- Was Tennessee's second-leading rebounder during the team's three-game European exhibition tour, pulling down 9.0 boards per game.

2016-17 - SOPHOMORE

- Played in all 32 games, earning 23 starts while averaging 14.0 mpg. Finished the year averaging 3.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game.
- Led the Vols with two blocked shots against Georgia (3/9/17) in the SEC Tournament.
- Played 26 minutes at South Carolina (2/25/17), tying for the team lead in rebounds with eight and posting a game-high three blocks.
- Posted six rebounds in UT's 90-70 win over Missouri (2/18/17).
- Led the Vols with nine rebounds (six offensive) against Georgia (2/11/17); also posted six points and a block.
- Heavy on hustle plays in the win vs. Ole Miss (2/8/17), logging five rebounds and three blocks in just 13 minutes of action.
- Controlled the glass in a home win over Kansas State (1/28/17), grabbing a game-high nine rebounds in just 18 minutes of action; also finished with eight points.
- Started and played 20 minutes at Ole Miss (1/17/17), finishing with six points, six rebounds and a block.
- Started in the win at ETSU (12/22/16), scoring six points to go along with five rebounds and two blocks.
- One of four Vols to pull down five or more rebounds against No. 8 Gonzaga in Nashville (12/18/16), finishing with six.
- Recorded a team-high three blocks in a 90-50 rout of Presbyterian (12/11/16).
- Knocked down his first career 3-pointer in Tennessee's 95-81 win over Chaminade on the final day of the Maui Invitational (11/23/16).
- Led the team with six rebounds against No. 16 Wisconsin at the Maui Invitational (11/21/16).
- In the Appalachian State win (11/15/16), he set a new career-high in scoring for the second time in as many games, as he finished with 13 points.
- Opened his sophomore campaign with a then-career-best seven points to go along with eight rebounds, four blocks and a steal as he drew a starting assignment vs. Chattanooga (11/11/16).

2015-16 - FRESHMAN

- Earned a spot on the 2015-16 First-Year SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- Appeared in 32 games during his freshman campaign, logging 11 starts and a 12.2 minutes per game average along the way.
- Averaged 1.7 points and 3.2 rebounds per game and ranked second on the team with 31 total blocked shots (0.97 bpg).
- Posted a team-high two blocks in Tennessee's 38-point romp over Auburn (3/9/16) in the opening game of the SEC Tournament.
- Tallied four blocks against Arkansas (2/27/16), three of which came on three consecutive defensive possessions midway through the first half.
- Matched his season-best scoring effort with six points and grabbed a team-best seven rebounds in 25 minutes at Missouri (2/13/16)—his second game of the season of 25-plus minutes.
- Showed glimpses of a rapidly developing offensive game when he knocked down a turnaround jumper—a shot he had been working on all season—off the left block in UT's rout of Auburn (2/9/16).
- Made the third start of his career in Tennessee's comeback win over 20th-ranked Kentucky (2/2/16).
- Tied Tennessee's single-game record with six blocks at TCU (1/30/16); also pulled down a season-best 11 rebounds in 31 minutes of action in Fort Worth.
- Each of his team-high three blocks against Vanderbilt (1/20/16) came against players standing 7-0 or taller.
- Made his first career start vs. ETSU (12/22/15) and posted three blocks for the third consecutive game (and fourth in five games).
- Tallied two points, six rebounds, and three blocks in 22 minutes of action vs. Gonzaga (12/19/15) at the Battle in Seattle.
- Logged 22 minutes against Florida Atlantic (12/16/15), finishing with a season-high six points, five rebounds, and three blocks.
- Pulled down five rebounds and swatted three shots in 15 minutes vs. Nebraska (11/28/15) at the Barclays Center Classic in New York City.
- Recorded his first career field goal on an offensive rebound and put-back in the second half against Army West Point (11/24/15).
- Recorded his first collegiate point, a free throw during UT's victory over Gardner-Webb (11/22/15).
- Made his collegiate debut in Tennessee's season-opening win over UNC Asheville (11/13/15) and grabbed three rebounds in five minutes off the bench.

2016-17 - FRESHMAN

- Appeared in 23 games during his freshman campaign after missing nine non-conference games with a left foot injury. Averaged 7.2 ppg while shooting 37.2 percent from the field and posted a team-best 2.9 apg (66 total assists).
- Was a part of the highest-scoring freshman class in program history (1,040 points).
- Owned a team-best 1.77 assist/turnover ratio in SEC play.
- Led the Vols in scoring four time during his debut season, including a team-high 14-point and five-assist effort in the SEC Tournament against Georgia (3/9/17).
- Matched his season-high with four made 3-pointers against the Bulldogs in Nashville—his third game of multiple threes on the year. Those three games accounted for 10 of his 14 made 3-pointers on the year as he went 14-of-46 (.304) from deep.
- Handed out six assists to just one turnover in UT's 90-70 win over Missouri (2/18/17).
- One of the few bright spots for Tennessee at Kentucky (2/14/17), finished with 15 points, four rebounds and two assists in a season-high 32 minutes.
- Handed out a team-high five assists against Ole Miss. (2/8/17).
- Led Tennessee in both points and rebounds at Mississippi State (2/4/17), scoring 13 points and securing a season-high eight boards.
- Recorded five assists versus just one turnover in Tennessee's win over Kansas State (1/28/17).
- Scored eight points, handed out four assists and grabbed six rebounds in a home win over Mississippi State (1/21/17).
- Erupted for a season-best 23 points at Vanderbilt (1/14/17)—his first collegiate game in his hometown—going 8-of-12 from the field and 4-of-5 from three. Also dished out a game-high five assists.
- Swiped a season-high three steals against South Carolina (1/11/17).
- Distributed a game-high eight assists and also logged seven points and two steals in the Vols' home win over Appalachian State (11/15/16).
- Started the season-opener vs. Chattanooga (11/11/16) and scored a team-high 21 points, marking the sixth-best scoring output by a Vol in his freshman debut.

HIGH SCHOOL

- Graduated from The Ensworth School in Nashville, Tennessee, where he was coached by Ricky Bowers.
- Bone helped lead the Tigers to the state championship game in 2016, the semifinals in 2015 and also played on Ensworth's back-to-back state championship squads as an underclassman in 2013 and 2014.
- Ensworth went 83-37 during Bone's four-year varsity career.
- As a senior, he was a finalist for Tennessee's DII-AA Mr. Basketball Award, and he also earned Division II All-State honors from the Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA).
- Averaged 20 points, four rebounds, five assists and two steals per game while leading Ensworth to a 23-6 record as a senior.
- Led Ensworth to the championship at the Gulfshore Holiday Hoopfest in Naples, Florida, in December of 2015, scoring 22 points in the title game on his way to being named the 18-team tournament's Most Valuable Player.
- As a junior in 2014-15, he earned Division II-AA All-State honors from the TSWA after averaging 17 points, four rebounds, three assists and three steals.

FRESHMAN - 2016-17

- Appeared in 30 games and earned 28 starts during his freshman campaign, averaging 7.9 ppg, 2.9 rpg and swiping a team-high 27 steals (0.9 spg).
- Was a part of the highest-scoring freshman class in program history (1,040 points).
- His 22.8 mpg ranked third on the team, trailing only senior Robert Hubbs III (31.6 mpg) and fellow freshman Grant Williams (25.4 mpg).
- Shot a team-best .841 at the free-throw line (53-of-63).
- Made 35 3-pointers on the year, including 17 in SEC play—both ranked second on the team.
- Played just one minute against Missouri (2/18/17) and missed the Vanderbilt (2/22/17) and South Carolina (2/25/17) games due to illness. Those absences halted a streak of six consecutive games in which he played 30-plus minutes.
- Averaged 7.3 ppg and 2.8 rpg and posted the team's best free-throw percentage (.811, 30-of-37) during SEC play.
- Played a team-high 32 minutes in UT's SEC Tournament game against Georgia (3/9/17), finishing with seven points, three rebounds, two assists and a steal.
- Back in the starting lineup in the win over Alabama (3/4/17), he dished out a season-best six assists in 22 minutes.
- Made his return to action at LSU (3/1/17) after missing two games due to illness, promptly knocking down two 3-pointers and a pull-up jumper to finish with eight points—all of which came in the first half.
- Tied his career high in rebounds with seven against Ole Miss (2/8/17), scoring 14 points including a clutch three-pointer with under a minute left to secure the win.
- Went 4-of-5 from the field in the second half of UT's win at Auburn (1/31/17), scoring all 15 of his points in the second period. Also chipped in three steals.
- Played 32 minutes and scored 13 points in Tennessee's win over Kansas State (1/28/17). Eleven of his 13 came in the first half.
- Scored 12 of his 14 points in the second half to help the Vols beat Mississippi State (1/21/17); also notched seven rebounds.
- Made three 3-pointers en route to 14 points at Ole Miss (1/17/17). Also notched a team-high two steals.
- Went 3-of-5 from distance en route to 15 points at Florida (1/7/17). Also matched his season-high with three steals against the Gators.
- Scored nine points vs. Tennessee Tech (12/13/16) and his rim-rocking alley-oop slam off an in-bounds pass landed at No. 3 on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.
- Named SEC Freshman of the Week after averaging 16.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game against Presbyterian (12/6/16) and No. 7 North Carolina (12/11/16).

- Scored 12 points against seventh-ranked North Carolina, including 10 points in the first half on 4-of-5 shooting and 2-of-3 from beyond the arc.
- Dropped a season-best 21 points against Presbyterian (12/6/16), knocking down five treys along the way. Scored 11 consecutive points on four straight possessions in the second half, hitting three straight 3-pointers and capping the flurry with a steal and a breakaway dunk.
- Started all three games at the Maui Invitational, playing a season-high 36 minutes against No. 13 Oregon (11/22/16) and scoring 11 points to go along with six rebounds against host Chaminade (11/23/16).
- Earned the starting nod in just his second game as a Vol, scoring 14 points in 22 minutes of action vs. Appalachian State (11/15/16); he drained four first-half 3-pointers against the Mountaineers.
- Made his collegiate debut in the Vols' opener vs. Chattanooga (11/11/16), grabbing one rebound off the bench.

PREP SCHOOL

- Attended 22 Feet Academy of Shannon Forest Christian School in Greenville, South Carolina, where he was a member of the academy's National Team, coached by Ryan Schmidt.
- Averaged 17 points, 6.8 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game while leading 22 Feet to a 26-9 record.
- Drew interest from several high major programs after a 30-point performance at the Tarkanian Classic in Las Vegas in December of 2015 and also raised his stock at the Legacy Nissan Classic in London, Kentucky, earlier that same month.
- 22 Feet handed national powerhouse Oak Hill (Va.) Academy its only loss of the season, posting a 70-67 victory at the Phenom Hoops Showcase in Lewisville, North Carolina, on Nov. 14, 2015.
- Was a teammate of South Carolina signee Sedee Keita and Mississippi State signee Eli Wright.

HIGH SCHOOL

- Graduated from Carter High School, in Strawberry Plains, Tennessee, where he was coached by Joby Boydstone.
- His performance as a senior in 2014-15 earned him All-State and District 3-AA MVP recognition, along with the nod for the *Knoxville News Sentinel's* 2015 PrepXtra Boys Basketball Player of the Year (the first player from Carter ever to receive that honor).
- Totaled 932 points as a senior in 2014-15, shot 55 percent from the field and averaged 26.6 points, 8.9 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game.
- During his senior season, the Hornets advanced to the quarterfinals of the Class AA tournament, where—despite 26 points from Bowden—they suffered a 74-69 loss to eventual champion Haywood County; Carter's final record stood at 27-8.
- Bowden was held to fewer than 15 points in only four games in 2014-15, but he scored 30 or more 14 times; known for playing above the rim, he reeled off 10 consecutive double-doubles early in the season.
- Erupted for a school-record 54 points against Gibbs High School on Jan. 30, 2015; it was the first of two 50-plus-point performances on the year.
- Also led Carter to the Class AA state tournament as a junior in 2013-14.

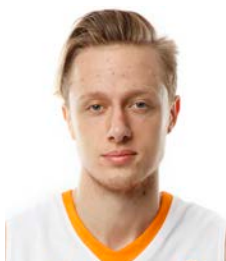
