BADGERS HOST THE BULLDOGS

- The Badgers conclude their two-game homestand with Drake at 7 p.m. on Wednesday before hitting the road for a five-game stretch of away games.
- The Badgers' best season opening was a 10-0 start in 2008-09 and the best home opening slate was in 1983-84 when the Badgers started off with an 11-0 record at home.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON AT THE KOHL

- In a dominating Saturday afternoon game at the Kohl Center, the Wisconsin women's basketball team marched past Louisiana Tech, 79-65, to begin the regular season. The Badgers (1-0) were paced by strong offensive efforts, as four players scored in double-digits.
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** lead the Badgers with 16 points on the night, as the point guard tallied went 5-of-10 from the field and sank all six of her free throw attempts. She also shared game-high honors with four assists.
- Close behind Whyte was senior **Nicole Bauman**, who collected 14 points for the Badgers, including 10 points in the third period.
- Returning to the floor after sitting out last season due to injury, senior **Michala Johnson** made her presence known with 13 points and five rebounds, while only playing 20 minutes of the game.
- Junior **Avyanna Young** was the fourth Badger to score in double-digits tonight, as the forward tallied 12 points and eight rebounds.
- The Badgers were not only hot on offense, but defensively too. **Tessa Cichy** paved the way with 16 rebounds, as the senior set a new career high, surpassing her old mark of 10 boards.



In her big return after taking a medical redshirt, senior Michala Johnson put up 13 points in just 20 minutes played on Sunday against Louisiana Tech in the Kohl Center.

TEAM EFFORT

- Wisconsin shot 50.8 percent (31-61) from the field and 52.9 percent (18-34) in the second half. UW held Louisiana Tech to shooting 30.1 percent (22-73) from the field in the game.
- Wisconsin outscored Louisiana Tech in all but the first quarter. UW outscored LA Tech 27-15 in the third period to come back from being behind 36-35 at the half.
- The Badgers had four players in double figure points. Eight of the nine players who saw action put points on the board.
- The Badgers outrebounded the Lady Techsters 43-42. Every Badger who saw action in the game brought down at least one board.
- Wisconsin shot 73.7 (14-19) percent from the free-throw line.

CAREER MARKS

- Senior G **Tessa Cichy** pulled down 16 rebounds and set a new career high. Her previous mark of 10 was set on Jan. 6, 2015 against Penn State.
- Senior **Nicole Bauman** tied her career high with three blocks. She also tied her career high with five made free throws on five attempts (100 percent).
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** led all players with 16 points and set a new career high after shooting a perfect 100 percent (6-6) from the free-throw line.
- Junior **Avyanna Young** in her first start for the Badgers put up 12 points and brought down eight rebounds.

BAUMAN BLASTS PAST 800

- Senior **Nicole Bauman** notched her 800th career point after putting up 14 on Saturday against Louisiana Tech.
- Bauman was the team's leading scorer in 2014-15, averaging 15.3 points per game and ranking 11th in the Big Ten.

CICHY FOR 400

- Senior **Tessa Cichy** was close to a double-double with nine points and 16 rebounds on Saturday against Drake but did pass the 400-point mark in her career and now has a total of 406 points in her career.
- She totaled just 118 points in her freshman and sophomore campaigns and more than doubled that total with 279 points as a junior.

EXHIBITION EXCELLENCE

- The Wisconsin women's basketball team rolled past the Minnesota State Mavericks on Nov. 8 in an 84-48 home-opening exhibition game at the Kohl Center. Senior **Tessa Cichy** led all players with 22 points, while fellow senior **Dakota Whyte** was close behind with 20.
- Junior **Avyanna Young** made her Badger debut after sitting out last season due to transfer rules by recording a double-double

with 15 points and 15 rebounds. Senior **Nicole Bauman** also scored in double-digits for the Badgers, as she tallied 11 points in the game. Freshman **Marsha Howard** had an impressive freshman debut, as she tallied seven points and 11 rebounds.

- The Wisconsin women's basketball team downed UW-Eau Claire, 69-49, on Nov. 11 in the final exhibition game of the season.
- **Nicole Bauman** had a big game offensively as she started off the night firing. She went 5-for-5 in the first half alone, and picked up 15 points and four rebounds on the night.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- The 2015-16 Badgers return six letterwinners and four starters, including its top-three scorers from last season. UW returns 72.2 percent of its scoring and 53.9 percent of its rebounding for the upcoming season.
- Michala Johnson, a 2014 first-team All-Big Ten pick, was granted a sixth year by the NCAA and will return in 2015-16. The 6-3 forward played in six games last season before tearing her ACL. She was the Badgers leading scorer (16.6 ppg) and rebounder (7.3 rpg) in 2013-14.
- Wisconsin returns three of the Big Ten's most improved scorers. Senior Nicole Bauman was the league's most improved scorer in 2014-15, upping her scoring average by 9.2 points per game. Seniors Tessa Cichy and Dakota Whyte also ranked among the top-10 most improved scorers. Cichy ranked fourth at plus 7.8 while Whyte ranked 10th at plus 4.9 points per game.
- Junior Nicole Bauman earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors, leading the team and ranking 11th in the conference with 15.1 points per game. She is the sixth player to earn All-Big Ten honors under Coach Kelsey.
- The Badgers drew a season-high attendance of 11,428 vs. Iowa on Feb. 8, which was the 16th best crowd all-time at UW. It was also the largest since drawing 11,369 vs. Iowa on Feb. 28, 2010. The attendance helped Wisconsin average 4,126 fans per game, which ranked seventh in the Big Ten.

A LOOK BACK AT 2014-15

- Wisconsin ended the season 9-20 overall, 5-13 in the Big Ten. The Badgers five Big Ten wins were the most since 2011-12, head coach Bobbie Kelsey's first season. UW won three Big Ten road games last season, the most since winning four road games in 2010-11.
- Wisconsin ended the Big Ten season as the No. 1 3-point shooting team in the conference at 39.2 percent (130-of-332). Junior Nicole Bauman led the league individually at 50.8 percent (61-of-120) while senior Jacki Gulczynski was second at 44.9 percent (40-of-89).
- The Badgers went down in program history as one of the most proficient 3-point

teams. In Big Ten-only play, Wisconsin set school records for most triples (130), triples per game (7.22) and percentage (.392). In all games, UW set a school record for percentage at .374.

- The Badgers improved in nearly every statistical category compared to the 2013-14 season. The largest improvement was in 3-point percentage where UW improved by 0.6 percentage points. Wisconsin trailed in only points per game and free throw percentage.
- UW had one of the toughest schedules in the nation, ranking 30th in strength of schedule according to RealTimeRPI.com. Wisconsin also ranked 40th for schedule strength by RPI Ratings.com.
- In 14 losses, the Badgers led or trailed by single digits with under nine minutes to play.
- The Badgers shot 42.5 percent (708 of 1666) from the field, their best shooting percentage in five years, since hitting 43.2 percent in 2009-10. Wisconsin shot 40 percent or better from the field in 22 games, including the last 14 games of the year. UW hit 45 percent or better in nine games and 50 percent or better in three games.
- Seven Badgers earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, tying the most in a single season for UW. Honorees were Nicole Bauman, AnnMarie Brown, Tessa Cichy, Jacki Gulczynski, Malayna Johnson, Michala Johnson and Carly Truesdale.

STARTERS

- Senior **Nicole Bauman** led the Big Ten overall and ranked second nationally with a 3-point percentage of .488. The 5-10 guard was 80-of-164 from beyond the arc this season. Bauman set the UW Big Ten-only season mark with 61 made 3-pointers while her .508 (61-of-120) shooting percentage from deep was also a record.
- Senior **Dakota Whyte** ranked second on the squad with 11.1 points per game, scoring in double figures in 19 games. She averaged 11.5 points per game in conference contests. Whyte had a team-high 110 assists (3.79/game) while Bauman added 103 assists (3.81/game), marking the first time since 2007-08 that two players recorded 100-or-more assists in the same season.
- Senior **Tessa Cichy** was one of UW's most improved players. The 5-10 guard picked up her play in Big Ten action, scoring in double figures in 13 of 18 games, including a career-high 20 points against Iowa on Feb. 1. Cichy also ranked second on the squad with 5.8 rebounds per game in conference play, recording her first career double-double with 12 points and a career-high 10 rebounds against Penn State on Jan. 6. On the year, Cichy averaged season bests of 9.6 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game.
- Sixth-year **Michala Johnson** returns after suffering a torn ACL last season. The 6-3 forward played and started six games last season before going out nine minutes into the game at Miami on Dec. 4. The 2014 first-team All-Big Ten selection averaged 28

minutes per game and 12.8 point per games last season while scoring in double figures in five games.

GUARDS

- Coach Kelsey's first top-100 recruit, **Cayla McMorris**, played in all 29 games as a freshman, averaging 16.7 minutes per game and 4.8 points per game. The 6-0 guard scored in double figures in five games. She had a career-high 17 points on two occasions against Marquette (Dec. 6) and Oral Roberts (Dec. 20).
- **Roichelle Marble** tore her Achilles tendon the summer before her freshman campaign and redshirted last season. The three-time all-state pick by the *Des Moines Register* was also a two-time Central Iowa Metro League first-team selection in high school.

FORWARDS/CENTERS

- Sophomore **Malayna Johnson** averaged season bests of 4.0 points and 3.1 rebounds per game. She shot a season best of 45.5 percent (45-of-99) from the field and 70.3 (26-of-37) percent from the line. She had 30 blocks last season, tripling her freshman-year total of 10, and played a season-high 13.8 minutes per game.
- Redshirt junior **Rosie Gambino** was set to be eligible to play second semester of this season but broke her foot in December and had surgery in early January. Led the Kishwaukee Kougars with 3.4 blocks per game in 2012-13.
- Junior **Avyanna Young** missed the entire 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules. The 6-1 forward transferred from Milwaukee after ranking 16th in the Horizon League with 13.3 points per game in 2013-14.
- Redshirt freshman **Michaela Crall** was recovering from a torn ACL suffered in April of 2014 during the 2014-15 season after taking a redshirt season as a freshman due to a foot injury. She averaged 9.4 points, 7.7 rebounds and 2.5 blocks per game as a senior for Olathe Northwest high school.
- One of the two newest Badgers, **Elizabeth Toye** comes to UW after setting the Lindblom Academy school record for career points with 1,142 points in three years.
- A three-star recruit by ESPN/Scouts, **Marsha Howard** starts her career as a Badger after being ranked as the No. 10 player in the state of Illinois for the class of 2015 by Midwest Recruiting Report. The 5-10 forward was a four-time all-conference honoree and two-time all-state honoree.

OH CANADA

- Senior **Dakota Whyte** helped make history as she led the Canada Development Women's National Basketball Team to its best finish at the World University Games and Canada's first medal since 1991. Team Canada was previously on the podium winning bronze in 1979 and 1991.
- Canada walked away with a silver medal in the 2015 International University Sports Federation (FISU) games in Gwangju, Korea, after falling to the United States, 82-63, in the championship game.
- Whyte led Canada with a powerful 20 points, shooting 50 percent (7-of-14) from field goal range.

ROCHEL IN ROMANIA

- Former Badger women's basketball player Cassie Rochel has signed a contract to play professionally with the Clubul Sportiv Phoenix Galati in Galati, Romania.

STAFF SNAPSHOT

- Several new faces have joined the Wisconsin staff this season including former Badger Anya Covington and former Syracuse assistant coach Sasha Palmer.
- In Bobbie Kelsey's first season at Wisconsin, Covington was a 2012 consensus honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, ranking second on the squad with 10.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game. A three-time team captain, the 6-2 forward was a two-time Big Ten Sportsmanship award winner. She played in 123 games in the Cardinal and White, averaging 5.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game while shooting 47.9 percent from the field.
- Following her graduation, Covington continued her playing career in the professional ranks overseas on a USA team against Ukraine and Moldova while ministering to those areas through Athletes in Action. She averaged 13.6 points, 10.3 rebounds and

1.8 blocks per game with the DBBL Rhein Main basketball team before suffering a season-ending injury.

- After her playing career was done, Covington served as a graduate assistant for former UW assistant coach Kathi Bennett at Northern Illinois during the 2013-14 season. She joined the staff at Evansville, under former UW assistant coach Otis Epps, in 2014-15, aiding the Purple Aces to a 13-19 record.
- Palmer comes to Wisconsin after serving as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the past two seasons at Syracuse University. The Orange were 45-20 in her two seasons, advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament both years. Syracuse also finished fifth both years in the Atlantic Coast Conference, going 21-11 in conference play.
- Palmer aided sophomore Briana Day to a Syracuse season record 322 rebounds in 2014-15. The 6-4 center averaged 10.4 rebounds per contest, which ranked 26th nationally. She also ranked 19th nationally with 2.68 blocks per game and 38th nationally in double-doubles per game.

- Drake (1-0) led by 10 points with 2:42 to go after junior Caitlin Ingle made a layup, but had to fight off a late charge from Iowa State to earn its first victory over the in-state rival since 2009.
- Junior Lizzy Wendell paced Drake with 16 points after being limited to just two points at halftime. Freshman Sara Rhine had 15 points and four rebounds in her first career game as a Bulldog.
- Sophomore Maddy Dean recorded a double-double with 10 points and 11 boards for her ninth career double-double.

DRAKE PICKED SECOND IN MVC

- Drake was picked second in the MVC annual pre-season poll behind Missouri State. Wendell was tabbed the preseason player of the year along with being named to the preseason first team.

DES MOINES, Iowa — A lack of rebounding and 18 turnovers cost the Wisconsin women's basketball team its first road game of the season. The Badgers fell at Drake, 89-77, at the Knapp Center on Sunday afternoon.

Despite four players scoring in double figures, Wisconsin (1-2) was outrebounded by the Bulldogs, 36-24. Drake also had 14 steals as the Badgers turned over the ball 18 times.

Senior Michala Johnson paved the way for UW with 17 points. Freshman Cayla McMorris put up a career high 16 points while senior Jacki Gulczynski added in 15 and junior Dakota Whyte chipped in 10 points.

The Badgers shot a season-high 55.7 percent (34-of-61) from the field but shot just 25 percent (4-of-16) from behind the 3-point line. Wisconsin was also just 5-of-7 (71.4 percent) from the free throw line while Drake (1-3) went to the line 12 times, making 10 for 83.3 percent.

The Bulldogs shot 53 percent (35-of-66) from the field, including 47.4 percent (9-of-19) from 3-point range. Drake was led by Lizzy Wendell with 33 points while three other players scored in double figures.

The Badgers didn't get off to a hot start, scoring only five points in the first five minutes, all coming from Johnson.

A jumper by Wendell pushed the Bulldogs lead back up to three (19-16) at the 10:21 mark. Another Wendell 3-pointer quickly dashed that lead until McMorris drove through the middle and was fouled to give Wisconsin its second tie of the half (30-30) with just under five minutes remaining.

A basket from sophomore Malayna Johnson at 4:27 gave the Badgers their only lead of the game, 32-20.

Johnson added a career-high four blocks along with grabbing seven rebounds. Gulczynski also notched a block and pulled down five boards. The Badgers ended with only six steals.

FIFTH SEASON

In her four seasons at Wisconsin, Bobbie Kelsey has been building a program the right way. By playing exciting basketball against some of the best teams in the nation, the Badgers are beginning to attract attention across the country.

Kelsey's Badgers have played some of the toughest schedules in the nation. Wisconsin played 14 teams that competed in post-season tournaments in 2013-14, finishing with the 28th toughest schedule. UW had the 15th toughest schedule in 2012-13, playing 18 games against post-season teams. Kelsey's team upset No. 8 Penn State at home in 2013 and also won a game in the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2010.

The Badgers have battled some of the nation's best teams, losing 11 games by single digits in 2012-13 and dropping 10 games in 2013-14 by 10-or-fewer points.

UW records have become a matter of fact under Kelsey as the Badgers set six school records in 2011-12, 13 UW single-game or season marks in 2012-13, including the school record for free throw percentage two straight seasons. Wisconsin also broke five single-game or season records in 2013-14.

Individual awards have also come to the Badgers under Kelsey. Michala Johnson earned first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2014, becoming the first UW player named to that team since 2008. Taylor Wurtz and Anya Covington earned All-Big Ten honors in 2012 while Morgan Paige and Jacki Gulczynski were honored in 2013. Nicole Bauman earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors in 2015.

Academic honors have also improved under Kelsey. After only one Academic All-Big Ten honoree in her first season, the Badgers had six honorees in 2013-14, including three-time honoree Morgan Paige. UW tied a school record with seven honorees in 2014-15.

Kelsey came to Wisconsin after four seasons as an assistant at top-ranked Stanford. The Cardinal compiled a 137-14 (.907) record, including a 69-3 (.958) mark in Pac-10 conference play, and advanced to the Final Four each year during her time there. Stanford's streak of four-straight Final Fours is tied for the second-longest streak in NCAA history. Prior to Kelsey's arrival, Stanford had not advanced to the Final Four since 1997.

In addition to coaching at Stanford under Hall of Fame head coach Tara VanDerveer for the last four seasons, Kelsey was a four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1992-96. She helped the Cardinal to three Final Four appearances in five years as a player, including the 1992 NCAA championship. Kelsey was a team co-captain in 1995 and 1996, voted the team's Most Inspirational Player in 1992 and 1996, and named the team's most improved player in 1993.

Kelsey graduated from Stanford in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in communications. She earned her master's degree from Duquesne University from the School of Leadership and Professional Advancement in Sports Leadership.
