TOLEDO - Toledo hosts Ball State on Wednesday, Nov. 16 in the final appearance in the Glass Bowl for 23 seniors. Fittingly, the outcome of the contest is critical to the Rockets' hopes of winning the MAC West title and earning a trip to the MAC Championship Game.

Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC) is one game behind MAC West leader Western Michigan (10-0, 6-0 MAC) with two games left to play for both teams. Assuming WMU wins its game vs. Buffalo on Nov. 19, the Rockets must defeat the Cardinals to stay in the race. Toledo and Western Michigan face each other in Kalamazoo in the regular-season finale on Nov. 25.

The Rockets kept pace in the division thanks to a come-from-behind 31-24 victory vs. Northern Illinois at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago on Nov. 9. Toledo trailed the Huskies, 21-10, in the second half

before rallying for the win. Senior running back Kareem Hunt scored the game-winning touchdown with 1:15 left. Redshirt freshman Aaron Covington clinched the win by intercepting NIU's Ryan Graham's pass at the UT 20-yard line with 33 seconds left. The victory snapped a six-game losing streak to NIU, with many of those previous losses knocking UT out of the hunt for a MAC title.

Ball State (4-6, 1-5 MAC) is coming off a 48-41 home-field loss to Eastern Michigan on Nov. 8. The teams combined for Scheumann Stadium records of 89 points and 1,164 yards. The Cardinals have dropped three straight MAC games. Their sole conference win was a 31-21 victory at Buffalo on Oct. 15. BSU is led by sophomore running back James Gilbert, who leads the MAC with 1,196 yards rushing and 12 TDs.

Rocket Round-Up

- Toledo is one game behind Western Michigan in the MAC West Division, and can earn at least a share of the division title and a trip to the MAC Championship Game by defeating Ball State and WMU on Nov. 25.
- Toledo holds a 21-19-1 edge in the series with Ball State. The Rockets won in Muncie last year, 24-10, and hold a two-game winning streak in the series.
- Logan Woodside was named a "contender" for the Heisman Trophy by the Heisman Trophy Trust. Woodside leads the nation with 37 touchdown passes.
- Senior RB Kareem Hunt compiled 122 yards on 19 carries vs. NIU to surpass the 1,000-yard mark on the season (1,048). He now has 4,518 career yards, second all-time at UT and just 331 yards off the record held by Chester Taylor (4,849 from 1998-2001).
- Senior TE Michael Roberts tallied his 11th and 12th TD passes of the season vs. NIU, which moved him into second place all-time at UT for season TD catches. The school record is held by Lance Moore with 14 in 2014.
- UT is bowl-eligible for the seventh-straight season.
- Junior WR Cody Thompson cracked the 1,000-yard mark in receiving yards in the NIU game. Thompson ranks eighth in receiving yards in a single-season with 1,021. The Toledo record-holder is Lance Moore with 1,194 yards in 2003.

ROCKET UPDATE

- Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC) is coming off a 31-24 win vs. Northern Illinois in Chicago on Nov. 9.

- The Rockets are one game behind Western Michigan (6-0) in the MAC West Division with two games left for both teams.

- Toledo is in control of its own destiny and can earn at least a share of the MAC West crown and a trip to the MAC Championship game with victories over Ball State and Western Michigan in its final two games.

- Toledo is averaging 539.7 yards of total offense and 339.5 in passing, both top marks in the MAC.

- The Rockets are averaging 39.4 points while allowing 22.9. Both figures rank second in the MAC behind Western Michigan.

TOLEDO-BALL STATE SERIES

The Rockets hold a 21-19-1 edge in the series with Ball State, 12-7 all-time in games played in the Glass Bowl.

In last year's 24-10 win in Muncie, Toledo's defense held the Cardinals to just 262 yards of total offense and one touchdown on a long pass play. The Rockets led 24-3 at halftime and held Ball State to just 26 yards rushing on 30 carries.

The offense was powered by a three-headed rushing attack of sophomore Terry Swanson (139 yards) and juniors Damion Jones-Moore (85 yards, 1 TD) and Marc Remy (56 yards). Senior

QB Phillip Ely shook off two first-quarter interceptions to complete 16-of-22 passes for 164 yards and two scores.

ROCKETS RALLY FOR 31-24 VICTORY OVER NORTHERN ILLINOIS

Logan Woodside threw for 286 yards and three touchdowns, and Kareem Hunt scored a late game-winning touchdown to lead Toledo to a 31-24 come-from-behind victory over Northern Illinois at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago on Nov. 9. The Rockets trailed at halftime, 14-3, but outscored the Huskies, 28-10, in the final 30 minutes.

The victory was critical for Toledo, which helped it remain a game behind Western Michigan in the West Division standings of the Mid-American Conference.

Woodside completed 23-of-33 passes on the night. Two of his scoring strikes were to tight end Michael Roberts, who leads the Rockets with 12 TD receptions on the season.

Hunt's game-winning touchdown came with 1:15 left in the contest, finishing off a nine-play, 71-yard drive that broke a 24-24 tie. The big play of the drive was a 39-yard completion from Woodside to sophomore wide receiver Jon'Vea Johnson to the NIU six-yard line.

GAME NOTES FROM THE NIU GAME

- The Rockets snapped their six-game losing streak against the Huskies. The last time Toledo defeated NIU was a 20-19 win in the Glass Bowl on Oct. 17, 2009. With the victory, Toledo extends its series lead to 30-14 all-time against NIU.

- Junior WR Cody Thompson recorded three catches for 34 yards to become the sixth Rocket receiver to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Thompson

WOODSIDE NAMED CONTENDER FOR HEISMAN TROPHY

Logan Woodside has been notified by the Heisman Trophy Trust that he is a "contender" for the 2016 Heisman Trophy and a candidate to be one of the finalists for the prestigious award given annually the best football player in the country.

The Heisman Trust will release the finalists for the 2016 Heisman Memorial Trophy on Monday, Dec. 5 and the winner will be announced in New York City on Saturday, Dec. 10 from the PlayStation Theater in Times Square.

Woodside leads the nation in touch-down passes with 37, shattering the Toledo single-season record of 29 set by Bruce Gradkowski in 2003 and 2005. He has thrown for at least three TD passes in every game this season. He has completed 70.8 percent of his passes for a MAC-leading 3,328 yards and is third the nation in passing efficiency (189.3).

Woodside is also on the official watch lists for the Maxwell Award (national player of the year) and the Manning Award (nation's top quarterback).

MICHAEL ROBERTS MOVES INTO SECOND PLACE ON SEASON TD LIST

Senior tight end Michael Roberts' two TD receptions at Northern Illinois give him 12 for the season, a record for Toledo tight ends and the second-most for any Rocket receiver. It also is the most of any tight end in the country this season (the next closest is seven), and tied for sixth in the country for any receiver.

Roberts broke the record for tight ends that had stood for 43 years. The previous high mark was nine by Don Seymour, set in 1973. His 12 TD catches is two shy of the school record of 14 set by Lance Moore in 2004.

Through 10 games, Roberts has 38 receptions for 448 yards, which ranks tied for seventh all-time at UT. He is on the official watch list for the John Mackey Award, named in honor of NFL Hall of Famer John Mackey, and given to the nation's best tight end.

yard mark. It was his 25th collegiate game with 100 rushing yards, the second-most in school history. Chester Taylor (1998-2001) owns the school-record with 27 such performances.

Hunt scored the game-winner with 1:15 left from one yard out vs. NIU. He also caught a career-best six passes for 37 yards.

Hunt has 4,518 career yards, second all-time at UT and just 331 yards off the record held by Chester Taylor (4,849 from 1998-2001). Hunt also ranks sixth in the MAC in career rushing yards.

Hunt rushed for 1,631 yards as a sophomore in 2014, earning first-team All-MAC honors. He gained 973 yards in an injury-shortened junior season, and was named second-team All-MAC.

Hunt has 41 rushing touchdowns for his career, second place on UT's career list.

Hunt has been named to the official watch lists for the 2016 Maxwell Award (College Player of the Year) and Doak Walker Award (nation's top running back).

LOGANWOODSIDE NATIONAL LEADER IN TD PASSES

Through 10 games this season, Logan Woodside has put up some impressive numbers.

The junior quarterback has completed 70.8 percent of his passes for 3,328 yards and 37 TDs. He is the national leader in TD passes, and is second nationally in passing efficiency (189.26). He is just the third Rocket QB ever to crack the 3,000-yard passing mark in a season. His total of 3,328 ranks fourth all-time at UT.

Woodside's 37 touchdown passes is the most ever by a Rocket quarterback, eight more than the previous record of 29 set by Bruce Gradkowski in 2003 and 2005. Woodside's total also ranks fifth in MAC history, tied with Chad Pennington (Marshall-1999) and Ben Roethlisberger (Miami-2003).

Woodside started 10 games as a sophomore in 2014, leading Toledo to a 9-4 record. He completed 62.5% of his passes for 2263 yards and 19 touchdowns. He sat out last season as a redshirt behind senior Phillip Ely.

ROCKETS HAVE BEEN EFFECTIVE ON THIRD DOWN

Toledo is third in the nation in successful third-down attempts, converting 78-of-146 (53.4%). Conversely, Rocket opponents have made just 37-of-137 third-down tries (27.0%), the third-best mark for defenses in the country.

THREE AND OUT!

Toledo's defense has been very effective in getting their opponents off the field. The Rockets have had 44 "Three-and-outs" this season in 127 opponent possessions (34.6%).

CODY THOMPSON CRACKS 1,000-YARD RECEIVING MARK

Junior wide receiver Cody Thompson recorded three catches for 34 yards vs. Northern Illinois on Nov. 9 to become the sixth Rocket receiver to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Thompson ranks 10th in receiving yards in a single season with 1,021. He needs 174 yards to surpass Lance Moore (1,194 yards in 2003) as UT's single-season leader.

Thompson is on the official watch list for the Biletnikoff Award, which honors the nation's top receiver.

THOMPSON AND JOHNSON ARE TOLEDO'S BIG-PLAY RECEIVERS

Junior wide receiver Cody Thompson and sophomore Jon'Vea Johnson have been potent deep threats this season. Johnson is averaging 20.6 yards per catch, while Thompson averaged 20.4 yards per grab, ranking sixth and seventh in country, respec-

tively.

Thompson has caught 50 passes for 1,021 yards and nine TDs this year. He has 10 receptions of at least 36. Johnson has 34 receptions for 700 yards and nine TDs.

PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK

Toledo's offensive line has allowed 10 sacks this season, which is tied for the eighth-fewest allowed in the nation.

Going back to last season, UT has not allowed a sack in 14 of its last 22 games. Toledo opened the 2015 season with seven consecutive games without a sack. The Rockets eventually relinquished five sacks in 2015, which was the second-fewest in the nation.

PROTECTING THE BALL

Toledo's running backs pride themselves on taking care of the football, and senior Kareem Hunt definitely sets the standard. In 723 carries in his four-year career, Hunt has fumbled only once, on Nov. 12, 2013 in the fourth quarter vs. Buffalo. Hunt recovered his own fumble, so he has never lost a fumble in his college career.

Since that fumble in his freshman season, Hunt has had 625 rushing attempts and 47 receptions without putting the ball on the ground, a streak of 672 chances without a fumble.

The NCAA record for rushing attempts without a fumble is 862 by Travis Prentice of Miami (OH) from 1997-99.

FUMBLE STREAK

Since a lost fumble by Terry Swanson in the first half of the Arkansas State game on Sept. 2, Toledo's running backs have not lost any fumbles, giving them a streak of nine consecutive games without a lost fumble and 28 out the last 29 games overall going

back to the 2014 season.

Before the Arkansas State game, the last time Toledo lost a fumble by one of its running backs was Oct. 4, 2014 in the fourth quarter of a 20-19 overtime win over Western Michigan when Swanson fumbled in a driving rain storm.

THE NAME IS JOHNSON, JON'VEA JOHNSON

Sophomore wide receiver Jon'Vea Johnson had his coming out party in Toledo's 55-53 loss at BYU. Johnson set career marks in receptions (9), receiving yards (182) and TD receptions (3).

In his 16 games as a Rocket previous to the BYU game, Johnson had 13 receptions for 237 yards and two scores.

Junior quarterback Logan Woodside and junior linebacker Ja'Wuan Woodley were each honored by the Mid-American Conference for their performances in Toledo's 31-26 loss to Ohio on Oct. 27. Woodside was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Offensive Player of the Week, while Woodley earned MAC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

Woodside completed 32-of-46 passes for 438 yards and three touchdowns vs. Ohio, including a school-record 98-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Jon'Vea Johnson in the third quarter. Woodside's completions and attempts were a career high, while his passing yardage was his second most as a Rocket.

Woodley had nine tackles and a career-tying best 3.0 tackles for loss vs. the Bobcats. He also recorded one sack and one forced fumble.

WOODSIDE, THOMPSON TEAM UP TO BEAT CMU, 31-17

Cody Thompson caught four touchdown passes and the Rocket defense contained a dangerous Chippewa offense to help Toledo to a 31-17 victory over Central Michigan at the Glass Bowl on Oct. 22.

Thompson caught TD passes of 16, 16, 11 and 34 yards—all in the second half—from quarterback Logan Woodside to account for all of the Rockets' 28 second-half points. Woodside completed 23-of-32 passes for 264 yards, four touchdowns and

no interceptions.

Thompson ended up with seven receptions and 122 receiving yards. Senior Kareem Hunt led the rushing attack with 87 yards.

Toledo's defense did a good job containing CMU senior quarterback Cooper Rush, who entered the game ranked second in Chippewa history with 85 TD passes. Rush was 18-of-31 for 229 yards, one TD and one interception. Two other Rocket interceptions were called back due to roughing-the-passer penalties.

THOMPSON NAMED MAC WEST DIVISION OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOLLOWING CMU GAME

Junior wide receiver Cody Thompson was named Mid-American Conference West Division Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Toledo's 31-17 victory over Central Michigan on Oct. 22.

Thompson tied his career high with seven catches for a game-high 122 yards and a career best four touchdowns vs. the Chippewas. His four touchdowns rank as the second most in school history in a single game behind Eric Page, who holds the school record with five touchdown receptions vs. Northern Illinois on Nov. 1, 2011.

ROCKETS CLAIM BATTLE OF I-75 TROPHY FOR SEVENTH CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Kareem Hunt scored on a three-yard run with 18 seconds left to give Toledo a thrilling 42-35 victory over arch-rival Bowling Green before a capacity Homecoming crowd of 30,147 at the Glass Bowl on Oct. 15.

The victory gave Toledo the Battle of I-75 Trophy for the seventh consecutive season.

Logan Woodside led the Rocket offense with 322 yards passing and four touchdown passes, three of them

to senior tight end Michael Roberts, who set his career high for TD receptions. Roberts had six catches for 94 yards, while junior Cody Thompson had six grabs for 74 yards and senior Corey Jones added five receptions for 90 yards and one score.

BIG CROWD

Attendance for the Bowling Green game was 30,147, the 11th-largest crowd in Glass Bowl history. It was also the largest home crowd since 31,981 fans saw the Rockets defeat the Falcons, 49-41, on Nov. 23, 2004.

Ellis booted a career-long 69-yard punt in the first quarter vs. the Falcons. For the game, he averaged 46.5 yards per kick on six punts and landed two inside the Bowling Green 20-yard line.

ROCKETS SHOOT DOWN EAGLES, 35-30

Logan Woodside threw for 247 yards and four touchdowns to lead Toledo to a 35-20 victory over a stubborn Eastern Michigan squad in Ypsilanti on Oct. 8.

The final outcome was not settled until Woodside connected with Corey Jones in the corner of the end zone from 12 yards out with 2:37 to play. A DeJuan Rogers' interception on the ensuing drive eliminated any hopes of an Eagle comeback.

ROCKETS FALL IN SHOOTOUT AT BYU, 55-53

Logan Woodside threw for a school record 505 yards and five touchdowns but it wasn't enough as Toledo fell to BYU, 55-53, in Provo on Sept. 30.

The Cougars won the game on the final play of the game, a 19-yard field by Rhett Almond. Toledo had taken the lead with 1:11 to play on a seven-yard TD by Kareem Hunt and a two-point conversion from Woodside to tight end Michael Roberts.

Woodside connected on 30-of-38 passes. Sophomore Jon'Vea Johnson had a career night, setting personal bests in receptions (9) and TD receptions (3). Hunt rushed for a season-high 146 yards.

ROCKETS ROLL OVER FRESNO STATE, 52-17

Logan Woodside threw for 239 yards and four touchdowns while Ka-

reem Hunt rushed for 123 yards and one score to lead Toledo to a 52-17 victory over Fresno State at the Glass Bowl on Sept. 19.

Toledo held the Bulldogs to just 254 yards of total offense and 0-of-13 on third-down conversions. UT did not yield a first down until the 10-minute mark of the second quarter. Fresno State quarterback Chason Virgil completed just 12-of-23 passes, while Bulldog running backs averaged just 1.9 yards per carry.

WOODSIDE EARNS TWO MAC AWARDS FOLLOWING BYU GAME

Junior quarterback Logan Woodside was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Toledo's 55-53 loss at BYU on Sept. 30.

Woodside also was named the MAC Male Scholar-Athlete of the Week. He is a marketing major with a 3.419 grade point average, and expects to graduate this December.

Woodside completed a career-best 30-of-38 passes for a school-record 505 yards and a collegiate-tying best five touchdowns against the Cougars.

Woodside's total of 505 yards passing tied for the seventh-most yards in a game in MAC history. Woodside has 16 TD passes for the season and has thrown at least four TD passes in each of the last three games. Woodside's five TD tosses are tied for third most in school history in a single game.

ROCKETS SHOOT DOWN BLACK BEARS, 45-3

Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 329 yards and four touchdowns to lead Toledo to a 45-3 victory over Maine at the Glass Bowl on Sept. 10.

The Black Bears held their own early on but could never sustain an

offensive attack against a smothering Rocket defense. UT held Maine to 235 yards of total offense, scored a touchdown in the third quarter on a blocked punt and blocked a field in the final period.

ROCKETS TAME RED WOLVES, 31-10

Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for a career-high 371 yards and three touchdowns and the Rocket defense dominated the Red Wolves' offense as Toledo routed Arkansas State, 31-10, on Sept. 2.

Toledo dominated both sides of the ball, outgaining Arkansas State, 556-266, in total offense. At halftime, the Rockets had 293 yards of offense to just 80 for the Red Wolves. UT took a 21-3 lead into the locker room.

Toledo's defense held Arkansas State to just 266 yards of total offense and 13 first downs. ASU had just 80 yards at halftime.

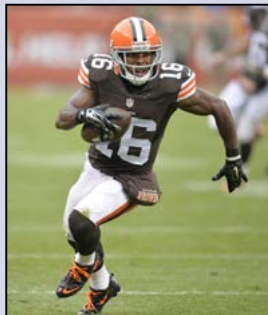

He may only be in his first season as head coach, but Jason Candle has played a major part of the success of Toledo Football since 2009. After seven seasons as an assistant with the Rockets, Candle assumed the head coaching role last December. He has since embarked on a quest to take an already outstanding program to even greater heights.

Candle was named Toledo's head football coach on Dec. 2, 2015, giving him exactly 20 days to put together a coaching staff and prepare his team for the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl.

Twenty days later, Candle and his team celebrated a 32-17 victory over No. 24 Temple in the rain of south Florida. The triumph capped a 10-2 season for the Rockets and gave Candle a head coaching debut to remember.

Candle, 36, was serving as associate head coach/offensive coordinator when UT Athletic Director Mike O'Brien chose him to replace Matt Campbell, who resigned his post after four seasons as the Rockets' leader to become the head coach at Iowa State University. Candle thus became the 27th head football coach in the 95-

year storied history of Toledo football.

"We are very pleased that Jason Candle has agreed to become the head football coach at the University of Toledo," O'Brien said at the time. "Jason has done a terrific job in his seven years with the Rockets, first as our receivers coach, then as our offensive coordinator. During that time, our offenses have been among the best in the Mid-American Conference, and in some cases, the entire country.

"I have also been very impressed with Jason as an individual and as a leader of young men. After careful consideration, I came to the conclusion that he is the best person to lead this program going forward. Our football program is in capable hands. We are very excited for the future of Rocket Football under Jason's guidance."

"I'm very excited to have the opportunity to be the head football coach at the University of Toledo," Candle said. "A lot of great coaches have walked through these doors. A lot of players and coaches have built the outstanding tradition of success at Toledo, so I'm very honored and humbled to lead this program."

First Months on the Job

Candle's first two months on the job were a whirlwind of activity. First, he had to prepare his team for a battle with a very strong Temple team in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Despite being short-staffed, the Rockets were ready for the No. 24 Owls, holding them to just three points and 67 yards of offense in the first half. Toledo dominated the fourth quarter, too, outscoring Temple, 20-8, in the final 15 minutes, coming away with a 32-17 victory.

Next on Candle's agenda was completing his coaching staff and signing the next generation of Rockets. Candle added eight assistants to the staff, as well as a strength and conditioning coach, a director of high school relations and a director of football operations. The newcomers—along with current assistant Derek Sage—helped Candle put the finishing touches on a recruiting class that was ranked second in the Mid-American Conference by ESPN.com.

Guiding the Rocket Offense

Under Candle's guidance as offensive coordinator, the Toledo offense was prolific, and 2015 was no exception. The Rockets were 10-2 and ranked third in the Mid-American Conference in scoring offense (35.0) and total offense (460.9 yards per game). Four Rockets earned All-MAC honors on offense, including first-team honoree Storm Norton (OL). Junior running back Kareem Hunt came back from injuries to lead the MAC in rushing with 108.1 yards per game. Toledo led the MAC in rushing, averaging nearly 208 yards per contest, and ranked No. 2 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed (five).

In 2014, UT led the MAC in just about every major offensive category, including scoring offense (36.6), total offense (490.5) and rushing offense (256.4). The 2014 season culminated with a nine-touchdown outburst in a

63-44 victory over Arkansas State in the GoDaddy Bowl for the 9-4 Rockets.

Six Rockets earned All-MAC recognition on offense in 2014, with senior center Greg Mancz snagging second-team All-America honors and the Vern Smith Leadership Award, given annually to the top player in the MAC. Sophomore running back Kareem Hunt ranked 10th in the nation in rushing (1,631 yards) and second in yards per carry (7.96). Candle also skillfully guided the Rocket quarterbacks through a

challenging season in which the top three signal-callers were all injured at the same time.

In 2013, the Rockets averaged 33.0 points and 447.3 yards of total offense per game. Toledo's running game was especially effective, ranking second in the Mid-American Conference with 240.6 yards per contest. In addition, seven players on the offensive side of the ball earned All-MAC honors, including two-time first-team running back David Fluellen.

In his debut as offensive coordinator in 2012, Candle helped guide the third-ranked offense in the MAC, as UT averaged 445.2 yards per game. The Rockets had five offensive players make the All-MAC team, propelling them to a 9-4 mark and a trip to the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.



Six of Candle's 13 seasons as an assistant football coach were as a coordinator. He was just 27 years old when he was named offensive coordinator at Mount Union.

Making his Mark as Receivers Coach

As the receivers coach from 2009-11, Candle mentored one of the most decorated receivers in Rocket history, Eric Page. Page caught 306 passes in his career, the most ever by a Division I-BCS receiver in three seasons. A three-time All-MAC player, Page broke virtually every UT receiving record and tied the MAC record for career receptions.

In 2011, the Rockets went 9-4 and won their first bowl game in six years, a 42-41 victory over Air Force in the Military Bowl. Sophomore wide receiver Bernard Reedy caught three touchdown passes

and was named the game's MVP. Page caught a school-record 125 passes for the season and earned first-team All-MAC honors.

In 2010, the Rockets went 8-5 and made their first bowl appearance in five seasons. Page caught 99 passes and was a first-team All-MAC honoree at wide receiver, earning All-America honors as a kickoff returner, as well. In 2009, Candle coached the slot receivers and tight ends. He helped guide Page to an outstanding freshman season. Page led the nation in receptions (82) and yardage (1,159) by a freshman and was named first-team Freshman All-America by *Phil Steele Magazine* and the *College Football News*.

Candle has earned some national accolades of his own. In 2010, he was named one of the top recruiters in the nation by *Rivals.com*. He was one of only nine coaches in the country from non-automatic BCS qualifying conferences to be named to the list and the only coach from the MAC. Candle also was named the Mid-American Conference "Recruiter of the Year" by *Scout.com* in both 2011 and 2012. Toledo's 2011 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the MAC by both Scout and Rivals. In 2014, Candle was named one of only two MAC assistants to be named among the top recruiters in the "Group of Five" conferences by Rivals.

Coaching Origins at Mount Union

Candle joined the Rockets' staff in 2009 after spending both his playing and coaching career under head coach Larry Kehres at Mount Union. In Candle's six years as an assistant at Mount Union, the Purple Raiders went 83-4 and won NCAA Division III national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2008. The 2003 and 2007 teams lost in the national championship game.

A 2003 Mount Union graduate, Candle was an All-Ohio Athletic Conference first-team selection in 2001 as he led the team in receptions (41), yards receiving (778) and touchdowns (9). He was a key member of the 2000 and 2001 national championship teams and finished his career with 57 grabs for 1,037 yards and 11 scores.

Candle, a native of Salem, OH, began his coaching career at Mount Union in 2003 as the receivers coach. In the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he worked

with Campbell, who was the Purple Raiders' offensive coordinator at the time. Candle took over the post of offensive coordinator in 2007, and also assumed the duties as the program's recruiting coordinator.

In Candle's two seasons as offensive coordinator, the Purple Raiders went 29-1, winning the national championship in 2008 and finishing as runners-up in 2007. Mount Union offensive players earned nine All-American honors in Candle's two seasons running the offense. QB Greg Micheli was honored in 2008 with the Gagliardi Trophy, given annually to the best NCAA Division III player in the nation. Candle also helped guide two Purple Raider receivers to All-American status during his time as the receivers coach from 2003-08. One of those All-American receivers, Pierre Garcon, is a starting wide receiver for the Washington Redskins. The other was Cecil Shorts, a fourth-round draft pick of the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2011.

Candle and his wife Nicole were married in June of 2014.



Candle's record at Toledo in seven years in the program is 56-30. In 13 years of coaching at the college level, Candle has been a part of 12 teams with winning records.

GAME 1 - TOLEDO 31, ARKANSAS STATE 10

Jonesboro, AR - Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for a career-high 371 yards and three touchdowns and the Rocket defense dominated the Red Wolves' offense as Toledo routed Arkansas State, 31-10, in the season opener for both schools at Centennial Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, AR on Sept. 2.

The victory, Toledo's third over ASU in the last three seasons, was the first regular-season win for head coach Jason Candle. Candle also coached the Rockets to victory in the final game of last season, a 32-17 triumph over Temple in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl.

Toledo dominated both sides of the ball, outgaining Arkansas State, 556-266, in total offense. At halftime, the Rockets had 293 yards of offense to just 80 for the Red Wolves. UT took a 21-3 lead into the locker room.

Woodside sat out last season as a redshirt but hardly missed a beat. His passes threaded the needle and he made smart decisions when receivers were covered. Junior Cody Thompson led the Rocket receivers with five receptions for a career-high 174 yards and a touchdown.

All three of Toledo's running backs contributed, with senior Damion Jones-Moore leading the way with 81 yards on 11 carries. Senior Kareem Hunt added 78 yards and a score, while junior Terry Swanson chipped in with 30.

Toledo's defense, which returned only three starters from last season, kept Arkansas State off balance all night. The Rockets held the Red Wolves to just 142 yards rushing on 38 carries. Sophomore defensive end Olasunkanmi Adeniyi led the way with eight tackles, three tackles for loss and one sack.

Toledo started out a little slow before finding its bearings. UT missed a chance to score first when Jameson Vest's 40-yard attempt went wide right midway through the first quarter. Moments later, Arkansas State took advantage of a Rocket turnover and converted it into a 43-yard field goal by J.D. Houston to take a 3-0 lead with 1:17 left in the opening period.

The Rockets struck back with three touchdowns in three consecutive possessions. The first score was a 75-yard drive that took 12 plays. Hunt got the drive going with 19-yard run in which he bowled over a pair of Red Wolves before going down at the ASU 47-yard line. Six plays later, Woodside found tight end Michael Roberts wide open for a five-yard score.

Toledo made it 14-3 on its next drive, going 51 yards in 11 plays. Hunt capped it off with a dive from one-yard out. Moments later, Woodside hit Cody Thompson in the end zone for a 16-yarder that put UT up, 21-3.

It was more of the same in the second half as the Rockets scored on their first two possessions to put the game on ice. Vest began the half with a 42-yard field goal. Roberts caught his second TD pass of the night, a 22-yard strike from Woodside that made the score 31-3. That play was set up by a 44-yard pass-and-catch over the middle by Thompson, who broke two tackles before being forced out of bounds at the ASU 21-yard line.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

The Rockets won their season opener for a third straight season. UT's last loss in an opener was at No. 10 Florida by a 24-6 margin in 2013 ... Toledo leads the all-time series vs. Arkansas State by a 5-0 margin. The Rockets have defeated the Red Wolves in each of the last three years ... The Rockets have won nine straight road games dating back to the 2014 season ... Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for a career-high 371 yards by completing 23-of-31 passes for three touchdowns. Woodside's previous best was 337 yards against Central Michigan on Sept. 27, 2014 ... Senior running back Kareem Hunt moved past Trinity Dawson (3,474 yds. - 2002-05) into 3rd place on UT's career rushing list. He now has 3,548 yards in his Rocket career and trails only Chester Taylor (4,849 yds. - 1998-2001) and Wasean Tait (4,338 yds. - 1993-98) ... Hunt also registered his 35th career rushing touchdown to move into a tie for third place with Joe Schwartz (1970-72). Chester Taylor ranks first with 56 with Wasean Tait placing second with 38 scores ... Junior wide receiver Cody Thompson registered a career-best 174 receiving yards by hauling in five catches with one touchdown.

GAME 2 - TOLEDO 45, MAINE 3

Toledo, OH - Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 329 yards and four touchdowns to lead Toledo to a 45-3 victory over Maine at the Glass Bowl Saturday night.

The Black Bears, a Division I-FCS school, held their own early on but could never sustain an offensive attack against a smothering Rocket defense. UT held Maine to 235 yards of total offense, scored a touchdown in the third quarter on a blocked punt and blocked a field in the final period.

Woodside did much of his damage in the first half, connecting on long touchdown passes to Corey Jones (85 yards) and Cody Thompson (64) to propel Toledo to a 17-3 halftime lead. Jones led the Rockets with three catches for 100 yards. Senior Kareem Hunt led the rushing attack with 66 yards on 15 carries.

For the second straight week, Toledo's defense dominated the game. The Rockets, who beat Arkansas State 31-10 in their opener, have surrendered just 13 points in their first two wins. Junior linebacker Ja'Wuan Woodley led the way with eight tackles, two tackles for loss and a forced fumble, while senior defensive end John Stepec added six tackles and two TFL. Maine was limited to just 9-of-25 passing for 65 yards.

Maine actually got on the board first, taking the opening kickoff 68 yards in 15 plays to set up a 29-yard field goal by Patrick Leonard. Toledo struck back quickly when Woodside hit Corey Jones over the middle and the senior sped down the field for an 85-yard score, giving the Rockets a 7-3 lead they held through the first quarter.

The Black Bears missed an opportunity for points early in the second quarter when they recovered a fumbled Toledo punt on the UT 35-yard line. But Toledo stopped Maine on downs on a fourth-and-6 play from the 31 yard-line. The Rockets then countered with a 14-play, 55-yard drive that culminated in a 31-yard field goal by Jameson Vest.

After Maine was forced to punt on its next possession, the Rockets struck quickly, scoring on the first play of the next drive. Woodside hit Cody Thompson on a crossing pattern that the junior turned into a 64-yard touchdown, giving Toledo a comfortable 17-3 lead with 3:29 left in the half.

Toledo blew the game open with three touchdowns in the third quarter. UT extended the lead to 24-3 on its second drive of the period when senior tight end Michael Roberts hauled in a 21-yard TD pass from Woodside to finish off a 13-play, 84-yard drive. A little more than a minute later, Thompson blocked a Black Bear punt that was picked up by freshman Ronnie Jones and returned for a 27-yard touchdown to make the score 31-3 with 4:21 left in the third quarter. Following a three-and-out by Maine, Woodside struck again, connecting with sophomore Jon'Vea Johnson for an 89-yard bomb to make it 38-3.

Toledo's defense continued its stinginess when Tuzar Skipper blocked a 35-yard field goal midway through the final quarter, giving UT a second-half shutout.

ROCKET ROUNDUP: Toledo begins the season 2-0 for only the second time in the last 11 years. UT began with a 7-0 run last year...With the victory over Maine, the Rockets improve to 22-2 all-time vs. schools from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) since Division I institutions were split into two divisions in 1978...After spotting Maine a 3-0 lead, Toledo reeled off 45 consecutive points to tally the decisive 42-point home victory...UT has now scored at least 30 points in five-consecutive games, dating back to last season...The Rockets finished with a commanding 516-235 edge in total offense. UT posted 187 yards rushing and 329 yards passing...Toledo held a commanding 281-yard advantage in total offense despite running seven fewer plays (67-60) than Maine... The Rockets averaged a whopping 8.6 yards per play, while the Black Bears were limited to 3.5...UT had three scoring plays that covered at least 64 yards and two that went for at least 85...Toledo limited Maine QB Dan Collins to 9-of-25 passing for a mere 65 yards...Cody Thompson was credited with a blocked punt in the third quarter, which resulted in a 27-yard return for a score by freshman S Ronnie Jones.

GAME 3 - TOLEDO 52, FRESNO STATE 17

Toledo, OH - Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 239 yards and four touchdowns while senior running back Kareem Hunt rushed for 123 yards and one score to lead Toledo to a 52-17 victory over Fresno State at the Glass Bowl on Sept. 19.

Toledo held the Bulldogs to just 254 of total offense and 0-of-13 on third-down conversions. UT did not yield a first down until the 10-minute mark of the second quarter. Fresno State quarterback Chason Virgil completed just 12-of-23 passes, while Bulldog running backs averaged just 1.9 yards per carry. Senior defensive tackle Treyvon Hester led the way with two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss, while senior defensive end John Stepec had two TFLs and two QB hurries.

Woodside completed 15-of-26 passes, with two scoring throws to senior tight end Michael Roberts and one each to junior Cody Thompson and sophomore Jon'Vea Johnson. His four TD passes give him 11 in three contests this season. Thompson (game-high 102 yards receiving) and senior Corey Jones each had a game-high four receptions, while Roberts had three. Hunt cracked the 100-yard mark for the first time this season and the 21st time in his four-year career. Redshirt freshman Art Thompkins also gained 103 yards on 15 carries, his first 100-yard effort.

The Rockets took advantage of good field position to open up a 24-0 halftime lead, with drives of 64, 60, 55 and 50 yards. Toledo opened the scoring on their second possession on a 36-yard touchdown pass from Woodside to Thompson. Woodside went right back to work on UT's next possession, connecting with Roberts for a nine-yard score to make it 14-0 with 5:36 to play in the quarter.

The Rockets third score came on the ground, a seven-yard rushing TD by Hunt that capped a seven-play, 55-yard drive early in the second quarter.

Woodside opened the second half with an 18-yard scoring strike to Johnson to extend the lead to 31-0. On their next possession, the Rockets used a 47-yard completion from Woodside to Thompson to set up a six-yard scoring toss to Roberts.

Fresno State broke into the scoring column with 2:02 left in the third quarter on a nine-yard completion from Virgil to KeeSean Johnson. FSU tacked on a 42-yard field goal by Kody Kroening on the second play of the fourth quarter to trim the lead to 38-10.

Thompkins scored his first collegiate touchdown on a one-yard plunge to make it 45-10. FSU cut the lead to 45-17 on an 85-yard bomb from Virgil to Jamire Jordan. Toledo closed out the scoring on a 62-yard TD pass from junior Michael Julian to senior Zach Yousey with 4:03 left.

GAME 4 - BYU 55, TOLEDO 53

PROVO, UT – Junior Logan Woodside threw for a school record 505 yards and five touchdowns but it wasn't enough as Toledo fell to BYU, 55-53, in Provo Friday night.

The Cougars won the game on the final play of the game, a 19-yard field by Rhett Almond. Toledo had taken the lead with 1:11 to play on a seven-yard TD by Kareem Hunt and a two-point conversion from Woodside to tight end Michael Roberts.

BYU scored on the very first play from scrimmage, a 75-yard bomb from Taysom Hill to Jonah Trinnaman. Toledo answered with a 75-yard drive that took seven plays. Hunt had 27 rushing yard on three carries on the drive while Swanson hit pay dirt from eight yards out to make the score 7-7.

The two teams exchanged punts before the Cougars struck again, this time on a seven-play, 72-yard drive capped by a one-yard run by Jamaal Williams to give BYU a 14-7 edge. On Toledo's next possession, a deflection off a Woodside pass resulted in a BYU interception that was returned to the UT 13-yard line. Two plays later Williams scored again to make it 21-7 with 47 seconds left in the first quarter.

But the Rockets responded on the next play from scrimmage when Woodside hit Jon'Vea Johnson with a 79-yard TD strike to shave the lead to seven points, 21-14 at the end of the first quarter.

Toledo's defense stepped up in the second quarter, forcing back-to-back three-and-outs. The Rockets' offense took advantage as Woodside hit Corey Jones in stride for a 26-yard TD to tie the score 21-21. Toledo had a chance to extend the lead late in the half but Jameson Vest's 40-yard field goal attempt was blocked.

The back-and-forth nature of the contest continued in the second half. The Rockets took the opening kickoff in the second half and methodically marched down the field, going 83 yards in nine plays to take a 28-21 lead. Woodside scrambled to hit left and hit Johnson for a 12-yard score, his second TD catch of the night.

Toledo's lead was short-lived, however, as Williams scored two plays later on a 45-yard touchdown run. But the Rockets answered with a 28-yard field goal by Vest to regain the lead, 31-28. BYU then countered with a 62-yard TD run by Williams down the left sideline to make the score 35-31 in favor of the Cougars. Moments later Woodside hit Johnson for his third TD catch of the night to give Toledo a 38-35 with less than a minute left in the third quarter.

BYU opened up the fourth quarter with a 17-yard touchdown run by Squally Canada to put the Cougars up 42-38. But once again, Woodside came up big, hitting Thompson for a 78-yard heave to give UT a 45-42 margin with 10:57 left.

Williams scored his fifth TD of the game with 3:00 left, a 14-yarder to make the score 52-45. Hunt countered with a seven-yard score with 1:11 left.

BYU used up all the clock on its final possession, moving 71 yards in eight plays before Almond finished it off with the game-winning field goal.

ROCKET ROUNDUP: Toledo posted with a season-high 692 yards of total offense, the third-highest single-game total in school history, and a season-best 53 points ... The Rockets have now scored at least 31 points in each of the first four games this season ... The Rockets had their nine-game road winning streak snapped. GAME 5 - TOLEDO 35, EMU 20

Ypsilanti, MI – Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 247 yards and four touchdowns to lead Toledo to a 35-20 victory over a stubborn Eastern Michigan squad in Ypsilanti on Saturday.

The final outcome was not settled until Woodside connected with Corey Jones in the corner of the end zone from 12 yards out with 2:37 to play. A DeJuan Rogers' interception on the ensuing drive eliminated any hopes of an Eagle comeback.

Woodside, who leads the NCAA in passing efficiency, completed 25-of-31 passes. Junior Cody Thompson led the way with a career-high seven receptions for 126 yards and one TD. Senior Corey Jones also had seven catches and a score. Senior Kareem Hunt paced the running game with 141 yards and one TD.

Toledo's defense held EMU to 317 yards and forced two turnovers. The Eagles were just 2-of-10 on third-down conversions while Toledo was 11-of-17.

Neither team could break into the scoring column in the first quarter. Toledo had a good chance on its first drive, moving 60 yards in 14 plays, but was stopped on downs at the EMU 15-yard line when Woodside's pass to Corey Jones came up one yard short of the sticks.

The Rockets finally broke through with 8:24 left in the second quarter when Woodside hit Jon'Vea Johnson for a 17-yard scoring strike to cap off a five-play, 46-yard drive. Eastern countered with a 34-yard field goal from Paul Fricano with eight seconds left in the first half.

EMU cut the lead to one point, 7-6, on a 44-yard field goal by Fricano on the Eagles' opening drive of the second half. Toledo came right back with a big play, a 63-yard touchdown bomb from Woodside to Cody Thompson. On the ensuing kickoff, EMU fumbled and UT's Marcus Whitfield recovered on the Eagle 16-yard line. Three plays later, Hunt plowed in from two yards to make the score 21-6 with 8:24 left in the third quarter.

The Eagles did not quit, however, putting together a seven-play, 72-yard drive to cut the lead to 21-13. Breck Turner scored on a three-yard run to cap the scoring drive.

The teams exchanged punts over the next four possessions until UT truck again. Woodside hit tight end Michael Roberts in the corner of the end zone from 15 yards out to make the score 28-13 with 10:52 to play. Two minutes later, EMU quarterback Brogan Roback found Antoine Porter on a five-yard pass to cut the lead back to eight, 28-20.

Toledo put the game away with a 14-play, 83-yard drive that ate up over six minutes off the clock before Woodside hit Jones for the final score of the game.

ROCKET ROUNDUP: With today's 35-20 victory, Toledo won its MAC opener for the ninth consecutive year. The last time the Rockets lost their league lid-lifter was 2007...UT totaled 35 points and 467 yards of total offense. UT also held a decisive 30-16 edge in first downs and a 37:12-22:48 advantage in time of possession. The Rockets have now scored at least 31 points in each of the first five games this season...Toledo was an efficient 11-of-17 (64.7 percent) on third-down conversions, while EMU converted only 2-of-10 (20 percent)...Toledo extended its winning streak against the Eagles to 10 straight games. The Rockets lead the all-time series by a 33-11 margin, including a 16-1 win-loss mark since 1999...The Rockets forced their first two turnovers of the season. UT recovered a fumble on a kickoff in the third quarter before senior FS DeJuan Rogers sealed the victory with an interception late in the fourth quarter...Junior QB Logan Woodside completed 25-of-31 passes for 247 yards and four touchdowns. Woodside has now thrown at least three TD passes in every game this year. He also has 20 TD passes on the season, a total that ranks seventh most in school history in a single season...Senior RB Kareem Hunt topped the century mark for the third straight game with a season-high 29 carries for 141 yards, including a two-yard TD run in the third quarter. GAME 6 - TOLEDO 42, BGSU 35

Toledo, OH –Senior running back Kareem Hunt scored on a three-yard run with 18 seconds left to give Toledo a thrilling 42-35 victory over arch-rival Bowling Green before a capacity Homecoming crowd of 30,147 at the Glass Bowl on Saturday.

Junior quarterback Logan Woodside led the Rocket offense with 322 yards passing and four touchdown passes, three of them to senior tight end Michael Roberts, who set his career high for TD receptions. Roberts had six catches for 94 yards and senior Corey Jones added five receptions for 90 yards and one score.

Junior Terry Swanson led the ground attack with a season-high 112 yards on 12 carries, including a 63-yard TD run in the fourth quarter that put Toledo up, 35-21. Hunt had 99 yards on 25 attempts.

Bowling Green (1-6, 0-3 MAC) answered Swanson's touchdown with a pair of fourth-quarter TDs that tied the score, 35-35, setting the stage for Toledo's game-winning drive in the final three minutes.

The Rockets took the lead on another Roberts' touchdown, this time a 22-yard catch in the end zone from Woodside with just 36 seconds left in the half. The Falcons were able to attempt a Hail Mary pass at the end of the half but Morgan's 42-yard attempt was knocked down by Trevon Mathis. BGSU opened the second half by stopping UT on a three-and-out, then putting together a seven-play, 69-yard drive to tie the score, 14-14. Morgan connected with Miller from 15 yards out for the score.

The Rockets rallied back on the arm of Woodside who threw touchdown passes to Roberts and Corey Jones in the third quarter. Jones' TD was a 64-yarder down the middle of the field that made the score 27-14 with two seconds left in the third quarter.

But the Falcons struck back almost immediately, as Miller hit Morgan for his third TD catch two plays into the fourth quarter, a 57-yarder that pulled BG to within six, 27-21.

Moments later, Swanson came up with a big run, bolting 63 yards into the end zone. Woodside hit Roberts for the two-point conversion to put Toledo up 35-21 with 10:25 left.

Bowling Green would not quit, however. Morgan threw his fourth and fifth TD passes of the game to Marquis Zimmerman and Teo Redding, the latter with 3:07 remaining to tie the score at 35-35.

The final drive of the day belonged to Toledo, as Woodside marched the Rockets 66 yards in seven plays for the decisive score. Hunt sealed the win with his three-yard run.

ROCKET ROUNDUP: Toledo earned its seventh-straight victory over arch-rival Bowling Green. With the win, the Rockets earned the right to keep the "Battle of I-75" Trophy. UT won the trophy in 2011, the first year it was established, and has never had to relinquish it since...The game was the 87th-annual Homecoming Game at UT...Toledo improved to 18-1 against MAC East Division opponents since 2010. The Rockets' last loss to a cross-division foe came against Akron, 31-29, on Nov. 29, 2013...Attendance was announced at 30,147, the 11th-largest crowd in Glass Bowl history. It was also the largest home crowd since 31,981 fans saw the Rockets defeat the Falcons, 49-41, on Nov. 23, 2004...Junior QB Logan Woodside completed 23-of-30 passes for 322 yards and four touchdowns. Woodside completed passes to seven different receivers...Senior TE Michael Roberts set career highs in catches (6), yards receiving (94) and touchdowns (3). Roberts has now scored a TD in five of six games this season. The Cleveland, OH native was credited with a career-long 41-yard TD reception in the first quarter, a 22-yard TD catch in the second and a five-yard scoring reception in the third.

GAME 7 - TOLEDO 31, CMU 17

Toledo, OH –Junior wide receiver Cody Thompson caught four touchdown passes and the Rocket defense contained a dangerous Chippewa offense to help Toledo to a 31-17 victory over Central Michigan at the Glass Bowl Saturday afternoon.

Thompson caught TD passes of 16, 16, 11 and 34 yards—all in the second half—from junior quarterback Logan Woodside to account for all of the Rockets' 28 second-half points. Woodside completed 23-of-32 passes for 264 yards, four touchdowns and no interceptions.

Thompson ended up with seven receptions and 122 receiving yards. Senior Kareem Hunt led the rushing attack with 87 yards.

Toledo's defense did a good job containing CMU senior quarterback Cooper Rush, who entered the game ranked second in Chippewa history with 85 TD passes. Rush was 18-of-31 for 229 yards, one TD and one interception. Two other Rocket interceptions were called back due to roughing-the-passer penalties.

The first half was a battle of defenses and field position, with Toledo taking a 3-0 lead into the locker room. Toledo scored on its opening drive, a 34-yard field goal from Jameson Vest. Toledo jumped out of the gate to start the second half, scoring on its first x possessions. The Rockets started the half with a seven-play, 62-yard drive that ended when Woodside hit Thompson for a 16-yard TD. Woodside and Thompson hooked up again, again from 16 yards out to make the score 17-0 with 9:35 to play in the quarter.

Central Michigan answered with its first score of the game with a quick five-play drive that was capped off by a 20-yard run by quarterback Cooper Rush to cut the lead to 17-7. A few moments later, a 36-yard field goal by Chippewa kicker Brian Eavey made it 17-10.

Woodside found Thompson in the end zone for the third time, this time an 11-yarder to up the Toledo lead to 24-10 with 11:36 to play.

Toledo added onto the score when Thompson caught his fourth TD of the game, a 34-yarder with 7:30 remaining.

Central Michigan scored its final touchdown with 4:11 left when Rush hit Tyler Conklin from four yards out.

GAME 8 - OHIO 31, TOLEDO 26

Toledo, OH –Junior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 438 yards and three touchdowns but was not able to rally the Rockets in the waning seconds as Toledo fell to Ohio, 31-26, at the Glass Bowl Thursday night.

Trailing 31-20 late in the fourth quarter, the Rockets scored on a Woodside pass to sophomore Jon'Vea Johnson with just over three minutes left to cut the lead to five points. However, a last-gasp drive with less than a minute left in the game came up short.

Woodside connected on 32-of-46 passes and broke the UT record for touchdown passes in a season with 31. Johnson had six receptions for 156 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Corey Jones added seven catches for 115 yards and one TD.

The game started out slowly as both teams failed to score in the first quarter, though Ohio had two great opportunities that went for naught. Papi White returned a punt 19 yards to the UT 27-yard line, but Ohio was pushed back six yards in three plays and forced to punt. On their next drive, the Bobcats moved down to the UT 17-yard line but a 31-yard loss on a bad snap pushed them out of scoring range.

Ohio finally broke through with the first score of the game on a 57-yard TD bomb off a scramble from Quinton Maxwell to Kyle Belack with 9:17 left in the first half. Toledo countered with a 29-yard field goal by Jameson Vest to cut the lead to 7-3. But the Bobcats came right back when backup quarterback Sebastian Smith hit Greg Windham in the end zone for a 33-yard score to make the score 14-3 with 1:55 left in the half. Toledo used up the remaining time in the first half, moving the ball 38 yards in nine plays to set up a career-long 47-yard field goal by Vest to cut the lead to 14-6 at halftime.

Toledo scored its first touchdown of the contest came in the third quarter on a 98-yard bomb from Woodside to Johnson to trim the lead to 14-13. The pass was the longest play from scrimmage in UT history.

Ohio came back with a big play of its own, a 25-yard TD connection from Maxwell to White to extend the lead to 21-13. But the Rockets landed another big punch moments later, a 24-yard TD from Woodside to Jones.

Ohio closed out a high-scoring third quarter with a 39-yard field goal by Louie Zervos to move the Bobcats' lead to 24-20. The Bobcats added another touchdown on a 51-yard run by Dorian Brown to make the score, 31-20, with 8:08 remaining. Brown finished with 212 yards rushing.

Toledo cut the lead to five, 31-26, on a 10-yard pass from Woodside to Johnson.

Toledo then forced Ohio to punt and received the ball on its own 25-yard line with 55 seconds left. Woodside moved UT to the Ohio 44-yard line but with time running out he completed a pass to Kareem Hunt that was stopped for a five-yard loss. Toledo tried to get off another play but was whistled for snapping the ball too soon and the game was over.

ROCKET ROUNDUP: Toledo falls to 18-2 against MAC East Division opponents since 2010...UT's setback snapped a 12-game winning streak in the series against Ohio. The Bobcats' last win in the series was a 24-14 home triumph on Oct. 1, 1988. Ohio's most recent triumph in the Glass City was 20-14 on Sept. 16, 1967...Toledo sustained its first loss at home versus a MAC East Division school since a 27-13 setback against Miami on Oct. 26, 2002...Junior QB Logan Woodside completed 32-of-46 passes for 438 yards and three touchdowns, including a program-best 98-yard TD pass to sophomore WR Jon'Vea Johnson in the third quarter...Woodside's completions and attempts were a career high, while his passing yardage is second most as a Rocket....Woodside set UT single-season record 31 TD passes, surpassing the all-time mark of 29 set by Bruce Gradkowski in 2003 and 2005...Sophomore WR Jon'Vea Johnson caught six passes for 156 yards, including a program-best 98-yard TD catch in the third quarter.

GAME 9 - TOLEDO 48, AKRON 17

Akron, OH – Senior Kareem Hunt rushed for 136 yards and junior Logan Woodside threw for 327 yards and three touchdowns to lead Toledo to a 48-17 victory over the Zips in Akron on Wednesday night.

Hunt's touchdown early in the second half gave Toledo a 27-10 lead that was never seriously threatened. With his 136-yard effort, Hunt now has 4,396 career rushing yards, moving past Wasean Tait (4,338 yards from 1993-98) into second place on UT's all-time list.

Junior Terry Swanson added 67 yards and one rushing TD, as well as a 10-yard TD reception. Junior Cody Thompson led the receivers with 5 catches for 70 yards.

Toledo outgained the Zips in total offense, 622 to 444. Junior Ja'Wuan Woodley led the defense with three tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

The Rockets moved to 7-2, 4-1 in the MAC, while Akron fell to 5-5, 3-3 in league play.

Akron got on the board on its first play from scrimmage, a 91-yard TD pass down the middle of the field from Thomas Woodson to Jerome Lane. Toledo countered with a nine-play, 73-yard drive that resulted in a 21-yard field goal by Jameson Vest. On Akron's next drive, Tom O'Leary matched Vest's kick with a 21-yarder of his own to make the score 10-3 with 4:13 to play in the first quarter.

Toledo tied the score on the first play of the second quarter on a nine-yard run by Terry Swanson, then took the lead, 13-10, later in the period on a 23-yard field goal by Vest.

The Rockets scored on the final play of the half on an 18-yard TD pass from Woodside to tight end Michael Roberts, giving them a 20-10 lead at the break. The drive covered 51 yards in just 46 seconds, and was keyed by a 20-yard run by Hunt.

Hunt kept the offense rolling in the third quarter, rushing five times for 33 yards in a six-play drive he capped off with a two-yard score to make it 27-10 with 9:56 left in the quarter. Akron cut the lead to 27-17 with an eight-play, 75-yard drive that was culminated by a 27-yard TD strike from Woodson to JoJo Natson.

Toledo marched right back with a 12-play, 71-yard drive that was finished off by Terry Swanson's 10-yard TD catch from Woodside to push the lead out to 34-17. Woodside struck one more time with a 44-yard TD strike to Zach Yousey to make the score 41-17 with 11:53 left in the contest.

Redshirt freshman Art Thompkins capped the Rockets' scoring with a 10-yard TD run to extend their lead, 48-17, with 4:47 left in the game.

GAME 10 - TOLEDO 31, NIU 24

Chicago, IL – Logan Woodside threw for 286 yards and three touchdowns, and Kareem Hunt scored a late game-winning touchdown to lead Toledo to a 31-24 come-from-behind victory over Northern Illinois (3-7, 3-3 MAC) at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago Wednesday night. The Rockets trailed at halftime, 14-3, but outscored the Huskies, 28-10, in the final 30 minutes.

The victory was critical for Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC), which helped it remain a game behind Western Michigan in the West Division standings of the Mid-American Conference.

Woodside, who leads the nation with 37 TD passes, completed 23-of-33 passes on the night. Two of his scoring strikes were to tight end Michael Roberts, who leads the Rockets with 11 TD receptions on the season.

Hunt's game-winning touchdown came with 1:15 left in the contest, finishing off a nine-play, 71-yard drive that broke a 24-24 tie. The big play of the drive was a 39-yard completion from Woodside to sophomore wide receiver Jon'Vea Johnson to the NIU six-yard line.

NIU drew first blood in the contest, scoring on a one-yard TD pass from Ryan Graham to Shane Wimann late in the waning moments of the first quarter. The drive was kept alive when Toledo was whistled for off-sides on a made 33-yard field attempt.

Toledo countered on its next possession with a 10-play, 48-yard drive that ended with a 44-yard field goal by Jameson Vest, trimming the lead to 7-3 early in the second quarter. But the Huskies came right back with another long drive, this time culminating in a four-yard TD pass from Graham to Kenny Golladay to give NIU its 14-3 halftime edge.

The Rockets came out firing in the second half, forcing NIU to punt after a three-and-out, then moving swiftly to score their first touchdown of the contest. Woodside connected with Roberts for a 27-yard touchdown, the sixth play in a 52-yard drive that cut the lead to 14-10.

Northern Illinois had an immediate answer, however, marching down the field on its next possession to push the score to 21-10. But Woodside came right back moments later, hitting Jon'Vea Johnson for a 37-yard score to cut the lead to 21-17 with 3:23 left in the third quarter.

NIU held onto its four-point lead until Woodside hit Roberts again, this time from five yards out, to give the Rockets their first lead, 24-21, with 12:32 remaining in the game. The Huskies eventually evened the score with 4:31 left on the clock with a 22-yard field goal by Christian Hagen.

Toledo countered with their game-winning drive that ended with Hunt's TD.

Chester Taylor (1998-2001) owns the school-record with 27 such performances...Sophomore offensive lineman Yazeed Atariwa checked in as a defensive lineman on Toledo's first defensive possession and played numerous snaps on the defensive side of the ball. He tallied two tackles in the game...Senior WR Corey Jones hauled in four passes for 38 yards and has now recorded a reception in 35-consecutive contests.
