SETTING THE SCENE

UTSA (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) will host a game for the first time in nearly a month when it welcomes FIU (6-3, 4-1) to the Alamodome for a Conference USA contest on Saturday, Nov. 10. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. and the game will air on ESPN+ and 93.3/92.5 FM The Bull in San Antonio. The Roadrunners are looking to snap a three-game losing skid, while the Panthers are looking to keep pace with 5-1 Middle Tennessee in the C-USA East Division. Saturday's game will mark the third all-time meeting between the two teams. UTSA won the inaugural matchup, 16-13, on Oct. 11, 2014, at the Alamodome, while FIU scored a 14-7 home victory on Nov. 4, 2017.

TUNING IN

The game will air on ESPN+ (subscription required). Lincoln Rose (play-by-play), LaDarrin McLane (color analyst) and Tina Nguyen (sideline reporter) have the call. The contest will air live on the Roadrunners Sports Network and can be heard in the San Antonio area on 93.3/92.5 FM The Bull. Andy Everett (play-by-play), Jay Riley (analyst) and Pat Evans (sideline reporter) will call all the action. The pregame show will begin at 4 p.m. and there will be a 45-minute postgame show. The broadcast also can be heard live online at goUTSA.com, thebullcountry.iheart.com and on SiriusXM Internet channel 979, as well as via the free iHeartRadio app.

GAME 92

Saturday's matchup with FIU will mark the 92nd game in UTSA football history and its 46th home contest. Now in their eighth season of play, the Roadrunners are 41-50 overall and 24-21 at the Alamodome.

A LOOK AT FIU

The Panthers enter Saturday's game at 6-3 overall and 4-1 in Conference USA. FIU saw its four-game win streak snapped by Florida Atlantic in a 49-14 home setback on Saturday night. The Panthers are averaging 33.7 points and 407.9 yards per game and allowing 25.1 points and 391.7 yards per outing. Junior quarterback James Morgan leads the offense with 1,991 passing yards and 21 touchdowns. Senior running back Napoleon Maxwell and sophomore D'Vonte Price pace the ground game with 457 and 418 rushing yards, respectively, while junior receiver C.J. Worton is the top receiver with 27 catches for 518 yards and five TDs. Junior linebacker Sage Lewis leads the team in tackles with 96, while senior defensive lineman Anthony Johnson has a team-best 3.5 sacks and five quarterback hurries. Nine different Panthers have recorded an interception, led by junior cornerback Isaiah Brown's two picks. Saturday's game will feature two of the nation's top place-kickers, as sophomore Jose Borregales has made 10-of-11 field goals and 37-of-38 extra points this season to join UTSA sophomore Jared Sackett as two of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award. Head coach Butch Davis is 14-8 in his second season at the helm.

SERIES HISTORY

UTSA and FIU will meet for the third time on Saturday night at the Alamodome. The Panthers scored a 14-7 victory in the last meeting on Nov. 4, 2017, in Miami, Fla. The Roadrunners won the inaugural matchup, 16-13, on Oct. 11, 2014, in San Antonio.

LAST MEETING

Dalton Sturm had 187 yards of offense and La'Kel Bass and Marcus Davenport combined for 15 tackles, but it was not enough in a 14-7 setback to FIU on Nov. 4, 2017, at Riccardo Silva Stadium in Miami, Fla. Sturm rushed for a game-high 82 yards and added 105 through the air, as he completed 13 passes to seven different receivers, including three apiece to Josh Stewart and Kerry Thomas Jr. Meanwhile, Bass led a defense that held the Panthers to 315 yards of offense with eight tackles, including five solos and a tackle for loss. Davenport added seven stops and his third forced fumble of the season, which led to one of three FIU turnovers on the night. After a scoreless first half that saw the two teams combine for just 246 yards, FIU broke through for the game's first points with 3:40 left in the third quarter when Alex McGough hit Thomas Owens in the flat for a 13-yard touchdown pass to help put the home team up 7-0. UTSA coughed up the football on the ensuing kickoff and FIU recovered at the 15-yard line. On the next play, McGough found Shawndarrius Phillips open over the middle for his second TD pass of the night. The Roadrunners got on the board early in the final frame. Sturm completed a 12-yard touchdown pass to Brady Jones with 13:59 left to play, capping a 10-play, 75-yard drive. On the next possession, Austin Jupe picked off a long pass at the UTSA 31. The Roadrunners then marched all the way down to the FIU 1-yard line and threatened to tie the score but were stopped short of the end zone on fourth down with 6:44 remaining.

LAST TIME OUT

UAB registered more than 600 yards of offense and held UTSA to 220 in a 52-3 victory in Conference USA action on Saturday night at Legion Field. The C-USA West Division-leading Blazers racked up 668 total yards, including 419 on the ground. They held the Roadrunners to 84 rushing yards and 136 through the air. Spencer Brown led UAB's ground game with 147 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries, while James Noble added 92 yards on 11 totes. Tyler Johnston passed for 249 yards and three TDs on just 10 completions, three to Xavier Ubosi for a game-high 72 yards and two scores. Greg Campbell Jr. led UTSA's offense with six catches for 62 yards, while Brenden Brady rushed for 42 yards on eight carries. C.J. Levine paced the Roadrunners defense with 12 tackles, the third double-digit tackle game of the year for the senior safety. Meanwhile, linebackers Les Maruo and Josiah Tavaeafa posted nine and eight stops, respectively, and Cassius Grady picked off his team-leading third pass of the fall.

WILSON IN THIRD YEAR AT HELM

Frank Wilson is in his third season as head coach of the Roadrunners. The New Orleans native has guided UTSA to back-to-back seasons of being bowl eligible, including leading the program to its first-ever postseason appearance at the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, as UTSA tied the NCAA modern startup program by reaching a bowl game in its sixth season of play. He has coached 13 All-Conference USA selections and a pair of Freshman All-Americans in his first two years at the helm. Wilson came to San Antonio after a six-year stint as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at LSU, where he also was the associate head coach in 2012-15. Armed with more than a decade of coaching experience in the Southeastern Conference, Wilson also has been an assistant coach at Tennessee (2009), Southern Miss (2008) and Mississippi (2005-07). He has coached or recruited 36 individuals who have made it to the NFL, including 2018 NFL First Round Draft pick Marcus Davenport of the Saints.

C-USA TO HONOR MIKE SLIVE'S LEGACY THIS FALL

Conference USA Football teams will honor former C-USA commissioner Mike Slive and promote prostate cancer awareness in partnership with the Mike Slive Foundation by wearing custom helmet stickers this fall.

Slive, a respected and accomplished leader in college athletics, passed away in May at the age of 77. He was named the first Commissioner of Conference USA when the 12-team league was introduced on April 24, 1995. Under his direction, C-USA quickly emerged as one of the nation's top conferences. Slive served as the league's Commissioner until 2002, when he became Commissioner of the Southeastern Conference.

As a prostate cancer survivor, Slive founded the Mike Slive Foundation for Prostate Cancer Research in 2017. The Foundation's mission is to save lives by funding cutting-edge research and by raising awareness of prostate cancer. For more information, please visit: www.MikeSliveFoundation.org

Additionally, the C-USA Board of Directors approved naming the C-USA Athletes of the Year in Mike Slive's honor earlier this summer. The annual awards are announced in June and have been changed to the Conference USA Michael L. Slive Male and Female Athletes of the Year.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

UTSA boasts a youthful team in 2018 with 66 underclassmen, which equates to 60.6 percent of its roster. The Roadrunners have 38 freshmen (21 true/17 redshirt) and 28 sophomores on the 109-man squad list. In the season opener at Arizona State, 24 players made their UTSA debut, including eight who started. There were 13 first-time starters (8 offense/5 defense), while 15 total freshmen (8 true/7 redshirt) saw action in the contest. UTSA has seen a total of 23 first-time starters and 29 debuts this season. Eighteen total freshmen have seen action this season, including 10 true freshmen. Additionally, left guard Spencer Burford is one of just 16 true freshmen in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to have started on the offensive line this season.

TAUAEFA NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

UTSA junior Josiah Tavaeafa was named on Oct. 29 one of 10 semifinalists for the Butkus Award honoring the nation's best collegiate linebacker. He leads the Roadrunners with 77 total tackles, 49 solo stops, 8.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and two forced fumbles to go along with a pair of quarterback hurries this season. The Corinth, Texas, native has registered double-digit tackles three times and has tallied 34 combined stops in the last three contests. Finalists for the Butkus Award will be unveiled on Nov. 19 and the winner will be announced on or before Dec. 4.

HONORS ROLL IN FOR SACKETT

Last week, UTSA sophomore Jared Sackett was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award for the second straight season and he was announced as a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, which is given to the most outstanding football player in America who began his career as a walk-on. The Fort Worth native is 14-for-17 on field goals, including 9-of-12 from 40-plus yards, and he has made all 14 extra-point attempts this season.

THE POWER (5) OPEN

UTSA opened the season with three consecutive games against Power 5 conference opponents. The Roadrunners debuted at Arizona State on Sept. 1 and hosted Baylor one week later before closing the stretch with a road matchup against Kansas State on Sept. 15. BYU is the only other non-Power 5 team that opened the season with three straight Power 5 opponents (at Arizona [Sept. 1], vs. California [Sept. 8], at Wisconsin [Sept. 15]). Additionally, this marks the second time in four seasons that UTSA faced three consecutive Power 5 teams to open the season, as the 2015 squad played No. 22 Arizona, Kansas State and No. 25 Oklahoma State during the first three weeks.

UTSA QUARTET ON NATIONAL AWARD LISTS

Four Roadrunners have earned their way onto several national awards lists. Senior running back Jalen Rhodes appears on three different lists: Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award and Wuerffel Trophy. Josiah Tauaefa was named one of 10 semifinalists for the Butkus Award for the nation's best collegiate linebacker and the junior linebacker joins Rhodes on the Wuerffel Trophy watch list and also is a candidate for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. Jared Sackett was named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist for the second straight season on Nov. 1 and the sophomore place-kicker also is a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, which is given to the most outstanding football player in America who began his career as a walk-on. Yannis Routsas was added to the Ray Guy Award watch list on Sept. 20 and he was one of 10 semifinalists for the award last season. The senior punter also was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy on Sept. 26.

PAIR GARNERS PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE RECOGNITION

Senior defensive lineman Kevin Strong Jr. and junior linebacker Josiah Tauaefa were named to the Preseason All-Conference USA Team in a vote by the league's 14 head coaches. Strong Jr. was a second-team all-conference selection in 2017 after posting 27 tackles (12 solos), seven tackles for loss, three sacks and four quarterback hurries. Tauaefa, a Freshman All-American, the C-USA Freshman of the Year and a first-team all-league choice in 2016, posted 29 stops, two tackles for loss, a sack, two PBUs and a fumble return for a touchdown despite missing most of four contests during his sophomore campaign.

UTSA PICKED FIFTH IN C-USA WEST DIVISION

In a vote by the league's media, UTSA has been picked to finish fifth in Conference USA's West Division. North Texas is the preseason favorite in the West, followed by Louisiana Tech, UAB, Southern Miss, UTSA and a tie between Rice and UTEP. In the East, 2017 C-USA Champion Florida Atlantic is picked to defend its title, followed by Marshall, Middle Tennessee, FIU, WKU, Old Dominion and Charlotte. The 14th annual Conference USA Football Championship Game, pitting the champions of the East and West Divisions, will be held Saturday, Dec. 1.

FILLING THE TURNOVER BUCKET

The UTSA defense has shown a knack for creating takeaways this season, as the Roadrunners have come up with 18 for the turnover bucket through the first nine contests. The Roadrunners lead Conference USA and rank 16th nationally in turnovers gained and they are second and 15th, respectively, in turnover margin (+7). UTSA has recovered 10 fumbles — which leads the league and stands sixth among all FBS teams — and has picked off eight passes, a figure that ranks sixth in the conference and 47th in the country. Brenndan Johnson, Andrew Martel and Les Maruo have recovered two fumbles apiece and they are in a tie for second in C-USA and 13th in the nation. Junior cornerback Cassius Grady leads all Roadrunners with three interceptions, good for third in the league and 16th in the FBS.

DROPPED FOR A LOSS

The UTSA defense has continued a trend from the last two seasons of dropping opponents for a loss of yards. Through nine games, the Roadrunners have posted 62 tackles for a loss of 201 yards. Their average of 6.9 tackles for loss per game ranks fifth in Conference USA and 31st among all FBS teams. Junior linebacker Josiah Tauaefa leads the way with 8.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage, while sophomore defensive end Lorenzo Dantzler has 6.5 and senior defensive tackle Kevin Strong Jr. and has five. In all, 22 Roadrunners have been involved in a tackle behind the line of scrimmage. Of those 62 TFL, 20 have come in the form of a sack. Tauaefa paces the unit with 3.5 for 28 yards, while Dantzler and sophomore defensive end DeQuarius Henry have three apiece. Last year, UTSA posted 73 tackles for loss (6.6 TFL/game) and 23 sacks, while the 2016 squad set program records with 77 (5.9 TFL/game) and 27, respectively.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

The UTSA offense has scored on 90 percent of its visits to the red zone this season. The Roadrunners have scored 12 touchdowns and six field goals on a total of 20 trips inside their opponents' 20-yard line through the first nine contests. UTSA, which was perfect through the first eight games and 17 trips, ranks second in Conference USA and 21st nationally in red zone offense.

TACKLING MACHINE

Recently named one of 10 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, UTSA linebacker Josiah Tavaeafa has been a tackling machine for the Roadrunners since bursting onto the scene as a redshirt freshman in 2016. The 6-2, 245-pound junior set a school record with 115 tackles en route to being tabbed a Freshman All-American, the 2016 Conference USA Freshman of the Year and a first-team all-conference performer. Despite missing nearly half of his sophomore season, the Lake Dallas High School product still registered 29 stops, two tackles for loss, a sack and a fumble return for a touchdown for a defense that led C-USA in seven statistical categories and ranked in the top five nationally in five. This season, the preseason all-conference pick leads UTSA with 77 tackles (49 solos), 8.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, a pair of forced fumbles and two quarterback hurries. He has registered double-digit tackles in three games with 10 tackles (eight solos) in the opener at Arizona State and a season-best 13 stops versus both Louisiana Tech and Southern Miss. Tavaeafa ranks third in program history with 221 tackles (108 solos) and 10.5 sacks and he stands fourth all-time with 19.5 tackles for loss.

SENIOR STANDOUT NEXT IN LINE

Despite its young history, UTSA has developed a long line of accomplished defensive linemen; four who moved on to the professional ranks, including 2018 NFL First Round Draft pick Marcus Davenport. UTSA senior Kevin Strong Jr. has his sights set on being the next on that list. The Cleveland, Texas, native collected second-team all-conference accolades in 2017 after posting 27 tackles (12 solos), seven tackles for loss, three sacks and four quarterback hurries. The preseason All-Conference USA selection now has 97 career tackles, including 25 for loss (2nd in UTSA history) and 7.5 sacks, three pass breakups, two forced fumbles, a school-record two blocked kicks, one fumble recovery and the third safety in program history when he dropped Texas State quarterback Tyler Vitt in the end zone on Sept. 22.

SENIOR SAFETIES A STEADY HAND IN SECONDARY

UTSA boasts a steady safety duo in seniors Darryl Godfrey and C.J. Levine. The pair has combined for 119 tackles, seven tackles for loss, six pass breakups, a pair of quarterback hurries and a sack through the first nine contests. Godfrey ranks fourth on the team with 54 tackles. The San Antonio O'Connor High School product registered a team-high eight stops — 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage and a sack — against Kansas State and a season-high 11 stops at Southern Miss. Levine, who hails from Port Arthur, Texas, and is set to appear in his 46th career game this weekend, ranks second on the squad with 65 tackles, including 50 solo stops — currently second in C-USA and third on UTSA's single-season list — and 3.5 TFL, to go along with a team-best six PBUs, two QB pressures and an interception. He registered a game-high 10 tackles and three pass breakups in the 20-3 win at Rice and posted a season-best 12 stops and an interception that was returned eight yards for a TD against Southern Miss. With 12 tackles in his last outing against UAB, Levine has produced 41 stops in the last four contests and he now owns 152 tackles, 10 pass breakups and a pair of picks for his career.

RELIABLE RECEIVER

Greg Campbell Jr. has emerged as a reliable receiver for the UTSA passing game this season. The senior leads the team with 37 catches and 375 yards, and he is averaging 10.1 yards per reception and 46.9 yards per game. Campbell opened his final campaign with four receptions for 34 yards at Arizona State and he followed that with 62 yards on four catches in the home opener versus Baylor. The Humble Atascocita High School product hauled in six passes for 41 yards, including his first career touchdown on a 10-yard catch in the fourth quarter at Kansas State, before producing season highs of seven receptions and 71 yards in the 25-21 win against Texas State and four catches for 61 yards in the UTEP victory. He had five catches for 44 yards, including a two-yard TD reception at Southern Miss and six for 62 yards in his last outing at UAB. Campbell, who tied a school record with 10 receptions for 108 yards against Southern Miss last fall, already has surpassed his junior season totals of 27 catches for 300 yards.

RUSHING UP THE CHARTS

Senior running back Jalen Rhodes is rushing his way up several of UTSA's career charts. The Rowlett, Texas, product ranks second in program annals with 1,943 career rushing yards and he is 450 shy of Jarveon Williams' school record of 2,393 yards. Rhodes, who set the program's single-season rushing touchdowns record with nine in 2016, also ranks third in UTSA history with 18 career rushing TDs, just two shy of Glasco's record of 20, and he is tied for second all-time with 20 total scores, a pair behind Glasco's 22. Rhodes also has 410 career carries, the second-highest total in school history. He owns three 100-yard rushing games, including a career-high 174 on 15 totes in the 44-14 win against Texas State last fall.

YOU CAN'T SPELL roUTSAs WITHOUT UTSA

UTSA punter Yannis Routsas has established himself as one of the best at his trade in the conference. The Houston native and Ray Guy Award watch list member owns a pair of school records with a 41.3 career punting average and 234 punts. This season, he is averaging 42.9 yards on 55 punts, and he has pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line 20 times, has boomed 14 punts of 50-plus yards and has induced 14 fair catches. He punted five times in the home opener against Baylor for a 43.0 average, including a career-long 63-yarder, his fourth of 60-or-more yards and the second-longest punt in UTSA history. In the Texas State victory, the Clear Brook High School product averaged 45.7 yards on six punts and booted three of 50-plus yards, including a 53-yard effort that was downed at the 2-yard line and led to a safety on the next play. Routsas was named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week on Oct. 25 after he averaged 47.3 yards on nine punts, pinned Southern Miss inside its own 20 six times (three inside the 10) and boomed five punts of 50-plus yards, including a long of 58. A 2017 Ray Guy Award semifinalist, he ranks second in Conference USA and 37th nationally in punting average. Routsas, who also serves as the Roadrunners' holder, is on pace to eclipse his own UTSA single-season punting average standard of 42.0 set in 2016 and he owns three of the four longest punts in program history. He has 82 punts inside the 20, 40 of 50-plus yards and 73 punts that have resulted in fair catches for his career. Already armed with his bachelor's degree after graduating with a 3.51 GPA in mechanical engineering in May, he was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes the absolute best football scholar athlete in the nation, on Sept. 26.

SPLITTING THE UPRIGHTS

After a successful debut campaign in 2017, UTSA place-kicker Jared Sackett has put together another season worthy of recognition. The Fort Worth native, became the program's second Freshman All-American when he was honored by USA TODAY last fall after setting the school's single-season record with 19 field goals despite only kicking in 10 games. He finished the season ranked third in the FBS in field goals per game (1.9) and ninth in field-goal percentage (.864). This fall, Sackett has earned a spot on the Lou Groza Award semifinalist list for the second straight season. He has made 11 field goals in the last six games and is now 14-for-17 on the year, including 9-of-12 from 40-plus yards. He was 3-for-3 in the 25-21 victory against Texas State and was named C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week for his effort. Sackett also drilled three field goals in the 30-21 triumph over UTEP, including a career-long 51-yarder as time expired in the first half that is tied for the second-longest kick in school history, en route to being named a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week. A former walk-on, the Burlsworth Trophy nominee currently ranks third in Conference USA and 17th in the FBS in field goals per game (1.56) and fourth in the league and 21st nationally in field-goal percentage (.824). Sackett also has made all 14 extra-point attempts this season and he ranks second on UTSA's all-time list for field goals with 33 and for points by a kicker with 136.

UTSA TRIO HAS NFL TIES

Three UTSA players have significant family ties when it comes to relatives who have played in the National Football League (NFL). Junior defensive tackle King Newton is the son of Nate Newton, who was a three-time Super Bowl Champion (1992-93, '95) and six-time Pro Bowl offensive guard (1992-96, '98) for the Dallas Cowboys. Meanwhile, senior wide receiver Marquez McNair is the nephew of the late Steve McNair, who played quarterback in the NFL from 1995-2006 after winning the 1994 Walter Payton Award (NCAA Division I-AA's top player) and finishing third in the Heisman Trophy balloting at Alcorn State. True freshman cornerback Corey Mayfield Jr.'s father was a defensive lineman for the 49ers, Buccaneers and Jaguars.

ROADRUNNERS ROSTER MAKEUP

UTSA's 109-man roster features 20 seniors, 23 juniors, 28 sophomores and 38 redshirt or true freshmen. Eighty-two Roadrunners hail from Texas. There are six players from both Florida and Mississippi along with three from California, Louisiana and Tennessee. The squad is rounded out with a player each from Arizona, Indiana, Kansas, Oklahoma, Nigeria and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

DEGREE IN HAND

Six current Roadrunners already have earned their undergraduate degree. That list includes safety Carl Austin III, cornerback Stanley Dye Jr., quarterback D.J. Gillins, linebacker Les Maruo, running back Jalen Rhodes and punter Yannis Routsas.

TV BIRDS

All 12 of UTSA's regular season games this fall have been selected for broadcast across a total of seven networks, including CBS Sports, ESPN and Fox Sports networks. The Roadrunners, who have seen their last 69 outings appear over the airwaves, will make it 72 straight televised/streamed appearances by the end of the season.

FILLING SEATS

UTSA welcomed 42,071 fans to the Alamodome for the home opener against Baylor on Sept. 8. The attendance figure marked the second-largest home crowd in UTSA history behind the 56,743 fans who watched the inaugural game on Sept. 3, 2011. It also ranks as the largest home attendance figure in Conference USA this season. The next closest is 32,349 for Marshall's home game against North Carolina State on Sept. 22. It also was the biggest crowd to take in a UTSA game at the Alamodome since the 2013 contest against Oklahoma State when 40,977 fans filed into the facility. UTSA leads Conference USA with an average home attendance of 27,877. The Roadrunners now have drawn 1,231,108 fans for 45 all-time home games, an average of 27,358 per contest.

FEW CAN CALL A DOME HOME

The Roadrunners are one of only two FBS teams to play their home games indoors. UTSA, which boasts a 24-21 all-time mark inside the Alamodome, joins Syracuse (Carrier Dome) as the only FBS programs to play in enclosed facilities.

UP NEXT

UTSA will travel to Huntington, W.Va., to face Marshall (5-3, 3-2) on Saturday, Nov. 17. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. CT at Joan C. Edwards Stadium and the game will air on Stadium on Facebook and Ticket 760 AM in San Antonio.

MIAMI (AP) — Alex McGough tossed two third-quarter touchdown passes and the Florida International defense did the rest in a 14-7 victory over UTSA on Saturday.

After a scoreless first half, McGough led the Golden Panthers (6-2, 4-1 Conference USA) on a 15-play, 93-yard drive that ate up 8:26 of the clock. McGough capped the drive with a 13-yard TD pass to Thomas Owens.

FIU needed just one play to score on its next drive. Shermarke Spence recovered a fumble at the UTSA 18-yard line and McGough connected with Shawndarri Phillips for the score and a 14-0 lead.

But the Roadrunners (5-3, 2-3) made a game of it when Dalton Sturm engineered a 10-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a 12-yard scoring pass to Brady Jones with 13:59 left in the game. Sturm put the Roadrunners in position to tie the game when he led them to the FIU 2-yard line, but the Golden Panthers kept UTSA out of the end zone on four straight running plays to preserve the lead. UTSA had one last shot at knotting the score when a short punt gave it the ball at the FIU 40. A pass interference penalty moved the ball to the 25, but Sturm was sacked and then threw three straight incompletions to turn the ball over on downs.

FIU became bowl eligible for the third time in its 16-year history.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Freshman Tyler Johnston III threw three first-half touchdown passes and scored on a 3-yard run to help UAB cruise to a 52-3 win over UTSA on Saturday night for the Blazers' program record seventh consecutive win.

Johnston, making his first collegiate start in place of injured A.J. Erdely, hit Kailon Carter for a 50-yard TD on the opening possession and, after UTSA went three-and-out, connected with Xavier Ubosi on a 22-yard touchdown pass to make it 14-0 midway through the first quarter. Johnston's 31-yard scoring strike to Ubosi made it 28-3 and, one play after Gerrit Prince blocked a punt, Spencer Brown's 4-yard rushing TD gave UAB (8-1, 6-0 Conference USA) a 32-point lead with 12 minutes left in the first half.

Brown finished with 20 carries for 147 yards and two touchdowns and moved into a tie with Erdely atop the program's single-season rushing touchdown list with 13.

The Blazers had school record 668 total yards and their eight wins, which match last season's total, ties the school's single-season record.

UTSA (3-6, 2-3) has lost three in a row.

Introduced as UTSA's head coach on Jan. 15, 2016, Frank Wilson has led the Roadrunners to new heights in his first two seasons at the helm.

Armed with more than a decade of coaching experience in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and a proven track record as a highly successful high school head coach, the New Orleans native has had an immediate impact on UTSA in his short time in the Alamo City.

Wilson's debut campaign made history, as he led the Roadrunners to six wins and the 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl to match the NCAA modern startup program record by reaching a bowl game in their sixth season.

After leading UTSA to a second-place finish in Conference USA's West Division with a 5-3 league ledger that included upset wins against Middle Tennessee (45-25) and Southern Miss (55-32), Wilson saw seven of his players earn all-conference honors. Josiah Taauefa garnered Freshman of the Year, first-team all-conference and all-freshman team accolades at linebacker, while defensive end Marcus Davenport and safety Michael Egwuagu were named to the second team. Long snapper Matt Bayliss, offensive tackle Jevonte Domond, safety Jordan Moore and wide receiver Josh Stewart all collected honorable mention certificates. Additionally, Taauefa was named to the Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America Team, a first for the program.

Wilson guided UTSA to bowl eligibility for the second straight season in 2017. The Roadrunners pulled off another program first when they defeated Baylor, 17-10, in the season opener in Waco for UTSA's first victory against a team from a Power 5 Conference. The Roadrunners also improved to 2-0 all-time against Texas State with a 44-14 triumph in the H-E-B I-35 Showdown and they posted a 9-7 win against Marshall in the home finale.

Six Roadrunners collected all-conference accolades, headlined by C-USA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team defensive end Marcus Davenport, who became UTSA's first-ever NFL First Round Draft pick when he was selected 14th overall by the New Orleans Saints. Bayliss and defensive lineman Kevin Strong Jr. picked up second-team honors, while linebacker La'Kel Bass, safety Nate Gaines and place-kicker Jared Sackett were named honorable mention. Sackett also became UTSA's second Freshman All-American when he was honored by USA TODAY Sports. Additionally, wide receiver Brady Jones garnered Academic All-Conference USA honors and was a semifinalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy.

Wilson came to UTSA after a six-year stint as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at LSU from 2010-15, where he also served as associate head coach for his final four seasons with the Tigers. He also has been an assistant coach at Tennessee (2009), Southern Miss (2008) and Mississippi (2005-07).

While at LSU, he was recognized as the nation's top assistant coach at his position in 2011. Wilson also was named the 2011 Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com, the 2014 NFL.com Top Recruiter in College Football and the 2015 Scout.com SEC Recruiter of the Year.

As the recruiting coordinator at LSU, Wilson led the Tigers to back-to-back top-five recruiting classes in 2014-15 among five total groups that ranked among the top 10 nationally. He served as the lead recruiter for a long list of prominent players, including Odell Beckham Jr., La'el Collins, Jeremy Hill, Jarvis Landry, Tyrann Mathieu, Zach Mettenberger and the nation's No. 1 overall recruit in 2014 in Leonard Fournette, a 2014 Freshman All-SEC honoree and consensus first team All-American a year later.

Overall, Wilson has coached or recruited 36 individuals who have made it to the NFL. That list includes Davenport and Jarveon Williams from UTSA, Beckham Jr., Collins, Fournette, Hill, Landry, Mathieu and Mettenberger along with Lamin Barrow, Kendall Beckwith, Alfred Blue, Will Clapp, Malachi Dupre, Ego Ferguson, Russell Gage, BenJarvus Green-Ellis, Derrius Guice, Jerald Hawkins, Kenny Hilliard, Anthony Johnson, Deion Jones, Arden Key, Kendrick Lewis, Terrance Magee, Ronald Martin, Dexter McCluster, Denarius Moore, Eric Reid, Stevan Ridley, Duke Riley, Trai Turner, Mike Wallace, Spencer Ware and James Wright.

In six seasons at LSU, Wilson developed seven running backs that were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-team All-SEC performers in Fournette, Guice, Hill and Ridley. During his tenure, the Tigers posted a 61-17 overall record, captured the 2011 SEC Championship and appeared in the National Championship Game that same season.

Under his guidance, LSU rushed for at least 200 yards 39 times, including 12 300-yard games. The Tigers also recorded 45 100-yard individual rushing performances and four 1,000-yard individual rushers.

Wilson joined the LSU staff after spending the 2009 season at Tennessee, where he coached the wide receivers under Lane Kiffin.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff, Wilson spent the 2008 season as the running backs coach/recruiting coordinator at Southern Miss under Larry Fedora.

From 2005-07, Wilson served as the running backs/assistant special teams coach at Mississippi, where he recruited prominent future NFL stars Kendrick Lewis and Mike Wallace. He also developed a first-team all-conference running back in Green-Ellis.

Wilson joined the Rebels' staff after serving one year as director of athletics for the New Orleans Public School System after spending three-and-a-half seasons as head football coach and offensive coordinator at O. Perry Walker High School.

Wilson led O. Perry Walker to two District 10-4A championships and the Louisiana Class 4A State Championship game in 2002. He was honored by the NFL as the 2002 Louisiana Coach of the Year and was voted by his peers as the Louisiana Class 4A Coach of the Year. Wilson also was a finalist for the 2002 Nike National Coach of the Year.

During his head coaching stint at O. Perry Walker, Wilson developed 22 players who earned Division I scholarships, including 11 in 2002 to rank as the nation's largest high school class of D-I signees. The 2002 team defeated national-power John Curtis Christian School, 20-0, during the regular season, which snapped a 136-game district winning streak for John Curtis and marked the first time that team had failed to score in 303 consecutive games, a national record.

Wilson spent three years as an assistant coach at Edna Karr High School, also in New Orleans, from 1997-2000. He served as offensive coordinator at Edna Karr during the 1999 season in which the team reached the Class 3A state finals and recorded its best statistical season on offense in the program's history.

Wilson got his start in coaching as a student assistant at his alma mater, Nicholls State, working with the running backs while he finished his degree. While in Thibodaux, Wilson helped coach the first 1,000-yard rusher in school history and was part of the biggest turnaround in NCAA history at the time for the Colonels, who improved from 0-10 in 1995 to 8-2 in 1996.

A three-year letterman at Nicholls State, Wilson earned honorable mention all-conference honors as a running back his sophomore year.

Wilson attended Geneva University in Beaver Falls, Pa., his freshman season, earning conference Freshman of the Year honors as a running back and kick returner. He also earned first team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention NAIA Division II All-American.

Wilson received his bachelor of arts degree in general education from Nicholls State in 1997.

Wilson and his wife, Tiffany, have three children: Alaina, Sabree and Frank IV.

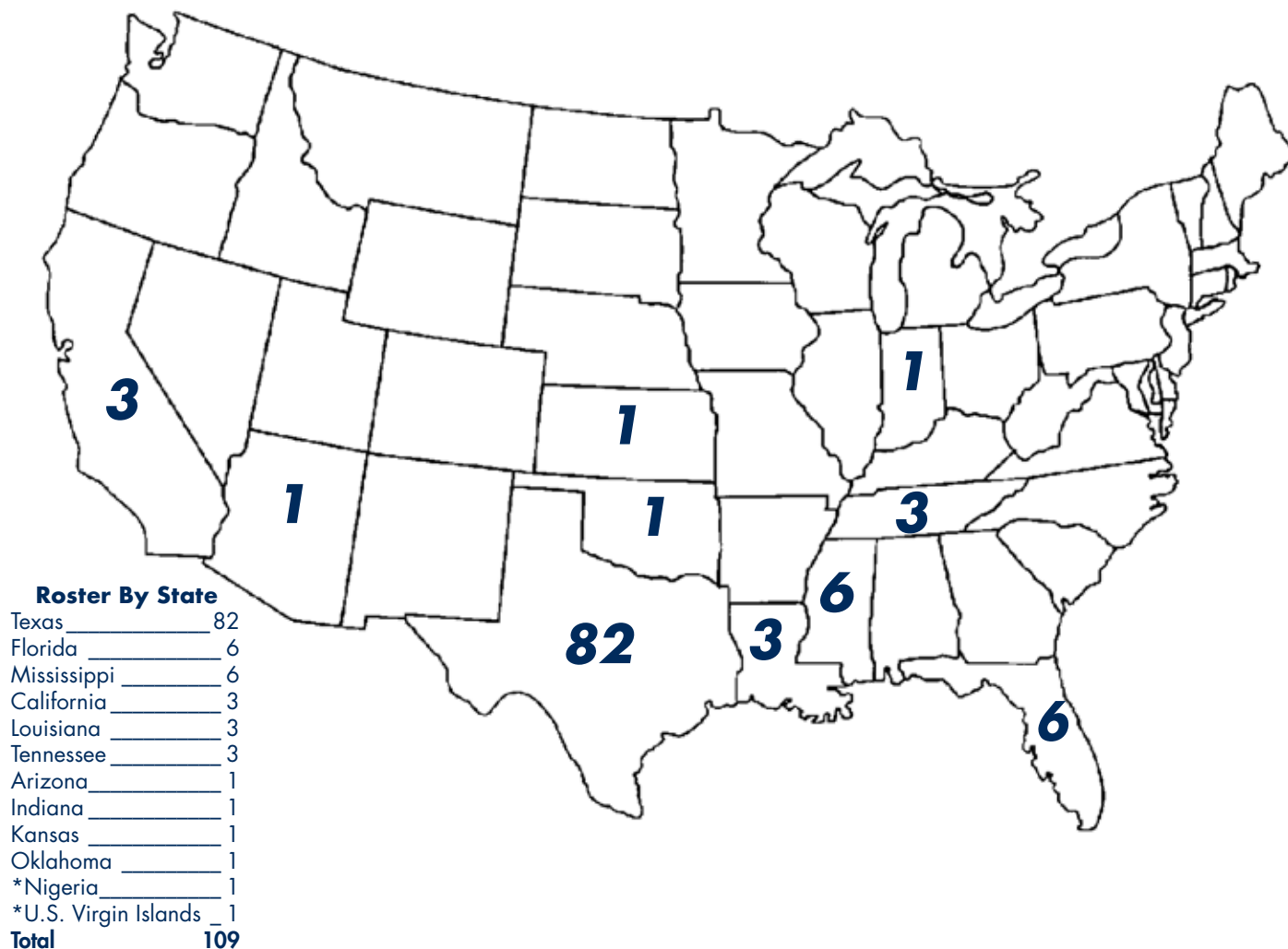
