WISCONSIN COACH BO RYAN

Bo Ryan is entering his second season as Wisconsin's head coach. Last year, Ryan guided the Badgers to a 19-13 record and a share of the Big Ten regularseason title. He became the first UW coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year, the first UW rookie coach to win an NCAA tournament game and set a record for wins by a first-year UW coach.

Ryan owns a career record of 402-116 (.776), the highest winning percentage for any current Division I coach with at least 15 years of coaching experience. He compiled a 30-27 record in two seasons at UW-Milwaukee. The winningest coach in Division III history, Ryan went 353-76 (.822) in 15 years at UW-Platteville. Prior to going to Platteville, he was an assistant at Wisconsin from 1976-84.

WISCONSIN EXHIBITION NOTES

Wisconsin is 34-4 all-time in exhibition games and has won 19 consecutive preseason games ... the Badgers defeated EA Sports 95-64 last year, with Devin Harris leading the way with 22 points ... Gallos de Pelea is the first international team the UW will play since defeating Yugoslavia-Mornar 64-48 on Nov. 5, 1997 ... the last time Wisconsin lost an exhibition game was in 1992 when the Russian National team defeated Bucky 87-81 ... the EA Sports All-Stars are 0-2 on their current exhibition tour, having lost to UW-Milwaukee (89-62) and UW-Green Bay (73-64) ... former Illinois players Lucas Johnson and Sergio McClain, along with former Michigan Wolverine Leon Jones, are on the EA Sports All-Stars' roster.

TEAM NOTES

- The UW opens its regular season on Friday, Nov. 15. The Badgers are hosting the NABC Classic and face Eastern Washington in the first round. Winthrop and Northern Illinois square off in the semifinal with the winners and losers playing each other on Saturday.
- Kirk Penney is the Badgers' lone senior this season. Six of their 11 scholarship players are freshmen and 10 of the 14 players on their roster are either freshmen or sophomores.
- The UW returns five of its top seven players from a year ago. In addition to Penney, juniors Dave Mader and Freddie Owens and sophomores Devin Harris and Mike Wilkinson were key contributors to last year's squad. The Badgers return 73.3 percent of their points and 69.2 percent of their minutes from last year.
- Penney, the lone returning firstteam All-Big Ten selection from last year, was named to the preseason "watch list" for the John R. Wooden Award. He joins Michael Finley, Sam Okey and Mike Kelley as the only Badgers to receive that honor.
- Penney spent the latter part of the summer with the New Zealand national team, preparing for and playing in the 2002 World Basketball Championships. The Kiwis finished a surprising fourth (their best-ever showing), losing to Germany in the Bronze Medal game. Penney was second on the team with 16.9 points per game and scored a personal-best 24 points against eventual World Champion Yugoslavia in the semifinals.
- The Badgers earned a share of the Big Ten regular-season championship last year for the first time since 1947. That was also the year head coach Bo Ryan was born. Wisconsin also earned the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament for the first time in school history.
- The UW's 11-5 (.688) record in conference play last year was the school's best since going 10-4 (.714) in 1962. It was just the second time since 1941 that Wisconsin had won 11 Big Ten games (the Badgers were 11-7 in 1997).

- The Badgers' 19 wins last season were the fifth-best total in UW history. They have won at least 18 games in five of the last six seasons.
- Wisconsin has been invited to the NCAA tournament a school-record four consecutive seasons. Last year, as a No. 8 seed in the East Region, UW defeated St. John's in the first round before falling to eventual national champion Maryland in the second round.
- Entering the 2002-03 season, Wisconsin owns the Big Ten's longest current home-winning streak. The Badgers, who broke Michigan State's Big Ten-record 53-game home winning streak last year, won their final 11 games at the Kohl Center last year. The UW is 46-8 (.852) at home in the last four years.
- The Badgers were the only team to defeat each of the other 10 Big Ten teams last season.

- The UW led the Big Ten in fewest turnovers last season, averaging just 12.9 per game. That was the fourth-best mark in school history. The Badgers were 12-2 when they committed less than 12 turnovers.
- Wisconsin was 14-0 last year when at least four players reached double figures in scoring. The UW had five players (Kirk Penney, Devin Harris, Charlie Wills, Mike Wilkinson and Freddie Owens) average more than 8.0 points per game, the first time that has happened since 1986-87.
- Half of the Badgers' games last season (16 of 32) were decided by six points or less. Wisconsin was 9-7 in those games.
- Wisconsin played 14 road games last season, tops among Big Ten teams. The Badgers played just 13 of their 32 games in Madison last year. This season, the UW will play at the Kohl Center 17 times.
