2006-07 Honors

- ◆ Named **Big Ten Player of the Year** by both the coaches and media and was the only unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection by both groups.
- ◆ One of five finalists for the **Oscar Robertson Trophy**, given to the national player of the year by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.
- ◆ One of four finalists for the **Naismith Trophy**, given to the national player of the year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.
- ◆ One of 10 finalists for the Lowe's **Senior CLASS Award**, presented each year to the outstanding senior NCAA Division I Student-Athlete of the Year.
- ◆ Named **first-team All-American** by the USBWA, NABC, ESPN.com, SI.com and *The Sporting News*. UW's first first-team All-American since 1950.

2006-07 Highlights

- ◆ Averaged 19.9 points per game and scored a **school-record 716 points** this season.
- ◆ Dating back to last season he scored in double figures in **43 consecutive games**, the 10th-best active streak in the country.
- ◆ In the Badgers' 14 nationally televised games (including six vs. ranked teams), Tucker averaged **20.6 points and 5.8 rebounds**.
- ◆ Scored at least **20 points in seven straight games** from Jan. 28-Feb. 17, the longest streak for a Badger since 1971.

Career Highlights

- ◆ Scored 2,217 career points, passing Michael Finley (2,147) to become **Wisconsin's all-time leading scorer**.
- ◆ Holds **seven other school records**, including games played, field goals made and free throws made.
- ◆ Ranks **ninth in Big Ten Conference history** in career points scored.
- ◆ Played in **99 victories at UW**, most in school history, and was a part of UW's four winningest teams.

Milestones: UW's all-time leading scorer (2,217) and ranks ninth in the Big Ten ... also the school's career leaders in games played (134), games started (126), minutes played (4,297), field goals (798), free throws (520), free throw attempts (817) and offensive rebounds (314) ... sixth in the country in career points among seniors ... the first Badger to lead the Big Ten in scoring (20.0 ppg., 2006) since Don Rehfeldt in 1950

Honors: 2007 Big Ten Player of the Year ... finalist for the Naismith, Oscar Robertson and Senior CLASS awards ... first-team All-American (USBWA, NABC, SI.com, ESPN.com, *The Sporting News*) ... 2007 NABC first-team All-District ... consensus first-team All-Big Ten selection in 2006 and 2007 ... also named to the 2006 Wooden Award Midseason All-American team and the Naismith Award Top 30 list ... earned NABC first-team All-District 11 and USBWA All-district V honors as a junior ... consensus third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2005 ... 2003 Big Ten All-Freshman Team

2006-07: Started all 36 games for UW ... led the team and ranks second in the Big Ten with 19.9 points per game ... scored 20 or more points in seven straight games (Jan. 28 - Feb. 17) ... 716 points are a UW single-season school record ... second on the team in assists (73) ... scored a season-high 32 points against Pitt ... averaged 22.2 points and 6.5 rebounds in road games

2005-06: Started all 31 games and led the team in

scoring (19.0 ppg.) ... ranked among the school's single-season top 10 in points, field goals and field goal attempts ... scored a career-high and Paradise Jam Tournament-record 38 points (fourth-most in school history) in win over E. Kentucky

2004-05: Played in 31 games, starting 30 ... led the Badgers in scoring (15.2 ppg.) ... was also second on the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg.) ... ranked among the top 10 in the conference in both categories

2003-04: Missed all but four games due to a right foot injury

2002-03: Played in all 32 games, starting the final 27 ... finished third on the team (and third among Big Ten frosh) in scoring with 12.0 ppg. ... led the Big Ten and set a school record for offensive rebounds
