BORDER BATTLE SHOWDOWN WITH NO. 3 MINNESOTA AWAITS NO. 1 BADGERS

The No. 1 Wisconsin women's hockey team, off to its best start in program history, wraps up a six-game homestand with a Border Battle clash with No. 3 Minnesota at LaBahn Arena. Friday's contest begins at 7 p.m., while Saturday's game starts at 3 p.m.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- UW is coming off of a sweep of Dartmouth at LaBahn Arena as the Badgers defeated the Big Green 4-1 on Friday before earning a 4-0 win on Saturday.
- The Badgers' 16-game winning streak is the third-longest streak in school history and the fifth-longest in WCHA history. It is also UW's longest streak to occur in a single season.
- Wisconsin leads the country in scoring defense, holding opponents to 0.38 goals per contest. UW has shut out its opponents in 11 of its 16 games this year.
- Sophomore **Annie Pankowski** ranks seventh in the NCAA in scoring, averaging 1.81 points per contest. She also has a 19-game point streak heading into this weekend's series, which is tied for the fifth-longest in program history.
- Junior **Ann-Renée Desbiens** enters the weekend with a perfect 14-0-0 record. Her nine shut-outs this season lead the NCAA and her 26 career blank slates are the sixth-most in NCAA history.
- Sophomore **Emily Clark** has scored a goal in each of the past six games for the Cardinal and White. The streak is the fourth-longest in program and WCHA history.
- Junior **Jenny Ryan** leads the country's defensemen in points, averaging 1.25 points per contest, while senior **Courtney Burke** is second, averaging 1.19 points per contest.



During Annie Pankowski's 19-game point streak, the Badgers are 18-1 and have outscored their opponents 90-10.

The Badgers have outscored their opponents by 73 goals through 16 games of the 2015-16 season. The Cardinal and White have scored 79 goals this year and are averaging 4.97 goals per game, while giving up an average of 0.38 goals per contest.

Wisconsin head coach Mark Johnson enters this weekend's series with 376 wins, the fourth-most in NCAA women's hockey history. Johnson needs 10 wins to pass former Minnesota Duluth bench boss Shannon Miller for third on the all-time list.

GET TO KNOW MARK

- Mark Johnson is in his 13th season as Wisconsin's head coach, and has led the Badgers to four national championships during his tenure.
- Johnson was a member of the 1976-77 NCAA Champion UW men's hockey team and was a two-time first-team All-American while at Wisconsin. He was named one of the WCHA's Top 50 Players in 50 Years, and is UW's all-time leading scorer with 48 single-season goals and 125 career goals.
- He played for five teams during an 11-year National Hockey League career that included an All-Star Game appearance.
- Johnson has been twice inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame – once as a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic hockey team and most recently for his individual accomplishments as a player and coach.
- The son of legendary Wisconsin coach Bob Johnson, he was named the American Hockey Coaches Association Women's Division I Coach of the Year as well as the WCHA Coach of the Year in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2011.
- Johnson was awarded the prestigious NCAA Silver Anniversary award for his accomplishments in the 25 years following the completion of collegiate competition.
- The leading scorer for the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team that won the gold medal in Lake Placid, Johnson coached in the Olympics 30 years later leading the U.S. women's hockey team to silver at the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver.
- In addition to winning four national titles at Wisconsin, Johnson has led the Badgers to four Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff titles and four WCHA regular season crowns and coached four Patty Kazmaier Award Winners. With more than 350 wins, Johnson is the winningest coach in program history.



THE SERIES VS. MINNESOTA

- The Badgers trail the all-time series with Minnesota 26-44-9. It is one of only two series that Wisconsin trails its opponent in.
- UW snapped a 14-game losing skid to the Gophers last year with a 1-1 tie in Minneapolis on Jan. 11.
- Wisconsin's last win against its Border-Battle rival was on Oct. 14, 2011 as the Badgers dispatched the Golden Gophers, 3-2.
- The two programs have combined to win nine of the past 12 NCAA titles.

THE QUEST FOR 400

- Wisconsin women's hockey head coach **Mark Johnson** enters the 2015-16 season with 360 wins, the fourth-most in NCAA women's hockey history.
- Johnson enters this weekend with a 376-74-34 record in his 13 years on the UW bench.
- The other three coaches to reach 350 wins at the NCAA Division I level are Katey Stone (Harvard), Michael Sisti (Mercyhurst) and Shannon Miller (Minnesota Duluth).
- Johnson only needs 10 wins to pass former UMD bench boss Shannon Miller for third on the all-time list.

ABOUT WISCONSIN

- The Badgers enter this weekend with a 16-0-0 record and hold first place in the WCHA standings along with both women's hockey national polls.
- Wisconsin's 16-game winning streak is the third-longest in school history ranks fifth in WCHA history (see page 4).
- UW enters the weekend leading the country in scoring defense with a goals-against average of 0.38.
- The Cardinal and White also ranks third in the country scoring offense averaging 4.94 goals per contest.
- The Badgers saw their NCAA-record nine-consecutive shutout streak snapped on Nov. 14 in their 4-2 win at UMD. The nine consecutive games without giving up a goal bested the previous NCAA women's hockey record by three games.
- The Badgers lead the NCAA in penalty killing with a .979 clip. UW has killed 46 of its 47 penalties, and has scored six short-handed goals in 16 games.
- The Cardinal and White has killed its last 41 penalties. The last power-play goal UW gave up was on Oct. 3, 2015, in a 8-1 win over Providence in San Jose, California.
- Last season, UW set the NCAA record for penalty killing with a .958 clip.
- Wisconsin leads the country in shots on goal per game, averaging 44.75 shots per contest.
- The Badgers have recorded 50 or more shots on net in their past three games, including a season-high 63 shots on goal

- The Cardinal and White are limiting its opponents to 15.31 shots on goal per contest, which leads the NCAA.
- The Badgers' shot margin of +29.44 is not only the best mark in the country, but their shot margin is more than nine shots better than second-place Minnesota (+20.25).
- **Annie Pankowski** leads the team with 11 goals and 18 assists for 29 points this season. The sophomore has a 19-game point streak, which is tied for the fifth-longest in school history (see page 6).
- Sophomore **Emily Clark** has scored a goal in six-straight games, which is the fourth-longest streak in school history.
- Clark leads the Badgers in goals with 12 this season in only 14 games played. She is tied for seventh in country in goals per game, averaging 0.86 goals per contest.
- Junior **Sarah Nurse** ranks sixth in the country goals per game, averaging 0.92 goals per contest. The Hamilton, Ontario, native also ranks second nationally in game-winning goals with four.
- **Ann-Renée Desbiens** leads the nation in save percentage (.972) and goals-against average (0.44). She also leads the country in shutouts with nine and is one of two goalies with a perfect record this season.
- Desbiens' nine shutouts ranked fifth in program history. Last season the La Malbaie, Quebec, native tied a UW record with 14 shutouts
- Desbiens also has 26 career shutouts, which ranks third in program history and is the sixth-best mark in NCAA history (see page 6).
- Junior **Jenny Ryan** leads the country's defensemen in points per game, averaging 1.25 points per contest. With her 20 points so this season, Ryan is only two points away from matching her season-high point total from last season.
- Senior **Courtney Burke** is second in the country in points among defensemen, averaging 1.19 points per contest. Her 92 career points are the fourth-most in program history among defensemen.
- Burke is seven points away from moving into 20th on the school's all-time scoring list and eight points away from becoming the third blue-liner in school history to reach 100 career points.
- Six Badgers this season are averaging 1.00 points per game or more.

- The Badgers blueliners rank second in the NCAA in scoring, averaging 4.19 points per game.

ABOUT MINNESOTA

- The Gophers enter the weekend with a 15-1-0 record and a 11-1-0 record in the WCHA.
- Minnesota leads the WCHA standings with 33 points, but the Gophers have played two more league games than Wisconsin at this point of the season.
- The Gophers lone loss of the season came at the hands of North Dakota, as the Fighting Hawks bested UM, 4-3, in Grand Forks, North Dakota.
- Minnesota enters the weekend ranked No. 3 in the polls.
- The Gophers are coming off of a sweep of Minnesota State, as Minnesota demolished the Mavericks, 11-1, on Friday before earning a 2-1 win on Saturday.
- The Golden Gophers offense is led by the trio of Dani Cameranesi (2.38 ppg), Sarah Potomak (2.36 ppg) and Hannah Brandt (2.31 ppg), as they rank No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3, respectively, in points per game.
- Potomak, who played with UW's Emily Clark and Sarah Nurse at the Four Nations Cup with Team Canada, leads all NCAA rookies in scoring.

THE NATIONS'S BEST COLLIDE

- This weekend's Border Battle will feature the country's top scoring offense against the NCAA's best scoring defense.
- The Badgers lead the NCAA in scoring defense with a 0.38 goals-against average. Minnesota is averaging 6.06 goals per game to lead the NCAA in scoring offense.
- In addition, Wisconsin has the nation's best penalty kill with a .979 clip (46/47), while Minnesota leads the country in the power play with a .490 (24/49) conversion rate.
- Both teams rank in the top four in the country in shots on goal per game, as UW is averaging 44.75 shots on goal per game, while UM is fourth, averaging 36.75 shots on net.

HOME SWEET HOME

- At LaBahn Arena, the Badgers are tough to beat, as UW is 51-10-3 (.820) at the new barn.
- The Badgers have outscored their opponents 202-62 at LaBahn Arena, and have posted 23 shutouts.
- In eight home games this year, the Badgers have outscored their opposition 39-2 at LaBahn Arena.

- Joining the Badgers next fall are goaltenders **Alyson Baldwin** (Richmond, Texas) and **Nicole Cece** (Oakville, Ontario), forwards **Alexis Mauermann** (Janesville, Wisconsin), **Presley Norby** (Shorewood, Minnesota) and **Abby Roque** (Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan) and defensemen **Maddie Rowe** (River Falls, Wisconsin) and **Mckenzie Steffen** (Centerville, Minnesota).
- Baldwin skated at the Under-18 USA National Player Development Camp. That same year Baldwin, who holds dual citizenship with Russia, was invited to skate with the Russian Women's National team prior to the 2014 Winter Olympic Games.

- Cece attended the Hockey Canada Top 44 camp with the Under-18 Team this past summer, and won bronze with Ontario Blue at the U-18 National Championships, earning Player of the Game nods in the team's game against Atlantic. In addition, Cece attended the 2015 Team Canada Summer Strength and Conditioning camp.
- Mauermann attends Shattuck St. Mary's, where she took the team to back-to-back national championships in 2013 and 2014. Through 26 games this season, she has already accumulated 13 goals and seven assists. She notched a goal and an assist as a member of the Team USA under-18 squad in its three-game series with Canada the same year in 2014. Most recently, Mauermann was selected to the U.S. U-18 team that won gold at the 2015 IIHF U-18 World Championships.
- A Minnetonka, Minnesota native, Norby has an impressive resume of hockey experience with her high school team as well as her international experience. She played on the U.S. under-18 squad in its series with Canada in 2014 and 2015, captaining the 2015 squad. Norby scored a goal and an assist at the 2015 IIHF U-18 World Championships, helping Team USA win the gold medal. Most notably, Norby suited up for the U.S. at the 2015 Four Nations Cup, helping the team win gold.
- A forward from Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, Roque brings years of Team USA experience to the ice for UW, in addition to her four seasons with the Sault Area High School boys' team. She also helped the U-18's to silver at the 2014 IIHF Women's World Championships, where she notched a goal and two assists during the tournament. At this past year's IIHF Under-18 World Championships, Roque picked up a pair of assists to help Team USA win gold.
- A native of River Falls, Wisconsin, Rowe is a 5-11 defenseman currently playing for River Falls High School. A two-time team captain, Rowe tallied 60 or more points in both her sophomore and junior seasons, leading the team in goals, assists, and points to earn first-team all-conference nods both years as well. She has skated at three USA Hockey National Player Development camps (2012, 2013, and 2014), making the All Star Team in 2014. Rowe also participated in the 2015 USA Hockey U-18 Top 66 Camp.
- Steffen, a defenseman from Centerville, Minnesota, has shined at both the prep and international levels. A member of the all-conference team her first three years, she led the Hill Murray High School team to back-to-back Minnesota State Championships in 2014 and 2015. Steffen was named to the American Family Insurance All-USA Girls Hockey Second Team during the 2014-15 season. She won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2015 Under-18 IIHF Women's World Championships.

LAST TIME VS. MINNESOTA - MINNESOTA 3, WISCONSIN 1 (3/20/15)

- Despite outshooting Minnesota 35-23, the No. 4-seeded Wisconsin women's hockey team fell 3-1 on Friday night in the semi-finals of the 2015 NCAA Frozen Four to top-seeded Minnesota at Ridder Arena.
- UW freshman **Annie Pankowski** scored the Badgers' lone goal of the game, which came 52 seconds in to the second period. It marked her 21st goal of the season and 43rd point, both team highs.
- The two teams battled in the first period, but neither could light the lamp as Wisconsin outshot Minnesota, 12-7, in the frame.
- All four of the game's goals came in the second period, as UW scored first before Minnesota rattled off three straight in the later part of the period.
- Off an offensive zone faceoff 52 seconds into the second, **Emily Clark** won the draw right to Pankowski, who snapped off a shot, beating Minnesota netminder Amanda Leveille top shelf.
- Minnesota tied the game with 11 minutes remaining the second, as Hannah Brandt scored on a scramble in front of the UW net.
- Less than two minutes later, the Golden Gophers scored again, as Maryanne Menefee tipped in a Megan Wolfe shot to take a 2-1 lead with 9:08 remaining in the period.
- After a **Brittany Ammerman** penalty, Minnesota capitalized on its first power-play chance of the game. Kelly Pannek absorbed a shot from the point and then pounced on the rebound, going top shelf to give Minnesota a 3-1 lead after two periods of play.
- The Badgers pulled **Ann-Renee Desbiens** in favor of the extra attacker with over three minutes to play, but the additional pressure wasn't enough to put another puck in the net against Leveille, who finished the game with 34 saves.

LAST TIME OUT - WISCONSIN 4, DARTMOUTH 0 (11/22/15)

- Thanks to a three-goal flurry in the second period, the undefeated and top-ranked Wisconsin women's hockey team completed its sweep of Dartmouth with a 4-0 victory on Saturday afternoon.
- **Sarah Nurse** tallied two goals, marking the seventh-time the junior has recorded a multi-goal game.
- For the sixth-straight game, sophomore **Emily Clark** tallied a goal, while freshman **Sam Cogan** rounded out the scoring for the Cardinal and White. Junior **Sydney McKibbon** tied a career high with three assists in the win, while captain **Courtney Burke** and sophomore **Annie Pankowski** each added two assists.

- Junior netminder **Ann-Renée Desbiens** saved all nine shots the Big Green threw her way to earn her ninth shutout of the season. The La Malbaie, Quebec, native now has 26 career shutouts, which ranks sixth in NCAA history.
- The Badgers (16-0-0, 10-0-0-0 WCHA) outshot Dartmouth (4-4-2, 4-1-2 ECAC) 63-9, and the Cardinal and White limited the Big Green to four shots on goal in the final 40 minutes. Wisconsin's 63 shots on goal rank sixth in program history.
- UW applied pressure earlier on Dartmouth, outshooting the Big Green 20-5 in the first frame, but both teams had a quiet period in comparison to Friday evening's game, as there were no goals or penalties in the opening period.
- It took almost 30 minutes for the UW offense to find its groove, but the Badgers would score three times in a span of 6 minutes, 12 seconds to open the game up.
- Midway through the second frame, Dartmouth's Laura Stacey took a tripping penalty to give UW the first power play of the night. Less than ten seconds into the power play, Nurse received a pass in front of Big Green goaltender Robyn Chemago and sent the snipe straight to the top shelf to give the Badgers a 1-0 lead.
- Pankowski earned a secondary assist on the game-winning goal to extend her point streak to 19 games, which is tied for the fifth-longest point streak in UW history. Pankowski has notched 33 points with 14 goals and 19 assists during the incredible run.
- Nurse would strike again a short time later, as McKibbon centered a pass from behind Chemago, where Nurse sent a rocket into the net.
- The Badgers' third score would come quickly, when Burke took a slapshot from the point that Clark tipped in for her third point of the weekend.
- Cogan would add the final goal late in the third period, tipping in Pankowski's wrist shot from the point. The score marked Wisconsin's third power-play goal of the contest.
- The Big Green went on their only power play of the game late in the final period, but were unable to send a shot past Desbiens despite the advantage.

FAMILY AFFAIR

- There are many family connections on this season's Wisconsin women's hockey team with the UW men's hockey program.
- Wisconsin redshirt junior **Mikayla Johnson** is the daughter of head coach Mark Johnson, who starred at Wisconsin from 1976-1979.
- In addition, Mikayla's brother, Patrick, played for the men's team from 2007-11. Mikayla now dons the No. 10 like her father and brother wore at Wisconsin.

2014-15 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- The Badgers won their fifth WCHA playoff title and advanced to the NCAA Frozen Four for the eighth time in 10 seasons.
- UW finished the year with a 29-7-4 record and a 19-6-3-1 WCHA ledger.
- Wisconsin head coach Mark Johnson earned his 350th win in a 4-1 Wisconsin victory against Clarkson on Jan. 25.
- **Annie Pankowski** became the first UW player to be named the National Rookie of the Year and the USCHO.Com Rookie of the year after leading UW in points with 43. She also became the first Badger freshman to pace their team in scoring since Sara Bauer accomplished the feat during the 2003-04 season.
- **Brittany Ammerman** became the first in UW women's hockey program history to be awarded the Hockey Humanitarian Award. Ammerman raised more than \$30,000 dollars for a women's soccer league she started in Kenya.
- **Jenny Ryan** became the third UW women's hockey player to receive the NCAA Elite 89 Award, which is given to the student-athlete that holds the highest grade-point average at the NCAA championship.
- **Annie Pankowski** was named the WCHA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the All-WCHA Second team, while **Blayne Turnbull** was named a All-WCHA First-Team selection. **Brittany**

Ammerman was on the second-team with Pankowski while **Karley Sylvester**, **Courtney Burke** and **Ann-Renée Desbiens** were all All-WCHA Third-Team honorees. Pankowski and **Emily Clark** also earned spots on the All-WCHA Rookie Team.

- **Brittany Ammerman** ended her career 12th on the school's all-time scoring list with points, while her 62 goals ranked 10th all-time.
- **Blayne Turnbull** ended her UW career ranked 20th on the school's all-time scoring list with 98 points. Turnbull also left UW with eight short-handed goals, which is tied for the most in program history.
- Wisconsin set the NCAA record in penalty killing with a .958 clip. UW also led the NCAA in 2014-15 with a 1.10 goals-against average.

**LABAHN ARENA**

- LaBahn Arena, opened in 2012, is the home to the Wisconsin women's hockey team along with the men's hockey and swimming and diving locker and team rooms. Women's hockey practices and competes in the 2,273-seat facility, while men's hockey practices in the arena.
- On Nov. 17 2010, the Wisconsin State Building Commission gave final approval to the multi-level, hockey and swimming competition and training facility to be constructed adjacent to the Kohl Center on the UW-Madison campus. LaBahn Arena is named after Charles (UW-Madison '49) and Mary Ann LaBahn, the lead donors for the project.
- The official ground breaking ceremony for the LaBahn Arena took place on Wednesday, May 11, 2011. The building was turned over to the UW athletic program on Oct. 1, 2012. The building dedication and first game was Oct. 19, 2012, when the Wisconsin women's hockey team hosted Bemidji State. The total cost of the project was \$27.9 million, with two-thirds of the cost coming from gifts to UW Athletics and the remainder coming from bonds.
- In its first year at LaBahn Arena, the Badgers compiled a 14-3-1 ledger and earned sweeps over Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Ohio State and two sweeps over St. Cloud State.
- The Badgers hold an 11-7-2 record against ranked opponents at LaBahn Arena.
- LaBahn Arena is a tri-level complex that includes, among other items:
 - Seating for 2,273 spectators
 - 90' by 200' ice sheet for men's and women's hockey practice and women's competition,
 - Women's hockey office suite and associated support spaces
 - Underground connection to the Kohl Center
 - A connecting skywalk to the Southeast Recreation Facility (SERF)

HEAD COACH MARK JOHNSON

13TH SEASON

With strong ties to Wisconsin hockey as a coach's son, player and assistant coach, Johnson stepped into the role of head women's hockey coach beginning with the 2002-03 season. In 12 seasons, Johnson and the Badgers have shattered both school and national records. Johnson has established Wisconsin's rank among the elite in college women's hockey. Under his direction, Wisconsin has compiled four NCAA titles, five Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff titles and four WCHA regular-season crowns. Johnson and the Badgers were the first team ever to land in the NCAA championship game in four consecutive seasons, winning the title three times (2006, 2007, 2009).

- A four-time American Hockey Coaches' Association Division I Coach of the Year, Johnson led the Badgers to their fourth national title in 2010-11 while posting a 37-2-2 record, setting a then-NCAA record for most wins in a single season. The Badgers also claimed the WCHA regular-season and playoff titles en route to winning their fourth national championship in six years.
- Four Badgers have won the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award under Johnson. Sara Bauer became UW's first award recipient in 2006, Jessie Vetter received the award in 2009, Meghan Duggan in 2011, and Brianna Decker in 2012.
- In 2005-06, Wisconsin debuted at No. 1 and went on to validate that distinction with a 36-4-1 record and a national championship. As an encore in 2006-07, the team successfully defended all three championships while posting a 36-1-4 record.
- Johnson guided the 2010 U.S. Olympic team to the silver medal at the XXI Olympic Winter Games in Vancouver, British Columbia. The U.S. fell to Canada, 2-0, in the gold medal game after outscoring its opponents 40-2 in the first four games of the tournament.
- In his playing career at Wisconsin, Johnson helped the Badgers to the 1977 NCAA Championship during his freshman campaign. The first Badger ever to win WCHA Rookie of the Year honors, he went on to become the school's second all-time leading scorer with 256 points on a school-record 125 goals and 131 assists in just three seasons
- Johnson represented USA Hockey as a player in 13 international tournaments. Most notably, he led the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team's gold medal-winning effort with 11 points, including two goals in the "Miracle On Ice" against the Soviet Union and an assist on the game-winning goal against Finland in the final contest.
- During his 11-year NHL career, Johnson collected 203 goals, 305 assists and 508 points, highlighted by his 87-point season as the captain of the Hartford Whalers in 1983-84. He also tied an NHL All-Star Game record with three assists that season.
- Johnson is the son of legendary coach Bob Johnson. Bob coached Wisconsin to three national titles and led the United States at the 1976 Olympics, three Canada Cups (1981, 1984, 1987) and four IIHF Men's World Championships (1973-75, 1981). He went on to coach the NHL's Calgary Flames for five seasons (1982-87) and led the Pittsburgh Penguins to the Stanley Cup title in 1991 before passing away from brain cancer that fall.


