# **UTRGV FIELDHOUSE**




Located on the northeast side of campus, the UTRGV Fieldhouse is the home of the volleyball and men's and women's basketball programs. Built in 1969, the UTRGV Fieldhouse currently has seating for 2,500.

The UTRGV Fieldhouse is set to undergo major renovations, including a new practice gym for the basketball and volleyball teams. Additionally, the fieldhouse itself, the university's largest multi-purpose facility that houses basketball, volleyball, and campus and community events, will be renovated to now include:

- •A new 15,000-square foot entrance plaza/atrium;
- •A new lobby including Hall of Fame & Hall of Honor area;
- ·Team store;
- ·Concessions;
- •Public restrooms:
- ·A new, unique way to watch games;
- ·New ribbon and video boards;
- ·New seating.





UTRGV Athletics is continiously upgrading the facility. The most recent renovations were completed in 2019, including new home and visiting team and officials' locker rooms and team rooms, new hallways leading to the locker room areas, a redesigned Sam Williams Court, new baskets, new scoreboards, new scorer's and media tables with LED boards, and new entry doors.

In 2018, renovations included new lighting, a brand new, larger and more advanced sports medicine center, a new concession stand, a new equipment room, and a new media room. UTRGV Athletics also installed a new sound system in 2017.

The UTRGV Fieldhouse is part of Health and Physical Education Building 1, which is 58,387 square feet and contains much of the athletic department's office space, as well as office/classroom space for the department of health and kinesiology and a swimming pool.




# **BERT OGDEN ARENA**



UTRGV Athletics is committed to playing at the best venues in the region, including Bert Ogden Arena, where the men's basketball team hosted Oklahoma in 2018-19, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in and, Tarleton in 2020-21, and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Sam Houston in 2021-22.

With a capacity of 9,324 on three levels of seating, Bert Ogden Arena is the largest indoor arena in South Texas. The arena features 15 luxury suites, two member suites, four bunker suites, 10 loge boxes, a 44' x 19' 6mm LED video board and concession stands with food from restaurants including Il Forno, Taco Palenque, Kumori, Luby's and Fuddruckers.

# STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING



In 2014, athletics moved into a new 3,000 squarefoot area strength & conditioning facility, and in 2015, with the help of donors, UTRGV Athletics purchased brand new speed and strength equipment, as well as free weight and aerobic/cardio equipment. UTRGV Athletics also acquired new power racks, platforms, benches and dumbbells.

The strength and conditioning facility is exclusively for UTRGV student-athletes.

PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE





For today's student-athletes, training and conditioning is a year-round commitment. Balancing the rigors of competing at the collegiate level with the demands of the classroom is one of the greatest challenges our student-athletes face. That is why it is so essential that the department of intercollegiate athletics provides our student-athletes with access to hands-on academic support.

Located in the Academic Services
Building, the Victory Center is an integral
part of the life of our student-athletes
and has a vast amount of services and
assistance available.

The Victory Center is structured after the principles of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills

Program, which is created to provide studentathletes with five basic components: Academic Excellence, Athletic Excellence, Community Service, Career Development and Personal Development.

UTRGV has approximately 275 student-athletes, including approximately 150 freshmen and transfers, who are required to attend study hall and specially designed workshops that assist them in acclimating to college life and living away from home. Student-athletes must dedicate anywhere from six to 10 hours each week to study hall as they work toward their ultimate goal, graduation.

The Victory Center provides student-athletes access to computers, tutors and other resources. The Victory Center, which is open six days a week (Sunday-Friday), houses a computer lab, a learning lab, areas for both individual and group study, and offices for the Academic Advisement Center staff.

Each student-athlete works with their college advisor to make sure that they are enrolled in the correct classes to graduate. The Victory Center staff verifies the classes to ensure that the student-athlete is working towards their degree, making yearly satisfactory progress and meeting grade point average requirements.

# History

UTRGV was created by the Texas Legislature in 2013 as the first major public university of the 21st century in Texas. This transformative initiative provided the opportunity to expand educational opportunities in the Rio Grande Valley, including a new School of Medicine, and made it possible for residents of the region to benefit from the Permanent University Fund – a public endowment contributing support to the University of Texas System and other institutions.

UTRGV has campuses and off-campus research & teaching sites throughout the Valley including Boca Chica Beach, Brownsville (formerly The University of Texas at Brownsville campus), Edinburg (formerly The University of Texas-Pan American campus), Harlingen, McAllen, Port Isabel, Rio Grande City, and South Padre Island. UTRGV, a comprehensive academic institution, enrolled its first class in the fall of 2015, and the School of Medicine welcomed its first class in the summer of 2016.

## **UT Brownsville and UT Pan American**

The shared history of The University of Texas-Pan American and The University of Texas at Brownsville goes back to 1973, when Pan American opened a second campus in Brownsville, which later became an independent institution of The University of Texas System in 1991. Over the years, the missions and the identities of these great institutions have continually evolved to serve the communities of the Rio Grande Valley.

At the UTRGV School of Medicine, students have access to high-quality, innovative medical education programs that are designed to train the next generation of physician leaders in medical education, scientific research, and patient care.

Our mission is to educate a diverse group of dedicated students who will become physicians who serve across all the disciplines of medicine; to bring hope to patients by advancing medical knowledge through research; to integrate education and research to advance the quality and accessibility of patient care in an integrated manner, curriculum are: and to engage with the Rio Grande Valley communities to benefit Texas and the world.

# **MD Program**

a forward-thinking medical education experience that graduates physicians dedicated to practicing scientific, evidence-based, and patient-centered medicine in any setting, but particularly in under-served communities. The curriculum provides a unique educational experience that integrates basic science disciplines, clinical skills, and professional development throughout the four-year program by incorporating and promoting:

- Principles of evidence-based practice & scientific research;
- ·Community and population-based health care;
- Patient advocacy and cultural awareness;
- Inter-professional collaboration and communication;
- Ethical and professional behavior;
- ·Life-long learning and problem-solving.

The school's distinctive geographic location at the border of the US and Mexico offers a rich bicultural

experience that will afford students with the opportunity to experience and to learn about border medicine and the interplay between the cross-cultural, socio-economic and environmental determinants of health.

#### The Four-Year Curriculum

The general four-year curriculum is divided into two preclerkship years comprised of sequential and longitudinal learning modules and two clerkship years comprised of clerkships, selective clerkships and sub-internships and electives. Woven throughout this four-year integrated

- Interprofessional Education: Students are given the opportunity to experience interprofessional education and team-based care by working and learning alongside an array of disciplines that The UTRGV School of Medicine is committed to providing include nursing, pharmacy, physician assistants, public health, social work, behavioral health and occupational therapy.
  - •Early Clinical Exposure: Students are given the opportunity to participate in direct patient interactions during the pre-clerkship years through venues such as the UTRGV Student-Run Free Clinic, Colonia UniMovil clinics, Operation Lone Stars, health fairs, and more.
  - ·Underserved Medicine: Student are given the opportunity to work in under-served communities, Colonias, and at the student-run free clinic, to learn about healthcare disparities and population health.

## **Graduate Medical Education (GME)**

The GME process, which includes residencies and fellowships, is intended to prepare the physician for the independent practice of medicine and to assist in the development of a commitment to the life-long learning process that is critical for maintaining professional growth and competency.

# **1962-63 NAIA National Championship Team**

During the 1962-63 season, Pan American College was on the "outs" with all of its opponents in the NAIA postseason tournament.

Head coach Sam Williams watched as his Broncs squad out-scored, out-rebounded, out-hustled, out-worked and out-played every opponent they faced en route to capturing the NAIA National Championship at Municipal Stadium in Kansas City, Mo.

Led by All-American Luke Jackson, the 12th-ranked Broncs went into the NAIA postseason tournament as one of the nation's hottest teams, winning 17 of their final 19 games of the season. Pan American proved to be untested in its first three contests, hammering Peru State (83-48) before beating Stetson (64-41) and Northern Michigan (99-73).

The Broncs biggest test of the tournament came in the NAIA National Semifinals against Grambling State and its dynamic duo of Hershell West and future Hall of Famer Willis Reed. West came into the contest tied for eighth in the nation in scoring (26.0 points per game) while Reed was second on the squad (21.2 ppg).

The Broncs knew that West and Reed would score their points, 34 and 31 respectively, but Pan American refused to let the rest of the Tigers shooters get the best of them. Grambling State got only 18 total points from the rest of the squad.

Jackson and Mitchell Edwards were a dynamic duo in their own right, as the pair tallied 26 of the Broncs' 36 first half points. In the second half, Jackson and company continued their strong play and outscored the Tigers 54-51, en route to pulling off one of the biggest upsets in the tournament with a 90-83 victory.

Jackson finished the game with 33 points and 13 rebounds while Edwards added 24 points and eight boards. The Broncs had four players score in double-digits, including Jim McGurk (14 points) and Marty Urand (12 points). In the national championship game, Pan American was pitted against 10th-ranked Western Carolina. The Catamounts held their own against the Broncs, trailing 59-52 with a little over nine minutes remaining in the contest.

Over that span, Western Carolina focused the majority of their attention on Jackson, who finished the game with 25 points and 25 rebounds.

That proved to be the Catamounts' downfall as Edwards and McGurk lit up the floor and combined to score 10 of Pan American's final 13 points. Edwards ended the contest with 20 points and 12 rebounds while McGurk added 12 points and 10 boards.

Pan American won the championship 72-63. Jackson earned MVP honors after averaging 26.4 points and 18.6 rebounds throughout the tournament.

The 1962-63 Pan American squad is one of just three Texas Universities to win a Collegiate Basketball National Title. In 2000, the team was reunited for the first time and honored at the UTPA Fieldhouse.

The Broncs were again reunited in February 2007 as they were inducted with the inaugural class into the UTPA Hall of Fame. Williams and Jackson were inducted individually as well.

The Broncs were honored by UTPA in 2013, as the team was brought back during homecoming to celebrate the 50th anniversary of their title. Additionally, Jackson's retired jersey was unveiled in the rafters and there was a moving ceremony honoring the late Williams.

# The Greatest of All-Time



A 6-9 power forward/center out of San Marcos, Luke Jackson is widely considered to be the greatest player to every wear this program's uniform.

Jackson spent three seasons with the Broncs, leading them to the 1963 NAIA National Championship as a junior by scoring 25 points and pulling in 25 rebounds to beat Western Carolina 73-62. Throughout the NAIA National Tournament, Jackson averaged 26.4 points and 18.6 rebounds per game to earn the Most Valuable Player award.

It was one of three NAIA National Tournament appearances for the Broncs during Jackson's time there, as he led the Broncs back to the NAIA National Championship game in 1964 as well

A two-time All-American, Jackson ranks first in program history in career field goal percentage (.547), free throws made (443) and free throws attempted (605), second in points scored (1,813), rebounds (1,393) and field goals made (685), and sixth in field goals attempted (1,252). His name is also in the Top 10 for single-season records 17 times and single-game records eight times.

Shortly after graduating, Jackson went on to help Team USA win the gold medal at the 1964 Olympics in Tokyo.

Selected by the Philadelphia 76ers with the fourth overall pick of the 1964 NBA Draft, Jackson went on to play in 522 games across eight seasons in the NBA, averaging 9.9 points and 8.8 rebounds per game. During the 1964-65 season, Jackson was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team and the NBA All-Star Team. He averaged a career-high 14.8 points and 12.9 rebounds per game. Jackson was a starter alongside Hall of Famer Wilt Chamberlain on the 1966-67 76ers squad that won the NBA Championship.

Jackson was inducted into the inaugural UTPA Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007. His jersey number, 54, which was the first to be retired in school history, one of just two to be retired in school history, and the only one to be retired across all sports, hangs proudly in the rafters of the UTRGV Fieldhouse.



# **1967-68 NCAA Division II Tournament Participants**

The 1960s were a time of change for Pan American athletics.

After transitioning from being a junior college to a four-year institution in 1952, Pan American College became a member of the NAIA. In 1962-63, the Broncs held dual membership with the NAIA and NCAA Division II. The Broncs began transitioning to the NCAA Division I level in 1965-66 as the men's tennis team made the jump and immediately reached the NCAA Championships. The men's basketball team didn't follow until 1968-69, allowing them to take part not only in the 1965-66 NAIA District Playoffs, but the 1967-68 NCAA Division II Tournament as well.

In the program's only NCAA Tournament appearance, the Broncs knocked off Jackson State in the first round 96-73 before falling to Trinity in the Southwestern Regional Finals 87-83 in overtime.

The Broncs finished the season 21-6. In those six losses, the Broncs' average margin of defeat was just 5.67 points per game. Even more impressively, though, is that after starting the season 2-3, the Broncs went 19-3 the rest of the way, including winning streaks of eight and 10 games. The Broncs' lone regular season losses during that time were on the road and by three points each. One of the games was even an overtime loss.

Part of the reason for the Broncs' success was defending home court, as the Broncs went 16-0 in Edinburg, including victories in the Pan American College Holiday Tournament over Emporia State, Illinois State and Louisiana Tech. It was one of just three times in program history that the Broncs went undefeated at home.

The Broncs averaged 90.4 points per game, the third highest total in program history, and UTPA Athletics Hall of Famers Otto Moore and Fred Taylor led that attack. Moore led the Broncs by averaging 24.6 points and 18.5 rebounds while shooting .510 from the field. Taylor averaged 21.4 points and 8.4 rebounds while shooting .485 from the field.

It was the Broncs' seventh postseason appearance in eight years, capping off the most successful stretch in program history.

# **The Father of the Program**



An inaugural member of the Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007, Sam Williams was also inducted into the Rio Grande Valley Sports Hall of Fame. Known as the "Father of Broncs Basketball," Williams served the University as an educator for more than three decades, and coached the Pan American College and Pan American University Broncs to 11 winning seasons, including four of at least 20 wins, in 15 years (1959-73). He remains the program's all-time winningest coach with 244 victories.

Williams led Pan Am to its first and only national championship, winning the NAIA title in 1963. The very next season, he coached Pan Am right back to the championship game in what was their fourth-straight post-season appearance. Williams earned the NAIA National Coach of the Year award that year.

Williams oversaw the Pan Am's transition into an NCAA Division I program. In their final season before the move, the Broncs won 21 games and reached the 1968 NCAA Division II Southwest Regional, where they won their first round game. Shortly after the transition, Williams became a member of the NCAA Basketball Officials Committee.

Williams was a pioneer in collegiate athletics in the late 1950s, as he was one of the first coaches to integrate his basketball program.

One of the black players Williams recruited and coached was Athletics Hall of Famer Luke Jackson, a two-time All-American who was the MVP of the 1963 NAIA National Tournament and went on to play in the NBA for the Philadelphia 76ers for eight seasons (1964-72) while making the 1964-65 NBA All-Rookie Team and NBA All-Star Teams. He also won an Olympic Gold Medal.

Jackson was one of 10 players to be drafted by an NBA team while Williams was the head coach. Four of those 10 played in NBA regular season games, including Howard Montgomery (San Francisco Warriors, 1962-63), Otto Moore (Detroit Pistons, 1969-71 and 1974-75, Phoenix Suns, 1971-72, Houston Rockets, 1972-73, Kansas City Kings, 1973-74, New Orleans Jazz, 1975-77) and Fred Taylor (Suns, 1970-71 and Cincinnati Royals, 1971-72).

The Broncs rededicated the UTPA Fieldhouse center court in Williams' honor on Nov. 20, 2010. UTPA President Dr. Robert S. Nelsen also surprised Williams by naming him head coach emeritus. Several members of the 1962-63 Broncs then presented Williams with the original NAIA National Championship banner, which had been hanging in the UTPA Fieldhouse since it was built.

Williams is one of only two coaches in school history to earn emeritus status, with the other being baseball head coach emeritus and Athletics Hall of Famer Al Ogletree.

Williams passed away on Oct. 22, 2012 at the age of 88 due to natural causes. As part of the tribute to Williams, a plaque was hung in the UTRGV Fieldhouse to help keep the memory alive.

# 1980-81 NIT Participants

In NBA circles, Kenneth "Apple" Green goes largely unnoticed.

The 6-8, 207-pound second round pick was traded twice before putting on a uniform and only suited up for 10 games when he joined the New York Knicks.

Though his life as a pro was short, there was a time when Green was a revelation.

From 1979 through 1981, he was the cornerstone of some of the most successful teams in Broncs basketball history.

The Broncs went a combined 39-17 and earned a spot in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) during the 1980-81 season, the Broncs' first and only postseason berth at the NCAA Division I level.

During that run, the Broncs scored a major coup in the college basketball world when, over the course of four days, the Broncs knocked off an eventual national champion and several future hall-of-famers during the 1980 Maui Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii.

The tournament was capped by a 66-60 win over the eventual national champion Indiana Hoosiers, led by none other than Hall of Famers Isaiah Thomas and Bobby Knight, arguably one of the biggest wins in program history.

"Pan American was just a better team than we were," Knight told the media after the game. "They stuck it to us at the very beginning."

And when the second winningest coach in NCAA basketball history says your team was better than his, you know you did something right.

Green, later voted the Most Valuable Player of the tournament, led the team with 21 points and nine rebounds, outscoring Thomas by seven points on a night when the Broncs held the future NBA legend in total check.

"I don't think our guys were scared of Indiana," Green told The Monitor. "We see Indiana on TV. But that motivates us to play better. [It] brings out the best in us." And the Broncs were their best throughout the tournament. They opened the tournament against a Marquette University team featuring current Los Angeles Clippers head coach and future hall of famer Doc Rivers. In a nail-biter, the Broncs held on for a 71-70 win that came down to a free throw from the most unlikely of shooters.

With time winding down and the potential for overtime, Marquette looked to intentionally foul and regain possession. Their candidate was Curtis Glasper, a strong player in his own right, but who also sported the team's worst free throw shooting percentage.

With the game in his grasp, Glasper made the free throw.

Against the Hoosiers, the Broncs were able to shut down the usually dominant Thomas by taking away his ability to drive to the net and forcing him to distribute the ball. The Broncs were also able to take advantage of an unusually undisciplined Indiana team. Pan Am made it to the line 27 times compared to the four times Indiana did. And when they got to the line they made it count, finishing the game with a .741 free throw shooting percentage.

Though the Broncs lost to host Hawaii University and had to settle for third place in the tournament, they left knowing that their efforts were not left unrewarded.

"If we beat Hawaii people say, 'so what,'" Green told The Monitor. "But we beat Indiana and Marquette, and people know about them."

Later in the season, the Broncs knocked off Missouri Valley champion Wichita State, a team that had been riding an unbeaten streak.

The Broncs finished the season 19-10 and earned a bid to the 1981 NIT, where they lost to eventual NIT champion Tulsa. Mike Carroll led the NCAA in assists with 275, the fourth highest total in program history.

If there was one negative that could be found among those two seasons it's this: the Broncs missed out on postseason play more than they deserved. During the 1979-80 season, Pan American went an impressive 5-3 against the 80 teams that made the postseason in either the NIT or NCAA Tournament the season before while going 20-8 overall.

Tournament berths or not, the victory over Indiana and the success of those two seasons changed the course of program history and showed that the Broncs can play with anybody. It's a sentiment that the program holds to this day, an identity that is defined by a strong work ethic and a belief that through honest effort, they too can hang with Hall of Famers.

# 2017-18 CBI Participants

When Lew Hill became the head coach of the UTRGV men's basketball team in 2016-17, he said turning the program around would be a step-by-step process.

In 2017-18, UTRGV took a step in the right direction.

UTRGV improved by five wins and earned its first postseason berth in 37 years by reaching the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) during its winningest campaign since 2012-13.

Part of UTRGV's improvement came against in-state rivals, as UTRGV went from being swept to sweeping Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in the South Texas Showdown, presented by Navy Army Community Credit Union. UTRGV also recorded big road wins over Rice and eventual CBI Champion North Texas.

UTRGV won three times as many Western Athletic Conference (WAC) contests, including a sweep of defending WAC Champion CSU Bakersfield, and a win over one of the top contenders in the conference, Grand Canyon.

"I think even in our first year, we played some people tough, but this year we beat Bakersfield twice and we beat Grand Canyon, and now we've got to take another step," Hill said. "It's never going to be complete at the beginning, but we're moving in the right direction."

UTRGV nearly won its first postseason game since 1968 before falling at New Orleans 77-74 in the first round of the CBI. This year, however, the result wasn't the most important thing. Simply making the postseason "meant everything."

"When you come in and do something like this in your second year and you make a postseason tournament, it gives the community, the university, the athletic department and the basketball program some deserved recognition," Hill said. "That's just the beginning. The NCAA Tournament is the ultimate goal we're striving for, but we know there are steps to take."

For the second year in a row, UTRGV was led by the WAC's leading scorer, Nick Dixon, who averaged 20.3 points per game, including 20.9 in WAC play. Dixon finished his career with 1,282 points, tying for 10<sup>th</sup> place in program history.

"You always have to have somebody to jump-start you and he did," Hill said. "Leading the conference in scoring two years in a row and making the All-Conference team twice... he jump-started this program in the right direction now we need to continue to take it up higher."

Dixon was part of a vaunted back court, as freshmen Javon Levi and Greg Bowie immediately took hold of key roles. Levi started 23 games at point guard, averaging 3.8 assists per game and a 2.6 assist-to-turnover ratio. Bowie started 14 times and averaged 7.5 points per game. His .347 shooting percentage from behind the arc ranked third on the team.

UTRGV also received a shot in the arm at midseason as Terry Winn III, became eligible following his transfer from UTEP. He also returned from a knee injury just in time to average 9.8 points and 7.2 rebounds per game in 13 games and starts during WAC play.

"Terry did a great job, but coming off a knee injury, I don't think you saw what a healthy Terry can do," Hill said. "He never got to go through preseason to experience the way we play. He will now. Hopefully he's healthy and ready to go so you can see the real Terry this year."

# 2018-19 CIT Participants

Historic.

That is the perfect word to describe the 2018-19 season for The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) men's basketball team.

UTRGV won a Western Athletic Conference (WAC) Tournament game for the first time, beating CSU Bakersfield 85-70 in the quarterfinal round.

UTRGV went on to make its second-straight postseason appearance for the first time since 1960-66, where the team made six appearances in a row.

UTRGV recorded its first-ever NCAA Division I postseason victory in its first-ever NCAA Division I postseason home game, 74-73 victory over Grambling State, during the opening of the 2019 CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT). UTRGV advanced to the second round of a postseason tournament for the first time in 51 years.


UTRGV recorded 20 wins for the first time in 17 years, tying for the eighth-winningest season in program history. The team ranked third in the NCAA and first in the WAC in free throws made and attempted, fourth in the NCAA and first in the WAC in total steals with 345, and third in the NCAA and first in the WAC in steals per game at 9.3.

Sophomore Javon Levi broke the all-time WAC record for steals (54) and steals per game (3.4) during WAC play. He ranked second in the NCAA and first in the WAC in total steals with a program record 109. Levi was also third in the NCAA and first in the WAC in steals per game (2.95). For his efforts, Levi earned WAC Defensive Player of the Year honors and was a member of the All-Defensive Team. He was also a finalist for the Lefty Driesell award, an award that is presented annually to the top defensive player in men's basketball.

Senior Terry Winn III was an All-WAC Second Team selection after averaging 14.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.4 assists while shooting 46.6 percent (75-for-161) from the field and 72.4 percent (76-for-105) from the foul line. During conference play, Winn ranked eighth in the WAC in scoring and 10th in field goal shooting percentage. He was selected to represent the WAC in the 3x3U National Championship Tournament.

So, what does UTRGV do for an encore?

"Just keep working, recruiting, and working some more," UTRV head coach Lew Hill said. "There's no shortcuts to it. It's just hard work, dedication, recruiting, and developing. The mindset is there. The winning culture has been set. We just have to keep recruiting the right type of kids and keep developing the kids that we have."

# **Peace & Love**



UTRGV Athletics was shocked and saddened when men's basketball head coach Lew Hill passed away on Feb. 7, 2021 at the age of 55. Hill coached the Vaqueros in a 77-75 loss to Texas Southern in Houston the previous night.

Hill was the head coach at UTRGV for five seasons, taking over the program in 2016 and making five-win improvements in each of his first three years, culminating with a 20-win 2018-19 season that saw the Vaqueros win an NCAA DI postseason game for the first time while hosting two rounds of the CIT. For his efforts, Hill was a finalist for CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe Award, presented annually to the top minority coach in Division I men's basketball. In total, the Vaqueros made the postseason twice under Hill, including the 2018 CBI.

Hill's teams never quit, rallying back from seven double-digit deficits in 2018-19 and then, after starting the 2019-20 season 6-14, winning eight of their final 10 to earn the No. 2 seed in

the Western Athletic Conference Tournament, the highest seed in program history.

The Vaqueros picked up right where they left of this season, going 8-4 under Hill. In total, the Vaqueros won 16 of Hill's final 22 games. For his head coaching career, Hill won 67 games, the fifth-best total in program history.

Hill was honored with the 2021 WAC Coach of the Year Award and was a finalist for CollegeInsider.com's Ben Jobe Award and Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, the latter of which is given annually to those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off the floor as well.

Beyond basketball, Hill was passionate about bringing awareness to diabetes, personally leading the charge to host diabetes awareness nights at home basketball games.

He also believed greatly in giving back to the campus and the community. Hill was known for buying large amounts of breakfast tacos and walking to faculty and staff offices around campus to deliver breakfast and thank his fellow UTRGV employees for their hard work and dedication. When UTRGV Athletics started a weekly story time series this past spring, Hill was the first employee to sign up, reading The Dinosaur Who Lived in My Back Yard with his daughter, Elle.

Hill often spoke out on issues of social justice, speaking to multiple media outlets in the wake of George Floyd's murder and again on the subject of the NBA and WNBA canceling games following the shooting of Jacob Blake. Hill was also a key part of round table discussions with The Monitor and Vaquero Radio as well as a healing circle that was open to all of campus.

Originally from Mount Vernon, N.Y., Hill was an All-State performer at Mount Vernon High School. He then went on to be an All-American point guard for San Jacinto Junior College, helping to lead the team to the 1984 NJCAA National Championship. He played his final two seasons at Wichita State, earning All-Missouri Valley Conference honors as a senior for helping to lead the Shockers to 20 wins and a berth in the 1988 NCAA Tournament.

Hill graduated with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice and played one season professionally in Germany before starting his coaching career at Wichita East High School in 1989-90. He moved up to the collegiate ranks as an assistant coach at South Alabama from 1990-92. From there, Hill worked as an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State (1992-94), East Carolina (1994-98) and Texas A&M (1998-03) before getting promoted to associate head coach at Texas A&M for the 2003-04 season. Hill joined former Pan American University head coach Lon Kruger's coaching staff at UNLV as an assistant coach in 2004 and then went with Kruger to Oklahoma in 2011. In Hill's final season at Oklahoma, 2015-16, the Sooners reached the Final Four.

Hill is survived by his wife, Renee, their two children, Lewis Jr. (LJ) and Elle, and three other daughters, Sierra, Erica and Asya.



#### **Dorms**

- Designed in suite style, with two rooms sharing a bathroom.
- · All rooms are furnished for double occupancy.

- The Student Union also contains the PlainsCapital Bank Theater, which brings cultural, musical and theatrical entertainment to UTRGV students and offers them the opportunity to meet and interact with the artists.






















- Weight area includes both free weights and exercise machines, including dumbbells, strength training equipment, cardiovascular machines, and multiple televisions for entertainment.
- Walking/running track, approximately 1/10 mile, with area for stretching. There are also stability balls and mats as well as three racquetball courts.
- Two dance/activity rooms for group exercise and specialty programs.
- The main gymnasium space can be divided into two basketball, two volleyball or multiple badminton courts.
   One indoor soccer court with rounded corners, dasher boards and Plexiglas can also be utilized as a basketball, volleyball or badminton court. Used for open recreation and intramurals.
- Indoor Climbing Facility (35' high) combines integral rock and moveable hand and foot holds. Also features three routes and hosts instructional courses from beginner to advanced. Group facility and private party rentals are

- available. Aquatics facilities feature a lap swimming pool, leisure pool, lazy river, and a jacuzzi. It is a perfect place for a private party or group rental.
- Outdoor Activity Area features two sand volleyball courts, two outdoor basketball courts, two tennis courts, and an outdoor pavilion with tables and chairs. A BBQ grill is available for group rentals.
- Men's and women's locker rooms with over 400 lockers, private shower areas, and vanity areas.
- Member Services Desk assists guests with membership sales, locker rentals, retail sales, and general guest services.
- Energy Zone serves up sandwiches, smoothies, specialty items, salads, fruits, soft drinks, sports drinks and bottled water.
- Lounge/Eating Area with tables and chairs, lounge furniture, couches, televisions, vending machines and great observational area for many activities.



- More than 1.3 million residents call the Rio Grande Valley home.
- Among them are 1990 Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee and former Dallas Cowboys head coach Tom Landry, Chicago Bears center Roberto Garza, St. Louis Cardinals pitcher Jaime Garcia, former Arizona Cardinals offensive guard Rolando Cantu, three-time Olympic Gold Medalist Bobby Morrow, wrestler Tito Santana, former Ms. Olympia Rachel McLish, actor Nick Stahl, who played John Connor in Terminator 3, former U.S. Secretary of the Treasury, Senator and Representative Lloyd Bentsen Jr., Iwo Jima flag raiser Harlon Block, astronaut Mike Fossum, and former Vice Presidential candidate Matt Gonzalez.
- Home to several minor league sports teams, including the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, the three-time NBA Gatorade League Champion affiliate of the Houston Rockets, and the RGV FC Toros, the USL affiliate of the Houston Dynamo. About 35 current and former NBA players have played for the Vipers, including Aaron Brooks, CJ Watson, Steve Novak, Hasheem Thabeet, Ben Uzoh, Patrick Patterson, Terrence Jones, Patrick Beverley, Troy Daniels and Robert Covington.
- The Vipers play at Bert Ogden Arena, which also plays host to a Houston Rockets exhibition game on a semi-regular basis. Recent opponent include the Boston Celtics (2009), Orlando Magic (2010 and 2015), Oklahoma City Thunder (2012) and Golden State Warriors (2014).
- Nearby Payne Arena draws some of the top acts in music, including Train, Rob Thomas, Shakira, Aerosmith, Kiss, ZZ Top, Cher, Nelly, George Straight, Elton John, REO Speedwagon, STYX and Lady Antebellum.




AVERAGE DAYS OF SUNSHINE

- The UTRGV campus is just minutes away from Mexico, where residents and visitors have the opportunity to enjoy the Mexican culture.










- One of the most popular Spring Break locations in the country, attracting thousands of college students every year.

### **UTRGV PRESIDENT**



### DR. GUY BAILEY

Guy Bailey, Ph.D., was named Founding President of The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley in May of 2014.

Prior to being named President of UTRGV, he served as President of the University of Alabama and of Texas Tech University; Chancellor of the University of Missouri Kansas City; Provost and Executive Vice President at The University of Texas San Antonio; Dean of Liberal Arts at the University of Nevada Las Vegas; Chair of the English Department at Oklahoma State University and the University of Memphis; and as a faculty member at Texas A&M and Emory Universities.

During his time at Texas Tech, the university met the criteria established by the Texas State Legislature for participation in the National Research University Fund; enrollment grew by 3,905 students (14%); research expenditures grew by \$89.9 million (170%); and graduation rates increase by five percentage points.

During his tenure at UTSA, the university was named an emerging research university by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; 16 new doctoral programs were added; external funding for research more than doubled; enrollment grew by more than 40%; and graduate enrollment grew by almost 50%.

While Bailey was at UMKC, the university completed a \$200 million capital campaign and built or gained approval for \$175 million in new construction. From 2010 to 2012, Bailey served on the Board of Directors of the NCAA and on the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Big XII athletic conference. He has also served on the Board of Trustees of Midwest Research Institute since 2007.

Bailey continues to do research on language change and variation. His research with his late wife, Jan, has been featured in a front-page article in the New York Times, on National Public Radio, on CNN Headline News, on BBC Radio, in Texas Monthly, and in the San Antonio Express News. Since 1984, Bailey has brought in over \$1 million in external funding for his research.

# CHASSE CONQUE

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) hired Chasse Conque (pronounced Chase Konk) as the Vice President and Director of Athletics on Aug. 2, 2019.

#### #RallyTheValley

During his introductory press

conference, Conque stated his intention to "Rally the Valley" behind UTRGV Athletics. #RallyTheValley has become both a rallying cry and a hashtag for not only athletics, but the university, as its meaning has grown to mean both rallying the Valley behind UTRGV and UTRGV rallying in support of the Rio Grande Valley.

UTRGV Athletics has rallied behind the Valley in a big way during Conque's tenure, ranking eighth in the nation in community service hours in 2021-22 (2,433) after ranking 20th in 2019-20 (1,526). In 2021-22, eight teams ranked among the top in community engagement in their sport, including women's track & field (first), men's track & field (second), women's tennis (second), women's golf (fourth), men's soccer (fourth), women's basketball (fifth), men's golf (fifth), and baseball (seventh). This is the second time UTRGV has had a team rank first among its peers as men's soccer led the way in 2019-20.

#### **Academics**

Academically, UTRGV student-athletes have thrived, currently sporting a 3.29 cumulative grade point average. During Conque's tenure, UTRGV student-athletes have earned 351 Academic All-WAC awards through the winter of 2022 and 1,035 AD Honor Roll awards through the spring of 2022. After initially honoring student-athletes with a semester GPA of at least 3.0, Conque moved to raise the bar for the AD Honor Roll, increasing the threshold to 3.25 for the 2021-22 academic year.

The commitment to academics extends beyond the student-athletes, as Conque is working with colleges on campus to create curriculum-based learning experiences for students. In 2019-20, the athletics marketing team began working with the Robert C. Vackar College of Business & Entrepreneurship, directly entering classrooms on both campuses monthly while working to create internships. UTRGV Athletics is also partnering with the Hospitality and Tourism Management program to give students opportunities for real-world, hands-on experience by assisting with the implementation of UTRGV athletic events. Additionally, UTRGV Athletics employs about two dozen student workers every year.

#### **Competitive Success**

UTRGV athletic program have experienced significant competitive success during Conque's first three seasons. Some of the highlights from 2021-22 include the volleyball team reaching the NIVC for the first time and the baseball team recording its third full season of 30+ wins in a row.

In 2020-21, Desirea Buerge reached the semifinals of the U.S. Track & Field Olympic Trials, the track & field teams combining for eight WAC Championships, the baseball team reached the WAC Tournament Championship Series for first time in program history, and the men's soccer team, under first-year head coach Bryheem Hancock, earned a top 25 ranking in the United Soccer Coaches Poll for the first time in program history.

In 2019-20, the men's soccer team earned its first-ever national ranking, coming in at No. 24 in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll. The volleyball team posted its first-ever victory over a Big 10 opponent, upsetting Maryland. Abraham Chirchir advanced to the NCAA Cross Country Championships for the second-straight year. The women's cross country team pulled off a stunning fourth place finish at the NCAA South Central Regional. The men's basketball team earned the best WAC Tournament seed in program history, coming in at No. 2, by winning eight of its final 10 games. The indoor track & field team won nine WAC Championships. The men's golf team won two team titles and one individual medal. Although spring seasons were cut short by the pandemic, multiple teams were hitting their strides including the baseball team, which opened the season with back-to-back home wins over Kansas State and closed the season on an eight-game winning streak.

#### #RISEup

All the above successes play into the new mission statement that Conque unveiled on Sept. 16, 2021:

UTRGV Athletics will create a first-class student-athlete experience that fosters a culture of RESPECT, growth, and INTEGRITY, and supports our student-athletes in achieving SUCCESS in both the classroom and in competition.

We will be inclusive and #RallyTheValley as we inspire pride, create excitement, and ENGAGE our campus community and our region as the Rio Grande Valley's Division I team.

#### Vagueros United

The impact of UTRGV Athletics goes well beyond traditional metrics, though, as student-athletes took the initiative to launch Vaqueros United in the fall of 2020, a collaboration between UTRGV Athletics, the UTRGV Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, and the campus community to motivate the community in continuing meaningful conversations of peace, equality, social justice, and human rights through the utilization of our public platforms.

While Conque was an active participant in these conversations, one of the early leaders was men's basketball coach, Lew Hill, and everyone was shocked and devastated when learning of his passing on February 7. In perhaps the most difficult role a Director of Athletics can have, Conque and the entire department were there for Hill's family, including his wife and kids, and the team. Conque did everything he could to support everyone who was close to Coach Hill, including spearheading an effort to hold a memorial ceremony at the UTRGV Fieldhouse.

#### **New Hires**

After the season, Conque led a national search for the next head coach of the men's basketball program, hiring 2017-18 Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year Matt Figger, who had been the head coach at Austin Peay for the previous four seasons. During his time at Austin Peay, Figger put together four winning seasons, including three 19+ win campaigns. Figger's team's won 60% of their games, including more than 66% in conference play.

Along with the hiring of Hancock from Radford in the fall of 2020 and women's soccer head coach Mark Foster from Little Rock in the spring of 2022, Conque has successfully attracted three sitting NCAA Division I head coaches to UTRGV for the first time in department history.

#### Community Investment

Despite the pandemic, Conque and his team have achieved unprecedented fundraising success, raising about \$1,000,000 in philanthropic commitments over three years to help improve the student-athlete experience for the department's 16 sports. The increased fundraising has been made possible in-part due to an increase in multi-year commitments, many of which have been made by members of the Champions Club, who make annual donations of \$5,000 or more.

#### **Facility Upgrades**

During Conque's tenure, he has emphasized both the fan and student-athlete experience in facility upgrades. On April 6, 2022, Conque unveiled \$30 million in enhancements for all UTRGV Athletics facilities that will touch all 16 sports over the next three years.

Additionally, prior to the start of the 2022 baseball season, UTRGV was able to renovate all 10 suites and add five corrals, bringing the total to 13 party decks beyond the right field wall. The corrals originally opened in Feb. 2020 as an area in which fans can bring their own food to grill while enjoying games.

Conque was able to move forward with a significant facility upgrade in 2020-21 – renovating the tennis complex – while laying the groundwork for future facility enhancements across all sports programs.

He also helped the basketball teams to play select games in the crown jewel facility of the Valley – Bert Ogden Arena, as well as by the beach on South Padre Island. Looking forward, UTRGV Athletics plans to continue playing at Bert Ogden Arena and on South Padre Island annually.

On Dec. 3, 2020, Conque enjoyed his 100th day in office with a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the completion of \$1.5 million of renovations to the UTRGV Fieldhouse and the launch of Vaquero Village, a new pregame fan experience at UTRGV basketball games. Renovations include new men's and women's basketball, volleyball, visiting team and officials' locker rooms and team rooms, new hallways leading to the locker room areas, a new athletic training room, a new media room, a new equipment room, a redesigned Sam Williams Court, new baskets, new scoreboards, new scorer's and media tables with LED boards, and new entry doors.

Vaquero Village features four sections, one for UTRGV students, one for kids with a custom inflatable and picnic tables, and one each for professionals and corporate partners with lounge furniture and cocktail tables.

Other enhancements during Conque's tenure were at UTRGV Baseball Stadium, including the addition of padding to the outfield walls with new, dynamic signage celebrating the history of the program and corporate partner support, the installation of a new batting cage, and the painting of the stairs to add an orange exclamation.

#### **Attendance**

After a year in which attendance and ticket sales were limited by the pandemic, the 2021-22 athletic year saw UTRGV shatter multiple record for attendance and tickets sold.

The baseball team drew a season attendance of 37,220, an average of 1,551 per date, both of which are the program's best figures in over 30 years and among the best in program history. The total attendance is over 9,000 more than in any other year since 1990 while the average is over 450 more than any in another year since 1990 and about 550 more than in any other full year since 1990.

UTRGV drew three of its four largest crowds since moving into UTRGV Baseball Stadium in 2022, with a program record 6,418 fans for the first home game against Texas since 1971 (4/26/21), as well as the third and fourth highest marks – 2,687 fans for a game against Sam Houston (5/13/22) and 2,418 fans for a game against GW (2/18/22).

The volleyball averaged 723 fans per game, the third-highest season average in program history, drawing a total of 7,225 fans for 10 matches, which ranks fourth in program history. This included the 10th largest single-match crowd, as 1,238 fans watched UTRGV host UTEP (9/23/21).

From a ticket sales standpoint, UTRGV Athletics set department records for basketball season ticket and baseball ticket package sales.

Conque's first year saw strong attendance at home events as well. The baseball team averaged 1,087 fans per game, its highest mark in over a decade and an increase of 20 percent over 2019. Men's basketball saw an attendance increase of 13.5 percent over 2018-19, including a sellout crowd of 2,618 for the "Pack the House" game against New Mexico State. Women's basketball enjoyed a 16.2 percent increase in attendance. The volleyball team welcomed three of the 12 largest crowds while recording the third-best attended season in program history.

#### **Partnerships**

Conque has led UTRGV Athletics into multiple new and exciting partnerships, starting by partnering with UT Health RGV as the official and exclusive healthcare provider for UTRGV Athletics to keep the Vaqueros in the game. UTRGV student-athletes have access to UT Health RGV's sports medicine team physicians and orthopedic surgeons, as well as to specialists in primary care, mental health, women's health, psychiatry and neurology, ear, nose & throat, plastic surgery, and nutrition.

UTRGV Athletics also joined the Under Armour family in May 2020, signing a five-year partnership agreement with BSN SPORTS to make Under Armour the official athletic footwear, apparel and accessory brand of the Vaqueros.

#### **Cameron County Commitment**

Conque has placed an emphasis on bringing UTRGV Athletics to both campuses, spearheading a Brownsville initiative that has seen the soccer and tennis teams play competitions and multiple teams host youth clinics in Brownsville.

Additionally, both UTRGV basketball teams are hosting yearly events on South Padre Island.

#### **Varsity Club**

Conque is passionate about reconnecting with former student-athletes, leading to the launch of the Varsity Club in July 2020. The Varsity Club is the official organization for all letter winners at UTRGV and its legacy institutions. The goal of the Varsity Club is to keep former student-athletes engaged with UTRGV Athletics following their collegiate careers, provide an opportunity for current student-athletes to have mentoring and networking opportunities with former student-athletes, and host letter winners on campus throughout the year.

#### Family

Conque and his wife, Lisa, have three daughters: twins Julianna and Sydney (10) and Adeline (8).


