2019-20 - SOPHOMORE

- Was the team's top reserve for the first 22 games before starting the final nine contests of the season.
- Averaged 12.3 ppg. and 5.7 rpg. during that end-of-year stint in the first five.
- Finished as Tennessee's second-leading (active) scorer at 10.5 ppg. and rebounder at 5.5 rpg., tying with Jordan Horston on the latter.
- Scored in double figures 15 times, with nine games of 15+ points and three of 20+.
- Led UT in three-point shooting nine times and finished with 21 treys on the year to rank fifth on the team.
- Got to the free throw line the second-most times (63-105) and was fourth on the squad with 23 steals.
- Led the team in scoring with a career-high 21 points and nine rebounds at Portland State.
- Matched her career high with 21 points and added nine rebounds and three assists at Arkansas.
- Recorded a double-double in her first career start, establishing SEC highs of 20 points and 10 rebounds vs. Miss. State.
- Led UT in scoring and rebounding against Texas A&M, finishing with 19 points and seven boards.
- Scored in double figures for a career-best fourth game in a row, tallying 18 points and grabbing five boards against Air Force.
- Was UT's top scorer against Howard, recording a double-double with 18 points and a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Put up a team-high 16 points in Tennessee's win over Missouri in the SEC Tournament Second Round.
- Logged career highs of 17 points, five steals and four assists against UAPB, with the latter two numbers still standing as bests.
- Recorded her first career double-double against Stetson, logging 10 points and 11 rebounds.
- Scored 16 points at Kentucky during the regular season while adding six rebounds, three blocks and two steals.
- Pitched in nine points and six rebounds in the marquee match-up at UConn.
- Hit two crucial free throws in the final seconds to help secure the win over Alabama, finishing with eight points, four rebounds and three assists.

2018-19 - FRESHMAN

- Saw action in every game as a freshman, averaging 3.6 points and 12.7 minutes of duty.
- Scored in 21 of 32 outings, hitting double figures on five occasions.
- Had nine games where she pulled down five or more rebounds.
- Reached double figures in points during the first three games of her college career.
- Opened the season by scoring 14 points and pulling down five rebounds vs. Presbyterian.

2019-20 - JUNIOR

- Earned a bachelor's degree in May 2020 in hotel, restaurant and tourism management with a minor in business administration.
- Finished junior year with 14 career shots made with the game clock running down, including two game-winning buckets, three before the half, seven at the end of the third quarter and two at the end of the first period.
- All-America honorable mention selection averaged 18.0 points, 8.2 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game while shooting 46.9 percent from the field and 80.2 percent from the free throw line.
- Was first on the team in scoring, rebounding, free throws made (89) and three-pointers made (34), second in steals (28) and third in assists (74).
- Her season scoring and rebound averages rank sixth and seventh, respectively, among all-time juniors at Tennessee.
- Scoring average was the best by a Lady Vol since Candace Parker averaged 21.3 in 2008.
- She is only the fifth Lady Vol in the past 35 years to average 18.0 ppg. or higher. The others were Bridgette Gordon, Chamique Holdsclaw, Tamika Catchings and Candace Parker.
- Career rebounding (7.82) and scoring (14.9) averages

rank No. 9 and No. 10, respectively, among anyone who has played for the Lady Vols, and her career free throw percentage (.804) ranks No. 10 as well.

- First-team All-SEC performer ranked second in the league in points (541) and field goals made (209), third in field goal attempts (446) and points per game (18.0), fourth in free throw percentage (80.2) and fifth in rebounds (245) and rebounds per game (8.2). She was eighth in field goal percentage (46.9).
- Against nine ranked opponents, Davis put up 19.8 ppg. and 7.0 rpg. and shot 43.8% on field goals and 84.2% on free throws vs. those teams.
- Averaged 19.9 ppg. and 8.0 rpg. vs. SEC foes while hitting 49.6% from the field and 82.8% at the charity stripe in 16 regular-season contests.
- Recorded 11 double-doubles, which tied for the seventh best total all-time by a Lady Vol junior with Cindy Noble and Shekinna Stricklen.
- Davis was tied with Bashaara Graves for 10th in UT history with 29 double-doubles during her first three seasons.
- Among active SEC players in 2019-20, Davis ranked third (29) in the league for career double-doubles, and she tied for fourth that season with 11.
- Scored in double figures in 29 of 30 games, including the last 28. Through 2019-20, she has scored in double figures in 42 of her last 43 contests.
- Hit for 15+ points on 25 occasions and tallied 20+ points six times as a junior, including a pair of 30+ efforts. She now has 13 20-point efforts during her career to rank No. 9 all-time at UT.
- With 18 points (and 13 rebounds) vs. Portland State, Davis became the 46th Lady Vol to score 1,000 points in her career. She stood at 29th on that list with exactly 1,400 through her junior year.
- Tallied a 33-point, 10-rebound double-double as UT won at #15/14 Notre Dame for the first time since 2008.
- Connected on a career-best five three-pointers in that career-high-tying scoring performance vs. the Fighting Irish.
- Named SEC Player of the Week following double-doubles at ETSU (13 pts./10 rebs.) and at Notre Dame.
- Went a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line en route to 30 points, eight rebounds and four steals vs. LSU.
- That day at the charity stripe was the best ever by a Lady Vol at Thompson-Boling Arena and ranked as the fourth-best effort in school history.
- Notched 16 points and eight rebounds at #3/5 UConn as the teams faced off for the first time since 2007.
- Chosen SEC Player of the Week after averaging 23.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals in those games against No. 3/5 UConn and No. RV/RV LSU.
- Led the team in scoring at #13/13 Kentucky, firing in 27 points and adding six rebounds for her 10th 20+ scoring game.
- Hit a long-range trey with .08 on the clock to lift UT past Alabama, finishing with 16 points and nine rebounds.
- Carded career highs of six assists and three blocks

- against Texas A&M while pitching in 18 points.
- Produced 18 points and 10 rebounds at #1/2 South Carolina.
 - Went 10 of 16 from the field and finished with 23 points and 11 rebounds vs. Colorado State.
 - Fired in 22 points in the win at Vanderbilt for her fifth of six 20+ scoring efforts as a junior.
 - Poured in 17 second-half points against Ole Miss to post the 28th double-double of her career with 19 points and 11 rebounds.
 - Closed out the regular season with her third-straight double-double and 11th of the year, carding 22 points and 10 rebounds at Auburn.
 - Set career highs of six assists and three blocks against #16/18 Texas A&M while tossing in 18 points.
 - Tallied 18 points, eight rebounds and three assists against #22/25 Arkansas.
 - Opened league play with a 19-point, 12-rebound effort vs. Missouri, pulling down eight offensive boards.
 - Named to SEC Coaches Preseason All-SEC First Team and Media Second Team.
 - Selected to preseason watch lists for Wade Trophy, Cheryl Miller Award, Wooden Award and Citizen Naismith Trophy.

2018-19 - SOPHOMORE

- Led UT in scoring (14.9), rebounding (7.7) and free throw percentage (.856) in her second season on Rocky Top.
- Ranked No. 1 in the SEC in free throw percentage, No. 8 in rebounding and No. 12 in scoring.
- Scoring average tied for No. 5 all-time by a UT sophomore, while her rebound average is the ninth-best for a second-year performer at Tennessee.
- Had the seventh-most double-doubles ever by a UT sophomore (9) and her 18 as a Lady Vol put her at No. 20 on the career list.
- Her sophomore double-double total (9) is the sixth-most by an active player in the SEC and second-most by an underclassman.
- Led Tennessee in scoring on nine occasions and was UT's leading rebounder in 15 contests during the 2018-19 season.
- Scored in double figures a team-leading 26 times, with 16 games of 15+ points and six of 20 or more.
- Had 10 games with 10 or more rebounds.
- Hit 29 of 34 free throws inside the final four minutes of games.
- Paced UT in scoring with a season-high 29 points at Mississippi State while pulling down six boards.
- Tallied 23 points and 14 rebounds in UT's SEC-opening win at Auburn.
- Led UT in scoring against UCLA in the first round of the NCAA Tournament with 21 points and 10 rebounds.
- Recorded a double-double against Stanford with 14 points, 10 rebounds and a pair of steals.
- Scored 19 points while dishing out three assists against LSU in the SEC Tournament.
- Named SEC Player of the Week after posting double-doubles against Auburn (15 pts./10 rebs.) and Mizzou (16 pts./11 rebs.).
- Chosen College Sports Madness SEC Player of the Week after logging double-doubles against Florida (19 pts./10 rebs.) and Vanderbilt (17 pts./12 rebs.).
- Selected MVP of the Junkanoo Jam after averaging 15.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals during the tournament.
- Produced 24 points and seven rebounds in a crucial home victory over LSU.

- Tallied 16 points, two assists and a team-high eight rebounds against Mississippi State in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament.
- Knocked down three treys in the fourth quarter, leading UT scoring with 18 points in its come-from-behind win over UAB.

2017-18 - FRESHMAN

- Averaged 12.0 points and 7.6 rebounds as a freshman, starting 32 of 33 games.
- Ranked No. 11 in rebounding in the SEC as a rookie, including second among freshmen.
- Finished sixth all-time in rebounds per game by a Lady Vol freshman at 7.6, leading the team on the boards six times during the 2017-18 season.
- Shot .483 from the field, .329 on three-pointers and .740 from the free throw line.
- Knocked down 25 threes to rank fourth on the team.
- Notched nine double-doubles to tie Tamika Catchings for fifth-most double-doubles ever recorded by a Lady Vol freshman. Tennessee alums ahead of her on the list are Chamique Holdscraw (16), Sheila Frost (11), Bashaara Graves (10) and Candace Parker (10).
- Tallied 10+ points in 20 contests and led the team in scoring on five occasions.
- Scored in double figures during 13 of the final 18 games of her freshman campaign.
- Davis' 33 points against Arkansas was the third-highest point total ever by a Lady Vol freshman behind only Tamika Catchings (35) and Candace Parker (34).
- In that Arkansas game, she added 14 rebounds, four assists, one block and one steal, setting new career highs in points, rebounds and three pointers made.
- Named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 13 after the effort vs. Arkansas and an 11-point, eight-rebound result vs. #18/18 Georgia.
- Banked in a three at the buzzer to give Tennessee a win over Auburn in the second round of the SEC Tournament; finishing with 16 points and five rebounds.
- Posted a double-double in her first NCAA appearance, tallying 18 points, 11 rebounds and three assists vs. Liberty.
- Tallied solid performances vs. No. 2/4 Texas (16 pts., 10 rebs.), No. 18/24 Stanford (7 pts., 10 rebs.) and #5/5 Notre Dame (12 pts., 5 rebs.).
- Led the team in scoring with 18 points against #7/6 South Carolina while pulling down 10 rebounds in the teams' meeting in Knoxville on Feb. 25.
- Also had 18 points each vs. Alabama, Alabama State and Ole Miss.
- Named SEC Freshman of the Week (11/28) after averaging 12.7 points and 8.3 rebounds as Tennessee went 3-0 at the Cancun Challenge.
