Division II Belmont Abbey College for three seasons in Belmont, N.C., going 52-12-2, including a 30-2-1 mark in Conference Carolinas (previously Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference (CVAC)) play. In 2007, the Crusaders finished 18-4-1 while going undefeated in the conference at 11-0. They broke numerous conference records, including most shutouts in a season (10), least goals allowed (one), and

lowest goals against average (0.09). The Crusaders finished fourth in the region, had the third best defense in the country (nine goals allowed), and achieved a national ranking as high as No. 22. Individual awards included five players earning First-Team All-Conference honors and three gathering All-Region honors. In 2006, the Crusaders finished 16-4-1, won the CVAC tournament, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. It was the first time a Belmont Abbey coach had led the program to back-to-back conference championships. Additionally, two players were named to the NSCAA All-Region team, while four earned All-CVAC recognition. In 2005, his first season with the Crusaders, Bugariu guided the team to an 18-4 record, their best finish since 1999. The Crusaders captured the CVAC Tournament Title and a share of the regular season. They also finished fifth in the regional poll. Other accolades earned in the 2005 season include being ranked as the second most improved team in the nation by the NCAA, finishing 11th in the country in shutouts, defeating the No. 3 and No. 10 ranked teams in the nation, and having two players earn NSCAA All-Region honors.

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Bugariu has worked at the professional and international level in the CONCACAF region, both on the men's and women's side. In 2004, he was named the assistant national team coach of Grenada, engaging in qualifying for the 2006 World Cup. There, the team reached the second round of World Cup qualifying, narrowly losing to the United States, in addition to advancing from the "Group of Death" during Gold Cup qualifying. These achievements resulted in a 13-place rise in the FIFA rankings, the most significant advancement in the history of the country. From a developmental standpoint, Bugariu created the Grenada National Goalkeeper Development Program and the goalkeeper coach education curriculum.

In 2000, at only 25 years of age, he was named Technical Director of the U.S. Virgin Islands, a country with a population of only 108,000 people. Bugariu was responsible for the development of the game in the country, creating programs that resulted in a 120 percent rise in soccer participation, in addition to creating national teams at every level. International headlines were made with the formation of a women's program at both senior and Under 19 levels for the first time in the history of the country. Both teams had significant success, with the senior women's national team reaching the second round of World Cup qualifying in the CONCACAF region. Additionally, he was in charge of all national teams, concentrating on the youth programs. Using mostly players under the age of 20 for all senior national team games, Bugariu achieved the first-ever rise in the men's FIFA Rankings for the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Having coached in over 30 international matches against nations such as the United States, Trinidad and Tobago, Haiti, Surinam, Puerto Rico, Antigua, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Bahamas, Monserrat, and Guyana, among others, Bugariu also holds foreign and domestic coaching licenses, including the USSF "A" license, UEFA "B" license, NSCAA "Premier" Diploma, USSF "Youth" License, and the FIFA "Sports Medicine" Certificate.

In the summer of 2011 Bugariu worked with Carolina Cobras of the W-League, serving as the inaugural coach of the new professional women's soccer franchise. Although he was able to lead them to their first ever win, the purpose of the job was to develop the playing and coaching staff and create a competitive team for the future, paving the way for his longtime assistant, Sandy Burris, to take over after his initial stint with the team.

Bugariu also served as a head coach at Meredith College during the 2000 season and the men's soccer assistant coach at Louisburg Junior College during the 1998 and 1999 seasons.

In addition, Bugariu has established an outstanding legacy in club and the Olympic Development Program (ODP), serving as the Director of Coaching for the Northern Soccer Club in Santa Fe, N.M. (Jan. 2003-Aug. 2005) while also working as head coach of the '88 NM ODP Girls team, and later as the Director of Goalkeeping for the New Mexico Youth Soccer Association. He has also been on the ODP staff in North and South Carolina and has worked on the state coaching education instructional staff and as an NSCAA Regional Staff Coach.

Overall, in nine seasons as a head coach, Bugariu has a career record of 111-88-19 (.553). He has won six regular or tournament championships in the past eight years. He is renowned for taking over struggling programs and quickly improving them, having been twice recognized in the top 10 of the NCAA "Most Improved Team" category at both the NCAA Division I and II levels.

Born in Bucharest, Romania, Bugariu came to the United States at the age of 10 and has since earned his citizenship and holds a degree in Recreation and Leisure Administration from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He earned his master's in sports science from the United States Sports Academy. He was an All-Region goalkeeper at Brevard College in N.C. and had a stint with the Romanian fourth division club, Soimii Sibiu, before playing for the C.D. Chapel Hill Dragons.

Bugariu resides in the Rio Grande Valley with his wife, Katarina, and their son, Joachim.
