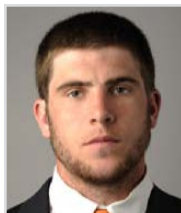

- Games/Starts: 7/7
- Record-setting sophomore QB returned to action against Vanderbilt (11/19) after missing five games with a fractured right thumb, suffered vs. Georgia (10/8)
- Started and led UT to overtime win vs. Vanderbilt 12 days after having cast removed on Nov. 7
- Won first six career starts in regular season
- Overall 8-4 as a starter
- Through seven weeks of the season, ranked eighth in passing yards/game (315.8), 10th in passing efficiency (165.3), 16th in total offense (303.8) and 33rd in passing yards (1579)
- Led the SEC in total offense, passing yards/game and passing efficiency and was third in both total passing yards and pass completions through seven weeks
- Owns UT record for consecutive games with multiple touchdown passes (10), breaking Peyton Manning's record (7) set in 1997
- Saw consecutive games streak with a TD pass (10) end against Georgia (10/8/11). Streak lasted from South Carolina (10/30/10) through Buffalo (10/1/11)
- Prior to Georgia game, was second to Boise State's Kellen Moore (16 at the time) for consecutive games with multiple touchdowns with 10
- Holds UT record for most passing yards in first four games of a season with 1,328, second is Peyton Manning (1,326) in 1997
- Also holds UT mark for most passing TDs in first four games of a season with 14. Manning had 12 to start '97
- Ranks seventh on career touchdown passes list with 35 TD pass. Next on list with 36 are Heath Shuler, Jonathan Crompton and Andy Kelly
- Ranks ninth in career passing yards with 3,832 heading into 2012
- Stands 10th in career completions (272) heading to 2012
- Tied for sixth on UT career list for consecutive games (10) with a TD pass (with Andy Kelly)
- Averaging 294 passing yards in 12 career starts with 300 or more yards in six of those games
- Has thrown at least three TDs in seven of nine career starts and four games with four TDs. Records are: Manning with 16 three-TD games and nine four-TD games
- In seven games in 2011, completed 59.5 of passes (147-of-247) for 1983 yards (283.3 per game) with 16 touchdowns
- Started 2011 without an interception until 86th attempt of the season (at Florida)

- Finished season with 215 passing yards on 15-of-38 with a 53-yard TD pass to Rajion Neal and two interceptions at Kentucky (11/26)
- Returned to action vs. Vanderbilt (11/19) and threw for 189 yards on 16-of-33 with two touchdowns in helping Vols to overtime win and first SEC win of the season
- Threw for 251 yards on 18-of-33 vs. Georgia (10/8) before leaving with a broken thumb in fourth quarter
- Threw for 342 yards on 21-of-30 with four touchdowns vs. Buffalo (10/1) Threw for 248 in the first half alone
- Threw three TDs and for 288 yards on 26-of-48 at #16 Florida (9/17)
- 48 pass attempts at Florida were career-high and the ninth-most in a game at UT
- Set school-record for completion percentage in a game with 82.9, completing 34-of-41 for career-high 405 yards vs. Cincinnati (9/10)
- Became only second player in UT history (P. Manning three times) to throw for 400-plus yards in game with 405 vs. Cincinnati. That mark is fourth-most in a game
- Threw four TD passes vs. UC, marking fifth time in seven games that he had at least three TD passes in a game
- Ran for first-career TD, 1-yard rush for five total TDs
- Career-high 34 completions vs. Cincinnati ranks as sixth-most in a game in UT history, three shy of record 37
- Opened 2011 with TD passes on first two attempts of the season: 47 yards to D. Rogers and 81 to J.Hunter vs. Montana.
- 81-yarder to Hunter tied for ninth-longest pass in UT history
- Threw for 293 yards on 17-of-24 with 3 TDs vs. Montana
- Marked fourth time in six career games with three or more TD passes, vs. Montana
- Career-high single-game completion percentage vs. Montana, completing 70.8 percent (17-of-24)

2010 - FRESHMAN

- Games/Starts: 9/5
- Played in nine games at quarterback and started the final five
- Went 4-1 as a starter, including a sweep through his first four
- Finished regular season 125-of-224 for 1,849 passing yards and 18 touchdowns, all UT freshman records
- Also threw 10 interceptions
- Among freshman Division I quarterbacks, ranked third in QB rating (142.73), tied for fourth in TDs, sixth in passing yards per game (205.4) and 10th in total yards
- Earned SEC Freshman of the Week accolades for three of his four regular-season starting performances to become one of just seven players to garner three or more SEC Player of the Week honors in 2010
- First Vol to earn three individual SEC weekly awards in one season
- Two of those SEC Weekly honors came in his first two career starts, making him one of just six SEC football student-athletes to be honored in consecutive weeks in 2010
- One of just two quarterbacks in the SEC to claim four 300-yard passing performances this season
- First UT QB to compile four 300-yard games in a season

since Peyton Manning in 1997 (nine times)

- In SEC games, Bray ranked sixth in passing average (198 ypg) and pass efficiency (138.2)
- Led 27 scoring drives, the average time of possession being 2:10
- 14 of those drives took less than two minutes (12 of which were TD drives), while 14 took five plays or less
- As a starter, helped team score 16 of 19 red zone trips (.842 success-rate)
- Notched a season-high 354 yards passing against Kentucky while tossing two touchdowns and two interceptions
- 354 yards passing ranked as the eighth-most in the SEC in a single game in 2010
- Became the first UT quarterback to throw multiple TDs in six consecutive games since Manning did so seven times (1/1-10/18/97)
- Completed 27-of-45 (both career highs) for 308 yards, four TDs and three INTs in Music City Bowl vs. North Carolina
- Four TDs tied the UT bowl game record, while 45 attempts were second most and 27 completions tied for the second most
- First UT quarterback to complete passes to nine different WRs in a single game since Erik Ainge (vs. Wisconsin, Outback Bowl, 1/1/2008)
- In his first career start at Memphis, he completed 19-of-33 for 325 yards and a career-high five touchdowns in two-and-1/2 quarters
- Compiled 308 yards and all five of his TD throws in the first half alone vs. the Tigers, shattering UT football records for passing yards and TDs in a single half
- Five-TD performance was one of just two in the SEC in 2010 while 325 yards ranked 14th in the league
- Connected on a career-best eight consecutive throws in the first quarter vs. Memphis
- In first SEC start versus Mississippi, completed 18-of-34 for 323 yards and three TDs, becoming the first UT quarterback ever to throw for 300-plus yards in first two starts and the first in consecutive games overall since Casey Clausen (2001)
- 80-yard strike to Justin Hunter on Vols' first offensive play vs. Ole Miss was UT's longest of 2010 and longest from scrimmage since 2006
- 265 first-half yards ranked ninth all-time for passing yards in a half and made him second UT QB to produce two top 10 performances for most passing yards in one half (Peyton Manning, 4)
- Connected on a career-best eight consecutive throws in the first quarter vs. Memphis
- In his first SEC start on the road at Vanderbilt, Bray completed 16-of-27 for 232 yards, two touchdowns and a pair of INTs
- Between his first throw at South Carolina, an INT returned for a score, and his next INT (at Vanderbilt) that ended a streak of 96 consecutive attempts without a pick, Bray went 58-of-96 for 980 yards and 12 TDs (QB rating: 187.42)
- Led Vols on four scoring drives, including a 3-for-3 success rate inside the red zone at Vanderbilt
- Took over at quarterback in the second half at South Carolina and after first throw was an INT returned for a TD, Bray finished 9-of-15 for 159 yards and a pair of touchdowns
- At Georgia, connected on first four pass attempts and finished 8-for-12 for 81 yards
- Connected on 5-of-14 passes for 39 yards vs. Alabama
- Saw first action in UT's season opener against UT Martin, completing 3-of-6 passes for 24 yards and an INT
