UTAH VALLEY CONTINUES ROAD PLAY AT UC DAVIS, GONZAGA

Utah Valley (3-3-1) continues road play this week with two challenging matchups. The Wolverines will take on UC Davis (5-2-0) on Thursday at Aggie Soccer Field, with kickoff scheduled for 6 p.m. MT. UVU will then travel to Spokane to face Gonzaga (3-2-1) on Sunday at Luger Field, with kickoff set for 2 p.m. MT. Both games will be broadcast live on ESPN+.

Last week, UVU dropped a 3-0 decision at home to No. 11 Utah State before securing a historic 2-0 victory over in-state rival Utah in Salt Lake City. The win marked the Wolverines' first-ever victory over Utah in nine tries, with Faith Webber scoring the game-winning goal. Haley Funn anchored the defense, and Leah Wolf secured the shutout with a standout performance between the posts. The Wolverines controlled 55% of possession and kept Utah off the scoreboard, ending the week with a 1-1 record.

Faith Webber leads the team with five goals, 11 points, 39 shots, 19 shots on goal, and two game-winning goals. She is tied with Ruby Hladek for the team lead in points; Hladek has three goals and three assists this

season. Manthy Brady, Nixan Jackson, and Taylor Nelson each have two assists on the year. Sadie Beardall and Mia Owens have also found the back of the net.

In goal, Leah Wolf leads UVU with a 0.44 goals-against average, having allowed only one goal in four games. She has 13 saves and a .929 save percentage, holding a perfect 2-0-0 record with one shutout. CJ Graham has a 2.75 goals-against average with a 1-3-1 record and 25 saves.

ABOUT UC DAVIS

UC Davis holds a 5-2-0 record this season, led by standout performances from Sam Tristan and Jayde Holley, who were both named Big West Women's Soccer Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively. Tristan has been prolific, scoring a goal in each of UC Davis' victories last week, including the game-winning goal in the 87th minute of a 3-2 comeback win against Eastern Washington. She also opened the scoring in a 3-1 victory over New Mexico State, bringing her season tally to six goals, the most in the Big West. Holley, who leads the Big West with five assists, has been a key defensive anchor while also contributing assists in both wins last week. The Aggies have scored 17 goals this season while conceding nine. In goal, Caeley Goldstein has recorded 26 saves and two shutouts, posting a 1.29 goals-against average.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE AGGIES

Utah Valley and UC Davis will meet up on the pitch for the fifth time on Thursday night. UC Davis holds an all-time 3-1-0 advantage in the series. Utah Valley defeated the Aggies in the last meeting between the two schools, taking a 2-1 win in Orem on Sept. 15, 2013. Prior to UVU's win in 2013, UC Davis had won the previous three matchups. The two teams have played each other in Davis, California just one time with the Aggies taking a 4-0 win in 2003.

ABOUT GONZAGA

Gonzaga women's soccer holds a 3-2-1 record after a 3-0 shutout victory over Illinois-Chicago last Sunday, marking the first-ever meeting between the two programs. Paige Alexander led the way with a goal and an assist, and Emily Todd and Alexis Parker also found the back of the net for the Zags. Alexander's contributions have been vital this season, with her goal against UIC being her second of the year. Erin Ewers and Alexis Parker lead Gonzaga with two goals apiece. In goal, Lauren Towne has been solid, recording three shutouts and maintaining a 1.17 goals-against average. Gonzaga will host Utah Valley on Sunday, following a Thursday night matchup against New Mexico State.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE BULLDOGS

Utah Valley and Utah will meet on the pitch for just the third time on Sunday afternoon. Gonzaga is a perfect 2-0-0 all-time against the Wolverines. Gonzaga won the last matchup between the two teams, 3-2, in Orem on Sept. 17, 2006. Gonzaga also took the only game played in Spokane, 2-1, in 2004.

UTAH VALLEY CONTINUES TO RECEIVE VOTES IN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TOP-25 POLL, TEAM MOVES UP TO NO. 8 IN PACIFIC REGION POLL

Utah Valley continues to gain national recognition, receiving seven votes in this week's United Soccer Coaches Top 25 Poll. The Wolverines are among the teams also receiving votes, alongside Mississippi State (15), Wake Forest (13), USC (10), Georgetown (8), Arizona State (3), and Oklahoma (1). This marks the fourth straight week

that UVU has received votes in the Top-25 poll. Additionally, UVU moved up one spot to No. 8 in the United Soccer Coaches Pacific Region Top-10 poll. Two of Utah Valley's three losses this season have come against top-10 teams, including No. 2 Virginia and No. 9 Utah State.

TWO WOLVERINES EARN WAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Utah Valley's Haley Funn and Leah Wolf were named the WAC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week and Goalkeeper of the Week, respectively.



Funn, a redshirt junior defender, anchored the UVU defense in a historic 2-0 shutout victory over in-state rival Utah, playing a crucial role in securing the Wolverines' first-ever win over the Utes. Her leadership on the backline helped UVU control 55% of possession and keep Utah off the scoreboard.

Leah Wolf, a junior goalkeeper, earned Goalkeeper of the Week honors for her standout performances. Wolf played 135 minutes of flawless soccer, securing

UVU PICKS UP HISTORIC 2-0 WIN OVER IN-STATE RIVAL UTAH



Utah Valley secured its first-ever victory over in-state rival and Big 12 opponent Utah with a 2-0 win on Sunday night at Ute Field in Salt Lake City. Faith Webber scored the game-winning goal in the 27th

minute, and the Wolverines benefited from an own goal in the 48th minute to seal the victory.

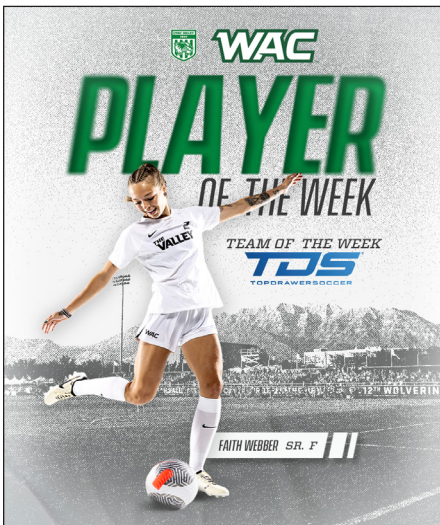
UVU snapped a three-game skid and improved to 3-3-1 overall on the season. Utah dropped to 2-2-1. "I'm really proud of the team," said Utah Valley head coach Chris Lemay. "Coming off three losses, you have to have a certain mentality to continue showing up every day, learning from mistakes, and growing. Tonight's performance was very mature, and I'm really proud of the group."

The Wolverines held their own in a closely contested match, with Utah just edging UVU on shots, 11-10, and holding a 5-2 advantage in shots on goal. Webber led the Wolverines with a match-high four shots. Leah Wolf played all 90 minutes in goal, recording five saves to secure the shutout win.

UTAH VALLEY SUCCESS AGAINST POWER 4 TEAMS THIS SEASON

Utah Valley has posted a strong 3-1-1 record against Power 4 teams this season. The Wolverines are 2-0-1 against the Big 12, which includes a 2-0 victory over BYU in an exhibition, a 1-1 road draw at UCF, and a 2-0 road win at Utah. UVU also picked up a 2-1 road victory over Big Ten foe Michigan. The team's lone loss came against No. 2 Virginia from the ACC.

WEBBER NAMED WAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AND TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TEAM OF THE WEEK ON AUG. 20



Faith Webber was named the Western Athletic Conference Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week after her stellar performances against Michigan and Detroit Mercy. Webber also earned a spot on the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week. Webber played a crucial role in Utah Valley's undefeated start to the season, scoring three goals and adding an assist over the two-game stretch. In the Wolverines' season opener, Webber notched a brace with two second-half goals, including the thrilling

game-winner with just 27 seconds left on the clock, to lift UVU to a 2-1 victory over Big Ten opponent Michigan. She followed that performance by contributing another goal in the 5-2 win over Detroit Mercy, while also assisting on the game-winning goal.

WEBBER NEEDS JUST SEVEN MORE GOALS TO BREAK UVU CAREER GOALS MARK

Faith Webber (35) needs just six goals to break the all-time Utah Valley career goals mark of 40 set by current Washington Spirit player and former Wolverine Heather Stainbrook. With her goal at Utah on Sunday, Webber now has 35 career goals. Webber has scored her 35 goals in just her third season at UVU (2022-24). Stainbrook's career record of 40 came in five seasons of play (2019-23). Webber is also just 24 points away from breaking Stainbrook's UVU career points record of 105. Webber has 82 career points at UVU.

UTAH VALLEY OPENS SEASON WITH THRILLING WIN AT MICHIGAN IN FINAL SECONDS

Utah Valley opened its season with a thrilling 2-1 victory over Big Ten opponent Michigan on Aug. 15 in Ann Arbor. Faith Webber led the Wolverines with a brace, scoring two second-half goals, including the game-winner with just 27 seconds remaining.

UVU GOES A PERFECT 2-0 IN EXHIBITION PLAY

Utah Valley kicked off the 2024 season with two strong exhibition wins last week, defeating third-ranked BYU 2-0 and Idaho State 7-2. Faith Webber led the attack, scoring the game-winner against BYU and netting a hat trick versus Idaho State. CJ Graham earned the shutout in goal against BYU, while Leah Wolf secured the win in the box against Idaho State.

WEBBER NAMED TO UNITED SOCCER COACHES PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST, RANKED NO. 36 ON TOP DRAWER SOCCER'S TOP-100 LIST

Utah Valley University senior forward Faith Webber continues to garner national attention as she has been named to both the United Soccer Coaches Players to Watch List and the Top-Drawer Soccer Top-100 Players list, coming in at No. 36.



BACK-TO-BACK REGULAR SEASON WAC CHAMPIONS

Utah Valley won its second straight Western Athletic Conference regular season championship last season, going unbeaten in league play with a 7-0-2 record. Utah Valley outscored WAC opponents 35-3 last year. The Wolverines have won three WAC regular season championship over the past four seasons. UVU has won WAC regular season titles in 2020, 2022, and 2023. UVU has also won three WAC Tournament championships (2015, 2017, 2021).

CLYDE FIELD MAGIC

Utah Valley holds an impressive 104-45-15 (.679) all time record at Clyde Field. The team has lost just eight matches over the past six seasons on the home pitch. UVU went 4-2-1 at home in 2023, 6-1-1 in 2022, 8-1-1 in 2021, 4-1-2 in 2020, 8-1-1 in 2019, 3-4-1 at home in 2018, 5-1-0 in 2017, 5-2-1 during the 2016 season and were unbeaten at home during the 2015 season with a 9-0-1 mark. UVU is 0-1-0 at home this season.

UTAH VALLEY PICKED TO WIN THE WAC, FAITH WEBBER NAMED WAC PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Utah Valley has been selected to win the 2024 WAC title in the Preseason Coaches' Poll, earning 46 points and five first-place votes. Faith Webber, named WAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and a Preseason All-WAC selection, leads the Wolverines' offense. Webber, who has scored 30 goals in the past two seasons, including a UVU record 16 last year, ranked fifth nationally in scoring in 2023. She also earned All-WAC First Team honors in back-to-back seasons and is a two-time All-District honoree.

Faith Webber's journey from Grand Blanc, Michigan, to becoming a standout forward at Utah Valley University is marked by her exceptional talent. Last season, she tied for fifth in the nation with 16 goals, earning First Team All-WAC honors for a second straight season. Webber's impressive achievements include two All-Pacific Region honors and two of the 13 hat tricks in UVU history. Off the field, she

excels academically with Academic All-District, United Soccer Coaches Scholar All-American, and Academic All-WAC honors. Faith's diverse background includes a deep connection to her Michigan roots and the rapper Eminem (her newborn brother, Cooper Marshall Thomas, is named after Eminem (Marshall Mathers) as well as her recent experience becoming an ordained minister to officiate her mom's wedding. Her commitment to community involvement and environmental advocacy, along with her diverse hobbies (skateboarding, hiking, snowboarding, climbing), showcases her multifaceted personality. As she enters her final season at UVU, Faith is poised to leave a lasting legacy both on and off the field.

ABOUT UVU'S ATHLETICS NCAA HISTORY

Until 2003, Utah Valley University competed as a NJCAA athletic program. The 2003-04 season was the school's first competing at an NCAA Division I level. In the summer of 2009, UVU'S provisional status was lifted and the program became a full member of NCAA Division I on July 8, 2009. Until then, UVU teams and individuals were not eligible to compete in NCAA championship events. The Wolverines spent six seasons as an independent before the Great West Conference became an all-sports league in 2008 and began its first full season in 2009. UVU also became a university in 2008, changing its name from Utah Valley State College (UVSC) to Utah Valley University (UVU). Utah Valley is the first and last school ever to jump from the junior college ranks to NCAA Division I status.

- Has had 111 Academic All-WAC selections, 12 Academic All-District honorees, an All-Region Scholar (Hannah Bruce-2019), three Scholar All-Americans (Heather Stainbrook(2x)/Jenna Shepherd, Gremillion/Faith Webber), and two Academic All-Americans (Heather Stainbrook/Sydney Bushman).
- His players have earned the WAC's top honors, including WAC Defensive Player of the Year (Jenna Shepherd, 2020/2022 / Sydney Bushman, 2023), WAC Offensive Player of the Year (2022), WAC Freshman of the Year honors (Amber Tripp-2017 / Breanna Eves-2021, and WAC Tournament MVP honors (Breanna DeWaal-2017).
- Has had 111 Academic All-WAC selections, 12 Academic All-District honorees, an All-Region Scholar (Hannah Bruce-2019), three Scholar All-Americans (Heather Stainbrook(2x)/Jenna Shepherd, Gremillion/Faith Webber), and two Academic All-Americans (Heather Stainbrook/Sydney Bushman).
- Led his team to the WAC Tournament championship match in five of his seven seasons with the team (2017, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022).
- Led Utah Valley to a WAC Tournament championship in his first season at UVU in 2017, earning the WAC's auto bid to the NCAA Tournament.
- His team registered a goal at Stanford, becoming the only team during the 2017 season to score a goal on Stanford's home pitch.
- Associate Head Coach at Cal (2013-16)

THE FUTURE HOME OF UTAH VALLEY WOMEN'S SOCCER UCCU STADIUM

Utah Valley University (UVU) announced plans in October of 2022 for a new \$30 million soccer stadium on the Orem Campus. Construction is already underway for the new home of Utah Valley soccer.

The future 22,000-square-foot stadium will include locker rooms, a team lounge for both programs, additional locker rooms for visiting teams and officials, 400 additional chairback seats, covered plaza seating, an MLS-style press box with a broadcast booth, and 10 luxury suites – each holding 16 guests.

The new naming rights sponsor is Utah Community Credit Union (UCCU). UCCU Stadium will be built on the west side of Clyde Field – the current soccer stadium – and will serve both the men's and women's soccer programs. When finished, it will be one of the top facilities in NCAA Division I soccer. A construction schedule will be announced later.

"This is a transformational game-changer for our student-athletes," said Dr. Jared Summison, UVU director of athletics. "We're grateful for our long-term partnership with Utah Community Credit Union and shared commitment in the future of our community and state. UCCU Soccer Stadium will be among the finest in the country and will provide the best premium experience that NCAA soccer has to offer."

The increased seating and luxury suites will take the facility's capacity from 2,000 to approximately 3,000 fans. Both the men's and women's programs are among the nation's leaders in attendance each season. Over the past four seasons, the women's program boasts an average attendance ranking of 11th in the nation, while the men's program has averaged the 14th-best attendance in the country during its short history.

"I love soccer, the world's 'fútbol!' UCCU Stadium will take this sport to the next level for our student-athletes and fans," said UVU President Dr. Astrid S. Tuminez. "It will give our men's and women's soccer programs an exceptional competitive advantage and open many doors for our student-athletes. We are grateful to Bret VanAusdal and the team at UCCU for their vision, support, and partnership with this stadium and in so many other impactful ways on campus and in our community."

"An investment in UVU is an investment in the future," said UCCU CEO Bret VanAusdal. "It provides tremendous benefits for our children, families, and the entire state, especially since 80% of UVU students are from Utah, and the vast majority settle here after graduation, contributing to our local workforce, industries, and communities."

The UCCU Soccer Stadium will include patios on the north and south ends of the new facility and a concession plaza behind the chairback seats. It will also be national broadcast-ready and include a videoboard and scoreboard on its north end.

The facility will be upgraded on the current south and east sides of the stadium, with enhanced concessions, restrooms, and a team shop on the southeast corner of the field. A canopy will be added over the east side seating to accommodate UVU's 12th Wolverines, The Den student section, and the Green Man Group. The VIP entrance to the stadium will be relocated to the northwest end, on the corner of Wolverine Way and Event Center Drive.

Future additions will include a children's playground and a small soccer field. Additional donor naming and corporate partner opportunities still exist within the complex.
