Georgia-Tennessee Series

When Mark Richt took over as Georgia's head coach in 2001, the Bulldogs won four of the first five meetings against Tennessee. However, the Volunteers bounced back in 2006 and 2007, rallying for a 51-33 win in Sanford Stadium in '06 and posting a 35-14 win in Knoxville in '07. But the Bulldogs got back on track in 2008, topping Tennessee 26-14 in Athens. Georgia has won three out of the last four games at Neyland Stadium. Tennessee leads the series 20-16-2 overall and the Bulldogs are 6-8-1 at Neyland Stadium (8-10-1 in Knoxville).

2008 Flashback: #10 Georgia vs Tennessee

Quarterback Matthew Stafford shredded the Volunteers for a career-high 310 yards passing during #10 Georgia's 26-14 win over Tennessee in Athens in 2008. Freshman **Blair Walsh** also set a career high with 14 points after knocking down four field goals, including a 41 yarder, and converting two PATs to lead the Bulldogs. Georgia scored the game's first 13 points and the defense managed to hold the Volunteers scoreless during both the first and fourth quarters. Tailback Knowshon Moreno anchored the running game by recording 101 yards on 27 carries while Tennessee managed only a yard rushing for the game. Also of note on offense, Georgia's Mohamed Massaquoi finished with five catches for 103 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore **Reshad Jones** had five tackles for Georgia's defensive unit.

Bulldogs Out Of USA Today, AP Polls

Georgia has dropped out of the *Associated Press* and the *USA Today* Coaches polls for the first time since Dec. 3, 2006. The Bulldogs finished 9-4 that season after beating #14 Virginia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. Georgia finished 23rd in the final AP poll after topping the Hokies 31-24.

A Rare Unranked Matchup

Saturday's game will mark the first time Georgia and Tennessee play each other and neither team is ranked in the *Associated Press* or *USA Today* Coaches polls since 1937. The Bulldogs and Volunteers have only met 38 times (25 times since the 1937 game) and only started meeting annually since 1992.

On The Road Again

Georgia now starts a three-game swing on the road. The Bulldogs travel to Knoxville, Tenn., to face Tennessee on Saturday before taking on Vanderbilt in Nashville on Oct. 17. Georgia is off on Oct. 24 before meeting #1 Florida in Jacksonville on Oct. 31. The Bulldogs will not return to Sanford Stadium for 35 days until they host Tennessee Tech on Nov. 7.

Green Leading The League In Receiving - Again

Georgia sophomore **A.J. Green** is building on a successful freshman season and is currently leading the SEC in total receiving yards (527), receiving yards per game (105.4) and rec. per game (6.0). His 527 yards ranks 11th in the nation. Green snagged eight catches for 153 yards and a touchdown versus ASU, giving him four career 100-yard games, and was named the *SEC Offensive Player of the Week*. He also blocked his first career field goal late in the fourth quarter against the Sun Devils to help secure the win. Against the Razorbacks, he registered 137 yards on seven catches and a career-high two touchdowns. Green has had at least one TD in all of his last three games and is tied for the league lead with five TD receptions this season. In 2008, Green led the SEC in receiving yardage, yards per game and tied for first in TDs by receivers. He became the first Bulldog to lead the SEC in receiving since Brice Hunter (59 rec., 799 yds., 7 TDs) in 1994.

Did You Know?

• The 2009 season marks the first time since 1970 that the Bulldogs played two out of their first three games on the road.

• Georgia leads the country with 12 consecutive seasons with eight or more wins. Texas and Virginia Tech rank second with 11 each. The next closest team in the Southeastern Conference is LSU with nine.

THE OFFENSE

Cox Has Record-Setting Performance Vs. Hogs

Senior **Joe Cox** tied the school record with five touchdown passes against Arkansas while passing for a career-high 375 yards. Cox was 18-of-25 on the night (72 percent) and his five TDs tied Matthew Stafford (Georgia Tech, 2008), D.J. Shockley (Boise State, 2005) and David Greene (LSU, 2004). Cox had scoring strikes of 21, 25, 50, 44 and 28 yards versus the Razorbacks. He was named the **Walter Camp Foundation National Offensive Player of the Week** and **SEC Offensive Player of the Week**. Against ASU, Cox completed a career-long 56-yard TD to **A.J. Green** and finished with 242 passing yards.



Cox led the Bulldogs on an 18-play, 60-yard TD drive that lasted 7:52 versus #4 LSU. This was the most plays during a TD scoring drive for the Bulldogs since they ran 19 plays covering 87 yards against Tennessee (1988). That drive lasted 8:45. The scoring drive against the Tigers lasted longer than any TD scoring drive since Georgia scored a TD in 8:33 on 16 plays versus Kentucky (1997).

Sophomore quarterback **Logan Gray** is Cox's backup. Gray also returns punts and plays on several special teams for the Bulldogs.

Experienced Front For 2009

The Bulldog offensive line has allowed only five sacks in the team's first five games. Georgia started **Trinton Sturdivant** (LT), **Chris Davis** (LG), **Ben Jones** (C), **Cordy Glenn** (RG) and **Clint Boling** (RT) in their season opener. Sturdivant, who was a Freshman All-American after starting 13 games in 2007 and then missed the 2008 season due to a left knee injury, re-injured his knee at #9 OSU and is out for the rest of the season. Sophomore **Cordy Glenn** has emerged as the starting LT after his play versus ASU. At RT, Boling was named the **SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week** after the 41-37 win over the Gamecocks.

Ealey Joins Competition At Tailback

Freshman **Washaun Ealey** made his debut against #4 LSU and finished with a team-high 33 yards on eight carries. Georgia started the season with sophomores **Richard Samuel** and **Caleb King** in the backfield. Samuel rushed for a career-high 104 yards at Arkansas, including an 80-yard TD run. King was slowed early with a hamstring injury and missed the first two games. He returned against the Razorbacks and had 11 carries for 59 yards.

Paving the way for Georgia's tailbacks will be junior fullbacks **Shaun Chapas** and **Fred Munzenmaier**. Munzenmaier scored his third career TD against ASU. Chapas caught a 1-yard TD strike from Cox against #4 LSU.

Cox's Other Targets

While sophomore **A.J. Green** has been the main target for Bulldog quarterback **Joe Cox** this season, several other receivers and tight ends have also had success. At split end, senior **Mike Moore** equaled his career high with six catches versus Arkansas for 91 yards. Five of Moore's catches gave the Bulldogs a fresh set of downs against the Razorbacks. Although Moore has been relatively quiet during the last two games, he is second on the team with 13 catches for 128 yards and two TDs. **Tavarres King** started his first game against USC and had his first TD catch against Arkansas, a career-long 50 yarder. Against #4 LSU, King had 57 yards receiving on a pair of catches. At TE, sophomore **Aron White** (a 21 yarder) and freshman **Orson Charles** (a 44 yarder) each had a TD catch versus Arkansas.

THE DEFENSE

SEC's Top Returning Tackler Back

Junior WLB **Rennie Curran** leads the Southeastern Conference with 55 tackles in five games. He is the top returning tackler in the SEC after recording 115 stops in 2008. Curran set a new career high with 16 tackles versus #4 LSU in 2009. Earlier in the season, he matched his career high with 15 tackles against USC and had the game-winning pass break-up in the game's final seconds. Junior SLB **Darryl Gamble** had a season-high nine stops versus the Gamecocks. Last time he faced LSU, Gamble tied an NCAA record by returning a pair of INTs for touchdowns and had a career-high 13 tackles. Senior **Darius Dewberry** returned to the lineup against ASU and then matched his career high against #4 LSU with four tackles.

Curran was the first Georgia defender to register 100 tackles in a season since safety Thomas Davis in 2003. Davis tallied 130 that season and eventually earned All-America honors and was a first-round pick in the 2005 draft by the Carolina Panthers, the 14th player selected overall.

Curran was one of four SEC players to have at 100+ tackles in 2008.

Three Seniors Headlining Defense Front

The Bulldog defensive line features three senior veterans as **Jeff Owens** returns from a 2008 injury to rejoin **Geno Atkins** and **Kade Weston**. Owens registered a career-high seven tackles and Weston set a new personal best with five tackles, including a sack, against #4 LSU in 2009. Sophomore **DeAngelo Tyson** also contributed for the Bulldog front after blocking USC's final extra point and forcing the Gamecocks to go for a touchdown in the game's final seconds. Although he was limited during the spring, the Bulldogs welcomed back Owens to the lineup after he suffered a knee injury during last season's opener versus Georgia Southern. Owens bypassed the NFL to return for his senior season in 2009.

Picks Starting To Come For Bulldog Secondary

The Bulldogs' starting unit features senior **Prince Miller** and sophomore **Brandon Boykin** at the cornerbacks and junior **Reshad Jones** and senior **Bryan Evans** at the safeties. Boykin had his second career interception and the team's third of the year to go along with four solo stops versus #4 LSU. He grabbed Georgia's first INT of the season and had four tackles against the Gamecocks. Redshirt freshman safety **Bacarri Rambo** had the Bulldogs' second INT of the season and recorded a career-high four tackles versus ASU. Jones had a season-high 10 tackles (career-high nine solos) against the fourth-ranked Tigers in 2009.

Georgia's rushing defense has forced teams to the air and the Razorbacks touched the Bulldogs for 408 passing yards and five TDs. Currently the Bulldogs are allowing 236.8 passing yards per game. Against OSU, the Georgia backfield was tested immediately against one of the nation's top receivers in Dez Bryant. He managed three catches for 77 yards and two TDs. Junior **Vance Cuff** led all DBs by tying his career high with five stops in that game.

Sack Attack

Georgia had five sacks through the first four games before exploding for six against #4 LSU. Sophomore **Justin Houston** tallied six tackles, including two sacks, versus the Tigers. For the first two games, Georgia's starting defensive ends were junior **Demarcus Dobbs** and senior **Rod Battle**. Battle suffered a season-ending knee injury against USC. However, Georgia got back Houston after he missed the first two games with a suspension. He responded with a career-high seven tackles against Arkansas and then had four tackles, a sack and two TFLs versus ASU, earning himself **SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week** honors.

Dobbs led the defensive ends against #9 OSU by tying his career high with four tackles as Battle tallied three tackles.

Butler Is Nation's Top Punter

With the graduation of Brian Mimbs, redshirt sophomore **Drew Butler** took over the punting duties and has done a stellar job. Butler is averaging an NCAA-leading 49.8 yards on 23 punts. His 57.0 average against #9 OSU is the second-best average for a game since 1958 (Bobby Walden, 63.0). Butler's 75 yarder was the longest since Mimbs booted a 77 yarder in 2008 versus USC. Versus the Razorbacks, Butler booted a 64 yarder to pin Arkansas on its own 9 yard line late in the fourth quarter to help clinch the game for the Bulldogs.

Butler is the son of former NFL standout and Bulldog All-American Kevin Butler. Butler is on Georgia's post-game radio show. Mitch Frix snapped the ball to Butler during the 1981-82 seasons and now Frix's son, **Ty**, snaps to Drew (see next note).

Frix Following In Footsteps

Redshirt freshman **Ty Frix** is starting snapper for the Bulldogs. Frix is a Biomedical Engineering major and was valedictorian at Calhoun HS. Georgia was looking for a new snapper after two-year starter Bo Fowler completed his career. Frix's father, Dr. Mitch Frix, was the starting snapper for Georgia in 1981 and '82 and was member of three SEC championship teams, one national title team and three Sugar Bowl teams.

Walsh Hits First Game Winner

Bulldog sophomore **Blair Walsh** connected on a 37-yard FG to beat ASU as time expired in 2009. This was the first game-winning FG for the Bulldogs since Brandon Coutu drilled one from the same distance to beat Vanderbilt in 2007 (*also a 20-17 win*). Walsh also hit a career-long 53-yard field goal at #9 OSU this year. This was the longest FG for the Bulldogs since Coutu connected on a 55 yarder against UAB in 2006. Walsh's FG was the longest on the road since Hap Hines hit a 54 yarder versus Kentucky in 2006.

Currently, Georgia has 40 former players on 2009 NFL opening day rosters. The Bulldogs were tied for third in the nation with 36 former players on NFL opening day rosters in 2008.

In the last six years, 16 former Bulldogs have helped their teams reach the Super Bowl, including Super Bowl XL MVP Hines Ward.

A total of 26 Georgia players have been NFL first-round draft choices since Frank Sinkwich was taken ninth by the Detroit Lions in the 1943. In 2009, Matthew Stafford was the No. 1 pick overall by the Detroit Lions while Knowshon Moreno went 12th to Denver.

Boykin Takes It To The House

Sophomore defensive back **Brandon Boykin** set a school record against USC by returning a kickoff 100 yards for a TD. This was the longest scoring play for Georgia in Sanford Stadium history. Boykin, who also had an INT in the game, finished with the second-most kickoff return yards in a single game (187), missing the school record by just three yards (Scott Woerner, 1977, Kentucky). Freshman **Branden Smith** also had a 48-yard kickoff return against the Gamecocks. Boykin and Smith are doing a nice job replacing Ramarcus Brown who graduated and finished as Georgia's record holder with a 25.6 career average. The Bulldogs are averaging 22.0 yards per return with Boykin posting a 26.7 average.

Did You Know?

In 2009, Georgia has two TD drives that have lasted more than seven minutes.

There was a 7:11 TD drive versus Arkansas, which at the time was the longest since 1998 (a 7:47 TD drive against Florida, going 80 yards in 17 plays).

Then two weeks later against #4 LSU, the Bulldogs had a 7:52 TD drive covering 60 yards in 18 plays. This marked the longest since 1997 (an 8:33 TD drive vs. Kentucky in 16 plays).

The 18-play TD drive vs. #4 LSU was the most plays in a TD-drive since 1988 vs. Tennessee (19 plays, 87 yards).

5: Touchdown passes by senior Joe Cox against Arkansas to tie the school record, joining David Greene, D.J. Shockley and Matthew Stafford.

6: Georgia's sack total vs. #4 LSU after having just 5 in the first 4 games.

7:52: The duration of Georgia's TD scoring drive vs. #4 LSU, marking the longest TD scoring drive for the Bulldogs since 1997.

25: The number of SEC road wins under Coach Richt. The Bulldogs are 25-4 in an SEC opponent's stadium since 2001.

83: The number of plays South Carolina had against Georgia as the Bulldog won a 41-37 shootout. It was the most plays by an opponent since 2001 when Vanderbilt had 88 in a 30-14 Georgia win.

93: Georgia and Arkansas combined to score 93 points, the second most in a regulation game in school history and fourth overall counting OT games. The teams combined for 1,015 yards of total offense, the most since 2001 when Georgia and Kentucky tallied 1,084.

100: Sophomore Brandon Boykin set a school and Sanford Stadium record with a 100-yard kickoff return in the win over South Carolina. It was the longest touchdown ever scored by a Bulldog "Between the Hedges." He finished with 187 yards on four returns, which ranks as the second best total in school history.

115: Georgia's national ranking out of 120 teams in the Football Bowl Sub-division (FBS) in both turnover margin (-1.8) and penalty yards per game (74.6).

252: Georgia set a school record with 252 kickoff return yards in the win over South Carolina.

1970: Prior to this season, this was the last year Georgia started out with two of its first three games on the road. They went 1-2 that year, losing 17-14 to Tulane in New Orleans, blanked Clemson 38-0 in Athens and fell 7-6 to Miss. State in Jackson, Miss.

The 13th ranked Bulldogs dropped their season opener to 9th ranked Oklahoma State 24-10 in front of a record crowd of 53,012 at Boone Pickens Stadium in Stillwater, Okla., and a nationally televised audience on ABC to start off the year 0-1 for the first time under Mark Richt.

Quarterback Joe Cox began his second career start in fine fashion as he led the Bulldogs on a 10-play 80-yard touchdown drive to open the game. Cox found Michael Moore in the right corner of the end zone from four yards out to put Georgia up 7-0, and that was the last time Georgia would see pay dirt. Cox finished the day 15 for 30 for 162 yards with one touchdown and one interception. A.J. Green led the team in receiving with 4 catches for 52 yards while Richard Samuel took care of Georgia's rushing attack with 87 yards on 20 carries.

Oklahoma State scored 10 points in the final minutes of the first half. A 46-yard pass from Zac Robinson to Dez Bryant tied the game and the Cowboys took the lead on a field goal after Georgia turned the ball over at their own 5-yard line. The Georgia defense held OSU to -5 yards on the first three plays forcing the field goal.

The Bulldogs defense, led by linebackers Rennie Curran and Marcus Dowtin, held the Oklahoma State passing attack to just 135 yards on the day but it wasn't enough as OSU's Robinson took the Cowboys down the field on the opening drive of the second half to go up 17-7 on a Robinson quarterback sneak.

Georgia sophomore kicker Blair Walsh cut the Cowboys led to 17-10 on a career-long 53-yard field goal midway through the third quarter. However, OSU's Robinson connected with Dez Bryant on a 12-yard pass in the 4th quarter to seal the game for the Cowboys.

The loss was the first season-opening loss for head coach Mark Richt, and was Georgia's first opening day loss since they fell to Southern Mississippi 11-7 in 1996.

The Georgia Bulldogs outlasted the South Carolina Gamecocks 41-37 Saturday night under the lights in Athens, in front of a raucous home crowd of 92,746 fans at Sanford Stadium. The game ended on an incomplete tipped pass from South Carolina quarterback Stephen Garcia on the Bulldogs four yard line. Sophomore linebacker Rennie Curran was responsible for the deflection and let the play cap his personal best, as he finished with fifteen tackles in addition to his late game heroics.

The game got off to a fast and furious start in the first quarter, as South Carolina and Georgia matched touchdowns with the Gamecocks engineering a scoring drive off of an A.J. Green fumble for Georgia, and sophomore defensive back Brandon Boykin's own answer. Boykin took a kickoff back 100 yards for a score and new Sanford Stadium longest play record, and would complement his efforts with a second quarter interception of Garcia. The Bulldogs didn't just look to Boykin for big plays, however, as freshman defensive back Branden Smith made the most of an appearance on the offensive side of the ball with a 61 yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Georgia would also get offensive help from some more familiar names in the second quarter, as running back Richard Samuel found his way into the endzone, along with A.J. Green on a nine yard reception from quarterback Joe Cox. Cox would have two touchdown passes on the night, with senior Michael Moore serving as the recipient of another in the third quarter. Cox's third touchdown pass of the evening went the wrong direction, as Gamecock linebacker Eric Norwood intercepted a pass in the fourth quarter and returned it for a touchdown. However, the extra point was blocked by Georgia defensive tackle DeAngelo Tyson, proving to be an important play as South Carolina was then forced to execute an unsuccessful touchdown drive to end the game.

Cox finished 17 of 24 for 201 yards and two touchdowns to go along with one interception. Smith's 61 yard run was enough to propel him to the top of Georgia's rushing leaderboard for the night, equaling Richard Samuel with 65 yards and one touchdown. A.J. Green hauled in six passes for 86 yards and a touchdown. Rennie Curran led all tacklers with fifteen stops, and safety Reshad Jones and linebacker Darryl Gamble each contributed with nine. Sophomore kicker Blair Walsh added to Georgia's scoring total with two field goals of 50 and 42 yards, and connected on five successful extra point attempts.

The Georgia football team outmatched the hosting Arkansas Razorbacks on Saturday, September 19th, by a score of 52 to 41 in front of a sell-out crowd of 74210 at Reynolds Razorback Stadium. Georgia's scoring total was their highest output on the season, and propelled them to a 2-1 record. The Bulldogs were led by a career best day from quarterback Joe Cox, who threw a school record tying five touchdown passes to go along with 375 yards through the air.

Like the script from the previous game versus South Carolina, Georgia found itself in an early 21-10 hole after two turnovers gave the Razorbacks two touchdowns. However, running back Richard Samuel, himself guilty of a first quarter transgression, atoned for his fumble by rocketing his way to an 80-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter. A 25-yard touchdown strike to AJ Green with just under two minutes remaining in the first half would give the Bulldogs a lead they would relinquish two more times in a true seesaw battle on their way to victory.

Cox was not the only Bulldog to have a career night, as freshmen Orson Charles and Tavarres King each caught their first touchdowns on 44 and 50 yard strikes, respectively. AJ Green also has two scores and tight end Aron White had one to help add to the Bulldogs' high offensive total. Running back Caleb King saw his first action on the season in a return from a hamstring injury and added 59 yards on the ground to go with Samuel's 104 and touchdown. Linebacker Rennie Curran paved the way for the Georgia defense with 11 tackles, while defensive end Justin Houston added seven in his first action on the season.

The Georgia Bulldogs defeated the Arizona State Sun Devils 20-17 in front of a rain-soaked Sanford Stadium crowd of 92,746 on a last second field goal by kicker Blair Walsh. The win raised Georgia's record to 3-1 (2-0 SEC) and provided some much needed relief for fans who had stayed to watch the game despite torrential pre-game conditions. Offensively, Georgia was led by wide receiver A.J. Green, who hauled in eleven receptions for 153 yards and one touchdown. Besides his impressive numbers in the box score, Green wowed Georgia fans with several spectacular catches, but perhaps his most impressive play came in the form of a game saving block of an Arizona State field goal attempt that would've given the Sun Devils the lead with 4:31 remaining in the game.

The Bulldogs jumped out to an early 14-3 lead with scores on a career long 56 yard touchdown reception by Green from quarterback Joe Cox and a two yard touchdown run from fullback Fred Munzenmaier. The Sun Devils took the lead 17-14 with 5:25 remaining in the third quarter after a Dimitri Nance touchdown run and a 47 yard interception return by safety Jarrell Holman, the first of his two interceptions of Joe Cox on the evening. Georgia evened the score with 14:53 left in the 4th after a 21 yard Blair Walsh field goal, and would maintain that tie until Walsh's game-terminating kick.

Quarterback Joe Cox was 17 of 31 through the air for 242 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions in his third consecutive victory as the Georgia starter. Caleb King added 55 yards rushing on eleven carries to lead all Bulldog rushers. Linebacker Rennie Curran had his fourth consecutive game leading Georgia tackles with six stops, and redshirt freshman safety Baccarri Rambo secured the Dogs's second interception on the year in the second quarter.

Georgia has fallen behind in all four of its games this season and has rallied to win its past three, however the deficits against South Carolina and Arkansas came in the first quarter and were by double digits.

The Georgia Bulldogs fell to the visiting Louisiana State Tigers on Saturday, losing on a late 33 yard touchdown run by LSU's Charles Scott in front of a capacity 92,746 stunned Sanford Stadium fans. The loss was Georgia's first in the South-eastern Conference on the season and dropped their record to 3-2 (2-1). Albeit the losing effort, the game was played very tight by both teams and certainly not devoid of late game heroics and drama.

Leading 6-0 at the start of the fourth quarter, LSU could not stop an 18 play, 60 yard drive by the Georgia offense that was punctuated by a one yard Shaun Chapas touchdown reception from quarterback Joe Cox. Leading 7-6, Georgia succumbed to a 13 play, 88 yard drive of LSU's that ended with a two yard Charles Scott touchdown scamper. After a failed two point conversion, LSU led 12-7 with 2:53 left. Georgia then marched down the field in just 1:38 and regained its lead as Joe Cox hauled in a spectacular 16-yard touchdown pass from Cox, but was flagged for a controversial excessive celebration penalty that would be enforced on the following kickoff. Following a solid return by LSU's Trindon Holliday, the Tigers took the ultimate lead 20-13 after Scott's 33 yard scoring rush with 46 seconds remaining. The loss overshadows solid play by the Georgia defense, led by linebacker Rennie Curran who accumulated 16 tackles, and defensive end Justin Houston, who had two of Georgia's six sacks on the day. Cox finished the afternoon 18-34 with two touchdowns and one interception, and A.J. Green led all receivers with 99 yards on five receptions. Freshman Washaun Ealey led the Bulldogs' ground game in his first career appearance, netting 33 yards on eight carries.

- Georgia was held scoreless through three quarters for the first time since the Colorado game in 2006. Quarterback Joe Cox came off of the bench to lead the Bulldogs to a 14-13 victory over Colorado.

- Georgia's 18-play touchdown drive in the fourth quarter lasted 7:52. This was the most plays during a TD scoring drive for the Bulldogs since they ran 19 plays covering 87 yards against Tennessee in 1988. That drive lasted 8:45. Today's scoring drive lasted longer than any TD scoring drive since Georgia scored a TD in 8:33 on 16 plays against Kentucky in 1997.

- Georgia held LSU to just three points during the Tigers' first three trips to the Red Zone and 10 points total in four trips. Georgia's first stop came on an interception by sophomore Brandon Boykin in the first quarter. Georgia also held LSU on a fourth-and-1 late in the second quarter on Georgia's 10-yard line. The Bulldogs have held opponents to nine field goals in 20 trips to the Red Zone.

It was a little fast and furious there at the end. The bottom line is we didn't do enough to win it. We always believe we can win, even to the bitter end, but it just didn't happen."
