WEST ALABAMA FOOTBALL HOSTS DELTA STATE FOR HOMECOMING

After suffering its first loss of the 2021 season and its first loss since 2019, Tiger football looks to bounce back against Delta State University during its annual homecoming game on Saturday, Oct. 23. The action can be viewed live on FloFootball.com with commentary provided by Robert Upchurch and Will Atkinson via SLY104.9.

West Alabama hopes to improve to 7-1 on the season and reclaim a top-10 spot in the polls after suffering a 42-17 loss against the No.4 Valdosta State. After sitting at No.10 in the AFCA Poll, the Tigers dropped to No. 15 in week seven.

Senior quarterback Jack McDaniels leads the Tiger offense. McDaniels has completed 136 passes for 1,835 yards and 16 touchdowns. His favorite target is Tyriq Martin, who has had 41 receptions for 651 yards. Martin is No. 1 in the conference in receptions per game and 10th in the nation. On the ground, Demetrius Battle leads the effort with 86 carries for 572 yards and nine touchdowns.

The D-Block is led by Chris Terrell, who has 29 solo tackles and six tackle assists on the season. He also has 7.0 tacks for a loss of 21 yards and four sacks for 14 yards. He is ranked second in the conference in solo tackles, third in tackles for a loss, and fourth in sacks.

QUICK NOTES

- West Alabama is 6-1 on the season, one of the best starts in a program history rivaled only by 1949 (7-2-1), 1968 (9-2), 1971 (11-1), 1972 (8-1-2), and 2017 (10-3).
- UWA is 3-1 in the GSC and ranks third behind Valdosta State and West Georgia.
- Head Coach Brett Gilliland is the winningest coach in UWA history with a 51-27 record and recently received his 50th win against West Georgia (10/2/21).
- West Alabama is ranked 15th in the AFCA poll, falling from 10th after the 42-17 loss against Valdosta State last week.
- Since 1994, Delta State leads the series 35-28-3. However, UWA has gone 7-3 since 2010, including a five-game winning streak from 2015-2018.

TIGER BITES

DUNKLE LEADS IN FG

Senior kicker Gabe Dunkle is at the top of the rankings for his performance as a field goal kicker. He ranks first in the conference in field goals per game and fourth nationally, averaging 1.67. He is third in the conference and 33rd nationally in field goal percentage at 71.4 percent. The Glendora, Calif. native also tops the ranking in scoring, averaging 9.0 points per game to rank first in the conference and 18th nationally.

MARTIN AMONG RECEIVING LEADERS

Wide receiver Tyriq Martin ranks second in the Gulf South Conference in receiving. In six games (NAU does not count), Martin has had 36 receptions for 525 yards and five touchdowns. He averages 14.6 yards per carry, 6.0 receptions per game, and 87.5 yards per game.

TOTAL OFFENSE, PASSING

UWA quarterback Jack McDaniels ranks fourth in the GSC in total offense with an average of 269.8 yards per game. He ranks third in passing with 1,567 total yards and has the least interceptions out of GSC starting quarterbacks with two.

LEWIS WITH THE INTERCEPTION

Defensive back Shamar Lewis is No. 1 in the conference in interceptions and 25th nationally. The Dixon, Mills, Ala. native has three on the season for 35 yards and averages 0.5 per game. His longest carry was 20 yards.

THE D-BLOCK NATIONALLY

The Tiger defense ranks high nationally in crucial statistics. The D-Block ranks sixth nationally and third in the conference in tackles for a loss, averaging 3.17 per game. The team ranks 11th in team passing efficiency defense, allowing only 100.53 passing yards per game, and 20th in punt return defense, limiting the opposing teams to just 3.17 yards.

HOMECOMING AT UWA

West Alabama's annual homecoming game is where alumni and friends return to Livingston for a week full of events. The 75th Homecoming queen will be crowned during the competition.

UP NEXT

West Alabama will return to the road, traveling Tigerville, S.C. to take on the Crusaders of North Greenville University. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. CT/ 12 p.m. ET inside Younts Stadium.



Head Coach Brent Gilliland

Record-setting quarterback and University of West Alabama Athletic Hall of Fame member Brett Gilliland is his alma mater's 21st head football coach. The winningest coach in school history, Gilliland is 45-26 in charge of the Tiger program and showing no signs of slowing down.

Now entering his seventh year as the Tigers head coach, Gilliland returned to West Alabama from Kennesaw State, where he was coaching quarterbacks. Previous coaching stops include Georgia Tech and Georgia Southern.

In just his fourth year as head coach at UWA, he led the Tigers to a 10-3 record and the 2017 Gulf South Conference championship, and a third round trip in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Under Gilliland, the Tigers became just the third team in school history to win at least ten games and the first since 1975. He followed that with an 8-4 mark in 2018 and another playoff trip.

Following his playing days at UWA, Gilliland began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech before moving on to the offensive staff at Georgia Southern. While at Georgia Tech, Gilliland was a part of three Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Coastal Division Championships (2006, 2008, and 2009). In 2007, Gilliland worked with Yellow Jacket quarterbacks after assisting with the receiving corps in 2006, including Biletnikoff Award winner and current Detroit Lions star Calvin Johnson. In addition, Gilliland coached the running backs for two seasons at Tech, a group that included Doak Walker semi-finalist Jonathan Dwyer. Dwyer was the ACC rushing leader and player of the year in 2008.

In three seasons at Georgia Southern, Gilliland worked with the running backs (2010), tight ends and tackles (2011), and wide receivers (2012). In addition, he took over the recruiting coordinator duties following the conclusion of the 2011 season. With Gilliland on staff, Georgia Southern posted a 31-12 (.721) overall record, won two Southern Conference titles (2011, 2012), and made three consecutive NCAA Football Championship Series (FCS) semifinal appearances during Gilliland's time as an Eagle.

Gilliland was a regional finalist for the Harlon Hill trophy in 2003. He earned all-region recognition from the Football Gazette (2002). He concluded his career as the Tigers' single-season (3,213) and career passing yards (6,689) record holder.

In 2012, he was inducted into the UWA Athletic Hall of Fame. After his playing career, Gilliland had posted four of the top 10 single-game passing performances in school history, including a then school-record of 470 yards against Valdosta State in 2002.

A two-time member of the All-Gulf South Conference Academic list, he was a two-time winner of the Asa Green Scholar-Athlete Award, an award presented to the UWA student-athlete with the highest grade-point average on the football team, winning it in 2001 and 2003.

A 2003 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District IV selection, he also was honored twice with a Gulf South Conference "Top Eight" award before graduating magna cum laude from UWA in 2004.

Gilliland and his wife, Amanda, are the parents of a son, Rece (10), and a daughter, Ella Kate (5). His father, Ronnie, was a member of the UWA 1971 National Championship Football team.

West Alabama 48, Morehouse 7

Tiger Stadium

Jack McDaniels passed for 344 yards, and four touchdowns as West Alabama opened its 2021 season with a 48-7 victory over Morehouse College on Saturday at Tiger Stadium.

Graduate Student Darius Nalls had 200 receiving yards in the game with nine receptions and two touchdowns, while senior Reggie Davenport netted 111 yards on the ground.

UWA had 550 yards of total offense in its first game after the abbreviated spring season. The Tigers finished with 344 passing yards and 206 on the ground.

The West Alabama defense was firing on all cylinders Saturday evening. The Tigers held the Maroon Tigers to 131 total yards (98 passing, 33 rushing), keeping Morehouse scoreless for the first half and allowing only one touchdown in the second.

Graduate student Chris Terrell led UWA's defense with five solo tackles. Terrance Carter, Shamar Lewis, SchDarren Archie, and Bishop Breaux had three each, and Ricky Chatman, Undraez Lilly, and Jeremiah Boyd had tackles for losses.

West Alabama took the opening kick-off after Morehouse won the toss and deferred to the second half. UWA marched the ball down the field, and after 10 plays and 63 yards, the Tigers found themselves in a 4th and 10 situation. A 28-yard field goal attempt was missed wide to end the drive.

Morehouse took its first possession of the game but came up hard against the D-Block. MC punted after three plays for just four yards, and UWA took control on its 31-yard line.

West Alabama took advantage of the quick turnaround, going 63-yards in six plays. A four-yard carry by James Smith, III punctuated the drive for a touchdown. Senior kicker Gabriel Dunkle added the PAT for the 7-0 lead with 7:33 left in the period.

UWA extended its lead in the second quarter, scoring three additional touchdowns and a field goal before the close of the half.

In the fifth possession of the period, the Tigers made it to the end zone in five plays for 76 yards. Closing the drive, Underwood carried for two yards for the touchdown, and Dunkle stuck the extra point.

At 6:07, West Alabama started another scoring drive that concluded with a 40-yard field goal by Dunkle to give UWA a 17-0 advantage.

Morehouse fumbled the punt return on the next drive, and senior Terrance Carter recovered for West Al on MC's 17. After a first down incomplete pass, McDaniels connected with Darius Nalls in the endzone for his first touchdown as a member of the UWA squad. The Tigers claim the extra point for a score of 24-0.

After another Morehouse punt, the Tigers scored again. McDaniels completed a 33-yard pass to Smiley Martin for the touchdown and West Alabama closed the half up 31-0.

Early in the third quarter, West Alabama scored again. McDaniels connected with Nalls for a 30-yard touchdown pass for his second of the game. Dunkle's PAT made it a 38-0 game.

With the new possession, Morehouse recorded its first points of the game. The Maroon Tigers found the endzone in nine plays for 84 yards to cut UWA's lead to 38-7.

The Tigers answered with a 6-play, 26-yard drive to score. This time, McDaniels connected with wide receiver Bayley Blanchard for the 16-yard touchdown pass for the last TD of the game.

In the game's final quarter, UWA added three points on a 39-yard field goal by Dunkle to end the game with the 48-8 victory.

West Alabama 33, Tuskegee 7

Gabriel Dunkle had the golden toe for West Alabama in its 33-7 victory over Tuskegee University Saturday afternoon. The senior kicker went 4-for-5 in field goals, including a career-long 47-yarder to begin the scoring effort for the Tigers.

UWA (2-0) had 467 yards of total offense (173 rushing, 295 passing) while holding the Golden Tigers (0-2) to 194. West Al's defense was a stopping force and halted Tuskegee scoring attempts in the red zone with three interceptions and one forced fumble for a UWA recovery.

Quarterback Jack McDaniels was 23 for 38 through the air for 294 yards and one touchdown. James Smith, III rushed for 134 yards and a score for West Alabama, and Bayley Blanchard caught four passes for 76 yards and a touchdown.

On the defensive side of the ball, Josh Hatcher tallied 12 tackles (nine solo, three assist) with two tackles for a loss of five yards. Undraez Lilly recorded seven total tackles (five solo, two assist) with 3.5 tackles for a loss of 10 yards, and Chris Terrell had five solo tackles, three for a loss of 10 yards.

Shamar Lewis, SchDarren Archie, and Michael Anderson have a single interception, and Anderson forced one fumble.

Dunkle began the scoring effort on the game's first possession. Opening the game with several first downs, the Tigers found themselves in a 4th and 10 situation. Dunkle came on the field and scored the first points for his team while breaking his career-long record with a 47-yard field goal.

Minutes later, West Alabama scored its first touchdown of the game. Reggie Davenport racked up 30 rushing yards for five carries in a 7-play possession, punctuated by a one-yard carry for a touchdown. Dunkle landed the PAT, giving the Tigers a 10-0 advantage over Tuskegee.

West Alabama started off the second quarter with yet another scoring possession. Being unable to get a first down in the run, Dunkle scored another field goal. This time 30-yarder to extend the West Al lead to 13-0.

Later in the quarter, with 6:02 left in the half, McDaniels completed a 43-yard touchdown pass in the possession's first play. The point after was good for a score of 20-0.

The only points in the third quarter came off the foot of Dunkle. The Glendora, Calif. native landed his third field goal of the night to add three points to the UWA score.

Tuskegee scored its only points of the game in its first possession of the fourth quarter. After eight plays and 59 yards, Golden Tiger quarterback Bryson Williams completed a 21-yard pass to Steven Hodges for a touchdown. The point after was good to cut UWA's lead to 23-7.

West Alabama answered on its next possession. Dunkle grabbed another piece, this time a 25-yarder.

In the game's final minutes, Senior running back James Smith, III ran for 62 yards for a touchdown.

The Tigers 80 points were primarily scored through the run game, with senior running back Demetrius Battles scoring three of UWAs 11 touchdowns. The Birmingham, Ala. native, fondly known as Eight Ball, led West Alabama in rushing yards with 170 yards on 10 carries.

Also racking up the rushing yards, Ta'Bryious Webb recorded 89 on 10 carries, while James Smith, III had 57 on 11 carries for two touchdowns. On the ground, West Alabama rushed for a total of 314 yards.

Starting quarterback Jack McDaniels connected on 14 of 21 passes for 232 yards. McDaniels main target was Smiley Martin, who had a big game in his own right. The Goose Creek, S.C. native, led the Tigers with 90 yards receiving on five catches. He also scored one touchdown.

UWA ended the game with 559 yards of total offense, compared to just 213 for NAU.

Defensive back Shamar Lewis led the Tigers with six tackles on defense, while Ricky Chatman had five and one tackle for a loss.

Linebacker Michael Anderson made waves with three tackles, one force fumble, a fumble return for 48 yards, and a touchdown.

North American University won the toss and deferred to the second half, giving UWA the game's first possession.

The Tigers started a little shaky with a sack that resulted in a fumble recovered by NAU. The tables turned in the next play with Josh Hatcher intercepting the ball and returning it for five yards.

The ball would change hands two more times before West Alabama made any real progress on the scoreboard. The drive started with a long incomplete pass, but it did not stop the Tigers momentum. On the next down, James Smith, III rushed for two, and on a third and ten, Jack McDaniels completed a 27-yard pass to Bayley Blanchard for the first down. On the next play, Smith covered the three yards to the end zone for his third touchdown of the season. Gabriel Dunkle added the PAT, and UWA grabbed an early 7-0 lead with 8:18 still left in the first period.

After the Stallions turned the ball over on downs, West Alabama made short work of the next drive. In two plays and 36 seconds, the Tigers covered 67 yards to score. In the first play of the scrimmage, McDaniels completed a four-yard pass to Smiley Martin. In the second play, McDaniels connected with Martin again for a 63-yard pass and touchdown, followed by a Dunkle PAT, giving UWA a 14-0 lead with 6:28 left in the first quarter.

After a North American punt, West Alabama started another scoring drive on the Stallion 48-yard line. The campaign was punctuated by a 37-yard pass from McDaniels to Dalton McKenzie for a touchdown. PAT was good, extending the Tiger lead to 21-0 with 4:07 left in the first quarter.

In the next North American possession, UWA linebacker Ricky Chatman forced a fumble, and Shamar Lewis recovered to take control at the Stallions 28-yard line. West Alabama turned the opportunity into another scoring effort. In 40 seconds, McDaniels rushed for eight yards to score, and Dunkle landed the point after, and the score moved to 28-0 with 3:11 left in the quarter.

Another North American possession resulted in a recovered fumble by Lewis, putting the Tigers on the Stallions 40-yard line. West Alabama did not make it to the end zone on this drive, but Dunkle landed a 30-yard field goal for three extra points for a score of 31-0 with 1:02 still in the first quarter.

The Tigers took second possession of the second quarter, and less than a minute into the period, UWA would score again. On the first play, Demetrius Battle rushed for a 69-yard touchdown. Dunkle's PAT was good, and the score was 38-0, with 14:02 left before the half.

The next three possessions would end in scoreless drives before West Alabama put together a good drive with just over six minutes left in the second quarter. In 1:27, the Tigers put together a combination of running and passing to cover yards. The possession ended with a 22-yard pass from McDaniels to Ta'Bryious Webb for the TD. Dunkle made the PAT for a score of 45-0, with 5:16 left in the half.

After a UWA punt, North American took possession on its own 13-yard line. The Stallions made good progress but fumbled on a third and eight, and

The University of West Alabama football team improves to 3-0 on the season after a historic 80-0 victory over North American University Thursday night.

Despite a 40-minute lightning delay, the Tigers offense and defense held firm to record the largest marginal victory in program history. Compared to conference records, UWA is tied in the Gulf South Conference for third in points scored in a single game and second for PATs converted in a single game with 11.

West Alabama football's winning streak continues after defeating Mississippi College 31-28 in its first conference matchup of the 2021 season. UWA improves to 4-0 on the season and 1-0 in conference play, while the Choctaws fall to 1-2 and 0-1.

"GSC games are not easy," said head coach Brett Gilliland. "Hats off to Mississippi College. They played a hard-fought game. The biggest thing was we had adversity as a team, and it was the first time we had that. We came back and rallied and found a way to win the game."

Demetrius Battle led the offensive charge on the ground, rushing for 109 yards on 19 carries inside Robinson – Hale Stadium Saturday night. The Birmingham, Ala. native averaged 5.7 yards per carry and had two touchdowns in the competition.

The Tigers rushed 35 times for 174 yards in the game. Even quarterback Jack McDaniels got in on the run, rushing seven times for 25 yards and a touchdown.

By air, McDaniels connected on 14 of 27 for 188 yards. He found targets in Bayley Blanchard and Tyriq Martin. Blanchard had five catches for 73 yards, and Martin had five catches for 100 yards and a touchdown. Martin's longest catch of the night was 46 yards in the Tigers first scoring drive.

Defensively, newcomer Michael Anderson had a big night. The Chatom, Ala. native had seven solo tackles and three tackle assists, one for a loss. Senior linebacker Josh Hatcher also played well with six solo tackles and three tackle assists.

It was well into the first quarter before the Tigers made it into the red zone. After a 46-yard pass from McDaniels to Martin, West Alabama found itself just 11 yards from the endzone. It would take the Tigers three more plays to score, with Demetrius Battle running the final two yards for the touchdown. Gabriel Dunkle lands the PAT to give UWA a 7-0 advantage with 4:56 left in the first quarter.

The second quarter belonged to the Choctaws. Mississippi College scored its first touchdown just five seconds into the period. MC attempted the point after, but Chris Terrell blocked the kick, which Shamar Lewis recovered, cutting West Alabama's lead to 7-6.

The Choctaws would make it into the endzone again after about 10 minutes ticked off the clock. The drive was made of 13 plays for 49 and took 6:48 to complete. After the touchdown, MC went for a two-point conversion and successfully grabbed a 14-7 lead with 6:37 left in the second period.

The Tigers answered in the very next drive. A long pass from McDaniels to Martin was good for a touchdown. UWA got the extra point and tied the game at 14 going into halftime.

In the third quarter, MC scored with just 1:42 left in the period. It took 5:23 to run 10 plays for 61 yards for a touchdown and the point after, giving the Choctaws a 21-14 lead.

West Alabama's offense ramped up in the final quarter for the win. The Tigers scored three times in under 10 minutes. After a two-minute-long drive of eight plays and 58 yards, UWA settled for a 44-yard field goal on the foot of Dunkle to cut the Choctaws lead to 21-17 with 14:33 left to play.

With a drive starting at 12:33, the Tiger positioned themselves to reclaim the lead. Battle started the campaign with a ten-yard carry for the first down. Battle went on to carry the ball an additional three before McDaniels got UWA's next first down, keeping it for 10 yards. Closing out the drive, McDaniels ran eight yards into the end zone for the touchdown, and Dunkle was good for the point after. West Alabama regained the lead at 24-17 with 10:39 remaining in the game.

The Tigers offense would strike one more time before the competition's close. Battle scored his second touchdown of the day on a one-yard carry. UWA got the PAT to extend its lead to 31-28 with just over five minutes to go.

Mississippi College struck last with a one-yard carry for a touchdown and the PAT. With under four minutes to go, the Choctaws would not score again for a 31-28 final score.

Michael Anderson recovered the fumble and ran it in for a touchdown. The Tigers got the extra point to extend their lead to 52-0 with 3:09 left before the half.

North American returned the possession to West Alabama after a punt. The Tigers continued their assault on the ground. Smith picked up 15 yards and then 11 yards to put UWA on the North American 10. McDaniels and Martin picked up seven yards in the air, and Smith ended the drive on a 3-yard rushing touchdown. Dunkle added the extra point for a 59-0 advantage with less than a minute left before halftime.

Returning from the half, the officials and the coaches decided to switch to 12-minute quarters. The Stallions had first possession, and after six plays for only 15 yards, North American punted the ball to the Tigers.

West Alabama started its first drive of the second half on the Stallions 33. Battle marched the ball down the field, rushing for 21 yards on the first down and gaining 33 on the third down for a touchdown. Kevin Butcher landed his first PAT of the season to put the score at 66-0.

The ball exchanged sides three times, and North American received the ball on a touchback to have it placed on its own 20-yard line. After three plays, the Stallions were forced to punt, and sophomore Kristopher Binion returned it 19 yards for a West Alabama touchdown. Butcher's PAT was good for a score of 73-0 with 58 seconds left in the third.

West Alabama took second possession in the fourth quarter. The Tigers kept the ball on the ground for nine plays and 91 yards. Battle ended the drive with a 14-yard rushing touchdown and a PAT from Butcher. UWA extends its lead to 80-0 with under five minutes to play for its last score of the game.

5 West Alabama 38, West Georgia 20

University Stadium

It was a big night for West Alabama football Saturday inside of University Stadium. With the 38-20 victory over the No. 9 ranked West Georgia, UWA claimed its first 5-0 start to a season since 1972, and head coach Brett Gilliland recorded his 50th career win.

Jack McDaniels completed 25 passes on 34 attempts for 323 yards and two touchdowns against the Wolves. His favorite target of the night was Tyriq Martin, who had 10 catches for 166 yards and one touchdown. He also connected with Bayley Blanchard six times for 87 yards and one touchdown.

On the ground, James Smith, III led the effort with 10 yards for 64 yards and one touchdown, and Demetrius Battle tallied 19 carries for 56 yards and two touchdowns.

On the defensive side of the ball, defensive end Chris Terrell had six solo tackles and one assist, including two tackles for a loss. The Pensacola, Fla. native also added a sack to the effort.

West Georgia took the ball first and marched it down the field. The Wolves used 11 plays to cover 80 yards in 4:28 minutes. The progress down the field mainly consisted of passes from UWG quarterback Harrison Frost. The drive ended on a 10-yard pass from Frost to wide receiver Phil Patterson for the game's first touchdown. The PAT by Omar Cervantes was good, and West Georgia grabbed an early 7-0 lead with 10:32 left in the first period.

West Alabama answered with a long, sustained drive of its own. UWA ran 11 plays for 78 yards in 4:35. Jack McDaniels kept the ball mostly in the air during the campaign. The Tigers scored their first touchdown when McDaniels connected with Tyriq Martin in the end zone for 25 yards. Gabriel Dunkle kicked the PAT to tie the game at 7-7 with 5:51 left in the first quarter.

On the next possession, the scoring continued for the Wolves. UWG took the

ensuing kickoff and went 82 yards in 11 plays, getting into the end zone on a one-yard run by Jace Jordan. Cervantes added the point after, and it was 14-7 with just under two minutes left in the first.

West Alabama took possession of the ball on its own 48-yard line after a 62-yard kickoff and a 30-yard return by Greg McConico, Jr. A personal foul by West Georgia added 15 yards to the run. On the first play from the scrimmage, McDaniels completed a 14-yard pass to Darius Nalls. Two plays later, he connected with Bayley Blanchard for 24 yards and found Martin again for 12 yards. The first quarter ended in the middle of the drive, and the Tigers started the second quarter just two yards shy of the end zone.

Demetrius Battle covered the yardage for a Tiger touchdown. Dunkle added the point after, and UWA tied the game at 14 with 14:57 left before the close of the half.

The two defensive units began to settle into their roles in the second quarter. The touchdown-for-touchdown streak ended the period.

UWG field goal kicker took the field for the first time in the competition on the next possession. The Tiger D-Block stalled West Georgia's efforts to make a return to the endzone. Cervantes attempted a 50-yard field goal for the Wolves, but it was wide and to the left to end the drive.

West Alabama suffered a similar fate on the next drive, but the Tigers ended up on top. After marching down the field, Dunkle ended the campaign with a 41-yard field goal to give UWA a 17-14 advantage with 9:23 left in the half.

The following two possessions ended in punts before West Georgia put together a good drive with 6:28 left in the second. After the Wolves marched down to the UWA 39-yard line, a series of incomplete passes forced UWG to settle on a field goal. Cervantes made his second field goal attempt on the night. This time, he stuck the 45-yarder to tie the game at 17 with under three minutes before halftime.

In the Tigers last campaign of the half, on a third and three, McDaniels found Martin for 43 yards to put UWA on the West Georgia 5-yard line. Running back James Smith, III carried the ball the rest of the way on the next play, and Dunkle grabbed the PAT. UWA regained the lead at 24-17 to close the half.

The second half opened with two possessions that ended in punts. A West Georgia punt ended in a Tiger miscue and a penalty on the third drive, returning the possession to the Wolves. West Georgia capitalized on the mistake and converted the campaign into a 21-yard field goal, cutting the UWA lead to 24-20.

The Tigers made up for the error on the next drive, covering 80 yards in 7 plays. In just 2:27, McDaniels completed several passes to put West Alabama in scoring position. The campaign ended when he connected with Bayley Blanchard for a 24-yard touchdown. Dunkle's point after was good to extend the West Alabama lead to 31-20 with 6:26 left in the third quarter.

West Georgia's next possession resulted in a punt. UWA's offense took over at the Wolves 42-yard line. The Tigers kept the ball on the ground with several runs by Demetrius Battle. Battle scored his second touchdown of the game on a three-yard carry with the point after. UWA moved to 38-20 over West Georgia with just 1:26 left in the third period.

In the remaining minute in the quarter, the Wolves rushed to score. A couple of incomplete passes and penalties forced West Georgia into a third and 15. With just seconds left, Tiger defensive end Christopher Terrell sacked the Frost for a two-yard loss. UWG ended the drive with a punt to start the fourth quarter.

West Alabama's first drive of the quarter ended with a punt, and UWG took over at their own 16-yard line. The Wolves marched into Tiger territory, but on a third and 10, linebacker Trevon Stanford recorded his first interception of the year to reclaim possession for UWA with 10:28 left to play.

The defense held off scoring for the rest of the game for a final score of 38-20.

West Alabama 44, Shorter 7

With a 72.2 pass completion percentage, senior quarterback Jack McDaniels connected with receivers 26 times for 262 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Tigers to a 44-7 victory over Shorter University.

With McDaniels taking charge, the Tigers offense saw 496 total yards (209 rushing and 287 passing) with 26 first downs. McDaniels favorite target during the competition was Tyriq Martin. The Goose Creek, S.C. native had nine receptions for 111 yards and one touchdown.

On the ground, Demetrius Battle led the run game to average 6.7 yards per run. With 15 carries for 100 yards, Battle found the endzone twice for touchdowns.

The D-Block held firm against the Shorter offense and made big plays to keep the Hawks from scoring. Charvez Embry blocked a crucial field goal, Shamar Lewis caught an interception for 14 yards, and Undraez Lilly, Michael Anderson, and Michael Sharpley had sacks for losses.

UWA's defense held Shorter to just 228 yards and 10 first downs. Christopher Terrell had five solo tackles and one tackle assist, leading the team, while Schdarren Archie had four tackles and three tackle assists.

The Tigers overcame an unsteady first quarter, sprinkled with several miscues, including an interception and a fumble recovered by the Hawks.

With the 44-7 victory over Shorter, West Alabama takes a 6-0 season start for the first time in program history and a 3-0 start in conference play since 2017.

Just a minute after the start of the second quarter, West Alabama finally found its rhythm and started the first scoring drive of the competition. It took the Tigers 4:44, 12 plays, and 69 yards to make it to the endzone. The ball spent most of that time in the air with McDaniels finding receiver Tyriq Martin for two passes for 10 yards. The drive ended on a 21-yard pass o Bayley Blanchard for a touchdown and point-after by Gabriel Dunkle to give the Tigers a 7-0 advantage with 9:16 left in the first half.

Shorter made three plays on the next drive before Shamar Lewis intercepted a pass from Hawk quarterback Aeneas Dennis and returned it for 14 yards. The Tiger offense took over at the 47-yard line but could not capitalize on the Hawk's miscue. UWA punted after three short plays.

The ball changed possessions three times before Shorter started a campaign

that put them in perfect position for a field goal attempt. Tiger defensive tackle Charvez Embry blocked the kick, and Trevon Stanford returned it for 41 yards. UWA offense took over. McDaniels completed a 26-yard pass to Deyon Hill, and Demetrius Battle ended the campaign with a 2-yard carry into the endzone. Dunkle scored the point after, and the Tigers extended its lead to 14-0 with just seven seconds left in the half.

West Alabama made quick work of the first possession in the second half. After kickoff and a 37-yard return by Bry Webb, the Tigers started the campaign on their 41-yard line. On a second-down and six, McDaniels connected with Blanchard for an 18-yard pass. Battle added four with a run, and then McDaniels found Martin for 14 yards. Completing the effort, Battle ran for 23 yards and a touchdown, with Dunkle collecting the point after. UWA moved to 21-0 over Shorter with 13:03 left in the period.

Another Shorter punt returned the ball to West Alabama on its 32-yard line to begin another scoring drive. With a mix of ground and air play, the Tigers covered 68 yards in 7 plays and 2:40. In the campaign, running back James Smith, III had a 17-yard carry, and McDaniels found Martin for a 31-yard touchdown. Unfortunately, the point after was no good, but the Tigers maintained their lead with a score of 27-0 with 7:39 left in the third quarter.

Shorter's next drive also ends in a punt, and the Tigers took the opportunity to score again. Starting the drive on their 45-yard line, McDaniels kept the ball for a 22-yard carry, and Battle rushed for 10. McDaniels connected with Martin for seven yards and Smith for 17 and another touchdown. The point after was good, and the score moved to 34-0 with 4:44 left in the period.

The Hawks finally made it on the board in the third. After a 29-yard kickoff by Tiger kicker Trey Sullivan, West Alabama had an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty that gave Shorter an additional 15 yards. On the very next play, Hawk quarterback Aeneas Dennis connected with John Dietl for a 32-yard touchdown. Nick Pope added the point after to cut West Alabama's lead to 34-7 with 43 seconds remaining in the third quarter.

West Alabama took first possession of the fourth quarter. After several attempts to make it into the endzone, the Tigers were in a fourth and three situation and elected to kick a field goal. Dunkle stuck the 22-yarder for the three points to give UWA a 30-point lead over the Hawks, 37-7 with 13:01 left in the game.

UWA covered the short 45 yards after a shallow punt to the endzone in six plays in 2:10 seconds in the game's final scoring drive. The campaign ended with a 15-yard carry by Bry Webb and the PAT, and the Tigers extended their lead to 44-7 with 9:23 left to play. The remaining minutes went scoreless to give West Alabama the win.

West Alabama 17, Valdosta State 42

No. 9/10 West Alabama played a solid first quarter but saw No. 5/4 Valdosta State takeover in the second as the Blazers beat the Tigers 42-17 on Saturday at Tiger Stadium.

Demetrius Battle rushed 17 times for 99 yards, and quarterback Jack McDaniels carried four times for 41 yards, as UWA rushed for 174 yards in the game. McDaniels hit 14 of 37 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns. His main target was Tyriq Martin, who had seven receptions for 90 yards and two touchdowns.

On defense, Josh Hatcher led West Alabama with eight tackles. Shamar Lewis had six, and Chris Terrell and Jeremiah Boyd had five each. Terrell also had one tackle for a loss of three yards, and Boyd had an interception with a 15-yard return.

Valdosta won the toss and deferred to the second half. West Alabama took full advantage of the opening drive and made it to the endzone in 3:15 seconds with nine plays for 75 yards. Tigers started on the ground with quarterback Jack McDaniels rushing for 39 yards on a first and 10. The campaign finished in the air as McDaniels connected with wide receiver Tyriq Martin for six yards and a touchdown. Gabriel Dunkle scored the point after, and the Tigers were 7-0 over the Blazers with 11:45 remaining to play in the period.

After a Valdosta point, UWA opened the next campaign with a 27-yard carry by Demetrius Battle. On the very next play, McDaniels found Martin again, this time for 39 yards and another touchdown. The extra point was good, and the Tigers extended its lead to 14-0 over Valdosta with 8:14 left in the quarter.

Finding themselves down by 14, the Blazers focused on the next drive to make it into the endzone. VSU quarterback Ivory Durham found Brian Saunders for 21 yards on a third and six to keep them in possession. To score, Durham connected with Lio'undre Gallimore for 46 yards. Estin Thiele grabbed the point after to cut UWA's lead to 14-7 with 5:48 left in the quarter.

The Tigers ended their last drive with a punt, and Valdosta took possession at its 35-yard line. Durham kept the ball in the air, finding Sauds for 31 yards on a second down and again for an additional 16. Jamar Thompkins jetted the last 18 yards for the touchdown to reach the endzone, and the PAT was good to tie the game at 14 with 3:15 remaining in the first.

Scoring slowed, and the ball changed possessions three times going into the second quarter. Valdosta took control on its 40-yard line and took 2:48 to complete seven plays for 60 yards. Punctuating the campaign, Durham found Gallimore for 21 yards, and Thiele added the point after. The Blazers took their first lead of the competition, 21-14, with 11:40 left in the half.

Closing the gap, the Tigers went on another drive to score. Unable to reach the endzone, Dunkle grabbed three points for UWA on a 25-yard field goal. The Tigers cut Valdosta's lead to 21-17, with 6:56 remaining in the second quarter.

Two punts return possession to Valdosta. A 59-yard pass from Durham to Saunders gives the Blazers their fourth down of the game and a 28-17 advantage over West Alabama with 1:44 left before halftime.

With less than two minutes left in the half, UWA worked fast to return to the endzone before retiring to the locker rooms. McDaniels completed a 23-yard pass to Bayley Blanchard after a Valdosta penalty and found him again for 17 yards. The Tigers could not score a touchdown despite the effort, and Dunkle missed the 36-yard field goal attempt.

Coming back from the halftime break, Valdosta started its first drive on their 19-yard line. After a few miscues, the Blazers scored another touchdown, covering 81 yards in 11 plays and 5:03. Seth McGill ran the ball into the endzone for VSU, and the PAT was good. Valdosta improved to 35-17 with 9:52 left in the third quarter.

After the punt, the Tigers took possession at their 25-yard line. Battle carried the ball on the first and second downs to pick up 15 yards and added an extra three on a second and 10 to put the Tigers on their 40. A rare interception off the hand of Jack McDaniels resulted in a pick-six for Valdosta. The Blazers hit the extra point and extended their lead to 42-17 with 7:57 left to play in the period.

West Alabama continued to fight against Valdosta and made some big plays in the final minutes of the third quarter and in the fourth. One such play was

an interception by Jeremiah Boyd for a 15-yard return to get the Tigers in the red zone.

Despite the effort, UWA could not bounce back, and the Tigers fell 42-17 for their first loss of the season.
