After one race of one mile, one of 1.75 miles and another of two miles, the cup has been raced on a 2000-meter course ever since.

Walsh Cup

Named after 1923 Naval Academy graduate, rower and head coach Commander Charles "Buck" Walsh, the Walsh Cup is awarded to the varsity eight victor between Wisconsin and the U.S. Naval Academy. Wisconsin won the first race for the cup in 1967. The Badgers kept a hold on the trophy until 1970 when Navy won for the first time. The Badgers claim 17 of the 31 all-time races.

Fred Emerson, a 1932 Wisconsin graduate, donated the trophy.

ECAC

In the 68 years since its inception, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) has emerged as the nation's largest conference. The ECAC has grown considerably from its charter membership of 58 schools, currently boasting 321 member schools in Divisions I, II and III, ranging in location from Maine to North Carolina. During the 2007–08 academic year, the ECAC hosted 105 championships in 37 men's and women's sports as the sponsors of over 19,000 male and female athletes.

The ECAC was founded in 1938 as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics. One of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred in 1983 with the consolidation of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) into the ECAC infrastructure. With the addition of women's sports, the ECAC doubled its number of championships and greatly increased its member base.

The ECAC administers 110 pre-season and post-season events for its member institutions including the EARC, EAWRC, CCRA and IRA rowing events.

EARC Rowing

The Wisconsin men's rowing team belongs to the Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges (EARC). Under the auspices of the Eastern College Athletic Conference, the rowing league currently consists of 18 teams east of the Mississippi River. Member schools are Boston University, Brown, Columbia, Cornell, Dartmouth, Georgetown, George Washington, Harvard, Holy Cross, M.I.T., Northeastern, Princeton, Rutgers, Syracuse, Navy, Pennsylvania, Yale and Wisconsin.

The league championship, called the Eastern Sprints, is a series of races on one day in early May on Lake Quinsigamond in Worcester, Mass. The UW has won three varsity eight Eastern Sprints titles including in 2008. The Badgers won the first Eastern Sprints in 1946, and prior to this past year, most recently in 2002. Wisconsin also won the Rowe Cup as team champion in 2008 for the second time and first time since 1946.

Ten Eyck Trophy

The Ten Eyck Trophy is awarded to the school that scores the most total points in competition at the Intercollegiate Rowing Association regatta (formerly the National Intercollegiate Rowing Championship). The Wisconsin men's crew have won the trophy a record 14 times, most recently in 2002.

The trophy, which represents the best all-around rowing program in the nation, is awarded on a weighted point system based on the number of teams entered in eight races from the varsity eight to the freshmen four.

Four times in the trophy's 53-year existence, a team has claimed the trophy four consecutive years. Wisconsin has accomplished the feat twice (1972-75 and 1999-02). Cornell did it from 1955-58, while Pennsylvania did it from 1966-69.

Varsity Challenge Cup

The Varsity Challenge Cup is awarded to the collegiate crew that wins the varsity eight race at the Intercollegiate Rowing Association Regatta. The winner of the Varsity Challenge Cup is considered the national champion among American colleges. Given to the IRA by Dr. Louis L. Seaman in 1898, the silver cup has been in Badger hands eight times.

Wisconsin has six top-five finishes under head coach Chris Clark, including the national title in 2008. The Badgers finished second in 2002, fourth in 1997, 2003 and 2011 and fifth in 1999.

Midwest Rowing Championships

Former Wisconsin head rowing coach Randy Jablonic inherited the men's crew program following the 1968 season and within five years began the Midwest Rowing Championships, which had been held for 32 consecutive years until weather cancelled the racing last year. Started in the spring of 1973 on Lake Wingra, the Midwest Rowing Championships give the Badgers an opportunity to showcase their graceful sport to the campus and Madison community. The Badger men boast 32 varsity eight titles—all but two of the 34 races in the regatta's history.

History and Highlights

Men's History and Highlights

Rowing is the oldest sport at Wisconsin. Boating has been a popular Madison pastime since at least the 1850s, and early evidence of men's rowing at the University of Wisconsin dates back to 1878 when rowing was part of intramural competition. But still an earlier date, 1874, is mentioned in a letter from a Wisconsin alumnus, C. B. Bradish, dated in 1912, who states that his father, George P. Bradish, told him of the many times "he rowed on the first crew Wisconsin ever had."

Since those early times, the University of Wisconsin has built a strong and competitive varsity program for over 130 years. The rowers encounter a national scope of competitors on the East and West coasts, as well as dominating the Midwest rowing scene.

Since 1900, Wisconsin has won 51 Intercollegiate Rowing Association titles and 14 Ten Eyck Championships. The Ten Eyck Trophy is awarded annually to the school which scores the most total points in competition at the national championship. In 1990, Wisconsin captured the national title and earned the school's fourth bid to the Henley Royal Regatta in London. The Badgers also attended the Henley in 1967, 1973 and 1986. Last year, the Badgers again captured the national title, but passed on a trip to Henley.

The Badgers first varsity eight national rowing championship came in 1951 under coach Norm Sonju at Marietta, Ohio, over a two-mile course at the Intercollegiate Rowing Association Regatta. Eight years later, the Badgers regained the national crown over a three-mile course on Lake Onondaga in Syracuse, N.Y. Sonju's third national title came in 1966 on Lake Onondaga. In addition to winning three national championships, he coached the crew to two national runner-up titles. Sonju led the Wisconsin rowers from 1948 until his retirement in 1968.

Since Sonju's departure, an annual award in his name is presented to the top male rower who has made outstanding contributions to the success of the program in the categories of leadership, dedication and sportsmanlike attitude.

At the conclusion of the 1968 season, Randy Jablonic took over the reigns of the men's rowing program.

Under Jablonic's direction, the Badgers won three consecutive national championships from 1973-75, won the 1986 and 1990 titles, and placed second six other times. Jablonic initiated the Midwest Rowing Championship on Lake Wingra in Madison in 1973. The Badgers captured the first eight varsity eight titles, only to be denied in 1981 and 1982. Wisconsin regained the trophy in 1983 and dominated the competition thereafter by winning 24 straight crowns.

The Badgers have been competing annually for the Cochrane Cup with M.I.T. and Dartmouth since 1961, and in 48 years have captured 30 titles. The Badger rowers won eight straight cup titles from 1984-91 and have won the cup 10 of the last 13 years.

Another traditional outing for the Badger program is competing at Annapolis, Md., with Navy for the Walsh Cup. Wisconsin has 17 titles including five straight from 1985-89 and six consecutive championships from 1997-2002.

A cup race against Boston University began in 1989 with the victor taking home the Jablonic Cup, in honor of longtime UW head coach Randy Jablonic. The Badgers claim 16 victories in 18 years of the cup.

A new tradition began with the appointment in 1996 of head coach Chris Clark, who brought international training and experience to the Badger program.

As the face of rowing continues to change, the University of Wisconsin men's rowing program has grown from its early days of intramural competition to that of a nationally-recognized program. Success has been the Badger tradition since those first competitive strokes were taken on Lake Mendota in 1874 and today as it competes for national and international recognition.

Wisconsin at Henley

The Badger men have attended the Royal Henley Regatta on the Thames River four times in program history, most recently in 1990. Wisconsin qualified for the mile-and-five-sixteenths race by winning the national collegiate championship. Although defeating Harvard for the collegiate title that year, the Crimson out-dueled

Wisconsin in the semifinals at the Henley, eventually winning the "Ladies Plate" race.

In 1986, Wisconsin lost in the semifinals to the British National Eight. The Badgers took three boats in 1973, after winning the collegiate varsity, junior varsity and freshmen eight titles in a rare sweep of all three events that year. All three boats qualified for the semifinals before losing in close races. Wisconsin's first Henley adventure was in 1967, when Oxford University defeated the varsity in the quarterfinals.

Head Coaches

Amos W. Marston **1894**

Rowed four years for Cornell, then got the UW going with a two-week part-time coaching tenure.

Andrew M. O'Dea **1895-98; 1900-06**

World famous Australian sculler coached the Badgers in their first race against a college crew when they defeated Yale in 1896 in Connecticut. Brother Patrick visited one summer and transferred to the UW. Patrick became known as Wisconsin football's fabled "Kangaroo Kicker."

Curran C. McConville **1899**

Team captain in 1898, McConville coached one year while Andrew O'Dea left to coach at Harvard. He directed the famous "Berry Crate Crew" of 1899.

Edward H. "Ned" Ten Eyck **1907-10**

First U.S. Diamond Sculls champion (British Regatta) and son of legendary Syracuse coach James Ten Eyck, for whom the Ten Eyck Trophy awarded to the all-points champion at the Intercollegiate Rowing Association Regatta is named.

Harry E. "Dad" Vail **1911-28**

Former Badger coach who is now known widely through the Dad Vail Regatta, held annually on the Schuylkill River in Philadelphia. The regatta is the largest collegiate regatta in the United States.

George W. "Mike" Murphy **1929-34**

Six-year coach of Wisconsin rowing, he was partly responsible for the University of Washington's current nickname of "Huskies," changed in 1922 from the Seattle-appropriate "Sun Dodgers."

Ralph Hunn **1935-40**

Two-year varsity coxswain at UW took over the head coaching job in 1934 despite his election as captain for his senior year. At age 22, he was the

youngest varsity coach among the major rowing colleges in the country.

Allen W. "Skip" Walz **1941-42, 1946**

New York native Walz was commentator for the first televised professional football game between the Brooklyn Dodgers and Philadelphia Eagles on Oct. 22, 1939 at Ebbets Field. Was also a Golden Gloves heavyweight champion and coached U.S. rowers to gold at the 1948 Olympics.

George A. Rea **1943**

Spent one year as head coach while still in school, before graduating with a mechanical engineering degree. Left to work for Douglas Aircraft Company, then enlisted in the Navy as an electronic technician.

Curt P. Drewes **1944-45**

He spent 37 years as Wisconsin's rigger, and two as interim coach. Attended the 1972 Olympic Summer Games in his native Germany as the U.S. Olympic crew rigger.

Norm Sonju **1947-68**

Hudson, Wis., born, but Poulsbo, Wash., raised, Sonju led the UW to three varsity eight national titles. He was co-manager of the 1964 U.S. Olympic Rowing Team in Tokyo that won eight and pair gold medals. During his UW tenure, he was an associate professor of physical education

Randall T. "Jabo" Jablonic **1969-1997**

Longest serving rowing coach in UW history, Jablonic led Wisconsin to 10 Ten Eyck Trophies and four varsity eight IRA titles. He also managed the U.S. Olympic crew in 1972.

Four-time IRA Gold Medalists

Only 16 men's college rowers in the country since 1895 have won a gold medal in the freshmen eight and then went on to win three varsity eight gold medals. The University of Wisconsin boasts three of these men, including Robert Espeseth, Jr., James Dyreby Jr., and Lou Schueller, Jr., all of whom won the freshmen eight title in 1972 and varsity eight titles in 1973, 1974 and 1975.

Robert Espeseth, Jr., Faculty and Club Rowing Coach, University of Tennessee-Chattanooga

A four-time Olympian, eight-time national team member and USRowing Hall of Fame inductee, Espeseth now spends his time since 1989 at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga. A teacher and club rowing coach, he coached one of the members of the 2004 Olympic varsity eight gold medal-winning boat. After leaving the UW, Espeseth spent five years on active duty in the U.S. Navy and earned post graduate degrees from the University of Illinois. He remained part of the U.S. Navy Reserves for a number of years.

Lou Schueller, Jr., CPCU, President and Treasurer, Schueller, Harrington and Associates

A 1974 U.S. National Team member in the men's four with coxswain, Schueller is now the president and treasurer of Schueller, Harrington and Associates, an independent insurance agency located in Milwaukee. He also holds the prestigious CPCU title. The 1975 graduate of UW currently resides in Mequon, Wis.

James Dyreby, Jr., MD, Orthopedic Surgeon

Wisconsin's Big Ten Medal of Honor winner in 1975, Dyreby competed on the 1973 U.S. National Team in the men's four with coxswain. A graduate of UW Medical School, Dyreby now practices orthopedic surgery in Rhinelander, Wis.

Note: USRowing selected Academic All-Americans for the first time in 1993. The award recognized the accomplishments of collegiate rowers based on academic standing, athletic excellence and additional activities. "Eight" men and women were selected first team, and a second team "Eight" was also noted. To be eligible, rowers had to have a minimum of a 3.2 grade point on a 4.0 scale, row or cox in the priority crew at the league championship and have achieved a specified score on an ergometer. It is no longer awarded.

UW Athletics Hall of Fame

The University of Wisconsin Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1991 by the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics, University of Wisconsin-Madison, in cooperation with the National "W" Club, Wisconsin's letterwinner organization. The Hall of Fame inductees are recognized and honored for their exemplary athletic achievement and contributions made to the University of Wisconsin. The first induction ceremony for the 35 charter members of the Hall of Fame was held in the Spring of 1991. Rowers who have been so honored include:

Carl Holtz

Inducted to the UW Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999, Carl Holtz became the first Wisconsin rower to join the select group of Wisconsin student-athletes. Holtz earned varsity "W" awards in 1942, 1946 and 1947, captaining the men's crew squad in 1947. He stroked the 1941 freshmen squad to second place at the Poughkeepsie Regatta and the Adams Cup. He also stroked the 1946 varsity crew to the first Eastern Sprint Regatta title, making it the first UW varsity crew to win a major regatta. Acclaimed as the finest stroke in collegiate rowing in both 1946 and 1947, his Wisconsin rowing career was interrupted when he served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II.

Robert Espeseth, Jr.

The first Wisconsin athlete in any sport to make four Olympic teams, Robert Espeseth, Jr., represented the United States in 1976, 1980, 1984 and 1988. His best result came in 1984 in Los Angeles when he stroked the men's pair with coxswain to a bronze medal. While at Wisconsin, Espeseth won national championships in four-straight seasons, including 1972 with the novice eight and 1973, 1974 and 1975 in the varsity eight. He won a world championship in 1986 at Nottingham, England, and was named U.S. Rowing's Male Athlete-of-the-Year that season. An eight-time member (1976, 1979, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1986, 1987 and 1988) of the U.S. national team, he was inducted into the U.S. Rowing Hall of Fame in 1997.

Randall "Jabo" Jablonic

Jablonic, a 2004 Hall of Fame inductee, won national championships at Wisconsin as both a rower and coach. With the varsity eight in 1959, Jablonic rowed as the three seat to help the Badgers to their second national title in the varsity eight. As a coach, Jablonic spent 29 years (1969-97) at the helm, leading the UW to four IRA varsity eight national titles, as well as 10 Ten Eyck Trophies as team points champion at the regatta. His 1986 and 1990 varsity eights also won the short-lived National Intercollegiate Rowing Championship, while in total, Wisconsin boats won 28 national titles under his direction. Jablonic also served as team manager for the Badgers' trip to the Royal Henley regatta in 1968 and as assistant manager for the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team. 1973 President of Rowing Coaches of America, he was 1973, and 1974 President of the Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges. Founder of the Midwest Rowing Championship in Madison in 1973, he served as a national team assistant coach in 1976, directed the 1981 US National Team to a bronze in the men's eight at the World Championships and was director of the USRowing Association in 1984. Prior to his induction in the UW Athletics Hall of Fame, he was inducted in 1991 into the Madison Sports Hall of Fame, and in 1999 into the Power 10 New York Hall of Fame.

Jefferson Burrus

A seven-time letterwinner in football and rowing, Burrus earned a "W" in rowing in 1924, 1925, 1926 and 1927. Rowing captain in 1927, he became a Rhodes Scholar and a member of Phi Beta Kappa. A member of the Scholastic Hall of Fame, he was a Second-Team All-Conference and All Western End on football team. He is also one of nine Badger rowers to have won the Big Ten Medal of Honor, awarded for academic and athletic excellence. He earned the honor in 1927.

US Rowing Hall of Fame

Robert Espeseth, Jr.

In January 1997, former Badger rower Robert Espeseth, Jr. was inducted into the USRowing Hall of Fame in New York.

Espeseth, who rowed for the Badgers from 1972 to 1975, won three varsity eight national titles. He was inducted along with members of the four oared shell that won the World Championship in 1986 and was third in 1987. Espeseth was a four-time member of the U.S. Olympic team (1976, 1980, 1984, 1988) and an eight-time member of the U.S. national team. He now works as the head rowing coach at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga.

Espeseth was also inducted into the University of Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003.

Beau Hoopman

In March 2010, former Badger rower Beau Hoopman was inducted into the USRowing Hall of Fame.

Hoopman, and Olympic gold medalist in the men's eight from 2004 and an Olympic bronze medalist from 2008, was inducted along with the rest of the 2004 men's eight, which set a world fastest time for 2,000 meters in Athens, Greece during the Olympic Games.

Academic All-Big Ten

Begun in 1986–87, the Academic All-Big Ten Conference team is comprised of letterwinners who maintain a cumulative grade-point average of 3.00 or better (4.0 scale) and have been at the school at least one year.
