UP NEXT: UW HEADS TO NEW YORK CITY

Nov. 27, 2014 (in Paradise Island, Bahamas)

► Wisconsin will travel to New York City to take on Georgetown on Friday and either Duke or VCU on Sunday at Madison Square Garden as part of the 2K Classic benefitting the Wounded Warrior Project.

► The Badgers, who are 27-2 in non-con play over the last 3 seasons, have won each of the last two November tournaments they have participated in, claiming the 2013 Cancun Challenge and the 2014 Battle 4 Atlantis.

NOTES TO KNOW

1 ALL-BIG TEN TANDEM: UW returns just 38% of its minutes played from last season, but welcomes back a pair of Wooden Award candidates in juniors Nigel Hayes and Bronson Koenig. Hayes was also 9th in the AP Preseason All-American voting. The Badger duo are on the watch lists for

the Julius Erving Award (Hayes) and Bob Cousy Award (Koenig), given to the nation's top small forward and point guard, respectively. The tandem is combining for 33.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg and 8.3 apg this season.

- **2** YOUNG BLOOD: No team in the nation has more freshmen than Wisconsin (8) and a quartet of the Badgers' newcomers are having an immediate impact. Ethan Happ, Alex Illikainen, Khalil Iverson and Charlie Thomas are combining to average 22.3 points and 14.7 rebounds per game through 3 contests.
- **3** MADE 'EM BELIEVE IN 2015: Spirited by a "Make 'Em Believe" rally cry, Wisconsin put together arguably the greatest season in school history a year ago. UW set a school single-season record with 36 wins en route to Big Ten regular season and tournament titles and the school's first national championship game appearance since 1941.
- **4 BO KNOWS:** A 2015 Naismith Hall of Fame finalist, Bo Ryan enters the season ranked 9th in conference history with 172 career Big Ten wins and owns the highest Big Ten winning percentage in conference history. With the win over UND, Ryan improved his career record to 742-229 (.764), surpassing John Cheney (Temple) and David Hixon (Amherst) for 27th on the NCAA's all-time wins list. Ryan is 5 wins short of passing the legendary Phog Allen (746).
- **5 AT HOME ON THE ROAD:** Wisconsin is known for its incredible home record, but has actually been just as good away from home lately. UW is 37-8 (.822) away from home over the last two seasons (21-3 last season), owning the most road/neutral wins and the best win percentage away from home among major conference teams.

NOTES FROM UW'S LAST GAME

UW 78, UND 64 - 11/17/15 - Kohl Center, Madison

- ► Wisconsin wrapped up a stretch of 3 games in 5 days with a 78-64 win over North Dakota Tuesday at the Kohl Center. The Badgers jumped out to a 9-2 advantage and the lead never got closer than 5.
- ► All 5 Badgers starters finished in double figures led by 17 points each from **Ethan Happ** and **Bronson Koenig**. Happ posted career highs in points and rebounds (7). **Vitto Brown** chipped in 12 points, while **Nigel Hayes** added 11 points, 6 rebounds and a career-best 7 assists. **Zak Showalter** also notched a career-high output with 10 points.
- ► UW out-rebounded UND 40-31, including a 16-5 edge on the offensive glass that led to an 18-8 advantage in second-chance points.

NON-CON NO-CONTEST

- ► UW has won 30 of its last 32 regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012.
- ► The Badgers' season-opening loss to Western Illinois snapped a streak of 51 consecutive regular-season, non-con wins against unranked teams. Prior to that, the last time UW lost to a team that was not ranked in the AP poll was a 58-51 defeat to Notre Dame at the 2010 Old Spice Classic (11/28/10).
- ► Under Bo Ryan (since 2001-02), UW is 145-32 (.819) in non-conference games, including a mark of 106-9 (.922) at the Kohl Center.
- ► Since 2003-04, Wisconsin is 88-3 (.967) vs. unranked non-con opponents, the 5th-highest win percentage in the nation over that span.


ALL-TIME VS. GEORGETOWN

Friday's game will mark the fourth-ever meeting between Wisconsin and Georgetown with the Badgers owning a 2-1 advantage in the series.

▶ UW pulled out a 68-65 win over the Hoyas last year in the semifinals of the Battle 4 Atlantis Tournament. Prior to that, the teams hadn't met since 1982. UW and GU will also both be participants in the 2016 Maui Invitational.

- ▶ Wisconsin erased a 9-point deficit with 11:09 remaining to pull out a 68-65 win over previously unbeaten Georgetown in the 2014 Battle 4 Atlantis semifinals. Sam Dekker scored a team-high 17 points while the sophomore duo of Nigel Hayes (15 points, 7 rebounds) and Bronson Koenig (14 points, 4 assists) combined for 29 points.
- ► The Badgers won despite a season-high 14 turnovers and shooting a season-low 48.8% from the field. Wisconsin did go 20-for-27 (74.1%) from the field throw line, while limiting the Hoyas to just 9-for-13 at the stripe.
- ► Frank Kaminsky was held to 6 points (1-8 FGs), his only game in single digits all season.



► The Badgers last played in Madison Square Garden as part of the 1947 NCAA Tournament. UW lost to the City College of New York, 70-56, before defeating Navy, 50-49, in the East Regional third-place game.

Starters Returning/Lost: 2/3 Letterwinners Returning/Lost: 9/5

▶ Wisconsin looks to replace 5 of the top 7 scorers from a year ago, but does return a pair of starters in juniors Nigel Hayes and Bronson Koenig. Overall, the Badgers bring back just 38.1% of their minutes played from last season, the lowest total since Bo Ryan inherited a 2001-02 team that returned 30.0% of its minutes.

UW returns 34.3% of its scoring and 31.5% of its rebounding from 2014-15, both are the fewest of any team in the Big Ten.

- ▶ The 2015-16 season will mark the first year under Bo Ryan in which the Badgers do not have a scholarship senior. The only senior on the roster is walk-on G Jordan Smith. Wisconsin has had at least one senior starter in each of Ryan's first 14 seasons in Madison. In fact, the Badgers have started at least two seniors in 10 of those 14 seasons.
- ► UW returns 4 players from last season's 9-man rotation.

- ▶ Defending Big Ten regular season and tournament champions, the Badgers enter the 2015-16 season seeking back-to-back conference titles for the first time since 2002-03. Wisconsin will also take aim at a third-consecutive Final Four appearance, something only 11 schools have done in the history of the NCAA tournament. The most recent team to turn the three-peat was UCLA (2006-08).
- ▶ Wisconsin will play a total of 13 games vs. teams in the 2015 NCAA Tournament field, with 8 of those coming away from home. During the non-conference schedule, the Badgers will travel to Oklahoma and Syracuse, host Marquette and Temple, as well as taking on Georgetown and either Duke or VCU at the 2K Classic in NYC.

BO KNOWS

- ► The winningest coach in Wisconsin history (359-126, .740), Ryan currently ranks 9th in conference history with 172 career Big Ten wins. With a career record of 172-68 (.717), Ryan owns the highest Big Ten winning percentage in conference history.
- ► In his 32nd season as a head coach, Bo Ryan is 27th on the NCAA's all-time wins list with a record of 742-229 (.764). Ryan is just 5 wins shy of passing the legendary Phog Allen (Kansas) for 26th in NCAA annals. Among active Div. I coaches, Ryan's 742 wins rank 5th.
- ► Ryan's career win percentage of .764 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.788) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.766) among active coaches with 600 wins. Among all-time coaches with 600 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 10th.
- ► The 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year and 1 of 4 finalists for the Naismith National Coach of the Year, Bo Ryan was named one of 12 finalists for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2015.

EARLY TRENDS

Through 3 games, a few trends have begun to emerge for Wisconsin.

- ► UW has out-rebounded each of its first 3 opponents and owns a +9.4 average margin.
- ► UW has grabbed 23 more offensive boards than its opponents (47-24) and is averaging 15.7 off. rpg.
- ► UW is averaging just 6.7 turnovers per game, which ranks 4th in the NCAA.
- ► UW is averaging 25.7 FTAs per game and 7.0 more FTAs per game than its opponents.

HAYES FOR DAYS

► After earning 2014 Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year, **Nigel Hayes** expanded his game in 2015 and was rewarded with third-team All-Big Ten honors.

Now Hayes enters his junior season as a preseason All-American and the focal point of Wisconsin's offense.

- ► Through 3 games, Hayes is averaging 14.0 ppg, 4.3 rpg and a team-high 5.0 apg. He has dished 1 assists without a turnover. He leads the Badgers in FTs (13) and FTAs (19).
- ► Last season, Hayes finished 3rd on the team in points (12.4) and ranked 13th in the Big Ten with 6.2 rebounds per game. He led UW in steals (34) and was 3rd in blocks (16).

Hayes ranked 9th in the Big Ten shooting 49.7% from the field and shot 39.6% from 3-point range, which ranked 13th in the Big Ten.

► The junior made great strides in 3 areas in particular: rebounding, 3FG% and FT%.

► Hayes has scored in double figures 45 times in his career, including 30 of 40 games last season. Hayes posted a career-high 25 points vs. Green Bay a year ago and owns 4 career double-doubles.

► The Toledo, Ohio, native continued his penchant for getting to the free throw line. As a freshman, Hayes was 2nd on the team with 164 FTAs. Last season, he was again 2nd on UW in both FTAs and made FTs, going 125-for-168 (.744).

KOENIG ON POINT

When Traveon Jackson went down with a foot injury at Rutgers on Jan. 11, 2015, **Bronson Koenig** took over the starting point guard role for the Badgers and flourished in the new role.

Now a junior, the preseason All-Big Ten pick is the unquestioned lead guard at Wisconsin.

- ► Koenig leads the Badgers averaging 19.0 ppg while shooting 52.4% from the field and 45.0% (9-20) from 3-point range. Koenig is also tallying 4.7 rpg, 3.3 apg and a 2.5 assist-to-turnover ratio (10 ast, 4 TOs).
- ► Last season, Koenig ranked 4th on the Badgers averaging 8.7 points per game and 2nd on the team with 2.5 assists per game.

Koenig connected on 40.5% of his 3-point attempts (62-153), good for 12th in the Big Ten.

► In 2014-15, Koenig had 98 assists to just 33 turnovers. His 2.97 assist-to-turnover ratio was tops among Big Ten players with at least 75 assists.

"VELVET" VITTO BROWN

During his first 2 years on campus, junior forward **Vitto Brown** was best-known for his singing prowess. Now in the Badgers' starting lineup, Brown is proving his game might be as strong as his voice.

► Brown has started each of the first 3 games this season and is 3rd on the Badgers in scoring at 13.0 ppg and leads the team with 5.7 rpg. He tallied a career-high 16 points vs. Siena and is a perfect 10-for-10 from the FT line on the year.

Brown has scored in double figures in all 3 games this season. He had a total of one double-digit scoring game entering the year.

► A talented crooner who has been performing with his family's singing group, "Shades of Brown," since a young age, Brown has performed the national anthem before several UW games, including at the Final Four in Indianapolis last season.

THE HAPP-ENING

Redshirt freshman **Ethan Happ** took the first 2 games of his career to get his feet wet, but jumped into the deep end in game 3 vs. North Dakota.

- ► Happ tallied career highs with 17 points and 7 rebounds in 25 minutes of action. He went 7-for-11 from the field, adding 2 assists and a block.
- ► On the season, Happ ranks 4th on the Badgers averaging 9.7 ppg and is tied for the team lead with 5.7 rpg. The Milan (pronounced MY-lin), III. native also leads UW shooting 60.0% from the field (min. 10 FGAs).
- ► Happ, who has started every game this season, became just the 3rd freshman to start the season opener under Bo Ryan, joining Devin Harris (2001) and George Marshall (2012).

YOUTH BEING SERVED

The 2015-16 Badgers are the youngest in Bo Ryan's 15 seasons. No school in the country has more freshmen on its roster than Wisconsin (8). Cornell and UTEP are the only other schools with 8 freshmen.

► In addition to Ethan Happ, true freshmen Khalil Iverson, Charlie Thomas and Alex Illikainen have each seen extensive action off the Badgers' bench.

Iverson is playing 23.0 minutes per game off the bench and producing 4.7 ppg and 4.0 rpg while leading the Badgers with 4 blocks and 3 steals.

Thomas is seeing an average of 13.3 mpg and tallying 4.3 ppg and 4.3 rpg, with a team-high 8 offensive rebounds.

Illikainen did not appear in the opener, but has played 9.0 mpg since then and is contributing 5.5 ppg and 1.0 rpg.

► UW's other active scholarship freshmen **Brevin Pritzl** suffered a broken foot in August and has been easing back into the rotation. He has appeared in just one game (4 min. vs. Siena).

Andy Van Vliet is forced to sit out this season after the NCAA ruled him ineligible for not enrolling in college within a year of high school graduation.

TAKING THE SHOW ON THE ROAD

UW is renowned for its incredible home success, but it has been just as good on the road lately.

- ▶ Wisconsin is 37-8 (.822) away from home over the last two seasons, including a mark of 21-2 last year (10-2 on the road and 11-1 in neutral).
- ► UW won 10 true road games last season, equaling the school single-season record set in 2007-08.
- ► Kentucky (10-0) and Virginia (11-1) were the only major conference teams with a better road win percentage than Wisconsin (10-2) last season.
- ► Among major conference teams, UW owns the most wins and the best win percentage away from home over the last 3 seasons.

2014-15 LOOK BACK

Record: 36-4 | **Big Ten:** 16-2 (1st)

► Playing in its 17th-consecutive NCAA tournament after earning the first No. 1 seed in school history, Wisconsin returned to the Final Four for the 2nd-straight season and the 4th time in school history. UW is just the 9th Big Ten team in history to reach back-to-back national semifinals.

With a 71-64 win over No. 1 Kentucky, the Badgers advanced to their first national championship game since 1941. UW would fall to Duke in the title game, 68-63.

- ▶ UW set a school single-season record with 36 wins, winning at least 30 games in back-to-back seasons and the 4th time in program history (all 4 since 2007). Kansas (6) and Duke (5) are the only schools in the nation with more 30-win seasons since 2007.
- ► At 36-4, UW is just the 3rd Big Ten team to win at least 35 games in a season and the first since Ohio State (35-3) in 2006-07. The B1G record is 37 wins by Illinois in 2004-05.
- ► After winning 3 games in 3 days in Chicago, the Badgers added 2015 Big Ten Tournament Champions to a resume that already included the outright 2015 regular-season championship.

With a mark of 16-2, UW matched its best-ever 18-game conference record and claimed the 18th regular season championship in school history and the 4th title under Bo Ryan (also in 2002, 2003 and 2008).

- ► Senior Frank Kaminsky put together the greatest season in Wisconsin history, becoming the first Badger player to earn consensus National Player of the Year honors. The 21st consensus All-American in school history, Kaminsky swept the national awards winning the Wooden, the Naismith, the Robertson and the AP Player of the Year. Kaminsky averaged 18.8 points, 8.2 rebounds while shooting 54.7% overall and 41.6% from 3-point range.
- ► Kaminsky and junior Sam Dekker became the first Badgers duo to be drafted in the first round of the NBA Draft. Selected 9th overall by Charlotte, Kaminsky is the 2nd-highest drafted UW player in the last 60 years. Dekker was picked 9 spots later by the Houston Rockets. Senior Duje Dukan also signed a rookie contract with the Sacramento Kings.
- ▶ Bronson Koenig took over the starting point guard job in early January and started the final 24 games of the season. As a starter, Koenig averaged 11.5 ppg, shooting 50-for-113 (.442) on 3FGs. Overall on the season, Koenig's 3.0 A/TO ratio was the top mark in the Big Ten (min. 90 assists).
- ► According to Ken Pomeroy's rankings, UW boasted the No. 1 offense in the nation, averaging 127.9 points per 100 possessions. During conference play, UW ranked 2nd in the Big Ten in scoring (70.3 ppg) and tops in shooting (47.7%).
- ► The 2014 Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year, Nigel Hayes earned third-team All-Big Ten last season after averaging 12.4 ppg and 6.2 rpg while starting all 40 games. He shot 49.7% on the season, including 39.6% (40-101) from 3-point range, just one year after not attempting a single trey in 2013-14.

► UW led the nation in fewest fouls (12.5 avg.), fewest turnovers (7.4 TOs avg.) and fewest opposing FTAs per game (11.7). The Badgers also ranked 12th in the NCAA in scoring D (58.2 ppg).

On the year, the Badgers MADE 584 free throws while their opponents ATTEMPTED 469 free throws. UW's +115 differential was the highest in the nation.

- ▶ Wisconsin improved to 37-8 (.822) away from home over the last two seasons (21-3 in 2014-15), owning the most road/neutral wins and the 2nd-best win pct. away from home among major conf. teams.
- ► The Badgers sold out all 16 home games in 2014-15, averaging a Big Ten-best 17,279 per game. That figure also ranked 5th in the nation, trailing only Syracuse, Kentucky, Louisville and North Carolina. UW has led the Big Ten in attendance in 10 of the last 13 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 15 years.

2015 BIG TEN CHAMPIONS

Wisconsin clinched the outright 2015 Big Ten Championship, marking the school's first title since 2008 and the fourth under head coach Bo Ryan.

► Bo Ryan's 4 regular-season titles put him in exclusive company among recent Big Ten greats.

A program known for defense, Wisconsin has steadily become one of the nation's most potent offenses. According to Ken Pomeroy, the Badgers ranked No. 1 in offensive efficiency last season, averaging 127.9 points per 100 possessions.

In fact, UW posted the most efficient offense in the history of Pomeroy's rankings (since 2002).

► The Badgers also led the nation in Points Per Possession, averaging 1.22. That registered as the highest PPP of the Bo Ryan era.

- ► Last season, UW led the nation and set an NCAA record averaging a mere 7.40 turnovers per game.

The Badgers broke their own NCAA singleseason record for fewest turnovers per game. In fact, UW now owns 3 of the 4 lowest marks in NCAA history.

- ► This season the Badgers ranks 4th in the nation, turning it over just 6.7 times per game.
- ▶ Over the last 5 seasons, the Badgers have had single-digit turnovers in 128 of their 182 games (70.6%). That's the most such games of any program in the nation over that span. Michigan has the second-highest total among major conference teams with 82 -- 45 fewer games than Wisconsin.
- ► Wisconsin also ranked 2nd in the nation with a 1.70 assist-to-turnover ratio this season, dishing 504 dimes with only 296 turnovers. Only Davidson (1.80) has a better A/TO ratio.

▶ Wisconsin's football team has qualified for a bowl game and its men's basketball team has earned an invitation to the NCAA Tournament for 13 consecutive years (every year since the start of the 2002 season). - ▶ UW has posted a winning conference record in each of the last 14 seasons. Among the 6 major conferences, only Kansas (23 seasons) has a longer active streak of finishing above .500 in league play.

▶ UW's 357 wins since 2001 are the most of any Big Ten team and rank 11th among all Div. I teams. Ohio State (354) and Michigan State (347) own the next-highest win totals in the conference.

NCAA TOURNEY REGULARS

- ▶ UW has qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of Bo Ryan's 14 seasons in Madison, posting a 25-14 record over that span. Under Ryan, UW has won at least one game in 12 of the last 14 NCAA appearances. Among Big Ten teams, only MSU (28) has won more NCAA tourney games than UW since 2001-02.
- ▶ UW has made 17 consecutive NCAA tourneys 1 of just 6 schools with an active streak of at least 16 years: Kansas (26), Duke (20), Mich St. (18) & Gonzaga (17).
- ▶ Wisconsin advanced to the Final Four in both 2014 and 2015, becoming one of 8 Big Ten teams to reach back-to-back Final Fours. The Badgers have advanced to the Final Four a total of 4 times, winning the national championship in 1941 and reaching the national semifinals in 2000.
- ► UW has reached the Sweet 16 or better in 4 of the last 5 years. No team in the nation has gone more frequently over that span.

- ◆ In Ryan's first 10 seasons, the Badgers lost a TOTAL of 11 home games.
- ◆ Four of the 8 longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened with Bo Ryan on the sidelines, including the school-record 38-game winning streak from 2002 to 2005.
- ◆ Over the last 15 seasons, 157 of the Badgers' 212 home wins have come by at least 10 points (74.1 percent).
- ◆ Wisconsin has trailed at halftime in only 42 of 235 home games under Ryan. UW has come back to win 27 of those 42 games.

Ryan has taken UW to new heights

◆ With 359 wins, Bo Ryan has surpassed Hall of Famer Harold "Bud" Foster (265) to become UW's all-time career wins leader. Last season, Ryan also supplanted Hall of Famer Walter Meanwell (158 wins) as the school's leader in conference wins.

- Ryan set the UW wins record in just 365 games and 11 seasons. Foster reached the milestone in 532 games and 25 seasons.
- ◆ Bo Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and is 1 of just 9 active Division I coaches to reach that hallowed ground. Ryan's career winning percentage of .764 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.788) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.766) among active coaches with 700 wins. Among all-time coaches with 700 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 8th.
- ◆ Ryan tied legendary Indiana coach Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest coach in conference history to record 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. Only Bob Knight did it faster (131 games).
- Ryan's .717 (172-68) win percentage in conference games is the best mark in Big Ten history, surpassing legendary Indiana coach Bob Knight (353-151, .700).
- ◆ Indiana's Bob Knight (327) and Purdue's Ward Lambert (331) are the only coaches in Big Ten history to reach 250 wins faster than Bo Ryan, who did it in 343 games.
- Ryan won his fourth Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2015. Only Purdue's Gene Keady (7) and Indiana's Bob Knight (5) have won the honor more times than Ryan.

With 359 wins, Ryan is the all-time wins leader in Wisconsin history, surpassing Hall of Famer Bud Foster (265). Prior to Ryan's hire at UW in 2001-02, the Badgers had four 19-win seasons (high of 22) in 103 years.

Including last season, Ryan has now led the UW to at least 19 wins in each of his first 14 seasons at UW and owns 12 seasons of 20+ wins and 4 seasons with 30+. In fact, Ryan's teams have accounted for the 11 winningest seasons in school annals.

UW has averaged 25.5 wins per season during the Ryan era with four 30-win seasons.

Big Ten Record

UW pre-Bo Ryan: 607-757 (.445) UW with Bo Ryan: 172-68 (.717)

In the first 96 years of Big Ten play, Wisconsin won at least 11 Big Ten games 9 times (just once from 1941-2001). Including this season, Ryan has led the Badgers to at least 11 conference wins in 12 of 14 seasons. He was the first Big Ten coach to win at least 11 league games in each of his first four years.

With 172 wins, Ryan owns the most Big Ten wins in UW history and ranks 9th on the conference's all-time list. He has led UW to a 172-68 (.717) conference record, the highest win percentage of any coach in Big Ten history.

Ryan's teams own a winning record against every other team in the Big Ten (\min . 3 gms).

Ryan is the fastest coach in UW history to reach 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. That also ties Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest in conference history. Only Bob Knight (131 games) did it faster.

The Badgers have won 6 Big Ten titles (4 regular season and 2 tournament) under Ryan.

Including this season, UW has finished among the top 4 in the Big Ten in each of Ryan's 14 seasons. That 14-year stretch of top-4 finishes is the longest in Big Ten history.

NCAA Tournament Record

Ryan led the Badgers to back-to-back Final Fours in 2014 and 2015.

Wisconsin made 7 appearances in the first 63 years of the NCAA tournament. Since Bo Ryan took over as head coach, the Badgers have earned 14 consecutive tournament bids and advanced to the Sweet 16 seven times.

UW has won 25 NCAA tournament games under Ryan, surpassing the Badgers' total of 9 in the 63 years prior to Ryan.

A 2015 Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year finalist, the basketball hall of fame credentials of Bo Ryan span well beyond his 14 seasons at the helm of the University of Wisconsin



men's basketball program. Ryan has elevated the UW program to heights previously unseen in Madison, climbing even higher in 2015 by reaching a second-straight Final Four and the national championship game for the first time since 1941.

With 740 wins, 19 championships and countless conference and national coach of the year accolades, there is little doubt that Ryan is among the great coaches in college basketball history.

Ryan is in his 32nd season as a head coach in 2015-16 and his 15th atop the Wisconsin program. His incredible combination of longevity and unparalleled success elevates Ryan among college basketball's elite.

Owning the most wins in UW annals (357 entering 2015-16), Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and his 740 wins currently rank fifth among active Division I coaches.

A member of five Halls of Fame, Ryan has been enshrined into the Wilkes College Athletic HOF (2003), the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2008), the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2011), the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association HOF (2011) and the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference HOF (2012).

One of the most respected coaches in college basketball, Ryan was awarded the NABC Guardians of the Game Award for Service in 2004. In 2009, the NABC presented Ryan with the Outstanding Service Award "for his actions inside and outside the lines of coaching that have distinguished him as a valuable member of his community."

Ryan is one of college basketball's most active participants when it comes to improving the game. In the past, Ryan has served on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee and on the Academic Progress Rate committee. Ryan currently serves on the board of directors for both the NABC and the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Assoc. (WBCA).

In 2013, Ryan was given the Coaches vs.
Cancer Champion Award, rewarding his dedication to such a worthy cause. Since joining Coaches vs.
Cancer in 2007, Ryan has raised over \$1.5 million to support the American Cancer Society. His team of coaches in Wisconsin transformed the Coaches vs.
Cancer Wisconsin Gala from a small local fundraiser into the largest Coaches vs. Cancer gala in the nation.

Ryan and his wife, Kelly, have also hosted a Shooting Down Cancer at UW in each of the last four years, donating over \$220,000 to the American Cancer Society and raising a total of \$1,078,301. Ryan is also very active in numerous other national and local charity efforts including the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF), the UW Children's Hospital and the Memorial Veterans Hospital.
