NOTES DU JOUR

HOME COOKING - In its home-opener Saturday vs. UW-Green Bay, Wisconsin shot a season-best 54.9 percent (28-51) from the field and 76.9 percent (10-13) from the free throw line. In addition, the Badgers held UWGB to 57 points and 22 field goals, both season lows for a UW opponent. Wisconsin also outrebounded the Phoenix 35-23, tying the Badger's largest rebounding margin this season.

SPREADING THE WEALTH - Five Badgers (Kirk Penney, Charlie Wills, Freddie Owens, Devin Harris and Mike Wilkinson) scored at least 11 points in Wisconsin's win over UW-Green Bay on Saturday. That's the first time the UW has accomplished that feat since Dec. 28, 1995 when Wisconsin beat Eastern Illinois 105-70 in the UW Field House. Jeremy Hall (19), Sean Mason (18), Sam Okey (17), Sean Daugherty (13), Hennssy Auriantal (11) and Osita Nwachukwu (11) all scored at least 11 points for the Badgers that day.

FAMILIAR FOES - This is the seventh consecutive season in which Wisconsin and Temple will square off. The Badgers have won five of the previous six meetings with the Owls, including two out of three in Madison. The UW won last year's game, 66-58, in Philadelphia. Wisconsin leads the all-time series between the teams 5-2 as Temple defeated the Badgers 82-80 in 1967.

ON THE SIDELINES

WISCONSIN'S BO RYAN - In his 18th season as a head coach, his first at Wisconsin ... career record of 385-107 (.783) is fourth-best among active Division I coaches with at least 10 seasons ... coached last two seasons at UW-Milwaukee (30-27, .526) ... coached 15 years at UW-Platteville, winning four Division III national titles ... winningest college coach of the 1990's (all divisions) with a 266-26 (.908) record ... all-time winningest coach in Division III history (353-76, .822).

TEMPLE'S JOHN CHANEY - In his 20th year as Temple's head coach, his 30th overall ... 17th on the NCAA's all-time wins list and seventh among active coaches with 658 career victories ... has led Temple to 18 straight postseason appearances, including 12 consecutive NCAA tournaments ... inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame on Oct. 5, 2001.

TEMPLE NOTES

► Temple is 2-2 this season and coming off consecutive home wins over Charlotte and Penn State.

► Senior guard Lynn Greer, a member of Team USA in the 2001 World University Games, leads four double-figure scorers for the Owls with 23.2 points per game. He has played every minute thus far this season after averaging 39.6 minutes last season.

► The Owls have five players averaging at least 26 minutes per game and four averaging more than 30.

TEAM NOTES

STATE PRIDE - The Badgers kicked off their three-game set against in-state, Division I opponents with a 70-57 win over UW-Green Bay on Saturday. Wisconsin hosts Marquette on Dec. 22 then travels to UW-Milwaukee on Dec. 27. The Badgers have swept their state rivals in each of the last two seasons, last year defeating UW-Green Bay 61-53, UW-Milwaukee 55-47 and Marquette 52-47.

QUICK STARTS - Wisconsin has held the lead at halftime in four of its last five games. The Badgers are outscoring their opponents by an average of 16 points and have connected on 48.1 percent (26-54) of their shots in the opening 20 minutes of their last two games.

CLOSE CALLS - Despite a 2-4 record, Wisconsin is still outscoring its opponents this season, 67.3-64.7. That's because the Badgers' four losses have been by a combined 13 points. The UW fell to UNLV by five (74-69), Weber State by four (73-69), Hawaii by three (60-57) and Georgia Tech by one (62-61).

BALANCING ACT - Six players are averaging at least eight points a game for the Badgers. Three players, Devin Harris (14.2), Kirk Penney (11.5) and Mike Wilkinson (10.0) are averaging in double figures. Freddie Owens is contributing 9.2 points off the bench while seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills are at 8.3 and 8.0 points per game, respectively.

MARKSMEN - Both Travon Davis and Devin Harris are among the conference leaders in free throw percentage. Harris has connected on 22 of his 25 attempts (.880), good for seventh in the Big Ten. Davis is 16-20 from the line (.800), tied for 13th. Davis was a career 50 percent free throw shooter (42-84) entering this year.

HELP OFF THE BENCH - Sophomore Freddie Owens and freshman Mike Wilkinson are providing the Badgers with a spark off the bench this season. Wilkinson is third on the team in scoring with 10.0 points per game while Owens is fourth with 9.2. They are averaging 27.0 and 24.0 minutes, respectively.

CAREER HIGHS - This season, seven Badgers have set or tied career highs in points. Freshman Devin Harris (20) set a personal best in Wisconsin's opener at UNLV. Against Hawaii-Hilo, freshman Neil Plank scored the first points (five) of his college career while senior Charlie Wills matched his career best with 15. In the UW's loss to Weber State, sophomore Freddie Owens (15) and freshman Mike Wilkinson (12) came off the bench to score career highs. Wednesday against Georgia Tech, senior Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points while freshman Clayton Hanson lit the scoreboard for the first time, draining a three-pointer.

LOGGING SERIOUS MINUTES - Six Badgers are averaging at least 24 minutes a game this season. Devin Harris leads the team at 34.3 minutes per game, while Travon Davis is at 30.8. Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are averaging 28.5 and 28.2 minutes, respectively. Mike Wilkinson and Freddie Owens are coming off the bench to average 27.0 and 24.0 minutes, respectively. Badgers' top eight players have established career highs for minutes played this season.

PRIME TIME PERFORMER - Senior point guard Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points and equalled his career best with seven assists in the Badgers game at Georgia Tech on Wednesday. He also led the UW with six rebounds, one shy of his personal best. Davis is currently fourth in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.0) and sixth in assists (4.4 apg.)

FOR STARTERS - The Badgers have used the same starting lineup for all six games this season, tipping off with seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills, junior Kirk Penney, sophomore Dave Mader and freshman Devin Harris.

HELMIGK OUT - Freshman forward Andreas Helmigk tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in preseason practice and will miss the entire 2001-02 season. Surgery is scheduled for late November. Helmigk's injury leaves the Badgers with just eight healthy scholarship players entering the season.

THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER - New Zealand native Kirk Penney is Wisconsin's lone returning starter. The junior was the second-leading scorer on the team a year ago, averaging 11.2 points. He led the Big Ten in three-point shooting during conference games (.478).

SENIOR LEADERSHIP - Seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills were named co-captains prior to the season.

CAL WHO? - Senior Charlie Wills has never missed a game (102 straight) in his UW career.

NO GIMMES - After having the third-toughest schedule in the country last year according to the Sagarin ratings, the Badgers face another tough slate in 2001-02. In addition to the always-grueling Big Ten schedule, Wisconsin travels to UNLV, Xavier, Georgia Tech, Ohio and UW-Milwaukee while hosting Temple, Tennessee, Marquette, UW-Green Bay and Furman.

EXPERIENCE LOST - Five seniors from last year's team have departed, including four starters. Those seniors accounted for 65 percent of the team's minutes played, 64 percent of the points, 61 percent of the rebounds and 74 percent of the assists last season. They also led the Badgers to three NCAA tournament appearances, including the 2000 Final Four.

EXPERIENCE GAINED? - Seven of the 15 players on the Badgers' roster are freshmen. Nine of Wisconsin's players never played in a college game prior to this season. Travon Davis, Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are the only UW players to average more than five minutes per game last season.

PLAYER POINTS

TRAVON DAVIS, SR., G - Team captain ... one of just two seniors on the team ... has appeared in 75 games, backing up four-year starter and Wooden Award finalist Mike Kelley at point guard for three seasons ... scored a career-high 14 points (all in the first half) at Georgia Tech ... dished out a career-best seven assists (with just one turnover) against Hawaii-Hilo, then tied that with seven against the Yellow Jackets ... career-high seven rebounds in personal-best 36 minutes against Hawaii ... fourth in Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.92) and sixth in assists (3.8 apg.) ... 4.3 rebounds is fourth on the team ... has played in seven NCAA tournament games in his career.

CLAYTON HANSON, FR., G - Scored first points of his career at Georgia Tech, hitting a three-pointer in the first half ... saw first collegiate action against Hawaii-Hilo ... good three-point shooter ... averaged 28.7 points per game as a senior in high school last year, earning *Capital Times* Player of the Year honors.

DEVIN HARRIS, FR., G - Leading scorer for the Badgers (14.2 ppg), 11th in the conference ... 13 three-pointers made are tied for second in the conference ... ranked in the top 15 in the conference in scoring, free throw percentage, three-point percentage, three-pointers made, blocked shots and steals ... scored in double figures in five of Wisconsin's six games ... led the Badgers with 20 points, including five three-pointers, against UNLV ... first freshman to start a season-opener at UW since Mike Kelley in 1997 ... second-most points (20) in Badger history by a freshman in a season-opener ... 22-25 (.880) from the free throw line, including 20 of last 21 ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year.

DAVE MADER, SO., C - Biggest player on the Badgers' roster at 6-11, 240 pounds ... has started every game and played career-best 20 minutes against Weber State and UW-Green Bay ... averaging 3.5 points and 2.8 rebounds in 15.2 minutes a game ... appeared in 17 games as a redshirt freshman a year ago.

FREDDIE OWENS, SO., G - Averaging 9.2 points in 24.0 minutes off the bench ... scored in double figures in four of the last five games ... 6-7 from the field vs. UWGB ... has connected on 24-43 (.558) two-point shots this season ... averaged 12.0 points and 25.3 minutes in three games at the Big Island Basketball Invitational ... scored a career-high 15 against Weber State ... played in 18 games as a true freshman.

KIRK PENNEY, JR., G - Badgers' only returning starter from a year ago ... averaging 11.5 points ... has hit at least one three-pointer in 22 of last 23 games ... led Badgers with 15 points and added career-high tying seven rebounds against UW-Green Bay ... 5.0 rebounds per game, third-best on the team ... has made 5-9 three-pointers in last three games ... was second on the squad in scoring last year, averaging 11.2 points per game ... led the Big Ten in three-point shooting in conference games (.478) ... his 70 three-pointers last year were sixth-most in school history ... leading scorer (14.8 ppg) on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team ... also a member of the New Zealand Olympic team in 2000 ... one of 35 players to have played in the Final Four and the Olympics in the same year.

NEIL PLANK, FR., G/F - Scored five points, including a three-pointer, in the first half against Hilo ... hit a three-pointer and 1-2 free throws against Georgia Tech ... averaging 10.2 minutes off the bench ... first-team all-state selection in Illinois ... has two prep teammates playing in Division I (Matt McCollom - Ball State and Jake Sans - Indiana State).

MIKE WILKINSON, FR., F - Averaging 27.0 minutes and 10.0 points off the bench ... 5.5 rebounds per contest are second-best on the team ... scored career-high 12 points against Weber State ... three double-digit scoring efforts this season ... has scored between eight and 12 points in each of the Badgers' six games ... redshirted last season ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year in 2000.

CHARLIE WILLS, SR., F - Team captain ... most experienced player on UW roster ... has played in every game during his career (103 straight) ... has started 35 of those games ... matched career high with 15 points against Hawaii-Hilo ... tied career high with 10 rebounds vs. UNLV ... leading rebounder on the team (6.8 rebounds per game) and 11th in the Big Ten ... team was 9-0 last season when he started ... averaged 18.0 minutes and 4.2 points a year ago ... part of the Big Ten Foreign Tour team that went 6-0 this past summer ... engaged to be married (Nancy).

7 - The Badgers have seven freshmen on their roster. In addition, they have a total of nine players who never played a collegiate game prior to this season. One of those players, freshman forward Andreas Helmigk, is out for the year with a knee injury.

8 - Wisconsin has just eight healthy scholarship players entering the 2001-02 season. Helmigk tore the ACL in his left knee during preseason practice, freshman guard Latrell Fleming was diagnosed with a heart condition prior to preseason drills and sophomore Julian Swartz left school for personal reasons.

9 - Wisconsin has earned nine postseason invitations in the last 13 years. Including last season's NCAA Tournament appearance, the Badgers have gone to the "Big Dance" in four of the last five seasons.

13 - The UW has just 13 home games this season. Monday's game against Temple is one of just five non-conference games at the Kohl Center this year.

18 - The Badgers won 18 regular-season games last season for just the third time in school history. Wisconsin has won at least 18 games in four of the last five years (after doing so just four times prior to 1995).

35 - Wisconsin has won 35 of its last 42 games at the Kohl Center, an .833 winning percentage. Overall, the Badgers are 37-12 in the Kohl Center since it opened in 1998.

38 - Travon Davis and Devin Harris have combined to make 38 free throws (in 45 attempts) through six games. The rest of the UW team has made 41 (68 attempts).

62 - The UW's 62 wins over the last three seasons are fourth-best among Big Ten teams over that stretch. Only Michigan State (93), Ohio State (70) and Indiana (64) have more victories than Wisconsin.

.500 - Wisconsin finished fifth in the Big Ten with a 9-7 record. That marked the third consecutive season the Badgers finished with a .500 or better record in conference play (9-7 in 1999, 8-8 in 2000). That hadn't happened in Madison since 1942-44.
