•This is the first NCAA Division I football game to ever be held in the Rio Grande Valley

Program Starters

•After hiring head coach **Travis Bush** in Dec. 2022, using 2023 to recruit and 2024 to both recruit and practice, UTRGV is set for its first season of competition.

 UTRGV is the only new college football program at the NCAA Division I level this season and one of four overall along with Marine Maritime Academy (NCAA DII), Roanoke College (NCAA DIII), and University of Rio Grande (NAIA).

•The last time a team joined DI was 2022, when Stonehill transitioned from DII to FCS. The last time a brand new program debuted at the DI level was 2015, when Kennesaw State launched from scratch and East Tennessee State returned from a 12-year hiatus. The last new program in the Southland Conference was Houston Christian University, which launched at the DI level from scratch in 2014.

•UTRGV head coach **Travis Bush** was the Offensive Coordinator/QB Coach on the inaugural UTSA team, which launched in 2011. Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach **Jeff Bowen** was a graduate assistant coach on that team. Director of Football Operations & Administration **John Simmons** was a quarterback on that team. Bush and Simmons were present for the practice season in 2010.

•UTRGV Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers Coach **Brian Gamble** helped Incarnate Word start a new program as the Defensive Line Coach, joining the program in 2008 ahead of its inaugural season in 2009.

History of College Football in the Rio Grande Valley

Palm Bowl

•McAllen Memorial Stadium previously played host to the Palm Bowl seven times from 1978 through 1985. The first two games, in 1978 and 1979, were the NAIA National Championship Game. The last five games, held from 1981 through 1985, were the NCAA Division II Championship Game.

Junior Colleges

•The Rio Grande Valley once had two junior college football teams, with the first known meetings between the two occurring in 1928, when Edinburg College defeated The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley, in Edinburg and the Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley beating Edinburg College in Brownsville. The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley was formed and began sponsoring football in 1926.

•Edinburg College was formed as a junior college in Edinburg in 1927 and competed in football under head coach **J.D. Foster** from 1927-30, with known records of 4-2-3 in 1927 and 5-2 in 1928.

•Among the players on the inaugural Edinburg College squad was Lou Hassell, a tackle who served as team captain as a sophomore before earning a scholarship to Rice and earning All-Southwest Conference honors. He later returned to the Valley to serve on the Pan American Board of Regents. A 2014 inductee into the UTRGV Athletics Hall of Honor, Hassell established an endowed scholarship that goes to the male student-athlete with the highest GPA each year. Although Hassell has passed on, the scholarship is still given in his name today.

 Another player on the inaugural Edinburg College squad was John McCauley, a triple-threat fullback who played for the team from 1927-28 and went on to earn All-American honors while leading Rice to the 1934 Southwest Conference Championship.

•In 1930, Edinburg College and The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley met in the Texas Junior College Championship Game at Brownsville High School's Tucker Field. The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley won 63-0 to complete an undefeated season, with their lone non-win coming in a 6-6 tie again Texas A&M's freshmen team.

•After a hiatus due to the Great Depression and World War II, football returned in 1947 at Edinburg Junior College, which had changed its name from Edinburg College in 1933. Bobby Cannon became head coach as Edinburg Junior College competed in the South Texas Junior College Conference against teams that included Brownsville Junior College, which changed its name from The Junior College of the Lower Rio Grande Valley in 1931. The 1947 Edinburg Junior College squad featured 35 players while the 1948 team had a 28-player roster.

 After another name change, the football team continued to compete from 1948-50 as Edinburg Regional College before the board of trustees voted to drop the program on May 9, 1951.

•Jim Brooks was initially hired as the head football coach at Edinburg Regional College, the predecessor to UTRGV legacy institution Pan American College, in 1950, coaching the team's final season before becoming the department chair of health and physical education during the transition to becoming a baccalaureate college. Brooks was then hired as the first athletic director in university history, spending 31 years in that role and as athletic director emeritus (1973-83) at Pan American College and Pan American University.

•Brownsville Junior College put its football team on hiatus in 1933 due to the Great Depression but brought it back for the 1938 and 1939 seasons before again halting the program until 1947 due to World War II. Brownsville Junior College changed its name to Texas Southmost College in 1950 and is known to have fielded a football team in the 1950s. It is unclear when Texas Southmost College dropped football.

2025 Preseason Notes

 UTRGV has one of the highest concentrations of Texas high school football alumni in the nation, with 86 student-athletes (76.11%) who played Texas high school football, including 12 from the Rio Grande Valley.
