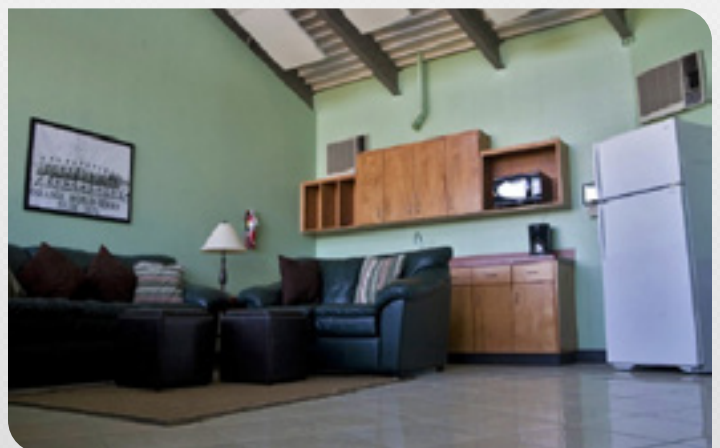
UTRGV BASEBALL STADIUM



Located on the northwest corner of campus, UTRGV Baseball Stadium opened its gates in 2001. Its dimensions of 325-380-405-380-325 allow for a spacious outfield and a pitcher friendly environment on natural grass.

The Vaqueros have played at UTRGV Baseball Stadium since 2002, posting a 217-178-1 (.549) record at home in that time.

UTRGV Baseball Stadium normally seats 5,000 fans, but can expand to 16,000 for concerts and other special events while providing parking for 3,000 vehicles. The stadium also features 10 luxury suites that come fully equipped with air conditioning, TVs, an entertainment lounge and 20 VIP seats.



STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING



In 2014, athletics moved into a new 3,000 square-foot area strength & conditioning facility, and in 2015, with the help of donors, UTRGV Athletics purchased brand new speed and strength equipment, as well as free weight and aerobic/cardio equipment. UTRGV Athletics also acquired new power racks, platforms, benches and dumbbells.

The strength and conditioning facility is exclusively for UTRGV student-athletes.

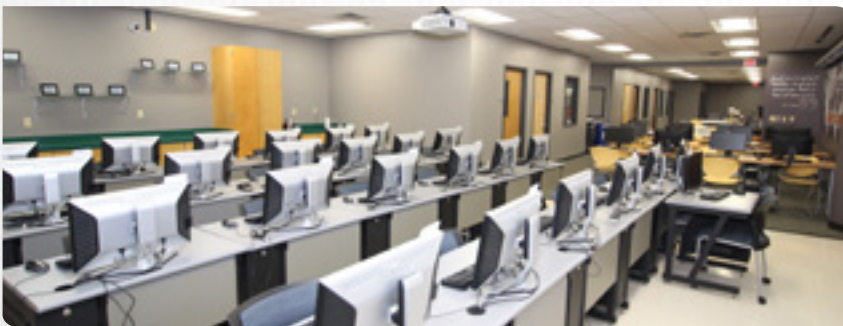


VICTORY CENTER



For today's student-athletes, training and conditioning is a year-round commitment. Balancing the rigors of competing at the collegiate level with the demands of the classroom is one of the greatest challenges our student-athletes face. That is why it is so essential that the department of intercollegiate athletics provides our student-athletes with access to hands-on academic support.

Located in the Academic Services Building, the Victory Center is an integral part of the life of our student-athletes and has a vast amount of services and assistance available.



The Victory Center is structured after the principles of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, which is created to provide student-athletes with five basic components: Academic Excellence, Athletic Excellence, Community Service, Career Development and Personal Development.

UTRGV has approximately 250 student-athletes, including approximately 150 freshmen and transfers, who are required to attend study hall and specially designed workshops that assist them in acclimating to college life and living away from home. Student-athletes must dedicate anywhere from six to 10 hours each week to study hall as they work toward their ultimate goal, graduation.

The Victory Center provides student-athletes access to computers, tutors and other resources. The Victory Center, which is open six days a week (Sunday-Friday), houses a computer lab, a learning lab, areas for both individual and group study, and offices for the Academic Advisement Center staff.

Each student-athlete works with their college advisor to make sure that they are enrolled in the correct classes to graduate. The Victory Center staff verifies the classes to ensure that the student-athlete is working towards their degree, making yearly satisfactory progress and meeting grade point average requirements.

THE UNIVERSITY



A New University with a Long History

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) was created by the Texas Legislature in 2013 as the first major public university of the 21st century in Texas. This transformative initiative provided the opportunity to expand educational opportunities in the Rio Grande Valley, including a new School of Medicine, and made it possible for residents of the region to benefit from the Permanent University Fund – a public endowment contributing support to the University of Texas System and other institutions.

UTRGV has campuses and off-campus research and teaching sites throughout the Rio Grande Valley including in Boca Chica Beach, Brownsville (formerly The University of Texas at Brownsville campus), Edinburg (formerly The University of Texas-Pan American campus), Harlingen,

McAllen, Port Isabel, Rio Grande City, and South Padre Island. UTRGV, a comprehensive academic institution, enrolled its first class in the fall of 2015, and the School of Medicine welcomed its first class in the summer of 2016.

UT Brownsville and UT Pan American

The shared history of The University of Texas-Pan American and The University of Texas at Brownsville goes back to 1973, when Pan American opened a second campus in Brownsville, which later became an independent institution of The University of Texas System in 1991. Over the years, the missions and the identities of these great institutions have continually evolved to serve the communities of the Rio Grande Valley.

CREATING AMERICA'S NEXT GREAT UNIVERSITY

In the Fall of 2015, the landscape of higher education in the U.S. was forever changed. The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley enrolled its inaugural class of first-year students, and this region now shines to the rest of the world as a global leader in higher education, bilingual education, health education, biomedical research, and emerging technology.



UTRGV combined the talent, assets, and resources of UT Brownsville, UT Pan American, and the Regional Academic Health Center, along with other resources, to create a new model of excellence in education. Here is the story of this significant journey:

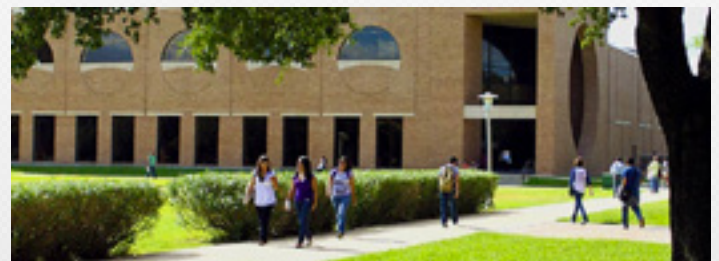
Students enrolled at UT Brownsville and UT Pan American were automatically admitted to UTRGV.

OUR STORY

1927-33

Edinburg College was founded as a two-year community college governed by the Edinburg School District. The original building housed 200 students and today is listed as a historical site in the city of Edinburg, the county seat for Hidalgo County.

1933-48

Edinburg Junior College, as the only institution of higher learning in South Texas, experienced rapid growth in its early years, prompting administrators to pursue the first name change.

1948-52

Edinburg Regional College was moved from the original four-acre site to a 186-acre campus a few blocks west. During the 1950s and 60s, the campus was purchased in parcels at a cost of \$677,000.

1952-71

Pan American College made its transformation from a junior college to a four-year university in the early 1950s. The name Pan American was selected to reflect the institution's desire to bridge the cultures of North and South America and to reflect the cultural and ethnic diversity of the university.

1989-2015

The University of Texas-Pan American was established in 1989 after the successful and historic merger of Pan American University with the University of Texas System. In 1991, the Brownsville campus formed a separate institution, the University of Texas at Brownsville.

1971-89

Pan American University saw the student population diversify during the 1970s, reflecting a predominantly Mexican-American population. *The Wall Street Journal* credited then President Dr. Miguel Nevarez with creating a Hispanic middle class for the South Texas region. In 1973, PAU began to expand, opening a campus in Brownsville.

Present

The UT System Board of Regents approved a proposal to create UTRGV on Dec. 6, 2012. The bill passed and was signed into law by Governor Rick Perry on June 14, 2013. UTRGV received accreditation on Sept. 1, 2015.

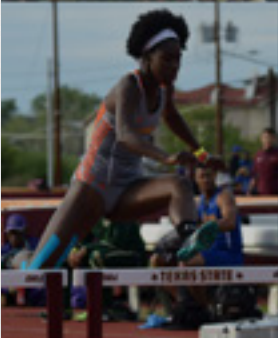
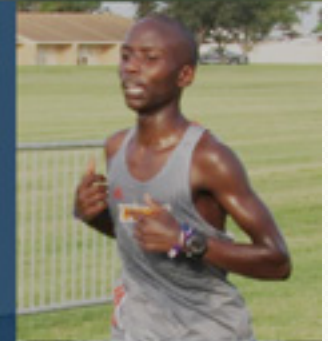

1971 College World Series Team

When asked about his Pan American College Broncs' team in 1971, former head coach Al Ogletree always responds, "I had all the young men that no one else wanted, but we had a good year."

A 'good year' could be the understatement of the century, as the Broncs played the roles of underdogs during the District VI regional tournament. The Broncs pulled off one of the greatest upsets in college baseball history by shutting out the University of Texas twice. It was the first time the Longhorns were shutout in consecutive games in 62 years as Pan American was crowned District VI Champions.

"Lupe Salinas pitched a 1-0 shutout then Gary Doyle pitched the second with a 4-0 victory that sent us to the College World Series in Omaha," Ogletree said.

At the College World Series, the Broncs fell to Southern Illinois University, 5-4, in the first round.

"It was a close game, which would have been even closer, but we had a base runner miss third and that run would have made it a tie ball game. Salinas pitched well enough to win, but sometimes those are the breaks," Ogletree stated.

The opening game loss sparked an even more determined Pan Am team heading into their second game match-up. The Broncs faced Seton Hall, and with the strong pitching of Doyle, the Broncs won 8-2. As game three approached, Ogletree decided on Andre Rabouin to take the mound, and he hurled a complete-game shutout against Harvard, 1-0.

"It was the first time he had ever pitched a nine-inning game, and he was given a standing ovation from his team when he got on the bus to go back to the hotel."

The final game of the CWS was a rematch between the Broncs and the Southern Illinois team that handed the team their earlier loss.

"We didn't understand why we were facing this team again. It didn't really make sense because there were teams we hadn't faced yet. The guys played with a lot of heart, but we lost it in the final inning."

The Broncs saw their season come to an end after leading the game until the ninth inning, when they fell behind 8-6 and lost.

Although the season had come to a close, there was much to celebrate. The 1971 Broncs finished the season with 44 victories, an all-time record for any Texas college or university at the time. The Broncs finished fourth at the College World Series with a 2-2 record, and were selected as the top-ranked team in the country at season's end.

Ogletree was named College Coach of the Year by both The Sporting News and the South Plains Professional Scouts Association.

With a team full of talented, hard-working athletes, most of their success could be attributed to the coaching methods that Ogletree brought to the field everyday. The strategy paid off as the Broncs led the nation in fielding.

"I made sure the team was fundamentally-sound. We were skilled because we worked on the basics everyday in practice. I also made sure we covered everything that might happen in a game. We examined every game situation, and how we were going to tackle it," Ogletree said.

In those first seasons at the helm of the program, Ogletree instilled in his players the tradition of hard work and a winning attitude that continued with him through his 29 years at Pan American.

"I continued to wear the uniform number 44. Those 44 victories gave me a 100-32 record in those first three seasons at Pan American University."

During that memorable season, James Tyrone was named All-American for the second consecutive season by the NCAA, AACBC and Topps. He hit .349 with 55 stolen bases. Tyrone and teammate Mike Duffey were selected as honorable mention All-Americans by The Sporting News.

After shattering all of their attendance records that season, Pan American University went to work on the building of a new stadium to be ready for competition in 1974. The new stadium had the seating capacity for 4,200 Broncs fans, and they needed it. The Broncs made the NCAA Tournament in each of the next five seasons and hosted the Midwest Regional in 1976.

In total, the Broncs have reached the NCAA Tournament 13 times, including 10 trips following the College World Series appearance. The Broncs have also had 12 winning seasons since 1971.

Even with all the success that followed, however, the 1971 campaign currently ranks as the greatest season in program history.



1983 NCAA Regional Team

The Pan American University Broncs baseball team had a slogan of “Teamwork, Pride, and Desire” that had elevated them into NCAA postseasons in 10 of the previous 13 seasons.

Two of the three non-playoff seasons took place in 1981 and 1982, making the Broncs determined to return to playoffs in 1983.

“After years of success, our pitching staff stumbled those two years. We recruited some big, strong pitchers to put us back into the winning column again,” head coach Al Ogletree said.

The road back wasn’t easy. As an Independent squad, the team was forced to play some of the NCAA’s best baseball teams to even be considered for postseason play.

“I had a feeling this team possessed the blend of experience, pitching, defense and hitting that would put us back among the elite in the Southwest,” Ogletree said. “Overall, it would be our pitching that would tell the tale. We had five returning pitchers and eight new players who would hold our program’s future in their hands.”

The Broncs picked up three of their most impressive wins of the season just prior to playoffs. Wichita State University invited Pan American to come play after a cancellation from the University of Texas left them with an opening in their schedule.

“They had offered to fly us out there and give us room and board to play them. They were ranked No. 1 in the nation and had the number one draft choice for the Major Leagues.”

Pan Am took the four-game series 3-1, beating Wichita State 19-9, 4-2 and 12-5 before falling 10-4 in the final game.

“If I remember correctly, we hit five home runs in the first game. Rafael Barbosa had two, Bobby Joe Williams, Michell Moran and Pat Marshell had one. After that, the hits just kept coming in the second and third games,” Ogletree said.

The Broncs made their way to the NCAA Regional Playoffs in Austin, where they rode the right arm of All-American Jim Hickey to beat Grambling State 5-0 in the first game. In the second game, Pan American made a dramatic comeback in the ninth inning against Northeastern Louisiana to record a 9-8 victory.

“Game Two was a special one. Northeast Louisiana hit three consecutive home runs in the top of the ninth inning with two outs to take the 8-6 lead. Barbosa, Luis Chavez and Gilbert Beason each clubbed home runs for us in the bottom of the ninth inning and we came back to win 9-8,” said Ogletree.

What made the moment so incredible for Ogletree was the fact that it was the second time in one season that a situation like that had occurred.

“Earlier in the season against Louisiana Tech, we were down 5-3 in the ninth with no outs. Gilbert Trevino, Williams and Moran hit successive home runs to win us the game 6-5. After that game, I told them they had just seen something happen that they would probably never see again. The first thing they said to me as I got on the bus after the Northeastern Louisiana game was, ‘I thought you said we would never see that again,’” Ogletree said.

The Broncs suffered their first loss of the regional playoffs against Mississippi State, 7-5. That Bulldogs squad consisted of two future MLB All-Stars, Will Clark and Rafael Palmeiro.

In the fourth round of the playoffs, the Broncos squared-off against a Texas Longhorns team that possessed four of the top pitchers in college baseball that season, including future seven-time Cy Young award winner Roger Clemens. The Broncos fell short 6-1 and their season came to a close.

Overall, the Broncos went 64-19-1, setting a program record for wins in a single-season.

At the conclusion of the season, Hickey was named first team All-American by the NCAA and AACBC, recording a 16-2 record on the mound with a 1.66 earned run average. He struck out 109 hitters while walking only 29 in 130.1 innings.

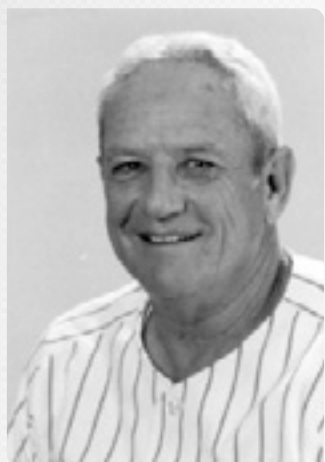
Moran finished the season hitting .320 with 20 home runs, 12 doubles and 85 runs batted in. He racked up 162 total bases, scored 74 runs and stole 27 bases as well.

As a team, the Broncos hit .280 with 82 home runs, 93 doubles and 15 triples. They averaged 6.25 runs per game.

The Broncos finished 19th in the nation that season, and several players continued their careers in the professional ranks, including Hickey, who is now the pitching coach for the Tampa Bay Rays.



Hall of Fame Head Coach Emeritus Al Ogletree



When faithful of Pan American baseball talk about the legacy and tradition of the program, the topic always begins with one man, Al Ogletree.

Ogletree took the reigns of the baseball program at Pan American in 1968.

After posting a 50-46 record at Sul Ross State and taking his 1968 squad to the NAIA College World Series, Ogletree was informed that the baseball program would be dropped. Sul Ross State's loss was Pan American's gain.

A 1952 graduate of Texas A&M, where he also earned his master's degree in 1956, Ogletree played professional baseball for two years and then spent two years in the United State Army as an officer. He began his coaching career at the University of Dallas as he led them to an 82-45 record, including a 71-26 mark in his last four seasons.

Ogletree then went on to coach at Sul Ross State for two seasons. While he'd already coached successfully for 11 years, the road ahead of him was filled with some of the most impressive years he spent as a head coach.

Coach Al brought his passion for the game to Pan American University, where he spent 29 years as a head coach before retiring as one of the winningest coaches in NCAA history.

In 1971, Ogletree led his team to a 44-9 record and a fourth place finish at the College World Series. At season's end, The Sporting News named him as the nation's Coach of the Year. He received the honor from his colleagues in the NCAA District VI, the Texas Sports Writers' Association and the South Plains Professional Scouts Association as well.

Ogletree finished with a 1,084-618-1 (.637) record at Pan American. He retired in 1997, finishing with 1,217 wins in his 41 years of coaching collegiate baseball. He produced 175 future coaches, including his successor, Reggie Tredaway, current Tampa Bay Rays pitching coach Jim Hickey, and current Miami Marlins first base and infield coach Perry Hill.

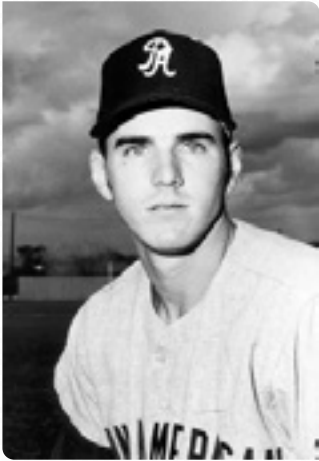
Ogletree has been a legend in the collegiate world of baseball for over four decades, and his hard work and dedication to the UTPA baseball program was recognized when he became an inaugural member of the UTPA Athletics Hall of Fame in February 2007. He is also the Broncs head coach emeritus, one of only two people to ever hold that title at Pan American.

Ogletree has also been inducted into nine Hall of Fames around the State of Texas:

- Austin High School Hall of Fame
- Texas A&M Hall of Fame
- American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame
- The Rio Grande Valley Sports Hall of Fame
- UTPA Hall of Fame
- Central Texas Semi-Pro Hall of Fame
- University of Dallas Collegiate Hall of Fame
- Sul Ross State Hall of Fame
- Texas Sports Hall of Fame

Ogletree also serves as a member of the UTPA Athletics Hall of Fame committee that nominates future hall of fame and hall of honor inductees.

Remembering Jody Ramsey



Jody Ramsey was the Pan American University's leading hitter and co-captain for the 1972 season, and that year, he led the team in eight statistical categories, including hitting (.346), games played (56), at-bats (185), runs scored (47), hits (64), triples (four), stolen bases (17) and walks. He also earned NCAA All-District VI honors.

Prior to the 1973 season, Ramsey was working on the construction of the new Pan American baseball stadium being built. As one of the laborers, he spent many hours on the site of the ballpark and, in an unfortunate turn of events, was killed in an electrical accident before the stadium had reached completion.

Former head coach Al Ogletree said that the death of Ramsey was one of the most upsetting moments in his coaching career.

"1973 turned out to be a dark time in my life, and in the history of Pan American baseball, with the death of one of the great men and students of Pan Am."

After his death, students petitioned the Pan American University Board of Regents to name the park in Ramsey's memory. The recommendation was accepted unanimously, and in 1974, the Broncs took the field to play their first season in Jody Ramsey Memorial Stadium.

The Broncs baseball program played in Jody Ramsey Memorial Stadium from 1974 through 2000. The park was dismantled in 2003 to make way for an education building.

The Broncs also honored Ramsey by hosting the Jody Ramsey Tournament every year from 1980 through 1995, and through a memorial award given to a senior baseball player each season. Considered the top award given to any baseball player, it goes to the athlete who best exemplifies the standards set by Ramsey, including superior athletic ability, character, leadership and dedication to excellence on and off the field. Recent recipients have been Mike McCarthy, Richard Bandrich, and Adrian De La Rosa.

Additionally, Ogletree never again gave out Ramsey's jersey number (six).

While he was very impressive on the field, Ramsey was equally outstanding in his character and standards of living. He was twice elected president of the Pan American University Chapter of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Ramsey lived an outstanding moral existence and had a brief, but brilliant career within the Broncs baseball program.

A 2013 UTPA Hall of Honor inductee, Ramsey was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Johnny Ramsey of Freeport, Texas.

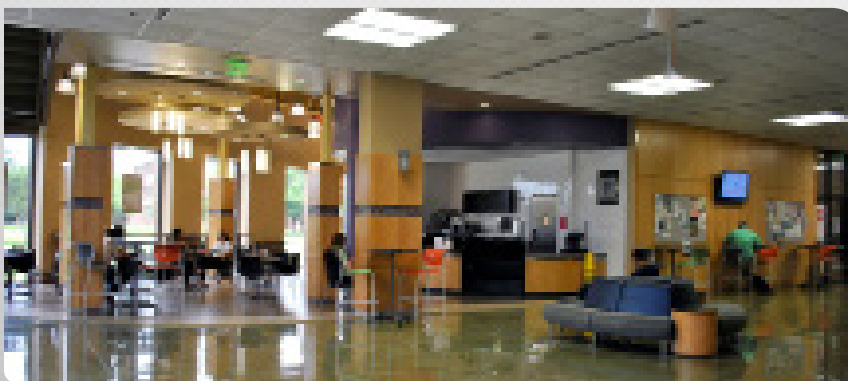
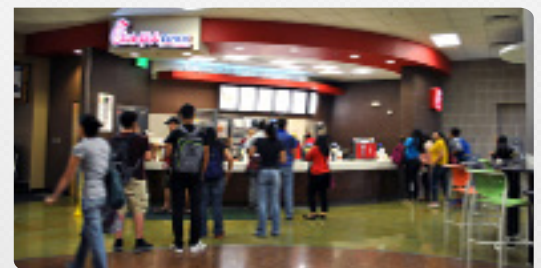
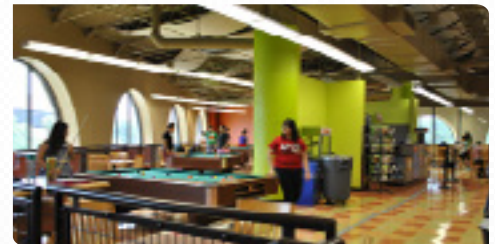


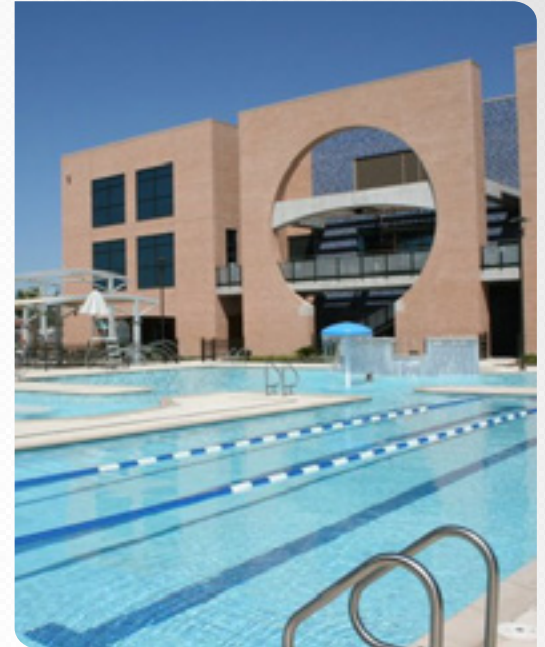
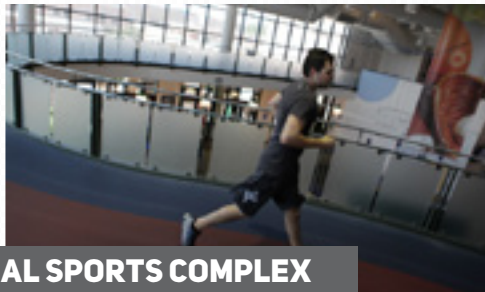
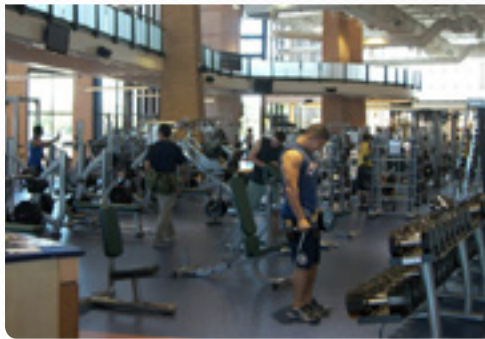
Student Union

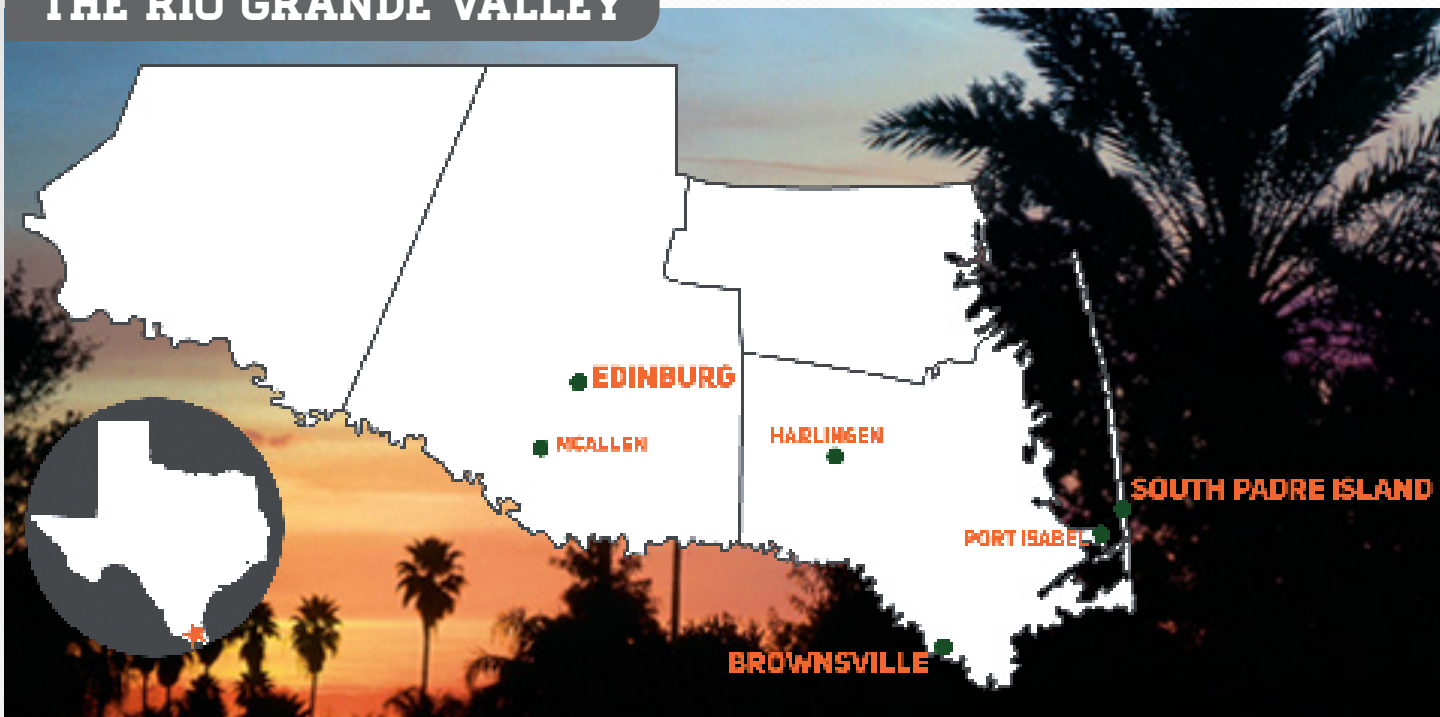


WELLNESS & RECREATIONAL SPORTS COMPLEX



- Weight area includes both free weights and exercise machines, including dumbbells, strength training equipment, cardiovascular machines, and multiple televisions for entertainment.
- Walking/running track, approximately 1/10 mile, with area for stretching. There are also stability balls and mats as well as three racquetball courts.
- Two dance/activity rooms for group exercise and specialty programs.
- The main gymnasium space can be divided into two basketball, two volleyball or multiple badminton courts. One indoor soccer court with rounded corners, dasher boards and Plexiglas can also be utilized as a basketball, volleyball or badminton court. Used for open recreation and intramurals.
- Indoor Climbing Facility (35' high) combines integral rock and moveable hand and foot holds. Also features three routes and hosts instructional courses from beginner to advanced. Group facility and private party rentals are available. Aquatics facilities feature a lap swimming pool, leisure pool, lazy river, and a jacuzzi. It is a perfect place for a private party or group rental.
- Outdoor Activity Area features two sand volleyball courts, two outdoor basketball courts, two tennis courts, and an outdoor pavilion with tables and chairs. A BBQ grill is available for group rentals.
- Men's and women's locker rooms with over 400 lockers, private shower areas, and vanity areas.
- Member Services Desk assists guests with membership sales, locker rentals, retail sales, and general guest services.
- Energy Zone serves up sandwiches, smoothies, specialty items, salads, fruits, soft drinks, sports drinks and bottled water.
- Lounge/Eating Area with tables and chairs, lounge furniture, couches, televisions, vending machines and great observational area for many activities.

- Home to two minor league sports teams, including the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, the two-time NBA Development League Champion affiliate of the Houston Rockets, and the RGV FC Toros, the USL affiliate of the Houston Dynamo. About 35 current and former NBA players have played for the Vipers, including Aaron Brooks, CJ Watson, Steve Novak, Hasheem Thabeet, Ben Uzoh, Patrick Patterson, Terrence Jones, Patrick Beverley, Troy Daniels and Robert Covington.

- The Vipers play at State Farm Arena, which draws some of the top acts in music, including Train, Rob Thomas, Shakira, Aerosmith, Kiss, ZZ Top, Cher, Nelly, George Strait, Elton John, REO Speedwagon, STYX and Lady Antebellum.

- State Farm Arena plays to a Houston Rockets exhibition games on a semi-regular basis, including games against the Boston Celtics (2009), Orlando Magic (2010 and 2015), Oklahoma City Thunder (2012) and Golden State Warriors (2014).

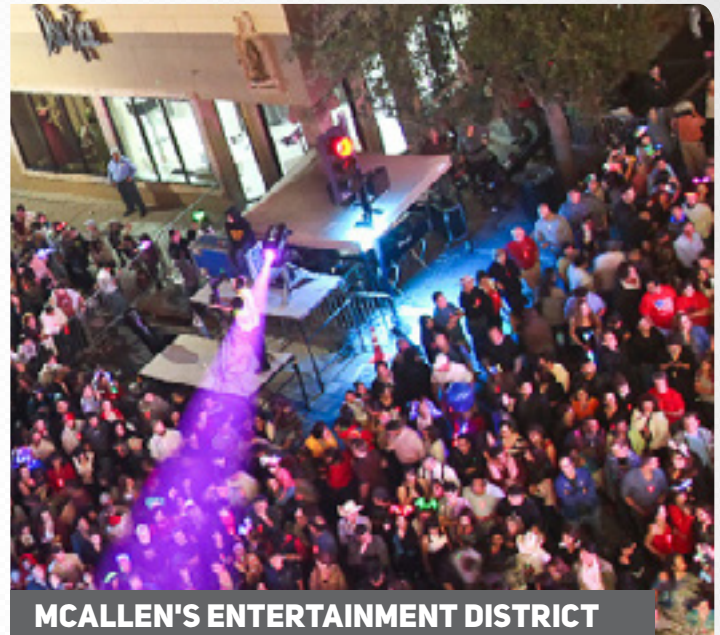

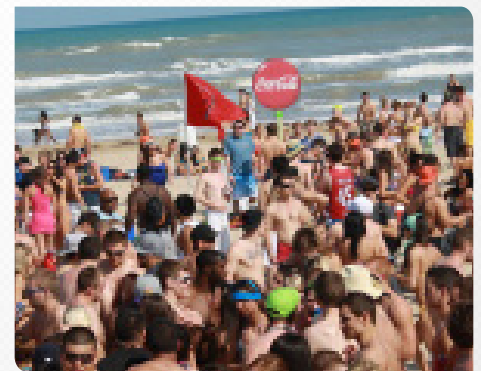

UTRGV PRESIDENT



DR. GUY BAILEY

Guy Bailey, Ph.D., was named Founding President of The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley in May of 2014.

Prior to being named President of UTRGV, he served as President of the University of Alabama and of Texas Tech University; Chancellor of the University of Missouri Kansas City; Provost and Executive Vice President at The University of Texas San Antonio; Dean of Liberal Arts at the University of Nevada Las Vegas; Chair of the English Department at Oklahoma State University and the University of Memphis; and as a faculty member at Texas A&M and Emory Universities.

During his time at Texas Tech, the university met the criteria established by the Texas State Legislature for participation in the National Research University Fund; enrollment grew by 3,905 students (14%); research expenditures grew by \$89.9 million (170%); and graduation rates increase by five percentage points.

During his tenure at UTSA, the university was named an emerging research university by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; 16 new doctoral programs were added; external funding for research more than doubled; enrollment grew by more than 40%; and graduate enrollment grew by almost 50%.

While Bailey was at UMKC, the university completed a \$200 million capital campaign and built or gained approval for \$175 million in new construction. From 2010 to 2012, Bailey served on the Board of Directors of the NCAA and on the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Big XII athletic conference. He has also served on the Board of Trustees of Midwest Research Institute since 2007.

Bailey continues to do research on language change and variation. His research with his late wife, Jan, has been featured in a front-page article in the New York Times, on National Public Radio, on CNN Headline News, on BBC Radio, in Texas Monthly, and in the San Antonio Express News. Since 1984, Bailey has brought in over \$1 million in external funding for his research.

UTRGV DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



CHRIS KING

Chris King has served as Director of Athletics since October 1, 2009.

As the leader of the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, Chris King's proactive style and leadership have

helped the department reach new heights and lay a solid foundation for future growth and success.

Inspired by the growth and innovation of the Rio Grande Valley, King has made it UTRGV Athletics' goal to Elevate the standard of Division I Athletics and proudly represent the university in competition, in the classroom, and in the community.

In order to accomplish that goal, King unveiled a new five-year strategic plan in Feb. 2017. The focus of this strategic plan is to improve the student-athlete experience and lead UTRGV Athletics to become the industry standard of the WAC and Division I. The five main goals include student success and experience, the 3 F's: facilities, finance and fundraising, competitive excellence, promoting a culture of integrity, and branding and engagement.

King also redefined UTRGV Athletics' culture, vision, core values, expectations and beliefs, under the mantra of, "16 Sports, 1 Team." Part of the new culture is ensuring an end product of academic success, social responsibility, competitive excellence, fan experience, community engagement and leadership development.

UTRGV Athletics has seen considerable elevation in academics, competition, facilities, revenue generation, diversity and equity, and community service during King's tenure. Much of the elevation has occurred since King secured a bid into the Western Athletic Conference starting with the 2013-14 season, ending a period of 15 years without access to an automatic qualifier to NCAA Championship-level events.

Academics

The department pushed its cumulative grade point average (GPA) to 3.14 in 2016-17, with a record 146 student-athletes earning 2017 Spring AD Honor Roll recognition after a then-record 141 student-athletes earned the honor in the fall for boasting a GPA of at least 3.0. Student-athletes continue to maintain higher GPAs and graduation rates than their peers in the general student body. The student-athlete graduation success rate has jumped from 54 to 77 percent over the last eight years.

Competition

UTRGV won its first WAC Volleyball Tournament Championship and Individual WAC Indoor Track & Field Championships in 2016-17 while also adding a title in women's outdoor track & field. Since joining the WAC in the fall of 2013, UTRGV has won two team and 16 individual WAC Championships.

Making the postseason is becoming a regular occurrence, as the volleyball and women's tennis teams made their respective NCAA Tournaments in 2016 and the women's basketball team has now made three-straight postseason appearances, winning its first-ever postseason home game in March of 2017.

Other successes in 2016-17 include women's cross country earning the first regional ranking in program history, men's soccer making the WAC Tournament as the No. 5 seed in its second season of play after an 18-year hiatus, and women's soccer posting a winning record in just its third season of play.

The 2016-17 academic year also featured the launch of the South Texas Showdown, presented by Navy Army Community Credit Union, a rivalry series pitting UTRGV against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in 12 sports to determine South Texas bragging rights. #BeatCorpus

Facilities

Under King's leadership, UTRGV Athletics has completed numerous facilities upgrades. In 2016-17, UTRGV completed a pair of projects, including the Coach Al and Joann Ogletree Plaza and upgrades to the Victory Center.

The Coach Al and Joann Ogletree Plaza features a statue of legendary Baseball Head Coach Emeritus Al Ogletree and a plaque of late wife, Joann, on top of a bricks placed in the shape of a baseball at the entrance to UTRGV Baseball Stadium.

UTRGV Athletics secured a \$100,000 grant from the NCAA Accelerating Academic Success Program Committee to make immediate improvements to the Victory Center with the purposes of directly influencing student-athletes' progress toward degree and APR requirements. This injection of funds provided upgrades for facility renovations, additional technology, and professional development efforts. Over the last four years, UTRGV Athletics has received over \$300,000 in grants from this NCAA program.

New Builds

The \$4.55 million UTRGV Soccer and Track & Field Complex opened in Oct. 2014 to host the first season of women's soccer and then, in 2015, the return of men's soccer. The complex also hosted the 2017 WAC Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

Capital Projects

King arranged the donation of the \$6.5 million baseball stadium from the City of Edinburg to the university in Oct. 2014, and has since conducted significant renovations as part of a capital project, including the installation of a new video board and scoreboard.

King moved UTRGV Athletics into a new strength & conditioning facility in 2013-14 and completed a capital project in the spring of 2015 to acquire new equipment.

Renovations

King has completed numerous renovations to the UTRGV Fieldhouse, including the addition of the largest indoor video board in the Rio Grande Valley (34.45'x11.81') by securing a \$250,000 gift from Coca-Cola Refreshments in 2012. King has since resurfaced the court and upgraded the basketball team and locker rooms with new lockers, furniture, carpeting and graphics.

The Orville Cox Tennis Center has been upgraded during King's tenure, with six resurfaced courts, new fences, new windscreens, new walkways and a new entrance.

King also oversaw the renovation of office space for women's basketball, tennis, golf, and track & field, creating additional office space for five head coaches and three assistant coaches.

Major Gifts

Over the last eight years, King has secured numerous six and seven-figure major gifts through gifts for capital projects, planned giving and endowed scholarships. Most recently, King brought in a \$1 million planned gift from Dan and Terry Martinez in June 2017.

Revenue Generation

King and the fundraising and external sales staff increased fundraising by 198 percent and grew corporate sponsorship revenue by 157 percent in 2015-16. Ticket revenue increased by 44.67 percent in 2016-17. The increase in ticket revenue was due in large part to a 24.33 percent increase in attendance at ticketed sports, including a 23.80 percent increase in men's basketball attendance. King also renegotiated the University licensing royalty revenue agreement to increase licensing revenue by over 200 percent in 2015-16.

Diversity and Equity

King's main priority upon becoming Director of Athletics was advancing his belief in a culture of integrity, including rules compliance, diversity, equity, and inclusion.

King completed the Title IX/Gender Equity Plan by starting women's soccer in 2014, adding 7.0 scholarships to fully fund men's track & field, 1.8 scholarships to fully fund baseball, 1.5 scholarships to fully fund men's golf, and 1.5 scholarships to fully fund men's tennis. Another part of the plan included the creation of two new head coaching positions, as the university went from having one coach for both tennis teams and one for both golf teams to having separate coaches for each team. King also set up the track & field and volleyball teams to add an assistant coach.

Community Service

After completing the 15th-highest total of community service hours in NCAA Division I and 20th-highest overall in the NCAA Team Works Competition for NCAA DI, DII, and DIII athletic departments and student-athletes in 2015-16, UTRGV athletics set an all-time record in service and volunteering, outreach and engagement, campus engagement, and networking hours of service in 2016-17.

Leadership Positions

King's accomplishments led to his selection as a current member of the NCAA Division I Nominating Committee and the former NCAA Division I Legislative Council. King also serves as an executive board member of the I-AAA Athletic Director Association and the chair of the I-AAA Athletic Director Association Mentoring Committee. King also holds multiple leadership positions with the WAC, serving as the 2017-18 WAC council chair, as well as the strategic plan chair and the men's basketball chair.

Prior to UTRGV, King spent seven years (2002-09) at the University of Alabama as an Associate Athletic Director. King's athletic career began in 1995 at Campbell University as a compliance assistant. He then moved to Liberty University, where he was the Director of Compliance and Special Events. He later worked at the University of Central Florida, where he served as Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance and Internal Operations.


King is married to the former Alicia Flowers, who is the Associate Vice President for Development at UTRGV. They reside in McAllen with their two daughters, seven-year old Kylie Marie, and four-year old McKenzie Elizabeth.






