**2005** - Games/Started: 5/5 ... Posted a game-high 14 tackles in the Vols' season-opener vs. UAB ... Stellar day vs. the Blazers included one TFL and 13 solo stops ... Was rarely tested during the game at Florida and logged just three tackles, including an impressive sack for a 10-yard loss to kill UF's first drive of the game ... Totaled eight tackles in the overtime win at LSU ... Tallied seven tackles and one TFL vs. Mississippi ... Suffered a season-ending hip injury while tackling Georgia tight end Leonard Pope in the second quarter of the Vols' loss to the Bulldogs Oct. 8.

**2004** - Games/Started: 13/13 ... Elected team captain for 2004 season ... Led the SEC in tackles with 123 tackles for a 9.5 per-game average ... Had 88 solo stops -- good for sixth in Division I-A ... Became the first non-linebacker to lead the Vols in tackles since defensive team recrods began in 1970 ... Allen and defensive end Parys Haralson are the second set of junior captains in as many years ... Was the Vols' only returning starter in the defensive secondary ... Named by league coaches as a first-team All-SEC performer ... Allen is on pace to be the first defensive back in Tennessee history to lead the team in tackles (defensive statistics were first kept in 1970) ... Was the SEC's top tackler during the regular season, averaging 9.8 tackles per game ... Tallied five stops in the Vols' opener vs. UNLV ... Made the switch to free safety during the Vols' bye week before the Florida game ... Improved his career-high for tackles when he totaled 14 stops (and a sack) against Florida ... The La. Tech game marked his second straight 10-tackle outing, as two TFLs highlighted his 10-tackle effort ... Posted double-digit tackles for the third straight outing when he totaled a team-high 14 stops against Auburn ... Ranked first in the SEC in tackles with 10.8 per game following the games of Oct. 2 ... Made three tackles and broke up a pass vs. Georgia ... At Mississippi, he posted seven tackles (all solo) and broke up a deep pass along the sideline that could have potentially gone for a touchdown ... Also forced and recovered a Rebel fumble ... Made big plays all game long against Alabama, finishing with a game-high 15 tackles (10 solo) and a pair of PBUs ... Recognized as the Walter Camp National 1-A Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts vs. the Crimson Tide ... The South Carolina game marked his second consecutive 15-tackle game, and his fifth double-digit tackle outing of the season ... Logged 10 stops against Notre Dame ... Totaled a team-high nine tackles at Vanderbilt and also made his second INT of the year ... Jumped back up to double digits by logging 10 stops vs. Kentucky ... Sustained a gash that required stitches in the first half of the SEC Championship Game vs. Auburn but returned to make six tackles ... Forced one of four Texas A&M fumbles in the Vols' SBC Cotton Bowl triumph ... Finished the Cotton Bowl with five tackles.

Had 12 tackles against Tide while also tallying two PBUs and a crucial blocked field goal (first career) ... Was defensive stalwart in Vols' victory at Miami, leading team with 11 tackles and one forced fumble ... Also recorded PBU against Hurricanes, denying UM tight end Kellen Winslow in end zone on final play of first half ... Ended season with eight-tackle, two-PBU effort vs. Clemson.

Came off the bench in UT's season-opener vs. UAB and completed 17 of 24 passes for 217 yards with one TD and one INT (which was bobbled by the intended receiver) ... His lone TD toss against the Blazers was a 12-yard strike to C.J. Fayton, and he also connected with Fayton for a 53-yard bomb later in the game ... Earned the starting nod when the Vols traveled to Gainesville to face No. 6 Florida ... Started at Florida but led the Vols for just three offensive drives during the game ... Completed two passes for no yards vs. the Gators and was sacked once ... Orchestrated an outstanding come-from-behind win at LSU (where he began his college career in 2002) ... Entered the game vs. the Tigers in the second quarter as the Vols were faced with a 21-0 uphill battle ... Completed 21 of 32 passes for 250 yards and one TD while also rushing for a score ... After the Vols completed the comeback with a 30-27 final score in OT, Clausen was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week ... Missed the season-finale at Kentucky due to a knee injury suffered during the final play of the Vanderbilt contest one week earlier.
