KEY STORYLINES

PRUITT ERA BEGINS

- HEAD COACHING DEBUT: Saturday's matchup with West Virginia will mark Tennessee head coach Jeremy Pruitt's first game as a head coach.
- ELITE RESUME: Prior to being named the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, Pruitt established himself as one of the top defensive coordinators in the country during stops at Alabama (2016-17), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).
- LEADER OF HISTORIC DEFENSES: In five seasons as a defensive coordinator, Pruitt's defenses have finished No. 1 in the nation in scoring defense three times (2013. 2016. 2017), ranked No. 1 in total defense twice (2016, 2017) and led the nation in rush defense (2016, 2017) and pass defense (2013, 2015) twice each.
- **RELEVANT RECORDS:** Since becoming a coordinator in 2013, Pruitt's defenses have been stifling. His teams went 23-6 against ranked opponents with three shutouts, 5-0 in season-openers and 2-0 at Bank of America Stadium.

SMITH RACKS UP HONORS

- STELLAR FRESHMAN SEASON: Tennessee offensive lineman Trey Smith burst onto the scene as a freshman in 2017, starting all 12 games and becoming the first Vol true freshman to start at left tackle in over 30 years. Smith's efforts were recognized, as he was named a Freshman All-American by the FWAA and 247Sports.
- PRESEASON HYPE: Smith has also garnered his fair share of preseason buzz. The Jackson, Tenn., native was named to the Preseason All-SEC First Team by the media and coaches, as well as the Outland Trophy Watch List.

SEASON OPENING NEUTRAL SITE GAMES

- UNBEATEN: Tennessee is 5-0-1 all-time in season-opening neutral site games, dating back to the 1987 season
- RARE BIG 12 MATCHUP: The Belk Kickoff Classic against West Virginia will mark the second time that the Vols have faced a Big 12 opponent in a season-opening neutral site game. Tennessee faced off against eventual national champion Colorado (now a member of the Pac-12) to open the 1990 season in Anaheim, Calif.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA

- West Virginia went 7-6 in 2017, finishing the season with a 30-14 loss to Utah in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl. The Mountaineers began the year 7-3 before losing their final three games by an average of 19.3 points.
- West Virginia started the 2017 season ranked 22nd in the Preseason AP Top 25 and returned to that position in Week 9, but never rose any higher than No. 22. They begin this season at No. 17 in the AP Poll.
- Despite missing the final two games of the season, quarterback Will Grier finished the season 20th in the FBS in passing yards with 3,490 yards, also with 34 touchdowns and 12 interceptions last year. Entering the 2018 season, he is considered a preseason Heisman candidate and has garnered multiple first-team All-American selections.
- Three West Virginia wide receivers ranked in the top 32 in the FBS in receiving yards in 2017: **Gary Jennings** (18th), **Ka'Raun White** (30th) and All-American **David Sills V** (32nd).

Jennings (97 rec., 1,096 yards, TD) and Sills V (60 rec., 980 yards, 18 TDs) both return for the Mountaineers this season.

- The Mountaineers finished last season as the 13th-ranked passing offense in the FBS (309.3 yards per game) and 20th in total offense (459.6 yards per game).
- While its offense was one of the best in the nation, West Virginia's defense struggled last season and was an area of emphasis for head coach Dana Holgorsen going into this year. They ranked in the bottom third of teams in scoring defense (90th), passing defense (90th), rushing defense (103rd) and total defense (106th)
- West Virginia won its last matchup against an SEC opponent -- against Missouri in 2015 -- but prior to that lost five straight to SEC foes, dating back to 2009.
- The Vols and Mountaineers have three sets of notable high school teammates. Tennessee's **Shy Tuttle**, who will likely start at nose tackle, and West Virginia's **Kennedy McKoy**, the team's top returning running back, played together at North Davidson High School in Lexington, N.C. **Brandon Johnson** (UT) and **Alec Sinkfield** (WVU) were teammates at American Heritage in Plantation, Fla., while **Austin Smith** (UT) and **Tyler Thurmond** (WVU) both played at Buford High School in Buford, Ga.

SERIES NOTES

- This marks the first meeting between the two teams.
- West Virginia is one of just seven teams amongst Power Five schools that Tennessee has never played, with the other six being Arizona, Arizona State, Illinois, Michigan State, Stanford and Washington.
- The Vols own a 9-8 record all time against the Big 12 but have only played Kansas, Oklahoma, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech more than once.
- Tennessee is currently riding a 12game winning streak against nonconference foes, including four games against Power Five teams. UT has also won seven straight games at neutral sites, dating back to 2012.
- While the Vols have never played WVU, they do own a 2-0 record against another team in the state. In 2003 and 2006, the Big Orange hosted Marshall in Neyland Stadium. The Thundering Herd and Mountaineers are the only two programs in FBS from West Virginia.

Jeremy Pruitt was introduced as the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, taking the helm of the Volunteers after cementing himself as the nation's top defensive coordinator during stints at Alabama (2016-17), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).

Pruitt comes to Rocky Top with five national championships to his credit, including the 2018 College Football Playoff National Championship victory he helped lead Alabama to a month after taking the UT job. He also was part of three national championships (2009, 2011, 2012) on the staff of the Crimson Tide from 2007 to 2012 and was the defensive coordinator during the Seminoles' undefeated national championship season in 2013. Pruitt was a standout high school coach before joining the Alabama staff as the Director of Player Development. He played collegiately for coaching legends Boots Donnelly, at Middle Tennessee State, and for Gene Stallings, at Alabama, after growing up in Rainsville, Ala., a town just 45 minutes south of Chattanooga.

Pruitt is a teacher at heart, spending time as a physical education instructor right out of college while serving as an assistant football coach for his father at Plainview and Fort Payne high schools. In his introductory press conference, Pruitt joked that he taught every kid in Fort Payne, Ala., how to tie their shoes from 2001-04.

Former players he recruited and coached swear by Pruitt years later, including NFL All-Pro cornerback Jalen Ramsey, Heisman Trophy winner Derrick Henry, Pro Bowl linebacker Telvin Smith and Redskins linebacker Ryan Anderson to name a few

He owns a 96-13 (.881 winning percentage) record as a collegiate assistant coach and is a two-time Broyles Award finalist in addition to being named National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports in 2012.

He has coached 44 NFL draft picks and 18 All-Americans. The list of players coached by Pruitt reads like a who's who of college football's top defensive players this decade and includes 2017 National Defensive Player of the Year Minkah Fitzpatrick, 2016 Butkus Award (nation's top LB) winner Reuben Foster, 2016 National Defensive Player of the Year Jonathan Allen, top 10 NFL draft picks Ramsey, Roquan Smith, Leonard Floyd, Mark Barron and Dee Milliner, and current NFL stars Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Dre Kirkpatrick, Lamarcus Joyner and Telvin Smith.

PRUITT WENT 5-0 IN OPENERS AS A DC

- Jeremy Pruitt went 5-0 in season-openers as a defensive coordinator - all dominant victories, paced by stifling defensive performances.
- In five season-opening games as a coordinator, Pruitt's defenses allowed an average of only 12.2 points, 256.6 total yards, 66.6 rush yards and 190.0 pass yards. No opponent exceeded 300 yards of offense, 100 rushing yards or 225 passing yards.

INFLUENCED BY THE GREATS

- Jeremy Pruitt has played and worked for a distinguished list of college coaches.
- Boots Donnelly (College Football Hall of Fame inductee) coached Pruitt in 1993-94, converting the prep quarterback to defensive back.
- **Gene Stallings** (College Football Hall of Fame inductee, 1993 national champion) coached Pruitt in 1995-96 after he transferred to Alabama.
- Nick Saban (six national championships) hired Pruitt as his director of player development when he took over the Alabama program in 2007. Pruitt served as the DBs coach from 2010-2012 and returned as the defensive coordinator from 2016-17. He helped Saban win national championships in 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2017.
- Jimbo Fisher (2013 national champion) gave Jeremy Pruitt his first defensive coordinator job in 2013. The result was an undefeated national championship season where the Seminoles led the nation in scoring defense (12.1), passing defense (156.6) and interceptions (26), and ranked third in total defense (281.4).

 Pruitt was the defensive coordinator at Georgia for Mark Richt (SEC and ACC C.O.Y.) from 2014-15.

NUMBERS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Pruitt finished with a 23-6 mark against ranked opponents as a DC.
- Pruitt holds three shutouts against ranked opponents (2013 - No. 25 Maryland, 63-0, first game as DC vs. ranked team; 2014 - No. 23 Missouri, 34-0; 2016 -No. 15 LSU, 10-0).
- Pruitt's defensive numbers vs. ranked teams (29 games: points/game 17.6; total offense 313.1; rush defense 113.4; pass defense 199.8.

TOPS IN TAKEAWAYS

- In his five years as a defensive coordinator, Pruitt's defenses averaged 27.8 turnovers gained per season and 2.0 turnovers per game.
- Washington led the nation with 136 takeaways since 2013. Pruitt's defenses totaled 139 in the same time frame. (David Hale, ESPN)
- His teams led the SEC in turnover margin three times (2017, 2016, 2014) and his FSU defense finished second in the nation with 35 takeaways (26 INTs!).

DOMINATING D IN CHARLOTTE

- Saturday marks Pruitt's third game at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte since he became a defensive coordinator in 2013 with his defense leading the way to victories in both previous matchups.
- Pruitt's defense held Duke to just one late-game score in a 45-7 Florida State win in the 2013 ACC Championship Game, holding the Blue Devils to just 239 yards of total offense.
- In a dominant 37-14 win over Louisville in the 2014 Belk Bowl, Pruitt's Georgia defense allowed only 62 yards rushing and tallied three interceptions.

NOTING THE VOLS

BELK COLLEGE KICKOFF

- Tennessee's 2018 season-opener will be played in Charlotte as the third-ever Belk College Kickoff.
- Tennessee has not lost a season-opener since 2008, a streak of nine consecutive wins
- The game will mark Tennessee's fourth straight season playing a regular season neutral site game. The Vols are 3-0 in those games.
- The Belk College Kickoff will be contested in the Carolina Panthers' Bank of America Stadium, which marks the fifth straight season that the Vols will play a game in an NFL stadium. The Vols are a perfect 5-0 in games inside NFL stadiums in that time period.
- The game will be Tennessee's first inside the borders of the state of North Carolina since 1961.
- The matchup will mark the first time since 2015 and just the third time since 2012 that the Vols have opened the season on a Saturday.

VOLS, WVU MEET FOR FIRST TIME

- There are only seven Power Five schools that Tennessee has never faced: West Virginia, Illinois, Michigan State, Arizona, Arizona State, Stanford and Washington.
- West Virginia is the only Power Five school located less than 480 miles from Knoxville that the Vols have never played (Knoxville to Morgantown distance: 422 miles).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Tennessee has won 12 consecutive games against non-conference teams, dating back to 2015.
- Over the course of the streak, the Vols have defeated the likes of Northwestern (2015), Virginia Tech (2016), Nebraska (2016) and Georgia Tech (2017).
- The 12 straight wins over non-conference teams have come by an average of 23.2 points per game.

NEUTRAL SITE WIN STREAK

- When Tennessee faces West Virginia to open the 2018 season, the Vols will be defending a seven-game win streak on neutral fields – which began when UT defeated NC State, 35-21 in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Aug. 31, 2012.
- The Vols haven't lost on a neutral field since falling to North Carolina, 30-27 (20T) in the Music City Bowl on Dec. 30, 2010 – over seven years ago.

SEASON OPENERS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

- West Virginia enters the 2018 season ranked No. 17/20 in the country, making Saturday's season opener the first time since 2007 that Tennessee will open the season against a ranked opponent.
- Tennessee has opened the season with a win over a ranked team six times, last in 2006 (a 35-18 win over No. 9 California). The Vols have only once opened the season with a win over a ranked team while not being ranked themselves, a 3-0 win over No. 3 Auburn in 1959.
- Jeremy Pruitt's debut will mark the first time ever that a Tennessee head coach opens his career against a ranked opponent.

FIRST YEAR VOL HEAD COACHES

- Saturday's game represents the first game at Tennessee for head coach Jeremy Pruitt, hired on Dec.
 7, 2017 as the 26th head football coach in UT history.
- Vol head coaches are 20-5 in their UT debuts, including winning eight of the last 10 dating back to Jim McDonald's opening season in 1963.
- Since the 1950s, UT head coaches in their first full season with the Vols have finished the season with a record above .500 on five occasions.
- Six of the coaches have captured a ranked win in their inaugural season, including three of the last four coaches on Rocky Top.
- Bill Battle (1970) and Hall of Fame coach Phillip Fulmer (1993) are the only two coaches to ever finish ranked after their first year. Battle led his team to an impressive 11-1 record and a No. 4 finish in the AP Poll, while Fulmer's squad ended the year ranked 12th.
- Since the conference switched to divisions in 1992, three of UT's four coaches have claimed top 3 finishes in the SEC East, including Fulmer's first season when the Volunteers were tied for first after posting a 7-1 record in league play.
- In season openers, seven of the last eight coaches have won their first game, including each of the last four.

BACK IN THE FOLD

- Three key contributors that missed the 2017 season will return for the Vols in 2018: offensive lineman Chance Hall, wide receiver Jauan Jennings and linebacker Darrin Kirkland Jr.
- Prior to the 2017 season in which he redshirted due to injury, Hall had established himself as a valuable piece along Tennessee's offensive line. As a freshman in 2015, he was named to the Freshman All-SEC team, as well as being named a Freshman All-American by Sporting News and 247Sports.
- Jennings burst onto the scene for the Vols in 2016, racking up 40 catches for 580 yards and seven touchdowns -- including a 43-yard Hail Mary catch as time expired to give the Vols a win over Georgia. The Murfreesboro native suffered a season-ending wrist injury in the first half of the season-opener against Georgia Tech.
- Kirkland Jr. accumulated a total of 111 tackles over the course of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, earning Freshman All-SEC honors in 2015. An injury suffered in preseason fall practice forced the now-redshirt junior to miss all of the 2017 season.

ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

 Nine players on Tennessee's roster will take the field this fall already possessing degrees: Dillon Bates, Keller Chryst, Todd Kelly Jr., Brandon Kennedy, Darrin Kirkland Jr., Riley Lovingood, Madre London, Kyle Phillips and walk-on Malik Elion.

NOTING THE VOLS

- 60 players on Tennessee's roster were named Vol Scholars this past spring (3.0 GPA or higher).
- Over 40 degree programs are represented on Tennessee's roster.
- 97 percent of Tennessee players that complete their eligibility leave Knoxville with a degree.
- Former Vols Who Have Recently Won Academic Awards: Parker Henry won the 2018 McWhorter Award as the SEC's Male Student-Athlete of the Year. Joshua Dobbs won the 2017 Torcherbearer Award - the most prestigous honor given to a student at Tennessee.

PRUITT BRINGS IN HERALDED STAFF

- Tennessee's 11 on-the-field coaches have combined...
- To win 13 national championships as a member of a staff.
- To win more than 20 conference championships.
- To develop more than 130 NFL draft picks -- including more than 30 first-round selections.
- In the first round of the 2018 draft, eight of the 32 selections were directly coached by a member of Tennessee's staff.
- Overall, members of Tennessee's staff coached 21 draft picks in 2018.

VOLS ADD THREE GRAD TRANSFERS

- Three scholarship graduate transfers will join the Tennessee offense this season: quarterback Keller Chryst (Stanford), offensive lineman Brandon Kennedy (Alabama) and running back Madre London (Michigan State).
- Chryst appeared in 23 games over the course of three seasons at Stanford, posting a record of 11-2 as a starting quarterback.
- In three seasons at Michigan State, London recorded a total of 230 carries for 924 yards and eight touchdowns.

 Kennedy was limited by injuries at Alabama, playing in 10 games over the past two seasons primarily at center.

FROM THE PEACH STATE TO ROCKY TOP

- UT boasts 16 total players from the state of Georgia on its 2018 roster, which is the second most from any state, trailing only Tennessee (46).
- Four of Tennessee's 19 signees in its 2018 class hail from Georgia.
- The Vols are expected to receive major contributions from a handful of its players from the Peach State, including: DB Micah Abernathy, DL Paul Bain, DB Baylen Buchanan, WR Marquez Callaway, DB Trevon Flowers, DL Alexis Johnson, LB Quart'e Sapp, DB Shawn Shamburger and DB Nigel Warrior.

VOLEADERS

- Three members of Tennessee's football team are a part of the VOLeaders Academy Class of 2018-19.
- Defensive lineman Matthew Butler, defensive back Cheyenne Labruzza and wide receiver Josh Palmer will represent the football team in the 19-member group comprised of student-athletes from 15 different sports at UT.
- Current Tennessee wide receiver Marquez Callaway, offensive lineman Trey Smith, defensive back Micah Abernathy and defensive lineman Kyle Phillips have all been members of the VOLeaders Academy in past years.
- The University of Tennessee announced the inception of its VOLeaders Academy in July of 2015. By using their platform in sport, student-athletes admitted into the VOLeaders Academy learn how to positively impact their team, campus and local and global communities.



VOLS IN THE NFL

UT WELL-REPRESENTED

- As the preseason winds down, there are 38 VFLs currently on NFL rosters.
- The Pittsburgh Steelers have six VFLs on their roster in Joshua Dobbs, Ramon Foster, Justin Hunter, Daniel McCullers, Cameron Sutton and Kendal Vickers, while the Kansas City Chiefs boast five VFLs in Eric Berry, Dustin Colquitt, Alex Ellis, Zach Fulton and Kahlil McKenzie.
- The Vols had three players selected in the 2018 NFL Draft in Rashaan Gaulden, John Kelly and Kahlil McKenzie.

BARNETT WINS SUPER BOWL

- In his first NFL season, Tennessee's all-time sacks leader and current Philadelphia Eagles' defensive end Derek Barnett helped lead a powerful Eagles defense to a Super Bowl LII victory over the New England Patriots.
- Barnett's key fumble recovery with 2:16 remaining in the fourth quarter helped seal the Eagles' 41-33 win.
- Over the course of his rookie season and the playoffs, Barnett finished with 20 total tackles and six sacks.

THREE VFLS MAKE 2017 PRO BOWL

- The Vols had three former players participate in the 2017 Pro Bowl, held in Orlando, Fla.
- Running back Alvin Kamara, defensive lineman Malik Jackson, and tight end Jason Witten all took part in Pro Bowl festivities.



 Witten's appearance was the 11th of his career, while Kamara and Jackson made their Pro Bowl debuts.

KAMARA NAMED ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

- VFL and current New Orleans Saints running back Alvin Kamara was named AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year (voted on by the media) and NFL Pepsi Rookie of the Year (voted on by the fans) following a breakout rookie season.
- Kamara finished the regular season with 120 rushes for 728 yards, as well as 81 receptions for 826 receiving yards (10.2 yards per reception).
- Kamara scored 14 total touchdowns during his rookie campaign, while racking up 1,901 all-purpose yards.

WITTEN RETIRES, JOINS MNF CREW

- VFL tight end Jason Witten announced his retirement in May after a 15-year career with the Dallas Cowboys.
- The 11-time Pro Bowler finished his incredible career with the second most receptions by a tight end in NFL history and the fourth most overall with 1,152.
- Witten also ranks 21st all-time in receiving yards and is Dallas' franchise leader in catches, yards (12,448) and TD receptions (68).
- Witten has made the move to the broadcast booth where he'll serve as analyst for ESPN's Monday Night Football this season.

THE NFL DRAFT



The Vols have one of the most storied histories of producing NFL players:

354 drafted players, third most in SEC and ninth among all schools.

At least one former Vol has played in 25 of the last 26 Super Bowls, with a total of 39 playing in the big game since 2000. For Super Bowl LII, VFL Derek Barnett was on the roster for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Sixteen former Vols have been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 2000, while 77 UT players have been selected overall in that time frame.

UT is third in the SEC and seventh in the nation with 46 all-time first-round draft picks.

UT sack king Derek Barnett was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles with the 14th overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, making him the Vols' first NFL first-round pick since the Miami Dolphins selected Ja'Wuan James with the 19th overall selection in 2014. He also became Tennessee's first defensive player selected in the first round since 2010, when the Kansas City Chiefs selected Eric Berry with the fifth pick and the Arizona Cardinals selected Dan Williams with the 26th pick.

Six Vols were selected in the first four rounds of the 2017 NFL Draft. That marks the most Vols picked in the first four rounds since 2002.
