For the past 16 years, no one has embodied the success of Toledo Football more than Head Coach Jason Candle.

Now entering his 10th season as Toledo's head coach, Candle has won two Mid-American Conference Championship titles and three MAC West Division crowns, while making seven bowl appearances. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2017 and 2023.

Candle has won 73 games as Toledo's head coach, tied with Gary Pinkel (1991-2000) for the most victories in school history. No team in the Mid-American Conference has won more games than Toledo during Candle's tenure. Toledo has not had a losing season in Candle's nine seasons as head coach.

In 2024, Candle's Rockets went 8-5 and won two games again Power Four teams, a 41-17 romp at Mississippi State and a 48-46, six-overtime thriller vs. Pitt in the GameAboveSports Bowl.

In 2023, Toledo won 11 consecutive games on its way to a Top 25 ranking, a MAC West Division crown and an appearance in the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl.

During his tenure as head coach, 11 Rockets have been selected in the NFL Draft, including Quinyon Mitchell, who was chosen in the first round by the Philadelphia Eagles in 2024, and Darius Alexander, who was taken in the third round by the New York Giants in 2025.

Candle first joined the Rockets as an assistant coach in 2009, eventually assuming the role of offensive coordinator. He took over as head coach in December of 2015 and led the Rockets to a 32-17 win over No. 24 Temple in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl.

In 2017, the Rockets achieved an 11-3 record and won the Mid-American Conference Championship with a 45-28 victory over Akron in the MAC title game. Candle was named MAC Coach of the Year, leading the Rockets to their first outright MAC West Division crown since 1998 and first league championship since 2004.

In 2022, Toledo went 9-5 and won another league title, defeating East Division champion Ohio, 17-7, in the MAC Championship Game. Toledo went on to defeat Liberty in the Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl, becoming the first Rocket team since 2001 to win a MAC Championship title and bowl game in the same season.

Candle also has a tremendous record of recruiting talent to the Glass City. Toledo has had the No. 1 recruiting class in the MAC seven times during his tenure, including the highest rated class in MAC history in 2024.

Steeped in tradition, the University of Toledo football program has produced countless memorable players and great moments in its 108-year history.

From the legendary 35-game winning streak from 1969-71 to all the championship seasons that followed, Toledo football has a rich legacy of success.

Rocket football dates back to 1917, when a group of Toledo University (as it was known then) students put together a football team with the help of a young professor, John Brandeberry. Toledo lost its first game to the University of Detroit by the incredible score of 145-0, but the foundation of the program had been established.

Prospects for Toledo gradually improved after that first season. Coach James Dwyer led Toledo to its first winning record and its first Northwest Ohio league championship in 1923. Eventually Toledo became a reliable football power, with just one losing season from 1933 to 1948.

Toledo joined the Mid-American Conference in football in 1952 and won its first MAC championship in 1967, but the Rockets really burst onto the national scene two years after that. From 1969-71, Toledo captured the country's attention by winning 35 consecutive games, three straight MAC championships and three straight Tangerine Bowl titles. In each of the three undefeated seasons, Toledo was ranked in the top 20.

The 35-game winning streak ended as the second-longest in major college football history, bettered only by a 47-game string put together by the great Oklahoma teams of 1953-57.

The most famous star of the 1969-71 teams was the legendary quarterback Chuck Ealey. Ealey earned MAC "Back of the Year" honors for an unprecedented three consecutive years and numerous All-America honors from AP, UPI and Football News magazine. Ealey also became the first player in MAC history to receive votes for the Heisman Trophy, receiving 168 points for an eighth-place finish in 1971.

Toledo won its fifth and sixth MAC championships in 1981 and 1984, but it was in the 1990's and 2000's that the Rockets really took off as a national presence. Toledo was coached in the 90's by Gary Pinkel, who amassed a 73-37-3 record before departing for Missouri following the 2000 season. Pinkel's teams won or shared four titles and cracked the top 25 three times in his final six seasons.

Taking the Rockets to even greater heights was Tom Amstutz, a Toledo native and UT graduate who had spent 21 years as an assistant coach. Amstutz led the Rockets to two MAC titles, four division crowns and four bowl games in eight years at the helm from 2001-08. Running

back Chester Taylor (4,849 career yards) dominated from 1998-2001. Quarterback Bruce Gradkowski took over as the star of the Midnight Blue and Gold, setting 21 school passing records from 2003-05.

In 2011, the Rockets went 9-4 and won their first bowl game in six years, a 42-41 triumph over Air Force in the Military Bowl. The victory marked the head coaching debut of Matt Campbell, who took over at the end of

the regular season when Tim Beckman departed for Illinois. Campbell's Rockets followed that up with 9-4 seasons in 2012 and 2014, including a 63-44 victory over Arkansas State in the 2015 Go-Daddy Bowl behind 271 yards rushing and five touchdowns by sophomore Kareem Hunt.

In 2015, the Rockets zoomed up the national polls, checking in at No. 19 in the nation, thanks to big wins over No. 18 Arkansas and Iowa State in successive weeks. Camp-

bell left to take the head coaching position at Iowa State at the conclusion of the 2015 regular season. Offensive coordinator Jason Candle stepped in and led Toledo to a 32-17 victory over No. 24 Temple in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl, giving the Rockets their first 10-win season in 15 years. Hunt led the Rockets in rushing for three straight years from 2014-16, twice earning First-Team All-MAC honors.

The 2017 Rockets, led by future NFL players Diontae Johnson and Logan Woodside, went 11-3 and won the school's first MAC Championship since 2004. Five years later, QB Dequan Finn led the Rockets to the 2022 MAC title and went on to win the Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl, becoming the first Toledo team since 2001 to win a league championship and a bowl game in the same season.

The 2023 team made history by winning 11 straight games and becoming the first Toledo team ever to go 8-0 in MAC play. The Rockets, who were ranked as high as No. 23 in the country, won their second consecutive MAC West Division title and earned an invitation to the Barstool Arizona Bowl. Cornerback Quinyon Mitchell earned All-America honors for the second straight season and was selected in the first round of the 2024 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles.

The 2024 team made their mark with victories over two Power Five opponents. The Rockets smashed the SEC's Mississippi State, 41-17, in Starkville in the regular season, and went on to defeat Pittsburgh of the ACC in the GameAbove Sports Bowl, 48-46 in six overtimes.

Toledo has had the distintinction of having four former players or coaches inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Two members of the famous 35-0 teams—Mel Long (Class of 1998) and Chuck Ealey (2022)—are in the hall, as are coaches Gary Pinkel (2022) and Nick Saban (2025).

1917

• John Brandeberry, an engineering professor, is "selected" coach when he begins conversing with some students on the gravel field near the 11th Street UT campus. Team member Charles Morgan later says, "Nobody else wanted the job." Each of the team's 13 members purchases his own uniform. The team has no practice scrimmages prior to playing the first game in school history, a contest at powerful Detroit. UT not only loses the game, 145-0, it

loses four players to injury. But the program is sustained by the whopping \$150 guarantee it receives for playing the game. Toledo finishes the season 0-3, outscored 262-0 by its opponents.

1918

• The first win in school history comes over Defiance, 19-12. UTfinishes the season with a 1-1 record.

1920s

• The Blade newspaper refers to the team as "Munies," short for Munici-

pal University, and also as the "Fighters."

1922

•The first football field, usually referred to as University Stadium, is built at Scott Park. Seating, consisting of seven rows of wooden bleachers, is added in 1923. Games are also played at Armory Park, and Waite, Scott, Libbey and St. John's high schools from 1918-1936.

1923

Toledo acquires its current nickname

following a game with powerful Carnegie Tech. Surprised to learn that Toledo has no nickname, Pittsburgh sports writers pressure James Neal, a UT student manager working in the press box, to come up with one. Neal, impressed with his team's flashy performance against a superior Carnegie Tech team, labels UT the "Skyrockets," which the writers shorten to "Rockets."
•Toledo wins its first football championship (Northwest Ohio Conference), also the school's first in any sport.

• Jim Pierce is the first African-American team captain, and becomes a professor after graduation.

- The UT marching band, 30 members strong, appears for the first time at a home football game.
- The annual football budget grows to \$2,000.

- UT hosts and defeats 12th-ranked Marshall, 13-7, in front of 9,500 fans.

• With the country at war, football is suspended from 1943-45.

1946

- After lying dormant for almost four years, University Stadium is renovated and renamed "The Glass Bowl." Lights are installed for the stadium's first night games.
- Toledo hosts the first of four postseason contests known as the Glass Bowl Game. A record crowd of 13,500 watches UT defeat Bates College, 21-12.

1948

• The first Toledo football game is televised by WSPD-TV13 (now WTVG).

1952

•Toledo plays its first season in the Mid-American Conference, which at the time also includes Cincinnati, Miami, Ohio, Bowling Green, Kent State, Western Michigan and Western Reserve.

1961

• A U.S. Army Nike-Ajax missile is first installed in the north end zone. Later it is moved to just outside the stadium.

1966

•The cannon is fired off at home games following Toledo scores for the first time.

1967

After a season-opening loss to Ohio,

the Rockets reel off nine straight wins to clinch its first MAC title.

1969

- A 45-18 win over Villanova marks the beginning of Toledo's famed 35-game winning streak, second only in NCAA history to Oklahoma's 49 straight.
- •The Rockets win their second MAC title and end an 11-0 season by defeating Davidson, 56-33, in the Tangerine Bowl.

1970

•Toledo thrashes William & Mary, 40-12, in the Tangerine Bowl, finishes 12-0 and is ranked 12th in the final AP poll.

- Mel Long becomes the first consensus All-American in MAC history. Long later played with the Cleveland Browns.
- •The Rockets win a third-consecutive MAC title and their fourth in five years.
- Toledo is 12-0 and ranked 14th in the final AP poll following a 28-3 victory over Richmond in the Tangerine Bowl.
- Rocket quarterback Chuck Ealey is named MAC Player of the Year for the third time, and finishes eighth in the Heisman Trophy balloting.



• Toledo ties Central Michigan for the MAC title, UT's seventh MAC crown, in Coach Nick Saban's only season as head coach of the Rockets.

1991

• Long-time Washington assistant Gary Pinkel takes over as head coach.

1992

• The Rockets upset Purdue, 33-29, the first win in UT history over a Big Ten opponent. QB Kevin Meger is named Sports Illustrated national offensive player of the week.

1993

• The Denver Broncos selected UT defensive end Dan Williams with the 11th pick in the NFL draft, the highest pick in MAC history at the time.

1995

- Toledo wins its eighth MAC title in school history, posting a 7-0-1 conference mark.
- The Rockets complete their fourth undefeated season in school history (11-0-1) with a 40-37 victory over Nevada in the Las Vegas Bowl. Wasean Tait scores from two yards out for the winning points in the first overtime game in NCAA Division I-A history.
- Toledo is ranked 22nd in the final UPI

poll, 24th in the AP poll and 24th in the CNN/USA Today poll. Tait finishes second in the nation in rushing, tallying a MAC-record 2,090 yards.

1997

• Toledo begins its season with a 36-22 upset of Purdue and proceeds to an 8-0 record. Before the streak was snapped with a loss at Ball State, the Rockets were ranked No. 18 in the AP poll and No. 20 in the CNN/USA Today poll. The Rockets go on to win the MACWest title.

• Coach Gary Pinkel is named MAC Coach of the Year for the second time.

1998

• The Rockets repeat as MAC West champions.

1999

 A video replay board is installed in the north end zone of the Glass Bowl.
 Former Rocket Mel Long, Sr. is inducted into the National College Football Hall of Fame.

2000

- The Rockets go 10-1, including a 24-6 win at Penn State in the season opener. Toledo is ranked No. 25 in the nation in the final AP and USA Today/ESPN polls, but is the only ranked team that does not receive a bid to a bowl game.
- Gary Pinkel, the winningest coach in UT history, leaves after 10 years to take the top position at Missouri. Long-time assistant Tom Amstutz is named head coach.

- The Rockets win 10 games for the second consecutive season, but this time go on to win the MAC Championship Game and Motor City Bowl in Tom Amstutz's rookie season as head coach.

- Placekicker Todd France earns firstteam Verizon Academic All-America honors after graduating with a 3.97 grade-point average in mechanical engineering.

- After a tough 30-28 loss at Illinois, Toledo wins 11 consecutive games and moves to No. 23 in the AP poll.
- The Rockets go 8-0 in MAC play to win the MAC West title and appear in their second straight MAC Championship Game.

Toledo Football: "The Streak"

The famous Toledo 35-consecutive game winning streak, the second-longest in modern major college football history to Oklahoma's 47 (1953-57), began on Sept. 20, 1969 and didn't end until Sept. 9, 1972.

During that streak, the Rockets won three Mid-American Conference

championships and three Tangerine Bowltitles. They outscored opponents, 1,152-344 and led the nation in total defense all three seasons, on their

way to three undefeated seasons: 11-0 (1969), 12-0 (1970) and 12-0 (1971).

In all three seasons, UT was ranked in the Top 20, as high as No. 12 by the Associated Press in 1970, becoming the first MAC team to be ranked in three straight seasons. Legendary quarterback Chuck Ealey earned MAC "Offensive Player

of the Year" honors for an unprecedented three seasons, while defensive tackle Mel Long became the first consensus All-American (AP and UPI polls) in MAC history in 1971.

Nationwide attention came to the UT campus, as curious football fans from all overthe country awaited anxiously each week to see if the Rockets could keep their streak intact. Media such as ABC, CBS, NBC, Sports Illustrated and Newsweek made trips to the Glass Bowl to report on the unfolding drama.

There were certainly several big wins during the streak, including the Rockets'56-33 demolition of Davidson in the first Tangerine Bowl, and UT's 45-18 drubbing of Villanova on Sept.

20, 1969, the one that started it all. In addition, the Rockets posted seven shutouts, and their largest margin of victory was a 52-3 thrashing of Marshall on Sept. 26, 1970.

But not all of the wins were that easy. Four of the games were decided by four points or less, including two contests

that UT squeezed out by a point.

One of those tight games, possibly the greatest in MAC history, was played in Bowling Green, Ohio, on Oct. 11, 1969. Toledo and Bowling Green battled in a hard-fought war in front of a then-record 20,820 fans at Doyt Perry Field. UT led most of the way but the

Falcons rallied to take the lead late in the contest, 26-24. With two seconds remaining in the contest, UT placekicker Ken Crots booted a 37-yard field goal into the teeth of a strong wind to give the Blue and Gold a 27-26 come-frombehind win, extending the string to a mere four games at that time.

The next year, in perhaps one of the most famous of the victories, Toledo again faced certain defeat until the magic of its incredible quarterback came to the forefront. Ealey reached down into his bag of tricks and rallied

the Rockets late in the final quarter, overtaking Miami, 14-13, to keep the streak going at 19.

And who could ever forget what happened on

Oct. 16, 1971? The Western Michigan Broncos had Toledo on the ropes, leading by 14 points in the third quarter and carrying a 10-point lead into the fourth. But the steel-armed Ealey, who set five MAC records in the game, again took control. He guided the Rockets on numerous drives, putting 21 points

on the scoreboard in the final quarter to give UT an unbelievable 35-24 comefrom-behind victory in the Glass Bowl that pushed the string to 29 straight.

Frank Lauter bur was at the Rocket helm for 23 of the victories, while Jack Murphy took over the reins in 1971, guiding UT to 12 straight wins. The fun finally came to an end in the first game of the 1972 season when Tampa shut out UT, 21-0.

Ealey, however, wasn't around to experience the loss. In fact, he was up in

Canada leading the Hamilton Ti-Cats to the Grey Cup championship. A winner through and through, Ealey never lost a game at the amateur level, posting a 65-0 record during his combined high school and college career.



College Football Hall of Fame



MEL LONG, SR. - CLASS OF 1998



Mel Long was a three-time, first-team All-Mid-American Conference selection from 1969-71 as a defensive tackle. He was firstteam Newspaper Enterprise Association All-America, second-team AP All-America and third-team Central Press All-American in 1970. In 1971 he was a first-team pick of the AP, UPI, NEA, Football Writers Association and several others, thus becoming the first consensus All-

America in Mid-American Conference history.

Long was MAC "Defensive Player of the Year" in 1971 and played in the All-America Bowl Game in Tampa. He was tri-captain of the 1971 team that concluded a 35-game unbeaten, untied streak. He helped UT win three consecutive MAC and Tangerine Bowl crowns and earn top-20 rankings each season.

Long was drafted by Cleveland in the 1972 NFL Draft and spent the 1972-75 seasons with the Browns.

GARY PINKEL - CLASS OF 2022



Toledo's all-time leader in victories with 73 from 1991-2000, Gary Pinkel, was inducted as the winningest head coach at both the University of Toledo and the University of Missouri.

Pinkel began his head coaching career at Toledo in 1991 and during the next 10 years he would take the Rockets to new heights, winning 65.9 per-

cent of his games and amassing a 73-37-3 record. His nine winning seasons at Toledo included the 1995 MAC championship, with the Rockets going 11-0-1 and finishing at No. 24 in the final polls. Pinkel would lead Toledo to three other MAC West Division

In 1997, the Rockets finished 9-3, climbing as high as No. 18 in the national rankings. They repeated as division champions again in 1998 with a 7-5 record. In his final season with the Rockets in 2000, the team went 10-1, including a 24-6 win at Penn State. The team finished the regular season with the MAC West Division title and ranked No. 25 in the AP Poll. He was named the MAC Coach of the Year in 1995 and 1997.

Before announcing his retirement in 2015 due to a diagnosis of non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, Pinkel ranked as the third-winningest active coach behind future College Football Hall of Fame inductees Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech and Bill Snyder of Kansas State. Pinkel also is one of only four coaches in history to be the winningest coach of two college football programs, along with Bear Bryant (Kentucky, Alabama), Steve Spurrier (Florida, South Carolina) and Nick Saban (Toledo, Michigan State, LSU, Alabama). Pinkel coached 10 First Team All-Americans, three Academic All-Americans, three NFF National Scholar-Athletes and 79 first team all-conference players.

CHUCK EALEY - CLASS OF 2022





The signal caller for the best run in Toledo football

history, Chuck Ealey never lost a game in his three seasons as the Rockets' starting quarterback.

Named a 1971 First Team All-American, Ealey went a remarkable 35-0 as Toledo's starting quarterback. The three-time MAC Back of the Year became the first player in conference history to

receive votes for the Heisman Trophy, tallying 168 points for an eighth-place finish in 1971. A three-time First Team All-MAC selection, Ealey led the Rockets to three consecutive conference titles. While guiding the team to three-straight Tangerine Bowl victories, he earned MVP honors following standout performances in the 1969 and 1971 editions.

Ealey finished his career as Toledo's all-time leader with 5,275 passing yards and 45 touchdown passes. In both 1970 and 1971, he received the team's Jim Nicholson Award as the team's most valuable player.

After going undrafted by the NFL, Ealey signed with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats of the Canadian Football League. Taking over as the starting guarterback in 1972, he would go on to win the CFL's Most Outstanding Rookie Award and lead the Tiger-Cats to a victory in the Grey Cup, where he earned MVP honors. In total, Ealey played seven seasons in the CFL with the Tiger-Cats (1972-74), Winnipeg Blue Bombers (1974-75) and Toronto Argonauts (1975-78).

NICK SABAN) - CLASS OF 2025



Former Toledo head coach Nick Saban will inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in December of 2025.

Saban served as the head coach at Toledo in 1990, leading the Rockets to a 9-2 record and a share of the MAC Championship title with a 7-1 league mark. Toledo's only losses that year were a

14-13 setback at Central Michigan and a 14-10 loss to Navy in the Glass Bowl.

Saban left Toledo in 1991 to become an assistant coach for the Cleveland Browns under Bill Belichick. He went on to serve as the head coach at Michigan State, LSU and Alabama. He won a record seven national titles, six at Alabama and one at LSU, before retiring from coaching last year.

Saban is the second Toledo coach to be named to the College Football Hall of Fame, joining Gary Pinkel, who was inducted in 2022.

Glass Bowl History (Kickoff from the very first game in the Glass Bowl, Sept. 27, 1937 vs. Bluffton.

The Glass Bowl, the home of Toledo Football for nearly 90 years, enjoys a reputation as one of the most historic and unique football stadiums. Built by the Works Progress Administration, it was one of 65 projects undertaken by the WPA in Ohio in 1936 during the heart of the Great Depression. The first game was played in the new stadium in 1937.

Workers used picks, shovels and wheelbarrows to carve out a site for the structure south of campus, removing more than 13,000 square yards of earth from a natural ravine. The work was done entirely by manual labor, as bulldozers and other machinery were not available.

The project was paid for with \$272,000 from the federal government and \$41,558 from the city of Toledo and the university. The 300-man crew needed over one year to complete the work.

The new stadium had many modern features, including a press box, a onestory wooden structure with five windows located on the east side. Two stone towers, which still are in use today, were built on the north side and were used as locker rooms and at one point served as living accomodations for 12

players.

Originally known as University Stadium, it initially had a seating capacity of 8,000, which was increased to 11,500 in 1940. The largest pre-war crowd was 9,500 for a 13-7 Rocket victory over 12th-ranked Marshall in 1938.

The stadium fell into disrepair following nearly four years of vacancy during World War II (1942-45), when football was discontinued at UT. In 1946, Wayne Kohn, a Libbey-Owens Ford engineer, conceived of the idea of using glass to rebuild the stadium. Glass blocks were installed throughout the stadium

and a glass electric scoreboard was built in the south end zone. A new two-tier press box of blue vitrolite and glass blocks was also constructed. Lights were installed, beginning the tradition of night football at UT.

The newly renovated stadium was officially named the Glass Bowl in honor of Toledo's primary industry. The Glass Bowl Dedication Game was played on Dec. 7, 1946 as a post-season game vs. previously undefeated Bates College. Toledo won the game, 21-12. Three more post-season "Glass Bowl Games" followed in 1947-49.



creased to 12,800 in 1949, and to 15,900 in 1966. Further stadium improvements were sparked by the outrageous success of the famous 35-0 Rockets of 1969-71. A second deck on the east side brought official seating capacity to 18,500. A major improvement followed in 1974 when Astroturf was installed for the first time at a cost of \$404,000. Another \$525,000 was spent to upgrade the seats and locker rooms, and to install permanent fencing that enclosed the entire stadium. A new \$120,000 electronic message board followed in 1975. In 1978, a new lighting system was installed. In 1979, an extensive concrete replacement, in addition to new restrooms and concession stands, was built on the west side.

Improvements to the stadium and the increase in seating capacity could not keep pace with demand, however. Jammed with standing-room-only crowds, spectators headed for higher ground and at many games ended up sitting on the stone wall surrounding the field. In fact, UT led the nation in percentage of attendance from 1982-84 and had an incredible rating of 135.1 percent in 1982. One of the most memorable games was the Bowling Green contest on Oct. 23, 1982, when 31,369 people jammed into the Glass Bowl to see the Rockets' 24-10 victory.

By the 1980's, the Glass Bowl's age, combined with its frequent overflow crowds, necessitated change. That change began on May 25, 1989, when the first shovels of dirt were turned at a festive ground-breaking ceremony, signaling the beginning of the \$18.5-million renovation of the Glass Bowl.

The old wooden pressbox, which had a capacity of 53, was replaced by a new three-level press tower that seats 1,070. The tower houses a modern media communication center

that seats over 100 media personnel, 45 private suites and a 300-seat stadium club.

The second part of the renovation project was the construction of the Larimer Athletic Complex. The headquarters for the Rocket football team, the Larimer Athletic Complex is located at the north end of the stadium. The structure contains a state-of-the-art strength and conditioning facility, locker room, sports medicine center, equipment room, academic resource center, offices and meeting rooms.

One of the most appealing aspects of the Glass Bowl renovation was the way in which the architects introduced a modern look while keeping the flavor and atmosphere of the old stadium intact. The two towers and the stone outer wall remain, giving the Glass Bowl a look and feel unlike any other football stadium in America.

Within the community, financial support for the project has been tremendous. Over 90 percent of the renovation cost has come through donations from the private sector, and through the leasing of the suites and seats in the stadium club.

In recent years, new additions have helped keep the Glass Bowl one of the nation's sporting jewels. In 1999, the Glass Bowl became the first football stadium in the MAC to install a videoboard (a new, larger version was added in 2010). A renovation of the Larimer Athletic Center was completed in 2014. A new FieldTurf playing surface was added in 2025.


With all the changes to the Glass Bowl over the years, one thing has remained consistent—UT's winning tradition. The Rockets have won more than 69 percent of their games in the Glass Bowl since it opened in 1937, and nearly 75 percent since 2000.


Beginning in 2014, Academic All-MAC honors were awarded to any player with a 3.20 GPA or higher who was in his second year of athletic eligibility and had played in at least 50 percent of his team's games. From 2014-18, Distinguished Scholar-Athlete awards were voted on by the league's faculty athletic representatives, similar to the previous selection process for Academic All-MAC. From 2019-21, any Academic All-MAC player who earned first-team All-MAC honors and held at least a 3.50 cumulative GPA was automatically named a Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

% From 1999-2001, the Mid-American Conference did not name Academic All-MAC teams. Instead, any student-athlete with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher was named to the "Academic Honor Roll."





JIM NICHOLSON AWARD

Jim Nicholson became UT's first full-time football coach in April of 1930, at a time when the current Bancroft campus was still under construction. He upgraded the schedule and instituted organized recruiting, eventually building UT into a powerful and respected football program. In 1935, his final season, the Rockets finished 6-2-1, including a 63-0 win over Bowling Green that led to a 13-year cessation of the rivalry between the two schools.

Nicholson helped design the Glass Bowl, and after his retirement as coach participated in reorganizing the Varsity 'T' Club. Nicholson later became an industrialist and civic leader in the City of Toledo. Established in 1963, the Nicholson Trophy honors the player contributing the most toward the success of the team. The selection is made by the players.



Past Toledo Coaches



JOHN BRANDEBERRY 1917 Record: 0-3 (.000)

John Brandeberry, an engineering professor, was "selected" by the players as the first head coach in Rocket history. He led the team for one season in 1917, finishing with a 0-3 record. He also served as an

assistant under Walt Hobt in 1919-20. Brandeberry was a member of the UT faculty for 38 years, from 1915 until he died of a heart attack at age 59 in 1953. Brandeberry was a long-time member and one-time chairman of the UT Board in Control of Athletics. He was posthumusly inducted into the Varsity T Hall of Fame in 2005.

JAMES BAXTER
1918

Record: 1-1 (.500)

James Baxter became UT's head coach in 1918. He spent one season at the helm, leading Toledo to a 1-1 record. Baxter also claimed Toledo's first ever victory, a 19-12 win over Defiance.

WALT HOBT 1919-20

Record: 2-7 (.222) Best year: 2-4 (1919)

Walt Hobt led UT for two seasons from 19-19 to 1920. He finished his career with a 2-7 record and was the first Toledo head coach to win multiple games in a season in 1919.



JOSEPH DWYER 1921-22 Record: 5-7-3 (.433) Best year: 2-2-3 (1922)

Joseph Dwyer spent two seasons as UT's head coach, compiling a 5-7-3 record.



JAMES "PAT" DWYER 1923-25 Record: 12-15 (.444) Best year: 6-4 (1923)

James "Pat" Dwyer became head coach in 1923 and led the Rockets to their first winning season, posting a 6-4 record and winning a Northwest Ohio Conference

championship. Dwyer coached for three seasons and finished his UT career with a record of 12-15



BONI PETCOFF 1926-29 Record: 13-15-1 (.466) Best year: 5-2 (1927)

Boni Petcoff led the Rockets for four seasons. Under his guidance, UT won a Northwest Ohio Conference championship in 1927 and shared in the NWO title

in 1929, his final season as head coach. An immigrant from Bulgaria, Petcoff had a record of 13-15-1 in his time with UT. After retiring from coaching he became a physician in the Toledo area.



JIM NICHOLSON 1930-35 Record: 20-16-4 (.550) Best year: 6-2-1 (1935)

Jim Nicholson became UT's first full-time football coach in April of 1930, when the current campus was under construction. He upgraded the schedule and

instituted organized recruiting, eventually building UT into a powerful and respected football program. In 1935, his final season, the Rockets finished 6-2-1, including a 63-0 win over Bowling Green that led to a 13-year cessation of the rivalry between the two schools.

Nicholson helped design the Glass Bowl, and after his retirement as coach participated in reorganizing the Varsity 'T' Club. He later became an industrialist and civic leader in the City of Toledo.



CLARENCE "DOC" SPEARS

1936-42

Record: 38-26-2 (.591) Best year: 7-3 (1939)

Clarence "Doc" Spears' 38 career victories stood as a UT record for 30 years before being surpassed by Frank Lauterbur's mark of 48 wins. When football was suspended at UT because of WWII, he left to take the head coaching job at Maryland. Following the war, he left coaching to engage in a private practice of medicine, mostly in Ypsilanti, Mich.

Prior to coming to Toledo, Spears had head coaching stops at Dartmouth, West Virginia, Minnesota (where he coached Bronko Nagurski), Oregon and Wisconsin.



BILL ORWIG 1946-47 Record: 15-4-2 (.762) Best year: 9-2 (1947)

Bill Orwig coached the Rockets for just two seasons, but in that time established one of the best winning percentages in school history.

Orwig is one of the few coaches in UT history to oversee two sports at once, also taking the reins of the

basketball team during the 1946-47 season. He returned to Michigan, his alma mater, in 1948 as a member of the athletic administration, and became athletics director at Nebraska in 1954. He took the AD job at Indiana in 1961, hiring Bob Knight as basketball coach in 1971.

Past Toledo Coaches



FRANK LAUTERBUR 1963-70 Record: 48-32-2 (.598)

Record: 48-32-2 (.598) Best year: 12-0 (1970)

Frank Lauterbur presided over the most glorious era of UT football. Lauterbur coached the Rockets to the first MAC title in school history in 1967, followed

by league championships and perfect seasons in 1969 and 1970. Lauterbur's Rockets could score readily, but won by stopping their opponents, twice leading the nation in total defense.



In 1970, Toledo finished 12th in the AP poll and 17th in the UPI poll. After capping that season with a second straight Tangerine Bowl victory, Lauterbur took the head coaching job at lowa.

Frank Lauterbur's teams won MAC titles in 1967, 1969 and 1970.



JACK MURPHY 1971-76 Record: 35-32 (.522) Best year: 12-0 (1971)

Jack Murphy, an assistant under Frank Lauterbur, took over the coaching reins in 1971, promptly leading the Rockets to another MAC title and a

12-0 record. That was also the year Toledo's famed winning streak reached 35 games, as the Rockets' finished 13th in the UPI poll and 14th in the AP poll.

Murphy's perfect campaign came during his first season as a Division I-A head coach, a feat not equaled until Auburn's Terry Bowden turned the trick in 1993.



CHUCK STOBART 1977-81 Record: 24-31-1 (.438) Best year: 9-3 (1981)

Chuck Stobart was the head football coach for five seasons from 1977-81, rebuilding the Rocket program into one of the premier programs in the Mid-American

Conference. He earned MAC Coach of the Year honors in 1979 and 1981. In 1981, Stobart led UT to a 9-3 record, a MAC Championship title and a memorable 27-25 victory over San Jose State in the California Bowl that was decided on a last-second field goal by Tony Lee. Stobart left UT to become the head coach at Utah from 1982-84. He later served as the head coach at Memphis from 1989-94, and also spent time as the offensive coordinator at Pittsburgh, Arizona, USC and Ohio State.



DAN SIMRELL 1982-89 Record: 50-37-2 (.567) Best year: 9-2 (1983)

Dan Simrell recorded 50 victories in his eight seasons at Toledo, the third-most wins of any coach in school history.

He led UT to a Mid-American Conference title in 1984 and a berth in the California Bowl, as the Rockets posted a 9-2-1 record. In 1983,

Toledo raced to a 9-0 start before dropping its final two games of the season.

Inaddition to the league title, Simrell's teams finished second in conference play three times (1983, 1986, 1989).

Dan Simrell won 50 games at Toledo and a MAC title in 1984.



NICK SABAN 1990 Record: 9-2 (.818)

Nick Saban was head coach for one season, leading Toledo to a 9-2 record and a MAC cochampionship in 1990.

Saban left Toledo after the 1991 season to become the Cleveland Browns defensive coordinator. Saban has since

been the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99), LSU (2000-04), the NFL's Miami Dolphins (2005-06) and Alabama (2007-23). He has won seven national titles, one at LSU in 2003, and six at Alabama in 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017 and 2020.

Saban will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2025.

GARY PINKEL 1991-2000 Record: 73-37-3 (.659) Best year: 11-0-1 (1995)

Gary Pinkel has the most wins (73) and the secondbest winning percentage (.659) among UT coaches who led the program for at least four years.

In 1995, Pinkel led the Rockets to an 11-0-1 record, a victory in the Las Vegas Bowl and a top 25 ranking in both the AP and coaches' polls.

In 1997, Pinkel led the Rockets to the first-ever MAC West title and a trip to the MAC Championship Game. The Rockets finished the season 9-3 and were ranked as high as No. 18 at one point in the season.

Pinkel's Rockets repeated as MACWest champions in 1998, earning UT's third post-season appearance in four seasons.

In Pinkel's final season in 2000, the Rockets went 10-1, including a 24-6 victory at Penn State, and were ranked No. 25 in the nation in both final regular-season polls. Following the 2000 season, Pinkel took the head coaching position at Missouri. He has the rare distinction

of being inducted into four college hall of fames: Toledo; his alma mater, Kent State; the Mid-American Conference; and the College Football Hall of Fame.


TOM AMSTUTZ 2001-08 Record: 58-41 (.586) Best year: 10-2 (2001)

"Toledo" Tom Amstutz led the Rockets to some of their finest moments, including two MAC Championships, four West Division titles and four bowl appear-

ances

A native of Toledo who also played for the Rockets, Amstutz spent nearly his entire coaching career as an assistant at UT before moving into the big chair following the departure of Gary Pinkel at the end of the 2000 season.

During his eight seasons as head coach, Amstutz led his team to victories over Michigan, No. 9 Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Kansas and



lowa State, as well as dramatic comeback wins over Marshall in the 2001 MAC Championship Game and Bowling Green in the 2004 season finale that clinched the MAC West title. The Rockets won the 2001 Motor City Bowl and 2005 GMAC Bowl under Amstutz

Tom Amstutz won MAC Championships in 2001 and 2004.



TIM BECKMAN 2009-11 Record: 21-16 (.568) Best year: 8-4 (2011)

Tim Beckman revived the Toledo football program, racking up consecutive winning seasons and bowl appearances in his final two seasons with the Rockets. After a 5-7 mark in 2009, Beckman's Rockets

won eight games in both 2010 and 2011. Following the conclusion of the 2011 regular season, Beckman resigned to accept the head coaching position at the University of Illinois.



Tim Beckman led the Rockets to two bowl games in his three years as head coach.



MATT CAMPBELL 2011-15 Record: 35-15 (.700) Best year: 9-2 (2015)

Matt Campbell enjoyed four winning seasons as Toledo's head coach from 2011-15. His debut as head

coach came in the 2011 Military Bowl, a thrilling 42-41 victory over Air Force. Along the way were big victories over No. 18 Cincinnati in

2012 and No. 18 Arkansas in 2015, as well as another bowl victory in the GoDaddy Bowl over Arkansas State in January of 2015. Campbell resigned from his post at the conclusion of the 2015 regular season to accept the head coaching job at lowa State.



1969 TANGERINE BOWL TOLEDO 56, DAVIDSON 33

The Rockets headed to Orlando with much at stake: the first undefeated season in the history of the football program. The Rocket offense racked up 324 yards in total offense and put 42 points on the board in the first half. It all led to a 56-33 victory over Southern Conference champion Davidson in the 24th annual Tangerine Bowl.



Quarterback Chuck Ealey, voted the game's most valuable back, ran nine times for 83 yards and a touchdown and threw for 147 yards and three scores on 10-of-13 passing. Don Fair caught four passes for 78 yards and Charles Cole carried 22 times for 152 yards.

The Rockets were later rewarded with a No. 20 national ranking in the final Associated Press poll.

1970 TANGERINE BOWL TOLEDO 40, WILLIAM & MARY 12

The Rockets looking to repeat as Tangerine Bowl champs and post a second consecutive undefeated season, but Lou Holtz's William & Mary team had other ideas and looked primed for an upset when it jumped out to a 6-0 lead and trailed by one point, 7-6, at halftime.



But it was all Rockets in the second half as they scored on their first four possessions.

The Rockets churned out 326 yards rushing, paced by Charles Cole (132 yards) and Tony Harris (101 yards). Toledo finished 12th in the nation in the final A.P. poll, 14th in the Football News and 17th by UPI.

1971 TANGERINE BOWL TOLEDO 28, RICHMOND 3

For the first 15 minutes of the game, Richmond looked as if it had the ability to end Toledo's winning streak at 34 games, taking a 3-0 lead. But then quarterback Chuck Ealey and the No. 1 defense in the nation went to work.



The Rocket defense limited the Spiders to just 51 total yards of total offense in the second half,

including none through the air. Richmond punted on five of its seven possessions in the second half, was stopped on fourth down on one and intercepted on the other.

Ealey completed 14-of-23 passes for 176 yards and scored from one yard out. With the victory, the Rockets ran their winning streak to 35 games, to this day the second-longest in major college football.

1981 CALIFORNIA BOWL TOLEDO 27, SAN JOSE ST. 25

They said it couldn't be done. There was no

way that Toledo could beat a San Jose State team ranked 20th in the final UPI coaches poll. Yet when the first-ever California Bowl game was over, it was Toledo who left the field victorious, 27-25. Tony Lee's 41-yard field goal with just seconds left gave Toledo the victory.




Toledo had led in the game, 21-3, in the third quarter, but let that slip away. The Spartans took a 25-24 lead with just 52 seconds remaining, on a 35-yard touchdown pass and a two-point conversion

The Rockets were faced with 80 yards of field ahead of them and no time outs remaining. Quarterback Maurice Hall cooly marched his offense down to the Spartan 24-yard line to set the stage for Lee's winning field goal.

1984 CALIFORNIA BOWL UNLV 30, TOLEDO 13*

The Rockets came up short, 30-13, against



Randall Cunningham, Ickey Woods and the rest of the Runnin' Rebels. Cunningham had a stellar game, completing 18-of-28 passes for 270 yards. Woods, just a freshman at the time, led UNLV with 53 yards and a TD.

Rocket running back Steve Morgan was named Toledo's outstanding offensive player after totaling 154 yards on 31 carries, while quarterback A.J. Sager was 12-of-31 for 137 yards with one TD.

*NOTE: The contest was later forfeited to Toledo by the PCAA due to use of ineligible players by UNLV earlier that season. UNLV has never accepted the ruling.

1995 LAS VEGAS BOWL TOLEDO 40, NEVADA 37 (OT)

In a game that featured the first overtime in Division I-A football history, Toledo prevailed over Nevada, 40-37, electrifying a national TV audience on ESPN. After a field goal gave the Wolf Pack a 37-34 lead, its first of the game, the Rockets' Wasean Tait, who set four bowl records and was named co-MVP, scored the winning points on a two-yard run.



Tait set Las Vegas Bowl standards for rushing yards (185), all-purpose yards (238) and TDs (four).

The two teams battled to stand-still through regulation, with Nevada tying the game with a late field goal. Toledo won the overtime coin toss and elected to go on defense first. Nevada settled for a field goal, setting up Tait, who got the call on three of UT's four plays, the last one the game-winner. He was buried under a sea of Rockets in the victory celebration and passed out cold.



2001 MOTOR CITY BOWL TOLEDO 23, CINCINNATI 16

Chester Taylor ran for a Motor City Bowlrecord 190 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 24-yard run with 3:23 left as Toledo defeated Cincinnati, 23-16. But it was a big play by the defense that clinched the victory for Toledo.



Cincinnati drove to the UT five-yard line, but couldn't convert on fourth-and-4 with 50 seconds left. Cincinnati's Ray Jackson bobbled a deflected pass in a crowded end zone, and senior free safety Andy Boyd then wrestled Jackson—and the ball—to the ground to seal the victory for Toledo.

Quarterback Tavares Bolden was 14-of-28 for 135 yards, but it was his legs that helped Toledo the most. He ran for 41 yards on a draw on the first play of the second half that led to a UT field goal. He tied the game late in the third quarter when he sprinted 28 yards untouched for a touchdown. For the game, Bolden ran for 99 yards, which helped the Rockets set a Motor City Bowl record with 322 yards rushing.

2002 MOTOR CITY BOWL BOSTON COLLEGE 51, TOLEDO 25

Boston College scored on its first six possessions on its way to a 42-18 halftime lead, effectively putting the game away and preventing the Rockets from defending their Motor City Bowl title. Toledo cut the Eagles' advantage to 21-10 when Trinity Dawson scored on a two-yard run



with 10:47 remaining in the first half but UT never got any closer.

Down 28-10 with less than six minutes to go in the first half, Toledo gambled, going for it on a fourth-and-1 from its own 40, but Brian Jones' pass fell incomplete. Boston College took possession, and on the next play, Grant Adams caught Brian St. Pierre's pass across the middle, eluded a defender and raced into the end zone for a 35-10 lead. A one-yard TD run by Brandon Brokaw with 1:31 to go in the half made it 42-10.

Jones, the nation's percentage completion leader, connected on 27-41 passes for 331 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Wide receiver Carl Ford had a career-high 10 receptions for 112 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown pass with 24 seconds to go in the second quarter. Fellow senior Donta' Greene added four catches for 63 yards.

2004 MOTOR CITY BOWL UCONN 39, TOLEDO 10

Quarterback Bruce Gradkowski was game. Unfortunately, his broken right hand was not. Gradkowski, who broke his throwing hand in the MAC Championship Game, tried to play in the Motor City Bowl but was ineffective and clearly in pain. As a result, the Rockets' offense stalled, and Connecticut had its way with Toledo,



39-10. Gradkowski finished 6-of-12 for 43 yards before being replaced by Marques Council. By the time Council got in the game to start the second half, UConn was up, 30-7. Council set career highs in attempts (28), completions (16) and passing yards (160).

Toledo entered the game as the favorites, but without a healthy Gradkowski it was no contest. UConn scored on six of its first seven possessions as the Rockets were held to a season-low 10 points.

Gradkowski wasn't the only Rocket to go down, as the UT training staff was kept busy throughout the entire game. Senior All-MAC free safety Patrick Body broke his right arm in the second half. Lance Moore, Toledo's all-time leading receiver, left the game in the second half with a dislocated shoulder. Senior center David Odenthal suffered a sprained left ankle in the first half, returned briefly, then sat out most of the second half.

2005 GMAC BOWL TOLEDO 45, UTEP 13

Quarterback Bruce Gradkowski ended his storied collegiate career with an exclamation point, throwing five touchdown passes to lead Toledo to a convincing 45-13 win over UTEP. Fellow senior and roommate Trinity Dawson ran for 132 yards.



Toledo's defense shut down UTEP's offense at almost every turn. Linebacker Mike Alston contributed two big tackles for the Rockets to end the first half, when UTEP was threatening to cut into a 28-13 deficit. It was the last time the Miners appeared set to mount a rally.

Gradkowski, who completed 18-of-32 passes for 298 yards, was chosen as the game's MVP while Dawson (offense), Alston (defensive) and Steve Odom (special teams) also won game honors. After the game, Gradkowski summed up the sentiment of the team.


"It's been an honor to be here this week," said Gradkowski. "We were treated unbelievably by the city of Mobile. The southern hospitality has been awesome. We've never experienced anything like this. We wanted to give back to Mobile by performing the way we did. I hope we satisfied the fans out there.

"It's been a pleasure. What a way to go out. This is our champion-ship. We are GMAC Bowl Champions."



2010 LITTLE CAESARS PIZZA BOWL **FIU 34, TOLEDO 32**

Florida International capped a secondhalf comeback with a 34-yard field goal as time expired to give the Panthers a dramatic 34-32 victory over Toledo at the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl at Ford Field in Detroit.





Toledo held a 24-7 lead early in the second half but FIU scored 24 unanswered points to take a 31-24 lead with 3:18 to play. Junior Adonis Thomas led the Rockets with a career-high 193 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Thomas' second TD run was an 87-yard bolt in the second quarter, the longest run of his career, the fourth-longest rush in Toledo history and tied for the longest run in Little Caesars Bowl history. He finished the season with 1,098 yards, the 13th-highest total in school history.

2011 MILITARY BOWL TOLEDO 42, AIR FORCE 41

Toledo used its powerful offense and the defense came up with a big play in an exciting 42-41 victory over Air Force in the Military Bowl. The Rockets never trailed in a see-saw affair in which there were three ties and UT's largest lead was 14 points.



With 52 seconds left in the game, Air Force scored what appeared to be the game-tying touchdown when Falcons receiver Jonathan Warzeka caught a wide open 33-yard pass from quarterback Tim Jefferson.

Air Force lined up for the extra-point but opted to go for two points on a trick play. Holder David Baska took the snap and headed for the end zone, but sophomore defensive end Jayrone Elliott stripped the ball loose from Baska. The ball bounced in the direction of Parker Herrington, who tried to scoop up the loose ball but ending up kicking it out of the end zone leaving the Rockets with a 42-41 advantage and their first bowl victory since 2005.


The victory was a great vindication for a Rocket team that had survived numerous injuries—including three key injuries to its defense in this game. It was also a dramatic debut for head coach Matt Campbell, the Rockets' offensive coordinator who was named head coach just 16 days prior to the game.

2012 IDAHO POTATO BOWL UTAH STATE 41, TOLEDO 15

Despite the loss of two stars, Toledo

gave No. 18 Utah State all it could handle before losing, 41-15, at the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in Boise, Idaho.

Senior linebacker Dan Molls, the nation's leading tackler, was knocked out of the game with a concussion on the game's opening kickoff. A short while later, junior running



Despite those losses, Toledo was in the game well into the fourth quarter, trailing just 13-9 before a 63-yard touchdown run by USU's Kerwynn Williams put the game on ice just under the seven-minute mark. Williams then followed with two more scoring runs of five and 25 yards to finish the game with 18 carries for 235 yards.

Senior QB Austin Dantin, who played the first three quarters, completed 12-of-21 attempts for 132 yards with two interceptions for the Rockets. Junior QB Terrance Owens, hobbled by an ankle injury, played most of the fourth quarter and was 5-of-16 for 26 yards. Utah State's Chuckie Keeton threw for 229 yards and completed 21-of-31 pass at-

Junior WR Bernard Reedy led the Rockets in both rushing and receiving, finishing with a career-high 10 carries for 50 yards on the ground and six catches for 62 yards through the air. He was honored following the game as Toledo's Most Valuable Player.



2015 GO DADDY BOWL TOLEDO 63, ARKANSAS STATE 44



Sophomore running back Kareem Hunt rushed for a career-high 271 yards and a bowl-record five touchdowns to propel the Toledo Rockets to a 63-44 victory over Arkansas State at the GoDaddy Bowl in Mobile on Jan. 4.

Hunt, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player, set the bowl record for rushing yards, as well. His five TDs ties the Toledo record for touchdowns, and ties the all-time bowl record for rushing touchdowns held by two others, most recently Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders at the

1988 Holiday Bowl.


In a game that featured 107 total points and 1,009 yards of total offense, Toledo's defense played a big role in the victory, scoring two touchdowns in the first half and stopping Arkansas State's potent offense in several key situations. Junior defensive end Trent Voss, who recovered a fumble in the end zone on the game's first play, had a career-high four tackles for loss among his game-high 10 tackles. He was named Defensive

Sophomore quarterback Logan Woodside completed 21-of-27 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Damion Jones-Moore added 103 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries.





2015 MARMOT BOCA RATON BOWL TOLEDO 32, TEMPLE 17



Phillip Ely threw for 285 yards and two touchdowns and Toledo used a smothering defense to knock off No. 24 Temple, 32-17, at the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl at FAU Stadium. Ely, playing in his final game as a Rocket, returned to his native Florida to lead the Rockets to victory in Jason Candle's first game as head coach.

Ely, a transfer from Alabama, was named the game's Offensive MVP. He completed 20-of-28 passes despite throwing in driving rain most of the night. Kareem Hunt led the running attack

with 79 yards and two TDs. Cody Thompson had four receptions for a career-high 119 yards, including a big 80-yard score in the fourth quarter.

While Ely provided the Rockets (10-2) with leadership on offense, the Toledo defense set the tone of the game, holding the Owls to just 17 points and a mere 67 yards of total offense in the first half. Ja'Wuan Woodley, who had a key safety in the first half, was named the game's Defensive MVP. Chase Murdock and Trent Voss paced the front seven with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

Toledo's defense controlled the action in the first half, holding Temple (10-4) to just 67 yards of total offense.

2016 RAYCOM MEDIA CAMELLIA BOWL APPALACHIAN STATE 31, TOLEDO 28



Senior Kareem Hunt rushed for 120 yards and two touchdowns to become Toledo's all-time leading rusher, but it wasn't enough as Toledo fell to Appalachian State, 31-28, in the 2016 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl in Montgomery, Ala.

App State scored on a 39-yard field goal with 5:14 left in the fourth quarter to give the Mountaineers a 31-28 lead. Toledo


had its chance to tie the score but Jameson Vest's 30-yard field-goal attempt with 1:48 remaining was wide right.

Hunt led the rushing attack with 120 yards, giving him 4,945 career rushing yards, which breaks the all-time record at Toledo previously held by Chester Taylor (4,849 from 1998-2001). It was also the 28th 100-yard game in his career, breaking the school mark of 27 held by Taylor.

Senior Logan Woodside connected 18-of-26 passes and added to his nation-leading total by throwing two touchdown passes to give him 45. Junior Cody Thompson led the team with 99 yards on five receptions, giving him 1,269 on the season and surpassing the Toledo record of 1,194 set by Lance Moore in 2003.

The contest was a close battle throughout the night with neither team leading by more than seven points. The score was tied at 7, 14, 21 and 28.

2017 DOLLAR GENERAL BOWL APPALACHIAN STATE 34, TOLEDO 0



Toledo fell behind early and could never get back in the game in a 34-0 loss to Appalachian State in the Dollar General Bowl in Mobile, Ala.

The Rockets (11-3) trailed 20-0 at halftime and App State outgained Toledo in total offense for the game, 458-146.

Senior quarterback Logan Woodside, playing in his final game as a Rocket, completed 16-of-29 passes for 124 yards. Senior

Terry Swanson led the running attack with 44 yards. Sophomore Diontae Johnson caught two passes for 21 yards, finishing his season with a school-record 1,278 receiving yards.

Appalachian State controlled the first half, taking a 20-0 half-time lead and outgaining the Rockets in total offense, 267-85, in the first 30 minutes. The Mountaineers got on the board on their third possession of the game on a seven-yard TD run by Jalin Moore with 4:06 to play in the first quarter. The 36-yard drive was set up by an ASU interception of Woodside near midfield that was returned 19 yards by Anthony Flory.

ASU scored again on its next possession, a nine-play, 64-yard drive capped off by another seven-yard run by Moore. After the Mountaineers forced Toledo to punt, they drove 57 yards before settling for a 29-yard field goal by Chandler Staton to increase their lead to 17-0 with 8:09 left in the first half.

2018 MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL FIU 35, TOLEDO 32



Toledo scored the game's first points in the first 29 seconds of the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl, but couldn't hold off Florida International, falling to the Golden Panthers.

Eli Peters threw for 264 yards and tied a career high with three TD passes. Diontae Johnson caught six passes for 98 yards and a score, while Jon'Vea Johnson added two touchdown catches. Bryant Koback scored the game's first touchdown with a three-yard rush in the first quarter, and both Richard Olekanma and Tuzar Skipper

led the Rockets with eight tackles.

Toledo took the lead early on with 10 points in the first quarter, but FIU's strong rushing attack put the Panthers ahead by 10, 35-25, late in the game. However, Peters found Johnson for the second time in the corner of the end zone for a 43-yard touchdown with two seconds left to keep the Rockets' hopes alive. UT's chances came down to an onside kick, which was recovered by FIU to seal the Panthers' victory.



2021 BAHAMAS BOWL MIDDLE TENNESSEE 31, TOLEDO 24



Toledo came up on the short end of a 31-24 decision to Middle Tennessee State in the Bahamas Bowl in Nassau, Bahamas.

Toledo (7-6) led at halftime, 17-14, but the Blue Raiders (7-6) outscored the Rockets 17-7 in the fourth guarter to claim the win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Dequan Finn completed 18-of-39 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 83 yards and one touchdown. Junior running back Bryant Koback led the ground attack with 126 yards on

18 carries, while junior Matt Landers caught four passes for a team-high 137 yards and one score.

Defensively, junior Nate Givhan had a pair of sacks and seven tackles, while classmate Dyontae Johnson tallied a team-best 10 tackles. Junior Samuel Womack also notched his fifth career interception.

Middle Tennessee scored on the first play of the fourth quarter to make it 21-17 on quarterback Mike Diliello's 14-yard rush. The Blue Raiders extended their lead to 28-17 on Jarrin Pierce's touchdown reception with 6:24 remaining. Middle Tennessee added a field goal before the Rockets closed out the game's scoring when Finn found DeMeer Blankumsee in the end zone from 13 yards out with 1:08 to play.

2023 BARSTOOL SPORTS ARIZONA BOWL WYOMING 16, TOLEDO 15



Toledo led for much of the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl, but fell to Wyoming by a score of 16-15 on a 24-yard field goal as time expired at Arizona Stadium in Tucson, Ariz.

The Rockets led 15-6 heading into the fourth quarter, but the Cowboys scored 10 unanswered points in the final frame to pull ahead for the win. A 12-play, 87-yard drive ended when Wyoming's John Hoyland knocked the game-winning field goal through the uprights on the game's final play.

Junior running back Jacquez Stuart led the Rockets offensively, tallying 99 yards on nine carries, including an electric 80-yard touchdown run. He totaled 208 all-purpose yards, 105 of which came on kickoff returns.

Sophomore quarterback Tucker Gleason made his first start of the season and threw for 184 yards, completing 14-of-34 passes. His favorite target was junior wide receiver Jerjuan Newton, who caught five passes for 74 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Junior Vandeross III caught three passes for 53 yards.

Defensively, senior safety Nate Bauer posted a team-best 10 tack-les and added a tackle for loss and one pass breakup. The Rockets had a season-high eight tackles for loss and collected three sacks. Sophomore defensive tackle Esean Carter, junior defensive tackle Darius Alexander, and junior linebacker Deshawn Holt were credited with Toledo's sacks. Carter's sack resulted in a safety.

2022 ROOFCLAIM.COM BOCA RATON BOWL TOLEDO 21, LIBERTY 19



Sophomore quarterback Dequan Finn threw for one touchdown and ran for another in the second half to rally Toledo to a 21-19 victory over Liberty at the Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl in Boca Raton, Fla.

Finn, who was briefly knocked out of the game after being sacked in the first quarter, hit tight end Lenny Kühl for a four-yard touchdown in the third quarter, then ran it in himself in the fourth quarter to put the Rockets up 21-7 with 10:35 to play. For his efforts, Finn was named Of-

fensive MVP.

UT withstood two fourth-quarter touchdowns from the Flames and stopped a two-point conversion attempt with 3:40 to play to hang on and win. Sophomore running back Jacquez Stuart ran the ball six straight times on Toledo's final possession for 53 yards to run out the clock. Stuart rushed for 111 yards on 23 carries for the game.

Toledo's stout defense once again turned in a solid performance, holding Liberty to a season-low 253 yards of total offense, including just 91 yards in the first half. Senior Nate Givhan was named Defensive MVP after contributing perhaps the biggest defensive play of the game, a third-quarter strip sack that set up the Rockets inside the Liberty 10-yard line on the ensuing drive. Junior kicker Thomas Cluckey was named Special Teams MVP after going 2-for-2 on field goal attempts.

The Rockets controlled the pace in their victory, possessing the ball twice as long as Liberty (40:03 to 19:57).

2024 GAMEABOVE SPORTS BOWL TOLEDO 48, PITTSBURGH 46 (6 OT)



Junior Vandeross III scored the winning twopoint conversion in the sixth overtime to give Toledo a thrilling 48-46 victory over Pittsburgh in the GameAbove Sports Bowl at Ford Field in Detroit. Vandeross was named the game's Most Valuable Player after finishing the contest with a career-high 12 receptions and a career-best 194 receiving yards.

The six-overime game set the mark as the longest bowl game in FBS history.

Toledo led 20-12 at halftime thanks to a pair of big plays. Trailing 12-6 midway through the second quarter, the Rockets scored two touchdowns in 14-second span, first on a 67-yard TD reception by Vandeross and then on a 42-yard pick-six by Braden Awls.

Pitt looked like it had the game in hand in the second half, reeling off 18 consecutive points to take a 30-20 lead early in the fourth quarter, when defensive tackle Darius Alexander scored on a 58-yard pick-six to cut the lead to 30-27. Freshman Dylan Cunanan's 51-yard field goal tied the score at 30-30 with 1:45 left.

Toledo was led by junior quarterback Tucker Gleason, who completed 26-of-50 passes for a career-high 336 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Jerjuan Newton finished with eight receptions for 84 yards in his final game as a Rocket.


The defense was led by safety Jaden Dottin, who had a career-high 10 tackles and his first career interception.



Extra bleachers were brought into the north end zone of the Glass Bowl on a regular basis to accommodate overflow crowds in 2001, including a then MAC-record 36,852 vs. Navy in 2001. Since that season, however, stricter fire regulations have been imposed that prevent bleachers from being brought onto the field, making it impossible for UT to ever break its home attendance record in the current configuation of the Glass Bowl.




