## NOTES DU JOUR

CLOSE CALLS - Despite a 2-5 record, Wisconsin is outscoring its opponents 67.3-65.4. That's because the Badgers' five losses have come by a combined 16 points. Each of the UW's losses have come by five points or less and the Badgers have held a second-half lead in four of those contests. Wisconsin lost by five points at UNLV, by four to Weber State, by three to both Hawaii and Temple, and by one at Georgia Tech.

DOUBLE THREAT - Freshman Devin Harris recorded the first "double-double" of his career Monday night against Temple, registering career highs in both points (21) and rebounds (13). It was the first "double-double" by a Badger this season and the first since Andy Kowske had 14 points and 10 boards against Purdue on Feb. 7, 2001. Harris is the first UW guard to record a points-rebounds "double-double" since Feb. 18, 1998 when Hennssy Auriantal had 12 points and 10 rebounds against UW-Milwaukee.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE - Sophomore Freddie Owens and freshman Devin Harris scored 23 and 21 points, respectively, against Temple, establishing career highs. That was the first time a pair of Badgers scored more than 20 points since Darnell Hoskins had 22 and Sean Dougherty had 21 in the UW's 94-91 win over Wright State on Dec. 5, 1995.

#### ON THE SIDELINES

WISCONSIN'S BO RYAN - In his 18th season as a head coach, his first at Wisconsin ... career record of 385-108 (.781) is fourth-best among active Division I coaches with at least 10 seasons ... coached last two seasons at UW-Milwaukee (30-27, .526) ... coached 15 years at UW-Platteville, winning four Division III national titles ... winningest college coach of the 1990's (all divisions) with a 266-26 (.908) record ... all-time winningest coach in Division III history (353-76, .822).

OHIO'S TIM O'SHEA - In his first season at Ohio and his first as a head coach ... served as an associate head coach at his alma mater, Boston College, from 1997-2001 ... was also an assistant at Rhode Island (nine years) and Yale (two years).

#### **OHIO NOTES**

- ▶ Ohio is 2-0 this season heading into tonight's game at DePaul.
- ▶ Senior forward Brandon Hunter, a first-team all-MAC selection last year, is averaging 21.0 points and 7.0 rebounds this season.
- ▶ The Bobcats return all three of their frontcourt starters from a team that went 19-11 last season, tied for third in the Mid-American conference.

#### TEAM NOTES

BOMBS AWAY - Freshman Devin Harris attempted a school-record 20 three-pointers against Temple on Monday night. Harris also broke the previous Big Ten record of 19 set by Iowa's Chris Kingsbury vs. Long Island on Dec. 17, 1994. The UW's 40 three-point attempts as a team was also a school and conference record. Wisconsin held the previous Big Ten high with 37 three-point attempts against Missouri on March 19, 1994.

IRON MEN - Four UW players, Devin Harris, Mike Wilkinson, Travon Davis and Charlie Wills, played at least 40 minutes in Monday's double-overtime loss to Temple. The last time that happened at the UW was in the Badgers' triple overtime loss to Indiana on Feb. 16, 1987 with Tom Molaski (53), Mike Heineman (50), Trent Jackson (46) and J.J. Weber (44) each logging more than 40 minutes. Harris led the way with 47 minutes played against the Owls, the most by a Badger since Michael Finley played 49 against Purdue on Feb. 13, 1993, a 90-87 Boilermaker win in two overtimes.

BIG ON THE GLASS - Guard Devin Harris grabbed 13 rebounds against Temple, his career high and the most for a Badger since Andy Kowske had 14 against Fresno State on March 16, 2000. Harris' 13 boards were the most for a Badger guard since Michael Finley had 13 as a freshman against Michigan on Feb. 26, 1992. Finley, who was listed at 6-7, played guard as a freshman then moved to forward his final three seasons at UW.

HANDLE WITH CARE - The Badgers' starting backcourt of Travon Davis and Devin Harris combined for just one turnover in a combined 89 minutes against Temple's pressure defense on Monday night. The duo is averaging one turnover for every 20 minutes played this season. Davis is currently third in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.38). That would tie him for third all-time at UW for a season.

MR. VERSATILITY - Freshman Devin Harris is currently ranked in the top 15 in the Big Ten in scoring, free throw percentage, three-pointers made and blocked shots. He leads Wisconsin in those categories as well as minutes played (36.1), field goal attempts (80), three-point attempts (50), free throws (25) and free throw attempts (30). He is also second on the squad in assists (12) and steals (eight).

IN THEIR DEFENSE - Wisconsin is allowing its opponents an average of 65.4 points a game, third in the Big Ten. Only two teams, UNLV (74) and Weber State (73), have scored more than 70 points against the Badgers this season.

BALANCING ACT - Six players are averaging at least seven points a game for the Badgers. Three players, Devin Harris (15.1), Freddie Owens (11.1) and Kirk Penney (10.6) are averaging in double figures. Mike Wilkinson is contributing 9.7 points off the bench while seniors Charlie Wills and Travon Davis are at 7.9 and 7.6 points per game, respectively.

MARKSMEN - Both Travon Davis and Devin Harris are among the conference leaders in free throw percentage. Harris has connected on 25 of his 30 attempts (.833), good for fifth in the Big Ten. Davis is 18-22 from the line (.818), tied for eighth. Davis was a career 50 percent free throw shooter (42-84) entering this year.

#### Game Summary

Lynn Greer scored 47 points for Temple, including game-tying three-pointers at the end of regulation and the first overtime period, as the Owls held off Wisconsin, 70-67.

Sophomore Freddie Owens and freshman Devin Harris scored 23 and 21 points, respectively, both career highs. The Badgers rallied from a 14-point second half deficit to take a six-point lead with 1:27 left. Temple got the ball down three points with 26 seconds left and Greer connected from diwntown with 11 seconds remaining. In the first OT, Greer drilled a trey with :0.3 on the clock to extend the game.

HELP OFF THE BENCH - Sophomore Freddie Owens and freshman Mike Wilkinson are providing the Badgers with a spark off the bench this season. Owens is second on the team in scoring with 11.1 points per game while Wilkinson is fourth at 9.7. Wilkinson is also second on the team with 5.7 rebounds a game. Wilkinson and Owens are averaging 29.3 and 25.9 minutes, respectively. The UW is outscoring its opponents by almost six points a game (23.1-17.7) off the bench.

CAREER HIGHS - This season, seven Badgers have set or tied career highs in points. Sophomore Freddie Owens (23) and freshman Devin Harris (21) set personal bests against Temple on Monday. Senior Travon Davis scored a careerhigh 14 points at Georgia Tech while freshman Clayton Hanson lit the scoreboard for the first time, draining a three-pointer. In the UW's loss to Weber State, freshman Mike Wilkinson came off the bench to record a career-high 12 points. Against Hawaii-Hilo, freshman Neil Plank scored the first points (five) of his college career while senior Charlie Wills matched his career best with 15.

LOGGING SERIOUS MINUTES - Six Badgers are averaging at least 25 minutes a game this season. Devin Harris leads the team at 36.1 minutes per game, while Travon Davis is at 32.4. Charlie Wills and Mike Wilkinson are averaging 29.9 and 29.3 minutes, respectively. Kirk Penney (28.3) and Freddie Owens (25.9) round out the UW's top six. Seven of the Badgers' top eight players have established career highs for minutes played this season.

STATE PRIDE - The Badgers kicked off their three-game set against in-state, Division I opponents with a 70-57 win over UW-Green Bay on Saturday. Wisconsin hosts Marquette on Dec. 22 then travels to UW-Milwaukee on Dec. 27. The Badgers have swept their state rivals in each of the last two seasons, last year defeating UW-Green Bay 61-53, UW-Milwaukee 55-47 and Marquette 52-47.

PRIME TIME PERFORMER - Senior point guard Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points and equalled his career best with seven assists in the Badgers' game nationally televised game at Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. He also led the UW with six rebounds, one shy of his personal best.

FOR STARTERS - The Badgers have used the same starting lineup for all six games this season, tipping off with seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills, junior Kirk Penney, sophomore Dave Mader and freshman Devin Harris.

HELMIGK OUT - Freshman forward Andreas Helmigk tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in preseason practice and will miss the entire 2001-02 season. Surgery is scheduled for late November. Helmigk's injury leaves the Badgers with just eight healthy scholarship players entering the season.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP - Seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills were named co-captains prior to the season.

CAL WHO? - Senior Charlie Wills has never missed a game (104 straight) in his UW career.

NO GIMMES - After having the third-toughest schedule in the country last year according to the Sagarin ratings, the Badgers face another tough slate in 2001-02. In addition to the always-grueling Big Ten schedule, Wisconsin travels to UNLV, Xavier, Georgia Tech, Ohio and UW-Milwaukee while hosting Temple, Tennessee, Marquette, UW-Green Bay and Furman.

EXPERIENCE LOST - Five seniors from last year's team have departed, including four starters. Those seniors accounted for 65 percent of the team's minutes played, 64 percent of the points, 61 percent of the rebounds and 74 percent of the assists last season. They also led the Badgers to three NCAA tournament appearances, including the 2000 Final Four.

EXPERIENCE GAINED? - Seven of the 15 players on the Badgers' roster are

freshmen. Nine of Wisconsin's players never played in a college game prior to this season. Travon Davis, Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are the only UW players to average more than five minutes per game last season.

### PLAYER POINTS

TRAVON DAVIS, SR., G - Team captain ... one of just two seniors on the team ... has appeared in 76 games, backing up four-year starter and Wooden Award finalist Mike Kelley at point guard for three seasons ... dished out a career-best eight assists against just one turnover in 42 minutes against Temple ... scored a personal-best 14 points (all in the first half) at Georgia Tech ... career-high seven rebounds against Hawaii ... third in Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.38) and tied for fifth in assists (4.4 apg.) ... 4.4 rebounds is fourth on the team ... has played in seven NCAA tournament games in his career.

CLAYTON HANSON, FR., G - Scored first points of his career at Georgia Tech, hitting a three-pointer in the first half ... saw first collegiate action against Hawaii-Hilo ... good three-point shooter ... averaged 28.7 points per game as a senior in high school last year, earning *Capital Times* Player of the Year honors.

DEVIN HARRIS, FR., G - Leading scorer for the Badgers (15.1 ppg), ninth in the conference ... second in the Big Ten in three-pointers made (2.71 per game) ... scored in double figures in six of Wisconsin's seven games ... scored careerhigh 21 points against Temple ... set a Big Ten record with 20 three-point attempts against the Owls ... played 47 minutes against Temple and is averaging 36.1 minutes this season ... led the Badgers with 20 points, including five three-pointers, against UNLV ... first freshman to start a season-opener at UW since Mike Kelley in 1997 ... second-most points (20) in Badger history by a freshman in a season-opener ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year.

DAVE MADER, SO., C - Biggest player on the Badgers' roster at 6-11, 240 pounds ... has started every game and played career-best 20 minutes against Weber State and UW-Green Bay ... averaging 3.0 points and 2.4 rebounds in 13.7 minutes a game ... appeared in 17 games as a redshirt freshman a year ago.

FREDDIE OWENS, SO., G - Scored a career-high 23 points in personal-best 37 muinutes against Temple ... second on the team with 11.1 points per game ... scored in double figures in four of the last five games ... shooting .762 (16-21) from the field in the last two games ... has connected on 31-52 (.596) two-point shots this season ... 13th in the conference in field goal percentage (.523), fourth among guards ... second only to Reggie Evans in field goal attempts among top 15 shooters ... made 3-5 three-pointers against Temple, his first three-pointers since hitting a 60-footer to beat the halftime buzzer against Tennessee in last season's opener ... played in 18 games as a true freshman.

KIRK PENNEY, JR., G - Badgers' only returning starter from a year ago ... averaging 10.6 ... has hit at least one three-pointer in 22 of last 24 games ... led Badgers with 15 points and added career-high tying seven rebounds against UW-Green Bay ... 4.6 rebounds per game, third-best on the team ... was second on the squad in scoring last year, averaging 11.2 points per game ... led the Big Ten in three-point shooting in conference games (.478) ... leading scorer (14.8 ppg) on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team ... also a member of the New Zealand Olympic team in 2000 ... one of 35 players to have played in the Final Four and the Olympics in the same year.

NEIL PLANK, FR., G/F - Scored five points, including a three-pointer, in the first half against Hilo ... averaging 9.4 minutes off the bench ... first-team all-state selection in Illinois ... has two prep teammates playing in Division I (Matt McCollom - Ball State and Jake Sans - Indiana State).

MIKE WILKINSON, FR., F - Averaging 29.3 minutes and 9.7 points off the bench ... 5.7 rebounds per contest are second-best on the team ... scored career-high 12 points against Weber State ... career-best 43 minutes against Temple ...

CHARLIE WILLS, SR., F - Team captain ... most experienced player on UW roster ... has played in every game during his career (104 straight) ... has started 36 of those games ... matched career high with 15 points against Hawaii-Hilo ... tied career high with 10 rebounds vs. UNLV ... leading rebounder on the team (6.7 rebounds per game) and 11th in the Big Ten ... averaged 18.0 minutes and 4.2 points a year ago ... part of the Big Ten Foreign Tour team that went 6-0 this past summer ... engaged to be married (Nancy).

#### BY THE NUMBERS

- 3's Wisconsin made nine three-pointers in 18 attempts in the first half against Georgia Tech. Both those numbers were third-most in school history for a half. The Badgers also attempted 18 treys in the first half against Temple. Their 40 attempts against the Owls set a school and Big Ten single-game record.
- 3.2 The UW's five losses have come by an average of 3.2 points per game.
- 7 The Badgers have seven freshmen on their roster. In addition, they have a total of nine players who never played a collegiate game prior to this season. One of those players, freshman forward Andreas Helmigk, is out for the year with a knee injury.
- 8 Wisconsin had just eight healthy scholarship players entering the 2001-02 season. Helmigk tore the ACL in his left knee during preseason practice, freshman guard Latrell Fleming was diagnosed with a heart condition prior to preseason drills and sophomore Julian Swartz left school for personal reasons.
- 9 Wisconsin has earned nine postseason invitations in the last 13 years. Including last season's NCAA Tournament appearance, the Badgers have gone to the "Big Dance" in four of the last five seasons.
- 11 Five Badgers (Kirk Penney, Charlie Wills, Freddie Owens, Devin Harris and Mike Wilkinson) scored at least 11 points in the UW's 70-57 win over UW-Green Bay on Dec. 1. The last time the UW accomplished that feat was Dec. 28, 1995.
