GAME BASICS

Wisconsin opens the 2002-03 regular season this weekend, hosting the NABC Classic at the Kohl Center (17,142) on Friday and Saturday nights. The Badgers face Eastern Washington on Friday, approximately 30 minutes after the Winthrop/Northern Illinois game (6 p.m. tipoff). On Saturday, the third-place game will start at 6 p.m. with the championship game following 30 minutes later.

WISCONSIN COACH BO RYAN

Bo Ryan is in his second season as Wisconsin's head coach. Last year, Ryan guided the Badgers to a 19-13 record and a share of the Big Ten regular-season title. He became the first UW coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year, the first UW rookie coach to win an NCAA tournament game and set a record for wins by a first-year UW coach.

Ryan owns a career record of 402-116 (.776), the highest winning percentage for any current Division I coach with at least 15 years of coaching experience. He compiled a 30-27 record in two seasons at UW-Milwaukee. The winningest coach in Division III history, Ryan went 353-76

(.822) in 15 years at UW-Platteville. Prior to going to Platteville, he was an assistant at Wisconsin from 1976-84.

NABC CLASSIC NOTES

This is Wisconsin's second appearance in the NABC Classic ... the Badgers finished second in 1999, defeating Missouri and losing to host Syracuse ... the UW has never faced Eastern Washington ... EWU, ranked 10th in ESPN.com's Mid-Major Top 10, was 17-13 last season and lost in the Big Sky Championship game ... Northern Illinois and Winthrop square off in the other semifinal game ... Winthrop, the four-time defending Big South Conference champion, was 19-12 last year ... Northern Illinois returns four starters from a team that went 12-16 last year.

TEAM NOTES

- Wisconsin is the first Big Ten team to see action this season. Only Memphis, Syracuse, Alabama and Oklahoma (all play Thursday night) open the season before the Badgers. The UW football team was also the first Big Ten team to play this season.

- The NABC Classic will be played using three experimental rules. The three-point line will be moved back nine inches to a distance of 20 feet, six inches, the free-throw lane will be widened by two feet on each side and the free-throw lane block will be moved to eight feet from the end line and be a true neutral zone.

- The UW is 77-27 in season openers in its 104-year history. The Badgers are 66-16 in season openers at home. This is Wisconsin's first season opener in Madison since it defeated Loyola-Chicago 66-29 on Nov. 14, 1998. The Badgers have lost their last two season openers.

- Wisconsin was 14-0 last year when at least four players reached double figures in scoring. The UW had five players (Kirk Penney, Devin Harris, Charlie Wills, Mike Wilkinson and Freddie Owens) average more than 8.0 points per game, the first time that has happened since 1986-87. In each of the Badgers' two exhibition games, four players scored in double figures.

- In their two exhibition games, the Badgers outrebounded their opponents by an average of 52.0-34.0. Six players averaged at least 5.0 rebounds per game.

- Entering the 2002-03 season, Wisconsin owns the Big Ten's longest current home-winning streak. The Badgers, who broke Michigan State's Big Ten-record 53-game home winning streak last year, won their final 11 games at the Kohl Center last year. The UW is 46-8 (.852) at home in the last four years.

- The UW, which finished sixth in the country a year ago in average attendance (16,528), sold 15,097 season tickets this season, most in school history. Among those were 2,051 student season tickets. This is the first time in Kohl Center history that the student section has sold out before the season started.

- Kirk Penney is the Badgers' lone senior this season. Six of their 11 scholarship players are freshmen and 10 of the 14 players on their roster are either freshmen or sophomores. Andreas Helmigk, Alando Tucker, Boo Wade, Ray Nixon, Jason Chappell and John Emerson could all see their first action as Badgers this weekend.

- The UW returns five of its top seven players from a year ago. In addition to Penney, juniors Dave Mader and Freddie Owens and sophomores Devin Harris and Mike Wilkinson were key contribu-

tors to last year's squad. The Badgers return 73.3 percent of their points and 69.2 percent of their minutes from last year.

- Penney, the lone returning first-team All-Big Ten selection from last year, was named to the preseason "watch list" for the John R. Wooden Award. He joins Michael Finley, Sam Okey and Mike Kelley as the only Badgers to receive that honor.

- Penney spent the latter part of the summer with the New Zealand national

team, preparing for and playing in the 2002 World Basketball Championships. The Kiwis finished a surprising fourth (their best-ever showing), losing to Germany in the Bronze Medal game. Penney was second on the team with 16.9 points per game and scored a personal-best 24 points against eventual World Champion Yugoslavia in the semi-finals.

- The Badgers earned a share of the Big Ten regular-season championship last year for the first time since 1947. That was also the year head coach Bo Ryan was born. Wisconsin also earned the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament for the first time in school history.

- The Badgers' 19 wins last season were the fifth-best total in UW history. They have won at least 18 games in five of the last six seasons.

- Wisconsin has been invited to the NCAA tournament a school-record four consecutive seasons. Last year, as a No. 8 seed in the East Region, UW defeated St. John's in the first round before falling to eventual national champion Maryland in the second round.

- The UW led the Big Ten in fewest turnovers last season, averaging just 12.9 per game. That was the fourth-best mark in school history.

20 Kirk Penney, G, 6-5, 220

Named to preseason "watch list" for the John R. Wooden Award ... preseason first-team All-Big Ten selection ... lone returning first-team All-Big Ten player from last year ... led Badgers in scoring with 15.1 ppg last year (seventh in Big Ten) ... averaged 17.5 points in two exhibition games, leading the Badgers ... one of the best shooters in the country, has 155 career three-pointers (seventh in UW history) ... 65 points away from 1,000 career points ... academic All-Big Ten last year, majoring in landscape architecture ... led native New Zealand to fourth-place finish at the 2002 World Basketball Championships (its best-ever finish), averaging 16.9 points per game ... scored personal-best 24 points against eventual World Champion Yugoslavia in the semi-finals, holding Predrag Stojakovic to just

10 points on 4-14 shooting ... one of 35 players to appear in the Final Four and Olympics in the same year (2000) ... leading scorer on New Zealand's 2001 Goodwill Games team.

Started all 32 games last year, averaging 14.6 minutes per contest ... averaged 7.0 points and 7.5 rebounds in two exhibition games ... member of the 2002 Big Ten Foreign Tour team, tying for team lead with 6.8 rebounds per game ... had two front teeth knocked out during a summer pick-up game.

24 Freddie Owens, G, 6-2, 185

Came off the bench to play in all 32 games last year ... good penetrator, averaged 8.1 points last season ... averaged 11.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in two exhibition games ... scored 16 straight points in a span of 4:15 during a game last year at Northwestern ... hit game-winning bucket with 25 seconds left to snap Michigan State's Big Ten-record 53-game home winning streak last year ... voted "Funniest Player on the Team" by his teammates ... attended same high school as New York Knick Latrell Sprewell.

3 Ike Ukawuba, G, 6-3, 175

In his third season as a walk-on ... point guard on the scout team ... three assists in nine minutes in two exhibition games ... academic All-Big Ten selection last year, majoring in mechanical engineering.
