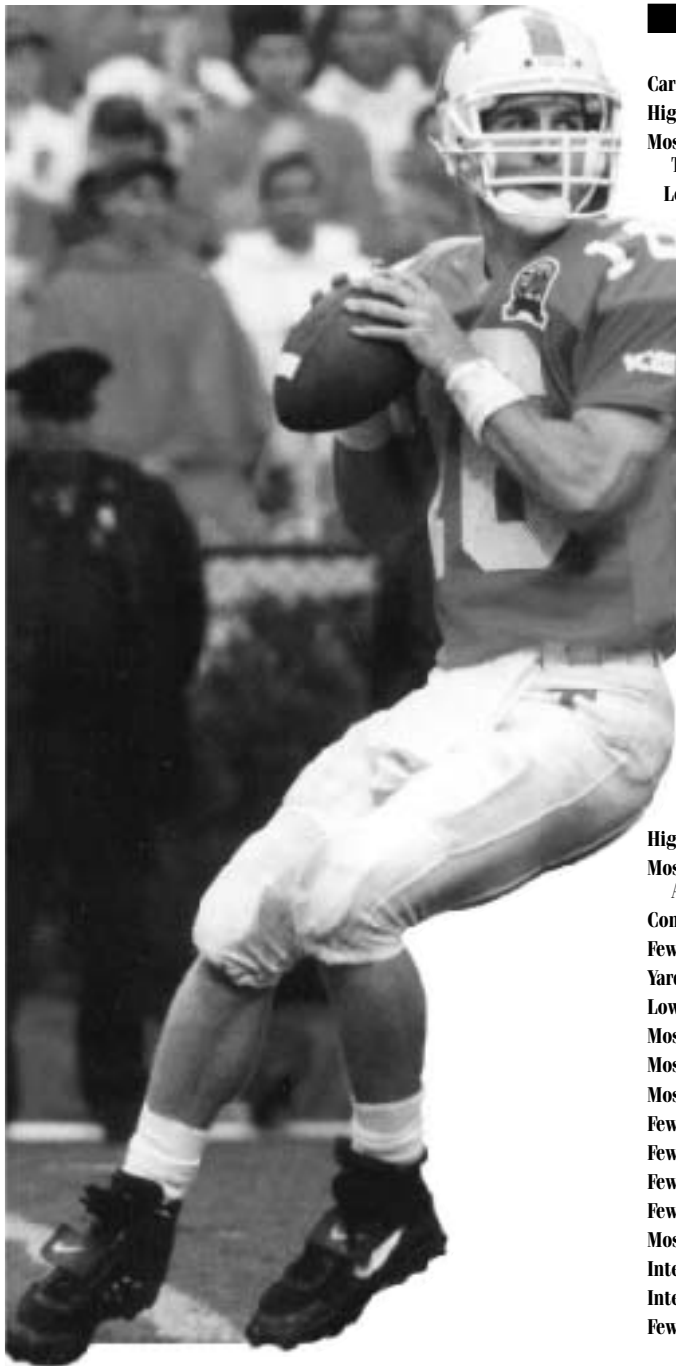


## SEC RECORD HOLDERS/STAT CHAMPIONS

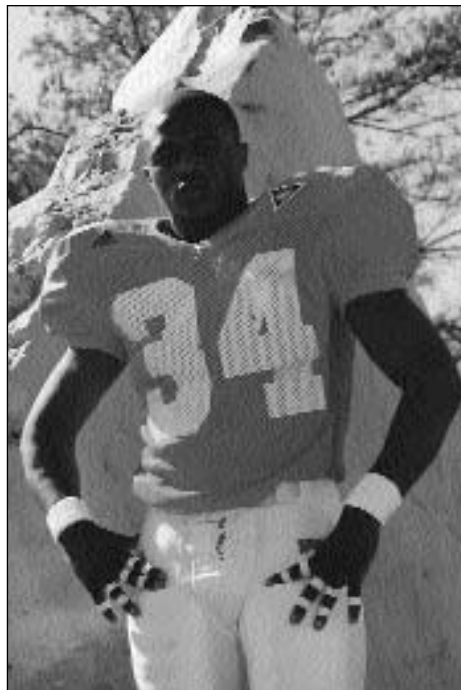
