UP NEXT: NO. 3 UW OPENS 117TH SEASON

► Coming off a 62-31 win over Northern Kentucky in Friday's season opener, Wisconsin will host Chattanooga Sunday afternoon at the Kohl Center. The game will serve as the opening contest of the Battle 4 Atlantis, a tournament the Badgers will participate in from Nov. 26-28 in Paradise Island, The Bahamas. Chattanooga will play in the mainland version of the Battle 4 Atlantis on Nov. 26-27.

The Badgers enter the season ranked No. 3 in the AP preseason Top 25 and were tabbed as the unanimous favorites to win the Big Ten.

► Next Wednesday, Wisconsin will host Green Bay at 8 p.m. (CT) on The Big Ten Network before entertaining Boise State on Saturday, Nov. 22 with a 9 p.m. (CT) tip off on BTN.



Senior Frank Kaminsky and junior Sam Dekker were both named to the 2014-15 preseason All-Big Ten Team.

NOTES TO KNOW

1 PRESEASON PRAISE: UW begins the season with its highest-ever AP preseason ranking (No. 3) and was tabbed by a panel of media to win the Big Ten, marking the first-ever preseason No. 1 designation under Bo Ryan.

2 GANG'S ALL HERE: The Badgers return seven of their top eight scorers from last year's team that finished 30-8 and advanced to the 2014 Final Four. UW loses only guard Ben Brust (12.9 ppg), but brings back 81.9% of its minutes played, 81.9% of its scoring, 85.9% of its rebounding and 89.1% of its assists.

3 STAR POWER: Frank Kaminsky enters the season after earning AP preseason All-American honors and being named the Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year. Sam Dekker joined Kaminsky on the preseason All-Big Ten team and received votes for the AP preseason All-American Team.

4 REMARKABLE RYAN: Entering his 31st season as a head coach, Bo Ryan is one of 34 coaches in NCAA history (and one of just five active Div. I coaches) with 700 wins. Ryan's career winning percentage of .759 is 3rd only to UNC's Roy Williams (.793) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.763) among active coaches with 600 wins.

5 FINAL FOUR LORE: In 2014, UW advanced to the school's first Final Four since 2000 after a 64-63 OT win over No. 1 Arizona in the Elite Eight. The Badgers came up one point short in the Final Four, falling 74-73 to Kentucky.

SERIES VS. CHATTANOOGA

▶ Sunday's contest with Chattanooga will mark the first-ever meeting between the Badgers and the Mocs. The two teams have a pair of common opponents this season as both will face Northern Kentucky and UAB during the non-conference.

▶ Wisconsin's 9-0 all time vs. teams from the Southern Conference. The most recent meeting came two years ago when UW won 87-51 over Samford on Dec. 29, 2012.

WISCONSIN IN OPENERS

▶ With Friday's 62-31 win over Northern Kentucky, Wisconsin has now won each of its last 13 regular-season openers. UW's last loss in the opener came in Bo Ryan's first game as head coach when the Badgers dropped a 74-69 contest at UNLV.

▶ The Badgers have won their last 13 openers by an average of 28.2 points per game.

▶ UW has won 17 consecutive home openers dating back to 1998-99. Wisconsin's last loss in the home opener was a 65-60 loss to Marquette on Nov. 14, 1997 in the UW Field House.

▶ Wisconsin will boast one of the most experienced and decorated teams in the nation in 2014-15. The Badgers return 7 of the top 8 scorers from last season's team that finished 30-8 and reached the 2014 Final Four.

▶ The Badgers lose only one starter (Ben Brust) from 2013-14 and bring back 81.9% of their minutes played from last season. UW also brings back 81.9% of its scoring, 85.9% of its rebounding and 89.1% of its assists.

▶ UW's projected starting lineup should own a combined 414 games played and 252 starts.

PRESEASON PRAISE

▶ Wisconsin will enter the season with its highest-ever preseason ranking, checking in at No. 3 in the AP Top 25 and No. 4 in the Coaches Poll. UW has only opened the season in AP top-10 on two occasions: No. 9 in 2006 and No. 10 in 1962.

▶ The Badgers were also tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the Big Ten, followed by Michigan State at No. 2 and Ohio State at No. 3. This season marks Wisconsin's first-ever preseason No. 1 ranking under Bo Ryan. The Badgers have been in the top three of the preseason rankings six times during Ryan's tenure.

▶ Senior **Frank Kaminsky** was named to the 2014-15 preseason All-American team as announced by the Associated Press. Since 1986-87, when the AP started its preseason squad, Kaminsky

▶ Kaminsky was also tabbed the Preseason Big Ten Player of the Year by a panel of conference media members. A unanimous choice for Preseason All-Big Ten, Kaminsky was joined on the All-Conference team by Dekker, marking the first time UW has ever had two players on the preseason list.

#2 JORDAN SMITH

R-Jr. | G | 6-3 | 180 | Orono, Wis.

► Walk-on shooting guard who redshirted last season as a junior. Has appeared in 17 career games.

#3 ZAK SHOWALTER

R-So. | G | 6-2 | 185 | Germantown, Wis.

► Appeared in 22 games as a true freshman in 2012-13 but elected to redshirt last season. Entered UW as a walk-on but subsequently earned a scholarship.

► Father, Steve, served as his high school coach and also played for Bo Ryan at UW-Platteville ('85-89). Brother, Jake, is a freshman on the North Dakota State basketball team.

#4 MATT FERRIS

Fr. | G | 6-6 | 195 | Appleton, Wis.

► Walk-on freshman was a three-sport (football, basketball, baseball) prep star at Xavier High School in Appleton, Wis. A former QB, he set state records as a senior for passing yards (3,949) and TD passes (50).

#5 AARON MOESCH

R-Fr. | F | 6-8 | 215 | Green Bay, Wis.

► Walk-on forward who redshirted as a true freshman last season. He was a 1,000-point scorer at Green Bay Southwest High School.

#10 NIGEL HAYES

So. | F | 6-8 | 235 | Toledo, Ohio

► The 2014 Big Ten Sixth Man of the year, he was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team after appearing in all 38 games and averaging 7.7 points and 2.8 rebounds per game in 17.7 minutes per game. Hayes increased his scoring average to 9.8 ppg during Big Ten play, shooting 54.6% from the field.

► Hayes scored in double figures 12 times last season, including a career-high 19 points in his first-ever Big Ten game at Northwestern. His 164 free throw attempts ranked second on the team and were the most-ever by a UW freshman. Also led UW with 32 steals and was third with 20 blocks.

#11 JORDAN HILL

So. | G | 6-3 | 175 | Pasadena, Calif.

► Sophomore guard will redshirt the 2014-15 season.

► Hill appeared in 11 games as a true freshman last season. An under-recruited prep, Hill attended Exeter Academy (N.H.) after high school, leading the school to its first-ever conference title.

#12 TRAEVON JACKSON

Sr. | G | 6-3 | 207 | Westerville, Ohio

► Jackson established himself as one of the better point guards in the Big Ten last season earning 2014 All-Big Ten honorable mention. Led the Badgers with 151 assists, the fourth-highest single-season total in school history. His 1.8 assist-to-turnover ratio ranked sixth in the Big Ten.

► Stepped up his game in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, averaging 12.6 points, 5.2 rebounds and 4.2 assists en route to earning All-Region honors.

► Improved his 3-point field goal percentage from 29.3% as a sophomore to 38.2% in his junior season.

► Needs 25 assists to tie Michael Flowers (278) for 10th place on UW's career assists list.

► Has connected on four game-winning or game-tying shots in the final minute during his career: made game-winning jumper with 2.1 seconds left in win over Minnesota (1/26/13), hit the game-tying 3-pointer with 29 seconds left to force overtime in a win over Iowa (2/6/13), drained a 25-foot 3-pointer as time expired to win at Penn State (3/10/13) and knocked down a game-winning 12-foot jumper with 2.1 seconds left to beat Michigan State (2/9/14).

► The son of Ohio State and NBA All-Star Jimmy Jackson, Traevon has trained in each of the last few summers in Ohio with Trey Burke and Michigan State's Travis Trice among others.

► Traveled on a basketball and faith mission trip with Athletes in Action to the Philippines during the summer of 2014.

► Will be withheld from the first 2 games of the season per NCAA rules after regaining a fourth year of competition due to exhibition participation during his redshirt season of 2012-13.

► Born in Split, Croatia and raised in the Chicago area, Dukan grew up in the Bulls locker room as his father, Ivica Dukan, has worked in the team's scouting department since 1992.

- Father, Terrell, played at Marquette and was a co-captain with Doc Rivers in 1982-83 and was a 7th round draft pick of the Dallas Mavericks in 1983.

#21 JOSH GASSER

R-Sr. | G | 6-4 | 192 | Port Washington, Wis.

- Two-time All-Big Ten Defensive Team selection (2012 and 2014), Gasser has appeared in all 108 games of his career, including 104 starts. Is on pace to set school records for games player (138) and starts (126).
- Led the Big Ten in 3-point shooting (49.2%) and free throw shooting (87.9%) during conference play last season, earning All-Big Ten honorable mention.
- Missed the entire 2012-13 season after suffering a torn left ACL. Returned last season and started every game, playing the second-most minutes on the team. Named to Seth Davis' "2014 All-Glue Team" for his ability to do everything well.
- Owns the only triple-double in school history and first Big Ten freshman to do it since Magic Johnson in 1977 with 10 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists at Northwestern (1/23/11).

- The lone scholarship freshman in UW's Class of 2014, Happ was a two-time AP first-team All-State selection at Rock Ridge High School. He averaged 33 points and 15 rebounds as a senior and went on to earn MVP honors at the prestigious U-18 Albert Schweitzer Tournament in Germany this summer.

#24 BRONSON KOENIG

So. | G | 6-4 | 190 | La Crosse, Wis.

- Sophomore guard appeared in 37 of 38 games as a freshman, averaging 15.5 minutes per game. Koenig had big games on big stages, scoring 12 points in a win at Iowa, 14 points (4-for-4 from 3FGs) vs. Minnesota in the Big Ten Tourn. and 11 points in the first half of Final Four vs. Kentucky.
- A proud member of the Ho-Chunk Indian Tribe, Koenig was a two-time state champion at La Crosse Aquinas High School.

R-Fr. | G | 6-5 | 182 | Minnetonka, Min.

- After redshirting his true freshman season, Dearing returns to the active roster in 2014-15. A long, athletic guard, Dearing has added 10 pounds to his 6-foot-5 frame since arriving on campus.

#44 FRANK KAMINSKY

Sr. | F | 7-0 | 234 | Lisle, Ill.

- Few players in the country had a breakout season like Kaminsky in 2013-14. After averaging just 10.3 minutes and 4.2 points per game as a sophomore, he became a consensus first-team All-Big Ten pick in 2014 after leading the Badgers in points (13.9) and rebounds (6.3) and posting the third-highest block total in UW history (66).
- Named 2014-15 Preseason AP All-American, just the third in UW history. Also became the third Badger to earn Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year.
- Scored a school-record 43 points against North Dakota (11/19/13), going 6-for-6 from 3-point range.
- Just the fifth 7-footer in UW history, Kaminsky has a knack for elevating his play at the biggest moments, including 25 points and 11 rebounds in the Badgers' win at No. 15 Michigan (2/16/14) or 28 points, 11 rebounds vs. No. 1 Arizona in the 2014 NCAA Tournament Elite Eight en route to being named West Regional Most Outstanding Player.
- Ranked second in the Big Ten in field goal percentage (.528) and 12th in the conference in scoring in 2013-14. He shot 37.8 percent (37-for-98) from 3-point range and 76.5 percent (101-132) from the free throw line.
- Father, Frank is 7th-leading scorer in Lewis Univ. history; mother, Mary, played volleyball at Northwestern; aunt & uncle also played hoops at Northwestern.

NOTES FROM UW's LAST GAME

#3 WIS 62, NKU 31 - 11/14/14 - Kohl Center

► UW opened the season with a 62-31 over Northern Kentucky Friday night. Frank Kaminsky posted the third double-double of his career (16 pts, 11 reb). Sam Dekker registered 15 points, while Nigel Hayes pulled in a career-best 10 rebounds.

► The Badgers held NKU to 31 points, equaling the fourth-fewest points UW has allowed in the modern era and the fewest since giving up 31 to UMKC on Nov. 22, 2011. UW shot 48.9% from the field and limited NKU to just 26.4% shooting.

NON-CON STREAKING

► Wisconsin went a perfect 13-0 in regular-season non-conference games last season. Overall, the Badgers have won 17 consecutive non-conference games. UW's home winning streak against non-Big Ten teams sits at 14 games.

► Under Bo Ryan (since 2001-02), Wisconsin owns an overall record of 132-30 (.815) in non-conference games, including a mark of 99-7 (.934) at the Kohl Center.

► Ryan's teams are 82-2 (.976) at the Kohl Center against teams outside of the 6 major conferences, including a streak of 55 straight wins.

UW's only 2 losses under Ryan against non-major teams are a 62-55 loss to North Dakota State in 2006 and a 70-67 overtime defeat to Temple in 2001, Ryan's first season.

CENTURY CLUB WATCH

► The Badgers have four players who could all reach the 1,000-point milestone in the 2014-15 season. If **Sam Dekker** (822), **Josh Gasser** (816), **Frank Kaminsky** (742) and **Traevon Jackson** (677) match their production from last season, each would eclipse 1,000 career points.

► In 13 seasons at Wisconsin, Bo Ryan has seen 12 players reach the 1,000-point plateau. In fact, 7 of the top 14 scorers in Badgers history have come in the Ryan era.

KOHL CENTER AMONG TOUGHEST

► Wisconsin has lost a TOTAL of just 21 home games in the Bo Ryan era.

In 13 seasons under Ryan, the Badgers are an incredible 195-21 (.903) at the Kohl Center. UW's .903 winning percentage since 2001-02 is good for 5th in the nation. Only Duke, Kansas, Gonzaga and Memphis have better home records in that span (pg 12).

► Three of UW's 5 longest home win streaks have come under Bo Ryan, including the school-record 38 straight from 12/7/2002 to 1/25/2005.

► In 2013-14, the Badgers ranked second in the Big Ten and finished 7th nationally by averaging 17,104 per game. Wisconsin has led the Big Ten in attendance in 9 of the last 12 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 14 years.

► This season, the Badgers sold out the 2,100-person Grateful Red (the third-largest student section in the Big Ten) in just five minutes.

ROSTER ADDITIONS IN '14-15

► UW adds a three-person freshman class and regains the services of three players who redshirted the 2013-14 season.

► Junior Jordan Smith, sophomore Zak Showalter and freshman Riley Dearing all return to the active roster after sitting out a year ago.

► Ethan Happ (Milan, Ill.) is the lone scholarship freshman in 2014-15 and is joined by walk-ons Matt Ferris (Appleton, Wis.) and T.J. Schlundt (Oconomowoc, Wis.).

2013-14 LOOK BACK

Record: 30-8

Big Ten: 12-6 (T2nd)

► With a 64-63 overtime win against No. 1 seeded Arizona in the Elite Eight, Wisconsin advanced to the 2014 Final Four for the third time in school history and the first time since 2000.

The No. 2 seed Badgers would fall to Kentucky, 74-73, in a 2014 National Semifinal game that was witnessed by 79,444 people, the largest-ever crowd for a college basketball game.

Wisconsin advanced to the NCAA tournament for the 16th-straight season, including all 13 seasons under Bo Ryan.

► The Badgers won 30 games in 2013-14 for just the 3rd time in school history, one shy of the school record. Bo Ryan-led teams are responsible for each of the 10 highest single-season win totals in Badgers annals. UW finished the season ranked No. 4 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, the highest postseason ranking in school history.

► Wisconsin's entire starting 5 and top reserve were all recognized with 2014 All-Big Ten honors, highlighted by Frank Kaminsky's consensus first-team selection. Sam Dekker was a second-team All-Big Ten pick, while Ben Brust, Josh Gasser and Traevon Jackson earned honorable mention.

Nigel Hayes won Big Ten Sixth Man of the Year and was also named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. Josh Gasser was chosen to the Big Ten's All-Defensive Team for the second time in his career.

► Any way you slice it, the Badgers owned one of the nation's top bodies of work in 2013-14. In addition to a trip to the 2014 Final Four, consider this:

- Opened the year 16-0, best start in school history
- UW was 13-5 against teams in the NCAA tournament field
- UW was 8-2 against teams in the AP top 25
- UW was 17-1 against teams outside the Big Ten
- UW had wins over 7 conference champs: Arizona (Pac-12), Virginia (ACC), Florida (SEC), Michigan (Big Ten), Saint Louis (A-10), Green Bay (Horizon) & E. Kentucky (OVC)
- UW was 16-5 away from home (8-3 road, 8-2 neutral)

► The 2013-14 Badgers rewrote the reputation of Wisconsin Basketball... sort of. UW still played great defense and led the nation in fewest turnovers (8.1 per game), however the team boasted its best offense since 1994. The Badgers average 73.5 ppg while ranking 7th in the nation in offensive efficiency (1.16 points per poss.). UW set school records for points, FGs, FGAs, 3-pt FGs, 3-pt FGAs, FTs and FTAs.

► Following Wisconsin's berth into the Final Four, respected basketball writer Dick "Hoops" Weiss typed out a poignant tweet, proclaiming: "will someone please put bo ryan in the naismith hall of fame - has 4 d III national champ rings."

► In addition to his incredible Div. III success, in 13 years at Wisconsin, Ryan has built the best record in Big Ten history, coaching the Badgers to a mark of 156-66 (.703), surpassing runner-up Bobby Knight's mark of .700.

RYAN JOINS 700-WIN CLUB

► With a win over Minnesota in the Big Ten tournament, Bo Ryan tallied his 700th career win, becoming just the 34th coach in college basketball history to reach the 700-win plateau.

Ryan is 1 of 5 active Div. I coaches with 700 wins.

► Alex Illikainen (6-9, 225)

Grand Rapids, Minn. (Brewster Academy [N.H.])

Illikainen will spend his senior year playing for Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire after being a two-time all-state selection at Grand Rapids High School. He averaged 26.5 points and 15.2 rebounds per game as a junior and is the school's all-time leading scorer and rebounder with 2,185 points and 1,402 boards. He is ranked as the No. 95 player in the country by ESPN.com.

► Brevin Pritzl (6-3, 185)

De Pere, Wis. (De Pere High School)

Pritzl averaged 20.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game as a junior at De Pere High School last season en route to first-team All-State honors from the WBCA. A shooting guard with deep range, Pritzl has already scored 1,082 points and hit 131 3-pointers in his prep career. ► Ryan's teams have won at least 20 games in 11 of his 13 seasons at UW. Illinois (10) is the only other Big Ten team with 10 20-win seasons since 2001-02. Prior to Ryan's arrival, the Badgers had just four 20-win seasons in 103 years of basketball.

UW has won at least 20 games in each of the last 8 seasons, the 2nd-longest active streak in the Big Ten.

BIG TEN, BIG RESULTS

► Since Bo Ryan took over in 2001, UW has won 5 Big Ten championships (3 regular season and 2 tourn.). Only OSU (10; 5 regular season, 5 tourn.) has won more titles during Ryan's tenure. ILL also has 5, but no other school has more than 3 over that span.

► Ryan's teams have posted a 156-66 (.703) Big Ten record, the best mark in the conference over the last 13 seasons. Michigan St. is second at 149-73 (.671) and Ohio St. is third at 145-77 (.653).

► This season, Wisconsin posted a 12-6 record in the Big Ten, finishing in second place. The Badgers have notched double-digit conference wins in 12 of 13 years under Bo Ryan and have never finished lower than fourth place in the Big Ten standings.

► UW has posted a winning conference record in each of the last 14 seasons. Among the 6 major conferences, only Kansas (23 seasons) has a longer active streak of finishing above .500 in league play.

ALL WE DO IS WIN, WIN, WIN

Over the last seven seasons (since 2006-07), Wisconsin has accumulated an overall record of 187-64 (.745). That win total and percentage puts the Badgers in pretty exclusive company.

Wisconsin's .745 win percentage ranks 14th among all NCAA Div. I teams in that span.

NCAA TOURNEY REGULARS

► UW has qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of Bo Ryan's 13 seasons in Madison, posting a 20-12 record over that span. Under Ryan, UW has won at least one game in 11 of the 13 NCAA appearances. Among Big Ten teams, only MSU (24) has won more NCAA tourney games than UW since 2001-02.

► UW has made 16 consecutive NCAA tournaments - 1 of just 6 schools with an active streak of at least 16 years: Kansas (25), Duke (19), Mich St. (17) & Gonzaga (16).

► Wisconsin has advanced to the Final Four for the third time in school history and the first since 2000.

► Only Duke (8), Kansas (8) and Michigan State (8) have been to more Sweet 16s in the last 11 years than UW (6).

BADGERS ATTENDANCE IS BIG

► In 2012-13, the Badgers ranked second in the Big Ten and finished 7th nationally by averaging 16,843 per game.

► Wisconsin has led the Big Ten in attendance in 9 of the last 11 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 13 years.

◆ In Bo Ryan's 14 seasons as Wisconsin's head coach, the Badgers have compiled a 196-21 (.903) record at the Kohl Center, including an 97-14 (.874) record in Big Ten home games.

◆ In Ryan's first 10 seasons, the Badgers lost at TOTAL of 11 home games.

◆ Four of the 8 longest home winning streaks in UW history have happened with Bo Ryan on the sidelines, including the school-record 38-game winning streak from 2002 to 2005.

◆ Over the last 14 seasons, 143 of the Badgers' 196 home wins have come by at least 10 points (73.0 percent).

◆ Wisconsin has trailed at halftime in only 40 of 217 home games under Ryan. UW has come back to win 26 of those 40 games.

◆ UW had a streak of 143 consecutive sellouts at the Kohl Center snapped in 2011 (vs. Green Bay). Wisconsin sold out every game from 2003 until midway through the 2011-12 season.

◆ In 2013-14, the Badgers ranked 2nd in the Big Ten and 7th nationally in attendance (17,104 per game). UW has led the Big Ten in attendance in 9 of the last 12 seasons and has finished among the nation's top 7 in each of the last 14 years.

◆ This season, the Badgers sold out the 2,100-person Grateful Red (third-largest student section in the Big Ten) in exactly five minutes.

Ryan has taken UW to new heights

◆ With 322 wins, Bo Ryan has surpassed Hall of Famer Harold "Bud" Foster (265) to become UW's all-time career wins leader. Ryan needs 8 Big Ten wins to supplant Meanwell (158 wins) as the school's leader in conference wins.

◆ Ryan set the UW wins record in just 365 games and 11 seasons. Foster reached the milestone in 532 games and 25 seasons.

◆ Bo Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and is 1 of just 5 active Division I coaches to reach that hallowed ground. Ryan's career winning percentage of .759 is 3rd only to North Carolina's Roy Williams (.793) and Duke's Mike Krzyzewski (.763) among active coaches with 600 wins. Among all-time coaches with 600 career wins (regardless of NCAA classification), Ryan's winning percentage ranks 10th.

◆ Ryan tied legendary Indiana coach Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest coach in conference history to record 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. Only Bob Knight did it faster (131 games).

◆ Ryan's .703 (156-66) win percentage in conference games is the best mark in Big Ten history, surpassing legendary Indiana coach Bob Knight (353-151, .700).

◆ Indiana's Bob Knight (327) and Purdue's Ward Lambert (331) are the only coaches in Big Ten history to reach 250 wins faster than Bo Ryan, who did it in 343 games.

◆ Ryan won his third Big Ten Coach of the Year honor in 2013. Only Purdue's Gene Keady (7) and Indiana's Bob Knight (5) have won the honor more times than Ryan.

With 322 wins, Ryan is the all-time wins leader in Wisconsin history, surpassing Hall of Famer Bud Foster (265). Prior to Ryan's hire at UW in 2001-02, the Badgers had four 19-win seasons (high of 22) in 103 years.

Including last season, Ryan has now led the UW to at least 19 wins in each of his 13 seasons at UW and owns 11 seasons of 20+ wins. In fact, Ryan's teams have accounted for the 10 winningest seasons in school annals.

Wisconsin has averaged 24.7 wins per season during the Ryan era, including three 30-win seasons.

In the first 96 years of Big Ten play, Wisconsin won at least 11 Big Ten games 9 times (including just once since 1941). Including this season, Ryan has led the Badgers to at least 11 conference wins in 11 of his 13 seasons. He was the first Big Ten coach to win at least 11 league games in each of his first four years.

Ryan ranks 11th in Big Ten history with 156 career wins. He has led UW to a 156-66 (.703) record in Big Ten play, the highest win percentage of any coach in Big Ten history.

Ryan is the fastest coach in UW history to reach 100 Big Ten wins, doing so in 140 games. That also ties Branch McCracken as the 2nd-fastest in conference history. Only Bob Knight (131 games) did it faster.

Including last season, UW has finished among the top 4 in the Big Ten in each of Ryan's 13 seasons. That 13-year stretch of top-4 finishes equals the longest in Big Ten history (Purdue also had a run of 13 in a row from 1920-32).

Ryan led the Badgers to the 2014 Final Four, the school's first appearance since 2000.

UW has won 20 NCAA tournament games under Ryan, surpassing the Badgers' total of 9 in the 63 years prior to Ryan.

Wisconsin Coaching Staff

BO RYAN HEAD COACH

Since being hired as the head coach at Wisconsin, Bo Ryan has elevated the program to heights previously unseen in Madison. In 2014, Ryan and the Badgers climbed even higher, reaching the program's first Final Four since 2000 and winning 30 games for just the third time in school history.

With over 700 wins, 17 championships and countless conference and national coach of the year accolades, there is little doubt that Ryan is among the great coaches in college basketball history.

Now as Ryan enters his 31st season as a head coach in 2014-15 - his 14th atop the Wisconsin program - it's difficult to decide which is more impressive, his incredible longevity or his unparalleled success. It is, however, safe to say that the combination of the two is what elevates Ryan among college basketball's elite.

Owning the most wins in UW annals (321 entering 2014-15), Ryan became the 34th NCAA coach to reach the 700-win plateau and is one of just five active Division I coaches to reach that hallowed ground. Ryan's career winning percentage of .759 (704-224) is seventh all-time among coaches with 700 career wins.



A member of five Halls of Fame, Ryan has been enshrined into the Wilkes College Athletic Hall of Fame (2003), the Delaware County Chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame (2008), the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame (2011), the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame (2011) and the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Hall of Fame (2012).

One of the most respected coaches in college basketball, Ryan was awarded the NABC Guardians of the Game Award for Service in 2004. In 2009, the NABC presented Ryan with the Outstanding Service Award "for his actions inside and outside the lines of coaching that have distinguished him as a valuable member of his community."

Ryan is one of college basketball's most active participants when it comes to improving the game. In the past, Ryan has served on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Issues Committee and on the Academic Progress Rate committee. Ryan currently serves on the board of directors for both the NABC and the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Assoc. (WBCA).

In 2013, Ryan was given the Coaches vs. Cancer Champion Award, rewarding his dedication to such a worthy cause. Since joining Coaches vs. Cancer in 2007, Ryan has raised over \$1.5 million to support the American Cancer Society. His team of coaches in Wisconsin transformed the Coaches vs. Cancer Wisconsin Gala from a small local fundraiser into the largest Coaches vs. Cancer gala in the nation.

Ryan and his wife, Kelly, have also hosted a Shooting Down Cancer at UW in each of the last three years, donating over \$160,000 to the American Cancer Society based on UW student's participation and ability to make a free throw or halfcourt shot. Ryan is also very active in numerous other national and local charity efforts including the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF), the UW Children's Hospital and the Memorial Veterans Hospital.
