STORYLINES

- **BACK IN NEYLAND:** Tennessee returns to Neyland Stadium for the first time in 42 days as the Volunteers host No. 6/5 Florida at 3:30 p.m. ET Saturday live on CBS. It represents UT's first home game since facing then-No. 2 Alabama on Oct. 24. The Vols did not play a home game the entire month of November, a first since 1891. Gameday seating will be at approximately 25 percent of the venue's full capacity (capacity was 23,394 vs. Alabama). Saturday represents the first December regular season game between these two teams since Dec. 1, 2001, in Gainesville in a game rescheduled after the events of 9/11. It will also be the first December game played in Neyland Stadium since the Vols defeated Vanderbilt, 17-10, on Dec. 2, 1989.
- **BOUNCING BACK:** The Vols are attempting to snap a five-game losing streak that dates back to Oct. 10. They will seek to do it against a Florida team that has won three straight in the series. The Gators lead the all-time series, 29-20, and own a 13-12 record in Knoxville. UT's last win in the series occurred on Sept. 24, 2016. UF is UT's third top-five ranked opponent (at the time of the meeting) of the season. The Vols will face a fourth top-five ranked team when they host No. 5 Texas A&M in December. Five of UT's 10 opponents are ranked in the first edition of the College Football Playoff Rankings. Those teams are a combined 32-7.
- **COVID POSTPONEMENTS:** The Vols were open last weekend after their contest against Vanderbilt was postponed due to the purpose of facilitating the rescheduling of the Vanderbilt at Missouri game and for the continued opportunity for all 14 SEC teams to play all 10 games this season. It was Tennessee's second postponement of the season. The Vols' Nov. 16 home game against Texas A&M was also postponed.
- **OFFENSIVE OUTPUT:** Tennessee racked up a season-best 464 yards of total offense in a tough 30-17 loss at No. 21 Auburn in its last game. It represented the Vols' highest offensive output against the Tigers since putting up 502 yards in the 1997 SEC Championship Game and was also UT's most vs. a ranked team since 521 yards against No. 24 Nebraska in the 2016 Music City Bowl. The Vols outgained Auburn by 79 yards, were 9-of-15 on third down and tallied 222 rushing yards, led by a season-high 173 yards on 22 carries from **Eric Gray**. Gray averaged 7.9 yards per carry and finished with 222 all-purpose yards. UT recorded 28 first downs, representing the most in a game in the **Jeremy Pruitt** era (previous: 26 vs. Missouri, 2019, 2020).
- **"JUICE" GRAY:** So. RB **Eric Gray** has gone over 100 yards rushing four times this season, including back-to-back games for the first time in his career. He is tied for second in the SEC in that category. Gray ranks fifth in the SEC in total rushing yardage (651), fourth in yards per game (93.0) and 10th in rushing touchdowns (4). During the month of November, Gray averaged 148.0 yards per game on the ground, which led the SEC and ranked sixth in the FBS. In his last nine games dating back to last year's Vanderbilt game, Gray is averaging 109.2 yards per game on the ground. Gray is the first Vol with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since John Kelly in 2017 (141 vs. Florida, 101 vs. UMass), and he's the first to do it in back-to-back conference games since Joshua Dobbs in 2016 (147 vs. Kentucky, 190 vs. Missouri).
- **TREY SMITH ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE:** Offensive guard **Trey Smith** elected to return for his senior season and is an Outland Trophy candidate. Smith has played in 39 career games with 38 starts, including 19 straight starts. Last season, he did not allow a sack in 758 snaps, and he has not allowed one in 485 offensive snaps this season. CBSSports.com projects him as a NFL first round pick. Smith fulfilled his promise to his late mother, Dorsetta, by obtaining his degree this month in recreation and sports management.

MEDIA INFORMATION

In response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, the Southeastern Conference and the University of Tennessee have adopted several new policies and restrictions related to in-person media coverage of Tennessee football games this fall. Press box seating will be limited to no more than 50 percent of capacity, sideline access will be restricted and the field-level media center will be closed. These changes, guided by public health authorities and CDC recommendations, mean that some outlets that have previously been approved for credentials may not receive access this fall. All credentials will be issued on a single-game basis for Tennessee home games. Our hope is that the current restrictions are only required for one season and that we can return to our traditional credentialing/media access procedures in the fall of 2021.

COACH PRUITT MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- **MONDAY:** Coach Pruitt's weekly press conference will be held every Monday of game week at noon ET via Zoom. A Zoom link will be distributed to media. It will also be streamed live on SEC Network+, utsports.com and the UT Athletics YouTube page.
- **WEDNESDAY:** Coach Pruitt takes part in the weekly SEC Teleconference each Wednesday at 11:50 a.m. ET. Media representatives should contact the SEC for a confidential phone number.
- **WEDNESDAY:** Coach Pruitt will meet with media members via Zoom following Wednesday's practice as well. A Zoom link will be distributed to media.
- **POSTGAME:** All SEC postgame press conferences this season will be held via Zoom. A link will be distributed to media.

STUDENT-ATHLETE MEDIA INTERVIEWS

- **TUESDAY:** Tennessee student-athletes will be available via Zoom at approximately 1:10 p.m. ET on Tuesdays depending on the practice schedule for that respective week. A link will be distributed to media.
- **POSTGAME:** All SEC postgame press conferences this season will be held via Zoom. A link will be distributed to media.
- Media are NOT permitted to contact student-athletes on their own at any time. This includes phone, email, text or through social media platforms. Student-athletes' contact information will not be given out.

PRACTICE COVERAGE

- Due to COVID-19, all practices during the 2020 regular season will be closed to media. The media workroom in the Tennessee Athletic Communications office will also be closed.
- Photos and footage will be distributed to media for select practices during game week.

"VOL CALLS" WEDNESDAYS

- "Vol Calls," the official statewide call-in radio show for the Tennessee Volunteers, airs from 8-9 p.m. ET on Wednesdays from Calhoun's On the River in downtown Knoxville. The show features head coach Jeremy Pruitt. It also airs live on utsports.com.

NEYLAND GAME DAY INFORMATION

- Media in attendance will be required to wear a face covering.
- All individuals credentialed for any 2020 Tennessee football home game will receive an electronic health questionnaire email via Sports Systems within 48 hours of kickoff. This questionnaire must be completed before arriving on campus. In the event the individual credentialed for the contest becomes ill or is a "close contact" to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, the outlet should contact Kimberly Hood (khood3@utk.edu, 865-974-1211) as soon as possible to arrange for a substitute credentialed representative.
- All credentials and parking passes must be picked up on gameday at the Anderson Training Center loading dock on the north side of Chamique Holdsclaw Drive. Credential pickup will begin 2.5 hours before kickoff. Media should wait in their vehicles along the curb for a medical representative from UT's College of Nursing to conduct a no-contact temperature check. Once cleared (by registering a temperature of 100.3 or lower), the media member will receive their credential and parking pass and can then proceed to their assigned parking location.
- Media will enter the press box through Gate 15A. This new media entrance is located approximately 10 yards north of the traditional media gate. The

- press box will open to media starting two hours and 15 minutes before kickoff.
- With the exception of one pool photographer and one pool videographer, there will be no field-level access for external media outlets this fall. The field-level Stokely Family Media Center will be closed to media, and sideline access will be restricted to personnel from each competing school, network TV personnel and the two pool shooters.
- Press box seating will be limited to 50 percent of normal capacity. Seating will be physically distanced (using every other seat) and chairs at unassigned seats will be removed.
- There will be no meals served in the press box this season. A small selection of individually wrapped snacks and bottled beverages will be provided. This season only, security and bag-check personnel will permit media to enter Gate 15A with food and drink (beverages must have an unbroken seal).
- With the exception of flip cards, all media materials will be available digitally in accordance with FWAA recommendations. This includes in-game stats, game notes and final books.
- Photo and video content, representative of both teams, will be provided to media members (including outlets that are not approved for credentials) to assist with remote coverage via a centralized FTP site managed by the SEC.

NOTING THE TENNESSEE-FLORIDA SERIES

- Tennessee and Florida are meeting for the 50th time with the Gators owning a 29-20 advantage in the series.
- This will be the 26th meeting in Knoxville. Tennessee is 12-13 vs. Florida in Knoxville.
- Four out of the last six meetings have been decided by 10 points or less, but Florida has won two in a row by double-digits.
- Tennessee and Florida have played each other every season for 30 straight years dating back to the 1990 season.
- The two teams have played each other in September for the last 18 years. This will be the first time the two haven't played in September since the postponed game due to the events of 9/11. That Dec. 1, 2001 contest saw the then-No. 5 Vols clinch an SEC Eastern Division championship over the then-No. 2 Gators with a 34-32 victory in Gainesville. Prior to that, the last non-September matchup occurred on Oct. 12, 1991, in Gainesville.
- Prior to COVID-19, the two teams were originally scheduled to play in their traditional month of September (Sept. 26).
- This will be just the sixth time that Tennessee and Florida face off in December: 2001; 1969 Gator Bowl on Dec. 27 that Florida won 14-13; Dec. 3, 1932, a game Tennessee won 32-13 in Jacksonville; Dec. 6, 1930 when General Neyland's Vols won 13-6 in Jacksonville and Dec. 8, 1928 when the Vols beat the Gators, 13-12, in Knoxville.
- The last time that Florida and Tennessee faced off in December in Neyland Stadium? Dec. 8, 1928.
- Jeremy Pruitt** is 0-2 vs. Florida as a head coach and he was 4-4 vs. the Gators as an assistant coach (4-1 at Alabama, 0-2 at Georgia, 0-1 at Florida State).
- Florida tight ends coach Tim Brewster coached with **Jeremy Pruitt** on Jimbo Fisher's Florida State staff during the 2013 national championship season.
- A total of 542 miles separate the two schools down I-75.

Vols Fall to Gators in SEC Opener, 34-3

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Despite a third quarter that saw Tennessee force two turnovers and record a pair of sacks, the Vols fell to the No. 9/8 Florida Gators 34-3 on Saturday afternoon in Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in their SEC opener.

The UT defense completed the afternoon forcing three turnovers.

Senior linebacker Daniel Bituli recorded a game-high two sacks. His first sack of the season forced a Kyle Trask fumble, the first of his career, which was recovered by freshman **Henry To'o To'o** at the UF 19-yard line.

Bituli and To'o To'o had eight tackles apiece to lead the Vols.

In the secondary, **Theo Jackson** and **Alontae Taylor** recorded their first career interceptions in the third quarter. Taylor's came off a pass-breakup from Jackson.

Though the Vols struggled offensively, Jennings had a milestone day. UT's opening drive saw Jennings become the 22nd Vol to reach the 100-reception milestone. The catch came on a six-yard toss from **Jarrett Guarantano**. Jennings finished the game with seven catches for 73 yards.

NOTEBOOK

A RARE DECEMBER REGULAR SEASON

- Regular season contests in the month of December are a rare occasion for Tennessee football.
- Saturday will be Tennessee's 34th regular season game played during the month of December and first since Dec. 1, 2001, a game that was rescheduled following the events of 9/11 (def. No. 2 Florida, 34-32 in Gainesville).
- The Vols are 29-3-1 in December regular season games all-time. The only losses: Dec. 5, 1953 at Houston (L, 33-19); Dec. 9, 1933 at LSU; (L, 7-0); Dec. 3, 1905 vs. Grant in Chattanooga (L, 5-0).
- This will be the 14th December game played in Knoxville, 13th in Neyland Stadium and first since Dec. 2, 1989 vs. Vanderbilt (won 17-10). The Vols are 13-0 in those contests.
- Including postseason, Tennessee owns a 43-14-1 (.750) record during the month of December. The last time the Vols played any game during December was a 38-24 win over No. 24 Nebraska in the 2016 Music City Bowl.

OFFENSE VS. AUBURN

- Despite the loss at No. 21 Auburn on Nov. 21, Tennessee's offense had a season-best night statistically.
- The Vols tallied 28 first downs, representing the most in the **Jeremy Pruitt** era. It was also the most first downs in a game by UT since recording 29 against Kentucky on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Tennessee put up over 400 yards of total offense for the second time this season and the 10th time in **Jeremy Pruitt** era. The Vols tallied 422 yards in a win against Missouri on Oct. 3.
- The Vols passed for 242 yards against the Tigers, representing their second-highest output of the year.
- In the loss, UT averaged a season-best 6.27 yards per play. That was the Vols' best yards per play average in any game since 7.19 vs. Vanderbilt last season.

SEASON NO. 124

- The 2020 season marks the 124th football season in Tennessee history.
- Tennessee's all-time record is 848-400-53 (.672), which puts the Vols 10th nationally and second in the SEC in all-time victories.
- For the first time in program history, the Vols are playing 10 conference games in a season. They host five SEC teams for the first time since 1959.
- Of Tennessee's three remaining games, two come against current top five opponents (No. 5 Texas A&M, No. 6 Florida).
- The Vols enter the game fifth in the SEC Eastern Division standings with three games remaining. At 7-1, Florida is currently atop the division.

TOP 1-2 RB PUNCH OF GRAY, CHANDLER

- Sr. **Ty Chandler** and So. **Eric Gray** have made a case as one of the best running back tandems in the SEC this season. Gray ranks fourth in the SEC in rushing yards per game (93.0) and Chandler is 15th in the SEC (45.0). Gray ranks 32nd in the FBS in rushing yards per game.
- Gray has shined in his last nine games dating back to 2019. During that span he has combined for nine total touchdowns - eight rushing and one receiving - and 983 total rush yards. He is averaging 109.2 yards per game on the ground in the last nine games.
- Four times Gray has gone over the 100-yard rushing mark this season, including three out of his last four games and back-to-back games for the first time in his career. He is tied for second in the SEC in 100-yard rushing games this season. He has done it five times in his career.
- Gray is coming off a 222 all-purpose yard performance at No. 21 Auburn, including 173 yards on 22 carries and one touchdown. He had no negative yardage runs against Auburn, averaging 7.9 yards per carry. A total of 76 of his 173 rushing yards came after contact according to PFF. The 173 yards represented the most rushing yards by a player against Auburn this season and the most against them since Georgia's D'Andre Swift had 186 on Nov. 10, 2018. Gray was also the Vols' leading receiver in yardage against Auburn with three catches for 49 yards.
- Gray collected 105 yards in the win against Missouri on Oct. 3. He rushed for a touchdown and caught a touchdown vs. the Tigers, becoming the first Vol to achieve that feat in the same game since Alvin Kamara did so on Nov. 26, 2016.

NOTEBOOK

- Gray owns a rushing touchdown in six out of his last nine games, including back-to-back games. He became the first UT player to record a rushing TD in four straight games since QB Joshua Dobbs in 2016 (Sept. 10 – Oct. 1).
- During the month of November, Gray led all SEC running backs and ranked fifth in the FBS in rushing yards per game (148.0). He was third in the Power 5 in that category behind Oregon State's Jermar Jefferson (168.75) and Minnesota's Mohamed Ibrahim (156.67).
- Gray ranks seventh in the SEC this season in all-purpose yards per game at 124.4. He has averaged 5.6 yards per play this season.
- Chandler leaped into seventh place in UT career all-purpose yards with his 77-yard performance at Auburn. He now has 3,120 career all-purpose yards, which is 41 yards shy of tying Jamal Lewis (1997-99) for sixth place.

JALIN HYATT'S BREAKTHROUGH

- Freshman wide receiver **Jalin Hyatt** has played just seven collegiate games but has shown his skill set early. The Irmo, South Carolina, native and former four-star high school prospect is averaging a team-best 17.8 yards per catch (min. two receptions).
- Hyatt is currently second among all SEC freshmen with three 30+ yard catches this season, and he ranks 17th overall in the SEC in that category.
- Against No. 2 Alabama on Oct. 24, Hyatt finished with two catches for 86 yards, including a 48-yarder and a 38-yard touchdown in the second quarter. The 86 receiving yards were the most by a Vol true freshman since Preston Williams logged 98 yards on three catches against Western Carolina on Sept. 19, 2017. In terms of an SEC game, they were the most by a Vol true freshman since Marquez North put up 102 yards on three catches against South Carolina on Oct. 19, 2013.
- For the season, Hyatt ranks fourth on the squad in receiving yards with 178. That is already the most receiving yards in a season by a UT true freshman since 2016. Tyler Byrd recorded 209 yards in 13 games that year.

JG IN THE RECORD BOOKS, SEC

- Redshirt senior QB **Jarrett Guarantano** made his 32nd career start against Auburn in Week 7. He surpassed Andy Kelly (1998-91) for seventh place in UT career QB starts and is one start shy of sixth place (Jeff Francis, 33). Guarantano ranks 11th nationally in career starts among active FBS quarterbacks.
- Guarantano has rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in the same game in two of seven games (South Carolina, Missouri). He became the first Vol to achieve that feat since Joshua Dobbs did so in back-to-back games vs. Kentucky (Nov. 12) and Missouri (Nov. 19) in 2016. It was the first time in Guarantano's career that he has rushed for a touchdown and passed for a touchdown in the same game.
- Guarantano is tied for the SEC lead in QB rushing touchdowns this season with four, also shared by Kentucky's Terry Wilson, Auburn's Bo Nix and South Carolina's Collin Hill. Guarantano came into the season with only one career rushing score. He provided a 9-yard rushing score in his last game at No. 21 Auburn.
- Guarantano ranks sixth in program history for career completion percentage with a 61.0 percent rate, coming in just outside of the top five behind Joshua Dobbs.
- Guarantano owns 6,112 yards of total offense, which ranks seventh in UT history. He became the seventh player in UT history to surpass 6,000 yards of total offense in a career in his last game at Auburn.
- Guarantano has accounted for 43 touchdowns in his career - 38 passing and five rushing.
- In the season-opener at South Carolina, Guarantano became the eighth player in Tennessee history to go over 400 completions in a career. He enters the Florida game with 494, which ranks seventh in school history.
- This season, Guarantano ranks seventh in the SEC in 30+ yard completions with nine. For his career, Guarantano owns 47 completions of 30+ yards, including 14 all of last season.

NOTEBOOK

CIMAGLIA IN THE RECORD BOOKS

- Sr. placekicker **Brent Cimaglia** ranks third in Tennessee history in field goal percentage at 74.2 percent (46-of-62) (min. 25 made). He is also a perfect 87-of-87 on extra points.
- Cimaglia ranks 16th nationally in career field goals made (46) among active FBS players, and he is second in the SEC in that active category behind only South Carolina's Parker White (55).
- Cimaglia made 23 field goals last season, which tied for the third-most made field goals in a single season in program history.
- This season, Cimaglia is 5-of-9 on field goals (made 27, 33, 50, 48, 47; missed 46, 39, 50, 37) and 18-of-18 on extra points.
- He has made four field goals of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 53-yarder against UAB on Nov. 2, 2019.
- For his career, Cimaglia's 46 career made field goals ranks eighth in school history.

JOHNSON, BENNETT AMONG SEC'S BEST PASS RUSHERS

- After a career-best performance in the season-opening win at South Carolina, Sr. linebacker/edge rusher **Deandre Johnson** captured SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.
- Johnson finished with a career-high six tackles, a career-best 2.5 sacks for a loss of 11 yards and one forced fumble. The 2.5 sacks led all SEC players in Week 1 and were the most by a Vol since Darrell Taylor had four against Kentucky on Nov. 10, 2018. Johnson's forced fumble in the second quarter stalled a Gamecocks drive. Two of his sacks came on third down, including a critical one in the fourth quarter. The 2.5 sacks were also the most by a Vol in a season-opener since 2007.
- Johnson was the first Vol to earn SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors since Kyle Phillips did so on Oct. 15, 2018.
- Tennessee and Georgia are the only teams in the SEC with multiple players in the top eight of the SEC in sacks this season as both Johnson and teammate **Kivon Bennett** are tied for sixth with 4.5.
- Bennett has produced back-to-back games with two sacks apiece. He registered two for a loss of 10 at Arkansas on Nov. 7 and then two for a loss of 13 at No. 21 Auburn. Both of Bennett's sacks of Auburn's Bo Nix came on the same drive to start the third quarter.
- Bennett is tied for sixth in the SEC in tackles for loss with 7.5. He has multiple TFLs in three out of his last four games.

20 MAKE DEBUT, 17 TRUE FRESHMEN IN 2020

- Newcomers and true freshmen seeing action early is a common theme in the **Jeremy Pruitt** era. A total of 20 Vols have made their debut this season, including 17 true freshmen (9 offensive players, 7 defensive players, 1 specialist).
- A total of 14 made their debut in the season-opener against South Carolina, including 12 true freshmen. The opener debuts included: Fr. WR **Jimmy Calloway**, Fr. WR **Jimmy Holiday**, Fr. WR **Jalin Hyatt**, Fr. RB **Jabari Small** (on special teams coverage), Fr. OL **Cooper Mays**, Fr. OL **Javontez Spraggins**, Fr. LS **Will Albright**, Fr. LB **Tyler Baron**, Fr. LB **Morven Joseph**, Fr. DB **Key Lawrence**, Fr. DB **Doneiko Slaughter**, Fr. DL **Omari Thomas**, WR/RS **Velus Jones Jr.** and So. LS **Matthew Salansky**.
- In the last two season openers, a combined 20 true freshmen have seen action.
- Two other Vols made their debuts in the home opener against Missouri on Oct. 3, including Jr. OL **Cade Mays**, who started at right tackle, and Fr. WR **Malachi Wideman**. Mays was ruled eligible by the SEC earlier that week.

- Four true freshmen made their collegiate debuts in Week 4 against Kentucky on Oct. 17. QB **Harrison Bailey** entered on the Vols' last drive in the fourth quarter, completing one pass for 24 yards. RB **Tee Hodge** saw action on special teams, while DB **Tamarion McDonald** saw his first snaps on defense and special teams. LB **Bryson Eason** also saw action in the fourth quarter.

TEN FIRST-TIME STARTERS IN 2020

- In the season-opening win at South Carolina, a total of five Vols earned their first career starts - two on offense and three on defense. So. WR **Ramel Keyton**, R-Jr. TE **Princeton Fant**, R-Jr. LB **Kivon Bennett**, R-Fr. DL **Elijah Simmons** and Fr. S **Doneiko Slaughter** all made their first career starts on Sept. 26.
- A week later in a 35-12 win over Missouri on Oct. 3, Jr. OL **Cade Mays** got the start at right tackle in his UT debut, while R-So. **Jacob Warren** made his first start at tight end.
- During a week 3 loss at No. 3 Georgia on Oct. 10, WR **Cedric Tillman** made his first career start.
- On Oct. 24 against No. 2 Alabama, RB **Eric Gray**, playing in what was his 18th career game, saw his first starting nod. WR **Velus Jones Jr.** also made his first career start as a Vol. It was Jones' first collegiate start since he was a junior last season at USC on Nov. 2, 2019, against Oregon.

GRAD TRANSFER VELUS JONES JR. IMPACT

- In the spring of 2020, grad transfer wide receiver/return specialist **Velus Jones Jr.** enrolled at Tennessee after four seasons at Southern Cal. UT Assistant Head Coach and former USC assistant **Tee Martin** recruited Jones and coached him for three seasons with the Trojans.
- Jones Jr. made his Tennessee debut at South Carolina on Sept. 26, logging five catches for 29 yards and returning two kickoffs for 66 yards, including a 40-yarder that put him over 2,000 return yards for his career.
- Jones Jr. finished his USC career second all-time in school history in kickoff return yards with 1,947, just 194 shy of the USC record.
- Jones Jr. enters the Florida game with 2,220 career kickoff return yards, which ranks third among active FBS players.
- For the season, Jones Jr. ranks second in the SEC and 32nd in the FBS in kickoff return average at 22.75 per return. His season-long was a 40-yarder.
- Jones Jr. has scored a touchdown three different ways during his college career - receiving (1), rushing (1) and kick return (1). He is seeking his first score as a Vol.

- Tennessee owns two defensive touchdowns this season, which ranks 12th in the FBS and tied for fifth in the SEC.
- LB **Henry To'o To'o** had a 32-yard pick six in Week 1 at South Carolina, while LB/edge **Kivon Bennett** recovered a fumble in the end zone at Georgia in Week 3.
- Tennessee has produced five defensive touchdowns (three pick sixes and two fumble returns) in the **Jeremy Pruitt** era (since 2018):

SEVEN DEFENSIVE TAKEAWAYS

- Through seven games, the Vols have forced eight turnovers. Two of those eight were defensive touchdowns. UT has recorded five fumbles gained and three interceptions.
- Tennessee has won the turnover battle in two of seven games this season and is 2-0 when doing so (South Carolina +2, Missouri +1). The Vols tied the turnover battle against Alabama and Auburn.
- Tennessee has forced at least one turnover in six of its seven games this season with Arkansas being the only contest it did not. In the 32 games under **Jeremy Pruitt**, the Vols have forced a turnover in 23 of those.

NOTEBOOK

MAYS, GARLAND BROTHERS

- Knoxville natives **Cade Mays** and **Cooper Mays** are seeing action together on the offensive line this season, continuing a family legacy of Vols. Cade and Cooper's father, Kevin, was an All-American SEC guard and offensive captain on the Vols' 1994 squad. Both Cade and Cooper prepped at Knoxville Catholic where they played together in high school.
- **Cade Mays'** waiver was approved and he was granted eligibility by the SEC on Sept. 30. Mays' waiver was approved by the NCAA on Sept. 17. Mays made his UT debut as the starting right tackle two days after the SEC cleared him against Missouri on Oct. 10. He started at right guard in Week 3 in his return to Georgia.
- During his college career, including his two seasons at Georgia, he has started 25 games - two at left tackle, two at left guard, 17 at right guard and three at right tackle. Cade was selected as a second-team preseason All-American by the Sporting News, and he is a candidate for the Outland Trophy.
- **Kurott Garland** and **Kwauze Garland** are also brothers on the same Vol team this season. Kurott has played in 24 career games, while Kwauze has played in three contests.

LIMITING BIG PLAYS

- A hallmark of **Jeremy Pruitt** defenses is limiting big plays. In the last three seasons combined (including seven games of 2020), Tennessee has allowed only 40 plays of 30+ yards, which is tied for the third-fewest in the FBS with Iowa and Arizona State.
- The Vols led the nation in fewest 30+ yard plays allowed a year ago with 10, and this season they are second in the SEC allowing 11. In the five seasons prior to Pruitt's tenure, UT allowed 137 and ranked 72nd in the FBS during that span.
- Tennessee also ranks tied for eighth nationally since 2018 in fewest 40+ yard plays allowed with 22.
- Tennessee has allowed three 50+ yard plays from scrimmage this season, which ranks fourth in the SEC. In Pruitt's entire tenure (32 games), the Vols have allowed only 12 50+ yard plays from scrimmage.

VOLS FIFTH IN SEC IN TACKLES FOR LOSS PER GAME

- Tennessee has accumulated 43.0 tackles for loss this season, which ranks eighth in the SEC. The Vols are averaging 6.14 tackles for loss per game, which ranks fifth in the SEC.
- The Vols tied a season-high with nine tackles for loss at Arkansas, matching the nine they had in the season-opener at South Carolina. **Henry To'o To'o** and **Kivon Bennett** led the way with two apiece against the Razorbacks.
- A total of 10 Vols have multiple tackles for loss this season led by **Kivon Bennett** with 7.5 and **Henry To'o To'o** with 7.0. A total of 20 players on the roster have at least 0.5 tackles for loss.
- Tennessee, Mississippi State and Auburn are the only teams with multiple players in the top 10 of the league in tackles for loss. Bennett is tied for sixth, while To'o To'o is tied for ninth.
- The 43 TFLs are the most through the first seven games of a season for UT since 2016 (47). The Vols produced 37 TFLs through the first seven games of 2019.

STOUT OFFENSIVE LINE

- Tennessee's offensive line is one of the elite units in the country led by preseason All-Americans Sr. **Trey Smith** and Jr. **Cade Mays**.
- Looking the part: A total of 13 Vol offensive linemen come in at over 310 pounds.
- Experience: The entire offensive line has combined for 151 career starts (includes the 18 starts made by **Cade Mays** at Georgia).
- Four players on the offensive line were five-star prospects coming out of high school, including starting So. LT **Wanya Morris**, starting Sr. LG **Trey Smith**, So. tackle **Darnell Wright** and Jr. starting RT **Cade Mays**.
- Four players on the offensive line were once freshman All-America selections during their careers (**Trey Smith**, **Wanya Morris**, **Cade Mays**, **Darnell Wright**).
- ESPN and SEC Network's Cole Cubelic rated Tennessee's unit as one of the top five offensive lines in the country heading into the 2020 season.
- **Trey Smith** elected to return for his senior season and is listed among the top offensive line prospects for the 2021 NFL Draft. Smith has started 38 career games and did not allow a sack all of last season, and he has not allowed one this season as well.
- Sr. C **Brandon Kennedy** is one of two SEC transfers on the offensive line. Kennedy played at Alabama before graduating and joining the Vols where he has served as UT's starting center the last two seasons. Kennedy is on pace to earn three degrees during his collegiate career and is a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.

PASS DEFENSE IN THE PRUITT ERA

- **Jeremy Pruitt** defenses are known for elite secondary play. Since Pruitt took over at Tennessee, the Vols have shined in pass defense.

15 STRAIGHT GAMES WITH A SACK

- Tennessee has produced at least one sack in 15 straight games dating back to the Mississippi State contest on Oct. 12, 2019. The Vols have racked up 42 total sacks during this streak, including a season-best four against Arkansas on Nov. 7. **Kivon Bennett** produced a career-high two sacks against the Razorbacks, and added two more against No. 21 Auburn last week.
- Bennett and **Deandre Johnson** lead the way this season with 4.5 sacks, which is tied for sixth in the SEC.
- A total of eight Vols this season have at least one sack. UT has accumulated 16 total sacks this season, which ranks seventh in the SEC.

PALMER SHINING IN SENIOR SEASON

- One of the biggest question marks entering the 2020 season was how would Tennessee replace the production of wide receivers Jauan Jennings (San Francisco 49ers) and Marquez Callaway (New Orleans Saints), who went onto NFL careers. That question has been answered through seven games led by the outstanding play of senior **Josh Palmer**.
- The 6-foot-2 Palmer leads the Vols in catches (22), receiving yards (331) and receiving touchdowns (4). He ranks 13th in the SEC in TD catches. Palmer had three touchdowns during his first three seasons combined (2017-19).
- Palmer produced the first multi-touchdown game of his career with two spectacular catches at No. 3 Georgia on Oct. 10 - both coming in the second quarter. He went up and hauled in a 36-yarder from **Jarrett Guarantano** that tied the game at 14 all and added another on the ensuing possession, a 27-yarder that gave the Vols the lead. Palmer added another TD reception, a 27-yarder in the third quarter against Alabama.
- Three of Palmer's 21 catches this season have gone for 30+ yards, which ranks 17th in the SEC, while six of his receptions have gone for 20+ yards, which ranks 19th in the SEC. A total of 17 of his 21 catches have gone for first downs.
- Palmer is a native of Brampton, Ontario, and is only the sixth Vol to earn a letter from Canada all time. He is one of three players on SEC rosters this season to hail from Canada, joining Florida freshman defensive lineman Lamar Goods (Fort McMurray, Alberta) and Alabama sophomore wide receiver John Metchie III (Brampton, Ontario). Palmer, whose parents are of Jamaican descent, played his high school football at powerhouse St. Thomas Aquinas High School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

NOTEBOOK

BROOKS TOP 25 IN FBS IN KICKOFFS, RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE

- Junior punter **Paxton Brooks** was chosen as the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week for his efforts at No. 3 Georgia on Oct. 10. Brooks punted six times for a total of 283 yards, averaging a career-best 47.2 yards per punt. Three of his punts ended up inside UGA's 20-yard line and he had a long punt of 55 yards.
- For the season, Brooks is averaging 43.3 yards per punt, which is tied for seventh in the SEC and 39th in the FBS. Of his 33 punts in 2020, 10 have been pinned inside the 20, while seven have gone for 50+ yards. He is on the watch list for the Ray Guy Award.
- Brooks also serves as the Vols' kickoff specialist. He is averaging 63.96 yards per kickoff this season, which ranks sixth in the SEC and 22nd in the FBS. A total of 20 of his 28 kickoffs this year have gone for touchbacks (71.43 percent, fifth in SEC).

BRANDON KENNEDY, CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALIST

- For the seventh time in program history, Tennessee has produced a National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete as senior graduate center **Brandon Kennedy** was selected as one of 12 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy, the NFF and College Hall of Fame announced on Nov. 12.
- Kennedy and the 11 other finalists will each receive \$18,000 postgraduate scholarships as members of the 2020 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class.
- Kennedy is the first Vol to be named an NFF National Scholar-Athlete since Michael Munoz in 2004. Munoz went on to capture the Campbell Trophy, seven years after Peyton Manning won the award.
- Kennedy was one of only three Power 5 student-athletes to earn the honor this season, joining Texas quarterback Sam Ehlinger and Washington defensive back Elijah Molden.
- Kennedy has started 20 consecutive games for the Vols at center. A grad transfer, Kennedy earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Alabama in just three years with a 3.55 GPA. After earning a master's degree from Tennessee in sports psychology and motor behavior in Dec. 2019, he is currently working on a second master's degree in agricultural leadership, education and communications.

Now in year three at the helm of Tennessee football, Jeremy Pruitt has proven that he is the man to get the proud program turned around.

Pruitt's Volunteers authored one of the most impressive in-season turnarounds in the country in 2019, finishing the year with six consecutive victories and seven wins in their last eight games. After starting the season 1-4, Pruitt and Tennessee never blinked en route to an 8-5 overall mark and a 5-3 record in the Southeastern Conference. The Vols capped the season with a remarkable comeback to defeat Indiana, 23-22, in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, becoming the only team in the country to overcome a 13-point deficit in the final five minutes during the 2019 season.

Tennessee finished 23rd in the nation in total defense (334.5) - its best mark in 10 years - and ranked in the top 20 nationally in pass defense (194.0) and interceptions (15), while finishing third in the SEC in sacks (34). Pruitt's defense limited explosive plays as well as any team in the country. The Vols allowed only 10 plays of 30 yards or more in 2019, representing the fewest in the nation.

Tennessee improved by three wins following Pruitt's debut season in 2018 where he led the Vols to upset victories over ranked conference opponents Auburn, on the road, and Kentucky, at home.

Tennessee's quick turnaround under Pruitt comes as no surprise as he has found success at every stop of his career.

Introduced as the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, Pruitt took the helm of the Vols after collecting five national championships as an assistant and cementing himself as the nation's top defensive coordinator during stints at Alabama (2016-17, 2007-12), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).

Pruitt's recruiting prowess was evident during his time as an assistant and it's continued during his tenure as a head coach. The Vols signed a top 10 recruiting class in the spring of 2020 and built momentum toward an elite class for 2021.

VOLS IMPROVEMENT UNDER JEREMY PRUITT

Tennessee improved in nearly every statistical category under Jeremy Pruitt in 2019. Most notably, the Vols made dramatic improvements in total offense and total defense each season since 2017. The Vols also have made significant leaps in scoring, rushing, passing, third-down and in opponent scoring and rushing.

No. 16 Vols Topple South Carolina in Opener

No. 16 Tennessee found the end zone in all four quarters during a hard-fought road win over South Carolina at Williams-Brice Stadium. The Volunteers triumphed in seven straight games, dating to last season. A special teams mistake by South Carolina (0-1) in the game's closing moments secured the victory for UT (1-0), as true freshman **Jimmy Holiday** secured a muffed punt deep in Gamecocks territory. Tennessee's defense shined in the first half and earned the stops it needed in the second to help the Vols open the third season of UT head coach **Jeremy Pruitt's** tenure on a high note. Henry To'o To'o recorded his first career interception and returned it 32 yards down the sideline for a touchdown in the second quarter. The Vols withstood a third-quarter surge by Carolina, which authored back-to-back touchdown drives to tie the game at 21-21. But Tennessee never allowed its opponent to pull ahead through the final three quarters. Making his 26th career start, Vols' quarterback Jarrett Guarantano completed 19 of 31 passes for 259 yards and one touchdown. The senior graduate also rushed for 12 yards and one score. Guarantano delivered the huge offensive play of the game. With the game tied, it took just four plays and 75 yards when the senior found **Josh Palmer** for a 32-yard touchdown catch with 9:35 to play. Defensively, **Bryce Thompson** and **Kenneth George Jr.** registered a team-high eight tackles apiece. Edge rusher **Deandre Johnson** collected a career-best 2.5 sacks. Two of his sacks came on third down, including a critical one in the fourth quarter, as he earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.

No. 20 Vols Rush Past Mizzou, 35-12

No. 21/20 Tennessee (2-0) rushed for four touchdowns and used a punishing defensive performance to extend its win streak to eight consecutive games following a 35-12 triumph over Missouri (0-2) on Saturday in Neyland Stadium. UT's eight-game win streak was the second-longest for the program since 1998, and the 23-point win is Tennessee's largest margin of victory over an SEC opponent since a 63-37 victory against Missouri on Nov. 9, 2016. **Jarrett Guarantano** made an impact for UT in both the passing and rushing game. The redshirt senior signal caller was an efficient 14-of-23 through the air for 190 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. On the ground, he recorded his first-career game with multiple rushing touchdowns, finishing with two for the day. Sophomore running back **Eric Gray** was patient and explosive in the run game, rushing for 105 yards and a touchdown on 16 attempts—marking the second time the sophomore has eclipsed 100 yards in his career. Gray also added a receiving touchdown to become the first Vols' player with a rushing and receiving touchdown in a game since Alvin Kamara did so against Vanderbilt on Nov. 26, 2016. Senior running back **Ty Chandler** added 90 rushing yards and a touchdown of his own, while junior safety Trevon Flowers led the way with 10 total tackles on the defensive side of the ball. The Vols were a perfect 4-of-4 on fourth down, representing the first time since 2002 that they converted four or more in a game.

No. 12 Vols' Win Streak Snapped at No. 3 Georgia

Despite leading No. 3 Georgia at halftime, No. 12 Tennessee fell short of pulling off the upset, falling by a score of 44-21 at Sanford Stadium. Georgia held Tennessee scoreless and forced three turnovers in the second half to snap the Vols' eight-game win streak. Tennessee quarterback **Jarrett Guarantano** threw a pair of touchdown passes to **Josh Palmer**, including a 27-yarder with 3:08 in the second quarter that gave the Vols a 21-17 advantage. Tennessee then had a huge goal line stop in the final seconds of the first half. Georgia ran four straight plays inside the 5-yard line, including two straight at the one that was stuffed out by the Vols as time expired. Sophomore tailback **Eric Gray** was Tennessee's leading rusher and receiver, finishing with career-highs in receptions (8) and receiving yards (54). Defensively, preseason All-SEC linebacker **Henry To'o To'o** led the Big Orange with a career-best 11 tackles, including two for loss. Outside linebacker **Kivon Bennett** scored his first-career touchdown, recovering an errant snap in the end zone on the game's second play from scrimmage to give UT an early 7-0 advantage. It was the second defensive touchdown of the year for Tennessee. Turnovers proved to be costly on the day as the Vols committed three of them that led to 13 Georgia points.

No. 17 Vols Fall to Kentucky, 34-7

Tennessee sophomore running back **Eric Gray** rushed for a season-high 128 yards, but four first-half turnovers by the No. 18/17 Vols were too much to overcome in a 34-7 loss to Kentucky Saturday afternoon at Neyland Stadium. Gray posted his second 100-yard game of the season and third of his career. He ended up with 24 carries vs. UK on Saturday, finishing one short of the career-best 25 attempts he had vs. Vandy. Defensively, UT was led by linebacker **Quavaris Crouch**, who was in on a career-high 11 stops. The Vols fell to 2-2 on the year, while Kentucky evened its record at 2-2 after opening the season 0-2. The Wildcats snapped a string of 17-straight Vol home wins in the series that dated back to 1986. Kentucky jumped on top 17-0 in the second quarter despite its offense moving past the 50-yard line only once in the first half. It was the Wildcats' defense putting all of those points on the scoreboard in a span of six-and-a-half minutes, capitalizing on three Vol miscues and turning two of them into scoring plays. UT's four turnovers allowed the Wildcats to carry a 10-point lead into the locker room, despite the Vols holding a 203 to 75 advantage in total yardage, including 120 to 28 on the ground. Gray led all rushers in the first half with 101 of those yards on 18 carries. Tennessee freshman quarterback **Harrison Bailey** made his collegiate debut with 10:48 left in the game, driving the Vols to the UK 10 before the Big Orange turned it over on downs.

Vols Drop Home Contest to No. 2 Alabama

Tennessee got a pair of touchdown passes from senior quarterback **Jarrett Guarantano** and a career-best day from freshman wide receiver **Jalin Hyatt**, but it wasn't enough for the Vols to keep pace in a 48-17 setback to No. 2 Alabama in Neyland Stadium. Guarantano, who had scoring passes of 38 yards to Hyatt and 27 yards to senior wide receiver **Josh Palmer**, finished the day 13-of-24 through the air. Hyatt finished the day by tying his career best with two receptions for a career-high 86 yards. He posted his longest catches of the season with a 38-yard TD in the second quarter, his first, and a 48-yard reception in the third period on another Vol scoring drive. Palmer, meanwhile, led the Big Orange in catches with four and amassed 57 yards. Sophomore running back **Eric Gray** paced UT on the ground with 57 yards on 19 carries. Alabama scored touchdowns on four of its first five possessions. Defensively, Tennessee was led by junior safety **Trevon Flowers**, who had his second double-digit tackle effort of the season. His 10 stops, eight of them solo, matched the 10 he had against Missouri earlier this season. He also forced a fumble. Six Vols registered at least 0.5 tackles for loss. Senior defensive lineman **Matthew Butler** added six tackles and a sack.

Despite leading 13-0 at halftime, Tennessee was unable to hang on and fell 24-13 to Arkansas at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium on Saturday night. Arkansas scored all 24 of its points in the third quarter while holding the Vols scoreless in the second half. **Eric Gray** had another impressive performance to lead the Vols offensively. Gray recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, finishing the night with 123 yards on 31 carries. He added 27 yards on three receptions, as well. The Vol defense pitched shutouts in the first, second and fourth quarters, while tying season highs with four sacks and nine tackles for loss. Brent Cimaglia connected on both of his field goal attempts in the first half. Gray provided the Vols with their lone touchdown, finishing off a 16-play, 81-yard drive with a 1-yard plunge early in the second quarter. Arkansas took the momentum in the third quarter scoring touchdowns on three consecutive drives and then added a field goal. UT quarterback **Jarrett Guarantano** was knocked out of the game in the third quarter due to a head injury and did not return. He was spelled by Brian Maurer and then true freshman Harrison Bailey, who played the final two drives. Redshirt junior **Kivon Bennett** collected two sacks while **Deandre Johnson** and **Ja'Quain Blakely** added a sack apiece. Sophomore linebacker **Henry To'o To'o** had seven tackles and added a pair of TFLs while senior defensive back **Theo Jackson** set a new career high with 10 tackles to lead the team, including one tackle for loss.

Vols Fall to No. 23 Tigers on The Plains

Despite holding a two-possession lead in the second quarter and another stellar performance by sophomore running back **Eric Gray**, Tennessee was unable to deliver the upset at No. 23/21 Auburn, falling 30-17 to the Tigers. Gray recorded a season-high 173 rushing yards on 22 attempts, marking the second consecutive outing that the Memphis, Tennessee, native surpassed the century mark and the fourth time this season. Gray added a touchdown on a 1-yard scamper late in the fourth quarter. The Vols outgained the Tigers 464-385 in total yards, but despite the offensive production missed on multiple scoring opportunities that proved costly. UT (2-5) struck first on its second offensive drive of the night with **Jarrett Guarantano** capping a nine-play, 80-yard drive with a 9-yard rush – the longest rushing TD of his career. Following UT's scoring drive, junior defensive back **Bryce Thompson** picked off a pass in the end zone to stall an Auburn drive. Auburn took a 20-10 lead into the fourth quarter after a 100-yard pick six from Smoke Monday. Defensively, the Vols efforts were highlighted by **Kivon Bennett**, who set a new career high with three tackles for loss and also recorded 2.0 sacks to tie a career high. Freshman quarterback **Harrison Bailey** led his first-career scoring drive, orchestrating a nine-play, 75-yard drive that was punctuated by Gray's lone touchdown of the night. Bailey finished the game 7-of-10 passing for 86 yards, both career bests.
