POSTSEASON PLAY BEGINS FOR BADGERS WITH BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Wisconsin begins postseason play this weekend with the Big Ten tournament. As the No. 2 seed, the Badgers earned the right to host their quarterfinal match against No. 7 seed Ohio State on Sunday in Madison. Wisconsin won the Big Ten tournament last year in West Lafayette, Indiana. Kickoff Sunday is at noon (CT) at the McClimon Complex.

STARTING XI

- BIG TEN CHAMPS:** Last weekend, Wisconsin clinched a share of its first Big Ten regular season title since 1994. The Badgers have now won two regular season titles and three Big Ten tournament titles, including last year's tourney.
- BIG TEN'S BEST:** Wisconsin had three individual award winners headline season-ending awards from the Big Ten. Paula Wilkins was Coach of the Year, Rose Lavelle was Midfielder of the Year & Victoria Pickett was Freshman of the Year.
- ROSE IN BLOOM:** 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy candidate Rose Lavelle leads UW in points, goals and assists. A standout in the U.S. Soccer youth program, Lavelle has drawn praise from U.S. Women's National Team coach Jill Ellis.
- MEUER POWER:** Asked to fill a new role this year, McKenna Meuer has stepped up and produced. The senior has scored a career high six goals (plus 3 assists for 15 points). She scored a combined seven goals her first three seasons.
- KICKING IT WITH KINLEY:** Kinley McNicoll has found her offensive stride recently. The senior has tallied at least a point in six of the last nine games; goal in 4 of last 9. She is one assist away from tying UW's career assist record (30).
- STINGY WITH STELZER:** Anchored by Brianna Stelzer, the Badgers have posted shutouts in eight of the last 10 games. Stelzer and Wisconsin set a Big Ten record for shutouts in a season last year with 18 shutouts in 24 matches.
- CALLING ON CLEM:** Sophomore Caitlyn Clem has stepped into net this season for graduating All-American Genevieve Richard (RISH-ard). With nine shutouts this year, Clem ranks 8th in school history for SOs in a season.
- BATTLE-TESTED BADGERS:** Wisconsin has faced six nationally-ranked teams so far this season. Wisconsin knocked off then-No. 11 Minnesota at home on Oct. 2, which was UW's first win over a top-11 team since 1998.
- BIG MILESTONE:** Head coach Paula Wilkins recently surpassed the milestone of 100 career Big Ten wins (103). Between time at Wisconsin and Penn State, she has won seven Big Ten regular season titles and three tourney titles.
- CONSISTENT CONTENDERS:** Under coach Wilkins, the Badgers have won 10+ games in a season a school record seven straight seasons. UW has also won 5+ Big Ten games seven years in a row, which is also a school record.
- THE WILKINS WAY:** With Coach Wilkins now in her ninth season, Wisconsin is looking to make the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in seven years. Wilkins is approaching 100 career wins at Wisconsin (98-59-24).

WISCONSIN IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The Badgers kick off postseason play this weekend with the 2015 Big Ten Tournament. As the No. 2 seed, Wisconsin earned the right to host its quarterfinal match, which is against No. 7 seed Ohio State.

- Wisconsin is 15-13-2 all-time in the Big Ten touney.
- The Badgers have laid claim to three tournament championships, including last season's title.
UW also won the 1994 and 2005 B1G tourney.

- This is the first time Wisconsin has hosted a Big Ten tournament game in Madison since 2003.
UW hosted the tournament in 2003 and advanced to the semifinals by beating Penn State in a shootout (4-3). Wisconsin fell to Michigan in the semis, 1-0.

- Head Coach Paula Wilkins has coached teams to three Big Ten tournament titles. That includes last year's at Wisconsin, as well as 2001 and 2006 while the head coach at Penn State.

SERIES VS. OHIO STATE

Sunday's game vs. Ohio State will mark the second meeting this season and the 26th all-time meeting between the Buckeyes and the Badgers.

- Wisconsin narrows leads the all-time series, 10-9-6.
- The Badgers hold an 8-2-2 all-time edge in Madison.
- The two teams faced earlier this season in Columbus, Ohio, on Sept. 20. A defensive battle, neither side was able to score and the game ended in a 0-0 double overtime draw.
- Three of the last four games between Wisconsin and Ohio State have gone to overtime. Two of the last four have gone into double overtime.
- Wisconsin is unbeaten in its last four games against Ohio State.
- The Badgers seek their third straight win at home against the Buckeyes.
- Head coach **Paula Wilkins** holds a 3-3-3 all-time record against Ohio State while at Wisconsin.
In Madison, Wilkins and the Badgers hold a 3-1-1 all-time record against OSU.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- Ohio State enters the Big Ten tournament coming off a 2-0 shutout of Michigan State on Wednesday.
- Nichelle Prince leads the Buckeyes with 18 points on six goals and six assists.
- There are four Buckeyes, Prince (18), Nikki Walts (15), Lindsay Agnew (14) and Michela Paradiso (12), who have tallied at least 12 points each.
- Two goalkeepers have split time for OSU this season. Devon Kerr has a 4-0-1 record and one solo shutout. Jillian McVicker has a 6-5-2 record and one solo shutout.
- Ohio State is under the direction of 19th-year head coach Lori Walker. She has guided the team to nine NCAA Tournament berths (2002-03-04-07-09-10-11-12-13), a Big Ten regular season championship (2010) and three Big Ten Tournament championships (2002, 2004, 2012). Her record at Ohio State is 212-146-37 and her career record, including two seasons at Kansas, is 225-169-38.

NOTES FROM UW'S LAST MATCH

NORTHWESTERN 2, WISCONSIN 1 (20T) - 10/28/15 - MADISON

- **Rose Lavelle** scored her team-leading seventh goal of the year and gave Wisconsin a 1-0 lead in the 74th minute, but Northwestern responded with a game-tying goal in the 81st minute and then won stunned the Badgers with a heartbreaking goal in double overtime for a 2-1 win in Madison.
- Goalkeeper **Caitlyn Clem** finished with four saves, but allowed two goals in the loss.
- UW lost its first game since Sept. 17 at Penn State.

LAVELLE, PICKETT, WILKINS HEADLINE SEASON-ENDING BIG TEN AWARDS

Wisconsin had three individual award winners headline its season-ending recognition from the Big Ten Conference on Friday.

- **Paula Wilkins** was Big Ten Coach of the Year. She is just the second in Wisconsin history, joining Dean Duerst in 1996. It was Wilkins' first Big Ten Coach of the Year honor at Wisconsin and sixth overall.
- **Rose Lavelle** was Big Ten Midfielder of the Year and was the only unanimous first team All-Big Ten honoree. She's the first to win the award at UW.
- **Victoria Pickett** was Big Ten Freshman of the Year. She was also named to the All-Big Ten second team and All-Big Ten freshman team.
- **Brianna Stelzer** and **Caitlyn Clem** were named to the All-Big Ten second team. This is the second straight year Stelzer has earned All-Big Ten second team accolades.
- **Holly Heckendorf** was recognized as a Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Over the last four seasons, Wisconsin is 28-9-1 at home at the McClimmon Soccer Complex.
- With head coach Paula Wilkins at the helm, the Badgers have now won five or more home games in eight of her nine seasons.
- UW finished 5-1 in home Big Ten games during the regular season.
Wisconsin was 4-1-1 in Big Ten home games last season, losing only to eventual champ Penn State.
The last time the Badgers went unbeaten at home in Big Ten play was under Wilkins in 2010 (4-0-1).
- Under head coach Paula Wilkins, the Badgers are 30-15-6 at home against Big Ten opponents.

NATIONAL PRAISE

A handful of Badgers have been garnering individual honors, both nationally and conference.

- Junior midfielder **Rose Lavelle** was named to the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer.
- Lavelle has been named to the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week twice this year: 8/25, 10/20.
She also earned honorable mention on Sept. 8.
- Junior midfielder **Micaela Powers** was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 27 after she scored the game-winning goal -- the first of her

- The Badgers earned the No. 2 seed in the Big Ten tournament and the right to host their quarterfinal match, which takes place Sunday at noon against No. 7 seed Ohio State at the McClimon Complex.
- No. 9 Rutgers, No. 10 Penn State and No. 25 Wisconsin represent the Big Ten in the most recent NSCAA rankings.

ROSE IN BLOOM

Junior **Rose Lavelle** broke onto the scene as a freshman and has become one of the nation's best.

- Lavelle was named to the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the highest individual honor in college soccer.
- Lavelle entered 2015 ranked as the No. 2 player in the country in TopDrawerSoccer's player rankings. She was on TDS' preseason Best XI First Team.
- This season, Lavelle either leads or is tied for UW's lead in points (17), goals (7) and assists (3).
She also paces the Badgers in shots (73) and shots on goal (31).

- Last season, Lavelle and teammate Genevieve Richard became the first Badgers to earn NSCAA All-America honors since Allison Wagner in 2000. Lavelle was a second team All-American.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio native was the first player in UW history to be tabbed conference freshman of the year in 2013. During her freshman campaign, Lavelle tied for eighth in the conference in assists (7) and led all Big Ten freshman in the category.
- As a freshman, Lavelle also became the first UW player to earn first-team All-Big Ten accolades since Michele Dalton earned the honor in 2011. She earned first-team Big Ten accolades again in 2014.
- Lavelle was named to the NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region first team last year; third team as freshman.
- Known for her creativity and possession in the mid-field, Lavelle is always a threat offensively. She led the team last year in assists (10) and ranked fourth for points with 16 on her 10 assists and three goals.
- A noted up-and-comer in the U.S. Soccer youth system, Lavelle was a finalist for 2014 U.S. Soccer Young Female Athlete of the Year.
- Lavelle was awarded the Golden Ball at the 2014 CONCACAF Women's U-20 Championships.

ROSE LAVELLE HAS JILL ELLIS' ATTENTION

In a recent interview with espnW, U.S. Women's National Team head coach Jill Ellis spoke about what's next for the national team and made specific mention and praise of Wisconsin junior midfielder **Rose Lavelle**.

- When asked whether some college players would be among those called in for camp over the next few months, Rose Lavelle was a name specifically mentioned by Jill Ellis as being on her radar.
- "Rose impressed me at the U-20 World Cup in Canada," Jill Ellis told espnW. "She's an intriguing player because the game slows down for her. She solves situations with her brain. The challenge for young players is always stepping into the next level, in terms of how much faster the game is. I don't necessarily focus on the stature of the player, more their durability and strength to hold players off. I think Rose has those physical qualities in college, and now I want to see her at our level."

KICKING IT WITH KINLEY

Since being honored on the All-Big Ten Freshman team, senior **Kinley McNicoll** has elevated her game throughout her collegiate career and is now looking to make the most of her senior campaign in Madison.

- After a slow start to her season, McNicoll has hit stride recently and been a big part of the Badgers' second-half surge this year.
McNicoll has tallied at least a point in six of the last nine games.
She's scored a goal in four of the last nine.
- McNicoll ranks second in school history for career assists (29) and is now just one helper shy of tying the school record.
- McNicoll entered 2015 ranked 18th in the country in the TopDrawerSoccer national player rankings. She's on TDS' preseason Best XI Second Team.
- McNicoll was a second team all-region honoree and a first team All-Big Ten selection last season. She was also on the All-Big Ten second team in 2013.

- McNicoll was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week once last season (9/9), as well as ESPNW College Soccer Player of the Week (9/10) and TopDrawerSoccer Women's Player of the Week (9/9).
- McNicoll had a junior campaign to remember, highlighted by scoring the game-winning goal in double overtime of the Big Ten tournament championship game. She was Big Ten Tournament Offensive MVP.
- One of the leaders for UW in points each season, McNicoll ranked second among Badgers last season with 27 points on nine goals and nine assists. She led UW in points during the 2013 season.

WORLD-CLASS BADGERS

- **Rose Lavelle** and **Kinley McNicoll** have both become prominent players and up-and-comers with their respective country's youth system.
- Lavelle started all four matches for the U.S. at the 2014 U-20 Women's World Cup, scoring her first international goal at the U-20 level and helping the U.S. advance out of group play and to quarterfinals. Lavelle helped lead the U.S. U-23s to a title at the Four Nations Tournament this past spring, tallying an assist in each of the three games and added one goal to her tournament tally in the finale vs. England.
- McNicoll served as team captain for host Canada at the 2014 U-20 Women's World Cup in Toronto. She played in all four matches and the Oakville, Ontario native helped guide Team Canada to the quarterfinals. McNicoll most recently played for Canada at the 2015 Pan American Games, also hosted by Canada.
- **Victoria Pickett** played with UW teammate McNicoll for Canada at both the 2015 Pan American Games and the 2014 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup. Pickett was 15 years old when she made her debut in the Canadian youth program.

- **Emily Borgmann** represented Canada at the 2014 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Costa Rica, starting two games and playing in all four games. Borgmann also played for Canada at the 2013 CONCACAF Women's U-17 Championship in Montego Bay. She helped Canada win a silver medal by starting in all five games and scoring five goals.

LAVELLE NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Earlier this summer, junior midfielder **Rose Lavelle** was named a candidate for the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer.

- An All-American last season, Lavelle was one of 28 women marked as a potential contender on the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- The MAC Hermann Trophy is the highest individual award presented to a player in intercollegiate soccer and is awarded annually to one male and one female athlete.

LAVELLE A FINALIST FOR 2015 MOST VALUABLE PLAYER OF USL W-LEAGUE

For her performance over the summer, junior midfielder

Rose Lavelle was named a finalist for the 2015 Most Valuable Player of the United Soccer League (USL) W-League.

- One of just three finalists for the league's highest individual honor, Lavelle played for the Seattle Sounders Women this summer. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored seven goals on the season and also tallied four assists in nine games with the Sounders. Lavelle ranked 10th in the W-League for points (18).
- Seattle earned a top postseason spot with a 10-1-1 overall record, but fell to the Colorado Pride in the Western Conference final. Lavelle did not play in the game, however. The Sounders were an undefeated 8-0-1 with Lavelle in the lineup.

LAVELLE AND MCNICOLL GARNER W-LEAGUE CONFERENCE HONORS

The Wisconsin duo of **Rose Lavelle** and **Kinley McNicoll** garnered individual team honors from the United Soccer Leagues (USL) W-League this week, as Lavelle earned all-league and all-conference nods, and McNicoll was an all-conference honoree.

- Both Lavelle and McNicoll played for the Seattle Sounders Women this summer. The duo helped lead Seattle to the conference championship game and the top postseason spot in the Western Conference with a 10-1-1 overall record.
- Lavelle and McNicoll were named to the 2015 W-League All-Western Conference Team. For Lavelle, it marked her second-consecutive season garnering all-conference accolades in the W-League.
- In addition, Lavelle was also named to the 2015 All-League Team. The midfielder ranked 10th in the league for points with 18 in nine games during the season. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native also ranked eighth in assists with four.

BADGERS PICKED THIRD BY COACHES

The Big Ten Conference preseason coaches poll picked Wisconsin to finish third in league play.

- This marks the sixth-straight season in which Wisconsin has been predicted to finish among the top five in the Big Ten coaches poll.
- Defending regular season champion Penn State enters 2015 as the favorite, followed by Michigan at No. 2 and then Wisconsin and Rutgers in a tie to finish No. 3.
- In addition to the coaches poll, the Big Ten also released its list of players to watch. From Wisconsin, that list included 2014 NSCAA second-team All-American **Rose Lavelle**, along with 2014 All-Big Ten honorees **Kinley McNicoll** and **Brianna Stelzer**.

Under Wilkins, Wisconsin put together the winningest season in program history in 2014. The Badgers finished 19-3-2, winning the Big Ten tournament and advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament. Wilkins coached Rose Lavelle and Genevieve RichardClick here to hear it to become the program's first NSCAA All-Americans since 2000, while Richard also became just the second player in UW history to be named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year. Cara WallsClick here to hear it, Rose Lavelle and Kinley McNicoll joined Richard in earning First-Team All-Big Ten accolades, while Brianna Stelzer was Second Team All-Big Ten. Lavelle, McNicoll, Richard, Stelzer and Walls each earned All-Great Lakes Region recognition, as well.

Wilkins has compiled a remarkable 206-74-32 (.712) record through 14 seasons as a head coach. Prior to her start at Wisconsin, Wilkins was the head coach at Penn State for six years. The Nittany Lions earned six NCAA tournament berths, which included two College Cup appearances during her tenure. In addition, Penn State won the last six Big Ten regular season championships, along with a pair of Big Ten tournament titles.

Penn State dominated Big Ten women's soccer for most of the 13 seasons of the school's sponsorship of the sport and Wilkins was part of the coaching staff the entire time. She joined the Nittany Lions as an assistant coach when the program debuted as a varsity sport in 1994 and served in that role until she was named head coach at the end of the 2000 campaign.

Wilkins coached nine All-Americans at Penn State, including four-time All-American Christie Welsh, the 2001 player of the year and winner of the prestigious M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Wilkins also recruited and guided Tiffany Weimer, a three-time All-American, two-time Big Ten offensive player of the year and the conference's record holder in career goals.

Paula Wilkins

Establishing a winning culture at Wisconsin

Having led teams to a pair of College Cup Semifinal appearances and 10 NCAA tournament berths, Paula Wilkins has earned a reputation as one of the most accomplished women's college soccer head coaches in the country. Through eight seasons in Madison, she has made giant leaps in rebuilding and sustaining the women's soccer program at Wisconsin.

- ▶ Now in her ninth season at Wisconsin, **Paula Wilkins** holds a career coaching record of 217-79-35. Having guided the Badgers to NCAA tournament appearances four of the last six years, the five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year looks to lead a talented group back to the postseason this year.
- ▶ Wilkins earned her 200th career win as a head coach last season by leading Wisconsin to a 4-1 win on the road against rival Minnesota on Oct. 18.
- ▶ Wilkins is approaching 100 career wins at Wisconsin with her record sitting at 98-60-24. She currently ranks third in school history for career coaching wins at Wisconsin. Dean Duerst (1994-2006) holds the program record with 151 wins in Madison, while Greg Ryan is second at 108.
- ▶ Last season, not only did Wilkins lead the Badgers in becoming the winningest team in school history, but the 2014 squad also became the fastest group to reach 10 wins in a season. Last year's team was just the fourth ever at Wisconsin to begin with a 10-1 start.
- ▶ With their magical run during the 2014 season, Wilkins and the Badgers became the first team in school history to reach 13 wins in a single season since 2005.
- ▶ UW has been incredibly consistent under the guidance of Wilkins. The Badgers reached 10 wins for a school-record seventh straight season this year. UW has also won 5+ Big Ten games a record seven years in a row.

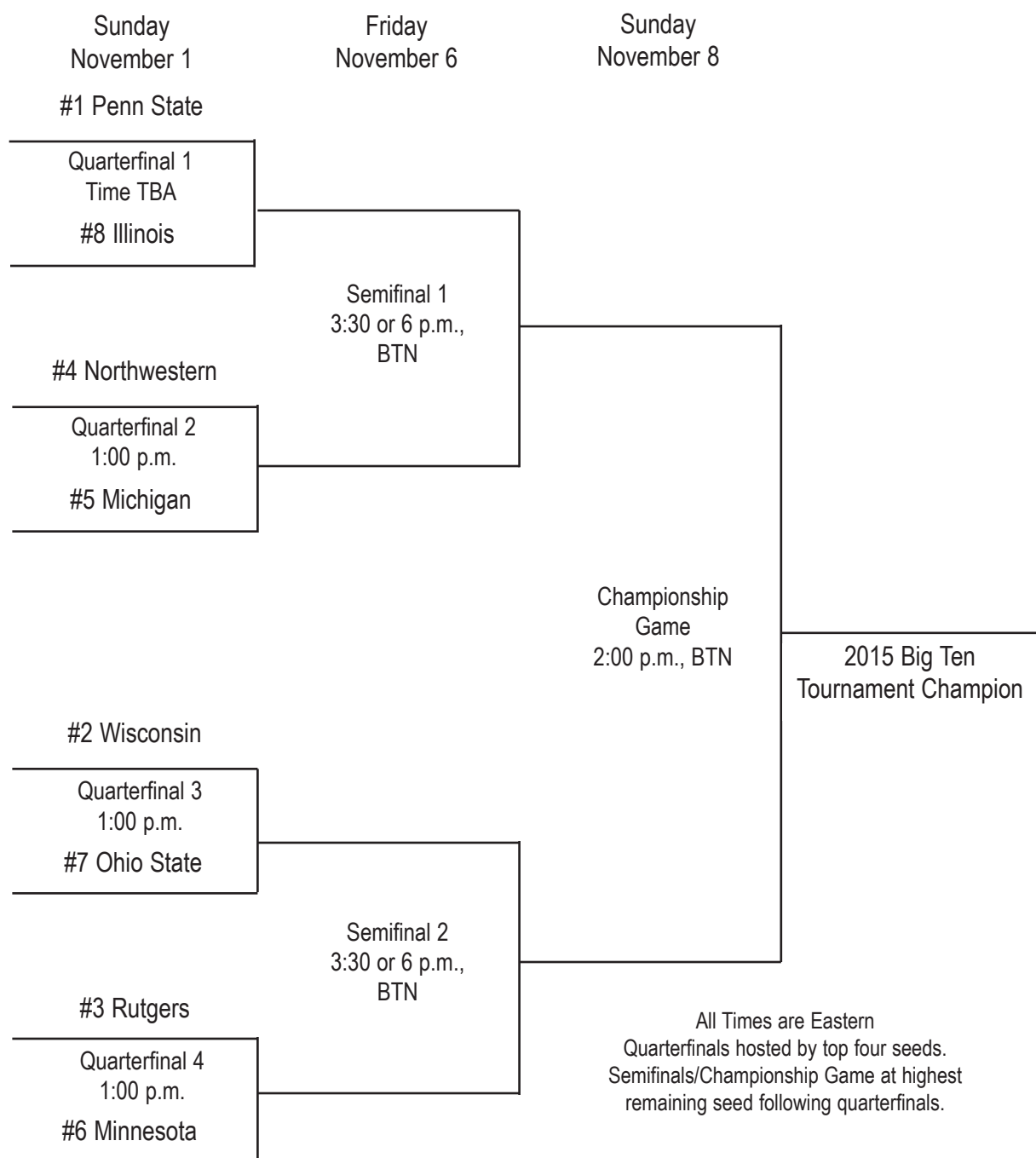

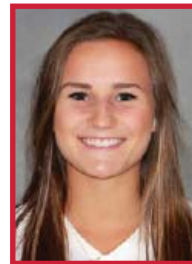

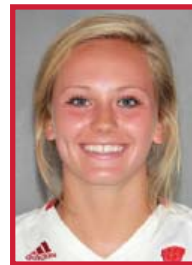
