### **UP NEXT: ROAD TRIP TO NO.7 OKLAHOMA**

- Winners of two straight, Wisconsin will begin a two-game road swing on Sunday at No. 7 Oklahoma. The first of a two-year home-and-home series with the Sooners, the Badgers will look to repeat a 69-56 win over OU in the 2014 Battle 4 Atlantis Tournament.
- Up next, Wisconsin will travel to Syracuse on Wed. Dec. 2 for the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Tip off is set for 6:15 p.m. (CT) on ESPN2.

### **NOTES TO KNOW**

1 ALL-BIG TEN TANDEM: UW returns just 38% of its minutes played from last season, but welcomes back a pair of Wooden Award candidates in juniors Nigel Hayes and Bronson Koenig. Hayes, who was 9th in the AP Preseason All-American voting, has scored in double figures in all 6 games averaging 14.0 ppg, 3.8 rpg and 4.2 apg.



For the second-straight season, UW boasts 2 players on the Wooden Award preseason Top 50 in Nigel Hayes and Bronson Koenig.

- 2 KLUTCH KOENIG: Junior Bronson Koenig entered the season with a single-game career high of 19 points. He has already topped that twice in 6 games this season, leading UW with 17.3 ppg. On Sunday vs. VCU, Koenig scored a game-high 22 points, including the game-winning basket with 5.9 seconds remaining.
- MAKING IT HAPP-EN: With back-to-back double-doubles in the 2K Classic in New York, Ethan Happ became the first UW freshman to post consecutive double-doubles since Mike Wilkinson in the 2001-02 season.
- YOUNG BLOOD: No team in the nation has more freshmen than Wisconsin (8) and a quartet of the Badgers' newcomers are having an immediate impact. Ethan Happ, Alex Illikainen, Khalil Iverson and Charlie Thomas are combining to average 23.9 points and 15.3 rebounds per game. Freshmen have played 32.9% of UW's minutes.
- BO KNOWS: A 2015 Naismith Hall of Fame finalist, Bo Ryan ranks 9th in conference history with 172 career Big Ten wins and owns the highest Big Ten winning percentage in conference history. Overall, Ryan ranks 27th on the NCAA's all-time wins list with a record of 744-230 (.764), just 3 wins short of passing the legendary Phog Allen (746).
- AT HOME ON THE ROAD: Wisconsin is known for its incredible home record, but has actually been just as good away from home lately. UW is 38-9 (.809) away from home over the last two seasons (21-3 last season), owning the most road/neutral wins and the best win percentage away from home among major conference teams.



### **NOTES FROM UW'S LAST GAME**

### UW 85, VCU 67 - 11/25/15 - Kohl Center

- ► Wisconsin stretched a 6-point halftime lead into a comfortable runaway before beating Prairie View A&M, 85-67, at the Kohl Center on Wednesday.
- ▶ UW had 6 players score in double figures, led by a team-high 16 points from **Bronson Koenig**. **Zak Showalter** added a career-high 14 points, going 3-for-7 from 3-point range.
- ► Freshman **Charlie Thomas** tallied career highs with 12 points and 6 rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench. Freshman **Ethan Happ** also chipped in 12 points with 8 rebounds. **Vitto Brown** (11 points) and Nigel Hayes (10 points, 7 assists) rounded out the double-digit scorers.
- ▶ UW shot 51.8% from the field, topping 50% for the 3rd time this season. PVAMU shot 60.9% in the first half (7-9 3FGs), but cooled to just 37.0% in the second half (0-2 3FGs).
- ► The Badgers went 21-for-26 from the FT line while drawing 27 fouls and forcing the Panthers into 19 turnovers.

### NON-CON NO-CONTEST

- ▶ UW has won 32 of its last 35 regular-season, non-conference games dating back to Dec. of 2012.
- ► Under Bo Ryan (since 2001-02), UW is 147-33 (.817) in non-conference games, including a mark of 107-9 (.922) at the Kohl Center.
- ► Since 2003-04, Wisconsin is 90-3 (.968) vs. unranked non-con opponents, the 4th-highest win percentage in the nation over that span.

### WRECKING THE RANKED

- ► The Badgers went 5-3 last season against teams that were ranked in the AP poll at the time, including a pair of top-5 wins over No. 5 Arizona and No. 1 Kentucky in the NCAA tournament.
- ▶ Overall, UW is 61-58 (.513) vs. ranked teams under Bo Ryan, having won 20 of its last 29 vs. ranked foes.
- ► Ryan's teams are 18-31 against AP top-10 teams all-time. That includes a mark of 8-5 against top-10 teams over the last 3 seasons.
- ► The Badgers have won 2 of their last 3 road games against teams ranked in the AP top 10. Wisconsin's last road win over an AP top-10 team was a 64-59 win at No. 2 Indiana on Jan. 15, 2013. UW also knocked off No. 8 Ohio State, 63-60, on Feb. 26, 2012 in Columbus, Ohio.

### **ALL-TIME VS. OKLAHOMA**


▶ UW has won each of the last 3 meetings, beginning with a 77-66 win in Norman, Oklahoma in 1954. The Badgers also posted a 75-64 win over the Sooners in the 1997 Big Island Invitational (Hilo, Hawaii) and a 69-56 win in the 2014 Battle 4 Atlantis championship.

- ► The Badgers clung to a 34-33 halftime lead, but opened the second stanza 16-2 run to gain control and cruise to the Battle 4 Atlantis championship.
- ► The Badgers had 5 players in double figures, led by tournament MVP Frank Kaminsky, who finished with 17 points (14 in the second half) and 8 rebounds.
- ► Seniors Traevon Jackson and Duje Dukan each scored 13 points, while Jackson equaled his career high with 8 assists. Sam Dekker (11 points) and **Nigel Hayes** (10 points) rounded out the top scorers.
- ► The Sooners had just one player reach double figues (Dinjiyl had 10 points).
- ▶ UW's defense held OU to a season-low 56 points and just 37.0% shooting, including 29.2% in the second half. The Badgers racked up a season-high 12 steals and converted OU's 21 turnovers into 26 points.

### **BO KNOWS**

- ► The winningest coach in Wisconsin history (361-127, .740), Ryan currently ranks 9th in conference history with 172 career Big Ten wins. With a career record of 172-68 (.717), Ryan owns the highest Big Ten winning percentage in conference history.
- ▶ In his 32nd season as a head coach, Bo Ryan is 27th on the NCAA's all-time wins list with a record of 744-230 (.764). Ryan is just 3 wins shy of passing the legendary Phog Allen (Kansas) for 26th in NCAA annals. Among active Div. I coaches, Ryan's 744 wins rank 5th.
- ► Ryan's career win percentage of .764 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.788) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.767) among active coaches with 600 wins. Among all-time coaches with 600 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 10th.
- ► The 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year and 1 of 4 finalists for the Naismith National Coach of the Year, Bo Ryan was named one of 12 finalists for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2015.

### **HAYES FOR DAYS**

► After earning 2014 Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year, **Nigel Hayes** expanded his game in 2015 and was rewarded with third-team All-Big Ten honors.

Now Hayes enters his junior season as a preseason All-American and the focal point of Wisconsin's offense.

- ► Through 6 games, Hayes is averaging 14.0 ppg, 3.8 rpg and a team-high 4.2 apg. He has dished 25 assists with just 9 turnovers (2.8 ratio). He leads the Badgers in FTs (28) and FTAs (41).
- ▶ Hayes has scored in double figures in all 6 games this season, including a season-high 22 points against Georgetown. The junior has 47 career games in double digits with a career-high of 25 points against both Michigan State (3/15/15) and Green Bay (11/19/14). He also owns 4 career double-doubles.
- ► Last season, Hayes finished 3rd on the team in points (12.4) and ranked 13th in the Big Ten with 6.2 rebounds per game. He led UW in steals (34) and was 3rd in blocks (16).

Hayes ranked 9th in the Big Ten shooting 49.7% from the field and shot 39.6% from 3-point range, which ranked 13th in the Big Ten.

► The junior made great strides in 3 areas in particular: rebounding, 3FG% and FT%.

► The Toledo, Ohio, native continued his penchant for getting to the free throw line. As a freshman, Hayes was 2nd on the team with 164 FTAs. Last season, he was again 2nd on UW in both FTAs and made FTs, going 125-for-168 (.744).

### **KOENIG ON POINT**

When Traveon Jackson went down with a foot injury at Rutgers on Jan. 11, 2015, **Bronson Koenig** took over the starting point guard role for the Badgers and flourished in the new role.

Now a junior, the preseason All-Big Ten pick is the unquestioned lead guard at Wisconsin.

- ► Koenig leads the Badgers averaging 17.3 ppg while shooting 50.0% from the field and 41.7% (15-36) from 3-point range. Koenig is also tallying 3.0 rpg, 3.2 apg with a 1.9 assist-to-TO ratio (19a, 10to).
- ► In UW's 74-73 win over VCU, Koenig scored a game-high 22 points, including the game-winning shot on a spinning, left-handed lay-in with 5.9 seconds remaining.
- ► Koenig entered the season with a career-high of 19 points, but has already eclipsed that twice this season. In addition to 22 points vs. VCU, he poured in 23 vs. Siena (11/15).
- ► Last season, Koenig ranked 4th on the Badgers averaging 8.7 points per game and 2nd on the team with 2.5 assists per game.

Koenig connected on 40.5% of his 3-point attempts (62-153), good for 12th in the Big Ten.

► In 2014-15, Koenig had 98 assists to just 33 turnovers. His 2.97 assist-to-turnover ratio was tops among Big Ten players with at least 75 assists.

▶ In 24 games as the Badgers' starting point guard, Koenig averaged 11.5 points, 2.2 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game. He also went 50-for-113 (44.2%) from 3-point range over those 24 games.

► Koenig had just 26 turnovers in 835 minutes last season as the starting PG (1 every 32.1 min.).

### **MAKING IT HAPP-EN**

**Ethan Happ's** collegiate career is off to a start seldom seen at the University of Wisconsin. The redshirt freshman is averaging 10.8 ppg and leading the Badgers with 7.7 rpg. The Milan (pronounced MY-lin), III. native is also shooting a team-high .558 from the floor and is 17-for-19 (.895) at the charity stripe.

- ► After grabbing just 10 total rebounds in his first 2 games, Happ is averaging 9.0 over the last 4 games. He also leads UW with 19 offensive rebounds.
- ► The last Wisconsin freshman to average at least 10.0 points per game was Alando Tucker in the 2002-03 season.
- ▶ With back-to-back double-doubles at the 2K Classic in New York, Ethan Happ became the first UW freshman to post consecutive double-doubles since Mike Wilkinson in 2002 (14 pts, 10 reb vs. Minnesota and 16 pts, 10 reb vs. Purdue). Happ had 12 pts, 11 reb vs. Georgetown and 12 pts, 10 reb against VCU.
- ► Happ tallied a career high with 17 points in 25 minutes against North Dakota (11/17). He went 7-for-11 from the field, adding 2 assists and a block.
- ► Happ, who has started every game this season, became just the 3rd freshman to start the season opener under Bo Ryan, joining Devin Harris (2001) and George Marshall (2012).

### "VELVET" VITTO BROWN

During his first 2 years on campus, junior forward **Vitto Brown** was best-known for his singing prowess. Now in the Badgers' starting lineup, Brown is proving his game might be as strong as his voice.

► Brown has started each of the first 6 games this season and is 3rd on the Badgers in scoring at 10.8 ppg and ranks 2nd with 5.7 rpg. He tallied a careerhigh 16 points vs. Siena and is 11-for-12 from the FT line on the year.

Brown has scored in double figures in 4 games this season. He had a total of one double-digit scoring game entering the year.

► A talented crooner who has been performing with his family's singing group, "Shades of Brown," since a young age, Brown has performed the national anthem before several UW games, including at the Final Four in Indianapolis last season.

### STEALING THE SHOWALTER

After playing the role of maximum effort, spark off the bench player, junior **Zak Showalter** has emerged as an offensive threat in 2015-16. Showalter is averaging 9.5 ppg and 5.0 rpg in 33.5 mpg.

- ► Entering the season, Showalter had made just 4-of-24 (16.7%) from 3-point range. Already in 6 games this season, Showalter is 8-for-22 (36.4%) from long range.
- ► "Showy's" offensive contributions haven't come at the expense of the other areas of his game. Showalter leads the Badgers with 7 steals and has already taken a team-high 7 charges.

### YOUTH BEING SERVED

The 2015-16 Badgers are the youngest in Bo Ryan's 15 seasons. No school in the country has more freshmen on its roster than Wisconsin (8). Cornell and UTEP are the only other schools with 8 freshmen.

► In addition to Ethan Happ, true freshmen Khalil Iverson, Charlie Thomas and Alex Illikainen have each seen extensive action off the Badgers' bench.

Wisconsin's freshman have played 32.9% of the team's minutes this season.

► Thomas is seeing an average of 14.5 mpg and tallying 5.7 ppg and 4.0 rpg. Over the last 2 games, the 6-foot-8 forward is averaging 10.5 points and 5.5 rebounds, including career highs of 12 points and 6 rebounds vs. Prairie View A&M.

Iverson is playing 20.8 minutes per game off the bench and producing 5.0 ppg and 2.8 rpg while leading the Badgers with 5 blocks and ranking second with 5 steals. Iverson also notched a career high with 9 points against Prairie View A&M.

Illikainen did not appear in the opener, but has played 5.8 mpg since then and has contributed 12 points and 4 rebounds.

► UW's other active scholarship freshmen **Brevin Pritzl** suffered a broken foot in August and has been easing back into the rotation. He has appeared in just one game (4 min. vs. Siena).

Andy Van Vliet is forced to sit out this season after the NCAA ruled him ineligible for not enrolling in college within a year of high school graduation.

### WHAT'S TRENDING IN 2015-16

Through 6 games, a few trends have begun to emerge for Wisconsin.

- ► UW has out-rebounded each of its first 6 opponents and owns a +7.0 average margin.
- ▶ UW has grabbed 31 more offensive boards than its opponents (88-57). The Badgers' 14.7 offensive rebounds per game ranks 3rd in the Big Ten and 42nd and in the NCAA.
- ▶ UW is averaging 10.5 turnovers per game. After posting single-digit turnovers in the first 3 games, the Badgers have had double-digit errors in each of the last 3 games with 14 TOs vs. Georgetown, 17 against VCU and 12 vs. Prairie View A&M.
- ► UW is averaging 24.5 FTAs per game and shooting 74.1% from the foul line, which ranks 4th in the Big Ten. Four of the Badgers' five starters are shooting over 88%.
- ► UW is drawing 23.3 fouls per game. The Badgers are committing 19.0 fouls per game.
- ► UW is averaging 17.0 3FGAs per game, a figure that is down 2.8 attempts per game from last season's average of 19.8 3FGAs per game.

▶ Wisconsin looks to replace 5 of the top 7 scorers from a year ago, but does return a pair of starters in juniors Nigel Hayes and Bronson Koenig. Overall, the Badgers bring back just 38.1% of their minutes played from last season, the lowest total since Bo Ryan inherited a 2001-02 team that returned 30.0% of its minutes.

UW returns 34.3% of its scoring and 31.5% of its rebounding from 2014-15, both are the fewest of any team in the Big Ten.

- ▶ The 2015-16 season will mark the first year under Bo Ryan in which the Badgers do not have a scholarship senior. The only senior on the roster is walk-on G Jordan Smith. Wisconsin has had at least one senior starter in each of Ryan's first 14 seasons in Madison. In fact, the Badgers have started at least two seniors in 10 of those 14 seasons.
- ► UW returns 4 players from last season's 9-man rotation.

- ▶ Defending Big Ten regular season and tournament champions, the Badgers enter the 2015-16 season seeking back-to-back conference titles for the first time since 2002-03. Wisconsin will also take aim at a third-consecutive Final Four appearance, something only 11 schools have done in the history of the NCAA tournament. The most recent team to turn the three-peat was UCLA (2006-08).
- ► Wisconsin will play a total of 13 games vs. teams in the 2015 NCAA Tournament field, with 8 of those coming away from home. During the non-conference schedule, the Badgers will travel to Oklahoma and Syracuse, host Marquette and Temple, as well as taking on Georgetown and either Duke or VCU at the 2K Classic in NYC.

### FINISHING MOVES

- ▶ Dating back to February of 2011, UW is 121-4 (.968) when leading or tied with 5:00 left, including a mark of 4-0 this season. The only losses over the last 5 years have been to Duke (tied 56-56) in the 2015 National Championship, Kentucky (led 69-65) and Ohio State (led 54-50) in 2014 and at Minnesota in 2012-13 season (led 49-43).
- ▶ UW has also won 140 of its last 142 games when shooting a higher FG% than its opponents, including a mark of 27-0 last season.

### **DOGGED DEFENSE**

- ► Wisconsin is surrendering 68.2 ppg so far this season. But if history is an indicator, the Badgers will find their defensive stride.
- ▶ UW has led the Big Ten in scoring defense in 9 of the past 13 seasons and finished among the nation's top 10 in 9 of the past 13 years. Last year, the Badgers allowed just 58.2 points per game last season, the top mark in the Big Ten and 12th nationally.

### 2014-15 LOOK BACK

**Record:** 36-4 | **Big Ten:** 16-2 (1st)

▶ Playing in its 17th-consecutive NCAA tournament after earning the first No. 1 seed in school history, Wisconsin returned to the Final Four for the 2nd-straight season and the 4th time in school history. UW is just the 9th Big Ten team in history to reach back-to-back national semifinals.

With a 71-64 win over No. 1 Kentucky, the Badgers advanced to their first national championship game since 1941. UW would fall to Duke in the title game, 68-63.

- ▶ UW set a school single-season record with 36 wins, winning at least 30 games in back-to-back seasons and the 4th time in program history (all 4 since 2007). Kansas (6) and Duke (5) are the only schools in the nation with more 30-win seasons since 2007.
- ► At 36-4, UW is just the 3rd Big Ten team to win at least 35 games in a season and the first since Ohio State (35-3) in 2006-07. The B1G record is 37 wins by Illinois in 2004-05.
- ► After winning 3 games in 3 days in Chicago, the Badgers added 2015 Big Ten Tournament Champions to a resume that already included the outright 2015 regular-season championship.

With a mark of 16-2, UW matched its best-ever 18-game conference record and claimed the 18th regular season championship in school history and the 4th title under Bo Ryan (also in 2002, 2003 and 2008).

► Senior Frank Kaminsky put together the greatest season in Wisconsin history, becoming the first Badger player to earn consensus National Player of the Year honors. The 21st consensus All-American in school history, Kaminsky swept the national awards winning the Wooden, the Naismith, the Robertson and the AP Player of the Year. Kaminsky averaged 18.8 points, 8.2 rebounds while shooting 54.7% overall and 41.6% from 3-point range.

- ► Kaminsky and junior Sam Dekker became the first Badgers duo to be drafted in the first round of the NBA Draft. Selected 9th overall by Charlotte, Kaminsky is the 2nd-highest drafted UW player in the last 60 years. Dekker was picked 9 spots later by the Houston Rockets. Senior Duje Dukan also signed a rookie contract with the Sacramento Kings.
- ▶ Bronson Koenig took over the starting point guard job in early January and started the final 24 games of the season. As a starter, Koenig averaged 11.5 ppg, shooting 50-for-113 (.442) on 3FGs. Overall on the season, Koenig's 3.0 A/TO ratio was the top mark in the Big Ten (min. 90 assists).
- ► According to Ken Pomeroy's rankings, UW boasted the No. 1 offense in the nation, averaging 127.9 points per 100 possessions. During conference play, UW ranked 2nd in the Big Ten in scoring (70.3 ppg) and tops in shooting (47.7%).
- ► The 2014 Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year, Nigel Hayes earned third-team All-Big Ten last season after averaging 12.4 ppg and 6.2 rpg while starting all 40 games. He shot 49.7% on the season, including 39.6% (40-101) from 3-point range, just one year after not attempting a single trey in 2013-14.
- ▶ UW led the nation in fewest fouls (12.5 avg.), fewest turnovers (7.4 TOs avg.) and fewest opposing FTAs per game (11.7). The Badgers also ranked 12th in the NCAA in scoring D (58.2 ppg).

On the year, the Badgers MADE 584 free throws while their opponents ATTEMPTED 469 free throws. UW's +115 differential was the highest in the nation.

- ▶ Wisconsin improved to 37-8 (.822) away from home over the last two seasons (21-3 in 2014-15), owning the most road/neutral wins and the 2nd-best win pct. away from home among major conf. teams.
- ► The Badgers sold out all 16 home games in 2014-15, averaging a Big Ten-best 17,279 per game. That figure also ranked 5th in the nation, trailing only Syracuse, Kentucky, Louisville and North Carolina. UW has led the Big Ten in attendance in 10 of the last 13 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 15 years.

### **2015 BIG TEN CHAMPIONS**

Wisconsin clinched the outright 2015 Big Ten Championship, marking the school's first title since 2008 and the fourth under head coach Bo Ryan.

► Bo Ryan's 4 regular-season titles put him in exclusive company among recent Big Ten greats.

### **NATION'S BEST OFFENSE**

A program known for defense, Wisconsin has steadily become one of the nation's most potent offenses. According to Ken Pomeroy, the Badgers ranked No. 1 in offensive efficiency last season, averaging 127.9 points per 100 possessions.

In fact, UW posted the most efficient offense in the history of Pomeroy's rankings (since 2002).

► The Badgers also led the nation in Points Per Possession, averaging 1.22. That registered as the highest PPP of the Bo Ryan era.

- ▶ During the Bo Ryan era, no team has taken better care of the ball than Wisconsin... and it's not close.
- ► Last season, UW led the nation and set an NCAA record averaging a mere 7.40 turnovers per game.

The Badgers broke their own NCAA single-season record for fewest turnovers per game. In fact, UW now owns 3 of the 4 lowest marks in NCAA history.

This season the Badgers ranks 4th in the nation, turning it over just 6.7 times per game.

- ▶ Over the last 5 seasons, the Badgers have had single-digit turnovers in 128 of their 182 games (70.6%). That's the most such games of any program in the nation over that span. Michigan has the second-highest total among major conference teams with 82 -- 45 fewer games than Wisconsin.
- ► Wisconsin also ranked 2nd in the nation with a 1.70 assist-to-turnover ratio this season, dishing 504 dimes with only 296 turnovers. Only Davidson (1.80) has a better A/TO ratio.

### **POSTSEASON PARTY**

► Since the start of the 1996 season, UW's football and men's basketball teams have combined for more bowl appearances and NCAA Tournament appearances than ANY OTHER school in the country.

That's the longest such streak of two-sport success in the nation, with Michigan St. (8 years), Louisville (5) and San Diego St. (5) owning the next-longest active runs.
- ► The University of Wisconsin is one of just two schools to have its men's basketball team ranked in ESPN.com's preseason Top 25 and be rated among the top 25 in the latest Academic Ranking of World Universities. The Badgers sit at No. 24 in the ESPN. com poll and UW is listed at No. 24 in the ARWU, which annually ranks more than 1,200 universities worldwide. ▶ Wisconsin's football team has qualified for a bowl game and its men's basketball team has earned an invitation to the NCAA Tournament for 13 consecutive years (every year since the start of the 2002 season). That is the longest streak in the country, five years longer than Michigan State's streak, which is the second-longest.

### **BIG TEN, BIG RESULTS**

- ► Since Bo Ryan took over in 2001, UW has won 7 Big Ten championships (4 regular season and 3 tourn.). Only OSU (10; 5 regular season, 5 tourn.) has won more titles during Ryan's tenure. MSU and ILL have 5, but no other school has more than 3 over that span.
- ► Ryan's teams have posted a 172-68 (.717) Big Ten record, the best mark in the conference over the last 13 seasons. Michigan St. is second at 161-79 (.671) and Ohio St. is third at 156-84 (.650).

- ► Last season, Wisconsin won the Big Ten with a record of 16-2 in conference play. The Badgers have notched double-digit conference wins in 13 of 14 years under Bo Ryan and have never finished lower than fourth place in the Big Ten standings.
- ▶ UW has posted a winning conference record in each of the last 14 seasons. Among the 6 major conferences, only Kansas (23 seasons) has a longer active streak of finishing above .500 in league play.

### ALL WE DO IS WIN, WIN, WIN

Over the Bo Ryan era (since 2001-02), Wisconsin has accumulated an overall record of 357-125 (.741). That win total and percentage puts the Badgers in pretty exclusive company.

Wisconsin's .741 win percentage ranks 9th among all NCAA Div. I teams in that span.

▶ UW's 357 wins since 2001 are the most of any Big Ten team and rank 11th among all Div. I teams. Ohio State (354) and Michigan State (347) own the next-highest win totals in the conference.

### **NCAA TOURNEY REGULARS**

- ▶ UW has qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of Bo Ryan's 14 seasons in Madison, posting a 25-14 record over that span. Under Ryan, UW has won at least one game in 12 of the last 14 NCAA appearances. Among Big Ten teams, only MSU (28) has won more NCAA tourney games than UW since 2001-02.
- ▶ UW has made 17 consecutive NCAA tourneys 1 of just 6 schools with an active streak of at least 16 years: Kansas (26), Duke (20), Mich St. (18) & Gonzaga (17).
- ▶ Wisconsin advanced to the Final Four in both 2014 and 2015, becoming one of 8 Big Ten teams to reach back-to-back Final Fours. The Badgers have advanced to the Final Four a total of 4 times, winning the national championship in 1941 and reaching the national semifinals in 2000.
- ▶ UW has reached the Sweet 16 or better in 4 of the last 5 years. No team in the nation has gone more frequently over that span.

### **BADGERS ATTENDANCE IS B1G**

- ► In 2014-15, the Badgers led the Big Ten and finished 5th nationally by averaging a sellout capacity of 17,279 per game.
- ► Wisconsin has led the Big Ten in attendance in 10 of the last 13 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 15 years.

◆ In Bo Ryan's 15 seasons as Wisconsin's head coach, the Badgers have compiled a 213-23 (.903) record at the Kohl Center, including a 106-14 (.883) record in Big Ten home games.

- ◆ In Ryan's first 10 seasons, the Badgers lost a TOTAL of 11 home games.
- ◆ Four of the 8 longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened with Bo Ryan on the sidelines, including the school-record 38-game winning streak from 2002 to 2005.
- ◆ Over the last 15 seasons, 158 of the Badgers' 213 home wins have come by at least 10 points (74.2 percent).
- ◆ Wisconsin has trailed at halftime in only 42 of 236 home games under Ryan. UW has come back to win 27 of those 42 games.
- ◆ UW had a streak of 143 consecutive sellouts at the Kohl Center snapped in 2011 (vs. Green Bay). Wisconsin sold out every game from 2003 until midway through the 2011-12 season.

## The Bo Ryan Years

### Ryan has taken UW to new heights

With 361 wins, Bo Ryan has surpassed Hall of Famer Harold "Bud" Foster (265) to become UW's all-time career wins leader. Last season, Ryan also supplanted Hall of Famer Walter Meanwell (158 wins) as the school's leader in conference wins.

- Ryan set the UW wins record in just 365 games and 11 seasons. Foster reached the milestone in 532 games and 25 seasons.
- ◆ Bo Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and is 1 of just 9 active Division I coaches to reach that hallowed ground. Ryan's career winning percentage of .764 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.788) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.767) among active coaches with 700 wins. Among all-time coaches with 700 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 8th.
- Ryan tied legendary Indiana coach Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest coach in conference history to record 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. Only Bob Knight did it faster (131 games).
- Ryan's .717 (172-68) win percentage in conference games is the best mark in Big Ten history, surpassing legendary Indiana coach Bob Knight (353-151, .700).
- ◆ Indiana's Bob Knight (327) and Purdue's Ward Lambert (331) are the only coaches in Big Ten history to reach 250 wins faster than Bo Ryan, who did it in 343 games.
- Ryan won his fourth Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2015. Only Purdue's Gene Keady (7) and Indiana's Bob Knight (5) have won the honor more times than Ryan.

With 361 wins, Ryan is the all-time wins leader in Wisconsin history, surpassing Hall of Famer Bud Foster (265). Prior to Ryan's hire at UW in 2001-02, the Badgers had four 19-win seasons (high of 22) in 103 years.

Including last season, Ryan has now led the UW to at least 19 wins in each of his first 14 seasons at UW and owns 12 seasons of 20+ wins and 4 seasons with 30+. In fact, Ryan's teams have accounted for the 11 winningest seasons in school annals.

UW has averaged 25.5 wins per season during the Ryan era with four 30-win seasons.

### **Big Ten Record**

UW pre-Bo Ryan: 607-757 (.445) UW with Bo Ryan: 172-68 (.717)

In the first 96 years of Big Ten play, Wisconsin won at least 11 Big Ten games 9 times (just once from 1941-2001). Including this season, Ryan has led the Badgers to at least 11 conference wins in 12 of 14 seasons. He was the first Big Ten coach to win at least 11 league games in each of his first four years.

With 172 wins, Ryan owns the most Big Ten wins in UW history and ranks 9th on the conference's all-time list. He has led UW to a 172-68 (.717) conference record, the highest win percentage of any coach in Big Ten history.

Ryan's teams own a winning record against every other team in the Big Ten ( $\min$ . 3 gms).

Ryan is the fastest coach in UW history to reach 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. That also ties Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest in conference history. Only Bob Knight (131 games) did it faster.

The Badgers have won 6 Big Ten titles (4 regular season and 2 tournament) under Ryan.

Including this season, UW has finished among the top 4 in the Big Ten in each of Ryan's 14 seasons. That 14-year stretch of top-4 finishes is the longest in Big Ten history.

Ryan led the Badgers to back-to-back Final Fours in 2014 and 2015.

Wisconsin made 7 appearances in the first 63 years of the NCAA tournament. Since Bo Ryan took over as head coach, the Badgers have earned 14 consecutive tournament bids and advanced to the Sweet 16 seven times.

UW has won 25 NCAA tournament games under Ryan, surpassing the Badgers' total of 9 in the 63 years prior to Ryan.

## **BO RYAN** HEAD COACH

A 2015 Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year finalist, the basketball hall of fame credentials of Bo Ryan span well beyond his 14 seasons at the helm of the University of Wisconsin



men's basketball program. Ryan has elevated the UW program to heights previously unseen in Madison, climbing even higher in 2015 by reaching a second-straight Final Four and the national championship game for the first time since 1941.

With 740 wins, 19 championships and countless conference and national coach of the year accolades, there is little doubt that Ryan is among the great coaches in college basketball history.

Ryan is in his 32nd season as a head coach in 2015-16 and his 15th atop the Wisconsin program. His incredible combination of longevity and unparalleled success elevates Ryan among college basketball's elite.

Owning the most wins in UW annals (357 entering 2015-16), Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and his 740 wins currently rank fifth among active Division I coaches.

A member of five Halls of Fame, Ryan has been enshrined into the Wilkes College Athletic HOF (2003), the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2008), the Pennsylvania Sports HOF (2011), the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association HOF (2011) and the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference HOF (2012).

One of the most respected coaches in college basketball, Ryan was awarded the NABC Guardians of the Game Award for Service in 2004. In 2009, the NABC presented Ryan with the Outstanding Service Award "for his actions inside and outside the lines of coaching that have distinguished him as a valuable member of his community."

Ryan is one of college basketball's most active participants when it comes to improving the game. In the past, Ryan has served on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee and on the Academic Progress Rate committee. Ryan currently serves on the board of directors for both the NABC and the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Assoc. (WBCA).

In 2013, Ryan was given the Coaches vs.
Cancer Champion Award, rewarding his dedication to such a worthy cause. Since joining Coaches vs.
Cancer in 2007, Ryan has raised over \$1.5 million to support the American Cancer Society. His team of coaches in Wisconsin transformed the Coaches vs.
Cancer Wisconsin Gala from a small local fundraiser into the largest Coaches vs. Cancer gala in the nation.

Ryan and his wife, Kelly, have also hosted a Shooting Down Cancer at UW in each of the last four years, donating over \$220,000 to the American Cancer Society and raising a total of \$1,078,301. Ryan is also very active in numerous other national and local charity efforts including the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF), the UW Children's Hospital and the Memorial Veterans Hospital.
