#### PANTHERS CLOSE OUT 2K CLASSIC PLAY WEDNESDAY NIGHT

Prairie View A&M closes out 2K Classic play on Wednesday night with a match up at Wisconsin inside the Kohl Center. The Panthers began the classic at Virginia Commonwealth, headed to Smithfield, RI for a pair of games before closing out play in Madison. The Panthers are 0-4 after dropping their past two games in Smithfield.

#### NEW FACES IN ABUNDANCE

The Prairie View A&M men's basketball program was picked to finish fifth in a preseason poll of the SWAC's head coaches and sports information directors. The Panthers return one starter, seven lettermen and feature 12 newcomers entering the 2015-16 season. Newcomer **Admassu Williams** leads the team in scoring with 13.8 points and 8.3 rebounds per game followed by fellow newcomer **Tevin Bellinger's** 12.3 points and 2.3 rebounds. Returnees **Jayrn Johnson** and **Karim York** average 10.3 points and 8.8 points per game, respectively.

#### THE SERIES

Wednesday's game marks the third meeting all-time between both schools as they last met in 2013 with the first meeting in 2010. UW's two wins over Prairie View A&M have come by an average of 40.5 points.

#### ABOUT THE PANTHERS

Head coach **Byron Rimm II** has a major task ahead of him with the departure of four talented starters from last year's squad. With a roster full of newcomers, Rimm will turn to two-year letterwinner **Karim York** to lead the way early on as the 6-9 Austin native averaged a career-high 9.1 points and 5.1 rebounds while also shooting 46 percent from the field. In addition to York, senior guards **Jacoby Green** and **Jayrn Johnson** will take on larger roles this season as both were the first two options off the bench last season along with senior forward **Charleston Dobbs** and sophomore forward **Zach Hamilton**.

**WILLIAM NICKS PRESS ROW**

The William Nicks Building opens two hours prior to game time. The press row is located on the gym floor of the Williams Nicks Building and can accommodate television, print and radio personnel. Media credentials are required for admittance to press row. Game notes, media guides and programs are provided prior to the game. Play-by-play game accounts will be distributed at the conclusion of each half while a full booklet containing play-by-play and stats provided after the game. Player features and other important information will be forwarded throughout the season on a regular basis.

**INTERVIEWS**

Prairie View A&M student-athletes (Tue., Wed.) and coaches (Tue., Wed., Thu.) will be available for in-person or phone interviews before or after practice. ## BYRON RIMM II HEAD COACH

Byron Rimm II begins his 10th season as the head men's basketball coach at Prairie View A&M University. Rimm, who has a vast coaching background that spans from the junior college ranks to the NCAA Division I level, assumed the head coaching reigns at Prairie View after spending the 2005-06 campaign as the team's assistant coach.

Armed with the task of rebuilding a program that has had only two winning seasons since moving up to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1980, Rimm has slowly put his touch on the program in his first three seasons at the helm. In his first season after accepting the head job in 2006, Rimm guided the team to a three-game improvement in the win column and narrowly missed the SWAC Tournament as the Panthers fell short in the final week of the regular season. Individually, the SWAC also took notice and selected Brian Ezeh as the league's newcomer of the year. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Panthers began to make strides under Rimm as they made national headlines for their performance against nationally ranked Tennessee. In addition, the Panthers also captured their first NCAA Division I win since 2005 with a win over Norfolk State and defeated Jackson State on the road for the first time in two decades.

After two seasons of rebuilding, everything fell into place for Rimm during the 2008-09 campaign as the Panthers got over the hump and made a big splash as they finished with their best record and finish since 2002-03 with a 17-16 record and third-place finish. Led by SWAC Newcomer of the Year and All-SWAC First-Teamer Darnell Huger, the Panthers advanced to the second round of the SWAC Basketball Tournament for only the third time since 1998 with an opening round win over Mississippi Valley State.

In 2009-10, Rimm continued to build on his previous accomplishments as he became the first head coach at Prairie View A&M since 2002 to make consecutive SWAC Tournament appearances. In addition, Rimm held a four-game winning streak over Texas Southern which marked the longest winning streak over the Tigers prior to 1980. As a result of the team's success, three Panthers also earned the opportunity to play professional basketball overseas in Darnell Huger, Dorian McDaniel and point guard Chris Jones. Huger inked with Saint Vallier Basketball Drome of France while McDaniel played in Germany with Duesseldorf. Jones ventured to Slovakia as he signed a contract with BC Prievdza.

During the 2010-11 campaign, Rimm earned the program's third SWAC Tournament appearance as the Panthers were the top-ranked offensive rebounding team in the SWAC. Two members (Trant Simpson and Brandon Webb) earned All-SWAC honors with Webb posting career highs in field goal percentage, points and rebounding.

Rimm had the task of meshing a roster which featured 10 newcomers entering the 2011-12 campaign. Despite the large amount of newcomers present, Rimm guided the Panthers to their best finish in three seasons and the program's fourth consecutive SWAC Tournament Appearance. Under Rimm, the Panthers were the SWAC's top rebounding team as they led the league in rebounding margin, rebounding offense, offensive rebounds and defensive rebounding. The Panthers also improved their offensive production last season as they finished second in scoring offense and third in scoring margin. Defensively, Prairie View A&M ranked second in three-point field goal percentage defense and third in field goal percentage defense, steals and scoring margin.

Three seasons ago, the program turned a huge corner under Rimm as the Panthers advanced to the finals of the SWAC Tournament Championship for the first time since 1998 en route to falling in the closing seconds of the tournament. The Panthers also had a memorable season as they defeated a pair of teams from Conference USA and the Patriot League while also dominating the glass as they finished 17th nationally in total rebounds, 24th in three-point field goal defense and 47th in field goal percentage defense. Individually, senior guard Jourdan DeMuynck earned Second Team All-SWAC honors for his play

during the regular season while DeMuynck and guard Carl Blair received All-Tournament honors. DeMuynck also received an opportunity to play professionally as he inked with Keravnos Strovolou in the Republic of Cyprus.

In the 2013-14 campaign, the Panthers came within minutes of making history once again as they fell in the finals of the SWAC Tournament for the second straight season. Junior guard Montrael Scott had a career season as he emerged as a team leader while the Panthers were deadly from beyond the arc as they led the SWAC in three-pointers made.

Last season, Rimm led the Panthers on a historic run which included a seven-game winning streak that marked the team's longest winning streak since the 1972-73 season under former coach Bill Cofield. In addition, PVAMU defeated Conference USA member North Texas in the first meeting between both schools while also leading PVAMU past the first round of SWAC Tournament play for the third consecutive season. Individually, senior guard Montrael Scott surpassed the 1,000-point career while finishing fourth in the SWAC in scoring en route to signing a professional contract with KB Golden Eagle Ylli in Kosovo. Senior guard Tre Hagood was an all-around threat as he ranked in the top 10 in four statistical categories while senior guard John Brisco also averaged double figures. In the paint, Reggie Onwukamuche was named the SWAC's Defensive Player of the Year while also earning a spot on the All-SWAC Second Team as he signed a contract with the Sheffield Sharks of the British Basketball League. Junior post Karim York also saw his role expand as he averaged a career-high 9.1 points per game along with 5.1 rebounds. York tripled his scoring average in 2014-15 and averaged nearly four times more rebounds than the previous season with the Panthers.

In the classroom, Rimm also made news as the men's basketball program posted the top score amongst men's basketball teams in the SWAC during the annual Academic Progress Report (APR) released by the NCAA two years ago. The team posted its highest APR in program history with a score of 944. Only three basketball teams in the SWAC posted scores of 900 or higher with a 27-point difference separating the Panthers from the closest institution.

A native of Pensacola, Fla., Rimm played junior college ball on the West Coast at Ventura College in Ventura, Calif. He was team captain on the school's 1995-96 state championship team before wrapping up his playing career at California State University, Los Angeles. He remained on the West Coast and began his ascension up the coaching ladder by serving as an assistant coach at Pasadena City College and Chaffey Community College from 1997-2000. After several years on the junior college level, Rimm moved to California State University, San Bernardino in 2000 and helped guide the team to a No. 3 ranking in NCAA Division II. He spent only season at UCB before assuming the reigns as the head women's basketball coach at Texas College in Tyler, Texas.

Heading a program that didn't offer athletic scholarships, Rimm rolled up his sleeves and posted a 20-12 record in his inaugural season – the best record in school history. After one season at Texas College, Rimm returned to the men's side and accepted a position as head coach of Jarvis Christian College in nearby Hawkins, Texas.

While at Jarvis, Rimm made an immediate impact in his first season and guided the Bulldogs to a second place finish in the Red River Athletic Conference and their first NAIA National Tournament appearance in more than three decades. As a result of JCC's success on the court that season, Rimm was selected as co-coach of the year and had two players earn all-conference honors in addition to earning votes for the NAIA national poll.

Rimm capped off his career at JCC by leading them to two appearances in the Red River Athletic Conference Tournament and recorded victories over two nationally ranked programs before moving on to Prairie View A&M as an assistant coach for the 2005-06 campaign.

A 1999 graduate of California State University, Los Angeles, Rimm received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Liberal Studies and also obtained a master's degree in education from American InterContinental University in 2005. He also holds memberships in the National Association of Basketball Coaches and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

Rimm is single and has one daughter, Jaya Nicole (8). He currently resides in Houston, Texas.

Wednesday's contest marks PVAMU's fifth game against a Big Ten opponent since 1992 as they've played Wisconsin (2x), Michigan State and Purdue.

The Panthers are 0-4 all-time against the Big Ten.

**RIMM VS. THE BIG TEN**

Wednesday's game marks the fourth time head coach **Byron Rimm II** will face a Big Ten opponent as PVAMU's head coach. Rimm is 0-3 with games at Michigan State and Wisconsin.

**WISCONSIN AND THE SWAC**

Wisconsin is 10-0 all-time against teams from the SWAC. Since **Bo Ryan** took over the program, he's 6-0 against the SWAC as he defeated Mississippi Valley State in 2011, Prairie View A&M in 2013 and 2010, Grambling State in 2009, Southern in 2008 and Texas Southern in 2002.

**ABOUT UW**

A member of the Big Ten, Wisconsin is coming off back-to-back Final Four appearances as they fell in the title game to Duke last season. The Badgers are 3-2 this season with losses to Western Illinois and Georgetown.

**SWAC VS. BIG TEN**

Since 1980, the SWAC is 3-49 against teams from the Big Ten Conference. The last time the SWAC recorded a win over the Big Ten occurred last season as Texas Southern defeated Michigan State in overtime.

On Dec. 28, 2003, Mississippi Valley State defeated Northwestern 49-47. Current PVAMU athletic director **Ashley Robinson** was on MVSU's team at the time. In 1994, Texas Southern defeated Minnesota 71-50.

**ROAD WARRIORS**

In non-conference play, the Panthers will live out their suitcases this fall as 11 of their 12 contests are away from campus.

Prairie View A&M will play four non-conference games in the state of Texas while traveling to a total of six states (Louisiana, Nebraska, Nevada, Rhode Island, Virginia and Wisconsin). In addition to the out-of-state trips, the Panthers will play in three different time zones (Central, Eastern and Pacific).

The team's lone non-conference home game will take place on Dec. 16 versus Texas State.

**THREES PLEASE**

The three-point shot was critical to the team's offense last season as PVAMU ranked second in the SWAC with a 33.3 percent average. The Panthers are off to a slow start behind the arc as they're shooting 22% (14-for-62).

**ROAD WOES**

If the Panthers are ever to have success, winning on the road is a must as the Panthers were 7-14 away from home during the 2014-15 campaign.

Overall, the Panthers shot 42.4 percent and 33.8 percent from beyond the arc last season while on the road, they shot 40.5 percent from the field and 31.1 percent from the three-point line.

At home, the team shot 46 percent and 39 percent from the three-point line inside the friendly confines of the Baby Dome.

PVAMU shot 61.8 percent from the free throw line on the road and 68.5 percent at home.

So far this season, the Panthers are shooting 37 percent overall as all games were on the road.

**DIVERSITY**

Head coach **Byron Rimm II** leaves no stone unturned in the recruiting process as seven states are represented on this year's roster.

Rimm has 12 players from Texas, two from Louisiana and one player each from Arkansas, California, North Carolina, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

## A NEW YORK

Senior post **Karim York** will play a vital role in the success of this year's team as he averaged career-high 9.1 points and 5.1 rebounds while also shooting 46 percent from the field. York also participated with the Athletes In Action tour in Poland this past summer.

## SWITCHING GEARS

The non-conference slate hasn't been kind to Prairie View A&M head coach **Byron Rimm II** since he took over the reigns at Prairie View A&M in 2006.

In 10 years, Rimm is 32-90 in non-conference match-ups with NCAA Division I wins coming against Bethune-Cookman, Houston, Navy, Norfolk State, North Texas, Florida Gulf Coast and Stephen F. Austin.

In SWAC play, Rimm holds a career mark of 77-84.

A sluggish finish to the first half cost the Panthers in a season-opening loss to Virginia Commonwealth University Friday night at the Siegel Center.

Prairie View A&M allowed VCU to get off to a good start, as the Panthers let the Rams shoot nearly 57 percent (17-30) from the floor in the opening half. PVAMU didn't end the half as it hoped, giving up a 12-2 scoring run that left the visiting team trailing 46-22 heading into intermission.

The Panthers clamped down on VCU's offense in the second half, limiting the Rams to 29 points, but were unable to put enough together offensively to make a significant dent in the VCU's lead.

**Zachary Hamilton** was strong in the opener for the Panthers, scoring a team-high 13 to go with eight boards and two blocks. **Karim York** had a solid opening to his season as well, scoring 12 points and grabbing seven rebounds.

VCU had three players score in double-figures: **Melvin Johnson** (13), **Doug Brooks** (13) NS **Justin Tillman** (10), who also pulled down 11 rebounds for a double-double.

## GAME 2

**HOUSTON 110**

**PRAIRIE VIEW A&M 69**

**WED., NOV. 18 - HOUSTON, TEXAS**

Prairie View A&M fell to Houston 110-69 at Hofheinz Pavilion on Wednesday night.

The Panthers started slow, allowing the Cougars to score the first nine points of the contest. PVAMU regrouped to get within six, but Houston was able to further its advantage over the course of the game as the Panthers were unable to claw back within striking distance of the homestanding Cougars.

Prairie View A&M was outrebounded 42-23 by the Cougars, and the Panthers were cold from beyond the arc, hitting 4-of-15 attempts from long range (26.7 percent).

**Tevin Bellinger** led the Panthers with 19 points. **Admassu Williams** added 17

points and seven rebounds.

Houston's **Devonta Pollard** scored 25 points and added nine boards. **Damyeon Dotson** added 21 points and pulled in six rebounds. **Ronnie Johnson** chipped in 17 points, six assists and six rebounds, and **Rob Gray Jr.** added 12 points for the Cougars.

Prairie View A&M dropped its third straight game as they fell to Bryant 71-58 in the 2K Classic on Friday.

Prairie View A&M fell behind 9-2 to open the game, but was able to claw back in it and make the score 16-11 with 12:35 left in the opening stanza. The Panthers then allowed 14 unanswered points en route to falling behind 43-20 at the break.

The Panthers outscored the Bulldogs 38-28 in the second half – after Bryant pushed its lead to 53-29 with 14:40 left in the game – PVAMU responded with a 19-6 run that cut the deficit to 11 as **Admassu Williams**, **Tevin Bellinger** and **Jayrn Johnson** willed the team with key baskets to provide a spark.
