NOTES DU JOUR

JUST A FRESHMAN? - Freshman guard Devin Harris has been the Badgers' most consistent player through four games. He leads the club in scoring (16.8 ppg) and minutes played (35.2). Harris has scored in double figures in each of Wisconsin's first four contests and paced the UW in scoring in three of those games. His 11 three-pointers made are tied for second in the Big Ten and his 90 percent shooting from the free throw line (18-20) is tied for fifth in the conference.

HEATING UP IN HAWAII - Sophomore guard Freddie Owens has emerged as one of the Badgers' top offensive threats. In three games in the City Bank/Aloha Airlines Big Island Basketball Invitational, Owens averaged 12.0 points in 25.3 minutes a game off the bench. He made 15-31 field goals and scored a career-high 15 points against Weber State. His 10.5 points per game are second-best on the team.

YEAR THREE - This is the third year of the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Wisconsin is 1-1 in the event, having lost 67-48 at Wake Forest in 1999 and defeating Maryland 78-75 in overtime at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee last year. The Maryland game was also the final game of former head coach Dick Bennett's career as he resigned the next day.

ON THE SIDELINES

WISCONSIN'S BO RYAN - In his 18th season as a head coach, his first at Wisconsin ... career record of 384-106 (.785) is fourth-best among active Division I coaches with at least 10 seasons ... coached last two seasons at UW-Milwaukee (30-27, .526) ... coached 15 years at UW-Platteville, winning four Division III national titles ... winningest college coach of the 1990's (all divisions) with a 266-26 (.908) record ... all-time winningest coach in Division III history (353-76, .822).

GEORGIA TECH'S PAUL HEWITT - In his second season at Georgia Tech and sixth overall as a head coach ... led the Yellow Jackets to the NCAA tournament and a 17-13 record last year ... spent four seasons as head coach at Siena, leading the Saints to two postseason (one NCAA, one NIT) berths.

GEORGIA TECH NOTES

- The Yellow Jackets lost two of three at the Las Vegas Invitational last week, beating Eastern Illinois but falling to Illinois and Saint Louis.
- Guards Tony Akins and Marvin Lewis lead the Jackets in scoring, each netting 15.0 points per contest.
- Georgia Tech is 0-2 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, losing to Michigan in 1999 and Iowa last season.
- The two teams have met once previously, a 104-84 UW victory in the Milwaukee Classic on Dec. 28, 1963.

TEAM NOTES

BENCH STRENGTH - Two of the Badgers top four scorers are coming off the bench. Sophomore guard Freddie Owens is averaging 10.5 points per game, second on the squad. Freshman forward Mike Wilkinson's 9.5 points is tied for fourth on UW. Wilkinson and Owens are averaging 28.8 and 24.0 minutes per game, respectively.

CAREER HIGHS - Through four games, six Badgers have set or tied career highs in points. Senior Travon Davis (11 points) and freshman Devin Harris (20) set personal bests in Wisconsin's opener at UNLV. Against Hawaii-Hilo, freshman Neil Plank scored the first points of his college career while senior Charlie Wills matched his career best with 15. In the UW's loss to Weber State, sophomore Freddie Owens (15) and freshman Mike Wilkinson (12) came off the bench to score career highs.

LOGGING SERIOUS MINUTES - Six Badgers are averaging at least 24 minutes a game this season. Devin Harris leads the team at 35.2 minutes per game, while Travon Davis is at 31.8. Mike Wilkinson and Kirk Penney are averaging 28.8 and 28.3 minutes, respectively. Charlie Wills is playing 27.5 minutes per contest and Freddie Owens is averaging 24.0 minutes per game off the bench. Seven of the Badgers' top eight players have established new career highs for minutes played this season.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME - Wisconsin is at the end of a five-game stretch away from home to open the season. The Badgers kicked off the season in Las Vegas against UNLV on Nov. 17. The next day the team flew to Hawaii and played three games in the Big Island Basketball Invitational on Nov. 23-25. The majority of the team flew back to Madison Sunday night and arrived home Monday evening. The UW is then departing for Atlanta on Tuesday afternoon for its Wednesday night game against Georgia Tech.

CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR - The Badgers' three losses this season have been by a combined 12 points. The UW opened the season with a 74-69 loss at UNLV. In the Big Island Invitational, Wisconsin lost to Weber State by four points (73-69) and Hawaii by three (60-57).

HAWAII RECAP - Wisconsin went 1-2 in last weekend's City Bank/Aloha Airlines Big Island Invitational. The Badgers defeated host Hawaii-Hilo 78-62 in the opener then lost to Weber State, 73-69, and Hawaii, 60-57, to finish fourth. Freshman Devin Harris averaged 15.7 points in the three games.

HELMIGK OUT - Freshman forward Andreas Helmigk tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in preseason practice and will miss the entire 2001-02 season. Surgery is scheduled for late November. Helmigk's injury leaves the Badgers with just eight healthy scholarship players.

THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER - New Zealand native Kirk Penney is Wisconsin's lone returning starter. The junior was the second-leading scorer on the team a year ago, averaging 11.2 points. He led the Big Ten in three-point shooting during conference games (.478).

Game Summary

Hawaii outscored Wisconsin 7-2 in a span of 3:44 late in the second half and went on to beat the Badgers 60-57 in the third-place game of the Big Island Basketball Invitational in Hilo, Hawaii. The UW held its last lead, 47-46, with 6:58 left in the game. The Rainbow Warriors then scored seven of the next nine points and held on for the victory. Freshman Devin Harris led the Badgers in scoring for the third time in four games, netting 15 points, all in the first half. Point guard Travon Davis pulled down a career-high seven rebounds to tie Mike Wilkinson for team-high honors.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP - Seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills were named co-captains prior to the season.

CAL WHO? - Senior Charlie Wills has never missed a game (101 straight) in his UW career.

NO GIMMES - After having the third-toughest schedule in the country last year according to the Sagarin ratings, the Badgers face another tough slate in 2001-02. In addition to the always-grueling Big Ten schedule, Wisconsin travels to UNLV, Xavier, Georgia Tech, Ohio and UW-Milwaukee while hosting Temple, Tennessee, Marquette, UW-Green Bay and Furman.

EXPERIENCE LOST - Five seniors from last year's team have departed, including four starters. Those seniors accounted for 65 percent of the team's minutes played, 64 percent of the points, 61 percent of the rebounds and 74 percent of the assists last season. They also led the Badgers to three NCAA tournament appearances, including the 2000 Final Four.

EXPERIENCE GAINED? - Seven of the 15 players on the Badgers' roster are freshmen. Nine of Wisconsin's players never played in a college game prior to this season. Travon Davis, Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are the only UW players to average more than five minutes per game last season.

scoring in three of four games this year ... led the Badgers with 20 points, including five three-pointers, against UNLV ... first freshman to start a season-opener at UW since Mike Kelley in 1997 ... second-most points in Badger history by a freshman in a season-opener ... 18-20 (.900) from the free throw line, including 16 in a row ... has just seven turnovers in a team-high 141 minutes this year ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year.

DAVE MADER, SO., C - Biggest player on the Badgers' roster at 6-11, 240 pounds ... has started every game and played career-best 20 minutes against Weber State ... averaging 4.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in 15.0 minutes a game ... appeared in 17 games as a redshirt freshman a year ago.

FREDDIE OWENS, SO., G - Team's second-leading scorer (10.5 ppg) coming off the bench ... averaged 12.0 points and 25.3 minutes in three games at the Big Island Basketball Invitational ... scored a career-high 15 against Weber State ... played in 18 games as a true freshman.

KIRK PENNEY, JR., G - Badgers' only returning starter from a year ago ... averaging 10.0 points ... has hit at least one three-pointer in 20 of last 21 games ... third on the team with 4.8 rebounds per game ... was second on the squad in scoring last year, averaging 11.2 points per game ... led the Big Ten in three-point shooting in conference games (.478) ... his 70 three-pointers last year were sixth-most in school history ... leading scorer (14.8 ppg) on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team ... also a member of the New Zealand Olympic team in 2000 ... one of 35 players to have played in the Final Four and the Olympics in the same year.

NEIL PLANK, FR., G/F - Scored five points, including a three-pointer, in the first half against Hilo ... averaging 10.0 minutes off the bench ... first-team all-state selection in Illinois ... has two prep teammates playing in Division I (Matt McCollom - Ball State and Jake Sans - Indiana State).

MIKE WILKINSON, FR., F - Averaging 28.8 minutes and 9.5 points off the bench ... 6.0 rebounds per contest are second-best on the team ... scored career-high 12 points against Weber State ... has grabbed seven boards in each of the last two games ... redshirted last season ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year in 2000.

CHARLIE WILLS, SR., F - Team captain ... most experienced player on UW roster ... has played in every game during his career (101 straight) ... has started 33 of those games ... matched career high with 15 points against Hawaii-Hilo ... tied career high with 10 rebounds vs. UNLV ... leading rebounder on the team (7.5 rebounds per game) and tied for fifth in the Big Ten ... team was 9-0 last season when he started ... averaged 18.0 minutes and 4.2 points a year ago ... part of the Big Ten Foreign Tour team that went 6-0 this past summer ... averaged 10.5 points and team-best 8.0 rebounds per game during preseason ... engaged to be married (Nancy).

BY THE NUMBERS

7 - The Badgers have seven freshmen on their roster. In addition, they have a total of nine players who never played a collegiate game prior to this season. One of those players, freshman forward Andreas Helmigk, is out for the year with a knee injury.

8 - Wisconsin has just eight healthy scholarship players entering this season. Helmigk tore the ACL in his left knee during preseason practice, freshman guard Latrell Fleming was diagnosed with a heart condition prior to preseason drills and sophomore Julian Swartz left school for personal reasons.

9 - Wisconsin has earned nine postseason invitations in the last 13 years. Including last season's NCAA Tournament appearance, the Badgers have gone to the "Big Dance" in four of the last five seasons.
