IN THE PAINT...

- North Dakota treks to Wisconsin to take on the Badgers in the team's first road game of the season on Tuesday, Nov. 17. The game will be aired on ESPN3.
- The Wisconsin-UND series dates back to 1936, but these two teams have met only six times on the hardwood with the Badgers winning each of those contests by double figures.
- Wisconsin and Minnesota are the only two Big Ten schools that UND has played since making the move to Division I prior to the 2008-09 season. UND played Nebraska, a current Big Ten member, during the 2010-11 season as well, but the Cornhuskers were a Big 12 member at the time of that game (77-46 loss; Jan. 3, 2011). UND is 0-4 in those DI tilts against Big Ten members.
- UND's last visit to the Kohl Center saw last year's National Player of the Year Frank Kominsky and two-time Mid-Major All-American Troy Huff go toe-to-toe in a rare shootout on UW's home court. Kominsky scored a Badgers' program record 43 points, while Huff, who was playing his home state, poured in a career-high 37 points in a game Wisconsin would win 102-85.
- For the second time in three seasons, UND opened its season with a win over Minnesota-Morris. Six players reached double figures in the 99-69 victory over the Cougars. UND has now won six-straight home openers and is 6-4 in season openers under Jones.
- Four of those were newcomers as that group accounted for 73 of the team's point total. True freshman Cortez Seales led the charge with 27 points as he went 11-for-15 from the field and 5-for-6 from the foul line in his UND debut.

OPPONENT PREVIEW: WISCONSIN

- Head coach Bo Ryan led Wisconsin to a 37-4 record a year ago and a national runner-up finish after falling to Duke in the title game, 68-63.
- The Badgers lost a pair of first-round NBA Draft picks (Frank Kominisky; No. 9 by Charlotte and Sam Dekker; No. 18 by Houston) off that team, but opened the season ranked No. 17 in the *Associated Press* and *USA Today Coaches' polls*.
- Wisconsin will bring a 1-1 record into its game against UND after splitting the first two games of the season. In the season opener, Western Illinois - a team picked to finish last in the Summit League - shocked the Badgers by posting a 69-67 win at the Kohl Center on Friday.
- Junior Bronson Koenig made sure the Badgers didn't start the year 0-2 as he tallied a career-high 23 points in a 92-65 win over Siena on Sunday. He averaged 8.7 ppg and started 24 of 40 games a year ago.
- Classmate Nigel Hayes is the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 12.4 ppg in 40 starts last season. He is scoring at a 15.5 ppg in the Badgers' two games this season.
- Hayes (four pts) and Koenig (five pts) combined for nine points in reserve roles as freshman in the 102-85 win over UND two seasons ago.
- Forward Vitto Brown is coming off a career-high 16-point effort in the win over Siena and is leading the team in rebounding through two games at 6.0 rpg.
- The 1-1 start to the season dropped Wisconsin out of the *Associated Press* and *USA Today Coaches' polls* on Monday. The Badgers had opened the season ranked No. 17 in both.

UP NEXT

North Dakota will leave Madison on Wednesday morning and depart for Fort Myers, Fla. , where the team will begin preparing for the Hilton Garden Inn FGCU Classic. UND opens the multi-team event with a matchup against Bowling Green on Saturday. The squad's second game is against host Florida Gulf Coast on Sunday and the final game in the Sunshine State is against Youngstown State on Monday. The Penguins are the only team on UND's 2015-16 schedule that UND has never played before on the hardwood.

ROAD TO RENO STARTS NOW

After not advancing to the Big Sky Tournament for the first time as a conference member last season, UND knows going into this season that a similar fate is no longer a possibility. All 12 league teams will travel to Reno, Nev., and participate in the 2016 tournament to be held March 8-12. This is a change from previous seasons when the regular-season champion would earn the right to host the conference tournament. Only eight teams made the field in 2015. UND advanced to the semifinals of the 2013 Big Sky Tournament and appeared in the title game at the 2014 event.

LAST TIME OUT | UND 99, Minnesota-Morris 69 (Nov. 13, 2015)

GRAND FORKS, N.D. -- True freshman **Cortez Seales** scored a game-high 27 points in his collegiate debut to lead North Dakota to a 99-69 victory over Minnesota-Morris Friday at the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center. It was the sixth straight season that UND (1-0) won its home opener as six players finished in double figures for the home team.

Seales made his first four field goals as UND raced out to an 18-2 lead and was never threatened by the visiting Cougars, who counted this contest as an exhibition. The left-hander finished 11-for-15 from the field to help UND finish with a 54.9 percent shooting clip in the opener.

JUCO-transfer **Corey Baldwin** added 17 as five UND newcomers accounted for 73 of the team's 99 points. True freshman **Conner Avants** joined veteran point guard **Quinton Hooker** with 12 points, while **Drick Bernstine** and **Carson Shanks** both added 10 in the victory.

Hooker led all players with seven assists and three steals, while Shanks topped all players with eight boards. The seven-footer helped UND dominate the glass, holding a 52-37 edge in that category.

LAST TIME VS. WISCONSIN | Wisconsin 103, UND 85 (Nov. 13, 2013)

MADISON, Wis. -- North Dakota senior Troy Huff scored a career-high 37 points in his return to his native state, but Wisconsin's Frank Kaminsky exceeded that output with a school-record 43 points to lead the 12th-ranked Badgers to a 103-85 victory on Tuesday at the Kohl Center.

UND did not have an answer early on for the Badgers' sharp-shooting, 7-footer, who went 7-for-8 from the floor and drilled all four of his 3-point attempts in the opening 20 minutes. His efforts helped stake stake Wisconsin to a 55-45 advantage at the half.

Kaminsky had a new-career by halftime, tossing in 21 points despite sitting out the final four minutes in foul trouble.

Huff, who was playing in front of dozens of friends and family, would not let his squad get too far behind providing a long-distance display of his own. He also did not let coming off the bench play a factor as head coach Brian Jones started a completely different lineup from the one that defeated Minnesota-Morris in the season opener.

The Milwaukee native scored the final 11 points of the half for the visitors and his fourth 3-pointer of the stanza cut what was once a 15-point deficit down to six with just over a minute to play. He finished the half with 26 points, which were two more than he had in a road win at Eastern Washington in 2011-12 when he had his previous career-high of 34.



**HEAD COACH BRIAN JONES**

Head coach Brian Jones is entering his 10th season at the helm of the North Dakota men's basketball program. After a down year in 2014-15, Jones will look to move UND back to the top of the Big Sky where it was during its first two seasons in the league. UND finished third in 2012-13 and tied for second in 2013-14 before falling into a tie for 10th in 2014-15. In its two Big Sky postseason tournaments, UND made a run to the semifinals in 2013, then bettered that in 2014 by advancing to the title game against top-seed and tournament host Weber State. Jones has also guided his team to four CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournaments in the past five seasons. He also led UND to Great West Conference Tournament titles in 2011 and 2012.

FOUR DI TRANSFERS LINE ROSTER

The 2015-16 roster has four players on it that have been part of a different Division I men's basketball program. **Drick Bernstine** played his first collegiate season at Denver in 2013-14 and sat out last season while attending a junior college in Texas. **Dustin Hobaugh**, one of two seniors on the roster, spent his first collegiate season (2011-12) at Houston Baptist, which was a Great West foe of UND's at the time. **Carson Shanks** spent his first collegiate semester at Utah State before transferring to UND in January of 2014. UAlbany transfer **Wheeler Baker** is the only one among the quartet that has to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules. He was part of a Great Danes' team that advanced to the 2015 NCAA Tournament.

HUFF TAKEN IN SECOND ROUND OF NBDL DRAFT

After a successful first professional season overseas, former North Dakota guard **Troy Huff** will continue his career back in the United State. Huff was taken 27th overall and was a second-round pick of the Erie BayHawks during the 2015 National Basketball Development League Draft.

Huff played his first season for Mobyt Ferrara in the Italian League and finished his UND career as the program's third all-time leading scorer with 2,005 points.

The BayHawks are an affiliate of the National Basketball Association's Orlando Magic. The draft featured eight rounds and Huff was the first player taken from the Big Sky Conference. He was a two-time All-Big Sky performer during his two seasons in the league.

BADGERING THE LINEUP

After his team opened the 2013-14 season with a 110-69 victory over Minnesota-Morris, head coach Brian Jones had an open competition between the first and second units in practice leading up to the team's first road game at Wisconsin. The second unit would win the competition and earn the right to start at the Kohl Center. Junior **Quinton Hooker** was part of that second unit as he made his first career start against the Badgers, finishing with four points and four assists in 24 minutes. The only other player to start that game currently on the roster is senior **Shane Benton**. That was his last start as he played seven minutes and made his only field goal attempt. Current upperclassmen **Dustin Hobaugh** and **Thomas Blake** played the final minute of the game.

WHAT'S BACK?

Junior **Quinton Hooker** returns to the backcourt after leading the team in scoring in both overall games (12.8 ppg) and Big Sky games (14.4 ppg). He finished with 19 double-figure scoring games, including five straight 20-plus point scoring games to close out the season. Hooker capped that run with a career-high 28 points at Northern Colorado. Hooker's not only adept at scoring as he also led UND in assists (127/4.2 apg) and steals (40/1.5 spg), while finishing second in rebounding (128/4.3 rpg).

Sophomore **Carson Shanks** is back for his first full season with UND after becoming eligible at the semester break in 2014-15. He appeared in 19 games and earned 13 starts, which is a figure that led all centers on the squad. Shanks averaged 6.8 ppg and 3.8 rpg and led the team with 27 blocked shots.

Senior **Dustin Hobaugh** was the only other player besides Hooker to appear in all 30 games. He averaged close to 15.0 mpg in a reserve role and earned a pair of starts during the campaign. Hobaugh averaged 2.9 ppg and 2.4 rpg.

Hobaugh and guard **Shane Benton** are the only two seniors on the roster. Benton is the longest-tenured player on the team, arriving at UND prior to the 2011-12 season. He has appeared in 60 games during his UND career and started nine. Sophomore **Bryce Cashman** and junior **Thomas Blake** also return to provide depth for Jones. Cashman played in 23 games and made four starts (2.6 ppg/2.8 rpg).

Redshirt freshmen **Geno Crandall** and **James Richman** round out the team's eight returners. Crandall started all four games on the team's European Tour, averaging 11.3 ppg, 7.8 apg and 6.2 rpg. He scored in double figures in each of the last three games. Richman sat out last season due to injury.

NEWCOMERS SHOW PROMISE IN EUROPE

Six of the team's seven newcomers will get a chance to contribute right away in 2015-16. The only one who will not is Albany transfer **Wheeler Baker**, who has to sit out the season due to NCAA transfer rules. Baker played in 30 games a year ago for a Great Danes' team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. He averaged 5.6 ppg and 1.4 ppg in nearly 14 mpg.

Those six newcomers all participated in the four-game European Tour that saw UND win all four contests by double figures. Denver transfer **Drick Bernstine** started all four games at power forward and averaged 12.5 ppg (second on team) and 7.3 rpg (tops on team) overseas, while JUCO-transfer **Corey Baldwin** also started all four games at wing and averaged 9.5 ppg and a team-high 5.5 spg. He also shot a team-best 40 percent from 3-point range (6-for-15).

FRESH FACES GET FIRST TASTE OF COLLEGE OVERSEAS

True freshmen **Conner Avants**, **Josh Collins**, **Adam McDermott** and **Cortez Seales** each played in reserve roles in Europe and gained valuable experience. Seales averaged 5.8 ppg and shot 62.5 percent from the field, while Avants averaged 4.5 ppg and 3.2 rpg. McDermott scored 11 points in his first collegiate action in the win over Haukar. Collins averaged 1.0 ppg and 1.0 rpg in his reserve role.

All four true freshmen played for prep programs that made deep runs in their respective state tournaments as senior. Avants averaged a double-double (19.9 ppg/10.4 rpg) as a senior helping lead Deer Creek to the Oklahoma Class 5A State Semifinals. Collins was part of three-consecutive state title at DeLaSalle High School in Minneapolis, averaging 10.5 ppg as a senior and earning all-tournament honors. McDermott averaged 18.0 ppg and led Cedar Rapids Xavier to a third-place finish - its best in school history - at the Iowa Class 3A State Tournament. Seales finished his prep career as North Scott's all-time leading scorer with 1,392 points after leading team to its first Iowa Class 4A state title.

GAME 1

Rome, Italy (Aug. 13, 2015) -- The North Dakota men's basketball team opened its 2015 European Tour with a 71-53 victory over Haukar (Iceland) on Thursday. Junior Quinton Hooker paced UND with 25 points to lead all scorers and freshman Adam McDermott added 11 off the bench in his collegiate debut.

The squads were tied at 32-32 after Corey Baldwin hit a 3-pointer late in a first half that saw Haukar lead by as many as six before UND closed the gap. It remained a back-and-forth affair until late in the third quarter when UND closed the stanza on an 11-1 run.

Freshman Cortez Seales, who finished with seven points, buried a corner 3-pointer to spark the run and Hooker had the next six to put UND up 51-41 going into the fourth quarter.

Haukar would struggle from the field in the second half, scoring only 21 points in the closing two quarters, while UND would get 39 points after halftime.

Sophomore Drick Bernstine added nine points, including two putbacks and Seales finished with seven as they were two of seven new players making their UND debuts.

Junior Quinton Hooker led a quartet of players in double figures with 22 points and JUCO-transfer Corey Baldwin had his best game of the tour, scoring 19 points and getting seven steals on the defensive end.

Hooker is averaging 21.3 ppg in the three contests and has led the team in scoring each time out in Europe. Baldwin went 8-for-12 from the floor and had 11 points in a decisive third quarter that propelled UND to the victory.

Drick Bernstine added 17 points and a team-high nine rebounds and Geno Crandall had 12 points to go with a game-high nine assists as that duo rounded out of the team's double-digit scorers.

The first half was a back-and-forth affair as both teams put together big runs. UND had the first one, surging ahead with a 14-2 run that gave them an 18-7 lead midway through the first quarter. Atletas would start trimming the deficit late in the first quarter and started the second on an 8-2 run that pulled them within a point.

A 10-2 run by the Lithuanians to close half provided them with a 45-38 edge at the break. Baldwin would get his team right back in the game early in the third quarter with his defense. The Bridgeport, Conn., native would get two steals that led to a pair of one-handed dunks and UND would go onto shoot 13-for-22 from the field in the stanza.

UND's lead would grow to double figures early in the fourth quarter and that is where it would remain until the final horn sounded. The 91 points were the most by the team on the tour so far.

That trio included Geno Crandall, who scored 13 points to go with seven rebounds and a team-high six assists, forward Drick Bernstine, who was 6-for-6 from the field and had a team-high nine rebounds to go with his 13 points and JUCO-transfer Corey Baldwin, who had 12 points and six rebounds.

UND never trailed in the contest after racing out to a 14-3 lead. Freshman Cortez Seales scored all of his six points in the opening quarter to help pace the team early.

The Italy squad would close to within 20-15 with an early second-quarter run, but UND would answer with an 11-0 spurt to put the game out of the reach. Hooker had seven-straight during that stretch and UND would build a 37-21 lead at the break.

It was more of the same in the third quarter as Italy continued to struggle to score and Hooker and company pushed the lead to as many 31 points at 61-30 with just under three minutes to play in the third quarter.

Bernstine never missed from the field, knocking down three baskets in each half and Hooker had 11 of his 18 after halftime. Crandall led the defensive effort, collecting five of the team's 15 steals in the contest.

Freshman Geno Crandall also had a big night, finishing with the team's first double-double of the tour as he scored 16 points and dished out 11 assists.

Golfe de Juan used a 23-5 run to open the fourth quarter and erased what was a 65-47 deficit. That spurt tied the game at 70-70 with 2:40 left to play, but Hooker and company had an answer, closing the game on a 15-5 surge.

Sophomore Carson Shanks made a hook shot in the lane to spark that closing run by the visitors and Hooker had nine of those points. He led UND in scoring in all four contests and finished the tour averaging 22.3 ppg.

UND led 60-45 at the half and pushed that to 20-plus midway through the third quarter before going cold from the field and getting careless with the basketball. After just turning the ball over 10 times in the first three quarters, the team had eight miscues in the final stanza, which allowed Golfe de Juan to get back in the game.

Sophomore Drick Bernstine had six of his 10 points in the closing stanza as he rounded out a trio of UND scorers in double figures.

Hooker went 10-for-18 from the field to help UND finish 31-for-54 from the floor. UND was once again active on the defensive end, coming up with 18 steals. Corey Baldwin led the team for the second straight game as he had seven steals once again.

UND will return home after picking off all four of its foreign opponents and take a few weeks off before resuming preparations with individual workouts for the 2015-16 season, which begins with a home contest against Minnesota Morris on Nov. 13.

NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a *Grand Forks Herald* account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's *A Century of UND Sports*, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the *Dakota Student*, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo was unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams will operate without an official nickname, while the university continues the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

UND President Dr. Robert Kelley announced the two finalists for the final runoff vote after the latest round of voting by a select group of UND stakeholders. The results from the first stakeholder vote resulted in a 3-way runoff that was held Oct. 19-23 and this latest runoff eliminated "Nodaks" from the list of potential nicknames.

The two remaining options that will be voted on from Nov. 12-16 are

Fighting Hawks (12,098 votes; 45.69 %)
Roughriders (7,400 votes; 27.95 %)

Nodaks (6,981 votes; 26.36 percent) was eliminated on Nov. 8 after the results of the first runoff vote.

North Stars (3,231 votes; 14.48 %) and Sundogs (2,858 votes; 12.81 %) were eliminated after the first stakeholder vote.

UND BY THE NUMBERS

UND's 80-69 victory over Idaho State on Jan. 31 marked the 100th victory for the team at the Betty Englestad Sioux Center. The team owns a 100-39 record in 11 seasons in that building.

UND ADDS TWO DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Head coach Brian Jones announced the addition of a pair of prep standouts to his men's basketball program on Nov. 12 after Billy Brown, a 6-foot-3 point guard from Spirit Lake, Iowa, and Kienan Walter, a 6-foot-8 forward from Vancouver, Wash., both signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period.

Brown averaged 13.8 ppg, 4.8 apg and 4.5 rpg for a Spirit Lake team that set a school-record with 21 wins during his junior season. Brown set a school record for assists last season and earned First Team All-Lakes Conference honors for his efforts as a junior. As a sophomore, he was an honorable mention All-Lakes Conference performer after averaging 13.4 ppg and shooting 36.2 percent from 3-point range.

Brown played his AAU Basketball for Martin Brothers, who won the 2015 AAU National Championship and Iowa State Championship. Brown was named the MVP at the 2015 King of the Courts Tournament. Brown also plays defensive back and wide receiver for the Spirit Lake football team that is ranked No. 2 in the state and will be playing in the Class 3A semifinals on Friday. As a junior, he earned Class 3A First Team All-State honors by both the Des Moines Register and Iowa Football Coaches Association.

Walter collected Associated Press All-State honors after a junior season that also saw him earn First Team All-Conference, First Team All-County, First Team All-Region and League MVP honors. The 6-foot-8 forward averaged a Trico League best 23.6 ppg, which was tops among Class 1A scorers in the state of Washington and led Kings Way Christian to the its first state tournament berth in school history at that level.

As a sophomore, Walter racked up First Team All-Conference and Second Team All-Region accolades and was voted Team MVP. Walter plays his AAU basketball for the Oregon Stars.





PRESEASON POLLS

OGDEN, Utah – The North Dakota men's basketball team was picked to tie for eighth in the Big Sky Coaches' preseason poll and 10th in the Big Sky Media preseason poll that were released by league officials on Thursday. The coaches selected Weber State to edge Montana in their poll as both teams received six first-place votes, while the media reversed those two teams in its poll, picking the Grizzlies as a heavy favorite.

Reigning tournament champion Eastern Washington was picked to finish third in both polls.

For the second-straight season, 10th-year head coach Brian Jones will have to replace five of his team's top six scorers from a team that finished 8-22 overall and 4-14 in Big Sky play. However, this 2015-16 edition will have some valuable experience to feed off of as it begins regular-season play on Nov. 13 vs. Minnesota Morris.

"I'm not surprised by the preseason polls," Jones said. "We earned that with how we finished last season and the fact that we have one of the youngest teams in the conference this year. Our job is to focus on the things that breed success on and off the floor. I think we got off to a good start with that this summer and during our trip to Europe."

"If we can continue to do those things our actual finish will be better than these preseason rankings. This league will provide great basketball again this season with each program possessing quality depth.
