SETTING THE SCENE

- Vermont travels to Indiana to face Notre Dame tonight as the schools open a two-game Hockey East series at the Compton Family Ice Arena.
- The Catamounts have won their first four games of the year to match their best start since 2005, when UVM began the season 7-0-0.
- Last season, Vermont officially welcomed Notre Dame to Hockey East in early November as the teams split a weekend set with a pair of one-goal games in Burlington during Vermont's 50th anniversary weekend.
- The Cats moved up four spots to No. 13 in this week's USCHO.com Poll and entered the USA Today/USA Hockey Poll at No. 14.

LAST TIME OUT: VERMONT 2, UCONN 1

- Brody Hoffman stopped 21 of 22 shots as then-No. 17 Vermont held off UConn 2-1 at sold out Gutterson Fieldhouse on Saturday night in the first Hockey East matchup between the schools.
- Defenseman Alexx Privitera scored his first goal in a UVM jersey on the power play in the second period, and sophomore Mike Stenerson added an insurance goal in the third for the eventual game-winner.
- Trevor Gerling got the Huskies on the board with seven minutes left in regulation, but Vermont held on to extend its unbeaten start.
- UVM was 3-for-3 on the kill to remain perfect on the year (14-for-14).

PERFECTION THROUGH FOUR

- With a perfect 4-0-0 record, the Catamounts have matched their best start in the last nine years under head coach Kevin Sneddon.
- UVM has out-scored its opponents 13-4 through the first four games and has not trailed for a single second this season.
- Junior Brody Hoffman is 3-0-0 with a .940 save percentage in three starts, while sophomore Mike Santaguida posted a 28-save shutout in his only appearance at Clarkson on Saturday, Oct. 18.
- The Cats had a shutout streak of 135:31 snapped in the third period against UConn on Saturday which dated back to Oct. 17 vs. Clarkson.
- 11 different skaters have registered a point in the winning streak, and eight different players have netted at least one goal.

PALIOTTA HITS HALF CENTURY MARK

- With a four-point game in the season opener at Northeastern, Mike Paliotta eclipsed the 50-point plateau for his career and now has 12 goals and 42 assists.
- He currently leads all NCAA defensemen in points per game after ranking 12th in the nation and third in Hockey East in that category last season.
- The blueliner finished third on the team in scoring last year with 27 points, including 22 assists to lead all Hockey East defensemen.
- The 2013 Hockey East Honorable Mention All-Star was unanimously selected as the captain this season to replace forwards H.T. Lenz and Chris McCarthy.

PUSKARICH CROWNED ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

- Mario Puskarich, who has six points in his first four games, became the first Catamount to win the Hockey East Rookie of the Year Award last season.
- Puskarich was also one of three unanimous selections to the All-Rookie Team.
- Among rookies, he ranked second in the nation in goals (19) and fourth in points (35); He also tied the overall NCAA lead with seven game-winning goals.
- Puskarich is the highest scoring Vermont rookie during its Hockey East era (2005-present), and he scored four more goals than any other league freshman.
- The Florida native was named the Hockey East Rookie of the Month twice last year and won the Rookie of the Week Award five times, all after Dec. 16.
- The rookie also led the league in shots on goal during league play with 101.

REYNOLDS RETURNS

- Skating in his first regular season game in roughly 18 months on Oct. 11, Kyle Reynolds picked up a pair of assists and is now just five points shy of 50.
- Reynolds returned to the lineup this season after missing the entire 2013-14 campaign due to a knee injury sustained against Ottawa in exhibition action.
- Two years ago, the forward ranked third on the team in scoring with 20 points and was tied for second with nine goals.
- As a freshmen, the Alberta native ranked among the top-30 rookie scorers in the nation with 23 points and was named to the Hockey East All-Rookie Team.

HATS OFF FOR TURK

- After netting a hat trick in the season opener at Northeastern, Jonathan Turk was named the Warrior Hockey East Player of the Week on Oct. 13.
- The junior was also recognized as the NCAA No. 1 Star of the Week as he became the first player in the nation to score a hat trick this season.
- He has already matched the goal total from each of his first two years as he takes over the role of top line center from Chris McCarthy this season.

STINGY DEFENSE

- The Catamounts have given up just four goals in their first four games and are tied for second nationally in team goals against average (1.00).
- UVM didn't concede a single goal from the third period against Clarkson on Oct. 17 until the third period of the UConn game last Saturday.
- Last year, Vermont ranked 11th nationally in team defense with a 2.34 GAA and went the entire season without allowing more than two goals in a period.
- Brody Hoffman ranked 11th nationally with a 2.25 GAA and 18th with a .925 save percentage in his 19 starts (10-8-1).

KILLER CATAMOUNTS

- Vermont's penalty kill is a perfect 14-for-14 through four contests.
- The penalty kill ranked eighth in the country last season at 85.2% and the team owned a 11-5-2 record when perfect on the kill.
- Last year's kill also finished Hockey East play at 80-for-91 (87.9%), which was the second best mark in the league behind only Boston College.
- A third of the power play goals allowed last season came on 5-on-3's.
- UVM, which averaged just 10.6 penalty minutes per game last year, is tied for eighth in the country in team discipline with only 9.0 per game this season.

PROTECTING THE LEAD

- Only twice in the last two-plus seasons has Vermont blown a 40-minute lead.
- During that span, the Catamounts have a 25-2-2 record when leading after two periods of play, including a 3-0-0 mark this season.
- Dating back to the start of last season, UVM is 14-2-0 when leading after the first period and 17-4-0 when scoring the first goal.

SERIES HISTORY

- Tonight marks the fifth all-time meeting between Vermont and Notre Dame.
- The teams split their first-ever Hockey East series last season in Burlington as UVM earned a 2-1 victory followed by a 3-2 loss at Gutterson Fieldhouse.
- The first two meetings of the series came on neutral ice during tournaments hosted by New Hampshire (1999) and Dartmouth (2002).

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

- Notre Dame entered the USCHO.com poll at No. 20 this week after sweeping Niagara at home last weekend by a combined score of 13-3.
- The Fighting Irish has won four straight games after losing its first two of the season, and it has played all six of its contests at home in South Bend.
- Mario Lucia leads the team with six goals and is tied with Robbie Russo for the team-lead in points with eight; Russo also has five assists through six games.
- Freshman Cal Petersen (1.34 GAA, .950 SV%) and sophomore Chad Katunar (3.03 GAA, .895 SV%) have each started three games in net with 2-1-0 records.
- Jeff Jackson enters his 10th year as the head coach of the Fighting Irish.

YEAR IN REVIEW

- Last season, Vermont celebrated its 50th anniversary of men's hockey and the 50th anniversary of Gutterson Fieldhouse.
- UVM won 20 games for the first time since 2009, made the Hockey East playoffs for the eighth time in the last nine seasons, and secured its sixth NCAA Tournament berth in school history.
- The Catamounts fell to eventual national champion Union in the NCAA East Regional at Webster Bank Arena in Bridgeport, Conn.
- The team collected two Hockey East All-Star honors and had a player (Mario Puskarich) win the Rookie of the Year Award for the first time.

HOCKEY EAST PRESEASON POLL

- Vermont was picked to finish eighth in the 2014-15 Hockey East Preseason Coaches Poll, which was released at the league's Media Day at TD Garden.
- Providence was selected to win the league this year with 127 points and seven of a possible 11 first place votes.
- Reigning regular season champion Boston College finished second in the poll (120) with three first place votes.
- Two-time defending Tournament champion UMass Lowell received the seventh-most points and one first place vote.

SNEDDON RECORDS DOUBLE MILESTONE

- Last season on Nov. 9 at Maine, Kevin Sneddon collected the 150th win of his tenure at Vermont and the 200th of his NCAA head coaching career.
- Sneddon, who enters his 12th season at UVM in 2014-15, is only the fourth head coach in program history and just the third since 1965.
- He has led the program to three NCAA Tournaments in the last six seasons, and took UVM to its second-ever NCAA Frozen Four in 2009.

VERMONT PROTECTS THE CAT CUP

- Vermont beat ninth-ranked Clarkson and Canisius last year to win the annual Sheraton/TD Bank Catamount Cup for the fourth time in the last six seasons.
- Vermont has claimed two straight titles and each one has featured an upset win over a top-15 opponent, including No. 12 Union in 2012-13.
- UVM is 15-4-1 overall in the Catamount Cup under Kevin Sneddon.

UVM CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY

- Vermont celebrated its 50th anniversary on Nov. 2 last season vs. Notre Dame.
- The Cats have been led by just four head coaches: Bill Ruffer (1963-65), Jim Cross (1965-84), Mike Gilligan (1984-2003), and Kevin Sneddon (2003-present).
- UVM has had 21 All-Americans, been to six NCAA Tournaments and two Frozen Fours (1996 and 2009), sent 15 players to the NHL, and had alumni win seven Stanley Cups and 11 major NHL awards, which is second in NCAA history.

INTRODUCING THE NEW CATAMOUNTS

- UVM added eight players (five forwards and three defensemen) to this year's roster for the 2014-15 campaign.
- Among the newcomers are All-USHL Second Team selection Alexx Privitera, AJHL MVP Trey Phillips, and 2013 RBC Cup champion Anthony Petruzzelli.
- The Privitera brothers (Alexx and Jarrid) along with Rob Darrar all skated for the USHL's Dubuque Fighting Saints last season.
- The Class of 2018 includes players with experience in junior leagues based in the United States, British Columbia, and Alberta.

TRAVIS BLANLEIL

F • 5'7 • 152 • Penticton (BCHL)

- During the 2013-14 campaign, he served as an assistant captain and helped lead Penticton to the Interior Division title with 36 regular season wins
- Skated in 52 games and registered eight goals, 21 assists, and 56 PIM

ROB DARRAR

F • 5'9 • 176 • Dubuque (USHL)

- Posted 11 goals and 22 assists for 33 points in 58 regular season games before notching five goals in seven playoff contests
- Also played two seasons for Gunnery Prep in Connecticut where he registered 63 points in 59 career games

MITCH FERGUSON

D • 6'0 • 170 • Salmon Arm (BCHL)

- Skated in 48 games for the BCHL's Salmon Arm SilverBacks last season and posted four goals and 30 assists from the blueline
- Was tied for third on the team in assists and led all Salmon Arm defensemen in overall scoring

KEVIN IRWIN

F • 6'0 • 174 • Green Bay (USHL)

- Served as an assistant captain for the squad last year and registered 18 goals, 13 assists, and 86 penalty minutes in 57 games
- Posted a 21-goal campaign in 2012-13 to rank fifth on the team and was second in penalty minutes with 90

ANTHONY PETRUZZELLI

F • 5'10 • 179 • Brooks (AJHL)

- Two years ago, he tallied 36 goals and 42 assists in 76 games and led Brooks to the 2013 RBC Cup as national champions of Canadian Junior A hockey
- During the 2013-14 campaign, he led the team in goals (27) and points (53) as Brooks defended its AJHL South Division crown

TREY PHILLIPS

D • 5'10 • 174 • Canmore (AJHL)

- Earned the AJHL MVP award last season and was recognized as the Top Defenceman in all of Canadian Junior A hockey

ST. LOUIS REACHES CUP FINAL AND 1,000 GAMES

- Martin St. Louis '97 helped lead the New York Rangers to the Stanley Cup Final last season for the first time in 20 years.
- Before being traded from the Tampa Bay Lightning, St. Louis suited up for his 1,000th career NHL game in November.
- Prior to the trade, he was one of only four NCAA alums to serve as NHL captains but was elected as an assistant captain this season in New York.
- In 2012-13, St. Louis became the oldest player (38 years) to win the Art Ross Trophy as the NHL regular season scoring champion.

SHARP AND ST. LOUIS WIN OLYMPIC GOLD

- Patrick Sharp '02 and Martin St. Louis '97 won the 2014 Olympic gold medal for Team Canada with a 3-0 shutout of Sweden in Sochi, Russia.
- Sharp and St. Louis each claimed their first career gold medals. Sharp made his Olympic debut in Sochi, while St. Louis skated in his second Olympics after appearing in the 2006 games in Torino, Italy.
- Americans John LeClair '91 (1998, 2002), Aaron Miller '93 (2002, 2006), and Tim Thomas '97 (2010) are the other UVM alumni to play in the Winter Olympics.

MILLER SIGNS EXTENSION IN BOSTON

- Former defenseman and captain Kevan Miller '11 signed a two-year contract extension in January with the Boston Bruins.
- He scored his first career NHL goal on Dec. 8 in a 5-2 win over the Toronto Maple Leafs at the Air Canada Centre.
- The defenseman made his NHL debut last November, becoming the sixth UVM alum to play in the NHL in 2013-14 and the 15th overall in program history.

THREE CATS TRADED ON DEADLINE DAY

- Before the NHL Trade Deadline in March, former Catamounts Torrey Mitchell '07, Martin St. Louis '97, and Tim Thomas '97 were dealt to new teams.
- Mitchell was traded from the Minnesota Wild to the Buffalo Sabres, St. Louis moved from the Tampa Bay Lightning to the New York Rangers, and Thomas was traded to the Dallas Stars from the Florida Panthers.

PAIR OF CATS HOIST STANLEY CUP

- Former UVM forwards Patrick Sharp '02 and Viktor Stalberg '09 were crowned 2013 Stanley Cup champions with the Chicago Blackhawks in Boston.
- Sharp clinched his second Stanley Cup after winning the 2010 trophy with Chicago, while Stalberg earned the title for the first time and became the sixth different Catamount Cup winner.
- Sharp and Stalberg mark the second set of former Cats to win the Cup in the same year (Martin St. Louis & Erin Perrin, Tampa Bay '04).

MAJOR NHL AWARDS

- UVM alumni have combined to win 11 major NHL awards, which ranks second in NCAA history behind North Dakota and Cornell.
- Vermont is one of only five college hockey programs to boast more than five major NHL honors from its alumni.
- UVM is also the only college hockey program in the country to have alums that have won the Hart, Jennings, Lady Byng, Pearson and Vezina trophies. Former Cats have also captured the Art Ross, Conn Smythe, and Ted Lindsay awards.

Kevin Sneddon is one of only three head coaches to lead the University of Vermont men's hockey program over the last half century. Sneddon enters his 12th year as the head coach of the Catamounts for the 2014-15 season and his 22nd year in the coaching profession. Last season, he notched his 150th career victory at UVM and his 200th as a Division I head coach. 10 of Sneddon's players have signed NHL contracts during his tenure, and all 10 have signed in the last eight years.

Last season, Sneddon and the Catamounts celebrated their 50th anniversary and won 20 games for the first time in five years. UVM qualified for its sixth NCAA Tournament in school history and made the Hockey East playoffs for the eighth time in the last nine seasons. The Catamounts captured the Sheraton/TD Bank Catamount Cup for the second straight year and the fourth time in the last six seasons, running their record in the tournament to 15-4-1 under Sneddon.

Vermont collected a trio of 2014 Hockey East All-Star honors at the annual awards banquet. Chris McCarthy became Vermont's first-ever Second Team All-Star, Michael Paliotta was tabbed an Honorable Mention All-Star, and Mario Puskarich secured the program's first Rookie of the Year Award as a league member. Puskarich was also one of three unanimous selections to the Hockey East All-Rookie Team after tying the NCAA lead with seven game-winning goals.

Two years ago, the Catamounts increased their overall and conference win total by five over the previous campaign and made their seventh playoff appearance in the last eight years. UVM also captured the Sheraton/TD Bank Catamount Cup for the third time in the last five seasons with wins over No. 12 Union and Princeton. For the second straight season, Sneddon's team placed 14 student-athletes on the Hockey East All-Academic Team, matching its highest number since joining the league in 2005.

In 2011-12, Sneddon's recent recruiting classes played a significant role on a young team as seven of the squad's top nine scorers were underclassmen. Sneddon helped Kyle Reynolds become just the third Catamount to earn a spot on the Hockey East All-Rookie Team, as he was honored at the league's postseason awards banquet. Reynolds finished the regular

season ranked among the top-30 rookie scorers in the nation with 23 points on 10 goals and 13 assists.

Sneddon's 2010 recruit Connor Brickley was selected to the 2012 U.S. National Junior Team and competed at the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championship in Alberta, Canada. He became the eighth Catamount to represent Team USA and the first in 20 years. Brickley is the second highest draft choice for the Catamounts in program history behind only U.S. Hockey Hall of Famer John LeClair, who was selected 33rd overall in the 1987 draft by the Montreal Canadiens.

In 2009-10, UVM upset Hockey East regular season champion New Hampshire in the league quarterfinals to advance to the TD Garden in Boston for the Hockey East Championships. For the first time in program history, the Catamounts earned a spot in the Hockey East Championships and NCAA Tournament in the same year. UVM also won the Sheraton/TD Bank Catamount Cup.

Sneddon led the Catamounts to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2008-09 and 2009-10, and took UVM to its second Frozen Four in school history in 2009. The Catamounts attained their highest-ever final ranking in 2008-09, finishing third in the USCHO.com/CBS College Sports Poll with a 22-12-5 record. Sneddon was named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the top Division I coach in the country. In 2009-10, Vermont upset Hockey East regular season champion New Hampshire in the league quarterfinals to advance to TD Garden in Boston for the Hockey East Championship. For the first time in program history, Vermont earned a spot in the Hockey East Championships and NCAA Tournament in the same year. UVM also won the Catamount Cup that year.

In 2007-08, Sneddon was named the Bob Kullen Hockey East Coach of the Year and was a finalist for National Coach of the Year after leading the Catamounts to a 17-15-7 record and their first-ever trip to the Hockey East Championship Game in Boston. The Catamounts defeated Northeastern in the quarterfinals before upsetting national power Boston University in the semifinals.

Sneddon guided Vermont to a 18-16-5 record and a championship in the prestigious Ice Breaker Invitational in 2006-07. The Catamounts finished second in the country in scoring defense with a 2.00 goals against average and they ranked third nationally on the penalty kill at 88.8-percent.

In 2005-06, the Catamounts posted a 18-14-6 record in their first year in Hockey East. Vermont established the best start to a season in school history by winning its first seven contests. The Catamounts went on to claim tournament titles in both the Nye Frontier Classic and Sheraton/TD Banknorth Catamount Cup.

During the month of December that season, Vermont was ranked as high as third in the country in both national polls, giving the Catamounts their highest ranking in a decade. Vermont finished third in the nation in goals against average at 2.16 and won the Sportsmanship Award in Hockey East for the least amount of penalty minutes in conference play. In addition, captain Jaime Sifers '06 was one of seven finalists for the Hockey Humanitarian Award, given annually to college hockey's finest citizen.

During the 2004-05 season, Sneddon led the Catamounts to their first 20-win season in eight years with a 21-14-4 overall mark, including 13 wins in ECAC play. Vermont was picked to finish 10th in the ECAC Preseason Coaches' Poll that year. Instead, the Catamounts finished fourth in the ECAC and were ranked as high as 10th in USCHO.com/CSTV Poll.

Vermont advanced to the ECAC Championships in Albany, N.Y., for the first time since 1996 after defeating Dartmouth in the ECAC Quarterfinals. The Cats were the most improved team in the country, by winning 12 more games than it did the previous season. Vermont defeated the No. 1 ranked team in the country for the first time in school history with a 3-2 win at Minnesota-Duluth in October.

Sneddon was the head coach at Union College in Schenectady, N.Y. from 1998 to 2003, and was associated with the Union men's hockey program since 1993 when he was named an assistant under former head coach Bruce Delventhal. Sneddon led the Dutchmen to their first-ever ECAC home-ice playoff series in 2003. Union qualified for the ECAC playoffs in three of Sneddon's last four years with the Dutchmen.

As a player in the collegiate ranks, he was a four-year starter at Harvard University where he helped the Crimson win the NCAA Championship in 1988-89. That season, he was named to the ECAC All-Rookie Team, the NCAA All-Tournament Team, and was selected by the Los Angeles Kings in the NHL Draft. During his four years at Harvard, he was the 96th captain of the Crimson men's hockey team and participated in the World Junior Camp and the Albany World Cup.

Sneddon suffered two season-ending injuries at Harvard, and operations on his shoulder and back limited his playing time in each of his last two campaigns. Before beginning his coaching career, Sneddon had a brief stint with the Kings in the NHL. Back surgery cut short his career and he made the decision to become a coach shortly thereafter.

Born and raised in Burlington, Ontario, Sneddon attended Nelson High School before attending Harvard. His father, Robert, played professional hockey for the Chicago Blackhawks and the California Golden Seals. He spent much of his career playing in the AHL and IHL minor leagues.
