STORYLINES—THE THOMAS MORE GAME

- Thomas More will be making its home debut as a NCAA Division II member. The Saints are in the transition process from the NAIA and like the Cavaliers are former members of the Mid-South Conference.
- Chris Norwell is in his second season as Thomas More's Head Coach. Previously, Norwell spent 13 years as the Saints' defensive coordinator where he was part of seven conference championships as a coach.
- Linebacker Del Thomas posted a game-high 13 tackles in the Saints' season-opening loss at Davenport. The graduate student has registered 237 total tackles in his career at Thomas More.
- Quarterback Rae'Von Vaden can beat teams with his arm and his legs. The redshirt junior has passed for 924 and 10 touchdowns in his career while rushing for 380 yards and five touchdowns.
- Saturday's game will be the first ever between the Saints and Cavs.

ABOUT UVA WISE

- UVA Wise forced five turnovers in last week's 48-0 win over Union College. It was the most for the program since also forcing five against Tennessee Tech in 2019.
- Placekicker Kellan Dalton is the reigning SAC Special Teams Player Of The Week. Dalton was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts with a long of 39 while going 6-for-6 in point after attempts last week.
- Senior Jaevon Gillespie posted the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career in the season opener. The tailback gained 101 yards on 16 carries.
- Shyhiem Pannell, Tyreeck Hall, Jordan Gillespie, DJ Powell and Da'Jon Barnes all scored their first collegiate touchdown against Union.

GAME PREVIEW

UVA Wise will look to start a season 2-0 for the first time since 2017 Saturday when Dane Damron's team travels to Thomas More University (Ky.) for a 12 p.m. kickoff. The Cavaliers scored a 48-0 triumph over NAIA Union College last week behind a defensive effort that forced five turnovers and limited the Bulldogs to 131 yards of total offense.

Nasir Howell was at the front of the defensive effort. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga transfer picked off a pair of passes in his UVA Wise debut as the defense tallied four interceptions overall.

It was also a banner day for the Cavaliers on special teams. Placekicker Kellan Dalton was a perfect 6-for-6 in point after field goal attempts while also successfully booting two field goals en route to SAC Special Teams Player Of The Week accolades. Additionally, UVA Wise scored a touchdown on special teams when Union botched a snap on a punt attempt, allowing Da'Jon Barnes to scoop and score from 17 yards out.

Thomas More enters the contest 0-1 after dropping a 31-17 decision to Davenport in its season opener. The Saints will be playing their first-ever home game as a NCAA Division II member as the school is currently in the process of moving from NAIA to the NCAA Division II ranks.

The Saints were picked 10th in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Preseason Poll but the team returns a pair of all-conference picks from 2022. Junior wide receiver Freddie Johnson hauled in 35 passes for 328 yards and a score last year and is off to a good start this season. The Cincinnati, Ohio native finished with six catches for 65 yards in the season opener. Fellow junior Elgin Phillips is also a returning all-league pick, the punter has averaged 40.8 yards per punt and 63-of-140 career punts have landed inside the 20-yard line. Last week, Phillips booted two kicks over 50 yards, including a 62-yarder. The Fairfield, Ohio product boomed a 72-yard punt as a freshman.

Damron's team played a trio of quarterbacks last week with Juwan Dent and Jake Corkren receiving the bulk of the snaps. The duo combined to go 19-of-27 through the air for 165 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Meanwhile, senior running back Jaevon Gillespie returned from injury and picked up where he left off in 2022. Gillespie gained 101 yards on just 16 carries to lead a rushing attack that pounded out 177 yards.

University of Virginia transfer Dorien Goddard led the receivers in week one. The Greeneville, Tenn. native caught five passes for 76 yards and a score. The touchdown marked the second consecutive season that Goddard scored in the season opener.

A road win would be a welcomed sight for the Cavs. UVA Wise is just 4-16 over its last 20 games away from Carl Smith Stadium. The team has not won a non-conference road game since Oct. 28, 2017 when the Cavs won 65-0 at Virginia University of Lynchburg.

Following Saturday's game, UVA Wise will play nine consecutive South Atlantic Conference games. The stretch starts with a trip to Barton College next Saturday, kickoff is slated for 4 p.m. from Wilson, N.C.

LAST WEEK'S GAME RECAP

WISE - - UVA Wise limited Union College to 131 yards of offense while picking off four passes en route to a 48-0 win at Carl Smith Stadium Saturday. Nasir Howell picked off two passes in his Cavalier debut to aid the program to its first shutout victory since Sept. 4, 2021 when the school scored a 54-0 win over Virginia University Lynchburg.

UVA Wise controlled the game from start to finish as redshirt sophomore DJ Powell capped the opening drive of the season with a 15-yard touchdown reception from fellow redshirt sophomore Juwan Dent. Powell's touchdown was the first of his career, putting the finishing touches on a 5-play, 56-yard drive.

Union (1-1) had its best drive of the evening on its first possession. The Bulldogs moved to the Cavs' 18-yard line before settling for a field goal attempt. Jacob Borden's 35-yard attempt would fall short, turning the ball back over to Dane Damron's squad.

The hosts would put together a second consecutive scoring drive as senior Jaevon Gillespie rushed for 43 of his game-high 101 yards on the drive. Redshirt junior Kellan Dalton capped the drive with a 39-yard field goal to make it a 10-0 affair with 5:31 to play in the opening quarter.

Dalton would boot his second field goal of the night with 10:01 to play in the first half to make it a 13-0 contest. Redshirt senior Jaylen Jones put UVA Wise in scoring position with an interception that gave his team the ball at the Union 48-yard line.

Sophomore Brub Hines would thwart the next Bulldogs' drive when he stormed through the offensive line to drop Union tailback Omarion Parks for a 3-yard loss on a fourth down and one play from midfield.

Seven plays later, Dent fired his second touchdown pass of the game when he found redshirt junior Dorien Goddard from three yards out. Following Dalton's conversion kick, UVA Wise was in front 20-0.

Redshirt junior Jordan Gillespie would essentially put the game out of reach on the first play from scrimmage in the second half. Gillespie would intercept a deflected pass and race 16 yards to the end zone to put the Cavs up four scores.

Former UVA Wise baseball player Shyheim Pannell scored on a 20-yard run later in the third quarter in what was the first touchdown of his career.

Redshirt freshman Da'Jon Barnes found the end zone for the first time in his career in the fourth quarter when he scooped up a botched snap on a punt and raced 17 yards for the score before running back Tyreeck Hall continued the stretch of first touchdowns when the freshman found pay dirt from two yards out for the final score of the game with 1:45 to play.

Gillespie averaged 6.3 yards per carry across 16 carries en route to the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career. Goddard finished with five catches for 76 yards as Dent and Jake Corkren combined to go 19-for-27 through the air for 165 yards and two scores.

The Cavs' defense tallied 10.5 tackles for loss and two sacks in addition to the five forced turnovers.

Saturday's game featured 30 combined penalties for 336 yards, 18 of the penalties and 206 of the yards were assessed to the hosts.

With the victory, UVA Wise has won its season opener for the third consecutive season. The Cavaliers will attempt to start 2-0 for the first time since 2017 when the team travels to Thomas Moore University (Ky.) for a 12 p.m. kick next Saturday.

HEAD COACH DANE DAMRON



Dane Damron will begin his eighth season guiding the football program at UVA Wise in the fall of 2023. In Damron's first seven seasons, the Cavaliers have compiled 25 victories, including the program's only winning season as an NCAA Division II member when his squad posted a 6-5 mark in 2016.

A year ago, Damron's squad claimed victories over Ferrum and South Atlantic Conference foe Erskine while three Cavaliers earned all-conference recognition.

In 2022, UVA Wise scored its biggest win to date as an NCAA Division II member when Damron's squad scored a 35-28 win over Lenoir-Rhyne. The win highlighted a 3-2 start to the season which also featured the program's first-ever victory over Carson-Newman.

In the spring of 2021, UVA Wise played an abbreviated schedule due to COVID-19 and the program posted a 1-2 record with the win coming in a 40-28 triumph at Mars Hill. The Cavs dropped two games by a combined nine points, including a three-point quadruple overtime defeat to perennial power Carson-Newman.

In 2019, UVA Wise played its first season as a member of the SAC where the team claimed its first-ever SAC win with a 21-14 victory over Catawba College. At the conclusion of the season, return specialist Demetrius Mann earned First-Team All-America status by the College Football Network as he led the league and finished second in NCAA Division II with 20.9 yards per kick return. In addition to Mann, three other Cavs earned All-SAC accolades.

The 2018 season saw the Cavs overcome numerous injuries to play their best ball at the end of the season. After falling 27-15 to eventual national semifinalist Notre Dame College in the team's final home game of the season, Damron's team claimed its first victory over regional power Shepherd University, 21-16, in the season finale. The win allowed the Cavs to finish the season with wins in three of the team's final five games after beginning the year 1-4.

In 2016, the team was fifth nationally in red zone defense as opponents scored on just 61.7 percent of their trips while ranking 14th in tackles for loss as the unit averaged 8.9 per contest.

A year later, the Cavs ranked 13th nationally in third-down conversion defense by holding opponents to a 30.1 percent conversion percentage while finishing 22nd nationally with 15 intercepted passes. In 2018, the defense put together its best season to date as an NCAA Division II institution. UVA Wise finished third in tackles for loss per game (9.9), 18th in passing yards allowed per game (168.1), 18th in fourth-down conversion defense (.300), 19th in total defense (302.6 ypg) and 23rd in third-down conversion defense (.311).

The trend continued in 2019 as the defense ranked 15th nationally in passing yards allowed per game (167.5) while holding opponents to a completion percentage of 51.1 percent.

Named the fourth head football coach in school history in December of 2015, Damron came to the College after a seven-year stint at

Eastern Kentucky University.

With the Colonels, Damron spent five years as the team's offensive coordinator. A 22-year coaching veteran, he has been known for his offensive prowess. In his final season at EKU, Damron's offense set a NCAA FCS record for offensive snaps in a game with 123 against Murray State. In 2012, the Colonels averaged more than 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards per game. The Colonels rushed for at least 1,700 yards in each of Damron's five years directing the offense.

During Damron's tenure as offensive coordinator, EKU posted at least six wins in all five seasons he oversaw the offense. The Colonels tallied eight wins in 2012 before posting nine victories in 2014. Overall, Damron's teams recorded 69-47 wins and losses during his collegiate coaching career.

Damron began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at EKU in 1994. Following a stint at Morehead State, he became the offensive coordinator at George Jenkins High School in Lakeland, Florida. Later, he moved on to Lake Gibson High School in Lakeland where the school reached previously uncharted waters on the football field. The Braves won their first playoff game in school history and advanced to the regional finals in each of Damron's last two seasons as head coach.

Following his time in Florida, the coach returned to his native state of Kentucky to become the head coach at Boyd County High School in Ashland, Kentucky. Damron's track record of success continued with the Lions as they won a playoff game in three consecutive seasons. The coach returned to the collegiate ranks in 2007 when he accepted the head coaching position at Kentucky Christian University. The 2008 season marked the first-ever varsity football team in Kentucky Christian history.

Damron played collegiate football at Georgetown College (Ky.) where he aided the Tigers to the 1991 NAIA National Championship. A two-time All-American, the former quarterback is enshrined in Georgetown's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Damron obtained a bachelor's degree in marketing and finance from Georgetown College before later earning a master's degree in sport administration from Eastern Kentucky. The coach and his wife Delisha have two children - Hanna and Derek.

ASSISTANT COACHES

Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line



Mike Compton is in his eighth season at UVA Wise. Serving as the assistant head coach and offensive line coach, Compton has seen a trio of offensive linemen earn all-conference accolades during his tenure with the program.

Recently inducted into the Virginia High School League Hall of Fame, the former NFL offensive lineman has overseen an offensive line that rushed for over 1,000 yards in each of the last two seasons. Additionally, the offensive line surrendered just 28 sacks despite the team attempting a program record 445 pass attempts in 2022.

In the COVID shortened spring 2021 season, the team rushed for more than 100 yards in two of their three games, including a 134-yard rushing performance at Limestone. On passing plays, UVA Wise surrendered just five sacks on 160 attempts to aid an offense that passed for 1,070 yards in the abbreviated season.

In 2018, UVA Wise gained 1,219 yards on the ground. It marked the third consecutive season that UVA-Wise had rushed for least 1,200 yards. Additionally, the unit improved its ability to protect the quarterback; in 2018, opponents posted 29 sacks a year after surrendering 39 sacks.

In 2017, Will White earned All-MEC Honorable Mention on the offensive line as the Cavaliers rushed for 17 touchdowns, the team's highest total since becoming a NCAA Division II member.

In his first season, the offensive line was part of an offense that rushed for 1,233 yards and 11 touchdowns. The 1,233 yards marked a 466-yard improvement from 2015.

Compton came to the College after spending the 2015 season at Concord University.

Prior to working at Concord, Compton spent two seasons each at Fairmont State and Bluefield College directing the offensive line.

A Southwest Virginia native, he spent three seasons as the head coach at Patrick Henry High School in Glade Springs. He started his coaching career at Tazewell High School where he worked from 2006-08 as an assistant coach on the offensive and defensive lines.

Compton was a standout offensive lineman at West Virginia University from 1989-92. He was a three-year starter at center and was a consensus All-America selection (United Press International, Kodak, Walter Camp, Playboy, Football News) as a senior in 1992. Following his senior season, he was selected to play in the Blue-Gray and Kodak Hula Bowl and was given the NCAA's Top 6 Award. He was a two-time All-BIG EAST selection and was also recognized for his academic excellence as a two-time first-team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree. Compton was given the Ira E. Rogers Award in 1991 and 1992, and was named the "Red" Brown Cup Award as the top male athlete at WVU in 1992. He was inducted into the WVU Hall of Fame in 2005.

Compton was drafted by the Detroit Lions in the third round (68th overall pick) in 1993. He spent his first eight seasons with the Lions, which included blocking for Barry Sanders during his 2,053-yard rushing season in 1997. He then spent three seasons with the New England Patriots from 2001-04 and was a member of two Super Bowl winning teams in 2001 and 2003. He finished his 12-year NFL career with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2005.

Compton is the father of three children, Jessica, Josh and Sarah, and grandfather to one grandson, Levi. Compton is married to Letonya Altizer-Compton.

Matthew White Defensive Coordinator



Matthew White is in his third season as defensive coordinator. A year ago, White's defense continued a trend of the Cavaliers being one of the hardest teams in NCAA Division II to pass on. UVA Wise ranked 19th in passing yards allowed as opponents passed for just 162.1 yards per game.

The passing defense highlighted a season that saw the defense score a trio of touchdowns while forcing 21 turnovers in the 11-game season. Both numbers ranked top 50 nationally while

the team's fourth down conversion defense (.200) was third best in NCAA Division II.

In White's first season at UVA Wise, the coach oversaw a defensive unit that was among the best in the South Atlantic Conference.

In 2021, the Cavs led the league in sacks per game (3.36) and total interceptions (14) while ranking third in tackles for loss per game (8.3).

Following the conclusion of the season, defensive lineman Chavon Fields and defensive back Markel Dailey earned First-Team All-SAC for their play on the unit.

Prior to serving as defensive coordinator, White served as the Cavaliers' defensive line coach while also overseeing the team's strength and conditioning program.

"I am pleased to announce Matt White as our defensive coordinator," remarked Head Coach Dane Dameron after White's promotion. "Matt brings high energy and has been successful as a head coach at the junior college level and as a coordinator at Kentucky Christian University."

A native of Montana, White played collegiate football at the University of Sioux Falls before beginning his coaching career at Montana Tech University.

Following his stint at Montana Tech, White moved to West Hills Community College, where he coached linebackers in 2015. From there, the coach spent four years at Los Angeles Valley College serving as the program's running backs, defensive backs and linebackers coach at various points before becoming the school's defensive coordinator.

White would eventually become the head coach at Los Angeles Valley where he guided the school to a winning record behind a defense that was ranked top 20 nationally in scoring (17 points per game) and an offense that posted 45.8 points per game.

The coach then headed east to Kentucky Christian where he was associate head coach and defensive coordinator for the Knights in 2019.

White obtained a bachelor's degree in elementary education from the University of Sioux Falls and a master's degree in human health and performance from Fort Hays State University.

ASSISTANT COACHES



Joseph Czelusniak Wide Receivers

Joseph Czelusniak is in his fourth season at UVA Wise and his second as the wide receivers coach.

In 2022, 17 different Cavaliers hauled in at least one reception with three finishing with over 400 receiving yards.

While serving as the program's running backs coach, Jaevon Gillespie earned second-team all-

conference honors after averaging five yards per carry and rushing for eight touchdowns.

In a shortened spring season in 2021 due to COVID, UVA Wise rushed for 325 yards in three games with four backs having over 50 rushing yards.

Czelusniak came to the college after completing his playing career at Alderson Broaddus where he served as team captain as a senior.

During his career, Czelusniak set six single-season and two career records for the Battlers. Over his junior and senior seasons, the quarterback passed for 37 touchdowns, ran for five more and passed for 4,708 yards while completing 55 percent of his passes.

Czelusniak graduated with dual degrees in business administration and sport management.



Jon Davis Defensive Line

Jon Davis is in his first season at UVA Wise, serving as the program's defensive line coach. A five-year coaching veteran, Davis most recently served as the defensive line coach and run game coordinator at Lithia Springs High Schools (Ga.). In that role, he helped develop a quartet of all-region selections as the team boasted the region's third-ranked defense in points allowed (19.6). The accomplishments allowed the coach to be named Georgia 5A Defensive Line Coach of the Year.

Prior to his time at Lithia Springs, Davis was co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at

Woodland High School (Ga.). In that role, he oversaw a defense that allowed just 13.7 points per game in 2021. Earlier in his career, the coach worked at Riverdale High School (Ga.) where the school made three consecutive playoff appearances, including a regional title in 2020.

Davis began his coaching career at Louisiana Christian University where he was the school's defensive tackles coach. Three student-athletes earned all-conference acclaim under Davis' tutelage at this stop.

Davis earned a bachelor of science in accounting from Jacksonville State University in 2014 before earning a M.A.T. in physical education from Georgia College & State University.



Nick Lopez Special Teams/Cornerbacks

Nick Lopez is in his second season as the special teams coordinator and cornerbacks coach at UVA Wise.

A year ago, UVA Wise allowed just 162.1 passing yards per game to rank 19th nationally among NCAA Division II schools while kicker Kellan Dalton booted a program-record 50-yard field goal as part of a season that saw him connect on 10 field goal attempts.

A former NCAA football student-athlete, Lopez came to the program after coaching defensive backs at Geneva College (Pa.).

At Geneva, Lopez was responsible for safeties and cornerbacks while also being given the privilege of calling secondary coverage in his lone season the team.

Prior to Geneva, Lopez spent nearly two full years at Glenville State College as the assistant defensive back coach. In that role, he assisted with all defensive backs while also working on game preparation by overseeing offensive scout teamwork.

Earlier in his career, Lopez was as an assistant coach at Hedgesville High School (W.Va.) where he served as secondary coach, special teams coordinator and weightlifting instructor.

As an athlete, Lopez earned Martinsburg High School (W.Va.) Athlete of the Year honors as a senior in addition to first-team all-state honors. During his collegiate career, he earned conference and national defensive player of the week honors in 2016 while playing for Glenville State.

Lopez obtained a bachelor's degree in fine arts from Frostburg State University in 2019.



Josh McClurg Tight Ends

Josh McClurg is in his first season as the tight ends coach at UVA Wise. A three-year letter winner at Morehead State, McClurg played defensive back for the Eagles.

Prior to his collegiate playing days, McClurg was a standout quarterback at Frederick Douglas High School in Lexington, Ky.

As a senior, he led his team a 14-1 mark as he tallied 1,443 passing yards and 1,005 rushing yards while combining for 28 touchdowns.

The coach earned a degree in business administration from Morehead State.

Nathan Mullen
Running Backs/Special Teams

Nate Mullen is in his first season coaching running backs at UVA Wise. The coach comes to the Cavaliers after spending last season as a graduate assistant with Murray State University, overseeing special teams and offensive quality control duties.

A former student-athlete at UNC - Charlotte and Western Carolina University, Mullen led the Catamounts in receptions

in 2018 and served as a team captain in 2019 while starting in all 33 games he played at WCU. With the 49ers he appeared in every game over two seasons while serving as the programs punt returner.

Mullen began his coaching career at the University of Southern Mississippi where he was a graduate assistant for two seasons. He worked with the offensive line and wide receivers in that capacity while obtaining a master's degree in sport management.
