Last Meeting: T, 4-4 (3-2 shootout) -- Cameron Hughes scored at 18:47 of the third period to give the Badgers a 4-3 lead, but Minnesota's Seth Ambroz scored an extra-attacker goal at 19:58 to send the game to overtime. After a scoreless overtime and a tie, the Badgers won a seven-round shootout, 3-2. The game took place on Jan. 31, 2015 at the Kohl Center. Grant Besse and Matt Ustaski scored the first two shootout goals, before Corbin McGuire got the winner. Joel Rumpel made 42 saves in the game, before stopping five of seven shots in the shootout. Besse, Ryan Wagner and Kevin Schulze scored for the Badgers. The tie came one night after UW dropped a 7-5 contest to the Gophers. Matt Ustaski led the way for the Badgers with a goal and three points in the game.

UM Series Notes: The teams meet for the 275th and 276th time, according to UW records, the most-played series in UW history ... Wisconsin sits 17-28-9 against Minnesota under head coach Mike Eaves, but is 15-19-8 since the start of the 2005-06 season ... UW went 0-2-2 against Minnesota last season, winning a pair of shootouts ... the Badgers are 8-10-6 against Minnesota at the Kohl Center since Eaves became coach in 2002-03 ... Wisconsin has six Minnesota natives on its roster (Barnes, Besse, Freytag, Hurley, Schulze, Wittchow)

Key Notes to Consider

▶ Wisconsin (4-10-6, 1-5-2-1 Big Ten) opens eight consecutive games at the Kohl Center with the border battle against Minnesota (11-10-0, 6-2-0 Big Ten). The teams meet Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m. and 7 p.m., respectively.

▶ The Badgers fought back to tie twice last Friday at Penn State, but dropped a 4-3 overtime contest, then fell 4-1 to the Nittany Lions last Saturday. The losses for UW marked the first time they were swept in a series this season.

Minnesota earned 5-2 and 3-1 home victories against Michigan State to extend a modest win streak to three games. Minnesota is tied with Michigan for the Big Ten lead with 18 points in eight games.

▶ Freshman Luke Kunin has been a special player of late. Now with points and goals in each of his last three games, he has a total of three goals and seven points over that span.

The Big Ten Third Star of the Week last week after producing the first four-point game for a Badger freshman since Kyle Turris did so in consecutive contests against Robert Morris on Oct. 19-20, 2007. Kunin scored the Badgers first short-handed goal of the season last Saturday at Penn State, the first for UW since Kevin Schulze scored shorthanded on Jan. 9, 2015 against Boston University.

In Saturday's game, Kunin fired off 11 shots on goal, the first Badger in double figures for shots in a game since Mark Zengerle had 10 against Bemidji State on Feb. 8, 2013. The shot total was the most since Jake Gardiner took 14 shots against Canisius on Jan. 8, 2011, and the most for a freshman since Jack Skille took 11 shots against Michigan Tech on Feb. 17, 2006.

Kunin leads the Badgers with nine goals and shares the team lead with 18 points.

The last Badger freshman to lead a team in goals was Dany Heatley in 1999-2000. Heatley scored 28 times that year. The last UW rookie to lead the team in points for a season was Turris, when he had 35 points in 36 games.

The last Badger rookie to post double figures in goals was Nic Kerdiles, who scored 11 times in 32 games during the 2012-13 season.

► The Badgers are in the midst of a stretch of 12 games during which they play 10 at the Kohl Center. This weekend begins a stretch of eight consecutive home contests. UW sits 2-2-4 at the Kohl Center this season.

► Freshman goaltender Matt Jurusik was credited with 54 saves in the 4-3 loss last Friday, matching the seventh-highest save total in a game for a Wisconsin goalie in program history. The total matched Kirk Daubenspeck's 54-save performance on March 1, 1996 in a 6-5 overtime victory over North Dakota in the WCHA playoffs.

Jurusik also posted the first 50-save game for a Badger goalie since Bernd Brückler stopped 50 shots in a 5-5 tie against Colorado College. It marked the 19th 50-save performance in UW history. Jurusik also became the 12th goalie to accomplish the feat.

Jurusik has started 16 consecutive games in goal for the Badgers and sits 4-9-5 with a 3.20 goals-against average, .901 save percentage and one shutout.

► Senior defenseman Eddie Wittchow set up UW's tying goal late in the third period last Friday that sent the game to overtime, then had the lone assist on UW's short-handed goal last Saturday. The points marked the first for Wittchow since March 4, 2014 when he had an assist at Michigan State. The assist snapped a 47-game pointless streak for Wittchow. He now has a goal, 11 assists and 12 points in 111 career contests.

► Sophomore defenseman Jake Linhart had the first two-goal game of his career last Friday, opening the scoring with a first-period power-play tally, before tying the game at 3-3, 16 minutes, 13 seconds into the third period to get the game to overtime.

Linhart, who had six assists as a freshman, shares second on the Badgers with six goals and leads the team's defensemen with 11 points.

Linhart is tied with Michigan's Zach Werenski for the league lead in goals among defensemen in all games. His three goals and six points in league games share second among Big Ten defenseman with teammate Tim Davison, among others.

► Junior forward Grant Besse shares the team lead with 18 points on five goals and a team-best 13 assists. Besse led the Badgers in goals and points last season, tallying 11 goals and 22 points in 32 games played.

Besse has been at his best during his career when skating against Minnesota, his home-state team. After going pointless in his first three career games against Minnesota Besse owns six goals, two assists and eight points, as well as three multi-point games over the last five meetings. In all five of those games, Besse has at least one goal. He is also 2-for-2 against Minnesota in shootouts, including a shootout winner on Jan. 16, 2015.

► The second period continues to be UW's strength with regards to scoring goals. The Badgers have tallied 31 goals in the second period this season. Thirty one of the team's 52 goals this year have come in the second period (59.6 percent).

The Badgers scored just one goal in the second periods at Penn State last weekend.

► The Badgers have led or been tied during the third period in 15 of their 20 games this season, including last Friday against Penn State. The Badgers are 4-6-5 in those contests.

► UW has two freshmen among the top nine in the Big Ten in scoring. Luke Kunin ranks third with 18 points on nine goals and nine assists, while Seamus Malone shares ninth with 14 points (3 goals, 11 assists).

► UW posted its sixth tie of the season on Jan. 9 against Ohio State, more than halfway to the school record of eight ties set during the 2003-04 campaign.

The Badgers had tied 11 consecutive overtime games and were unbeaten in 12 consecutive overtime contests before losing a 4-3 overtime contest last Friday at Penn State.

Big Ten Players to Watch

The Badgers went 1-0-11 over a span that dates back to March 22, 2014 and the Badgers' 5-4 overtime victory over Ohio State in the championship game of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament.

▶ The Badgers have overcome multi-goal holes to avoid defeat on three occasions this season.

The most recent came Jan. 9 against Ohio State when UW overcame a 4-2 deficit for a 4-4 tie.

The others were Northern Michigan on Oct. 10 (3-0 deficit in third; 3-3 tie) and Michigan on Dec. 5 (trailed 2-0 in first; 6-6 tie).

▶ The Badgers have scored six goals in the final minute of a period this season, five of

which have factored in either a victory or a tie.

Junior right winger Grant Besse had one in the third period vs. Northern Michigan on Oct. 9 that provided a 2-2 draw (19:18).

Sophomore defenseman Tim Davison had one in the third session vs. Ferris State on Oct. 23 that resulted in a 5-5 tie (19:40).

Kunin had one in the second period vs. Michigan State on Dec. 12 that gave way to a 3-0 win (19:02).

Kunin had another in the second session vs. Ohio State on Saturday night (19:48). That came a period prior to one by sophomore center Ryan Wagner (19:35).

▶ UW's special teams has been among its strengths this season. UW went 6-for-8 on the penalty kill last weekend against Penn State and leads the Big Ten with an 86.7 percent penalty kill (65-for-75). Penn State scored two power-play goals last Saturday, including one on a five-on-three, marking the first game this season UW has allowed more than one power-play goal.

Nationally, UW's penalty kill ranks seventh in the country.

Wisconsin has faced six of the top 20 power-play units in the nation this season, including Penn State, who ranks sixth with a conversion rate of 26.1 percent.

Against those top six power plays – No. 5 Michigan, No. 8 Boston University, No. 17 Ohio State, No. 18 North Dakota and No. 20 Boston College are the others – Wisconsin has an 88.1 kill percentage (37-for-42).

▶ The Badger power play ranks 22nd in the country at 19.2 percent (14-for-73). The Badgers had been as high as 11th, but are 1-for-18 with the man advantage over the last six contests.

▶ Wisconsin is celebrating a pair of NCAA championship anniversaries this season, including the weekend of Nov. 20-21, when the 1980-81 team was back for the 35th anniversary of their title.

The 2005-06 Badgers return to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the school's sixth NCAA title the weekend of Jan. 30 during the NHL All-Star break. The UW women's team will also be celebrating their 2006 NCAA title that same weekend.

▶ The Badgers are 2-2-4 through six home contests.

Wisconsin sits nine victories away from reaching 200 on the Kohl Center ice, not counting exhibition contests. Since the building opened in 1998, UW has reached at least 11 victories at the Kohl Center in 10 of 17 seasons.

Wisconsin has averaged slightly more than 11 wins per season at the Kohl Center, including five seasons of 14-plus victories. UW's best single season record in the KC came in 2013-14 with a mark of 17-2-1.

▶ Senior defenseman Eddie Wittchow (Burnsville, Minn.) skated in his 100th career game for the Badgers on Nov. 6 to become just the second current Badger to reach the milestone. He now has played in 111 games. Only fellow senior defenseman Kevin Schulze (White Bear Lake, Minn.), who has

Two other Badgers could play in their 100th career games this season as junior forwards Jedd Soleway (89 GP) and Grant Besse (88 GP) are within striking distance.

► UW faces one of the tougher schedules in the nation this season, with an especially grueling stretch to start the campaign. The Badgers played six of their first 12 games against teams ranked in the top five of the preseason USCHO.com poll, with at least one game against four of the top five teams.

Of its 34 total games, Wisconsin will play 14 against teams ranked in the top 13 of the USCHO.com preseason poll. Only three of UW's series this year are against a team not receiving votes in the preseason poll.

► The Badgers began the season with 28 skaters on the roster. That is the largest roster at UW since the 2009–10 team also boasted 28 members. Three of the 28 skaters on the roster that year did not see action.

► Senior defenseman Kevin Schulze led the nation in 2014–15 with an average of 2.66 blocks per game, 0.11 shots-per-game better than Bemidji State defenseman Sam Windle (2.55). Schulze's 93 blocks were four shy of Windle's national lead.

As a team, UW ranked 10th in the country with an average of 14.83 blocks per game.

This season, teammate Eddie Wittchow ranks fifth in the nation with an average of 2.55 blocks per game. Wittchow ranks 10th in the nation with 51 blocks.

Schulze still ranks among the nation's best in the category, blocking an average of 2.20 shots per game to rank 15th in the country. He has blocked 44 shots this year in 20 contests.

► Wisconsin will serve as host school for the 2016 NCAA Frozen Four set for April 7-9 at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Florida.

The Badgers last played host to the NCAA Frozen Four in 2006 when it was held at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee. The Badgers won the championship that season, defeating Boston College, 2-1, in the title game.

► Five Badgers were captains of their teams before arriving on campus including Kevin Schulze (Hill-Murray), Cullen Hurley (Academy of Holy Angels) and Jarod Zirbel (Notre Dame Academy), who each captained their high school teams, as well as Luke Kunin who served as a captain of the U.S. Under-18 Team and Patrick Sexton (Penticton) in the BCHL. Hurley also co-captained the Muskegon Lumberjacks in the USHL. Eddie Wittchow (co-captain) and Grant Besse (assistant captain) will earn their stripes this season as captains of the Badgers.

► Wisconsin boasts 13 skaters who have championships on their resumes. Three Badgers (Besse, Davison, Zirbel) own high school state titles, two (Rockwood, Sexton) own BCHL titles, Hughes won an AJHL championship, Malone won a USHL crown, McGuire won an EJHL championship and Keryluk owns an USPHL win. In addition, Kunin won a under-18 world title and Jurusik won the NAHL regular-season crown. Others include Wittchow's USHL western conference victory and Soleway's BCHL division triumph.

► Head coach Mike Eaves is behind the bench for his 14th season at Wisconsin. The Badgers own one NCAA title (2006), two Frozen Four appearances (2006, 2010), seven NCAA tournament appearances and two conference tournament titles (2013, 2014) during Eaves' tenure.

Eaves has seen 28 of his former Badgers go on to play in the NHL, as well as over 60 of his former players go on to play some sort of professional hockey (NHL, AHL, ECHL, overseas). Fifty NHL drafted skaters have played at Wisconsin under Eaves.

► Wisconsin hockey boasts five new staff members including associate head coach Luke Strand, assistant coach JB Bittner, director of hockey operations John Hamre, video coordinator Emily Engel and primary care Dr. Andrew Watson.

► For the new coaches, associate head coach Luke Strand came to UW from a year as general manager and coach of the first-year Madison Capitols of the USHL. He played college hockey for UW-Eau Claire. New assistant coach JB Bittner, who played his college hockey at Ohio State, arrived in Madison from a two-year assistant coaching stint for the USHL's Tri-City Storm in Kearney, Nebraska.

Three-point weekend at Michigan (12/4-5) set his new career-high for points in a series and included a two-assist game in the series finale, his second multi-point effort of the season. Netted UW's first penalty shot goal since Feb. 2, 2014 with his second-period goal against Arizona State (10/30). Penalty shot goal against ASU was his first goal of the season and first in 17 games dating back to his freshman season. Had first points of season on a pair of assists at Ferris State (10/23). Set up tournament-winning overtime goal to give Spruce Grove the 2014 AJHL Gas Drive Cup as league champions. Posted 21 goals and 57 points in 51 games to rank 15th in league scoring despite being one of the league's youngest players. Will be draft eligible for the first time for June's draft.

Led the state of Wisconsin with 103 points in 27 games as a senior in 2012 at Waunakee High School ... 2013 Janesville Jets (NAHL) MVP

23 Aidan Cavallini, Jr., F, L, 5-10, 205, Barrington, Ill. (Brookings, NAHL) Posted first point of season with an assist on game-tying goal in eventual 3-1 victory over then-No. 1 North Dakota (11/6). Has played in the USHL, BCHL, NAHL and EJHL. His mother, Katia, ran track at York University. His father, Gino, played college hockey at Bowling Green and played nine NHL seasons.

24 Jedd Soleway, Jr., F, R, 6-3, 220, Vernon, British Columbia (Penticton, BCHL) More than halfway to his career-high point total for a season (7 G, 2 A in 2014-15) through first 19 games with 4 G, 3 A. Recorded first goal of his season and 10th of his career in a 6-6 tie with Michigan (12/5). Registered second multi-point game of season and fifth of career, tying his career-high with a three-point outing (1 G, 2 A) at Michigan on Dec. 5 in a 6-6 tie. (Janesville, NAHL) Posted the seventh-highest save total in a game in UW history with his 54 stops against Penn State on Jan. 14, becoming the first UW netminder to make 50 or more saves in a game since Bernd Brückler on Feb. 8, 2002. Made 28 saves for his first-career shutout in 3-0 win at Michigan State on Dec. 12. Named a Big Ten Star of the Week in back-to-back weeks at start of November, becoming first Badger in first three seasons of the Big Ten to be honored in consecutive weeks. Big Ten Second Star of Week on Nov. 10 following UW's series split against then-No. 1 North Dakota, as he made 64 saves during the weekend and allowed just four goals. Big Ten Third Star of the Week Nov. 3 after he helped UW to a sweep of Arizona State, stopping 43 of the 45 total shots he saw in UW's 5-1 and 2-1 wins. Won first career game in UW's 5-1 triumph over Arizona State on Oct. 30, making 18 saves. Recorded 40 saves at Boston University on Oct. 17, 2015, making him first freshman goalie to record at least 40 saves in a game since Bernd Brückler made 47 saves March 2, 2002 against Minnesota Duluth. Produced a 29-game winning streak last season for NAHL's Janesville Jets that spanned the regular season (24) and playoffs (5). Backstopped the Jets to a league-record 100 points and the regular-season title. Led the league with 33 wins, 1.57 goals-against average, .939 save percentage and seven shutouts. Posted four shutouts in seven games and produced a shutout streak of over 300 minutes. A two-time invitee to USA Hockey's Warren Strelow National Team Goaltending Camp, which features the top goaltenders eligible for international play in select age groups. 31 Adam Miller, Sr., G, L, 5-10, 170, Long Grove, Ill. (Jersey, NAHL) Posted tie in first career start on Oct. 9, 2015 as a senior. Sister Megan is transfer goaltender for UW women's hockey team (from Boston College). Walk-on goaltender stopped 24 of 27 shots faced in 38:15 of relief action at Boston College on Oct. 18, 2013. Miller had just one prior appearance, skating 3:52 of action against Alabama Huntsville on Dec. 13, 2012, without having to make a save.

34 Gabe Grunwald, RS Fr., G, L, 6-3, 200, Toronto, Ontario (New York, EHL) Made 11 saves to split exhibition shutout win against Trinity Western (Jan. 1, 2016). Dad played basketball at Indiana and was a Boston Celtics draft pick. Father was also general manager of the NBA's New York Knicks and Toronto Raptors.

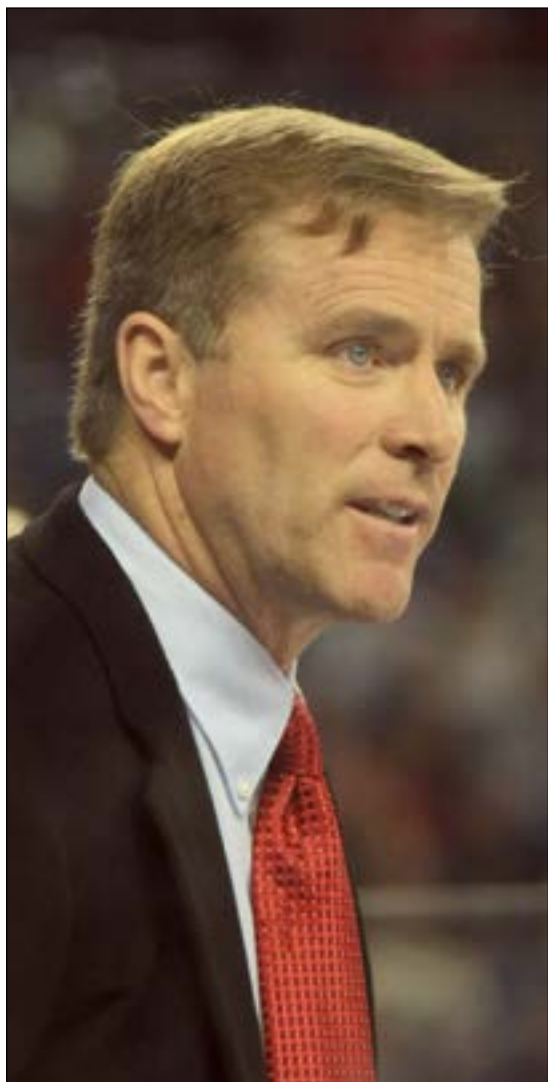

Kohl Center

Kohl Center Facts, Folklore and Traditions

- The Kohl Center, which opened in 1998, is the second largest on-campus rink in the nation (15,359). The only on-campus facility with a larger capacity is Value City Arena (17,500) in Columbus, Ohio. The building is the third-largest rink played in regularly by college hockey schools, behind Value City Arena and CenturyLink Center Omaha (16,680).
- Wisconsin has won at least 11 games in a season at the Kohl Center on 10 occasions.
- The Kohl Center played host to NCAA regional action for the first time in 2008 when the NCAA Midwest Regional took place on March 29-30. The building had previously played host to the 1998 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, a 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Regional and a 2007 NCAA Women's Ice Hockey Quarterfinal contest.
- The Kohl Center cost \$76.4 million to construct and is named after U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW graduate who donated \$25 million towards the project.
- The Kohl Center ice sheet is 200 feet long by 97 feet wide.
- Some of the names of players from opposing teams who have played in the building include Patrick Kane, Jonathan Toews, David Backes, Duncan Keith, Ryan Miller, Carl Hagelin, T.J. Oshie, Paul Stastny, Matt Carle, Kyle Okposo, Jack Eichel and Auston Matthews, among others.
