THE MATCHUP

- · Norfolk State is the last of three teams on UT's schedule it has never faced before, alongside Georgia Southern (12/12/23) and Tarleton State (12/21/23).
- · After competing in the NCAA Tournament in both 2021 and 2022 and then finishing 22-11 (9-5) last year, Norfolk State was picked second in the MEAC preseason poll.
- Junior guard Jamarii Thomas, who has six 20-point games this season and has thrice scored 27plus, leads the Spartans in ppg (18.0), apg (4.1) and spg (2.5).
- Tennessee's lone prior game against a current MEAC school was a 99-65 home victory over Coppin State on 11/19/06.
- · The Volunteers have also played four prior games, all at home, against then-MEAC members: 1-0 vs. Florida A&M (under Rick Barnes), 2-0 vs. North Carolina A&T and 1-0 vs. Savannah State (in the NIT).
- Rick Barnes is 7-0 against current MEAC schools: 3-0 vs. Coppin State, 2-0 vs. Morgan State and 2-0 vs. South Carolina State.

MAKING HISTORY

- Rick Barnes was named a 2024 first-time nominee for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, among just 17 new names on the North American list, alongside individuals such as Vince Carter and Bill Laimbeer. He is now one of only three active college coaches, at any level, on the ballot, joining Miami's $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{Jim}}$ Larrañaga (2023 nominee) and Memphis' Penny Hardaway (2024 nominee for his playing career).
- Santiago Vescovi is one assist away from joining Allan Houston as the only Volunteers with at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists. Both tallied over 1,400 in the first category.
- Vescovi is also just three made 3-pointers away from becoming the 10th player in SEC history and third Vol to hit 300 in a career.
- Josiah-Jordan James' next start will make him the 15th UT player with 100, while Santiago Vescovi's next such nod will make him the fourth Volunteer with 123.
- · In addition, James is just one rebound away from becoming the 18th player with 700 at Tennessee.

NEWS & NOTES

- · With a win over Norfolk State, Rick Barnes would own victories over 200 different current DI teams as a head coach.
- · Tennessee is on a 27-game nonconference home winning streak, dating back to the 2020-21 season opener (11/8/20), with victories over schools such as Arizona, Cincinnati, Colorado, Illinois and Kansas during that stretch. A victory over Norfolk State would clinch a fourth straight perfect non-conference home slate.
- · The Volunteers have been ranked in 100 separate AP Poll releases under Rick Barnes after being featured 74 times in the 14 seasons prior to his arrival.
- UT went undefeated (5-0) in December, its third time in the last 16 seasons (2008-present) doing so, alongside Dec. 2018 and Dec. 2020, both of which also came during Rick Barnes' tenure.
- The Vols limited Tarleton State (12/21/23) to 30.0 percent fieldgoal shooting and 9.1 percent 3-point shooting, the third time in the last 14 seasons it held a foe to both 30 or below and 10 or below.

UT has reached the top six (**6**) of the AP Poll in five of the last six years, including four in a row, after doing so six times prior.



The Volunteers are one of just eight DI teams with at least four (4) 1,000-point scorers. *The list is on Page 5.*

THE PRESEASON PICK

- Tennessee placed first in the SEC preseason poll, as voted on by a select panel of both SEC and national media members.
- This was the fifth time the Volunteers have been picked to win the league since polling began in 1989-90, with each nod coming since the turn of the century in advance of the 2000-01 season. UT's five first-place selections during that time are more than the combined total of every other school in the league except for Kentucky, as Florida (twice) and Alabama (once) are the only schools that have taken the pole position besides the Vols and Wildcats.
- The Volunteers have been picked first in two of the last four seasons, as their prior such recognitions came in 2020-21, 2008-09, 2007-08 and 2000-01.

- Three Volunteers were tabbed to Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame "Starting Five" Preseason Watch Lists.
- Zakai Zeigler was one of 20 players on the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Preseason Watch List.
- Santiago Vescovi was among 20 individuals on the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Preseason Watch List.
- Dalton Knecht, before even playing a game at Tennessee, was one of the 20 selections for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Watch List.

SEC PRESEASON MEDIA PLAUDITS

- Santiago Vescovi earned Preseason First Team All-SEC status, while Zakai Zeigler collected Preseason Second Team All-SEC recognition from the media. Both earned the same designation before (and after) the 2022-23 campaign.
- Tennessee was one of four schools with multiple Preseason All-SEC distinctions, joining Alabama, Arkansas and Kentucky.
- Vescovi is the fifth multiple-time Preseason First Team All-SEC designee in program history—polling began in 1989-90—alongside Allan Houston (thrice), Tony Harris (thrice), Chris Lofton and Tyler Smith.
- Zeigler is the eighth Volunteer to pick up multiple Preseason All-SEC honors, a list that also features Jeronne Maymon and Jarnell Stokes.

- Santiago Vescovi claimed Blue Ribbon Preseason Fourth Team All-America honors. He was one of four SEC players on the list, joining Mississippi State's Tolu Smith (Second), Texas A&M's Wade Taylor IV (Second) and Auburn's Johni Broome (Third).
- Vescovi, for the second straight year, also made both the Naismith Trophy Preseason Watch List and the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List.

TOP-10 TEAM

 The Volunteers entered the 2023-24 campaign as a near-unanimous preseason top-10 team according to both computer and human polls. A list of Tennessee's preseason top-10 positions is below ("C" indicates computer polls and "H" indicates human polls):

- Tennessee, as noted above, began the season at No. 9 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 10 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll. This is the fifth time in program history UT was in the top 10 of both major preseason polls, joining 2018-19 (No. 6/6), 2007-08 (No. 7/7), 2000-01 (No. 9/8) and 1998-99 (No. 9/9).
- The Volunteers were in the AP preseason top 10 for the seventh time, as they also earned the distinction in 2009-10 (No. 10) and 1975-76 (No. 9), the latter of which was before the formation of the Coaches Poll.
- This was the fourth straight year Tennessee started in the AP top 20, setting a program record. It was also the fifth year in a row the Vols were in the Coaches Poll top 25 to open the season, matching the best mark in UT history (2006-07 to 2010-11).

TOP-10 (AND TOP-FIVE) TAKEDOWNS

• Tennessee is 7-3 in its last 10 games against AP top-10 opponents. The lone setbacks during that stretch were 12/17/22 at No. 9 Arizona, 11/21/23 versus No. 2 Purdue (Honolulu) and 11/22/23 against No. 1 Kansas (Honolulu), all by single digits. The Vols are also 5-2 in their last seven contests versus AP top-five foes.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Volunteers' 2023-24 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) representing 13 states, as well as and Uruguay.
- UT has two players each from New York and North Carolina, plus one each from Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Maine, Minnesota, South Carolina. Tennessee. Texas and Virginia.
- Tennessee has three fifth-year players, one senior, four juniors, three sophomores, two redshirt freshmen and three true freshmen.
- Nine Vols stand 6-5 or shorter, while seven players are 6-6 or taller.

FIVE IN A ROW

- Tennessee has played in every NCAA Tournament since 2018. Those five consecutive berths tie for the second-longest streak in program history. The Vols appeared in six straight NCAA Tournaments from 2006-11 and made five trips in a row from 1979-83.
- The Volunteers' current streak includes a pair of Sweet Sixteen appearances (2018 and 2023).
- UT has earned a top-five seed in each of its last five NCAA Tournament trips: No. 3 in 2018, No. 2 in 2019, No. 5 in 2021, No. 3 in 2022 and No. 4 in 2023.

WINNING WAYS

- Over the last seven seasons, dating back to the start
 of the 2017-18 campaign, Tennessee leads all SEC
 teams in total victories (153; T-1st) and postseason
 wins (15), while placing a close second in winning
 percentage (.718). In that span, the Vols have
 claimed a pair of SEC championships, winning the
 regular season in 2018 and the tournament in 2022.
- In that same seven-year stretch, the Vols are one of only three SEC schools with an overall winning percentage over .700, alongside Auburn (.722) and Kentucky (.705). No other SEC team is at even .670.
- In regular season SEC play over the same seven-year period, Tennessee (74-33) owns a league-best .706 winning percentage and joins Kentucky (72-35) as the only programs to log at least 70 league victories.
- Over the last three seasons only (2021-24), UT owns a 61-22 (.735) overall record. That is good for the comost victories (tied with Texas A&M) and the best winning percentage of any SEC team in that span.

RACKING UP RANKED VICTORIES

- Over the past four seasons (2020-24), Tennessee leads all SEC teams in AP top-25 wins with 16, a figure that is eighth nationally. It is also tied for with Arkansas for first among SEC schools in AP top-10 victories with seven, placing co-fifth nationally. UT's five AP top-five wins over that span pace the SEC and are tied for the most of any team in America.
- The seven AP top-10 triumphs during that time are: #1 Alabama (2/15/23), #3 Kansas (11/25/22), #3 Auburn (2/26/22), #4 Kentucky (2/15/22), #5 Kentucky (3/12/22), #6 Arizona (12/22/21) and #10 Texas (1/28/23).
- Over the last four seasons (2020-24), Tennessee has played a league-high 30 games against AP Top 25 opponents, going 16-14 (.533). The Vols are the only SEC team, regardless of number of games, with a winning record against ranked foes during that span, while Alabama is second at 13-15 (.464).
- Tennessee (30), Alabama (28) and Arkansas (28) are the only SEC teams to play over 25 ranked opponents since the start of the 2020-21 campaign.

TOPPLING THE TEAM AT THE TOP

- · With its 68-59 home victory over top-ranked Alabama last season (2/15/23), Tennessee became one of only 17 DI programs with at least six wins over AP No. 1 teams.
- · Rick Barnes has led UT to two of those victories, as the program won each of its first two matchups with the AP No. 1 team during his tenure. The Volunteers, now 2-1 in such contests in his tenure, previously defeated Gonzaga, 76-73, on 12/9/18 in the Jerry Colangelo Classic in Phoenix.

BEATING THE BEST

- · Under Rick Barnes' tutelage, Tennessee has defeated many of the most successful programs in college basketball history. The list includes 35 total victories over 12 (of only a possible 37) different NCAA champions: Arizona, Arkansas (6x), Cincinnati, Duke, Florida (8x), Kansas (2x), Kentucky (10x), Louisville, Maryland, North Carolina, NC State (2x) and Wisconsin.
- · The Volunteers also own additional non-conference victories during Barnes' tenure over schools such as Colorado, Georgia Tech, Gonzaga, Illinois, Iowa, Memphis, Purdue, Wake Forest, Washington, West Virginia and VCU.
- In his 37 years as a head coach, Barnes owns 175 total wins over 28 (of the 37) programs with a national title. Of the other nine, six he has never faced.

POLL PRESENCE

- Tennessee has played 178 games as a ranked team in the AP Poll under Rick Barnes, posting a stellar 133-46 (.743) record. Over 64.0 percent of the Volunteers' games since Barnes arrived in 2015-16 have come with the team ranked in the AP Poll.
- Furthermore, UT owns a 112-41 (.732) record while ranked in the AP top 20 during Barnes' tenure, an 81-28 (.743) mark while in the top 15, a 61-19 (.763) ledger while in the top 10, a 25-7 (.781) tally while in the top five, a 17-2 (.895) record while in the top three and a 7-1 (.875) mark while ranked No. 1.
- The Vols are 22-20 (.524) in top-25 matchups under Barnes, including 17-13 (.567) with both teams in the top 20, 9-7 (.562) with both in the top 15 and 6-5 (.545) with both in the top 10.

TOP-TIER TRIUMPHS

- Tennessee is 18-20 (.474) against top-15 teams during Rick Barnes' tenure, including 12-12 (.500) versus top-10 foes, 9-7 (.562) against top-five opponents and 4-4 (.500) versus top-three teams.
- The Volunteers are particularly dominant at home against elite competition under Barnes, posting a 10-4 (.714) record at Food City Center when facing top-15 teams, including a 7-2 (.778) mark with six straight wins against top-10 foes. In addition, the program is a perfect 5-0 versus top-five teams in Knoxville, Tenn., with Barnes at the helm.

· Tennessee also has two exhibition wins over topfive foes. Prior to the 2022-23 season, it defeated #2 Gonzaga, 99-80, on 10/28/22 in the Legends of Basketball Classic in Frisco, Texas. In advance of this season, it knocked off #4 Michigan State, 89-88, on 10/29/23 in East Lansing, Mich.

VOLS AD WHITE HAS HOOPS DNA

- Tennessee Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics Dr. Danny White played college basketball at both Towson (1998-2000) and Notre Dame (2000-02). The Fighting Irish reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament both of his years there.
- Danny's father, Kevin White, was a legendary athletic director, leading six departments, including five at the DI level and three in a Power Five conference, over a 38-year career. Duke won two national titles in men's basketball (2010, 2015) during his 13-year tenure there, which ended with his retirement in 2021. Notre Dame also won a title in women's basketball (2001) during his first season there, which was also Danny's first year as a student at the school.
- · Danny's younger brother, Brian White, is the athletic director at Florida Atlantic. In his fifth year there, 2022-23, the Owls reached the Final Four in men's basketball for the first time and defeated Tennessee, 62-55, in the Sweet 16.
- · Danny's older brother, Mike White, was a four-year starter at Ole Miss from 1995-99 began a college coaching career one year after graduating. White is now in his 12th year as a DI head coach, including his eighth in the SEC and second at Georgia. He served as the head coach at Florida from 2015-22 and made four NCAA Tournament trips, including reaching the 2017 Elite. White was also the head coach at Louisiana Tech from 2011-15, posting a 101-40 record.

LEGENDARY LEADERS

- · Rick Barnes is one of six active UT head coaches who have guided their Tennessee program to a No. 1 national ranking.
- · Five of those coaches, including Barnes, led their team to a No. 1 ranking within the last six years.

- During the 2022-23 academic year, the Tennessee athletics department won its second straight SEC All-Sports Trophy. The Volunteers claimed both the men's and women's titles, becoming just the second team in the conference ever to do so.
- · The Volunteers have earned the trophy in both of Danny White's full academic years as the AD after never previously winning it.
- · Tennessee also finished an all-time best sixth nationally in the 2022-23 LEARFIELD Directors' Cup.

DOMINANT "D" A UT TRADEMARK

- Last season, Tennessee spent 15 weeks with the nation's best defensive efficiency, per KenPom. After a 64-50 win over third-ranked Kansas in the Battle 4 Atlantis championship game, the Vols posted the best defensive efficiency rating in the history of the KenPom database (since 1999-2000).
- Four times in the last six years, Tennessee has finished among the top 10 nationally in KenPom's year-end defensive efficiency ratings: sixth in 2018, fourth in 2021, third in 2022 and first in 2023.
- The Vols are coming off a 25-win campaign during which they finished first in Division I in KenPom adjusted defensive efficiency (87.5), 3-point defense (26.5), third in scoring defense (57.9 ppg) and third in field-goal percentage defense (37.3).
- Tennessee was a perfect 22-0 last season when holding its opponent to fewer than 60 points.
- Twelve times last season, Tennessee's foe failed to score greater than 50 points. No team in Division I held its opponent to 50 or fewer more times than Tennessee (Houston also had 12 such outings).
- Associate head coach Justin Gainey is in his second season as UT's defensive coordinator in 2023-24.

HAPPY AT HOME

- Over the last four seasons, since 2020-21, the Volunteers are 48-5 (.906) on their home court.
- Fifth-year guard Josiah-Jordan James owns a 59-11 (.843) mark at Food City Center during his career. Over half of those home setbacks (six) came during his freshman year in 2019-20. Fellow fifth-year guard Santiago Vescovi is 53-9 (.855) at home since his first appearance on 1/4/20, following his midyear enrollmenmt. Four of his nine losses came during his freshman season in 2019-20.
- During eight seasons under head coach Rick Barnes, the Vols are 113-22 (.837) at Food City Center. Twice during the Barnes era, UT has gone undefeated at home: 18-0 in 2018-19 and 16-0 in 2021-22.

4x1,000

- Tennessee, Auburn, Memphis, New Mexico, St. Bonaventure, St. John's (six), TCU (five) and Villanova are the only eight DI teams with four -plus 1,000-point scorers, while just 19 others have three.
- Santiago Vescovi (1,413), the lone Volunteer to enter 2023-24 in quadruple figures and one of 23 1,400-point scorers in UT history, hit that figure on 12/17/22 at Arizona in his 90th contest.
- Dalton Knecht (1,147) reached the 1K mark on 11/10/23 at Wisconsin in his 69th career outing and his second as a Volunteer. He scored 959 points in 67 games over two seasons at North Colorado.
- Josiah-Jordan James (1,107) reached the milestone on 11/14/23 versus Wofford in his 111th appearance and is now one of 48 Vols with 1,100-plus points.
- Jordan Gainey (1,043) entered quadruple digits on 11/29/23 at North Carolina in his 71st collegiate outing and his seventh at Tennessee. He scored 929 points across 64 games in two years at USC Upstate.
- That group owns a combined 4,710 points at the Division I level, an average of 1,178 each.

SHARPSHOOTERS

- Four players on Tennessee's roster made at least 50 3-pointers in 2022-23. Santiago Vescovi and Zakai Zeigler made 91 and 51 as Volunteers, respectively, while Dalton Knecht hit 77 at Northern Colorado and Jordan Gainey hit 70 at USC Upstate.
- In addition, Josiah-Jordan James hit 56 3-pointers in 2021-22, but injuries limited him to just 24 games last year and he made 40 long-range shots.
- That quintent of guards now has a combined career 3-point mark of 36.2 percent (887-of-2,448).
- Gainey, Knecht and Vescovi all own 145-plus made 3-pointers on over 37.0 percent shooting as collegians. Their combined career 3-point clip is 38.1 percent (605-of-1,591).

ZEIGLER ATTACKED REHAB

- Junior guard **Zakai Zeigler** suffered a season-ending left ACL tear three minutes into Tennessee's home finale against Arkansas last year on 2/28/23.
- Zeigler underwent surgery on 3/13/23 and spent the entire offseason rehabbing under the collaborative direction of athletic trainer Chad Newman, director of sports performance Garrett Medenwald and director of rehabilitation John Dean.
- After missing the final six-plus games of 2022-23, all three of UT's contests during its foreign tour to Italy and both 2023-24 exhibition outings, Zeigler returned for the season opener, notching five assists in 12 minutes versus Tenneessee Tech (11/6/23).
- Zeigler, who led the SEC in assists last season (5.4 apg), earned SEC All-Defensive Team honors in each of his first two years as a Vol and was a Second Team All-SEC pick in 2022-23. He had 254 assists with a 1.98 assist/turnover ratio his first two years.

 In Zakai Zeigler's three seasons, Tennessee is 7-4 against AP top-10 teams. He is averaging 13.1 ppg in the seven victories and 8.3 ppg in the four defeats.

FIVE FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

- Tennessee has a quintet of talented freshmen on its roster this season, including three first-year players and two redshirt freshmen.
- Cameron Carr, who stands 6'5 and hails from Eden Prairie, Minn., is a consensus four-star, top-65 recruit who joins the Vols from Link Academy (Mo.). His father, Chris, played in the NBA for six years and his older sister, Christianna, played Power Five basketball at three schools.
- Freddie Dilione V is a 6'5 guard from Fayetteville, N.C., who joined the Vols as an early enrollee in January 2023 before redshirting the remainder of the season. Prior to reclassifying up, the Word of God Christian Academy product was a top-25 recruit according to 247Sports.
- J.P. Estrella stands 6'11 and the forward from Scarborough, Mass., is the co-tallest player on UT's roster. A unanimous four-star, top-80 recruit, he is the son of a former Boston College women's basketball player, Allie (Booth) Estrella, and a graduate of powerhouse Brewster Academy (N.H.).
- D.J. Jefferson is a 6'5 guard who graduated from Minnesota Prep Academy (Minn.) and is a native of Richardson, Texas, becoming UT's first player ever from the Dallas area. A four-star recruit who placed No. 51 in On3's rankings, Jefferson spent the entire 2022-23 campaign with the Vols and redshirted.
- Cade Phillips, a 6'9 forward, is graduate of Link Academy (Mo.), where he teamed with Carr to lead the team to a 27-1 record. An ESPN four-star recruit from Jacksonville, Ala., his dad (John David), uncle and grandfather all played football at Alabama, while his mother (Reagan) played basketball there.

CLOSING IN ON 200

• With recent home wins over Georgia Southern (12/12/23), George Mason (12/5/23), #10 Texas (1/28/23) and Tarleton State (12/21/23), Rick Barnes has now beat 199 current DI schools as a head coach. He was the head coach at two of those four.

BARNES ERA 12-GAME POINT TOTALS

• Dalton Knecht's 188 points rank as the fourth-most for a player through 12 games in any season of Rick Barnes' tenure at Tennessee, behind only Kevin Punter Jr. (266 in 2015-16), Grant Williams (241 in 2018-19) and Admiral Schofield (218 in 2018-19).

POLL VOLS

- Tennessee has appeared in every AP Poll since the 2021-22 preseason rankings, a total of 46 releases in a row, surpassing the prior program record of 37 from March 1999 to Feb. 2001. The Volunteers have been in the top 10 in 19 of those 46 releases, including the top five thrice.
- Dating back to the 2020-21 preseason poll, Tennessee has been in 60 of 63 releases (all but the final three of 2020-21), with 24 top-10 appearances and still three in the top five.
- UT has peaked at sixth this year, ascended to second nationally last season, ended 2021-22 at a seasonbest fifth and placed as high as sixth in 2020-21. The Vols, who held the No. 1 spot in 2018-19, have now been top-six in five of the past six years, including each of the last four, after hitting that mark just six times in program history before Rick Barnes' arrival.

UNPRECEDENTED RUN

 Per Knoxville News Sentinel writer Mike Wilson, Tennesssee has been ranked in the top five of the AP poll 18 times under head coach Rick Barnes after being top-five just 17 times in the prior 70 seasons.

 Tennessee owns an 82-3 (.965) record under Rick Barnes when leading by double digits at halftime.

SHOOTING TO SUCCEED

- Over the last three seasons (2021-24), Tennessee owns a 25-4 (.862) record when connecting on double-digit 3-pointers in a game, including a 17-1 (.944) ledger at home. The Volunteers were 20-2 (.909) in the first 22 games of that stretch before splitting their last four such outings in 2022-23.
- During Rick Barnes' first six seasons on Rocky Top, 2015-16 to 2020-21, Tennessee was a strong 20-12 (.625) in such games, including 12-3 (.800) at home, but the last three years have been even better.

SECOND TIME'S A CHARM

 Over the last five years (2018-23), Rick Barnes guided Tennessee to a 20-7 (.741) record in regular season rematch games (SEC Tournament not included).

"SACK" COMPARISON

- Tennessee has posted 75 sacks—a defensive stop on three straight possessions—this season. Conversely, it has only been sacked 50 times. UT is averaging 6.25 sacks for and just 4.17 sacks allowed (+2.08).
- The Volunteers' high mark for sacks in a game is 11 against Tennessee Tech (11/6/23), while their low is four both at Wisconsin (11/10/23) and versus topranked Kansas (11/22/23) in Honolulu.
- Offensively, the top sack total Tennessee has allowed is seven against Syracuse (11/20/23) in Honolulu), while the fewest it has conceded is two at Wisconsin (11/10/23).

(TOP) TWO IN A ROW

- In its final two games of the Allstate Maui Invitational, Tennessee played #2 Purdue (11/21/23) and #1 Kansas (11/22/23) in Honolulu.
- According to Will Warren, Tennessee became the third team in the last 50 years to play the top two teams in the AP Poll in back-to-back regular season nonconference games. The Volunteers joined Bellarmine in 2021-22 (92-50 loss at #1 Gonzaga on 11/19/21 and 75-62 loss versus #2 UCLA in Las Vegas on 11/22/21) and Kansas in 1989-90 (89-83 win at #2 LSU on 11/17/89 and 91-77 win versus #1 UNLV in New York on 11/22/89).
- This was the first time UT ever played back-to-back games against AP top-three teams. It twice previously played consecutive games versus AP top-five foes: 1/18/06 at #4 Memphis (88-79 loss) and 1/21/06 versus #2 Florida (80-76 win), plus 12/1/65 at #2 Michigan (71-63 loss) and 12/7/65 versus #4 Vanderbilt (53-50 loss).
- Per FOX Sports Research, the Vols became the first team since Jan. 1972 to play the AP's top two teams on back-to-back days, as Loyola Chicago last did so on 1/28/72 versus #1 UCLA (92-64 loss) and 1/29/72 against #2 Marquette (69-67), both at home.

THREE TOUGH TESTS

- After playing Purdue and Kansas, Tennessee next went to #17/16 North Carolina (11/29/23) for an ACC/SEC Challege matchup in Chapel Hill, N.C.
- It marked the first time in program history UT played three consecutive non-conference games in a single season against AP top-25 foes and their first time doing so in any games since Jan. 2012. They also did so Jan. 2004 (four in a row) and Feb. 2001. Each of those stretches included just one game away from home, while this one was exclusively so.
- Purdue (Zach Edey), Kansas (Hunter Dickinson) and North Carolina (Armando Bacot) all feature AP Preseason First Team All-American big men.
- During that stretch, Purdue (48-30), Kansas (22-8) and North Carolina (38-16) all took at least 14 more free throws than the Vols, who were minus-54 in attempts across the three outings.

TRAVEL TIME

- Tennessee played four consecutive non-home games from 11/20/23 to 11/29/23, marking its first time doing so since the 2011-22 season when had four straight from 11/21/11 to 11/28/11.
- Of the Volunteers' seven contests in November, only two came on their home court. The only other Power Six teams that did not play at home at least thrice in November were Oregon and Texas A&M.

FOUR OF FIVE

- Following its four straight road games, including the three against top-20 foes, Tennessee returned home to play George Mason (12/5/23). It then faced #20/18 Illinois (12/9/23) at Food City Center in its next outing, making it four top-20 foes in a fivegame span.
- This was the fourth time in program history the Volunteers faced four AP-ranked teams in a five-game span. Most recently, in Jan. 2012, it faced #13 Florida (home win), #20 Mississppi State (road loss), #2 Kentucky (home loss) and #13 Connecticut (home win) in a five-game stretch. In Jan./Feb. 2004, the Vols had seven such foes in a nine-game span and went 2-5 in those outings. The other occassion was Feb./March 2002 to close the regular season and UT went 1-3 in those affairs
- This stretch in 2023 marked the the first time Tennessee has played such a stretch exclusively in non-conference play, as well as its first time doing so while ranked.
- Additionally, this was the third time UT played four top-20 teams in a five-game span (2012 and 2002).

STRENUOUS START

 As of 12/11/23, through its first nine games of the season, Tennessee ranked fifth in the nation in KenPom strength of schedule rankings and was the only Power Six team in the top seven of the list.

STUFFING THE STAT SHEET

- Facing top-ranked Kansas (11/22/23) in Honolulu, Jonas Aidoo amassed eight points, 11 rebounds, three blocks and three steals. He became the first Vol in Rick Barnes' tenure to compile that stat line, as well as the first DI player to do so against a Power Six foe since DePaul's Nick Ongenda on 2/25/23 versus Georgetown.
- In the ensuing outing, Aidoo recorded 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting at #17/16 North Carolina (11/29/23).
- Then, against George Mason (12/5/23), Aidoo had a career-high 17 points, eight rebounds, a co-careerbest four assists and one block, becoming the first Vol with those numbers since Josiah-Jordan James on 3/1/22 at Georgia.
- Aidoo then posted 14 points and seven rebounds in the victory over No. 20/18 Illinois (12/9/23).
- In the next contest, Aidoo scored a career-high 29 points on 10-of-16 shooting, also setting career bests in makes and attempts. He added 11 rebounds to notch his third-career double-double, as well as two blocks and two steals. Prior to Aidoo, the last four Power Six players with at least 29p/11r/2b/2s in a game were consensus National Player of the Year Oscar Tshiebwe of Kentucky (3/17/22), eventual top-25 pick Kris Murray of lowa (1/13/22), consensus First Team All-American and eventual top-10 pick Johnny Davis of Wisconsin (1/3/22) and consensus First Team All-American and eventual No. 1 overall pick Cade Cunningham of Oklahoma State (2/27/21).
- During the four-game stretch from 11/29 (North Carolina) through 12/12 (Georgia Southern), Aidoo averaged 18.3 ppg and 7.5 rpg on 60.9 percent (28of-46) shooting. He posted 13-plus points in all four contests after only hitting that mark twice in the first 59 games of his career.

DK DOMINANT AT THE DEAN DOME

- Dalton Knecht posted one of the finest outings in Tennessee basketball history on 11/29/23 on the road at No. 17/16 North Carolina, finishing with 37 points, six rebounds, three assists, two blocks and one steal. He shot 13-of-17 from the field, 4-of-8 beyond the arc and 7-of-8 from the stripe.
- Knecht exited the game with 1:39 left after injuring his left ankle on a drive to the rim and was thus unable to attempt the two free throws he earned.
- Despite his early departure, Knecht tied La Salle's Lionel Simmons (1/9/88) for the most points ever by a visitor at the Dean E. Smith Center. Their shared 37-point mark trails only Kent State's Doug Grayson (41 on 12/6/67 at Carmichael Arena) on the all-time visitor scoring list versus the Tar Heels at any venue.
- The only other visitors ever to score 35-plus points versus North Carolina at the Dean E. Smith Center are Syracuse's Cole Swider (2/28/22), Florida State's Xavier Rathan-Mayes (1/24/15), Duke's J.J. Redick (2/7/06) and Maryland's Len Bias (2/20/86), all of whom did so in ACC play.
- The 37 points are the second-most against North Carolina, regardless of location, in the last 15 seasons (2009-24), behind just the 47 by Kentucky's Malik Monk (12/17/16 in Las Vegas), with only six others even reaching 35 during that 15-year span.
- Knecht is one of just 21 players ever to score 37-plus points against the Tar Heels, including one of only 10 to do so away from home.
- Knecht's 37 points are the co-second-most by a Volunteer in the last 21 seasons, trailing only the Grant Williams (43 on 1/23/19 at Vanderbilt) and matching another total by Williams (37 on 1/9/18 at Vanderbilt). Kevin Punter Jr. (36 on 1/23/16 versus South Carolina), is the only other Vol with a 35-point game in Rick Barnes' tenure. Knecht's is the only one in a non-conference game (first at UT in 21 seasons).
- Only 12 prior Vols—30 occurrences—have posted at least 37 points in a game: Dale Ellis (two), Ernie Grunfeld (four), Allan Houston (three), Reggie Johnson, Bernard King (nine), Dyron Nix (two), Lum Reeder, Ron Slay, Tony White (three), Ron Widby, Carl Widseth and Grant Williams (two). Only seven prior Vols—11 occurrences—hit that mark in a true road game and just eight prior Vols—12 occurrences—did so in a non-conference contest.
- Knecht joined Grant Williams (two aforementioned games at Vanderbilt) and Ron Slay (1/4/03 at New Mexico) as the only Tennessee players with at least 37 points in a contest in the last 33 seasons.
- Knecht tied for the second-most points in a nonconference true road game in program history, matching Allan Houston (12/22/90 at Oregon State) and trailing only Tony White (49 on 12/30/86 at Florida State), with those the only other two such performances with even 33-plus points.
- Prior to Knecht, the last Vol to make 13 field goals on fewer than 20 shots was Jordan McRae (13-of-18 on 2/19/13 at LSU). The only other Vol with 13 makes, regardless of attempts, in Barnes' tenure is Kennedy Chandler (13-of-20 on 12/4/21 at Colorado).
- Knecht became the first DI player this season to score 37 points against a Power Six team and the third to do so in a regulation game versus any foe.
- The last SEC player with 37-plus points in a nonconference outing was Vanderbilt's Scotty Pippen Jr. (38 on 3/4/21 at Cincinnati).
- Knecht's 37 points tied Kentucky's **Antonio Reeves** (3/4/23 at Arkansas) and Kentucky's **Oscar Tshiebwe** (1/17/23 versus Georgia) for the most by an SEC player in a regulation game over the last three seasons (2021-24), while only Alabama's **Brandon Miller** (41 on 2/22/23 at South Carolina) had more in an overtime affair during that span.
- Knecht became the second DI player in the last 14 seasons with 37 points on 17 or fewer shots, six rebounds, three assists, two blocks and one steal, joining Eastern Kentucky's Jarelle Reischel (11/22/15 versus Longwood).

ONLY A DOZEN

• Tennessee conceded just 12 first-half points against Tennessee Tech in the season opener on 11/6/23, the fewest it has allowed in any frame to a DI opponent this century (since the 2000-01 season).

IN-STATE SUCCESS

- Tennessee has won 12 of its last 13 games against in-state opponents and is 29-6 overall against fellow Volunteer State foes under coach Rick Barnes.
- Those 29 wins have come against Vanderbilt (13x), Tennessee Tech (6x), ETSU (3x), Lipscomb (2x), Austin Peay, Chattanooga, Memphis, Tennessee State and UT Martin.

BEATING THE BLUEGRASS BLUE BLOOD

- From 1995-2015—a 21-season stretch that spanned the tenures of six UT head coaches—the Volunteers had a 9-33 (.214) record against Kentucky, including a 7-26 (.212) mark versus ranked Wildcat squads.
- Since **Rick Barnes** arrived in advance of the 2015-16 campaign, the Tennessee is 10-9 (.526) against Kentucky, with a 9-5 (.643) ledger against ranked Wildcat teams. No other team has even seven-plus wins over Kentucky in that time, while just Auburn (six) and Kansas (six) have even five-plus.
- The Vols are 6-1 against Kentucky teams ranked in the top six, including a perfect 6-0 in non-road games, under Barnes. That ledger includes a 5-1 record versus top-five Wildcat squads.
- UT topped Kentucky at least once each season from 2016-17 through 2021-22, including going 2-1 in 2021-22, 2018-19 and 2017-18. The Vols beat the Wildcats in Knoxville, Tenn., four years in a row, from 2015-16 through 2018-19, and then again in 2021-22.
- Under Barnes, the Vols are 5-3 at home against Kentucky, 3-5 on the road and 2-1 in neutral-site SEC Tournament play.

RECAPPING THE VOLS' TRIP TO ITALY

- Tennessee went a perfect 3-0 during a three-game exhibition tour of Italy that saw the team visit Milan, Como, Florence and Rome from July 31 - Aug. 9.
- The Volunteers posted back-to-back wins over the Lithuanian U21 National Team in Florence. They won the first game by 40 points, 97-57, and the second by 26 points, 116-90.
- Tennessee closed out the competitive portion of the trip by defeating Rome-based professional club A.S. Stella Azzurra by 46 points, 97-51, in the Blue Stars' home gym.
- Fifth-year guard Dalton Knecht was UT's top scorer in Italy, averaging 16.3 ppg. He shot 52.9 percent from the field and 48.0 percent from beyond the arc.
- Sophomore forward Tobe Awaka averaged a doubledouble through the three games, putting up 13.7 ppg and 10.3 rpg.
- Junior guard Jordan Gainey averaged 12.7 ppg on 39.1 percent 3-point shooting, while fifth-year guard Santiago Vescovi logged 12.0 ppg and 5.0 apg on 56.6 long-range shooting.
- Redshirt freshman guard Freddie Dilione V—who enrolled early and joined the program midseason last year—saw his first action as a Vol and impressed with averages of 11.0 ppg and a team-high 5.3 apg.
- Rick Barnes had associate head coach Justin Gainey to serve as Tennessee's acting head coach during all three games.

BIG SHOWING ON A BIG STAGE

- Sophomore forward Tobe Awaka was a top contributor and rebounding juggernaut for Team USA during its fourth-place showing at the 2023 FIBA Men's U19 World Cup in Debrecen, Hungary, in late June and early July.
- Awaka started six of seven games for Team USA and was the squad's second-leading scorer, averaging 11.6 ppg on 60 percent shooting from the field.

His 10.6 rpg led Team USA and were the secondmost among all players in the tournament. Awaka's 20.4 rebounds per 40 minutes far and away led all players who logged significant minutes during the event

- Awaka, despite averaging just 20.7 mpg, was the only player in the tournament to record four doubledoubles and was also one of only three individuals to average a double-double.
- With a 18.1 FIBA efficiency rating for the tournament, Awaka paced Team USA and finished fifth among all players at the elite global event.
- In the 10 games as a freshman in which he played 15 minutes or more, Awaka averaged 7.6 rpg. He also ranked seventh among all Division I players (min. 150 minutes) in offensive rebounding percentage (19.1) and top-15 nationally in total rebounding percentage (20.9).

ACADEMIC ACCOLADES

- For each of the last two years, Tennessee has earned the NABC's prestigious Team Academic Excellence Award for posting a team GPA of 3.0 or better. The 2022-23 squad owned a 3.33 GPA.
- Both those years, the Volunteers were one of only three SEC teams to earn the award.
- Basketball student-athletes are at their busiest during the spring semester, but the Vols have still managed to improve their team GPA each of the last two springs, going from a 3.08 in spring 2021 to a 3.26 in spring 2022 to a 3.29 in spring 2023.
- During that same two-year span, Santiago Vescovi was named to the NABC Honors Court each year thanks to his personal GPA exceeding a 3.2.

INAM: "IT"S NOT ABOUT ME"

- Tennessee notched an assist on 66.2 percent of its made baskets last season. That rate ranked second among all DI teams.
- Zakai Zeigler and Santiago Vescovi led the way with 161 (5.4 apq) and 102 (3.1 apq) assists, respectively.
- During 2022-23 SEC play, the Volunteers logged an assist on 64.9 percent of their made field goals.

BACK TO BACK

- In 2022-23, for the second straight season, Santiago Vescovi led the SEC in 3-point percentage during league games (38.7) last year. He also placed second in 3-point makes per game (2.71) during SEC play.
- As a sophomore in 2021-22, Vescovi shot a leaguebest 44.5 percent from deep during SEC play while making an SEC-leading 3.17 3-pointers per game.

DANDY DOZEN

- Tennessee set a program record in 2022-23 with 12 wins by 20-plus points. Five of those wins were against SEC opponents.
- The Volunteers won nine games by at least 30 points, including three in SEC play. Six of those triumphs were by 35-plus and four, including two in SEC action, were by at least 40. UT's largest win was by 54 points. 94-40. over Alcorn State on 12/4/22.

ZEIGLER FAMILY RELOCATED TO ROCKY TOP FOLLOWING TRAGEDY

- On 2/26/22, Zakai Zeigler's mother's apartment complex in Queens, N.Y., was destroyed by fire. His mother, Charmane Zeigler, and Zakai's specialneeds nephew, Nori, whom Charmane is raising, lost everything.
- On 3/2/22, with the assistance of Tennessee Athletics' compliance office and administration, Zeigler launched a <u>GoFundMe</u> fundraiser. UT fans responded in extraordinary fashion, collectively donating more than \$363,000 in under 24 hours.
- That summer, thanks to the generosity of Volunteer fans, Charmane and Nori permanently relocated to Knoxville, Tenn.

ELITE ATTENDANCE

- For each of the last four non-COVID-impacted seasons, Tennessee finished in the top five nationally in average home attendance. The Vols drew an average of 18,781 fans to 16 games at Food City Center last season, fifth-most in the country.
- The Vols have ranked top-20 in attendance for 18 consecutive years, including 11 seasons ranked in the top five nationally during that stretch.
- Tennessee's total number of season tickets sold this year (14,500) exceeds last year's average home attendance of all but 11 DI programs. In other words, before selling any single-game tickets, the Vols are likely assured of finishing in the top 15 nationally in average home attendance this year.

HOME HOOPS DURING THE BARNES ERA

- Tennessee is 114-22 (.838) at Food City Center under Rick Barnes, including 54-18 (.750) in SEC play.
- Barnes has led the Vols to a 15-6 (.714) home record against AP top-25 foes, including a 13-5 (.722) mark versus top-20 teams, a 10-3 (.769) ledger against the top 15, a 7-1 (.875) tally versus top-10 opponents and a perfect 5-0 record against the top five.
- The Volunteers have won 10 straight home games versus ranked teams, dating back to 1/30/21 against #15/18 Kansas.

20,000 STRONG

- In Rick Barnes' nine seasons, Tennessee has played in front of a home crowd of at least 20,000 on 28 occasions.
- Last year, the Volunteers had five sellout crowds, tying an arena single-season record. All 21,678 tickets were sold for matchups with Kentucky (1/14/23), Texas (1/28/23), Auburn (2/4/23), Missouri (2/11/23) and Alabama (2/15/23).
- UT has already sold out four home games, including future opponents, this year: Illinois (12/9/23), Alabama (1/20/23), Texas A&M (2/24/23) and Kentucky (3/9/23).

SEASON TICKETS EXCEED 13K AGAIN

 For the seventh consecutive full-capacity season, Tennessee has sold over 13,000 season tickets. This year, the Vols sold out of the full allotment of 14,500.

NATION'S MOST PASSIONATE FANS

- Tennessee in 2022-23 was yet again the only school in America to rank in the top 10 in average home attendance for football, men's basketball and women's basketball.
- In football, the Vols ranked fifth with an average home attendance of 100,532 in 2022.
- In hoops, the Vols and Lady Vols finished the season fifth (18,781) and seventh (8,369), in the NCAA, respectively.

ONE FLY, WE ALL FLY ... AT 14:00

- Tennessee's newest tradition started in 2018-19, but has become appointment viewing pregame.
 With approximately 14:00 left on on the clock, UT executes its "One Fly, We All Fly" unified slam dunk.
- Each game's "dunker" is determined by feel and the Vol who is feeling especially bouncy that day is identified. His teammates then circle the paint before the dunker explodes toward the rim. When the dunker takes flight, so do his teammates. As the ball is slammed and the Vols land in unison, UT fans in attendance let out a roar. The Vols then briefly return to the locker room for final preparations.
- Teams across all levels of basketball across the globe—including multiple NBA teams (even LeBron James weighed in on Instagram)—have replicated "OFWAF" which is believed to have been named by VFL Admiral Schofield, now on the Orlando Magic.
- The number of times each Volunteer has been the designated dunker in 2023-24 can be found at the bottom of Page 9.

Food City Center is the fifth-largest venue in the country, including third-largest among on-campus arenas. It is also the second-largest non-ACC facility in America, including the largest among the other Power Five conferences. It is one of just seven venues with over 20,000 seats.

One of the two schools with a larger arena, UNC Greensboro, only uses it part of the time, as it also has an on-campus facility. The same applies to St. John's, which ranks eighth with its off-campus venue.

PRO HOOPS NOTES

SEVEN VOLS DRAFTED SINCE 2019

- Over the last five NBA Drafts, seven Vols have been selected, good for the most in program history in a five-year span. The list includes three first-round picks.
- Three Vols were picked in the 2019 NBA Draft, matching the program record set in both 1977 and 1950 when the draft had double-digit rounds.
- UT is one of just seven schools with at least seven draftees in the last five years, alongside Arkansas, Duke, Florida State, Gonzaga, Kentucky and Michigan. The Vols are also one of 18 teams with three-plus first-rounders in the past five drafts.
- Only 11 schools have produced an NBA draftee in at least four of the past five years, as Tennessee joins Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Duke, Gonzaga, Kentucky, LSU, Michigan, USC and Villanova.
- Tennessee, Arkansas, Duke, Gonzaga, Kentucky and Michigan are the lone six programs represented in at least four of the last five NBA Drafts while producing seven-plus draftees and three-plus first rounders.
- The seven Vols chosen in the past five years are forward **Julian Phillips** (No. 35 in 2023), guard **Kennedy Chandler** (No. 38 in 2022), guard **Jaden Springer** (No. 28 in 2021), guard **Keon Johnson** (No. 21 in 2021), guard **Jordan Bone** (No. 57 in 2019), forward **Admiral Schofield** (No. 42 in 2019) and forward **Grant Williams** (No. 22 in 2019). The former four were all one-and-done selections.
- When Rick Barnes arrived on Rocky Top in 2015-16, only seven Vols had been picked in the prior 22 NBA Drafts (1994-2015), with just two in the first round.

MEDENWALD HAS VOLS WOWING AT NBA COMBINE

- Under the tutelage of Tennessee Director of Sports Performance Garrett Medenwald, a Tennessee alum has posted the highest max vertical leap at each of the last three NBA Combines and the best standing vertical leap at two of them.
- In 2021 combine, Keon Johnson set the all-time NBA Combine record in the max vertical leap at 48 inches, shattering the 20-year-old mark by 2.5 inches. Kennedy Chandler led the way in 2022 at 41.5, while Julian Phillips did so in 2023 at 43.
- Over the last four NBA Draft Combines, a Tennessee player has posted the No. 1
 result among all combine participants in nine different events: max vertical (3x),
 standing vertical (3x), shuttle run, lane agility drill and max bench press.

Tennessee all-time leading scorer Allan Houston (1989-93) is the New York Knicks'
 VP for Player Leadership & Development and the GM of the Westchester Knicks.

MVP CONNECTION

- Rick Barnes is one of only four active college head coaches who has developed an NBA MVP, as Kevin Durant was claimed the award in 2014.
- The other active coaches who have produced an NBA MVP are Kentucky's John Calipari (Derrick Rose [Memphis], 2011), Kansas' Bill Self (Joel Embiid, 2023) and Santa Clara's Herb Sendek (James Harden [Arizona State], 2018), the latter of whom was Barnes' assistant at Providence in 1988-89.

MEETING MANU

- Santiago Vescovi tested the NBA Draft waters in 2022, communicating with several teams. He worked out for the Cleveland Cavaliers and San Antonio Spurs.
- During Vescovi's 2022 workout with the Spurs, he met Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Manu Ginóbili, who now serves as a special advisor for basketball operations with the organization he won four NBA titles with.
- Growing up in Uruguay, Vescovi idolized and modeled his game after Ginóbili, who hails from neighboring Argentina.

VOLS WELL REPRESENTED IN THE NBA

5+ Steals

- Forward **Tobias Harris** (2010-11) is a regular starter for the Philadelphia 76ers and one of the team's top scorers. This is now his 13th NBA season and he is in the last campaign of a five year contract worth \$180 million after averaging 17.7 points per game on 49.0 percent shooting during the first four seasons of the deal.
- Guard **Josh Richardson** (2011-15) is in his ninth year in the NBA. Richardson averaged 10.2 points and shot 41.5 percent from 3-point range in 65 games last season. He then signed a two-year deal with the Miami Heat in the offseason.
- Forward Grant Williams (2016-19) averaged career highs in points (8.1), rebounds (4.6), assists (1.7) and minutes (25.9) per game in 2022-23, helping the Boston Celtics reach the Eastern Conference Finals for the third time in four years. He then signed a four-year deal with the Dallas Mavericks worth over \$53.3 million.
- Admiral Schofield (2015-19) is a fifth-year pro who is his third season with the
 Orlando Magic organization, while Jaden Springer (2020-21) is in his third NBA
 season alongside Harris with the Philadelphia 76ers. Julian Phillips (2022-23) is a
 rookie with the Chicago Bulls and third-year pro Keon Johnson (2020-21) signed
 with the Brooklyn Nets during the first week of the NBA season.
- Aided by six Vols, tied for the fifth-most in the league, the SEC led all conferences with 92 players on opening-day NBA rosters. All but one of the 30 NBA teams had an SEC player on its roster to start the season. Additionally, the SEC had 10 players, including Phillips, selected in the 2023 NBA Draft to pace all leagues.

NEW YEAR, NEW NAME

Tennessee Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics **Danny White** announced Aug. 23, 2023, a multi-year namingrights agreement with longtime UT Athletics corporate champion Food City that rebrands UT's on-campus arena as Thompson-Boling Arena at Food City Center.

The agreement with Food City was negotiated by Tennessee Athletics' multimedia rights partner, LEARFIELD/The Vol Network. Food City's overall commitment to UT Athletics will allow the University to invest in excess of \$20 million over the next 10 years and will aid new and needed renovations of the arena and upgrades to the facility's interior and exterior.

Among the planned additions to the venue will include new club amenities, updates to the Ray Mears Room and a state-of-the-art center-hung video board. The exterior façade of the facility will be modernized and the look will be more in line with Tennessee's other athletics venues

Food City's longstanding commitment to supporting UT Athletics and the department's mission of leading the way in college sports dates to 1997. The privately held family-owned company is headquartered in Abingdon, Va., and operates 152 retail locations in Tennessee, Virginia, Kentucky, Georgia and Alabama.

Opened in the fall of 1987, the arena is named for the late B. Ray Thompson and former UT President Dr. Edward J. Boling. The venue has undergone multiple phases of renovations in its 36-year history, most notably an overhaul in 2007 that included the addition of two levels of premium suites and one level of premium loge seating spanning the arena's north end.


