JUMP BALL

Vermont heads south once again after returning home last weekend for a post-Thanksgiving showdown with Yale. The Cats travel to face Southeastern Conference (SEC) foe and 20th-ranked South Carolina on Thursday (Dec. 1) at 6:30 p.m.

UVM is eyeing its first upset over a ranked opponent since knocking off No. 14 Boston College on November 13, 2007 with a 77-63 win in Chestnut Hill, Mass.

The matchup marks the second time in the last three seasons that the boys in green and gold play a ranked opponent during the regular season. Vermont last played a ranked opponent on November 15, 2015 at No. 23 Purdue.

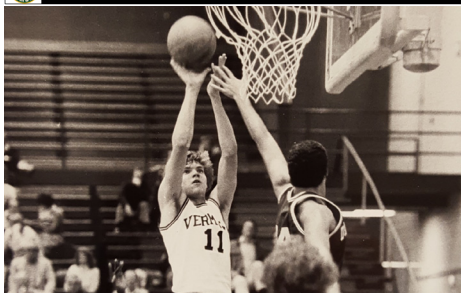

Steven Thode led the Cats with 18 points on 9-of-15 shooting and was one of three UVM players with six rebounds. Mike Evelt added 15 points, six rebounds, and made five of six attempts to the line.

UVM led 33-31 at the break, but USC's Zam Frederick sank both ends of a 1-and-1 with two ticks on the clock to hand the Cats the defeat.

Trae Bell-Haynes and Ernie Duncan have dropped last second game-winning shots for the Catamounts in the last week. UVM went three four seasons without a last second game-winner since Matt Glass tipped in a missed jump shot on November 26, 2011 to give UVM a 64-62 win over Siena.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

The Gamecocks come into Thursday night ranked No. 20 in the country, according to the Associated Press (AP) Poll. USC is ranked in the top 20 for the second straight season after climbing as high No. 19 last season.

South Carolina has one of the top defenses in the country. The Gamecocks rank fifth in the nation by holding their opponents to only 32.3% from the floor and sit sixth after only surrendering 56.7 points per game this season. USC has the 17th-best scoring margin at +18.8

Sindari Thornwell is the team's premiere player and leads the squad in points per game (20.0), field-goal percentage (48.7%), rebounds per game (7.0), three-pointers made (13), and free throws made.

PJ Dozier leads the SEC in steals (2.00) and positioned second in total steals (12).

RECAPING 2015-16

- For the eighth straight season, Vermont won 20+ games and advanced to a postseason tournament in 2015-16.
- The Catamounts finished with 23 wins and played in the College Basketball Invitational, advancing to the semifinals for the second straight year.
- Vermont had games in 11 states last season while playing a program-record of 37 games.
- Five different Catamounts earned America East All-Conference honors: Trae Bell-Haynes, Ethan O'Day and Kurt Steidl all were named to the All-Conference Third Team; Dre Wills earned a spot on the All-Defensive Team; Ernie Duncan found his way onto the All-Rookie Team.
- Vermont set single-season program records for points scored, points allowed, most field goals, most field goals allowed, most fouls and most games.
- The Catamounts advanced to the America East championship game for the third time under head coach John Becker (Vermont is 5-5 all-time in the AE title game).

N. 26, 2016: Vermont redshirt sophomore Ernie Duncan banked in the game-winning shot with one second left on the clock to give the Catamounts a 67-65 win over Yale on Saturday afternoon at Patrick Gym. Duncan's decisive shot marked the third time in the last four games where the outcome was decided on the last possession for UVM.

Duncan finished the game with nine points and a team-high six rebounds. Anthony Lamb led the Catamounts with 18 points, grabbed five rebounds, and set a new career-high with three blocks.

- Since the 2011-12 season, Vermont is 68-8 when holding opponents to 60 points or less. UVM was 17-0 in 2013-14, 16-4 in 2014-15 and 7-0 in 2015-16, and 1-0 in 2016-17.
- Vermont is 19-8 over the last two-plus seasons when Dre Wills scores in double figures.
- UVM is 94-6 when scoring 80+ points since the 2000-01 season. The last loss was to UMass Lowell on Feb. 8, 2016 (L, 100-93)

DOUBLE TROUBLE

Vermont players posted 11 double-doubles in 2015-16 which is the most in a single season since 2009-10 when Catamounts players combined for 21 double-doubles.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Balance was a key for Vermont in 2015-16. Five different returning players led the team in scoring. Trae Bell-Haynes ten times, Kurt Steidl nine time, Cam Ward six times, Ernie Duncan six times, and Dre Wills once. Five different players averaged at least nine points per game last season.

- Trae Bell-Haynes finished last season as the conference leader in both free throws made (143) and free throws attempted (179) while ranking fifth in free throw percentage (79.9).
- He made five or more free throws in 14 games last season to lead the team.
- He was also the first player with multiple games of 11+ free throws made since Clancy Rugg in the 2013-14 season.

GOING DOWNTOWN

- Vermont led America East shooting 38.3% from three-point range last season. The Cats boast some of the best shooters in the league and, statiscally, some of the best in program history.
- Vermont as a team has made at least one 3-pointer in 91 consecutive games (last game without a 3-pointer was at Wagner during the 2013-14 season (L, 68-61).

- Kurt Steidl made at least one 3-pointer in 30 of the 36 games he played in last season.
- Through his first three seasons in Burlington, Steidl has made at least one 3-pointer in 80 of 102 career games (78.4 %).

MID-MAJOR MADNESS

- In week two of the Mid-MajorMadness.com power rankings, the Catamounts climbed to No. 18 in the poll which was released on Monday. UVM earned four wins in a week's span in thanks to the Gulf Coast Showcase and a triumphant win over Yale on Saturday at Patrick Gym.

CRACKING THE TOP 10

- In last Saturday's win over Yale, senior Kurt Steidl made his 180th career shot from beyond the three-point arc and moved in the top 10 on the all-time list. Steidl has averaged just under two made three-pointers per game this season and is on pace to climb as high as sixth on the list.

SIXTY IS NIFTY

- Since the 2011-12 season, Vermont has held opponents to 60 points or less 75 times - tied for 21st for most in Division I over the span. The Catamounts are tied with Kentucky and Wright State.
- In those 75 games, Vermont has a record of 67-8.

Guard • 6'4" • 178
Dix Hills, N.Y. • Half Hollow Hills West

A late find on the recruiting trail, Dalrymple played his high school basketball for Half Hollow Hills West on Long Island where he averaged 18.1 points per game as a senior. He sank 73 three-pointers as a senior adding to an already potent Catamount arsenal from Ion Dalrymple holds his high school record for most three-pointers in a game (10) and most points in a quarter (28). As a senior, he earned First Team All-Long Island honors.



SAM DINGBA

Forward • 6'5" • 205
Yaounde, Cameroon • Salisbury School (Quinnipiac)

Dinga, a transfer from Quinnipiac, comes to Vermont having spent two years in Hamden with the Bobcats' program. He played in 45 career games for Quinnipiac and made 10 starts as a sophomore. He scored a career-high six points and added seven rebounds against the Catamounts in a matchup at Patrick Gym a year ago. Dingba will sit out the 2016-17 season due to NCAA transfer rules and have two years of eligibility remaining.



ANTHONY LAMB

Forward • 6'6" • 225
Rochester, N.Y. • Greece Athena High School

Lamb makes his way to Catamount Country via Greece Athena High School in Rochester, N.Y. while playing his AAU ball for Albany City Rocks. One of four finalists for New York State Mr. Basketball as a senior, Lamb was a two-time Greater Rochester Player of the Year while cementing himself as one of the best in the state as a senior. The 6-foot-6 power forward averaged 30 points and 17 rebounds per game during a senior season that saw his Greece Athena Trojans advance to the New York Section V Class A1 Final.



BEN SHUNGU

Guard • 6'2" • 200
Burlington, Vt. • Rice Memorial

A household name in local basketball circles, Shungu is a two-time Burlington Free Press Mr. Basketball selection and a three-time state champion at Rice Memorial High School. Shungu averaged 21.9 points, 5.9 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 3.2 steals per game as a senior and led the Green Knights to their sixth straight appearance in the Division I final at Patrick Gym. He will be the first Rice grad to suit up for the Catamounts since Pat Bergmann did so from 2009 to 2012.



JOSH SPEIDEL

Forward • 6'7" • 210
Columbus, Ind. • Columbus North

UVM will also welcome Josh Speidel to campus as he rounds out the 2016-17 roster. Speidel was the victim of a February 2015 car crash that left him with a traumatic brain injury. The NCAA has granted a waiver for Speidel to participate with UVM this season and not use a year of eligibility. Before the crash, Speidel was one of the top high school basketball players in the state of Indiana. He joined the Catamounts several times last season and sat on the bench for games at Purdue and Florida while experiencing Patrick Gym for the first time in January against Stony Brook.
