NOTES DU JOUR

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME - After starting the season with five games away from the Kohl Center, Wisconsin finally returns to Madison for its homeopener Saturday afternoon against UW-Green Bay. The Badgers kicked off the season at UNLV on Nov. 17 then traveled to Hawaii for the Big Island Invitational. The UW played three games in Hilo (Nov. 23-25) then returned to Madison for less than 24 hours before heading to Atlanta to play Georgia Tech on Wednesday night. Thursday was the first time the Badgers practiced on the arena floor at the Kohl Center since Nov. 14.

CLOSE CALLS - Despite a 1-4 record, Wisconsin is still outscoring its opponents this season, 66.8-66.2. That's because the Badgers four losses have been by a combined 13 points. The UW fell to UNLV by five (74-69), Weber State by four (73-69), Hawaii by three (60-57) and Georgia Tech by one (62-61).

STATE PRIDE - The Badgers' game against UW-Green Bay marks the first of three for the UW against in-state Division I opponents. Wisconsin hosts Marquette on Dec. 22 then travels to UW-Milwaukee on Dec. 27. The Badgers have swept their state rivals in each of the last two seasons, last year defeating UW-Green Bay 61-53, UW-Milwaukee 55-47 and Marquette 52-47.

ON THE SIDELINES

WISCONSIN'S BO RYAN - In his 18th season as a head coach, his first at Wisconsin ... career record of 384-107 (.782) is fourth-best among active Division I coaches with at least 10 seasons ... coached last two seasons at UW-Milwaukee (30-27, .526) ... coached 15 years at UW-Platteville, winning four Division III national titles ... winningest college coach of the 1990's (all divisions) with a 266-26 (.908) record ... all-time winningest coach in Division III history (353-76, .822).

UW-GREEN BAY'S MIKE HEIDEMAN - In his 11th season as a head coach, his seventh at UW-Green Bay ... career record of 168-102 (.622) ... led the Phoenix to the 1996 NCAA Tournament in his first season.

UW-GREEN BAY NOTES

- ▶ UW-Green Bay is 1-3 this season, coming off a home win against Chicago State (78-62) on Tuesday.
- ► Senior guard DeVante Blanks leads the Phoenix with 13.5 points per game while averaging 35.0 minutes.
- ▶ Wisconsin leads the series 7-0 with six of those victories coming in Madison. The first time the teams met, Dec. 6, 1980, resulted in a 68-66 double-overtime win for the Badgers.

TEAM NOTES

CAREER HIGHS - Through five games, seven Badgers have set or tied career highs in points. Freshman Devin Harris (20) set a personal best in Wisconsin's opener at UNLV. Against Hawaii-Hilo, freshman Neil Plank scored the first points (five) of his college career while senior Charlie Wills matched his career best with 15. In the UW's loss to Weber State, sophomore Freddie Owens (15) and freshman Mike Wilkinson (12) came off the bench to score career highs. Wednesday against Georgia Tech, senior Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points while freshman Clayton Hanson lit the scoreboard for the first time, draining a three-pointer.

LOGGING SERIOUS MINUTES - Six Badgers are averaging at least 23 minutes a game this season. Devin Harris leads the team at 35.8 minutes per game, while Travon Davis is at 32.0. Kirk Penney and Mike Wilkinson are averaging 28.6 and 27.6 minutes, respectively. Charlie Wills is playing 27.0 minutes per contest and Freddie Owens is averaging 23.2 minutes per game off the bench. Seven of the Badgers' top eight players have established career highs for minutes played this season.

FAMILIAR FOE - Wisconsin head coach Bo Ryan squared off against UW-Green Bay five times in his two seasons at UW-Milwaukee. Ryan's UWM teams held a 3-2 advantage in those games. Both teams were members of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference.

BALANCING ACT - Six players are averaging at least seven points a game for the Badgers. Devin Harris and Kirk Penney are averaging in double figures (14.8 and 10.8, respectively). Mike Wilkinson is contributing 9.8 points off the bench while Travon Davis checks in at 9.2 points per game. Freddie Owens is averaging 8.6 points and Charlie Wills is at 7.6.

PRIME TIME PERFORMER - Senior point guard Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points and equalled his career best with seven assists in the Badgers game at Georgia Tech on Wednesday. He also led the UW with six rebounds, one shy of his personal best. Davis is currently fourth in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0) and sixth in assists (4.4 apg.)

MARKSMEN - Both Travon Davis and Devin Harris are among the conference leaders in free throw percentage. Harris has connected on 18 of his 21 attempts (.857), good for seventh in the Big Ten. Davis is 16-20 from the line (.800), tied for 13th. Davis was a career 50 percent free throw shooter (42-84) entering this year.

FOR STARTERS - The Badgers have used the same starting lineup for all five games this season, tipping off with seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills, junior Kirk Penney, sophomore Dave Mader and freshman Devin Harris.

HELMIGK OUT - Freshman forward Andreas Helmigk tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in preseason practice and will miss the entire 2001-02 season. Surgery is scheduled for late November. Helmigk's injury leaves the Badgers with just eight healthy scholarship players entering the season.

Game Summary

Georgia Tech rallied from a 20-point, secondhalf deficit to beat Wisconsin 62-61 on a pair of free throws by Halston Lane with 14 seconds remaining. The Badgers used a 32-11 run over the final 9:04 of the first half and first 4:01 of the second to build the 20-point cushion. They scored only 10 points over the final 15:59, allowing Tech to come back. THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER - New Zealand native Kirk Penney is Wisconsin's lone returning starter. The junior was the second-leading scorer on the team a year ago, averaging 11.2 points. He led the Big Ten in three-point shooting during conference games (.478).

SENIOR LEADERSHIP - Seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills were named co-captains prior to the season.

CAL WHO? - Senior Charlie Wills has never missed a game (102 straight) in his UW career.

NO GIMMES - After having the third-toughest schedule in the country last year according to the Sagarin ratings, the Badgers face another tough slate in 2001-02. In addition to the always-grueling Big Ten schedule, Wisconsin travels to UNLV, Xavier, Georgia Tech, Ohio and UW-Milwaukee while hosting Temple, Tennessee, Marquette, UW-Green Bay and Furman.

EXPERIENCE LOST - Five seniors from last year's team have departed, including four starters. Those seniors accounted for 65 percent of the team's minutes played, 64 percent of the points, 61 percent of the rebounds and 74 percent of the assists last season. They also led the Badgers to three NCAA tournament appearances, including the 2000 Final Four.

EXPERIENCE GAINED? - Seven of the 15 players on the Badgers' roster are freshmen. Nine of Wisconsin's players never played in a college game prior to this season. Travon Davis, Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are the only UW players to average more than five minutes per game last season.

PLAYER POINTS

TRAVON DAVIS, SR., G - Team captain ... one of just two seniors on the team ... has appeared in 74 games, backing up four-year starter and Wooden Award finalist Mike Kelley at point guard for three seasons ... scored a careerhigh 14 points (all in the first half) at Georgia Tech ... dished out a career-best seven assists (with just one turnover) against Hawaii-Hilo, then tied that with seven against the Yellow Jackets ... career-high seven rebounds in personal-best 36 minutes against Hawaii ... fourth in Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0) and sixth in assists (4.4 apg.) ... 4.8 rebounds is third on the team ... has played in seven NCAA tournament games in his career.

CLAYTON HANSON, FR., G - Scored first points of his career at Georgia Tech, hitting a three-pointer in the first half ... saw first collegiate action against Hawaii-Hilo ... good three-point shooter ... averaged 28.7 points per game as a senior in high school last year, earning *Capital Times* Player of the Year honors.

DEVIN HARRIS, FR., G - Leading scorer for the Badgers (14.8 ppg), 11th in the conference ...12 three-pointers made are tied for second in the conference ... ranked in the top 15 in the conference in scoring, free throw percentage, three-point percentage, three-point percentage, three-pointers made, blocked shots and steals ... scored in double figures in four of Wisconsin's five games ... led the Badgers with 20 points, including five three-pointers, against UNLV ... first freshman to start a season-opener at UW since Mike Kelley in 1997 ... second-most points (20) in Badger history by a freshman in a season-opener ... 18-21 (.857) from the free throw line, including 16 of last 17 ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year.

DAVE MADER, SO., C - Biggest player on the Badgers' roster at 6-11, 240 pounds ... has started every game and played career-best 20 minutes against Weber State ... averaging 3.2 points and 3.0 rebounds in 14.2 minutes a game ... appeared in 17 games as a redshirt freshman a year ago.

FREDDIE OWENS, SO., G - Averaging 8.6 points in 23.2 minutes off the bench ... averaged 12.0 points and 25.3 minutes in three games at the Big Island

KIRK PENNEY, JR., G - Badgers' only returning starter from a year ago ... averaging 10.8 points ... has hit at least one three-pointer in 21 of last 22 games ... 14 points and four assists against Georgia Tech ... was second on the squad in scoring last year, averaging 11.2 points per game ... led the Big Ten in three-point shooting in conference games (.478) ... his 70 three-pointers last year were sixthmost in school history ... leading scorer (14.8 ppg) on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team ... also a member of the New Zealand Olympic team in 2000 ... one of 35 players to have played in the Final Four and the Olympics in the same year.

NEIL PLANK, FR., G/F - Scored five points, including a three-pointer, in the first half against Hilo ... hit a three-pointer and 1-2 free throws against Georgia Tech ... averaging 10.2 minutes off the bench ... first-team all-state selection in Illinois ... has two prep teammates playing in Division I (Matt McCollom - Ball State and Jake Sans - Indiana State).

MIKE WILKINSON, FR., F - Averaging 27.6 minutes and 9.8 points off the bench ... 5.4 rebounds per contest are second-best on the team ... scored careerhigh 12 points against Weber State ... has scored between eight and 12 points in each of the Badgers' five games ... redshirted last season ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year in 2000.

CHARLIE WILLS, SR., F - Team captain ... most experienced player on UW roster ... has played in every game during his career (102 straight) ... has started 34 of those games ... matched career high with 15 points against Hawaii-Hilo ... tied career high with 10 rebounds vs. UNLV ... leading rebounder on the team (6.4 rebounds per game) and 11th in the Big Ten ... team was 9-0 last season when he started ... averaged 18.0 minutes and 4.2 points a year ago ... part of the Big Ten Foreign Tour team that went 6-0 this past summer ... averaged 10.5 points and team-best 8.0 rebounds per game during preseason ... engaged to be married (Nancy).

BY THE NUMBERS

- 3's Wisconsin made nine three-pointers in 18 attempts in the first half against Georgia Tech. Both those numbers were third-most in school history.
- 3.3 The UW's four losses have come by an average of 3.3 points per game.
- 7 The Badgers have seven freshmen on their roster. In addition, they have a total of nine players who never played a collegiate game prior to this season. One of those players, freshman forward Andreas Helmigk, is out for the year with a knee injury.
- 8 Wisconsin has just eight healthy scholarship players entering the 2001-02 season. Helmigk tore the ACL in his left knee during preseason practice, freshman guard Latrell Fleming was diagnosed with a heart condition prior to preseason drills and sophomore Julian Swartz left school for personal reasons.
- 9 Wisconsin has earned nine postseason invitations in the last 13 years. Including last season's NCAA Tournament appearance, the Badgers have gone to the "Big Dance" in four of the last five seasons.
- 13 The UW has just 13 home games this season. Tomorrow's game against UW-Green Bay is one of just five non-conference games at the Kohl Center this year.
- 18 The Badgers won 18 regular-season games last season for just the third time in school history. Wisconsin has won at least 18 games in four of the last

five years (after doing so just four times prior to 1995).

- 21 Freshman Devin Harris has sat out just 21 minutes through the Badgers' first five games. He is averaging 35.8 minutes per game and has played at least 37 minutes in each of the last three games.
- 62 The UW's 62 wins over the last three seasons are fourth-best among Big Ten teams over that stretch. Only Michigan State (93), Ohio State (70) and Indiana (64) have more victories than Wisconsin.
- 34 Travon Davis and Devin Harris have combined to make 34 free throws (in 41 attempts) through five games. The rest of the UW team has made 35 (59 attempts).
- .500 Wisconsin finished fifth in the Big Ten with a 9-7 record. That marked the third consecutive season the Badgers finished with a .500 or better record in conference play (9-7 in 1999, 8-8 in 2000). That hadn't happened in Madison since 1942-44.
- .600 The UW finished the 2000-01 season with a .600-or-better winning percentage for the third consecutive season. That had not happened for the Badgers since 1928-30.
