STORYLINES

• **#CHECKERNEYLAND SEC OPENER:** No. 11/12 Tennessee begins its SEC slate at home against No. 20/22 Florida in front of a sold-out #CheckerNeyland Stadium at 3:30 p.m. ET Saturday on CBS. It marks the second consecutive game that Neyland Stadium is sold out, a first since the 2016 season - Florida (Sept. 24, 2016) and Alabama (Oct. 15, 2016). This is the sixth #CheckerNeyland game, which showcases Tennessee's iconic checkerboard pattern through the stadium. ESPN's College GameDay is also on hand for the first time since these two teams met in 2016. The show is originating from Knoxville for the 10th time overall. The Vols are 3-0 for the first time since 2016 and are looking to complete a perfect September for the first time since that fall. Florida, which has won five straight in the series, owns wins over Utah and USF.

• **HEUPEL ERA:** After a record-setting debut, **Josh Heupel** is in his second season as head coach of the Vols. Of the eight first-year Power Five head coaches hired in 2021, no coach won more regular season games than Heupel (7). He also produced the most 2022 NFL Draft picks among coaches making their debut with a new team (5). The 27th head coach in Vol football history, Heupel's 38 victories since the start of the 2018 season ranks tied for eighth among active FBS head coaches. With the win over No. 17/14 Pitt in Week 2, Heupel became the first UT coach in the AP Poll era (since 1936) to record at least one road win (non neutral) over a top-20 team in each of his first two seasons with the program. Heupel won at No. 18/17 Kentucky last season.

• **63-6:** Tennessee tallied its highest point total in the **Josh Heupel** era in a 63-6 rout of Akron last Saturday in Neyland Stadium. A crowd of 101,915 marked the Vols' first sellout for a non-conference game since Oklahoma in 2015. UT racked up 676 yards of total offense, representing the fifth-highest total in school history. It was the third time the Vols went over 600 yards in the Heupel era, and UT put up 416 yards in the first half. The 57-point margin of victory was the Vols' highest since defeating UL-Monroe, 70-3, on Sept. 23, 2000. QB **Hendon Hooker** was 14-of-18 for 298 yards and two touchdowns. He was lifted after the first series of the second half. WR **Jalin Hyatt** notched his first career 100-yard receiving game with five catches for 166 yards and two touchdowns. Tennessee limited the Zips to 35 yards rushing and 1-of-13 on third down. They notched four sacks and 11 tackles for loss. LB **Jeremy Banks** had a team-high five tackles, one TFL and a forced fumble. True freshman LB **Elijah Herring** collected a game-high two sacks.

• **DEFENSIVE TRAJECTORY:** DC **Tim Banks'** defense continues to improve. The Vols are allowing 14.3 points per game, have forced multiple turnovers in three of their first four games and are ranked third in the league in third-down conversion stops (11-of-46, 23.9). After ranking second in the SEC in tackles for loss last season with 102, the Vols have picked up where they left off with 22 TFLs, good for third in the league. UT is also third in the SEC in sacks with eight. LB **Aaron Beasley** leads the Vols with 22 tackles.

• **THE SEC'S NO. 1 OFFENSE:** A year after setting a school record for points in a season and becoming the FBS' most improved offense (No. 7, 39.3 ppg), Tennessee's offense is still thriving. The Vols are averaging 52.0 points per game, which is No. 1 in the SEC and No. 4 in the FBS. UT has put up at least 30 points in six straight games, a first since they did it in seven straight games from 2016-17. They average 553.7 yards per game of total offense this season, a mark that ranks No. 1 in the SEC and No. 3 in the FBS. UT's passing offense is No. 5 in the FBS and No. 2 in the SEC with 371.3 ypg through the air.

NEYLAND GAME DAY INFORMATION

- **MEDIA WILL CALL:** For those media members picking up their credentials, pickup is located at the Tennessee Media Relations Office on the ground floor of the Anderson Training Center on Fridays from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. On gameday, credential pickup is located at Gate 21 Will Call of Neyland Stadium (northwest side). Gameday pickup opens four hours prior to kickoff.
- **MEDIA PARKING:** For those media members approved for media parking, parking passes in 2022 will be digital and accessed via mobile devices through email via Ticketmaster.
- **MEDIA ENTRANCE:** Media will enter the press box through Gate 15A on the west side of Neyland Stadium.
- **PRESS BOX:** The Tom Elam Press Box opens 3.5 hours prior to kickoff. A pregame meal will be served beginning two hours prior to kickoff. After entering Gate 15A, take the elevator to Level 5.
- **STOKELY FAMILY MEDIA CENTER:** Stokely Family Media Center on the field level of Neyland Stadium opens 3.5 hours prior to kickoff and is available for credentialed photographers/videographers. A pregame meal for photographers/videographers

will be served beginning two hours prior to kickoff. To access Stokely Family Media Center, take the elevator to Level 1, enter the stadium concourse, and walk north (left). Just inside Gate 21, take the stairs down to the Gate 21A ramp. Enter the field area and walk along the back of the north end zone to the media center, which is located in the northeast corner of Neyland Stadium.

- **PRINTABLES:** With the exception of flip cards and final game books, media materials will be available digitally in accordance with FWAA recommendations. This includes in-game stats and game notes. Digital links will be distributed prior to game day for game notes.
- **POSTGAME PRESS CONFERENCES:** Tennessee's home postgame press conference will be held with media in person in the Stokely Family Media Center. There will be no Zoom option in 2022. The visiting team postgame press conference will be held adjacent to the visitor's locker room in the south end zone of Neyland Stadium. Media can access this area via the south end zone tunnel. On-demand video of Tennessee's press conference will be distributed via Tennessee's media share folder.

NOTING THE TENNESSEE-FLORIDA SERIES

- Tennessee and Florida are meeting for the 52nd time with the Gators owning a 31-20 advantage in the series.
- Tennessee and Florida have played each other every season for 32 straight years dating back to the 1990 season.
- The two teams will play each other in September for the 27th time in the last 29 meetings.
- Florida has been the first SEC opponent Tennessee has faced 18 times since 2000.
- Four of the last eight meetings have been decided by 10 points or less.
- This is the first time that the two teams will face each other both ranked since the Sept. 16, 2017, meeting when No. 24 Florida beat the No. 23 Vols, 26-20, in Gainesville. It's the first time they have both been ranked in a Knoxville meeting since Sept. 24, 2016, when No. 14 UT beat No. 19 UF, 38-28.
- Florida has captured five straight in the series. The Vols' last victory was that 2016 contest.
- Josh Heupel** is 6-1 against teams from Florida (0-1 vs. Florida, 3-0 vs. South Florida, 2-0 vs. FAU, 1-0 vs. Florida A&M).
- Heupel** is facing first-year Florida coach Billy Napier for the first time. After defeating Akron and coach Joe Moorhead in his first year with the Zips last weekend, Heupel improved to 10-1 in meetings with coaches in their first year with a school in his time as a head coach after going 3-0 last year and 6-1 at UCF.
- A total of 542 miles separate the two schools down I-75.
- Tennessee starting left tackle **Gerald Mincey** is a Florida transfer. A native of Fort Lauderdale, he played in 11 games in two seasons with the Gators.

Vols Fall To No. 11 Florida in SEC Opener, 38-14

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Trailing by only three at halftime, Tennessee was outscored 21-0 in the second half, falling to No. 11 Florida, 38-14, in its SEC opener at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium on Saturday evening.

Quarterback **Hendon Hooker** earned his second straight start and completed 13-of-23 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns, while a balanced rushing attack of **Jabari Small**, Tiyon Evans and Hooker combined for 148 yards on the ground.

The Vols never turned the ball over and forced their first fumble of the season late in the second quarter, but it was not enough to overcome the Florida offensive attack.

After conceding a touchdown on the Gators' first drive, Hooker and Small ripped off back-to-back rushes of 15 and 16 yards, respectively, before Hooker connected with Evans on a slip screen for a 47-yard score with 7:05 left in the first quarter.

The Vol defense held the Gators to a field goal after the Florida offense drove into the red zone. Tennessee's defense then forced a 3-and-out giving the Vols the ball at the 11. Four plays later, UT finally connected on the elusive deep pass as Hooker found senior JaVonta Payton on a go-route on the left side for a 75-yard touchdown to go ahead 14-10 early in the second quarter.

Alontae Taylor provided a key forced fumble in the second quarter that was recovered in the red zone by **Aaron Beasley**. The Gators would outscore the Vols 28-0 the rest of the way.

Trevon Flowers led all tacklers with a career-best 15 on the night. Flowers' 15 tackles were the most in a game for Tennessee since Daniel Bituli had 19 in a 17-13 win over Kentucky on Nov. 9, 2019.

- Sixth-year senior quarterback **Hendon Hooker**, who assumed the starting role for Tennessee in a 2021 Week 3 game vs. Tennessee Tech, is back as one of the top players in all of college football.
- The former Virginia Tech QB and 2022 second-team preseason All-SEC selection, is 9-5 as a starter at Tennessee and 17-12 for his collegiate career. In 2021, Hooker was named Tennessee's first Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist since Erik Ainge in 2006.
- **Hooker** has accounted for multiple touchdowns in 15 of his last 16 games entering the Florida game. He's thrown at least one touchdown pass in every game he has started at UT (14) and enters the Florida game with multiple TD passes in six straight contests.
- **Hooker** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 15 straight games, which is second in UT history. Heath Shuler (1992-94) holds the school record of 18.

This season his passing efficiency is currently fourth in the SEC at 176.10.

- Of the 72 FBS QBs who attempted 300+ passes in 2021, **Hooker** tied for the fewest interceptions among those with three. He enters the Florida game having not thrown a pick in his last 184 attempts, which is a school record. His last interception occurred in the Georgia game on Nov. 13, 2001. HENDON HOOKER OLDEST STARTING QB IN TENNESSEE HISTORY

- Experience and knowledge are two key traits to Sr. QB **Hendon Hooker's** game. When he starts under center against Florida he will be 24 years, eight months and 11 days old.
- Hooker is the oldest starting quarterback in Tennessee history and second-oldest active starting quarterback in the SEC behind Georgia's Stetson Bennett (24 years, 10 months, 25 days old on Sept. 24).
- Prior to Hooker, the oldest starting quarterback in Tennessee history was Daryl Dickey. Dickey's last start occurred in the 1986 Sugar Bowl against Miami on Jan. 1. He was 24 years, six months and 21 days old.
- Prior to Hooker, the oldest UT quarterback to start a season opener was Jarrett Guarantano, who in the COVID-19 shortened season of 2020, was 22 years, 10 months and 12 days old.

HOOKER + TILLMAN = SIX

- Sr. QB **Hendon Hooker** and Sr. WR **Cedric Tillman** form one of the top duos in all of college football. The two have connected for at least one touchdown in eight games overall, totaling 11 TDs.
- Last season, the two connected for touchdowns 10 times, which tied for fourth among QB-to-WR combos in UT single-season history. Peyton Manning-to-Marcus Nash is the single-season school record with 13 in 1997.
- Their latest TD connection was in dramatic fashion and gave the Vols a 34-27 overtime win at No. 17 Pitt on Sept. 10 when Hooker hit Tillman for a 28-yarder.
- The two need two more touchdowns together to crack the UT career QB-to-WR touchdown combos.

EPIC STARTS

- Tennessee outscores opponents an amazing 228-61 in the first quarter under **Josh Heupel**, including 190-51 in 2021 and 38-10 this season. The Vols have scored at least one touchdown in the first quarter in every game under Heupel (16 games).
- **Josh Heupel** teams are known for quick starts. In 52 games as a head coach, Heupel's squads have outscored opponents 675-275 in the first quarter (228-61 at UT, 447-214 at UCF). No active FBS head coach scores more points per first quarter in a career than Heupel (12.98; min. - multiple seasons coached). Nick Saban is second at 12.29). *via SportSource*
- In the last two seasons combined under Heupel, the Vols are first in the nation in first-quarter scoring at 14.25 points per game. Georgia is second at 10.94.
- In the last two seasons combined under Heupel, Tennessee is first in the Power Five in first-quarter scoring differential (+10.44). Georgia is second at (+9.56).
- Since the start of the 2018 season, **Josh Heupel** ranks second among all FBS coaches in first-quarter scoring differential (+7.69, min. - multiple seasons coached). Alabama's Nick Saban is first (+8.44).
- Heupel's teams have scored at least one touchdown in the first quarter in 48 of the 52 games he has coached. The last time that did not occur was his UCF team in the 2020 Boca Raton Bowl vs. BYU.

FAST, FUN, REAL

- A **Josh Heupel** specialty, Tennessee led the nation in offensive plays per minute at 2.99 in 2021. Ole Miss was second at 2.87. By comparison, the Vols averaged 2.36 a year prior to Heupel's arrival, which was 58th in the FBS.
- In the last two seasons combined under Heupel, Tennessee is averaging a nation-best 2.96 plays per minute. Ole Miss is second at 2.87. During that same span, the Vols are averaging a nation-best 1.79 offensive points per minute. Ohio State is second in that category at 1.57.
- From 2018-20, Heupel's UCF teams averaged a nation-high 3.04 plays per minute.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Heupel-coached teams lead the nation in offensive plays per minute (3.01, min. - multiple seasons coached), offensive points per minute (1.64, min. - multiple seasons coached) and offensive plays per game (78.94, min. - multiple seasons coached).

NOTEBOOK

RESPONDING IN THE SECOND QUARTER

- A big emphasis of Tennessee's offseason was second-quarter improvement. The Vols were outscored 143-109 in the second stanza in 2021. However, this season, Tennessee is outscoring opponents 59-7 in the second quarter.
- Pitt in Week 2 was the only team to score on the Vols in the second quarter this season. UT has not allowed a score at home in the second quarter this season.

IN JOSH HEUPEL'S 52 GAMES AS A HEAD COACH ...

- His teams have scored 30 points 45 times (12 times at Tennessee) and own a 38-7 record when doing so. The only times his teams did not hit 30 points was at Cincinnati (2019), Tulsa (2020), BYU (2020), Florida (2021), Ole Miss (2021), Alabama (2021) and Georgia (2021).
- His teams have scored 40 points 29 times (nine times at Tennessee)
- His teams have scored 50 points 15 times (five times at Tennessee)
- His teams have scored 60 points four times (three times at Tennessee)
- His teams have put up 400 yards of total offense in a game 47 times (13 times at Tennessee).

CEDRIC TILLMAN BACK FOR MORE

- Sr. WR **Cedric Tillman** elected to return for another season. A candidate for the Maxwell Award, Biletnikoff Award and a preseason All-American, Tillman is statistically the top returning wide receiver in the SEC this season. Last season, he became the first 1,000-yard receiver at Tennessee since Justin Hunter in 2012.
- Tillman** enters the Florida game with 100-yard receiving games in six of his last nine games. He became the first Vol with four straight 100-yard efforts since Joey Kent did in seven consecutive games in 1996.
- With his 162-yard performance at No. 17 Pitt in Week 2, **Tillman** entered the UT career top 10 in 100-yard games. He is tied with six other players for eighth place. One more would put him in a three-way tie for sixth place with Robert Meachem (2004-06) and Lary Seivers (1973-76) with seven.
- Tillman** owns the school record for consecutive games with a touchdown catch with seven, which broke Joey Kent's old mark. The streak came to an end in the season opener against Ball State. He has caught at least one touchdown in eight of his last 10 games.
- Tillman** also holds the school record for single-game touchdown catches with three, a feat he achieved in his last game in the 2021 Music City Bowl vs. Purdue.
- Tillman's** 14 career touchdown catches rank tied for 12th in Vol annals. He is one shy of 11th place held by Tim McGee (15 from 1982-85) and two shy of 10th place held by Alvin Harper (16 from 1987-90).
- In 2022, **Tillman** is third in the SEC in catches (17), fifth in receiving yards (246) and fourth in receiving yards per game (82.0).

NOTING TIM BANKS' ATTACKING DEFENSE

- Tim Banks** returns as the Vols' defensive coordinator this season, and his unit features more depth. In 2021, Banks' squad ranked second in the SEC and tied for eighth in the nation with 102 tackles for loss. That figure ranked tied for fifth in UT single-season annals and the most since the 2000 team produced a school-record 114. This season they have racked up 22, which is tied for third in the SEC.
- Tennessee features one of the most experienced safety tandems in the country. Sr. **Jaylen McCollough** (30 starts) and Sr. **Trevon Flowers** (28 starts) are starting in the defensive backfield together for the third consecutive season. McCollough has started 17 straight games entering the Florida contest. Flowers came up with a huge 12-yard sack in overtime and registered an interception in the end zone in the first half in a week 2 win at No. 17 Pitt.
- Sr. edge rusher **Byron Young** is poised for a monster 2022. The preseason first-team All-SEC selection is in his second season at the FBS level after racking up 11.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks in 2021. Young came up clutch with two tackles for loss, a game-high three QB hurries and a sack in a Week 2 win at No. 17 Pitt on Sept. 10. He was tabbed the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week.
- Banks' defense was disruptive in Week 2 at Pitt. They forced two turnovers, collected nine tackles for loss and four sacks, forced two fumbles and registered one interception. They also tallied 16 quarterback hurries, representing Tennessee's first double-digit game in that category since tallying 10 against Georgia State on Sept. 8, 2012.
- In a 63-3 Week 3 win over Akron, the Vols racked up a season-high 11 tackles for loss, marking the sixth time in 16 games of the Heupel era with double-digit TFLs.
- Tennessee has not allowed a point in the first half at home this season. The Vols held Ball State and Akron both scoreless in the first half.

NOTEBOOK

EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE

- Offensive line coach **Glen Elarbee** welcomes back four of his five starters on the offensive line this season. The only starter departure was tackle Cade Mays, who was selected in the sixth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Carolina Panthers.
- Center **Cooper Mays** (13 starts), guards **Jerome Carvin** (33 starts) and **Javonte Spraggins** (16 starts) and tackle **Darnell Wright** (31 starts) all return. Including reserves, **Dayne Davis** (3 starts) and **Ollie Lane** (5 starts), Tennessee's offensive line boasts a combined 105 starts and is one of the most experienced in the country.
- Wright has started 23 consecutive games entering the Florida game, while Carvin has notched 18 straight starts. The super senior Carvin did not allow a sack in 896 offensive snaps last season, and he has allowed only one sack in his last three seasons combined. Carvin has not allowed a sack in 16 straight games.

STAFF CONTINUITY

- Tennessee retained nine of its 10 on-field assistant coaches on **Josh Heupel's** staff, including both coordinators in OC **Alex Golesh** and DC **Tim Banks**.
- The only departure was at wide receivers as Kodi Burns took the same role with the NFL's New Orleans Saints. **Kelsey Pope** was hired as his replacement in the spring. Pope, however, was already in the building last season and worked closely with Burns as a quality control analyst last fall.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

- The Vols produced two first-time UT starters in the season-opener against Ball State on Sept. 1. Florida transfer redshirt sophomore **Gerald Mincey** made the start at left tackle, while redshirt junior wide receiver **Bru McCoy** got his first start as a Vol. McCoy started three games at Southern Cal in 2020.
- UT did not have any first-starters in Week 2 at Pitt. CB **Kamal Hadden** made his first start of the season, but he started two games last season (at Alabama, vs. Purdue).

STRIKING ON FIRST PLAY

- For the third time under head coach **Josh Heupel**, Tennessee scored on its first offensive play, doing so vs. Ball State in the season opener. Following an interception by **Tamarion McDonald**, QB **Hendon Hooker** found WR **Jalin Hyatt** on a 23-yard touchdown pass on the first offensive play of the season.
- The Vols scored on the first offensive play twice last season, a 2-yard run by **Jabari Small** vs. Pitt on Sept. 11 and a 75-yard touchdown pass by **Hendon Hooker** to JaVonta Payton at Kentucky on Nov. 6.

32 MAKE TENNESSEE DEBUT

- Thirty-two Tennessee players have made their debuts with the Vols this season, including 20 true freshmen.
- A total of 25 Tennessee players made their debuts in the season-opening win over Ball State on Sept. 1, including 17 true freshmen.
- The true freshmen include: OL **Mo Clipper Jr.**, DB **Christian Harrison**, LB **Elijah Herring**, QB **Tayven Jackson**, DL **Jayson Jenkins**, DL **Joshua Josephs**, OL **Addison Nichols**, DL **James Pearce Jr.**, LB **Kalib Perry**, DL **Jordan Phillips**, OL **Masai Reddick**, RB **Dylan Sampson**, DB **Jourdan**

- The eight non-freshmen who made their UT debuts were: TE **Charlie Browder**, WR **Bru McCoy**, OL **Gerald Mincey**, QB **Navy Shuler**, DB **Andre Turrentine**, DB **Wesley Walker**, RB **Patrick Wilk**, DL/LB **Noah Young**.
- In Week 3 against Akron, true freshmen RB **Hunter Barnes**, LB **Ben Bolton** and DB **Cameron Miller** all made their debuts. Four non-freshmen made their debuts as well against the Zips, including LB **Jackson Hannah**, DL **Austin Lewis**, DB **Trel Riley** and LB **West Shuler**.

FORCING TURNOVERS

- Last season, Tennessee forced 16 turnovers under defensive coordinator **Tim Banks**, which ranked tied for fifth in the SEC. This season they have forced five turnovers, which is tied for fifth in the league.
- The Vols picked up where they left off last season, registering two interceptions and a forced fumble in the opener vs. Ball State and one pick and a forced fumble at No. 17 Pitt in Week 2. UT forced another fumble in Week 3 vs. Akron. Their six turnovers forced and +3 TO margin are tied for second in the SEC.
- The Vols have won the turnover battle seven times under **Josh Heupel** and tied it six times. UT has not lost the turnover battle in six straight contests. In the entire Heupel era (16 games), the Vols are +6 in turnover margin.

REDZONE OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY

- Tennessee has converted all 16 of its redzone trips offensively this season, including 14 for touchdowns. They are one of three SEC teams who have been perfect in double-digit trips to the redzone, Vanderbilt (17-17) and Texas A&M (3-3).
- In two seasons under **Josh Heupel**, the Vols have scored on 65-of-74 (87.8) redzone trips with 53 touchdowns.

POLLING

- Tennessee is ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 for the third straight week and its second straight week in the AFCA Coaches Poll. The Vols are No. 11 in the AP and No. 12 in the Coaches. The No. 11 ranking marks Tennessee's highest position in the AP poll since Oct. 9, 2016, when it cracked the top-10 on the charts at No. 9. It also marks the highest position a Heupel-coached team has held since the final poll of the 2018 season when the UCF Knights held the No. 11 spot.
- Heupel's UCF teams were ranked a total of 27 weeks in his three seasons in Orlando. Their highest ranking in the Heupel era was No. 7 when it played in the 2018 AAC Championship Game and then the Fiesta Bowl.
- Tennessee holds two wins over top-20 teams in the Heupel era with both coming on the road. The Vols defeated No. 18/17 Kentucky, 45-42, last season in Lexington, and they topped No. 17/14 Pitt, 34-27, in overtime on Sept. 10. That victory was UT's first over a ranked non-conference opponent on the road since it beat No. 6 Miami, 10-6, on Nov. 8, 2003, in Orange Bowl Stadium.

TILLMAN, HOOKER, YOUNG ALL TAKE IN HONORS POST PITT

- After helping lead Tennessee to a thrilling non-conference road victory at No. 17 Pitt, quarterback **Hendon Hooker**, wide receiver **Cedric Tillman** and defensive end Byron Young all earned honors.
- Hooker** claimed SEC Offensive Player of the Week, marking the second time in his career that he's earned the award. He did so following a road win at No. 18 Kentucky on Nov. 8, 2021. Hooker was also the recipient of the Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8 following the Pitt victory.
- Young** was the first Vol to win SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors since Kyle Phillips did so on Oct. 15, 2018. He notched four tackles, a game-high two tackles for loss, a sack and a game-high three quarterback hurries.
- Tillman** was the recipient of the Senior Bowl's National Offensive Player of the Week as his 28-yard touchdown catch at Pitt was the game-winner. He finished with nine receptions for 162 yards, including 43 after the catch.

NOTEBOOK

CHASE MCGRATH CLUTCH

- Senior placekicker **Chase McGrath**, the Southern Cal transfer who is in his second year at Tennessee, has been clutch for the Vols. McGrath in 3-of-4 in field goals this season and 19-of-19 in PATs.
- McGrath booted two crucial field goals and converted all four of his PATs to help push No. 24 Tennessee past No. 17 Pitt, 34-27, in overtime in a non-conference road game. Following a turnover in the final seconds of the first half, McGrath drilled a 37-yard field goal as time expired to give the Vols a 24-17 lead. Then in the fourth quarter, McGrath extended Tennessee's lead to seven as he nailed a 51-yarder with 8:57 to play. It was his longest made field goal as a Vol and the longest by a UT player since Brent Cimaglia made a 53-yarder vs. UAB in 2019. It was the longest by a Vol in a road game since Cimaglia's 51-yarder at Florida in 2017.
- For his UT career, McGrath is 15-of-20 and 1-of-2 from 50 or more yards. He has connected on 85-of-85 PATs as a Vol.

TRENDING JALIN HYATT

- After an up-and-down sophomore season, WR **Jalin Hyatt** is off to a stellar start in 2022.
- Hyatt ranks second in the SEC in catches (18), third in yards (267), second in touchdown catches (3) and second in receiving yards per game (89.0.).
- Hyatt's explosive play has been on display his entire career. This season, he is tied for the SEC lead in 30+ yard plays (3), and he is first in the league in 40+ yard plays (3).
- Hyatt racked up 166 receiving yards and two touchdowns in Week 3 against Akron, giving Tennessee a receiver with 150+ receiving yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 1981 after **Cedric Tillman** had 162 yards at Pittsburgh in Week2. In 1981, Willie Gault had 217 yards against Vanderbilt in the regular-season finale and Anthony Hancock had 196 in the Garden State Bowl against Wisconsin.

CELEBRATING ANNIVERSARIES

- This season will see three significant Tennessee anniversaries.
- **100 Years in Orange:** Sept. 23, a day before the Vols host SEC rival Florida, marks the 100th anniversary of the first time Tennessee's football team wore orange jerseys. The Vols first donned orange jerseys in their season opener on Sept. 23, 1922 when head coach M.B. Banks led UT to a 50-0 victory over Emory & Henry.
- Sept. 2 marked 50 years to the day that Condredge Holloway became the first Black player to start at quarterback for an SEC team. He made history as the Vols beat Georgia Tech, 34-3, in Atlanta in front of a national television audience on ABC.
- Sept. 16, the day before the Vols hosted Akron, UT recognized the 50-year anniversary of the first night game in Neyland Stadium. No. 7 Tennessee beat Joe Paterno's No. 6 Penn State, 28-21, on Sept. 16, 1972.
- The Volunteers are also celebrating the 25th anniversary of their 1997 SEC Championship. Consensus first-team All-American and Maxwell Award winner Peyton Manning led the Vols to an 11-2 season and beat Auburn, 30-29, in the SEC Championship Game.

#CHECKERNEYLAND

- An electric, sold-out Neyland Stadium awaits Tennessee's Southeastern Conference opener against Florida on Saturday in what will see the return of the Volunteers' popular fan-driven initiative #CheckerNeyland.
- #CheckerNeyland showcases Tennessee's iconic checkerboard pattern throughout Neyland Stadium, which will be sold out for a second consecutive game. This will be the sixth #CheckerNeyland in program history.

- Saturday will mark the 10th time that Tennessee has hosted ESPN College GameDay and first time since Sept. 24, 2016. It stands as Tennessee's 22nd all-time appearance on the nationally-televised, on-campus pregame show.
- Including Saturday, the past three times Tennessee has hosted College GameDay have been for a matchup with Florida (2012, 2016, 2022).
- Saturday marks the ninth Tennessee-Florida game that College GameDay has broadcast from, regardless of location.
- Tennessee-Florida is tied for the third most frequently-visited matchup by the College GameDay crew, trailing only Alabama-LSU and Ohio State-Penn State and tied with Alabama-Georgia.

NOTEBOOK

VOLS MEMORABLE TRIUMPHS OVER GATORS

- The Tennessee-Florida rivalry is one of the best in the Southeastern Conference and has featured numerous unforgettable moments and historic games for both sides. Below are some of the most memorable Tennessee victories in the all-time series:

In Knoxville:

- 2016: Overcoming a 21-point deficit in the second quarter, QB Joshua Dobbs and the 14th-ranked Volunteers snapped an 11-game losing streak to No. 19 Florida, scoring 38 straight points from the second quarter into the fourth for a 38-28 victory.
- 2004: James Wilhoit was the hero, and redeemed an earlier missed extra-point, in a back-and-forth battle between the No. 13 Vols and the No. 11 Gators. Wilhoit lifted Tennessee to a 30-28 victory with a 50-yard field goal with six just seconds remaining.
- 1998: Pandemonium reigned in Knoxville as the goalposts came down and the press box shook when sixth-ranked Tennessee took down No. 2 Florida in overtime, 20-17. Al Wilson forced four fumbles and a field goal sailed wide left as Vol Nation stormed the field in ecstasy on the road to a National Championship season.
- 1992: In a flash, heavy rains doused Neyland Stadium as a young Heath Shuler and company drowned the fourth-ranked Gators, 31-14, with coach Phillip Fulmer stepping in for a sidelined Johnny Majors. The Vols nabbed their second top-15 win in as many weeks, with the rainfall coming down so hard the TV broadcast went down.
- 1990: After a defensive battle through the first 30 minutes, Dale Carter's kickoff return touchdown to start the second half opened the floodgates as the Vols turned a 7-3 halftime advantage into a 45-3 rout in Steve Spurrier's first season as the Gators' head coach.

In Gainesville:

- 2003: A 48-yard Hail Mary pass from Casey Clausen to James Banks just before halftime propelled Tennessee to a 24-10 win over No. 17 Florida.
- 2001: In a game that was postponed to December and was set to determine the SEC East champion, No. 5 Tennessee defeated No. 2 Florida, 34-32. Running back Travis Stephens rushed for 226 yards (the ninth-best single-game rushing total in UT history) and two touchdowns to lead the way for Tennessee's offense.
- 1971: A Tennessee team that included offensive lineman Phillip Fulmer secured a 20-13 victory at Florida despite being down to its third-string quarterback, Phil Pierce. Pierce threw a 20-yard touchdown pass that ended up being the game-winner in the third quarter.

IMPACT TRANSFERS

In April 2021, the NCAA ratified a rule change that allowed all athletes who have not yet transferred the ability to do so one time in a college career and be immediately eligible to play. Former Oklahoma national champion quarterback and UCF head coach Josh Heupel took the reins of Tennessee football in 2021 and led the proud program to an immediate resurgence. A 2018 National Coach of the Year finalist and two-time recipient of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach Award, Heupel was officially announced as the Volunteers' 27th head football coach on Jan. 27, 2021, by Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White, who he worked alongside at UCF.

Taking over a program coming off a 3-7 season and the departure of several players prior to his arrival, Heupel instilled a strong culture built on trust, accountability and relationships. Picked to finish fifth in the SEC East, Heupel guided Tennessee to a 7-6 first-year campaign, including a 4-4 mark in conference play to take third place in the division. The Vols beat six teams by at least 24 points, and Heupel became just the fifth UT head coach in the last 80 years to win seven or more games in his debut season. Of the eight first-year Power Five head coaches in 2021, no coach won more regular season games than Heupel. Tennessee secured the program's 54th all-time bowl berth with a Music City Bowl appearance, and Heupel became the fifth Vol coach in the last 70 years to lead the Vols to a bowl in his debut season.

The Vols shattered eight team single-season records in 2021, including points (511), total offensive yards (6,174), touchdowns (67), point after touchdowns made (67), total first downs (316), rushing first downs (164), fewest interceptions thrown (3) and passing efficiency (167.10).

NFL scouts and executives took notice of Tennessee's development under Heupel. A total of five Vols were called in the 2022 NFL Draft, representing the program's most since 2017 and more than UT produced in its last three drafts combined. Heupel's crop of five draftees ranked top five in the SEC and top 11 in the country. The five picks were the most of any FBS first-year head coach.

Tennessee held its centennial celebration of Neyland Stadium Shields-Watkins Field in 2021, and the iconic venue is in its 101st year. During the spring and summer of 2022, Neyland Stadium experienced an upgrade with two new videoboards, including one in the north end zone for the first time. As part of the "My All" Campaign, two new premium areas were installed with the addition of the North End Social Deck below the new videoboard and a new lower-west premium club with enhanced chairback seating. The modernization project brought Neyland Stadium's capacity to 101,915 for the 2022 season. The stadium previously held a capacity of 102,455 from 2010-21.



THE FUTURE

The UT Board of Trustees in June of 2022 approved a request to adjust the scope and budget of the ongoing Neyland Stadium renovations project originally approved in 2017. That approval brought the overall Phase I budget to \$288 million, which will be fully funded. A critical element in the plan is major and necessary upgrades to the south side and perimeter of the stadium, including the widening of concourses, construction of expanded gates and entryways and provision of additional restrooms and concessions areas. The ongoing renovations phase will provide annual deliverables through an anticipated project completion date of Fall 2026.

THE RETURN OF V-O-L-S

For the first time in over a decade, the iconic V-O-L-S letters will rise gloriously on the south end of Neyland Stadium in 2022. Two sets with an orange background and white lettering were installed this summer as part of stadium upgrades under the leadership of Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Danny White. A V-O-L-S history:

Summer 1966

The 8-foot tall backlit VOLS letters—originally with orange lettering and a white background—were installed at the top of the stadium on the south side. From summer 1966 until 1978, they were lit every evening. Beginning in 1978, they were turned off—with the exception of during night football games—as part of an energy conservation program.

Summer 1976

As part of renovations prior to the 1976 season, the design of the letters shifted to white lettering with orange background.

Summer 1999

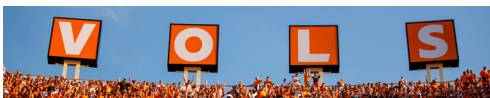
Neyland Stadium installed its first edition of a videoboard, and the letters are moved to the top of the videoboard. The design of the letters also shifted to orange lettering with white background.

Summer 2009

Due to Neyland Stadium's videoboard being replaced, the letters were removed entirely from the stadium for the first time since the 1965 season.

November 2010

The version of letters that overlooked Neyland Stadium from 1999 to 2009 were auctioned off to Copper Celler Family of Restaurants through United Way of Greater Knoxville's online auction.

Vols Bounce Ball State In Opener, 59-10

Quarterback **Hendon Hooker** accounted for 233 yards of total offense and four touchdowns as Tennessee rolled past Ball State, 59-10, in its season opener. It marked the second straight year that the Vols opened on a Thursday night. UT eclipsed the 45-point mark for the fourth straight game. That feat matched a school record set over the final four games of the 1993 season. The first two plays of the season couldn't have gone any better for Tennessee. **Tamarion McDonald**, making the start at the STAR position, intercepted Ball State on the first play of the game and returned it to the 23-yard line. On the Vols' first play from scrimmage, Hooker then found **Jalin Hyatt** for a 23-yard touchdown. Nine different receivers were the beneficiaries of passes from Hooker on the night. Hooker accounted for back-to-back rushing scores in the first half, representing his first multi-rushing touchdown game as a Vol. UT took a 38-0 lead into halftime and scored 45 unanswered to start. Hooker and the starters were lifted after the first series of the third quarter. The Vols scored on their first four drives and were 7-of-7 in redzone chances. **Kamal Hadden** added an interception in the second quarter. **Warren Burrell**, **Christian Charles** and **Aaron Beasley** each led Tennessee with eight tackles apiece.

#24 Vols Knock Off #17 Pittsburgh In Overtime

Quarterback **Hendon Hooker** found **Cedric Tillman** open in the end zone for a 28-yard touchdown in overtime, and the Big Orange defense came up with a monumental stop as 24th-ranked Tennessee took down No. 17 Pittsburgh on the road, 34-27, capping a thrilling edition of the Johnny Majors Classic at Acrisure Field. The victory marked Tennessee's first road triumph over a top-20 non-conference foe since defeating No. 6 Miami (Fla.), 10-6, on Nov. 8, 2003. The Vols fell behind 10-0 in the first six minutes of the game but settled down and outscored the Panthers, 24-7, the remainder of the half to take a lead. Safety **Trevon Flowers** came up with a big interception in the end zone to prevent a Pitt score, and **Tyler Baron** forced a fumble that led to a **Chase McGrath** 37-yard field goal as time expired in the first half. Tennessee's defense responded in the second half as Pitt quarterback starter **Kedon Slovis** exited due to injury. After a scoreless third quarter and multiple special teams miscues from Tennessee, Pitt rallied to tie the game after Flowers muffed a punt at the UT 39. On the Vols' first OT possession, Hooker escaped pressure, stepped up in the pocket and found Tillman for what proved to be the game-winning score. On the Panthers' OT possession, Flowers redeemed himself, sacking QB Nick Patti for a 12-yard loss on third down. Pitt turned it over on downs on its next play. Tennessee racked up four sacks, nine tackles for loss and 16 quarterback hurries on the day. Linebacker Aaron Beasley led all tacklers with 14, while Baron and defensive end **Byron Young** notched two tackles for loss.

#15/16 Volunteers Zap Zips, 63-6

In front of a sold-out Neyland Stadium crowd of 101,915 celebrating the 50th anniversary of the iconic venue's first night game, Tennessee piled up 676 yards of total offense on the way to a 63-6 thrashing of Akron—good for the highest point total and victory margin of the **Josh Heupel** era. Tennessee quarterback **Hendon Hooker** was stellar in the opening 30 minutes and early in the third quarter before retiring to the home sideline, ending the evening with 298 yards and two scores to improve his total to 37 TD tosses as a Vol, ranking seventh all-time on Rocky Top. Junior receiver **Jalin Hyatt** and running backs **Jaylen Wright** and **Dylan Sampson** had two touchdowns apiece to lead the offense. Hyatt shined with five receptions for a career-best 166 yards and two TDs, marking the fifth 150-yard receiving performance by a Vol under Heupel's leadership. Defensively, the Vols blanked Akron in the first half and didn't allow points until 7:35 remained in the third period. The Zips were held to 276 yards of total offense, including just 35 yards on the ground. The Big Orange had 11 tackles for losses, including four sacks. Freshman linebacker **Elijah Herring** had two of those quarterback takedowns to lead the team, while fellow linebacker **Jeremy Banks** was tops in total stops with five.

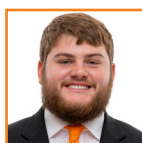
