NOTES DU JOUR

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME - After playing seven of its first nine games away from Madison, Wisconsin returns to the Kohl Center Saturday to face Furman. The Badgers split their first two home games this season, beating UW-Green Bay before falling to Temple in double overtime. No one is happier to see the Kohl Center floor than junior Kirk Penney. In his career, Penney is a 46.5 percent shooter in home games (86-185), including 49 of 108 (.454) from three-point range. On the road, Penney is shooting .361 (103-285) in his career, .329 (57-173) from beyond the arc.

TAKING GOOD CARE - Senior point guard Travon Davis is currently tied for second in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.73). That ratio would be good for third on the UW's all-time single season list. Among the top 15 players in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio, Davis is averaging the fewest turnovers per contest (1.7). In the past three games, he has dished out 18 assists against only three turnovers.

GETTING DEFENSIVE - Wisconsin is fourth in the Big Ten in scoring defense, giving up just 65.1 points per game. No Badger opponent has scored more than 74 points (UNLV in the season opener) against the UW this season. Wisconsin has held six of its nine opponents to 70 points or less. The Badgers are holding their opponents to an average of 8.3 points below their season scoring average.

ON THE SIDELINES

WISCONSIN'S BO RYAN - In his 18th season as a head coach, his first at Wisconsin ... career record of 386-109 (.780) is fourth-best among active Division I coaches with at least 10 seasons ... coached last two seasons at UW-Milwaukee (30-27, .526) ... coached 15 years at UW-Platteville, winning four Division III national titles ... winningest college coach of the 1990's (all divisions) with a 266-26 (.908) record ... all-time winningest coach in Division III history (353-76, .822).

FURMAN'S LARRY DAVIS - In his fifth season at Furman and his fifth overall ... spent three years as an assistant at Minnesota prior to coming to Furman ... was also an assistant at Delaware, Wake Forest and Ball State.

FURMAN NOTES

► Furman is 6-1 this season with its only loss coming at Georgia (75-62) to open the season.

► Junior forward Karim Souchu, a native of Paris, France, leads the team with 17.4 points per game.

► Nine players average in double figures in minutes for the Paladins, five of which are shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

TEAM NOTES

CLOSE CALLS - Wisconsin's six losses this season have come by an average of 4.2 points. Five of the six setbacks have been by five points or less.

BACK-TO-BACK - Freshman Devin Harris reached the 20-point plateau in consecutive games against Temple (21) and Ohio (24). The last freshman to score at least 20 points in back-to-back games was Sam Okey who scored 20 points against Wright State on Dec. 5, 1995 and 27 against St. Bonaventure on Dec. 9.

BOMBS AWAY - Freshman Devin Harris attempted a school-record 20 three-pointers in the Badgers' double overtime loss to Temple on Dec. 3. Harris also broke the previous Big Ten record of 19 set by Iowa's Chris Kingsbury vs. Long Island on Dec. 17, 1994. The UW's 40 three-point attempts as a team was also a school and conference record. Wisconsin held the previous Big Ten high with 37 three-point attempts against Missouri on March 19, 1994. The Badgers are averaging 22.3 trey attempts per game.

FIREPOWER OFF THE BENCH - Sophomore Freddie Owens and freshman Mike Wilkinson are providing the Badgers with a spark off the bench this season. Owens is third on the team in scoring with 10.0 points per game while Wilkinson is fourth at 9.2. Wilkinson is also second on the team with 5.8 rebounds a game. Wilkinson and Owens are averaging 28.8 and 25.8 minutes, respectively.

IRON MEN - Six Badgers are averaging at least 25 minutes a game this season. Devin Harris leads the team at 35.8 minutes per game, while Travon Davis is at 31.8. Charlie Wills and Mike Wilkinson are averaging 28.9 and 28.8 minutes, respectively. Kirk Penney (28.3) and Freddie Owens (25.8) round out the UW's top six. Harris, Wilkinson, Davis and Wills played at least 40 minutes in the UW's double-overtime loss to Temple. The last time that happened at the UW was in the Badgers' triple overtime loss to Indiana on Feb. 16, 1987. Harris led the way with 47 minutes played against the Owls, the most by a Badger since Michael Finley played 49 against Purdue on Feb. 13, 1993, a 90-87 Boilermaker win in two overtimes.

BIG ON THE GLASS - Despite having just three players on their roster taller than 6-7, the Badgers hold a rebounding advantage of 3.0 boards per game over their opponents. Wisconsin has outrebounded its foes in seven of its nine games.

MR. VERSATILITY - Freshman Devin Harris is currently ranked in the top 15 in the Big Ten in scoring, free throw percentage, three-pointers made and three-point field goal percentage. He leads Wisconsin in those categories as well as minutes played (35.8), field goals (40), field goal attempts (100), three-point attempts (62), free throws (35), free throw attempts (42) and blocked shots (seven). He is also second on the squad in assists (15) and steals (nine).

BALANCING ACT - Six players are averaging at least seven points a game for the Badgers. Three players, Devin Harris (15.6), Kirk Penney (10.2) and Freddie Owens (10.0) are averaging in double figures. Mike Wilkinson is contributing 9.2 points off the bench while seniors Charlie Wills and Travon Davis are at 8.0 and 7.0 points per game, respectively.

Game Summary

Wisconsin struggled offensively, connecting on just 35 percent (21-60) of its shots as the Badgers lost to Xavier, 57-48, in Cincinnati, Ohio. The UW never led in the game and trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half. The Badgers turned up the pressure defensively in the second half, though, holding Xavier to just 17 points in the first 17 minutes of the second stanza. Wisconsin cut the Musketeer lead to six points on three occasions in the last five minutes but couldn't get any closer.

CAREER HIGHS - This season, seven Badgers have set or tied career highs in points. Devin Harris scored 24 in the Badgers' win at Ohio while freshman Neil Plank added a career-best seven points. Sophomore Freddie Owens (23) set a personal best against Temple. Senior Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points at Georgia Tech while freshman Clayton Hanson lit the scoreboard for the first time, draining a three-pointer. In the UW's loss to Weber State, freshman Mike Wilkinson came off the bench to record a career-high 12 points. Against Hawaii-Hilo, senior Charlie Wills matched his career best with 15.

STATE PRIDE - The Badgers kicked off their three-game set against in-state, Division I opponents with a 70-57 win over UW-Green Bay on Dec. 1. Wisconsin hosts Marquette on Dec. 22 then travels to UW-Milwaukee on Dec. 27. The Badgers have swept their state rivals in each of the last two seasons, last year defeating UW-Green Bay 61-53, UW-Milwaukee 55-47 and Marquette 52-47.

PRIME TIME PERFORMER - Senior point guard Travon Davis scored a career-high 14 points and equalled his career best with seven assists in the Badgers' nationally televised game at Georgia Tech in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. He also led the UW with six rebounds, one shy of his personal best.

FOR STARTERS - The Badgers have used the same starting lineup for all nine games this season, tipping off with seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills, junior Kirk Penney, sophomore Dave Mader and freshman Devin Harris.

HELMIGK OUT - Freshman forward Andreas Helmigk tore the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee in preseason practice and will miss the entire 2001-02 season. He had surgery in late November. Helmigk's injury left the Badgers with just eight healthy scholarship players entering the season.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP - Seniors Travon Davis and Charlie Wills were named co-captains prior to the season.

CAL WHO? - Senior Charlie Wills has never missed a game (106 straight) in his UW career.

EXPERIENCE LOST - Five seniors from last year's team have departed, including four starters. Those seniors accounted for 65 percent of the team's minutes played, 64 percent of the points, 61 percent of the rebounds and 74 percent of the assists last season. They also led the Badgers to three NCAA tournament appearances, including the 2000 Final Four.

EXPERIENCE GAINED? - Seven of the 15 players on the Badgers' roster are freshmen. Nine of Wisconsin's players never played in a college game prior to this season. Travon Davis, Kirk Penney and Charlie Wills are the only UW players to average more than five minutes per game last season.

TRAVON DAVIS, SR., G - Team captain ... one of just two seniors on the team ... first year as a starter ... appeared in 69 games the last three years, backing up Wooden Award finalist Mike Kelley at point guard ... tied for second in the Big Ten in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.73) ... that mark would be good for third on the UW single-season list ... fewest turnovers per game (1.7) among Big Ten players in the top 15 in assist-to-turnover ratio ... 4.6 assists per contest are good for fifth in the conference ... has 18 assists and just three turnovers in the last three games ... dished out a career-best eight assists against just one turnover in 42 minutes against Temple ... scored a personal-best 14 points (all in the first half) at Georgia Tech ... career-high seven rebounds against Hawaii ... has played in seven NCAA tournament games in his career.

CLAYTON HANSON, FR., G - Has appeared in five games this season ... scored first points of his career at Georgia Tech, hitting a three-pointer in the first

half ... also hit a three at Ohio ... good shooter ... averaged 28.7 points per game as a senior in high school last year, earning *Capital Times* Player of the Year honors.

DEVIN HARRIS, FR., G - Leading scorer for the Badgers (15.6 ppg), sixth in the conference ... third in the Big Ten in three-pointers made (2.78 per game) ... tied for seventh in the conference in free throw percentage (35-42, .833) ... scored in double figures in eight of Wisconsin's nine games ... career-high 24 points at Ohio ... set Big Ten record with 20 three-point attempts (making six) against Temple ... played 47 minutes against the Owls and is averaging 35.8 minutes this season ... recorded first "double-double" of his career against Temple (21 pts., 13 rebs.) ... most rebounds by a UW guard in a game since Michael Finley had 13 on Feb. 26, 1992 ... averaging 8.3 rebounds over the last three games ... led the Badgers with 20 points, including five three-pointers, against UNLV ... first freshman to start a season-opener at UW since Mike Kelley in 1997 ... second-most points (20) in Badger history by a freshman in a season-opener ... 25 three-pointers rank sixth all-time among freshman at UW ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year.

DAVE MADER, SO., C - Biggest player on the Badgers' roster at 6-11, 240 pounds ... has started every game ... grabbed six rebounds and tied career-high with 20 minutes against Xavier ... averaging 3.0 points and 2.8 rebounds in 13.9 minutes a game ... appeared in 17 games as a redshirt freshman a year ago.

FREDDIE OWENS, SO., G - Scored a career-high 23 points in personal-best 37 minutes against Temple ... third on the team with 10.0 points per game ... tops on the team in field goal percentage (39-83, .470) ... has connected on 35-66 (.530) two-point shots this season ... grabbed personal-best nine rebounds at Ohio ... made 3-5 three-pointers against Temple, his first three-pointers since hitting a 60-footer to beat the halftime buzzer against Tennessee in last season's opener ... played in 18 games as a true freshman.

KIRK PENNEY, JR., G - Badgers' only returning starter from a year ago ... team's second leading scorer at 10.2 ppg ... led Badgers with 15 points and added career high-tying seven rebounds against UW-Green Bay ... 4.4 rebounds per game, tied for third-best on the team ... was second on the squad in scoring last year, averaging 11.2 points per game ... led the Big Ten in three-point shooting in conference games (.478) ... leading scorer (14.8 ppg) on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team ... also a member of the New Zealand Olympic team in 2000 ... one of 35 players to have played in the Final Four and the Olympics in the same year.

NEIL PLANK, FR., G/F - Scored career-high seven points in win over Ohio, including five in the last five minutes ... has played in all nine games and is averaging 10.2 minutes and 2.3 points off the bench ... first-team all-state selection in Illinois ... has two prep teammates playing in Division I (Matt McCollom - Ball State and Jake Sans - Indiana State).

MIKE WILKINSON, FR., F - Averaging 28.8 minutes and 9.2 points off the bench ... 5.8 rebounds per contest are second-best on the team ... scored career-high 12 points against Weber State ... career-best 43 minutes against Temple ... three double-digit scoring efforts this season ... has scored between seven and 12 points in each of the Badgers' nine games ... redshirted last season ... Wisconsin state prep player of the year in 2000.

CHARLIE WILLS, SR., F - Team captain ... most experienced player on UW roster ... has played in every game during his career (106 straight) ... has started 38 of those games ... matched career high with 15 points against Hawaii-Hilo ... tied career high with 10 rebounds vs. UNLV ... leading rebounder on the team (6.0 rebounds per game) and tied for 12th in the Big Ten ... averaged 18.0 minutes and 4.2 points a year ago ... part of the Big Ten Foreign Tour team that went 6-0 this past summer ... engaged to be married (Nancy).

BY THE NUMBERS

3's - Wisconsin made nine three-pointers in 18 attempts in the first half against Georgia Tech. Both those numbers were third-most in school history for a half. The Badgers also attempted 18 treys in the first half against Temple. Their 40 attempts against the Owls set a school and Big Ten single-game record.

7 - The Badgers have seven freshmen on their roster. In addition, they have a total of nine players who never played a collegiate game prior to this season. One of those players, freshman forward Andreas Helmigk, is out for the year with a knee injury.

8 - Wisconsin had just eight healthy scholarship players entering the 2001-02 season. Helmigk tore the ACL in his left knee during preseason practice, freshman guard Latrell Fleming was diagnosed with a heart condition prior to preseason drills and sophomore Julian Swartz left school for personal reasons.

9 - Wisconsin has earned nine postseason invitations in the last 13 years. Including last season's NCAA Tournament appearance, the Badgers have gone to the "Big Dance" in four of the last five seasons.

10 - The Badgers' starting backcourt of Travon Davis and Devin Harris has combined for just 10 turnovers in the last four games (269 minutes played). That's merely one turnover every 26.9 minutes.

11 - Five Badgers (Kirk Penney, Charlie Wills, Freddie Owens, Devin Harris and Mike Wilkinson) scored at least 11 points in the UW's 70-57 win over UW-Green Bay on Dec. 1. The last time the UW accomplished that feat was Dec. 28, 1995.

80 - Three players, Devin Harris, Mike Wilkinson and Travon Davis, have combined to make 80 of Wisconsin's 113 free throws this season. The trio is connecting on 75.5 percent (80-106) of its free throws.

18 - The Badgers won 18 regular-season games last season for just the third time in school history. Wisconsin has won at least 18 games in four of the last five years (after doing so just four times prior to 1995).

36 - Wisconsin has won 36 of its last 44 games at the Kohl Center, an .818 winning percentage. The Badgers are 16-2 in non-conference home games since the Kohl Center opened.

WISCONSIN ROSTER
