CAREER - Games/Started: 42/4

2006 - Games/Starts: 11/3 ... Named game captain prior to the Marshall and Arkansas games ... Had one reception for nine yards and one rush for nine yards against California before leaving the game with injury ... Missed Air Force game because of a concussion ... Returned to the lineup against Florida catching four passes for 35 yards ... Caught three passes for 41 yards versus Marshall ... Seven-yard reception in the fourth quarter for a touchdown was first of the season ... Finished Memphis game catching five passes for 46 yards and one touchdown ... Got Tennessee on the board when he hauled in a 16-yard pass from Erik Ainge in the first quarter against Georgia ... Caught seven passes for 94 yards and a touchdown against the Bulldogs ... Led the team with a career-high 95 yards receiving against Alabama ... Had both of Tennessee's receiving touchdowns in win over South Carolina ... Finished with four catches for 23 yards and two touchdowns against the Gamecocks ... Returned to his home-state of Arkansas and made four catches for 62 yards and one touchdown ... 39-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter put him over the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career ... Caught two passes for 29 yards at Vanderbilt ... Finished with two catches for 19 yards versus Kentucky ... Ruled academically ineligible for the postseason and did not play in the Outback Bowl against Penn State ... Selected to play in the Hula Bowl Jan. 14, 2007, in Honolulu, Hawaii.

2005 - Games/Starts: 11/1 ... Tied for team lead with three receiving TDs ... Led Vols' receiving efforts at Florida with four catches for 27 yards, including 8-yard TD grab ... Also had catch overturned during Florida game on what was first use of instant replay in history of Tennessee football ... Caught three passes for 38 yards at LSU, including 8-yard TD ... Totaled 17 yards on three catches versus Mississippi ... Caught four passes for career-high 85 yards against Georgia ... Had 10-yard reception versus South Carolina ... Caught 7-yard TD pass at Notre Dame and 2-point conversion pass in third quarter to tie game at 21 ... Three catches for 21 yards at Kentucky.

2004 - Games/Starts: 13/0 ... Led Vols with five TD receptions ... Two receptions for 34 yards against Florida, including fingertip catch near goal line for six points ... Caught three passes for 78 yards and two TDs vs. Louisiana Tech ... Only catches at Georgia and Mississippi were for touchdowns ... After UT's first six games, had five TDs on only 10 receptions ... Fielded onside kick late in South Carolina game and ran 44 yards for TD ... Finished with catches in 12 of 13 games ... Missed most of 2004 spring practice with toe injury and underwent surgery in April.

2003 - Games/Starts: 7/0 ... Did not play until contest against Florida, but first career catch was 57-yarder to Florida 1-yard line ... Scored first career touchdown in closing minutes of Georgia game ... Underwent surgery to repair torn ligament in thumb after injuring it against Georgia ... Missed Alabama, Duke and Miami games before returning for Mississippi State contest.

HIGH SCHOOL - Parade and SuperPrep All-America ... Selected as No. 1 overall prospect in Arkansas by SuperPrep and Rivals.com ... Selected to Class 3A All-State Team ... Played in U.S. Army All-American Bowl ... Capped senior season with 62 receptions for 1,162 yards ... Finished junior year with nearly 1,900 yards receiving on 103 catches, including 23 touchdowns for Arkansas' 3A champions.
