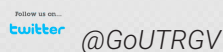

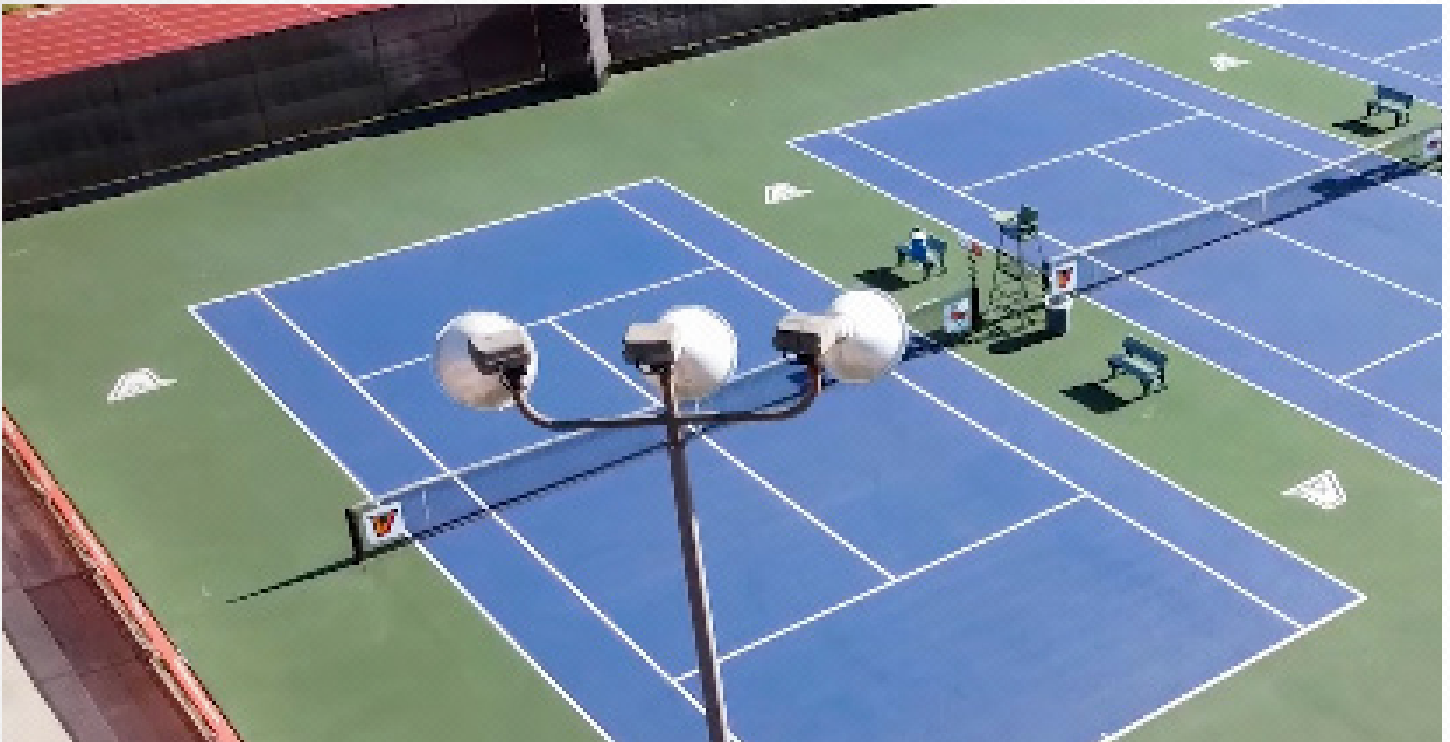

ORVILLE COX TENNIS CENTER



Located on the southeast side of campus, the Orville Cox Tennis Center is the home of the UTRGV men's and women's tennis teams.

The Orville Cox Tennis Center received a \$70,000 renovation in 2020, including the resurfacing of the courts with a new paint scheme and logos, new fence screens, new scoreboards for each court, new net logos, renovated umpire chairs and updated landscaping at front entrance.

Built in 1958, the Orville Cox Tennis Center is named after a McAllen attorney and former President of the Pan American College Board of Regents. A member of the school's athletics Hall of Honor, Cox is known as the father of tennis at the University for his almost single-handed procurement of the construction of the then \$75,000 facility with a cost to Pan American College of only \$3,000.

The Orville Cox Tennis Center has six tennis courts available and a main bleacher capacity of 300.





The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley is planning to expand the footprint of the Orville Cox Tennis Center by building new locker rooms, coaches offices, public restrooms, a sports medicine area and a concession stand. The renovations also include a new entrance.

In 2022, UTRGV Athletics moved into a new 6,000 square-foot area strength & conditioning facility with brand new speed and strength equipment, as well as free weight and aerobic/cardio equipment, new power racks, platforms, benches and dumbbells.

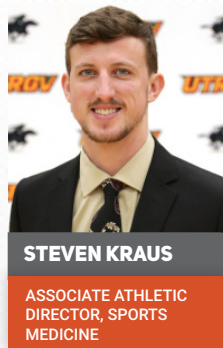

VICTORY CENTER



For today's student-athletes, training and conditioning is a year-round commitment. Balancing the rigors of competing at the collegiate level with the demands of the classroom is one of the greatest challenges our student-athletes face. That is why it is so essential that the department of intercollegiate athletics provides our student-athletes with access to hands-on academic support.

Located in the Academic Services Building, the Victory Center is an integral part of the life of our student-athletes and has a vast amount of services and assistance available.



The Victory Center is structured after the principles of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Program, which is created to provide student-athletes with five basic components: Academic Excellence, Athletic Excellence, Community Service, Career Development and Personal Development.

UTRGV has approximately 275 student-athletes, including approximately 150 freshmen and transfers, who are required to attend study hall and specially designed workshops that assist them in acclimating to college life and living away from home. Student-athletes must dedicate anywhere from six to 10 hours each week to study hall as they work toward their ultimate goal, graduation.

History

UTRGV was created by the Texas Legislature in 2013 as the first major public university of the 21st century in Texas. This transformative initiative provided the opportunity to expand educational opportunities in the Rio Grande Valley, including a new School of Medicine, and made it possible for residents of the region to benefit from the Permanent University Fund – a public endowment contributing support to the University of Texas System and other institutions.

UTRGV has campuses and off-campus research & teaching sites throughout the Valley including Boca Chica Beach, Brownsville (formerly The University of Texas at Brownsville campus), Edinburg (formerly The University of Texas-Pan American campus), Harlingen, McAllen, Port Isabel, Rio Grande City, and South Padre Island. UTRGV, a comprehensive academic institution, enrolled its first class in the fall of 2015, and the School of Medicine welcomed its first class in the summer of 2016.

UT Brownsville and UT Pan American

The shared history of The University of Texas-Pan American and The University of Texas at Brownsville goes back to 1973, when Pan American opened a second campus in Brownsville, which later became an independent institution of The University of Texas System in 1991. Over the years, the missions and the identities of these great institutions have continually evolved to serve the communities of the Rio Grande Valley.

OUR STORY

1927-33

Edinburg College was founded as a two-year community college governed by the Edinburg School District. The original building housed 200 students and today is listed as a historical site in the city of Edinburg, the county seat for Hidalgo County.

1933-48

Edinburg Junior College, as the only institution of higher learning in South Texas, experienced rapid growth in its early years, prompting administrators to pursue the first name change.

1948-52

Edinburg Regional College was moved from the original four-acre site to a 186-acre campus a few blocks west. During the 1950s and 60s, the campus was purchased in parcels at a cost of \$677,000.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

At the UTRGV School of Medicine, students have access to high-quality, innovative medical education programs that are designed to train the next generation of physician leaders in medical education, scientific research, and patient care.

Our mission is to educate a diverse group of dedicated students who will become physicians who serve across all the disciplines of medicine; to bring hope to patients by advancing medical knowledge through research; to integrate education and research to advance the quality and accessibility of patient care in an integrated manner, and to engage with the Rio Grande Valley communities to benefit Texas and the world.

MD Program

The UTRGV School of Medicine is committed to providing a forward-thinking medical education experience that graduates physicians dedicated to practicing scientific, evidence-based, and patient-centered medicine in any setting, but particularly in under-served communities. The curriculum provides a unique educational experience that integrates basic science disciplines, clinical skills, and professional development throughout the four-year program by incorporating and promoting:

- Principles of evidence-based practice & scientific research;
- Community and population-based health care;
- Patient advocacy and cultural awareness;
- Inter-professional collaboration and communication;
- Ethical and professional behavior;
- Life-long learning and problem-solving.

The school's distinctive geographic location at the border of the US and Mexico offers a rich bicultural

experience that will afford students with the opportunity to experience and to learn about border medicine and the interplay between the cross-cultural, socio-economic and environmental determinants of health.

The Four-Year Curriculum

The general four-year curriculum is divided into two pre-clerkship years comprised of sequential and longitudinal learning modules and two clerkship years comprised of clerkships, selective clerkships and sub-internships and electives. Woven throughout this four-year integrated curriculum are:

- Interprofessional Education: Students are given the opportunity to experience interprofessional education and team-based care by working and learning alongside an array of disciplines that include nursing, pharmacy, physician assistants, public health, social work, behavioral health and occupational therapy.
- Early Clinical Exposure: Students are given the opportunity to participate in direct patient interactions during the pre-clerkship years through venues such as the UTRGV Student-Run Free Clinic, Colonia UniMovil clinics, Operation Lone Stars, health fairs, and more.
- Underserved Medicine: Student are given the opportunity to work in under-served communities, Colonias, and at the student-run free clinic, to learn about healthcare disparities and population health.

Graduate Medical Education (GME)

The GME process, which includes residencies and fellowships, is intended to prepare the physician for the independent practice of medicine and to assist in the development of a commitment to the life-long learning process that is critical for maintaining professional growth and competency.

1952-71

Pan American College made its transformation from a junior college to a four-year university in the early 1950s. The name Pan American was selected to reflect the institution's desire to bridge the cultures of North and South America and to reflect the cultural and ethnic diversity of the university.

1989-2015

The University of Texas-Pan American was established in 1989 after the successful and historic merger of Pan American University with the University of Texas System.

In 1991, the Brownsville campus formed a separate institution, the University of Texas at Brownsville.

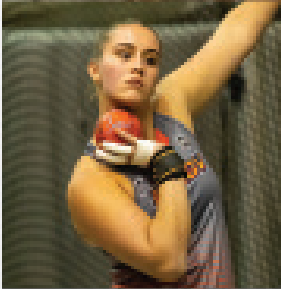
1971-89

Pan American University saw the student population diversify during the 1970s, reflecting a predominantly Mexican-American population. *The Wall Street Journal* credited then President Dr. Miguel Nevarez with creating a Hispanic middle class for the South Texas region. In 1973, PAU began to expand, opening a campus in Brownsville.

Present

The UT System Board of Regents approved a proposal to create UTRGV on Dec. 6, 2012. The bill passed and was signed into law by Governor Rick Perry on June 14, 2013. UTRGV received accreditation on Sept. 1, 2015.

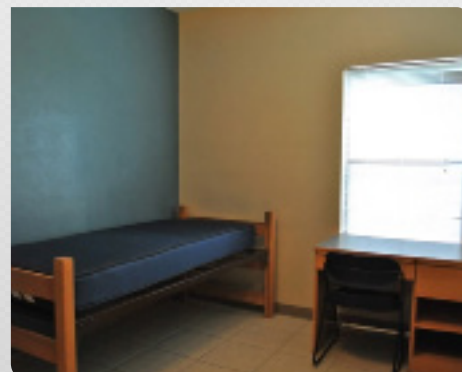
- Designed in suite style, with two rooms sharing a bathroom.

- Serves as the center of the University community life.

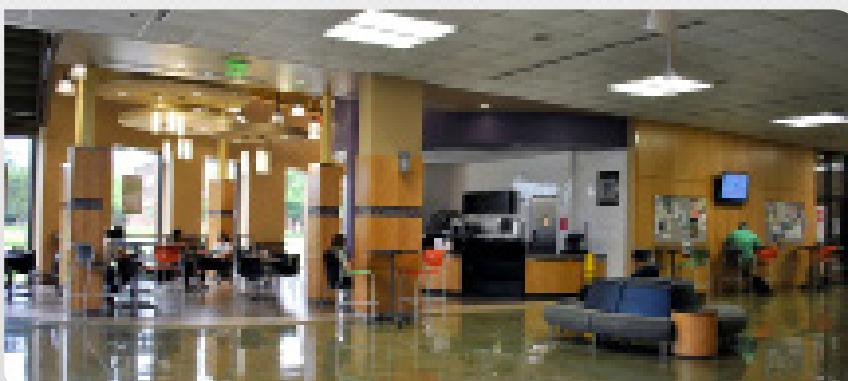
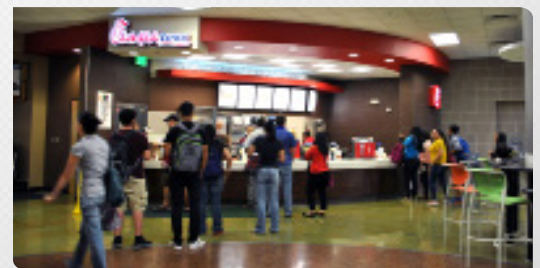

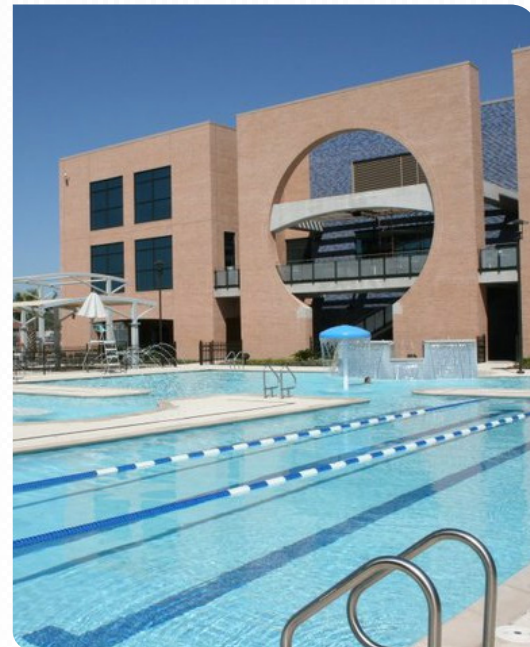
- The Student Union Game Room is located on the second floor of the Student Union. It offers seven pool tables, three air hockey tables and the latest video games.

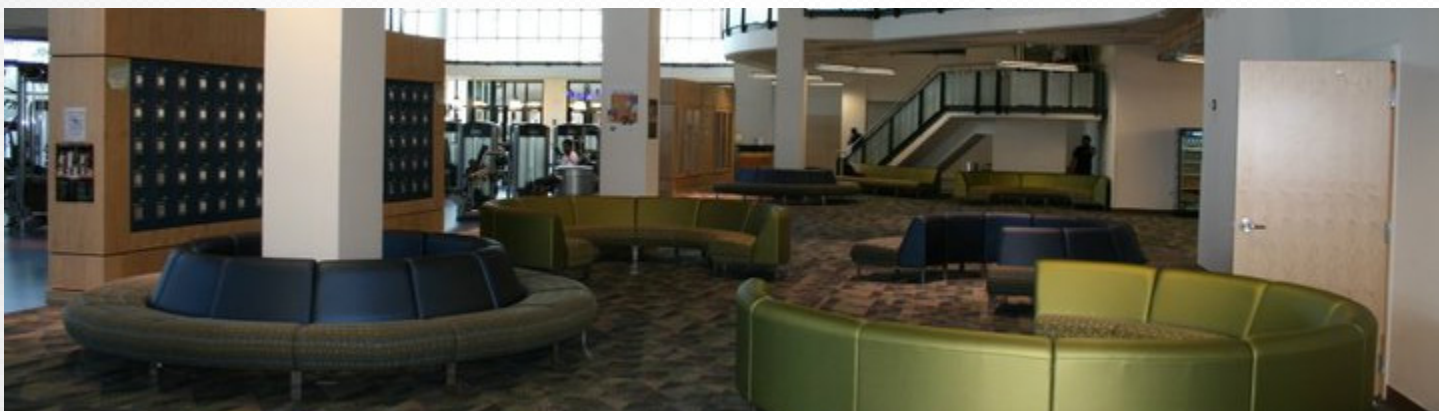

- Weight area includes both free weights and exercise machines, including dumbbells, strength training equipment, cardiovascular machines, and multiple televisions for entertainment.

- Walking/running track, approximately 1/10 mile, with area for stretching. There are also stability balls and mats as well as three racquetball courts.

- Two dance/activity rooms for group exercise and specialty programs.

- The main gymnasium space can be divided into two basketball, two volleyball or multiple badminton courts. One indoor soccer court with rounded corners, dasher boards and Plexiglas can also be utilized as a basketball, volleyball or badminton court. Used for open recreation and intramurals.

- Indoor Climbing Facility (35' high) combines integral rock and moveable hand and foot holds. Also features three routes and hosts instructional courses from beginner to advanced. Group facility and private party rentals are

available. Aquatics facilities feature a lap swimming pool, leisure pool, lazy river, and a jacuzzi. It is a perfect place for a private party or group rental.

- Outdoor Activity Area features two sand volleyball courts, two outdoor basketball courts, two tennis courts, and an outdoor pavilion with tables and chairs. A BBQ grill is available for group rentals.

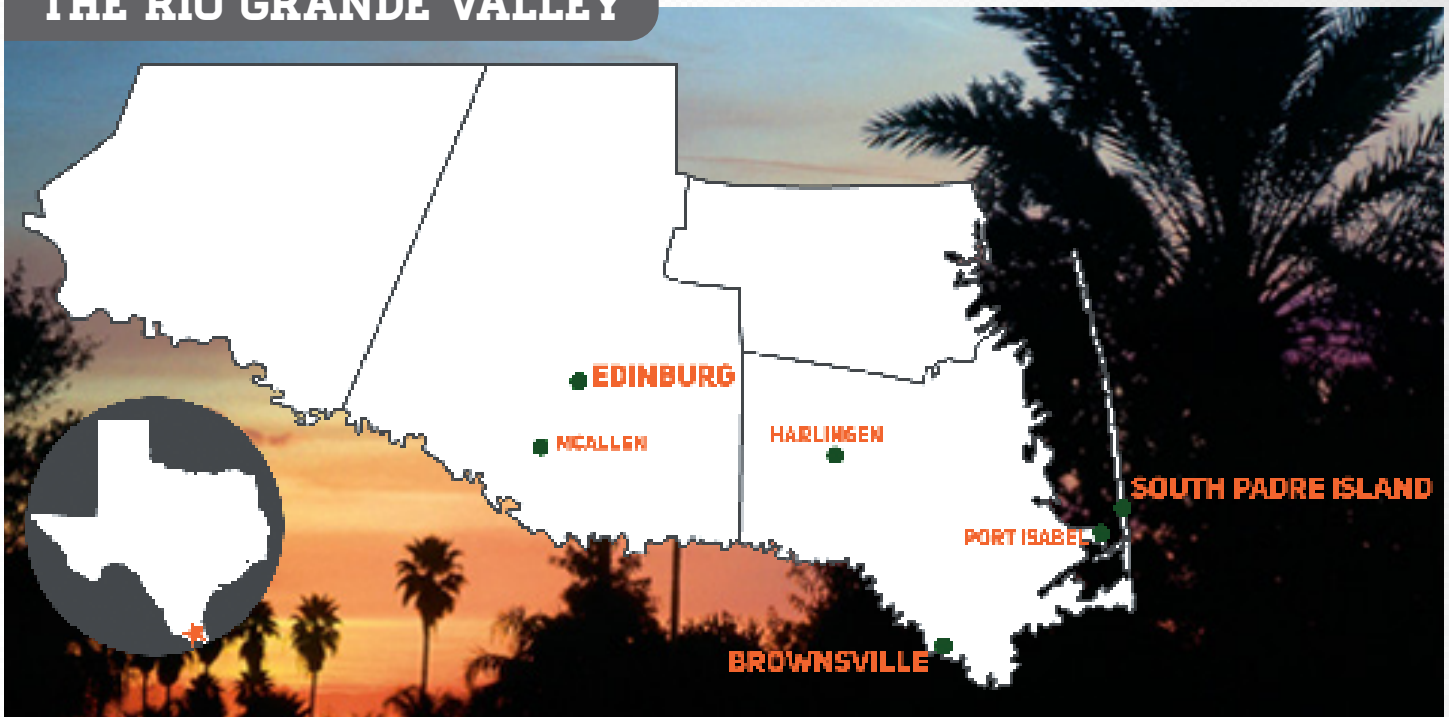
- Men's and women's locker rooms with over 400 lockers, private shower areas, and vanity areas.

- Member Services Desk assists guests with membership sales, locker rentals, retail sales, and general guest services.

- Home to several minor league sports teams, including the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, the two-time NBA Gatorade League Champion affiliate of the Houston Rockets, and the RGV FC Toros, the USL affiliate of the Houston Dynamo. About 35 current and former NBA players have played for the Vipers, including Aaron Brooks, CJ Watson, Steve Novak, Hasheem Thabeet, Ben Uzoh, Patrick Patterson, Terrence Jones, Patrick Beverley, Troy Daniels and Robert Covington.

- The Vipers play at Bert Ogden Arena, which also plays host to a Houston Rockets exhibition game on a semi-regular basis. Recent opponent include the Boston Celtics (2009), Orlando Magic (2010 and 2015), Oklahoma City Thunder (2012) and Golden State Warriors (2014).

- Nearby Payne Arena draws some of the top acts in music, including Train, Rob Thomas, Shakira, Aerosmith, Kiss, ZZ Top, Cher, Nelly, George Strait, Elton John, REO Speedwagon, STYX and Lady Antebellum.

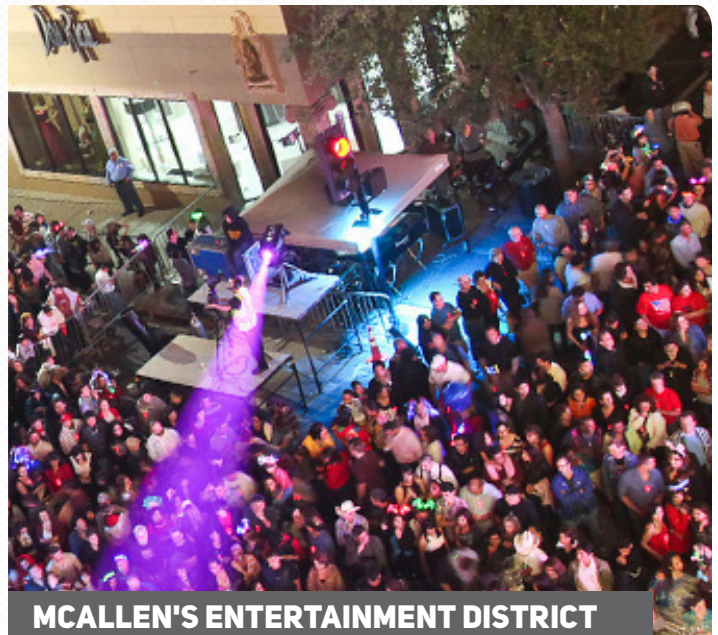

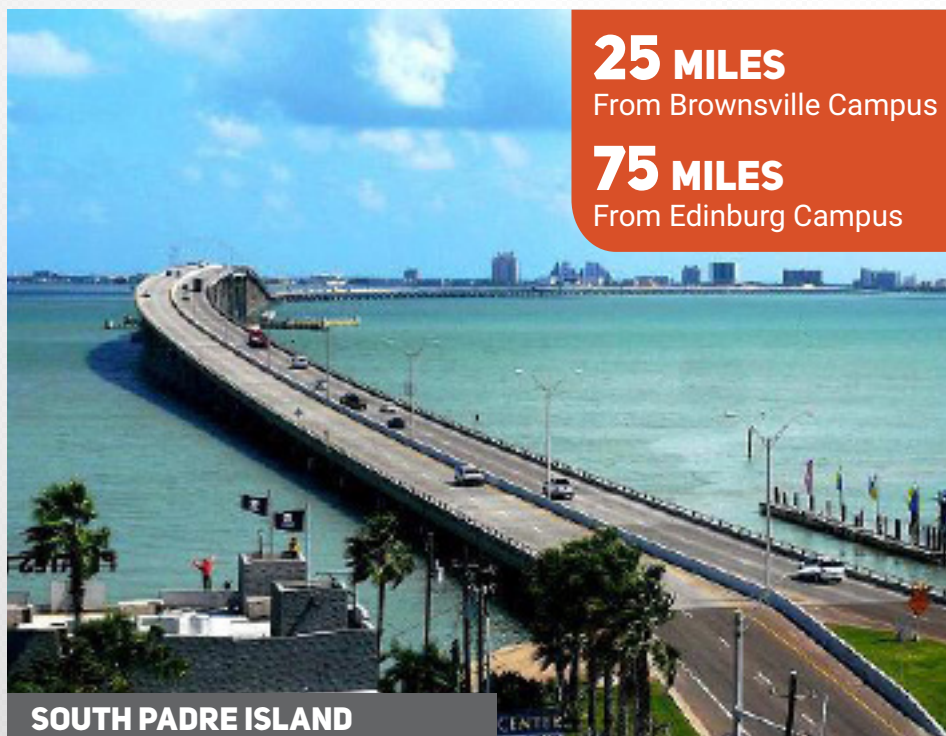

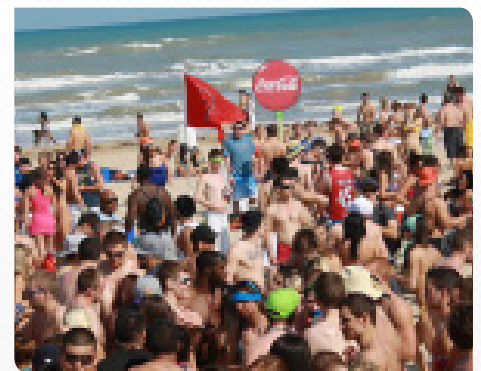
